FULL FIELD FOR JESSAMINE

A fees-paid berth to the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf is on the line today in Keeneland's GIII J P Morgan Chase Jessamine S. The morning-line favorite

Emerald Gold (War Front) hasn't actually raced on grass, but has looked sharp in a pair of Polytrack appearances at Del Mar. After an educational debut at Hollywood June 26, the Glen Hill colorbearer graduated at the oceanside oval July 30, and came back to finish a promising third to Weemissfrankie (Sunriver) in the GI Del Mar Debutante S. Sept. 3 ([video](#)).

"She came running in that last race, and the winner wasn't getting away from her," trainer

Tom Proctor told *Daily Racing Form*. "I think the farther she goes, the better off she's going to be. She has a nice turf pedigree, which is a main reason we went in here instead of the [GI Darley] Alcibiades last weekend. I also thought turf would be her best chance to make the Breeders' Cup." The bay filly will need to work out a good trip from post 11.

DUTROW'S LICENSE REVOKED

The New York State Racing and Wagering Board revoked trainer Richard Dutrow Jr.'s license for 10 years and fined him a total of \$50,000 during a meeting at its offices in Schenectady, N.Y. The combination of the loss of license and fines is believed to be most severe sanction ever handed down by New York's regulators. Dutrow's attorney, Michael Koenig, promptly filed a motion for a stay of the penalties imposed on the 52-year-old trainer pending a legal appeal. Judge Richard Giardino scheduled a hearing on the application for the stay for Oct. 17 in Schenectady County Court. The three-member board voted unanimously to revoke Dutrow's license, and made it effective Oct. 18 in order to allow horses already entered to run and to give owners time to move their horses to other trainers. Hearing officer Clemente Parente recommended in his report that Dutrow receive a lifetime ban in New York. While the board did approve Parente recommendation that Dutrow have his license revoked and be fined \$25,000 for each of two incidents in November 2010, it reduced the permanent ban to 10 years. In a statement issued after the meeting, the board said that it is taking Dutrow's license because he is a person, "whose conduct at race tracks in New York state and elsewhere has been improper, obnoxious, unbecoming and detrimental to the best interests of racing." Board Chairman John D. Sabini said: "We have a situation here where a licensee has repeatedly...violated rules in jurisdictions across the country. A license is a privilege, not a right." **Cont. p2**

Dutrow's License Revoked cont.

During the meeting, board member Charles Diamond said that Dutrow's record showed 64 violations in nine states at 15 race tracks. However, it was Diamond who said that he thought that a lifetime ban was too severe and that 10 years was more appropriate. Board member Daniel D. Hogan said that Dutrow's record showed a disregard for the racing law. "We have seen a lot of evidence presented and we've had a lot of people come forward to speak on his behalf," Hogan said. "Mr. Dutrow loves horses, but he loves winning more and he wasn't above breaking out rules to win." In March, Dutrow was ordered by New York regulators to show cause why his license should not be revoked after he was suspended for two separate incidents in November at Aqueduct: the discovery of hyperdermic needles and a banned substance in his desk Nov. 3 and a post-race positive on Nov. 20. Dutrow testified on the third day of a hearing presided over by Parente May 30 and June 1-2 in Schenectady, and denied having any knowledge of why the needles containing xylazine were in his desk or the events leading up to Fastus Cactus testing positive for the painkiller butorphanol in the post-race urine sample. Trainers are prohibited from having the hypodermic needles, and both substances are prohibited. Reached by phone late Wednesday, Dutrow declined comment and referred all questions to Koenig, who criticized the board's actions. "This is vindictive, heavy-handed and, most importantly, contrary to the facts, contrary to the evidence and contrary to any sense of fundamental fairness or due process," Koenig said. "The structure and process of the Racing and Wagering Board allows it to be the prosecutor, the judge and the jury. No fair or even-handed result can come from such a stacked process. We look forward to challenging this decision in courts, which will be free from the biases and conflicts of interest that infect the Racing and Wagering Board in this decision." Koenig has said throughout the process that Sabini was in a conflict of interest situation because Ed Martin, president of the Racing Commissioners International, to which Sabini belongs, asked the Racing and Wagering Board to consider revoking Dutrow's license for his long history of violations, instead of fining him or suspending his license. At the meeting Wednesday, Sabini said he rejected Koenig's request that he recuse himself from the Dutrow matter. "Mr. Dutrow has said in public discourse and when reporters ask him, 'You guys know my game,'" Sabini said. "As far as I'm concerned, game over. Let this be a lesson to other people in the business who have had repeated violations." --Mike Kane

Alex Waldrop, president and CEO of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, later issued a statement. "Today's ruling by the New York State Racing and Wagering Board in the case of Rick Dutrow is a clear indicator that regulators will not tolerate a pattern of disregard for the rules of racing by a licensee," the statement read. "Integrity is an indispensable part of Thoroughbred racing, and all participants must abide by this principle in order to retain the privilege of participation."

Atlantic Jewel has gone from a maiden win over the Geelong all-weather to Group 1 winner in the span of 10 weeks, stamping herself as Australia's best 3-year-old filly with this dominating win. Purchased for A\$320,000 at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, Atlantic Jewel overcame trouble to take her Aug. 23 debut before overwhelming fields at Moonee Valley and Caulfield Sept. 10 and 24, respectively. She was sent off a strong odds-on choice trying the metric mile for the first time, and settled near the tail of the field early on here. Committed to a wide run into the stretch, she looped her rivals and raced away through the final furlong. Mosheen completed an exacta for her sire. "I can't [put it into words], she's very good," trainer Mark Kavanagh said of Atlantic Jewel. "These [kinds of horses] don't come along very often. She can do many things that I haven't seen horses do before." Winning jockey Michael Rodd was also full of praise, and thinks there is even better to come. "She's still got a lot to learn, her ears are always flicking wherever she is, and she's still very green, so it's going to be very good to see what she can do this time next year," he commented. Kavanagh said he would not be tempted to try the filly in next week's G1 Cox Plate, and would likely recommend she head to the paddocks for a brief spell. Kendam ran sixth in the July 19 Listed Prix des Reves d'Or at Vichy and improved one spot in the Aug. 4 Listed Criterium du Bequet at Bordeaux in her second stakes go next time. She struck by a confidence-boosting four lengths in a Sept. 2 Moulins conditions heat in her penultimate outing and came here off a runner-up effort in the G3 Prix d'Arenberg over this course and distance Sept. 13. Kendam was swiftly into stride and raced freely on the front end until her owner's beret rouge Misedargent (Fr) (Kendargent {Fr}) assumed pacemaking duties. Stoked up to regain the initiative from that rival approaching the final eighth, she weaved off a straight line when under pressure in the closing stages, but had enough in hand to safely hold the late threat of Chica Loca. "She found her day today after finishing second at the same level last time," said trainer Alex Pantall. "It is great for her owner-breeder Guy Pariente, who also stands the sire Kendargent at his farm [Haras de Colleville]. She's a consistent filly and will probably run again this year, maybe in the [seven-furlong G3] Prix Miesque [at this track Nov. 1]. The [G2] Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte [over course and distance Nov. 1] is another possibility."

THE QUEEN ELIZABETH II S.- A Brief History

In the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S., Khalid Abdullah and Sir Henry Cecil have chosen some race to further flaunt the talents of their champion elect **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}). Given its present name in 1955, it has showcased two major luminaries of the post-war period who have cropped up more than once in conversation about the merits of the current Warren Place incumbent. They are Tudor Minstrel (GB) and Brigadier Gerard (GB). The former saw out his brief but brilliant career in this race under its previous guise as the Knight's Royal S. in 1947. The Fred Darling trainee had established his dominance over his peers and booked his place in folklore with a commanding display at Newmarket in the 2000 Guineas that season. Tudor Minstrel was recorded to be have been eight lengths in front at the line that day--only today's QEII principal has come close to that margin in the interim--and the Timeform comments of the race read, "Made all: never out of canter." By the time of the Knight's Royal, his headstrong tendencies had begun to get the better of him, but he managed a 1 1/2-length victory all the same in his finale.

Of all the milers since, only the "Brigadier" has managed to equal Tudor Minstrel's scintillating performance. He registered the first of his back-to-back successes in this contest by eight lengths in 1971 and, like Frankel, had already captured the Guineas, St James's Palace S. and Sussex S.

While Tudor Minstrel's early fire and brimstone petered out after he was stretched too far in the Derby, John and Jean Hislop's illustrious aberration of the 70's just carried on building on each power-packed run. A year after his initial victory here, the Brigadier was a scarcely believable six lengths better than the top-class Sparkler (Ire) despite giving that rival seven pounds. Timeform currently have Frankel on a rating of 142, just two pounds shy of that remarkable duo. In keeping him in training at four, connections obviously believe his Tudor Minstrel-like raw power can be fine-tuned to keep him on the path that the great Major Dick Hern laid for Brigadier Gerard.

It took just three renewals after the retirement of that institution of the turf to witness another dual winner in the form of Rose Bowl, who preceded Henry Cecil's first winner Kris (GB) in 1979. A year later, when it was still a Group 2 and worth less than £15,000 to the winner, the late Lord Howard de Walden's famous chestnut lost out by a neck to Known Fact in a thriller that lifted the profile of the race and, in turn, made a strong case for its promotion. That finally came in 1987, when the meeting was newly labeled the "Festival of British Racing" and the purse of the race was significantly bolstered. In its first term as a Group 1, the Meon Valley homebred Milligram (GB) upstaged the great Miesque and Sonic Lady in a renewal dominated by the fillies (amazingly, no member of their sex has managed to emulate that win in the subsequent period). Twelve months after that encounter, Juddmonte's stellar miler Warning (GB) was fired to glory by five lengths from Salse, and in 1989, Maktoum Al Maktoum's brilliant Zilzal beat Polish Precedent in convincing fashion to establish the newly invigorated contest among the major ones of Europe.

In 1990, a fresh-faced Frankie Dettori captured his first win at the highest level on Known Fact's son Markofdistinction (GB) and was back six years later to stage his own personal highlight at his beloved Berkshire venue. By the time he was utilising the deadly turn of acceleration of Mark of Esteem (Ire) to eclipse the wonderful filly Bosra Sham (Woodman) in this event, he was well on his way to his unrepeatable "Magnificent Seven" and to enduring fame. Mark of Esteem's success was the first of five in this for Godolphin, with the second of them representing an emotive peak for the operation as the extraterrestrial Dubai Millennium (GB) (Seeking the Gold) put a trio of over-matched rivals to the sword. After that first genuine showcase of his sheer class, Sheikh Mohammed stated that "there is no horse like this horse," and five months later we all got to see what he meant in Dubai. One of the boys in blue's lesser-heralded successes came via the supposed pacemaker Summoner (GB) (Inchinar {GB}) in 2001, who was one of two rabbits who got away in recent times. The other was Shadwell's 66-1 surprise package Maroof (Danzig), who refused to relinquish his front-running role at the chief expense of Baratheia (Ire) seven years earlier. Four of the best from the last decade are the versatile ground-breakers Falbrav (Ire) (Fairy King) and Rakti (GB) (Polish Precedent), the brilliantly talented but paddock-averse George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) and slow-burner Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality), who finally managed to usurp arch-rival Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) in 2008 before repeating the feat in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita.

But Saturday is all about Frankel, and the first staging of the race on the straight course should be his to own. Up there already with the ghosts of this famed place, let's see if he can outrun a few.

One-time English galloper **December Draw** is set to start the shortest-priced favorite of this G1 Melbourne Cup pointer in 45 years and will break from post 11 with an ante-post quote of 7-5. A winner of just three of 16 starts in Europe, the 5-year-old has been reborn since his sale to Australian interests. He was registered five wins in six trips to the post, including the G3 Naturalism S. at Caulfield Sept. 17 and a last-out score in Flemington's G1 Turnbull S. Oct. 2. "You can't fault his form, he's improved every time and he showed last time that he can really fight when in a bit of a scrap, so we're looking forward to it," trainer Mark Kavanagh told *Australian Associated Press*. "He pulled up the best after the Turnbull. That really brought him on, and he's gone on in leaps and bounds since then. I couldn't be happier. You try to keep a lid on it, but it's pretty exciting. He has improved with every run." The participation of German raider **Lucas Cranach** is in some doubt. The 6-1 second choice pre-post is reportedly suffering from a foot abscess, but was able to go through his morning work Wednesday. He will be subject to a veterinary exam Friday morning. The 4-year-old, victorious in the G2 Grosser Preis von Lotto Hamburg in June, was most recently fifth to recent G1 Arc de Triomphe winner Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) in the G1 Grosser Preis von Berlin July 24.



BREEDERS' CUP BULLETIN

On His 'Way' to the Classic

GI Breeders' Cup Classic contender **Tizway** (Tiznow), who missed an intended start in the Oct. 1 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup with a fever, breezed a mile in 1:38.47 over the Belmont main track yesterday morning. The 6-year-old is usually based at Saratoga, but trainer Jim Bond wanted a different surface for his charge's workout. "I made my up my mind about 10 days ago that I wanted to get a good mile workout into him, and I wanted to do it on a track that was faster than the Oklahoma," said Bond. "He is going into a mile-and-a-quarter race, one of the richest in the world, and I needed to make sure I had him where I wanted him physically. I want to give him the best chance to prove to everyone that he is the best horse in America. I couldn't be happier with him right now." The conditioner was pleased with the move. "It was a tremendous work with a great gallop out," said trainer Jim Bond. "He did it so easily, and the best part is that he was not even breathing hard afterwards. I am ecstatic." Tizway captured the GI Metropolitan H. on Memorial Day and added the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga Aug. 6, but hasn't faced the starter since. "He runs huge off layoffs," said Bond. "He is better suited to bring his 'A+' race when he has plenty of spacing between races." Tizway is expected to return to Saratoga today, and will ship to Churchill on Halloween.

Ruler On Ice Confirmed for Classic

George and Lori Hall's **Ruler On Ice** (Roman Ruler) will make his next appearance in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Nov. 5. A surprise winner of the GI Belmont S. in June, the chestnut has run back to finish third in the GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth July 31 and second in the GII Pennsylvania Derby at Parx Sept. 24. "He went an easy five furlongs, 1:02 flat, last week [at Monmouth]," said trainer Kelly Breen. "We'll probably give him an easy weekend and then work him on the 22nd and 29th. He'll ship out after his last work."

Champ Pegasus Out of Turf Picture

Shortly after leading Californian runner Acclamation (Unusual Heat) was taken out of Breeders' Cup consideration, **Champ Pegasus** (Fusaichi Pegasus) was also ruled out of the GI BC Turf, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Runner-up in last year's Turf at Churchill, the 5-year-old was most recently second to Acclamation in the GII Clement L. Hirsch Turf Championship S. at Santa Anita Oct. 2. "We had an ankle problem after we got back from Dubai," trainer Richard Mandella told *DRF*. "It's not a serious one, but it's coming back a little bit. We're X-raying it, doing a workup on it. He's going to get a rest. It might be a short rest, it might be a longer rest, but he's not going to go to the Breeders' Cup."

Dirt Mile for Shackleford

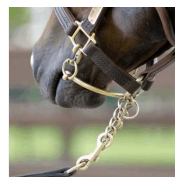
GI Preakness S. winner **Shackleford** (Forestry) will likely target the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, rather than the Classic, *Daily Racing Form* reported. The front-running chestnut is coming off a second to Wilburn (Bernardini) in the GII Indiana Derby at Hoosier Park Oct. 1. "The Dirt Mile is probably the way to go, the way we're leaning anyway," Romans told *DRF*. "It just looks like the best spot of the day for him. The Classic is going to be a super-tough race with a lot of speed in it." Another 3-year-old who may end up in the \$1-million Dirt Mile is **Tapizar** (Tapit), who returned from a knee chip operation to post a sharp allowance win at Belmont last Saturday. "If he doesn't regress we'll move forward," owner Ron Winchell told *DRF*. "I just hope having one prep race can get the job done." Tapizar captured the GIII Sham S. Jan. 15.

No BC for Mr. Nedawi

Brazilian champion **Mr. Nedawi (Brz)** (Nedawi {GB}), who qualified for the GIII Breeders' Cup Marathon by winning the June 20 G2 Clasico General Belgrano at Palermo as part of the "Win and You're In" series, will not run in the World Championships, Breeders' Cup representative John Fulton confirmed. The 6-year-old is instead being touted as a possibility to defend his title in the G1 Gran Premio Internacional Dardo Rocha, Hipodromo La Plata's marquee event on Nov. 19. Mr. Nedawi won the Belgrano by three lengths to cement his spot in the 1 3/4-mile Marathon at Churchill Nov. 4. Since his upset victory in the Belgrano, the Brazilian-bred was second in the G2 Clasico Chacabuco July 16 and G3 Clasico Vicente L. Caceres Sept. 18, both run over the Palermo strip at 2500 meters.

Team Valor Doubles Down for Juvenile Turf

Team Valor, successful in last year's BC Juvenile Turf with Pluck (More Than Ready), has a pair of youngster's pointing to this year's renewal, which will be run as a Grade I event for the first time. **State of Play** (War Front), who secured a "Win and You're In" berth in the GII With Anticipation S. at Saratoga, has recovered from a fever that knocked him out of the GIII Bourbon S. last Sunday at Keeneland. **Lucky Chappy (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), made eligible for the Breeders' Cup program for \$130,000, rallied to finish third in the Bourbon ([video](#)) after a rough start. "For him to break like that, knowing that he was a frontrunner in all of his previous races, and to make up that much ground and finish full run, it impressed me enough that I am going to point him to the Breeders' Cup," said trainer Graham Motion.

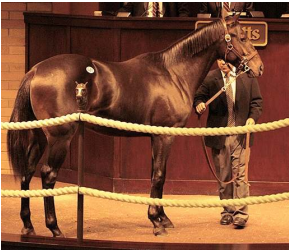

Out of Melody Fair (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), a half-sister to G3 Middleton S. winner Strawberry Dale (Ire) (Bering), the colt was bought as a foal for 75,000gns.

"We did think he would make around that money, as we thought he was the best horse selling today and should make a 2-year-old type. He's been bought for a new owner with Richard Hannon," said Doyle.

"Shamardal speaks for himself and he's out of a mare by Montjeu, who is becoming a decent broodmare sire. We bought Strong Suit from Pier House Stud, so they have been lucky vendors for us."

Shortly afterwards it was Peter Doyle's moment in the spotlight when he came out best in a two-way battle with agent Bobby O'Ryan. Standing alongside trainer Richard Fahey, he paid 200,000gns for a colt by Acclamation (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}) who is a half-brother to three winners. He was offered from Denis McDonnell's Parkway Farm.

"We are sorting out an owner for him, and if he's not a racehorse, then Richard [Hannon] will eat his hat," joked Doyle. "We've supported Acclamation since the early days, they are uncomplicated horses with a lovely attitude, but everyone else has caught on now."

HKJC Jumps In for a Pair...

Despite many unsuccessful attempts to buy in Book 1 last week, a team from the Hong Kong Jockey Club only managed to get one lot. But they had more luck yesterday with one six-figure purchase as the day began and another at the end. Former British jump jockey Mark Richards, assisted by trainer Nick Littmoden and agent Larry Stratton, now heads the Hong Kong Jockey Club buying team following the departure of Mark Player nine months ago. He struck early when paying 150,000gns for a Red Clubs (Ire) half-brother to G3 Palace House S. winner Dandy Man (Ire) (Mozart {Ire}) sold from Noel O'Callaghan's Mountarmstrong Stud.



Richards's second purchase was a 160,000gns Dubawi (Ire) colt out of listed-placed Salee (Ire) (Caerleon) offered from Lavington Stud.

"I've never been underbidder so many times as I was last week," said Richards. "These two will go to Nick Littmoden for 14 months before heading out to Hong Kong for the international sales. We will have two sales in 2012, one for predominantly Northern Hemisphere horses in December and the second catering for Southern Hemisphere-bred animals in March."

The Book 2 sale concludes today, with a session starting at 10 a.m., and Book 3 follows tomorrow.

John Fulton's **Chuck Berry (Arg)** (Grand Reward) will try to win the second leg of Argentina's Triple Crown Saturday when the Roberto Bullrich-trainee goes postward in the G1 Gran Premio Jockey Club going 2000 meters on the turf at San Isidro. Last month's G1 Polla de Potrillos hero will square off with treble Group 1 winner **Suggestive Boy (Arg)** (Easing Along), the number one-ranked sophomore colt on the grass. G2 Clasico Ensayo winner **Perversado (Arg)** (Thunder Gulch) looks like a chief rival for Chuck Berry and Suggestive Boy. A total of 15 colts will be part of one of the most important races on the Argentinian calendar, which carries purse money of more than \$130,000. The card also features the G1 Gran Premio San Isidro and the G1 Gran Premio Suipacha over 1000 meters.

BELO ACTEON ARRIVES FOR U.S. ASSAULT

Brazilian Group 1 winner **Belo Acteon (Brz)** (Acteon Man {Brz}) arrived in the United States on Sept. 5 for a North American campaign. He will be going to trainer Christophe Clement for the Gulfstream Park winter meet after completing his acclimation period at Stephens Thoroughbreds in Ocala, FL, according to international bloodstock agent Renato Gameiro, who will manage the 4-year-old colt's international campaign on behalf of owner-breeder Aluizio Merlin Ribeiro's Stud H&R. "We are looking to run two races in the United States, then the [G1] Dubai Sheema Classic and the [G1] King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. as we did with Brazilian champion Hard Buck (Brz), who was second in both races," Gameiro said. "If all goes according to plan, we will continue the sequence in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden culminating with Europe's prestigious G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe." **Cont. p8**



Trained in Brazil by Dulcino Guignoni, Belo Acteon won or placed in five of six starts on the turf in his native country and earned \$444,655. He won his final two starts in Brazil, including the G1 Grande Premio Brasil, Rio de Janeiro's premiere race at Gavea Racecourse on July 8.
