NOTHING SOUR ABOUT JESSAMINE WIN

Patently ridden by Alex Solis, Caroline Forgason's **Somali Lemonade** (Lemon Drop Kid) began passing horses on the final turn of Thursday's GIII Jessamine S. at Keeneland, wheeled out widest of all in upper stretch and powered her way past **Sweet Cat** (Kitten's Joy) for an authoritative win in the Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" event for the GII Juvenile Fillies Turf. It was the first try at two turns for the well-bred bay and the second exceedingly impressive performance in as many career starts. She turned in an eye-opening effort in her Sept. 11 debut racing seven panels over a good Belmont turf, coming from 10th place and bridging an 11-length deficit before scoring by a widening 1 3/4 lengths as a 10-1 chance. A bit flat-footed to start here, Somali Lemonade was immediately guided down to the fence and caboosed the field into the first turn and into the backstretch. She was still towards the tail of the field, but began to pick off horses--mostly under her own courage--and had reached a midfield position by the time they neared the stretch. Confidently steered out to the middle of the turf course, softened a bit by rain showers during the day, Somali Lemonade took aim on Sweet Cat leaving the eighth pole and sprinted by with relative ease. The duo pulled well clear of **Emerald Gold** (War Front), who was exiting a third in the GI Del Mar Debutante S. "She likes to take her time leaving the gate," Solis commented. "After that, just like the first time, I just let her do her thing. She's so professional behind all those horses. When we got to the half-mile pole, I called on her a little bit and she jumped in the bit right away and she was ready to do whatever I wanted. At the quarter pole, I got her out in the opening and she flew home." **Chart p2**

SEVEN TO TAKE ON FRANKEL

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) will face seven rivals in tomorrow's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot after Cityscape (GB) (Selkirk) and Rio de la Plata (Rahy) were the only withdrawals Thursday. Complete with his gallops lead horse and 3/4-brother **Bullet Train (GB)** (Sadler's Wells), Khalid Abdullah's colt's unbeaten record will be in the hands of Tom Queally. "The feeling is one of anticipation, and he goes in there with a marvelous chance again as he always does," said Queally. "He seems very well at home, and fingers crossed." Ian Mongan will have the task of towing the brilliant colt as far as he can on Bullet Train, while one who will be looking to spoil the party is Giuliano Manfredini, Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's **Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}). His trainer Marco Botti is not under any illusion as to the 3-year-old's task. "He looks in good order, but whether he is good enough to beat Frankel, who knows," the trainer said of the Sept. 11 G1 Prix du Moulin hero. "He has done really well and is much stronger, so we're hopeful." **Cont. p3**

Caroline Forgason may not be a name on the tip of your tongue, but she is well-related. Forgason's sister, Helen Alexander, is the owner and operator of Middlebrook Farm, and their mother, Helen K. Groves, was the name on the docket when Somali Lemonade's dam Chic Corine sold for \$380,000 as a yearling at Keeneland July in 1993. Another of Forgason's sisters, Emory Hamilton, purchased Somali Lemonade's third dam Too Chic for \$100,000 at the King Ranch dispersal at Keeneland in 1980 and bred very successfully from the mare, including Somali Lemonade's second dam, 1987 GI Ashland S. winner Chic Shirine and MGISW Queena (Mr. Prospector), who produced GISW Brahms. The Alexander sisters' grandfather was Robert J. Kleberg Jr., who operated King Ranch in Texas and bred and owned 1946 Triple Crown winner Assault and Middleground, winner of the 1950 Belmont S. Middlebrook Farm consigned Chic Corine, in foal to Broken Vow at the 2007 Keeneland November Sale, and it was Reynolds Bell who signed the ticket at \$240,000 under his R B T S banner. Forgason is the sister-in-law of trainer Michael Matz, who is married to another of Forgason's sisters, Dorothy.

Jockey Musical Chairs...

Jamie Spencer keeps the ride on Excelebration, while Richard Strauss's June 17 G1 Coronation S. and Aug. 15 G1 Prix Jacques le Marois heroine **Immortal Verse (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}) will be partnered by regular rider Gerald Mosse. Richard Hughes was to stick with G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua victor **Dick Turpin (Ire)** (Arakan), leaving Johnny Murtagh to ride Andrew Tinkler's dual Guineas runner-up and Aug. 27 G2 Celebration Mile winner **Dubawi Gold (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}). Last year's winner **Poet's Voice (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) has Frankie Dettori on board, while Jimmy Fortune is on Pearl Bloodstock's Aug. 11 G3 Sovereign S. scorer **Side Glance (GB)** (Passing Glance {GB}).

MOORE CALLED UP FOR THINK RIDE

So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) will be reunited with Ryan Moore in tomorrow's G1 Qipco Champion S. at Ascot, for which a dozen were declared yesterday. Having ridden the 5-year-old in the May 22 G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh and the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at the Royal meeting at this venue June 15, the recently recuperated rider replaces Seamie Heffernan. In another late twist, Ed Dunlop declared Cristina Patino's four-time Group 1 winner **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab), and Olivier Peslier will be on board. Third in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe ahead of her G1 Irish Champion S. conqueror So You Think 13 days ago, she has bounced out of that contest in top order. "Mrs Patino is a very sporting owner, and she is all for giving it a go," Dunlop explained. "The Champion was never really on the agenda, as everything was again focused on an autumn raid on Japan and Hong Kong, but we had to rewrite the script somewhat after her injury in Dubai. Consequently, she only got started properly in July, so is still a relatively fresh filly. Obviously, it is a concern that the race comes up only 13 days after the Arc, but she has taken her exertions in Paris better than we could have hoped, and she looked in great form when she worked up the Al Bahathri under Adrian McCarthy on Wednesday morning." **Cont. p4**

Snow Fairy's participation rests largely on the state of the ground at Ascot. "Who would have thought that we would get our ground on the third Saturday in October, but that looks like being the reality and, with the QEII Commemorative Cup in Japan five weeks away, it would be silly to let such a big prize pass us by," Dunlop added. "Snow Fairy has not won in Britain since she landed the Oaks at Epsom last year, and we are all very excited that she is playing at home with a big chance. Olivier Peslier rode Native Khan for us when finishing third in the Guineas and he is a top-class jockey, who rides Ascot particularly well. He did the job for us on Ouija Board in the Prince of Wales's S. and has a great record around the track, so all is set fair. We are under no illusions about the task Snow Fairy faces. So You Think has beaten us twice, but we took our revenge at Longchamp and, though there are plenty of others to worry about, such as Nathaniel, Twice Over and Midday, we are going there in optimistic mood." One notable who will miss out is Pride Racing Club's June 5 G1 Prix du Jockey Club winner **Reliable Man (GB)** (Dalakhani {Ire}). "We will not be going to Ascot with Reliable Man," trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre told *Racing Post*. "There is no rain forecast and the going is likely to be good-to-firm. I don't want to take the risk. Reliable Man will not run again this season, but remains in training at four."

A. U. MINER DQ'D FROM GREENWOOD CUP

A. U. The ruling could cost the 5-year-old an all-expenses-paid trip to the Marathon, but the conditioner indicated he would point his trainee to the race, no matter the outcome of an appeal, which is unlikely to be heard prior to Breeders' Cup weekend. The winner's share of the \$200,000 purse has been redistributed to Birdrun (Birdstone) and, under Breeders' Cup rules, the Preston colorbearer has been given the automatic berth in the Marathon.

EMIRATES PARK BUY HALF OF DREAM AHEAD

AHEAD Emirates Park Stud announced that they have purchased a 50% share in **Dream Ahead** (Diktat {GB}--Land of Dreams {GB}, by Cadeaux Genereux {GB}). While the five-time Group 1 winner is still under consideration for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile before concluding his racing career, he will stand the 2012 Southern Hemisphere season at the New South Wales-based operation. The deal was arranged with co-owners Ballylinch Stud following the 3-year-old's defeat of Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) in the G1 Prix de la Foret at Longchamp Oct. 2. That win was the latest in his series at the top level, alongside the Prix Morny, Middle Park S., July Cup and Haydock Sprint Cup. Emirates Park's CEO Trevor Lobb said, "He's a magnificent individual, standing 16.2 hands with an incredibly relaxed manner. I think anyone who saw the preliminaries for the Prix de la Foret would have noted what a wonderful temperament he possesses, and now I have seen it first-hand. It's been confirmed in the past few days that Timeform rated the performance 133lb. That compares more than favourably with any sprinter ever to stand in Australia. I've been looking for the most suitable new stallion to secure for Australia since joining Emirates Park, and Dream Ahead is just that horse. I'd started negotiating his purchase well before his Prix de la Foret victory, but that win only made us more determined to secure him. I'd long since felt that Dream Ahead was the perfect horse for us, because he was the perfect horse for Australia. He's a world-class sprinter with a magical outcross for our broodmare owners. He is an outstanding type with plenty of length and he is very sound--ideal for Australian conditions. What I personally like about Dream Ahead is that he never carried any gear. That's always the sign of a very exciting stallion prospect." Lobb added, "We have not decided on whether he will race again, but he really has nothing more to prove. He'll be the Cartier Sprinter of the Year, and people shouldn't forget that he was also equal top-rated 2-year-old of last season with none other than Frankel. Securing a horse of Dream Ahead's caliber signals the beginning of a new era at Emirates Park. His Excellency Nasser Lootah and his son Hussain are providing me with the backing to develop their existing concern into one of Australia's most commercial racing and breeding enterprises. Being given the go-ahead to secure such a magnificently credentialed young stallion with obvious appeal in both hemispheres is a clear indication of our intentions." Emirates Park nominations manager Bryan Carlson added, "Dream Ahead has some hugely impressive selling points that clearly establish his innate sprinting ability. For instance, his time in winning the Prix de la Foret was the fastest in the race's history. Also, his time when winning the Prix Morny was the race's second-fastest ever, and his Haydock Sprint Cup was won in the third-fastest time on record. Winning the Middle Park by nine lengths was also some feat."

HUGHES QUILTS OVER WHIP BAN Jockey Richard Hughes yesterday gave up his riding license after receiving a second whip ban in the space of four days at Kempton's evening meeting. Having been found guilty of hitting runner-up More Than Words (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) six times in the final furlong of the six-furlong maiden on the card, Hughes was handed a 15-day ban, which rules him out of the Breeders' Cup. The new sanctions were introduced on Monday, and Hughes was one of two jockeys to have fallen foul of them on the opening day. Leaving the track after the race, the rider declared on *Racing UK*, "Unfortunately, I've received another ban and, as of tonight, I've handed in my license until further notice. I've been trying to obey the rules, but they have set a trap for us by saying we can only hit five in the last furlong. I feel they are taking the art of race-riding away from me. I feel I can't do my owners justice. This is my own decision. I am not a whip jockey, and I hit the horses less than the amount I was allowed, but got a 15-day ban and will miss the Breeders' Cup. It's only a matter of time until the rest of the jockeys are done as well. I can't ride under these rules and, until they are resolved, I won't be riding anymore." The news came shortly after it was announced that the British Horseracing Authority are awaiting formal written submissions about the new penalty structure from the Professional Jockeys' Association. Paul Roy, Chairman of the BHA, said yesterday afternoon, "We remain clear and confident in the [whip] review and its findings, and are encouraged that the PJA is generally supportive of the principles behind the new rules and the need for compliance with them. However, they have raised certain concerns, particularly in relation to the penalty structure, and we expect to receive further formal written submissions from them shortly. We will therefore reconvene the Review Group working party, and they will begin to consider the PJA's submission as soon as possible after it is received."

Turallure Breezes Five Furlongs for Mile...

Four D Stable's **Turallure** (Wando), upset winner of the GI Ricoh Woodbine Mile in his most recent appearance Sept. 18, breezed five furlongs over the Keeneland turf course Thursday morning in 1:01.40 as he prepares for a start in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Nov. 5. Regular rider Julien Leparoux was aboard for the move. With the temporary rail up and the dogs out on the course, Turallure went in fractions of :12.40, :25 and :50 before galloping out three-quarters of a mile in 1:14.20. "That was all we wanted," said trainer Charlie Lopresti of the colt, who also took the GII Bernard Baruch H. in August. "I got his last eighth in 11 and change. I was glad to get a little cut in the ground this morning." The work was accomplished over a firm turf, but through intermittent rain showers.

Jeranimo Confirmed for Mile...

B. J. Wright's **Jeranimo** (Congaree), who registered a mild upset over Mr. Commons (Artie Schiller) in the GII Oak Tree Mile last Saturday, will make the trip to Churchill Downs for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Nov. 5, trainer Mike Pender told *Daily Racing Form*. "He's tearing the barn down," the conditioner told the publication. Despite the presence of the likes of three-time defending champion Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) and the tough American milers Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) and Courageous Cat (Storm Cat), Pender thinks his horse fits. "On his best day, our horse can run with those horses," he told *DRF*. Victorious in the GII Strub S. when it was contested over a synthetic surface in Feb. 2010, Jeranimo was winning for the first time since annexing the grassy GII San Gabriel S. last December.

BARRETT'S OCTOBER CLOSES WITH GAINS

The Barretts October Yearling Sale concluded Wednesday with gains in the major statistical categories. A total of 154 horses were reported as sold for gross receipts of \$2,599,700, a gain of 15% from 2010. The average of \$16,811 represented a 19.5% increase over the corresponding figure from last year, while the median of \$9,750 was ahead by 8.3%. "We had a very good sale," commented Kim Lloyd, the auction house's vice president of sales. "We were really pleased with the 2-day format, that seems to be doing really well. Overall we were real pleased, but at the same time, we thought we would do well. It was good for everyone involved. The breeders and consignors, they put a lot of hard work into it and it's great to see them rewarded." On a somewhat negative note, buybacks finished at 30.3%, always a concern to sales officials. "We always want to keep a low buyback rate, though many of those horses have been sold after the sale and they don't show up on the sheets," Lloyd explained. "All in all, it is a negative aspect of the sale, no doubt about it." Despite positive expectations going in, Lloyd was pleased to see the results build upon the year's previous yearling sales. "Momentum is important," he acknowledged. "We saw that Keeneland had a great sale and it seems like it's picking up a bit. Maybe we have found a bottom and it's starting to ease up a bit and that's really good to see. It's not going to skyrocket or anything like that, but something steady and dependable is very, very important right now." Wednesday's second and final session was topped by a California-bred daughter of Marino Marini--Kiss Me Not (Deputy Minister), who brought a final bid of \$70,000 from trainer Mike Machowsky as agent. A descendant of GISW Jeanne Jones, hip 204 was consigned by Havens Bloodstock Agency, agent.

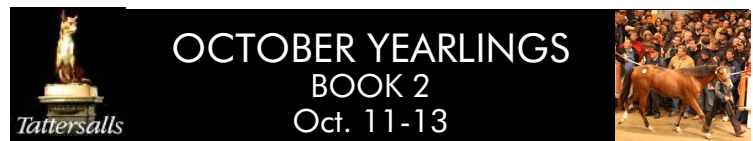

Tattersalls October cont.

With trading wrapped up just after 9 p.m., Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony commented: "Last week's extraordinary trade at Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale gave the bloodstock industry a much needed boost, and it has been wonderful to see the demand sustained throughout the three days of Book 2. The key indicators of average and median have both made significant gains, and the turnover is a new record for the sale despite a considerably smaller catalogue than last year. Competition at the top of the market has been particularly fierce, with a huge rise in the number of six-figure transactions, and an outstanding clearance rate from start to finish.

"Book 2 of the October Yearling Sale is a focal point for so many trainers and owners from throughout the world, and a clearance rate in excess of 85% demonstrates the strength and depth to this week's trade.

"The key factor, both in Books 1 and 2, has been the smaller catalogues. We catalogued a record number of yearlings last year and quite simply, in the prevailing economic climate, it was too many. The imbalance between supply and demand needed to be redressed, and reducing the numbers in Book 2 by almost 200 lots has played a crucial part in the success of this year's renewal. Fewer yearlings, combined with an emphasis on quality, have created real competition at all levels of the market, which bodes well for Friday's Book 3 of the October Yearling Sale and the rest of the Tattersalls sales season."

The top price over the three days of Book 2 came yesterday at lunchtime when the Hong Jockey Club team headed by Mark Richards saw off Charlie Gordon-Watson at 260,000gns for lot 1156, an Exceed And Excel (Aus). Out of Temple Of Thebes (Ire) (Bahri), the bay colt was bred by Anthony and Victoria Pakenham and consigned from Lofts Hall Stud. Richards was assisted by agent Larry Stratton and trainer Nick Littmoden. "He was the one I said to the people in Hong Kong that I thought we should really have, and was a bit of a no brainer for us," Richards remarked. "I hope he'll be the finished article in another year's time when he will be offered for sale in Hong Kong. He's from a family that has shown speed; Exceed And Excel works in both hemispheres, and he's done well in Hong Kong." Temple Of Thebes had been bought carrying the colt by the Pakenhams--best known as owners of G1 Derby hero Sir Percy (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire})--for 80,000gns at the 2009 Tattersalls December Sale.

George and Jackie Smith, who sold an Oasis Dream (GB) colt for 700,000gns to Coolmore in Book 1 of the October Yearling Sale, reinvested some of their windfall through agent John Warren. The couple spent 230,000gns through agent John Warren on an Acclamation (GB) colt consigned from Rathbarry Stud. Gordon-Watson was again underbidder. "Mr. and Mrs. Smith asked me to find them some nice yearlings, and we missed out on a number of good horses last week," said Warren. "This colt this was my pick of this week's sale and was an exceptional individual." The Smiths also purchased three yearlings from Book 1.

It has been a remarkable sale for the Rathbarry Stud stallion Acclamation, who had another standout yesterday in a pinhooked colt out of With Colour (GB) (Rainbow Quest), a granddaughter of GI Hollywood Oaks and GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Fran's Valentine. A 35,000gns foal, he became a 165,000gns yearling when David Redvers saw off Angie Loder for the March-born youngster. Offered by Rathbarry, the colt was bought for Qatar-based Sheikh Fahad Al Thani's Pearl Bloodstock and looks set to join top two-year-old Harbour Watch (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}), in whom the owner now has a share, with trainer Richard Hannon. "He was the most athletic Acclamation I've seen all year, and certainly the lightest on his feet," said Redvers. "We haven't made a final decision on a trainer, but I suspect he could follow the Harbour Watch route."

Charlie Gordon-Watson fought off the likes of trainer Ed Dunlop and agents Cormac McCormack and Peter Doyle to get lot 1124, a full-brother to this year's G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. heroine La Collina (Ire) (Strategic Prince {GB}), for 150,000gns. The bay colt offered from the Barry family's County Limerick-based Manister House Stud. "He is out of a Galileo (Ire) mare [Starfish {Ire}], and I think he has a great start as a broodmare sire, and this was just a thoroughly nice horse," said Gordon-Watson. "I've bought him for a longstanding client, and there is a choice of two trainers he could go to."

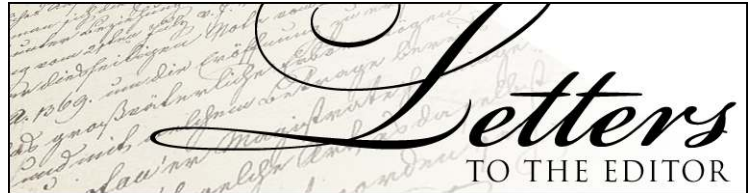

AN INDUSTRY OBLIGATION--NOT CHARITY

Having served for 20 years as president of Thoroughbred Charities of America ("TCA"), it has been obvious to me that one of our major industry problems is the funding for care of our racehorses at the end of their racing career. TCA has worked very hard to establish a productive funding mechanism as well as careful accreditation of grantees for a workable and affordable aftercare program. For many years, TCA has conducted a stallion season auction which has raised and distributed almost \$20,000,000 to more than 200 rescue groups in 38 states. This certainly has helped but is obviously a pittance compared to the amount needed by the many well-meaning volunteers.

In donating seasons to the TCA Stallion Season auction, many stallion farms have been, and continue to be, very generous, while others have chosen not to participate in this philanthropic effort. Such is the way with all volunteer funding initiatives. My suggestion is that Breeders' Cup level the burden by adding a small amount to every Stallion nomination fee which should be used for the aftercare of our racehorses. Credit could be given for those stallions included in the TCA Stallion Season auction. This would distribute the burden equitably in addition to raising more funds.

The Jockey Club should be commended for instituting the voluntary foal check off fee. The Jockey Club also deserves our gratitude for adding to the voluntary check off \$200,000 per year as a direct donation. The problem is that our industry breeders are not stepping up and doing their share. The amount checked off by the breeders was \$52,000 in 2009 and \$43,000 in 2010. In 2009, there were 32,606 foals registered and in 2010 we had 30,669 registered foals. This means that the average contribution was \$1.59 per foal in 2009 and \$1.40 per foal in 2010. If we assessed a fee of \$100 per foal, assuming a foal crop of 30,000, we would have \$3,000,000 in 2009 and another \$3,000,000 in 2010. Is it too much to ask breeders to pay \$100 for a "Social Security" program for the horses they have brought into this world?

Then, of course, there are owners who do not breed but rather purchase horses at the sales. Last year, about \$652 million dollars passed through the sales companies Keeneland, Fasig-Tipton, OBS and Barretts for the purchase and sale of yearlings and foals. To their credit, Fasig Tipton does have a voluntary check off for the Blue Horse Charity program. If we assessed an average ¼% tax on all purchasers, another \$1,630,000 would be raised. If we assume the sale of a yearling for \$100,000, the assessment would be \$250--again, a relatively small amount for what it would accomplish. If the sales companies would contribute a small percentage to match the purchasers, the total could easily be more than \$3,000,000.

Some racetracks are already supporting an aftercare program in various ways. If all tracks initiated some program to raise funds and the veterinarians, farriers, jockeys, and trainers participated in some manner, we will have gone a long way in solving a major problem. If we do nothing, I guarantee we will be fighting this uphill battle and public relations nightmare for a very long time. We will also be inviting government intervention.

The point I'm trying to make is pretty obvious. Charity and voluntary contributions alone will not cure a very difficult problem our industry has to deal with viz. proper care for our Thoroughbreds once their racing career is over. Just think, where would our Social Security program be if it depended upon charity and voluntary contributions?

The answer is very clear---we must have a mandatory funding program. This funding program must include *all participants* in our industry including owners, breeders, sales companies, consignors, trainers, jockeys, vets, racetracks etc... Equally important, a responsible, existing (we certainly do not need another *new* group) and proven organization must administer the program.

Simply, we all know that funding for proper care of our retired athletes is a major problem in our industry and we also know what it takes to fix it. This is not only the right course of action for the horse but it certainly would enhance the public's perception of our industry. Finally, it might even prevent the government from stepping in with regulations to address the aftercare problem. Is there a strong enough will to address it? In my opinion, anything less is irresponsible and unacceptable.
