## DARLEY TO STAND STALLIONS IN CHINA

*(Edited press release)* In support of the Chinese Thoroughbred industry, two well-bred, high-performing racehorses owned and raced by Sheikh Mohammed will begin their stud careers in China in 2012.

in 2012. **Jalil** (Storm Cat--Tranquility Lake, by Rahy), who cost \$9.7 million as a yearling and who went on to win the G2 Maktoum Challenge in Dubai for Godolphin, will stand at Lisui Farm in Beijing, while the Australian Group 1 winner **Sousa (NZ)** (Galileo {Ire}--Liberty Song {Ire}, by Last Tycoon {Ire}), who took the G1 Spring Champion S. by six lengths, will stand at Ordos Farm in Inner Mongolia.

The stallions will be managed by Junling Sun, a graduate of the Darley Flying Start program. John Ferguson--Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock advisor--said, "Sheikh Mohammed is eager to support the emergence of the Chinese Thoroughbred industry, and is particularly pleased he can contribute to the development of the Chinese racehorse. Sheikh Mohammed has selected these two stallions, as they are both exceptional physical specimens, each boast stellar Classic bloodlines, and both performed with great credit at the highest level."

## BHA, PJA HOLD WHIP TALKS

British Horseracing Authority officials yesterday met with representatives of the Professional Jockeys' Association as the ongoing whip rule furor forced back the BHA's scheduled board meeting. A planned strike action at Monday's Windsor and Pontefract meets was averted when BHA officials offered to discuss submissions made by the PJA. Those in attendance for the 90-minute meeting included trainer John Gosden and riders Frankie Dettori, Richard Hughes, Tony McCoy and Ryan Moore. Jockeys initially welcomed the new rules, which include a five-hit maximum inside the final furlong, but have altered their stance once the reality of bans and withheld fees hit home. "We put our point across and we'll see what they say," PJA chief executive and former champion jockey Kevin Darley told *Racing Post*. "If the response isn't favourable, we'll consider our position. They listened to all the points that we made. It was very useful for the PJA to have senior jockeys present because they were able to paint various different racing scenarios to the board members." **Cont. p2**

## DUTROW RECEIVES 30-DAY STAY

Judge Richard Giardino has granted trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. a 30-day stay of the judgement handed down by the New York State Racing and Wagering board last week. The decision followed a 30-minute hearing in Schenectady County Supreme Court Monday morning. In a unanimous decision Oct. 12, the three-member NYSRWB voted to revoke Dutrow's trainer's license, effective Oct. 18. He was also banned from the grounds of all tracks in the state, fined a total of \$50,000 for two incidents at Aqueduct Racetrack in November 2010, and barred from reapplying for a license until 2021. The stay permits Dutrow to continue to operate his business while his attorneys prepare and file papers for the appeal. If the appeal is accepted, his attorneys will ask for another stay while the case moves through the legal system. Dutrow did not attend the hearing. Assistant Attorney General Adrienne J. Kerwin, representing New York State, argued against the stay. The New York Racing Association issued a response to inquiries about Dutrow receiving the stay, saying, "This matter is pending before the court. When the court makes its determination, NYRA will abide by that decision."

**DUTROW ATTORNEY OUTLINES CASE** Saying that the 10-year license revocation amounted to “a death penalty” for the 52-year-old trainer's business, Dutrow's attorney, Michael L. Koenig, specifically requested a 30-day stay rather than the normal 120-day window to file an appeal. Koenig said that he will argue in his appeal that the sentence was unfair and that there was a conflict of interest involving NYSRWB Chairman John Sabini that prevented Dutrow from receiving due process.

According to Koenig, the conflict of interest stems from communication between Edward Martin, president of the Racing Commissioners International and a former executive director of the NYSRWB, and Sabini, the chairman of the New York board and an RCI officer. Martin wrote to Sabini, requesting that New York regulators consider revoking Dutrow's license. Koenig contends that, as the result of Martin's request, there was a conflict of interest that prevented Dutrow from being treated fairly. “Because that happened at the beginning, it infected this proceeding from the very beginning,” Koenig said. “The minute the RCI sends a letter to Chairman Sabini, the minute one board sends a letter to his other board, you have an infection of the entire process from the get-go. We believe that is significant. We believe it is a violation of due process, and we believe the courts are going to find that.”

Koenig also said that the penalties that Dutrow received were “grossly disproportionate” to the violations at Aqueduct, and that his past should not have come into play and used as a reason to revoke his license.

“He was originally suspended for 30 days and 60 days with the underlying charges,” Koenig said. “It is only when he decided to appeal those suspensions that they brought the order to show cause seeking to revoke his license. I think it is patently unfair. We have argued that below and we're going to argue it again.”

Giardino remarked that a stay would not undermine the integrity of the regulatory system, but cautioned Koenig, “not to use it as a delaying tactic to get to the next racing season.”

Koenig assured the judge that the appeal would be filed on time, adding, “We're very satisfied with the judge's decision. We are satisfied that we received 30 days, because Rick Dutrow is not looking to delay a resolution of this case. We are ready to move forward. We just want to make sure that we have a fair and meaningful opportunity to do so. That's why we were very comfortable saying that we can do this within 30 days. We're comfortable with the case, we're comfortable with the facts and we are looking forward to bringing this to the courts.”

**WHIP CONTROVERSY cont.** The BHA later issued a statement which read, “Throughout the process of amending the rules on use of the whip and associated penalties, the BHA has worked closely with representatives of the PJA and we are encouraged that they recognise our commitment to thorough consultation. We will not be suspending the current rules pending these discussions, but we do commit to resolving this matter as quickly as possible while ensuring that due process is followed. In light of the positive dialogue taking place between the BHA and the PJA, we urge everyone involved in racing to engage with this process and to work with us to take the sport forward with no disruption to the racing programme.”

However, there were further suspensions later in the day. Joe Fanning was the latest senior jockey to fall foul of the new rules and incurred a five-day ban [from Oct. 31 to Nov. 4] for hitting his mount Dubious Escapade (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) one over the permitted amount at Pontefract. “I misjudged it as I thought the first crack I gave him was outside the furlong pole,” Fanning admitted to the trade daily. “I'd used my quota, so put my stick down near the line. It's only the third time I've been banned for the whip in 21 years riding in Britain.” Fellow rider Kieren Fox, who was banned for 15 days at Salisbury on the day the new regulations were introduced, was in trouble for a second yesterday, getting an additional 10 days from Windsor's stewards.

Ballydoyle's G2 Royal Lodge S. hero **Daddy Long Legs** (Scat Daddy), heads a cast of nine for Saturday's G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster following yesterday's supplementary stage for the £200,000 contest. Trainer Aidan O'Brien currently has four engaged for Britain's final Group 1 race of the season and his team also includes **Camelot (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}), a 525,000gns TATOCT yearling and an impressive debut winner at Leopardstown in July, and fellow maiden scorers **Learn (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Tibet (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}). **Sassy Image Injured, Out of BC...**

MGISW **Sassy Image** (Broken Vow) will be forced to skip the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint after exiting a workout with a chip in a hind ankle. The 4-year-old was the 7-5 favorite in her latest start, the GI Ballerina S. at Saratoga, but bolted on the far turn and trailed the field home. She emerged from the race with a badly grabbed front quarter. Back on the work tab Oct. 8, she went a half in :48.60 at Churchill Downs, but came out of the breeze with the injury. "She's a filly that has always moved perfectly and the next morning, when we saw that she was a little off, we knew that something was wrong," said trainer Dale Romans, who conditions the filly for his brother Jerry. Sassy Image had won three in a row prior to the Ballerina, taking the May 7 GI Humana Distaff S., May 30 GIII Winning Colors S. and July 9 GI Princess Rooney S. Overall, she has compiled a record of 15-7-2-1 and earnings of \$809,931. She is catalogued for the Nov. 6 Fasig-Tipton November Sale as [hip 17](#). "If the new owners wanted to remove the chip, then she could probably come back next year," Romans said.

after splits of :12.60, :24.80, :37 and :49.60. She galloped out six panels in 1:16. "I'm very pleased with her breeze," Asmussen said. "We're obviously extremely impressed with her talent and how she's going. We have a pretty good comfort level with the Breeders' Cup running here. She didn't start here, but she spent a lot of time here in the

spring. She's comfortable with the surroundings." My Miss Aurelia exits a win in the GI Frizette S. Also sent five furlongs Monday were GI BC Dirt Mile candidate **Tapizar** (Tapit), who went in 1:02.80 in company with BC Juvenile Sprint hopeful **Seeker** (Hard Spun); and BC Dirt Mile contender **Wilburn** (Bernardini), who was clocked in 1:02.40. Targeting the GI BC Juvenile, **Sabercat** (Bluegrass Cat) went in 1:02.40 and **She Digs Me** (Henny Hughes) got the distance in 1:02.60. "We're very pleased with the physical condition that we're in right now," Asmussen said, adding, "We surely want a couple of more weeks of that."

### BC, CDI and KHRC Announce Enhanced Communications Protocol... *(Edited press release)*

Several new policies will be in effect at this year's Breeders' Cup World Championships at Churchill Downs Nov. 4-5 to ensure seamless communications between Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) personnel, stewards, members of the veterinary teams, race participants and Breeders' Cup and Churchill Downs racing officials. The new policies are an outgrowth of meetings among representatives of Breeders' Cup, Churchill Downs and the KHRC after the 2010 Breeders' Cup World Championships at Churchill Downs when circumstances involving the pre-race conduct of racing officials and a televised interview with jockey John Velazquez, who rode Life at Ten in a last-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic, resulted in a KHRC investigation, the final determinations of which are still pending.

"The circumstances of last year's Ladies' Classic were unprecedented and initiated us to work with the KHRC and our hosts at Churchill Downs to take steps needed to make sure all individuals of the on-track safety team have access to the same information in real time," said Breeders' Cup President and CEO Craig Favel. "Together with the KHRC, we will also be working with the Guild and meeting with the jockeys to make sure they understand their responsibilities and that the commission veterinarians and the stewards are the final arbiters for deciding whether to scratch a horse."

The new measures include: the establishment of a communications command center at Churchill Downs; designation of one of the three stewards to be in the paddock during saddling for each race; the institution of easily identifiable uniforms with the words "VET TEAM" in large block letters for both the KHRC and Breeders' Cup veterinarian team members; inclusion of stewards and representatives of the Jockeys' Guild in a pre-event television production meeting; and advance meetings with the Jockeys' Guild regarding on-track veterinary team and pre-race communications protocols. **Cont. p5**

Back in June, just weeks after the death of Sadler's Wells, I commented in the British magazine *Thoroughbred Owner & Breeder* on the huge impact that his sons Galileo and Montjeu have exerted on the European Classics of recent years. In attempting to compare the two, I wrote:

"One area in which Montjeu is undoubtedly outshone by Galileo is his record as a sire of fillies. Although Montjeu has more than 30 black-type daughters in the Northern Hemisphere, including 17 stakes winners, only one of them--Montare--has scored at the highest level. Only six of them--Montare, Maria Royal, Miss Keller, Mont Etoile, Clowance and Albisola--have become group winners..."

"That said, you ignore Montjeu's daughters at your peril. The G3 Prix de Royaumont, on the day after the Derby, featured three daughters of Montjeu among the 10 runners. One of them--Jehannedarc--proved very difficult to load into the stalls, demonstrating that temperament is the most likely explanation for the discrepancy between the achievements of Montjeu's sons and daughters."

I'm pleased to say that the ink was barely dry on those words before Montjeu's daughters started a consistent run of success. June saw Campanillas fail by only a neck to snatch victory in the G2 Prix de Malleret, July provided Pink Symphony with her first Group 3 success in the Give Thanks S. and August saw Sarah Lynx gain her first group win in the G2 Prix de Pomone.

Then, during a very profitable September, Pacifique gained a second stakes success of the year in the G3 Prix de Lutece, Bernieres won the Prix des Tourelles and Gradara took the Prix Panacee. **Cont. p8**

This month has developed into a purple patch for the 15-year-old stallion. His magnificently bred juvenile daughter Wading established herself as a leading contender for next year's fillies' Classics when she took the G2 Rockfel S.

Then, eight days later, the action at Woodbine was dominated by the Grade I victories of his daughters

Miss Keller in the E.P. Taylor S. and Sarah Lynx in the Canadian International.

Another of Montjeu's daughters who made her mark this month was Halla Siamsa. Although a winner of nothing grander than a maiden race at Fairyhouse, her first foal is Parish Hall, winner of the G1 Dewhurst S. Three other Montjeu broodmares have also

been represented by juvenile stakes winners this fall, one of the others being the speedy filly Restiadargent, winner of the G3 Prix d'Arenberg over 5 1/2 furlongs.

This run of success means that Montjeu now has 23 stakes-winning daughters in the Northern Hemisphere, with his 10 group/graded-winning daughters now being headed by three Group 1 winners. His total of black-type daughters is now heading for 40. In addition, he also has Group 1 and Group 2 winners among his daughters conceived in New Zealand.

It is interesting to recall that there was a time when Sadler's Wells's daughters appeared to be considerably less successful than his sons. No fewer than 20 of the colts in his first four crops became group winners, with as many as 12 scoring at the highest level. Remarkably, only two fillies from these first four crops became group winners and only one scored at the top level. However, that top-level winner was the tremendously talented Salsabil, who completed the 1000 Guineas and Oaks double prior to defeating the colts in the Irish Derby.

# Sixth Debut Winner for Champion Miler HAT TRICK

Subsequent crops by Sadler's Wells were to increase his tally of Epsom Oaks winners to five, and he also sired three consecutive winners of the Irish 1000 Guineas, plus three winners of the Irish Oaks. And if any doubts remained about the worth of Sadler's Wells's daughters, they have surely been answered by their achievement of providing Sadler's Wells with six consecutive broodmare sire championships.

The question is how do we explain such a remarkable change of fortune? Perhaps, with Sadler's Wells, the explanation was no more complicated than it took breeders a little while to establish the type of mare that best suited the great stallion. And maybe it also took trainers a little while to work out the dos and don'ts of maximizing their potential.

With Montjeu, I suspect the issue has been more complicated. Montjeu was a high-mettled individual, as was his broodmare sire Top Ville, and it wasn't long before there were reports that Montjeu's fillies could be difficult to manage and often need careful handling.

I suspect it is no coincidence that Montjeu's three Group 1-winning fillies all gained their Group 1 victories after the age of three--Montjeu's dam Floripedes didn't race at two, didn't break her maiden until August of her 3-year-old season and didn't become a group winner until Oct. 1. Montjeu's first female Group 1 winner, Montare, was four when she won the 2006 Prix Royal-Oak. The second, Miss Keller, was four before she became a graded winner and five when she won the E.P. Taylor S., a year after finishing a good second in the same race. And Montjeu's third Group 1-winning daughter, Sarah Lynx, didn't become a stakes winner until August of her 4-year-old campaign, when she took the G2 Prix de Pomone.

The dates of the first group victories by Montjeu's other daughters stands at Oct. 23 of Clowance's 5-year-old campaign; July 31 of Pink Symphony's 4-year-old season; Oct. 27 of Albisola's 3-year-old season; Oct. 2 for the 3-year-old Maria Royal; and Sept. 4 of Pacifique's 3-year-old year.

In other words, the distinction of being the earliest group-winning daughter of Montjeu belonged to Mont Etoile, winner of the G2 Ribblesdale S. on June 22 as a 3-year-old, until Wading took the Rockfel S. earlier this month.

This suggests two thoughts. The first is that Wading, with the benefit of having a dam by the precocious Green Desert, could be exceptional. The second is that Montjeu's daughters are definitely slower to find their feet than their male counterparts, but it is equally clear that they are capable of rewarding their connections' patience and understanding.

Now that the European program for older fillies is so much better than it used to be, I suspect that we will be seeing more and more daughters of Montjeu staying in training beyond the age of three. We can therefore expect Montjeu's record as a sire of fillies to continue to improve.

After Galileo's exploits this year with Danehill mares, I expect that most of Danehill's top daughters will be heading in his direction in 2012. Spare a thought, though, for Montjeu. Sarah Lynx is out of Danehill's group-winning daughter Steel Princess, and his G3 winner Albisola is out of another Danehill mare. He now has five black-type performers among his first 41 foals. Add in the fact that Wading is out of another granddaughter of Danzig, and Montjeu's record with Danzig-line mares is also improving.

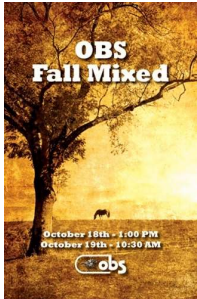

Consigned by Ecurie des Monceaux, [hip 39](#) is a half-brother to the listed-placed Garden City (Fr) (Majorien {GB}), from the extended family of Deep Impact (Jpn). Later, the Broadhurst Agency was on hand to pay €200,000 for the pick of the Haras d'Etream draft.
