BREEDERS' CUP BULLETIN

No Breeders' Cup for Zazu

Mr. and Mrs. Jerome Moss's **Zazu** (Tapit), last seen recording an impressive last-to-first win in the GI Lady's Secret S. at Santa Anita Oct. 1, will miss a tilt at the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic with inflammation in a shoulder, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Trained by John Sadler, the gray worked four furlongs in :46 2/5 at Santa Anita Oct. 16. "We're going to bypass the Ladies' Classic," Sadler told DRF. "She came out of her work a little off. We put her

in the nuclear scan, and it revealed a little inflammation. The timing is lousy, but the prognosis for next year is 100%." Sadler added that the GI Las Virgenes S. victress will be given 90 days off. "It looked like she had a big shot," Sadler concluded. "We're disappointed."

Red Duke out of Breeders' Cup

Trainer John Quinn yesterday ruled out a long-planned tilt at the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf with **Red Duke** (Hard Spun). Maxilead Ltd's July 9 G2 Superlative S. winner and Sept. 10 G2 Champagne S. runner-up had beaten only one home in the G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket 12 days ago, and the signs are that he is not ready for a trip to Churchill Downs. "Red Duke has started to show all the signs of a horse who is feeling the effects of a long year," Quinn explained. "He has been very quiet since running slightly below-par at Newmarket, where we didn't feel he ran to his best for one reason or another. It would be unfair of me to take the colt and his owners half way around the world to run when I feel he may not be up to performing to his best. It is for this reason I've decided it best to rest him now for the winter and look towards a 3-year-old campaign in the UK and abroad. I'm sure he will come back as good as ever and repay our faith in him."

JOCKEYS' WHIP STRIKE STILL POSSIBLE

Strike action by jockeys remains a possibility as the severity of punishments for breaking the recently introduced whip guidelines became the focus of their cause, according to a statement released by the Professional Jockeys' Association yesterday. The flames were fanned further with the PJA claiming senior jockeys Frankie Dettori and Tony McCoy would not have given their endorsement had they known the full implications of the regulations. The British Horseracing Authority, who consulted various institutions that included jockeys' representatives before introducing the new rules, is set to make another announcement on the matter Friday. Riders are permitted to strike their mounts a maximum five times inside the final furlong--and a maximum seven all told--during a flat race and face a sliding scale of deterrents. "There are concerns within horseracing that many jockeys will independently decide not to take part in some racing fixtures next week in protest at the new rules," according to PJA chief executive Kevin Darley. "In hindsight, we would like to have given more thought and consideration to the new rules before commenting. We didn't give them properly informed approval, and we really do wish the BHA would stop saying that we did. There is now a process of proper consultation and discussion involving jockeys which should have happened before the original announcement by the BHA last month."

Kevin Darley continued, Had we been properly consulted over some of the important details that relate directly to jockeys prior to that announcement, we feel that we would not be in the position we are today. Jockeys have no issues with the restricted amount of times they can use the whip under the new rules. The careers of jockeys are short by definition, and the implications of financial penalties and long suspensions are savagely disproportionate.”

Giant Ryan Works for Sprint

Shivananda Parbhoo's **Giant Ryan** (Freud), currently riding a six-race winning streak, including the

GI Vosburgh Invitational S. at Belmont Park Oct. 1, tuned up for the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint with a three-furlong move in :39.20 at Churchill Downs Wednesday. With exercise rider Sabastian Garcia in the irons, Giant Ryan caught his first eighth of a mile in :12.60 and galloped out a half mile in :53.60. The breeze was contested over a “wet fast” surface following the break. “I just wanted


him to get used to the track, and I told the rider to really slow him down and not go too fast,” Parbhoo said. “The next work next week is more important. He'll go a half-mile and gallop out a strong five-eighths.”

'Chamberlain' Ready to Defend Title

Carl R. Moore Management LLC's **Chamberlain Bridge** (War Chant), hero of last year's GII Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint at Churchill Downs, worked a five-furlong bullet in :59 beneath the Twin Spires yesterday. Jockey Jamie Theriot was aboard for the move, timed in fractions of :11.80, :23.40, :35.40, :47 and out six furlongs in 1:13.80. The 7-year-old heads to the Breeders' Cup following a close third-place finish in the GIII Turf Monster H. at Parx Sept. 5. “You can't do any better than that,” Theriot commented. “I think he has a big, big chance.” Theriot continued, “The [prospective] field doesn't look as a deep as last year. There were some tough horses in there last year.”

Overseas Runner for Team Valor in Marathon

Team Valor International's **Brigantin** (Cozzene), last seen dead-heating for third in the 2 1/2-mile G1 Qatar Prix du Cadran at Longchamp Oct. 2, is being pointed toward the GII Breeders' Cup Marathon at Churchill Downs Nov. 5. The G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier victor, trained by Andre Fabre, will be piloted by Julien Leparoux. “This is Andre's idea,” said Team Valor CEO Barry Irwin, who bred the colt in partnership with Mrs. Elisabeth Fabre and Craig Bendoroff's Denali Stud. “He thinks the colt will be able to act on dirt and we know the trip will prove no problem.”

Ask the Moon Works for Ladies' Classic


Myron Miller's **Ask the Moon** (Malibu Moon) geared up for the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic with a four-furlong workout in :48 over the Keeneland Polytrack Wednesday. The GI Ruffian Invitational H. and GI Personal Ensign Invitational S. heroine heads to the Championships off a disappointing sixth in Santa Anita's GI Lady's Secret S. Oct. 1. The 6-year-old was acquired by Miller via a \$75,000 claim at Belmont in June; she was previously campaigned by owner Johnsen Millicent and trainer Edward Allard. "She was bucking and playing and really feeling good," said Heather Irion, trainer Marty Wolfson's Keeneland assistant, who was aboard for yesterday's move. "She did really well."

In related news, Miller, who along with his father Robert own Farnsworth Farms, privately purchased GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie S. third-place finisher **Ann of the Dance** (English Channel) following a ninth-place finish in the GI Darley Alcibiades S. at Keeneland Oct. 7. The bay, formerly campaigned by owner William D. Cox and conditioner James DiVito, is being pointed at the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. She is also currently with Wolfson's Keeneland string.

"She's doing extremely well," Irion continued. "She is just doing everything perfect. Marty is very excited to get her onto the turf because [she is by turf champion] English Channel and her mother [Dans La Ville {Chi}] is a Grade 2 winner on turf. That's exactly why he bought her. He feels she's going to improve a lot on the turf."

Time Off for Awesome Gem

West Point Thoroughbreds' **Awesome Gem** (Awesome Again), who had been under consideration for a fifth straight Breeders' Cup appearance, exited his second-place finish in the GI Goodwood S. Oct. 8 with a "minor issue" and will get some time off. "We see no reason to push to make the Breeders' Cup if he is not 100%," Terry Finley said on www.westpointtb.com. "It's something that should be a non-issue with some time on the farm. I think there's a very good possibility we bring this horse back next year as a 9-year-old. He loves his job and has a strong desire to compete. He's in that in-between spot where he's probably not good enough to compete against the horses in the Breeders' Cup Classic, but his optimum distance is a little further than mile, so we're not keen to go to the other races like the Dirt Mile or the Marathon." Winner of the 2010 GI Hollywood Gold Cup, the 8-year-old chestnut captured the GIII Longacres Mile at Emerald Downs prior to the Goodwood. "Awesome Gem's earned a break this season," said trainer Craig Dollase. "He's a game old contender who continues to live a healthy and happy life thanks to judicious placement, and we want to do the right thing by him. He came out of his last race with a very minor hind end issue that just needs some time on the farm to resolve." Awesome Gem, who has bankrolled over \$2.7 million, is expected to be off for 60-90 days.

88 Group 1 Winners Entered for Hong Kong Races...

A record 88 Group 1 winners have been nominated to the four races that comprise the 2011 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong International Races, to be held at Sha Tin Dec. 11. The entry list features a total of 311 nominations, the highest number since 2007. Nearly 80 percent of the entries are of group status-- also a record number. "The worldwide response to this year's Cathay Pacific Hong Kong International meeting exceeds all expectations and once again illustrates the tremendous interest in what is clearly one of the world's great race days," said Hong Kong Jockey Club Executive Director of Racing William A. Nader. "This race meeting has earned its title as the 'Turf World Championships' and promises the very best that our sport has to offer."

Standout performers in the lists include such international champions as G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner **Danedream (Ger)** (Lomitas{GB}); G1 Qipco British Champion S. winner **Cirrus Des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}); G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 Qipco British Champions Fillies' and Mares' Stakes winner **Dancing Rain (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}); G1 Dubai World Cup winner **Victoire Pisa (Jpn)** (Neo Universe {Jpn}); G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen and G1 KrisFlyer International Sprint winner **Rocket Man (Aus)** (Viscount {Aus}), and dual G1 Oaks, G1 Queen Elizabeth II Commemorative Cup and G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Cup winner **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab). The four races that make up the International card are the HK\$20 million G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Cup (2000mT); the HK\$20 million G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Mile (1600mT); the HK\$14 million G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Vase (2400mT); and the HK\$14 million G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Sprint (1200mT). 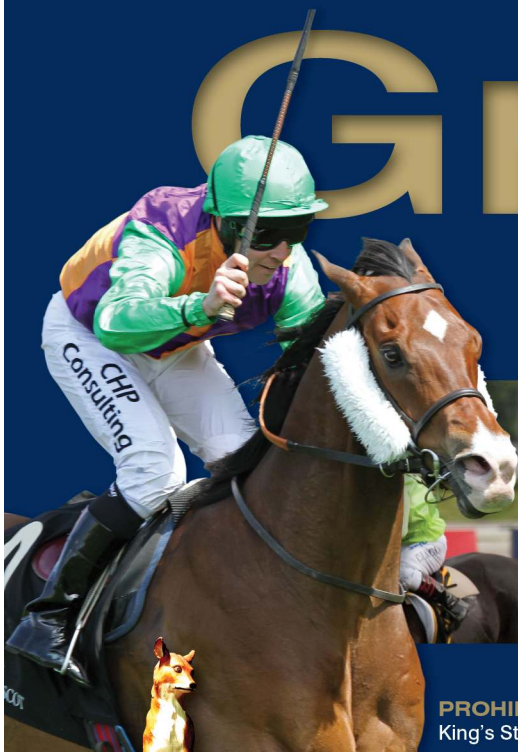

Moss homebred **Sister Moon** (Dixie Union), who established a new track record for 5 1/2 furlongs when scoring by 9 3/4 lengths in her Del Mar unveiling Aug. 21 ([video](#)), makes her much anticipated return to the races versus five rivals in Saturday's \$65,000 Anoakia S. at Santa Anita. The ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆, trained by John Sadler, covered the distance in 1:02.70. "She's been working good," jockey Joel

Rosario said. "We'll see how much better she gets when she runs. She has a lot of talent; she's classy. When you ask her to go, she'll do whatever you ask her to, and that's most important. There's no need to rush her into longer races right now. The race at Del Mar was her first and we didn't know what we had, but it turns out it was real impressive." Sister Moon, a \$57,000 RNA at the OBSAPR sale earlier this year, worked a bullet six furlongs in 1:11.60 at Santa Anita Oct. 15.

THE RACING POST TROPHY- A Brief History

By Tom Frary

Introduced as the Timeform Gold Cup in 1961 by the mastermind behind that famous Halifax firm Phil Bull, this mile contest staged on Doncaster's Town Moor became known as the Futurity until taking on its now familiar name as the Racing Post Trophy in 1989. Brought in to cater for the high-class juveniles bred to appreciate more of a stamina test than was in evidence at the time, it is fair to say it was greeted with a deal of scepticism and controversy. By far the most valuable 2-year-old event ever staged in Europe with a winner's prize of £22,000, the organisers were taking on the traditional stance that the merit of this generation was best tested at six furlongs. In its inaugural year, the fifth-most valuable race run in Britain answered the critics by playing host to the following season's Epsom Derby and St Leger heroes Larkspur (GB) and Hethersett (GB), who managed only fifth and sixth placings, respectively. The next year, it was won by the Paddy Prendergast-trained Noblesse (GB), who was the brilliant Epsom Oaks heroine of 1963, while Ribocco became the first of Lester Piggott's five successes in 1966 and also went on to Classic glory when capturing the Leger. In 1967, the great Vaguely Noble (Ire) stamped his presence on proceedings with a seven-length victory en route to toppling Sir Ivor in the Arc the following October.

Racing Post History cont.

As the swinging sixties neared their end, the new initiative was firmly entrenched in the British program, and it was the turn of racing's own style icon Henry Cecil to begin a long love affair with this prize when saddling Approval (GB) to become the first of his 10 winners. Two years later, the race witnessed yet another budding Classic hero when High Top (Ire) scored en route to 2000 Guineas glory, and in the process proved that miler speed was as essential a requisite as stamina. The remainder of the decade was highlighted by the wins of Jacques Wertheimer's Green Dancer in 1974 and Daniel Wildenstein's Hello Gorgeous in 1979, the latter of which represented another of Cecil's impressive haul. In 1980, there was an early reversal in store for Shergar (Ire), as His Highness The Aga Khan's ill-fated legend ran into one too strong in Beldale Flutter before Cecil began to farm the race. Between 1982 and 1993, the Warren Place trainer only gave best on five occasions. Starring among his swathe of winners was Reference Point (GB), who was the first to go on to glory in the blue riband. Louis Freedman's esteemed homebred put his marker down with an emphatic seven-length success in 1986 and was nearly upstaged in terms of superiority six years later by the effervescent Juddmonte runner Armiger (GB). After playing his part in helping Khalid Abdullah and Pat Eddery to their record-equaling tally of four and five wins, respectively, the chestnut failed to deliver on the sky-high promise of his six-length score despite being runner-up in the following year's Prix Lupin and St Leger. The subsequent King George hero King's Theatre (Ire) was Cecil's last when bringing his sequence to double figures in 1993, a year before arguably the race's finest advert arrived on the scene.

From the little-known Lady Herries stable, the monstrous Celtic Swing (GB) took complete control of the 1994 edition with a 12-length rout of over-matched rivals in a performance that has remained the benchmark. Rated one of the best 2-year-olds Europe had witnessed as a result, the black colt appeared to have the world at his feet and, although he went on to taste Classic success in the Prix du Jockey Club, like Armiger he never quite managed to reproduce this visual extravaganza. While Peter Savill's domineering performer was peaking at Doncaster, the 2001 hero High Chaparral (Ire) was only just coming to the fore as he ground down his odds-on stable companion Castle Gandolfo (Gone West) as the second of Aidan O'Brien's current total of five winners. In four of the next five years, more embryo Classic heroes were in the winner's spot, with Brian Boru (GB), American Post (GB), Motivator (GB) and Authorized (Ire) ensuring a golden spell for the race. The latter pair were from the initial crops of Montjeu (Ire), while the latest Ballydoyle scorer St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) also advertised that sire's potency in this race with his memorable surge two years ago. If the vibe surrounding his latest star in the ascendant Camelot (GB) is to be believed, we will be looking at a quartet of wins for the brilliant Coolmore resident come Saturday afternoon.

Helmet (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) and **Jimmy Choux (NZ)** (Thorn Park {NZ}), the likely favorites for the G1 Cox Plate at Moonee Valley, will be able to keep close tabs on each other as they break from adjacent stalls Saturday. The pair have drawn wide--New Zealand star Jimmy Choux will start from barrier 10, with Helmet one position further out--and will need to do what only the great Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) has been able to achieve in the past 15 years after drawing the outside half of the field. Helmet's rider Kerrin McEvoy wasn't overly concerned by the draw, and said he was optimistic his mount could reproduce his stirring win in the 1600-meter G1 Caulfield Guineas in his latest.

"Obviously I've got to keep in mind it's 2040 [meters], last start was a mile, so I have to ride him accordingly, but I'm just really looking forward to the race," McEvoy said. 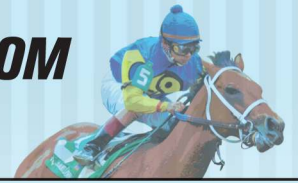

ANOTHER DATES CONFLICT IN MARYLAND

The conflict between the Maryland Jockey Club, which operates Pimlico and Laurel, and the state's horsemen over the live racing calendar is again escalating. The issue seemed to have been resolved, at least through 2013, after the two sides agreed to a 146-date schedule for 2011 in a last-minute deal negotiated by Gov. Martin O'Malley at the end of last year. In return for signing off on the number of dates, the Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association contributed \$1.7 million and the state pledged to transfer up to \$6 million a year from the state's slot-machine program to help defray operating costs at the MJC. The slots revenue had been earmarked for track improvements. The horsemen and members of the Maryland Racing Commission believed the MJC, an entity of the Stronach Group, had agreed to the terms through 2013, but that proved not to be the case during a Commission meeting Tuesday. The MJC floated a proposal during the meeting that called for just 40 live racing dates at Pimlico next year, and none at all at Laurel, which would instead be leased to the MTHA as a training facility. According to Alan Foreman, an attorney for the MTHA, the horsemen felt blindsided when they were first presented with the proposal two weeks ago. "First of all, there is a task force that has been assembled that includes the horsemen, the breeders and [representatives of] the racetracks to discuss the long-term viability of Maryland racing, including year-round racing, but there have been no meetings," Foreman said. "This proposal comes to us in a vacuum." He added, "When [the MJC] was issued its license by the Maryland Racing Commission in June, it was with the understanding that they would run 146 live racing dates in 2011 AND 2012. That's the background." MJC President Tom Chuckas insisted that the track operator is looking for a resolution acceptable all sides, telling the Baltimore Sun, "It's fair to say that no one involved in this situation wants World War III. It's incumbent on the parties involved in the negotiations to structure a deal that prevents a disaster and to come up with a resolution, both short term and long term." As to the impression that a three-year arrangement had been agreed to, Chuckas continued, "For 2011, we fully supported the Governor's efforts to keep racing at 146 days." But, he added, "Frank [Stronach] is a firm believer that he doesn't want any capital or money from the state for operations, and he wants to create his own business model and be [self] sufficient. If you take the \$6 million [in slots revenue], then you have to race 146 days. From our perspective, we like to be financially viable. That's not doable with 146 days."

LEGISLATION INTRODUCED TO PROTECT H-2B WORKER PROGRAM

Congressman Rodney Alexander (R-LA) introduced H.R. 3162 to prevent the Department of Labor (DOL) from instituting two new rules for the H-2B Visa program for seasonal workers that could have a severe negative impact on the horse racing industry and make the program unusable for many owners and trainers.

One of the new rules is scheduled to go into effect on November 30. This rule changes the way the prevailing wage is calculated and requires the employer to pay H-2B workers the highest of the prevailing wage, the federal minimum wage, the state minimum wage or the local minimum wage. The new formula could raise rates by as much as 100 percent in some cases.

The DOL also is looking to finalize a second rule in December that would impact the H-2B program. Among the changes, this rule increases the amount of time employers must try to recruit U.S. workers and requires these employers to extend certain benefits to U.S. workers that are offered to H-2B workers. An example is the reimbursement of transportation costs.

But Foreman said the proposal now on the table is a "non-starter," adding, "It's not feasible, financially, legally or practically. [The horsemen] are not going to operate [Laurel]; we had that experience with a harness track down here, and it was a disaster." Foreman said that overtures have been made to the MJC, but no meetings have been scheduled. "[MTHA President] Richard Hoffberger has reached out numerous times, offering to sit down and discuss various alternatives, to put everything on the table. But, at least to this point, [the MJC] has not responded to any of those offers." The Maryland Racing Commission is required to approve the 2012 schedule by the end of this year.

The last and most expensive of the trio turned out to be Customer Base, and Glen Hill President Craig Bernick says it's quality over quantity when he and his team go shopping

[Hill 'n' Dale Farm's] Donato Lanni and I look at the horses and get it down to the ones we like, and [Glen Hill trainer] Tom Proctor casts a vote and we try to buy the ones we like," explained Bernick, the grandson of owner Leonard Lavin. "We don't like too, too many and only try to buy the ones we have to have. We've sort of been lucky the in last little while."

He continued, "[Customer Base] and the War Front [Emerald Gold] were our two favorite fillies. Customer Base was a really classy filly, and she was always out when we went by. She acted professionally and never turned a hair. She had a beautiful neck and shoulder and was extremely balanced."

Connections always thought a lot of Customer Base, but it was that final pre-race breeze that got the attention of all involved, including Emerald Gold.

“Customer Base started four lengths in front and held her own, and we really thought Emerald Gold would be competitive in the Grade I,” Bernick recollected. “We were extremely impressed that a filly that had never run would hang in there that well with a filly like Emerald Gold. We knew she could run, but hers isn’t really a great first-out pedigree, and Tom usually doesn’t ask much first time out either. We thought she was special.”

Having celebrated graduation day, plan A was to stay in the Golden State for the balance of the season. But anyone who deals with races and race selection knows that it’s wise to have plan B and sometimes C and D.

“Unfortunately there were just two races in California for her in California that didn’t go and we had to fly her to Kentucky,” he said. “Thankfully we found an allowance race here.”

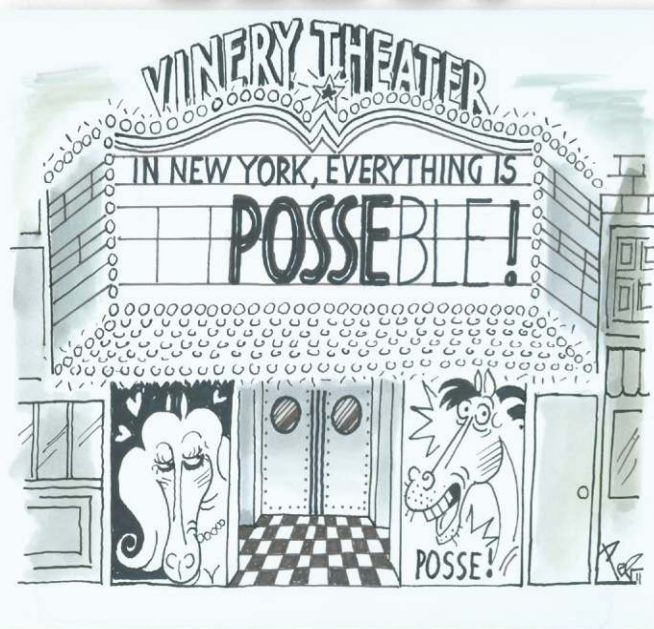
And what does the future hold for the newest **☆ "TDN Rising Star" ☆?**

“If she had stayed in California, the plan was to run in and win the allowance and run in the GIII Miesque S. [on turf] and then the GI Hollywood Starlet at the end of the meet,” Bernick offered. “But I really don’t think we’ll take her back to California, at least by design. It’s not good to ship young horses around all the time, so I don’t know exactly what’s next. We’ll think about the Juvenile Fillies Turf, but it’s pretty quick back and I haven’t even talked to Tom yet. She’s got a lot of ability and we’ll just make the call down the road.”

Ultimately, Bernick believes Customer Base will be best on the turf since “her family says turf and she looks like a grass horse.” She will winter in Florida, and is a candidate for races like the Florida Oaks at Tampa and the GIII Herecomesthebride S. at Gulfstream. But given her ability on the Poly, a race like the GI Ashland S. in April is not out of the question, Bernick said.

“She looks like she has a world of ability and relaxes really well on the track,” he stated. “She did it going one turn and now at two turns. To win first at Del Mar and now at Keeneland, I’d say that’s a pretty exciting way to kick off the career.”--*Alan Carasso*

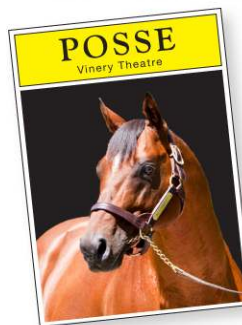

JOCKEYS ON CORRUPTION CHARGES

Four jockeys and one former jockey are among several who will today appear at a BHA hearing to face charges that they breached the rules of racing in relation to horses being laid to lose on betting exchanges. The BHA conducted an investigation into suspicious betting activity on a number of races which took place at Bath, Kempton, Lingfield and Wolverhampton between Jan. 17, 2009 and Aug. 15, 2009, and its 10-day hearing will conclude Nov. 2. Riders Paul Doe, Greg Fairley, Kirsty Milczarek, Jimmy Quinn and rider-turned-trainer Paul Fitzsimons are each alleged to have conspired to commit a corrupt or fraudulent practice. Specifically, that they communicated directly or indirectly to one or more betting exchange account holders, for material reward, gift, favor or benefit in kind. It is also alleged that each intentionally failed to ensure that their horse was run on its merits. Eight others are additionally alleged to have caused the jockey in the race to act by communicating to him directly or indirectly, at his request and for material reward, gift, favor or benefit in kind. The BHA will issue no further update until after the conclusion of the closed proceedings.

Gestut Karlshof has announced the death of their high-class broodmare **Sacarina (GB)** (Old Vic {GB}-- Brave Lass {GB}, by Ridan) as a result of cancer. Heralded internationally as the dam of Group 1-winning Monsun (Ger) trio of Samum (Ger), Schiaparelli (Ger) and Salve Regina (Ger), the unraced chestnut also produced the listed scorer Seventh Sky (Ger) (King's Best) while her daughters Salve Regina and the winning Sasuela (Ger) (Dashing Blade {GB}) are stakes producers themselves. Bred in 1992 by Bassam Freiha in England, Sacarina was acquired by Gestut Karlshof as a broodmare prospect and produced a total of 12 living foals, of which the youngest is the 2-year-old colt Seven Summits (Ger) (Manduro {Ger}). Her first foal was the millennium G1 Deutsches Derby and G1 Grosser Preis von Baden hero Samum, who has also excelled as a sire. Her second Derby victor Schiaparelli was her biggest earner after joining Godolphin, while Salve Regina took the 2002 G1 Preis der Diana and ran second against the colts in the Derby.

The colt breezed in [:10.69](#) on Monday over a muddy track at the Gold Coast, and is a half-sibling to three stakes horses, including the Group 1-performing 3-year-old Playtime (Aus) (Foreplay {Aus}).

Shaw and Williams teamed to purchase the topper at last year's sale, Tzar (Aus) (Gonski {Aus}), a A\$180,000 acquisition who already a multiple winner at Kranji. "We've had a lot of luck buying from this sale ring," added Shaw. "We hope it continues with this colt and the others we get from the sale."

The top-priced filly--and the only of the fairer sex to crack the top 20--was [lot 107](#), a chestnut by Magnus (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}) out of De Lago Lass (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) who made A\$80,000. Ontrack Thoroughbreds purchased the Waverley Park Lodge-consigned miss.

In total, 78 lots brought A\$3,233,000, an average of A\$41,449 that's down 4.6% from a year ago. The buy-back rate was a relatively high 31%, which was still better than the 2010 rate of 33%.

"There was strong demand on a number of lots through and the top and middle of the market," said Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox. "We had a good line up of buyers from around the country as well as overseas, with a large percentage of horses sold to international buyers."

Cox added, "The top priced lot of the day--the Red Dazzler colt from Boganvillia--was the obvious stand out, but plenty of others sold well. Obviously, the demand on the fillies wasn't as strong; there's no doubt buyers got some great value there."
