Sanagas (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) showed his appreciation of the cool temperatures and wet conditions that are often encountered in Lexington during Keeneland's fall meeting to take home the lion's share of the purse in Thursday's Sycamore S. Originally carded as a 1 1/2-mile Grade III on the turf, the 1 5/8-mile Main track event was downgraded to listed status after coming off

Joseph O'Brien will renew the partnership after steering him to a facile debut success at Leopardstown July 14. Colm O'Donoghue is booked for the impressive fellow Leopardstown maiden scorer **Learn (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Well backed at 9-5 this time, Sanagas settled at the back of the leading rank in the early going and eagerly inched his way into contention on the back stretch. Ready to strike at the quarter pole, the bay forged to the front midstretch and had enough in reserve to best Tahoe Lake by a half length. Center Divider was a clear third.

Last season, Sanagas triumphed in three of four starts for trainer Peter Schiergen in allowance and handicap company in Germany before closing out his tenure with the German-based trainer with a score in a 1 7/16-mile handicap at Nuess Feb. 27. Turned over to Graham Motion, the gelding was seventh--

beaten 3 1/4 lengths--in the 10-furlong GIII Arlington H. July 9. Appreciating the drop in class, Sanagas came home a comfortable 2 1/4-length winner in the restricted Johns Call S. over 1 5/8 miles Aug. 5. Favored in his latest in the 11-furlong GII Bowling Green H. at Belmont Sept. 10, the Andreas Jacobs representative finished a credible fourth, beaten 1 1/4 lengths by Grassy (El Prado {Ire}).

In addition to Aidan O'Brien's defections, the other scratching was Sheikh Ahmed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Farraaj (Ire)** (Dubai Destination). Trainer Roger Varian revealed that the Sept. 22 G3 Somerville Tattersall S. runner-up had scoped badly. "Farraaj has a slightly dirty scope and is just not A1, which you have to be going into a race like this," he told the *Racing Post*. "His blood wasn't 100% either and the two things side by side is enough. That will probably be it for the year as there is not a lot left."

MGISW Smiling Tiger to Bypass Breeders' Cup

Millionaire **Smiling Tiger** (Hold That Tiger) encountered a minor setback and will bypass the Nov. 5 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Churchill Downs in favor of the Dec. 11 G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Sprint at Sha Tin. "He was invited to go to Hong Kong, so that's our focus now," said Mersad Metanovic, racing manager for owners Alan Klein and Philip Leberherz. According to Metanovic, the three-time Grade I winner exited a four-furlong work in :46 4/5--the third fastest of 40 moves at Santa Anita Sept. 28--with a slight injury, which has kept him off the worktab since.

"He had a bruised foot, an abscess, so we are just trying to get that out of the way," explained Metanovic.

"It was a minor issue, but, as a result, he missed some training, and [trainer] Jeff [Bonde] thought we wouldn't be getting the best out of him [in the Breeders' Cup Sprint] if we were to rush and put works into him. We just want to be careful."

Metanovic added, "The worst part is that this is the first time that's ever happened to him. It's disappointing, but it's just the way it is."

Listed among his top wins, the chestnut captured the GI Bing Crosby S. and GI Ancient Title S. in 2010 before adding a score in the July 2 GI Triple Bend H. Most recently, the 4-year-old was fourth--beaten only 2 1/4 lengths--in the GI Pat O'Brien S. at Del Mar Aug. 28.

"The purses abroad are very interesting to us," said Metanovic, explaining the decision to send the \$40,000 Washington September sale grad overseas. "Also, we really want to give him the opportunity to show his best around the world. He's sound, still has a lot of run in him, and he travels very well."

As a long-range goal, Metanovic revealed to the *TDN* that Smiling Tiger is likely to head to Dubai for the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen on World Cup day at Meydan in the spring.

"With an international schedule, we can space out his races a lot more, and that will definitely suit him better," said Metanovic. "He is a horse that wants more time in between races to show his best."

While it was recently announced that Smiling Tiger might be offered at the upcoming Fasig-Tipton November Sale, Metanovic confirmed yesterday that nothing had been set in stone.

"That is still to be determined," added Metanovic. "That still is a possibility, but at this moment, under Jeff, the goal is to run in Hong Kong and later Dubai."

'Think' Team Target Classic

Connections of **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) have given their clearest indication yet that the 5-year-old will run in the Nov. 5 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs. Following his second to Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) in Saturday's G1 Champion S., the Ballydoyle flagbearer is set to tackle the dirt. Part owner Dato Tan Chin Nam told *The Sydney Morning Herald*, "He could have won three Cox Plates, but we wanted to take on the world. He has showcased Australian racing to the world and showed that we can match them. It has taken two course records to beat him. I hope he can go better in America."

Trinniberg Gearing Up

Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint candidate **Trinniberg** (Teuflesberg) breezed a half in :48.20 over a sloppy Churchill track yesterday morning. Wearing blinkers, the dark bay went in company with an older stablemate. "It was a good little work and I got him to relax," said rider Willie Martinez. "He's got natural speed and is extremely quick. At the top of the lane, when I asked him, he responded." Owned by Shivanada Parbhoo, Trinniberg was second by 3/4 of a length in both the GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. Sept. 5 and GI Nashua S. Oct. 2, but is not currently eligible to the Breeders' Cup program, and would need to be supplemented for \$100,000. "We'll see how he is tomorrow," Parbhoo said. "I would have no hesitation in writing the check. I love the game. But, he has already paid his way [with runner-up finishes in the Nashua and Hopeful]."

Midday Possible for Breeders' Cup

Khalid Abdullah's **Midday (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) could take in a third GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf, Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe announced yesterday. Fourth in Saturday's G1 Champion S., the

six-time Group 1 winner will be joined by the operation's G1 Prix Jean Romanet heroine **Announce (GB)** (Selkirk). "Midday has come out of [the Champion S.] really well and she just got shuffled back a bit too far," Grimthorpe explained. "She did make up quite a bit of ground to get up for fourth and she looked like she hadn't finished her business. She was looking like she wanted

to go on and do a bit more. [Trainer] Henry [Cecil] has got her in the [GI Breeders' Cup] Turf as well, so we'll take a peek at that, but I would think the first preference will be the Filly & Mare Turf. Grimthorpe added, "[Trainer] Andre [Fabre] is very pleased with Announce, who is four now so has been about a little bit. I would think she'll cope with it all. She has two options after the Breeders' Cup; either she could stay in America or come back to the Stud." He also revealed that the Oct. 1 G2 Prix Dollar winner **Byword (GB)** (Peintre Celebre) would tackle the GI Breeders' Cup Mile and that the Aug. 17 G2 Great Voltigeur scorer **Sea Moon (GB)** (Beat Hollow {GB}) remains on course for the Breeders' Cup Turf. "Byword has always been a good horse and won the G1 Prince of Wales's S. last year," he said. "He's had a slightly truncated season, but he came back really well in the Dollar and hadn't run since June so it was a pretty smart performance. We want to give him a shot and he's a genuine contender at a mile. The Breeders' Cup Turf just seems to have come in right for Sea Moon--he's quite a robust horse both in character and type, so I don't think you'd worry too much about going to America."

Catalano Works Breeders' Cup Hopefuls

On a crisp and rainy morning in Lexington Thursday, Ken and Sarah Ramsey's **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) and **Coalport** (Mineshaft) worked five furlongs over Keeneland's main track. With trainer Wayne Catalano's assistant Kelsey Danner in the irons, the winner of the GI Darley Alcibiades S. breezed five furlongs in a bullet :59 with a gallop out time of 1:14 4/5.

"She worked very well," said Catalano of the homebred. "They got her in :59 flat and she galloped out OK, so we were happy with the work." Stephanie's Kitten is expected to make her next start in the Nov. 5 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. Also recording his first official work since a runner-up finish in the GIII Bourbon S. Oct. 3, Coalport, who is headed to the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, went five furlongs in 1:01.60 before galloping out in 1:15 2/5. The pair were scheduled to breeze over the turf course, but Keeneland canceled the morning's turf works as a result of the heavy rains that hit the area over the previous two days. According to Catalano, Stephanie's Kitten might have one more work, over the Churchill turf course, before the Breeders' Cup.

'Caviar' Shoots for #15 on Cox Plate Undercard...

Australian sensation **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}) faces just four rivals as she attempts to extend her winning streak to 15 straight as the defending race champion in Saturday's G2 Schweppes S. at Moonee Valley Racecourse. The reigning Australian Horse of the Year and world champion sprinter is pegged at odds of \$1.04 (1-25) to take the measure of her rivals in a race in which she romped home by 5 1/2 lengths last season. **Scenic Blast (Aus)** (Scenic {Ire}), the 2008-2009 Horse of the Year in Australia, returns to the races for the first time in 11 months. The 7-year-old, victorious in the G1 Lightning S., G1 Newmarket H. and G1 King's Stand S. in 2009, made five starts for trainer John Shireffs in California in 2010, the highlight of which was a runner-up effort to Smiling Tiger (Hold That Tiger) in the GI Bing Crosby S. over the Del Mar Polytrack. He is the second choice in the wagering at 13-1. "He's obviously been off the scene for a fair while but is back in good nick," trainer Dan Morton told AAP. "He hasn't raced for quite a while so realistically he's going to need the run on Saturday. But we're looking forward to running him in the [G1] Patinack Farm Classic down the straight [at Flemington Nov. 5]." Also on the Cox Plate undercard, **Americain** (Dynaformer) will try to prove he is up to a defense of his G1 Melbourne Cup title when he goes postward in the G2 Drake International Cup over an extended mile and a half. Gerald Mosse is in for the ride.

Ramsey Farm Offering Kitten's Joy Incentive:

Ramsey Farm will be offering graded-stakes producers **Cardinalli** (Capote) and **Blush** (Menifee), both in foal to Kitten's Joy, at Fasig-Tipton's November Sale, and the mares' purchasers will have a free option to breed back to the farm's flagship stallion in 2012. Cardinalli is the dam of multiple Grade II winner Banned (Kitten's Joy), while Blush's 3-year-old Derby Kitten (Kitten's Joy) captured the GIII Coolmore Lexington S. in April. For Adam Lazarus and his partners, **Musical Romance** (Concorde's Tune) has been a "godsend" and a "dream come true." Lazarus, who operates the Pinnacle Racing Stable along with his partner and trainer Bill Kaplan, was forced to bide his time and watch several horses on his short list go by the wayside at the 2009 OBS April Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training, but after more than 1,100 horses and well into the fourth day of the auction, the team finally found what they hoped would be their four-leaf clover.

"We were basically down to our last swing at that sale," Lazarus explained. "She was one of the last horses that we had on our list. She breezed :21 flat and looked awesome doing it, and I remember when Bill pulled her out of her stall at Ocala Stud's consignment. I looked down at the sheet of paper and I saw the second dam, Sea of Green (Seacliff). Then I looked at this filly and saw how long-legged she was. She had a great body."

At that point, Lazarus availed himself of some 'inside' information.

"Bill had trained Seacliff, who swept the Florida Stallion Stakes, and Sea of Green was the best horse that Seacliff ever produced," he stated. "He was a monster in the northeast, won close to a half-million dollars in sprints. So I am fixated on that, and then I am looking at this horse and thinking, 'Boy, she's a long-legged horse and she breezed so well,' and we were just very lucky to get her." Kaplan signed the ticket on the filly for \$22,000. **Cont. p8**

But, just when things appeared to be going well, fate intervened. "After we bought her, on the second day at the track, she broke her ankle," Lazarus said. Musical Romance would undergo surgery in Ocala to have four screws inserted. "I had sold [all the shares in] her coming out of the sale, and I returned all the money. I wouldn't take any more money for the filly until she proved she could come back and work out consistently, and until I felt comfortable enough that I could offer her to my partners."

The filly recovered quickly and made it to the races in the fall of 2009 and, though she broke her maiden sprinting on the dirt, became a useful runner going two turns on turf, winning a Gulfstream allowance and the Sweettrickydancer S. at Calder in 2010. But the operation found itself at something of a crossroads in the middle of the season, and a crucial decision was made.

"Bill's closest friend on the track is Milt Wolfson, and he trains Trip for A. J. (Trippi)," Lazarus commented. "She was one of the best fillies in South Florida and, as a 3-year-old, she was really dominating the two-turn races."

Lo and behold, last fall, a seven-furlong allowance race with some good fillies in there came up. We ended up running, and ran the fastest seven-furlong time of the meet at Calder. We had not sprinted at that point for about a year, but that encouraged us a little bit to look at races like the Sunshine Millions Sprint."

Sent off at 62-1 in that six-furlong event last winter, Musical Romance made a late run that saw her finish fourth, beaten under a length behind Aegean (Northern Afleet) and the talented Jessica Is Back (Put It Back).

"We wanted to avoid Trip for A. J., because we didn't think we could beat her on a consistent basis, and the Sunshine Millions Sprint showed she could sprint," Lazarus continued. "But there was still some convincing we had to do, because up until this year, we were running on the turf and going long. So, she's really only been sprinting since May."

Winner of the Ema Bovary S. and the U Can Do It H. at Calder this past spring, Musical Romance came into the GI Princess Rooney H. as a 7-1 chance against the likes of top distaffer sprinter Sassy Image (Broken Vow). Reserved at the back of the pack, Musical Romance took the lead in deep stretch, only to be run down on the money by a freakish last-to-first run from Sassy Image. It was an effort Lazarus found difficult to be upset about.

"Going into that race, I was hopeful she'd hit the board," he admitted. "I wasn't disappointed in the result, because my expectation level was just to hit the board. A lot of people felt bad for us and were almost apologetic, but going into the race, it was like signing a contract... If you hit the board, I'll be happy."

He continued, "She's going against fillies who were the best of her generation and just missed by a nose. It's a gigantic circle and you figure you'll get the bob next time, which is exactly what happened a little later."

Shipped to Presque Isle Downs for the valuable 6 1/2-panel GIII PID Masters S. Sept. 10, the dark bay was up for a neck victory. But in her most recent start in the six-furlong GII Thoroughbred Club of America S. at Keeneland Oct. 8, the wire came a bit too soon at a distance probably too short and she settled for second behind Holiday for Kitten (Kitten's Joy). Those efforts, in addition to the Princess Rooney, would make Musical Romance one of the top chances in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint, but Lazarus does not expect to be there, at least this year.

"I don't think it's very likely," he said, explaining that it would take a \$140,000 supplement to get her in. "To make the investment that it would take to get her in, I don't think it fits our economic model. She deserves to go, she fits, but I'm not sure it makes sense for us--unless I win the Powerball. But I think she could be rolling into a season where she can be a real force. Next year, could be the year."

Lazarus attends the 2-year-old sales exclusively, and keeps to a strict budget and plan.

"Pinnacle Racing Stable is a partnership, and our goal is to find anything between \$15,000 to \$35,000," he offered. "That's usually our budget to run in South Florida. Bill grades every horse that's in the sale, and he does it strictly off the videos, doesn't even look at the pedigree page. Every horse that grades out well enough on his grading scale is examined for conformation. If they pass both, he provides a list to me and we go over what we think would fit in to our program. He'll give me his list, and I'll kind of peel away the pedigrees that might be, in my eyes, horses that will be sound based upon a pedigree page. Other than that, it's totally up to Bill. He looks for athletes and he does an incredible job and has an incredible eye for young horses."

He sees another advantage in the breeze-up sales.

"I feel like the fillies fall through the cracks at 2-year-old sales and that you can get more value for your money with fillies. I firmly believe that," he said.

Lazarus, who attended Appalachian State University on a baseball scholarship and whose father befriended Kaplan on the links, said Musical Romance could run once more this year in the GIII Sugar Swirl S. at Gulfstream Dec. 10.--Alan Carasso

THE JC RELEASES 2011 MARES BRED

STATISTICS *(Edited Release)* According to a Jockey Club report of mares bred in 2011 issued Thursday, a total of 1,935 stallions covered 36,504 mares in North America Oct. 12, 2011. The annual statistics, which include the number of mares bred to each stallion, represent approximately 90% of the total number of mares that will ultimately be reported as bred in 2011. According to historical trends, The Jockey Club expects to receive RMBs representing an additional 3,500 to 4,000 mares bred during the 2011 breeding season.

The number of stallions declined 11.5% from the 2,186 reported at this time in 2010, while the number of mares bred fell 10% from the 40,576 reported at this time in 2010.

The number of stallions covering 100 or more mares increased from 82 in 2010 to 84 in 2011. These stallions accounted for a greater percentage of the total mares reported bred this year--30.6% of all mares bred in 2011, versus 26.8% of all mares bred in 2010 as reported at this time last year.

Further book size analysis shows a 2.5% increase in the number of mares bred to stallions with a book size of 100 or more in 2011 when compared to 2010 figures; a 32.2% drop in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 75 and 99; a 17.8% decline in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 50 and 74; an 8.0% decrease in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 25 and 49; and an 11.4% decline in mares bred to stallions with a book size fewer than 25. In 2011, Congrats led all stallions with 205 mares bred, followed by Giant's Causeway (198), Bellamy Road (192), Scat Daddy (191) and Henrythenavigator (189).

As in previous years, Kentucky's 228 reported stallions covered 15,714 mares, or 43% of all of the mares reported bred in North America in 2011, while the number of mares bred to Kentucky stallions declined 9.2% from the 17,303 reported at this time last year.

Of the top 10 states and provinces by number of mares reported bred in 2011 through Oct. 12, 2011, only Ontario stallions covered more mares in 2011 than in 2010.

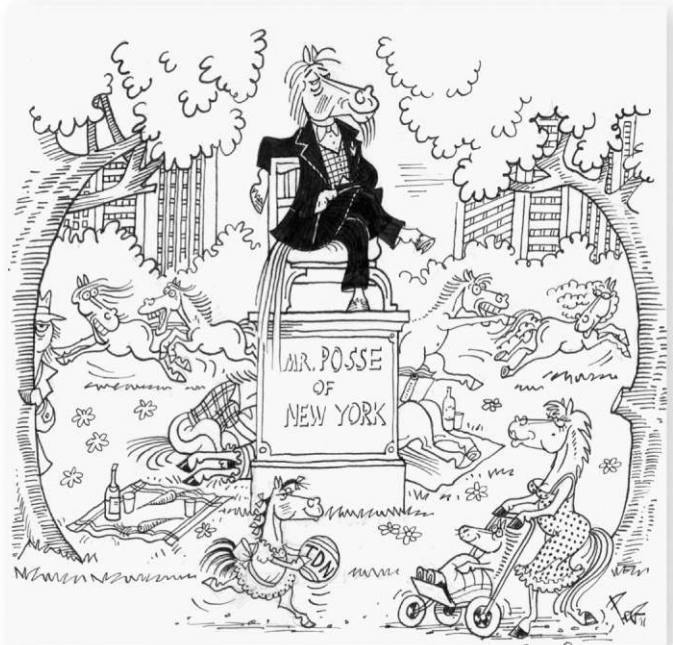

STATUS QUO AT OCTOBER

Arqana's October Yearling Sale concluded with the key stats almost identical to last year. The average of €27,539 was down by less than a percentage point, and the median of €20,000 was just one tick behind the 2010 figure of €21,000. President Eric Hoyeau said, "The results reflect the consolidation of the new format and of the level of prices that were reached last year. The average and aggregate are the third best ever for this sale, only to the exceptional year 2007 and to last year's highly satisfactory results. The clearance rate has, however, been affected by the greater number of horses catalogued, which was a record for this sale. Such a large offer played against the sale's momentum, and we will have to apply a more rigorous selection next year in order to maintain a busy trade." He continued, "Overall, if we look at the French yearling market this year, it was a good performance. We catalogued 40 yearlings more than last year, and the number of horses sold increased accordingly, from 668 in 2010 to 703 in 2011. The cumulated average price also improved despite the larger numbers, and the overall turnover went up 11%. However, such generally satisfactory results should not hide the difficulties faced by many commercial breeders to balance their books. It is more than ever necessary to take actions aimed at increasing the number of owners in France and at encouraging existing owners to turn over their stock more regularly by putting more emphasis on young horses in the racing program. I think these two aims should be amongst the priorities of France Galop's next president, in order to support the breeders who provide the necessary raw material to our sport."
