Havre de Grace Drills at Keeneland

Fox Hill Farm's GI Breeders' Cup Classic contender **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam) prepped for her Nov. 5 engagement with a five-furlong spin in :58.60 over the Keeneland Polytrack Monday morning. Pilot Gabriel Saez was in the irons, guiding the 4-year-old through fractions of :35.60 and :47 flat with a six-furlong gallop-out in 1:12 flat. The work was the second-fastest of 14 at the distance.

"I couldn't have wanted it to go any better," trainer Larry Jones said. "It's what we needed. She was blowing a little bit [afterward], but she didn't drink a whole lot of water. We're ready. I would like to have run last Saturday. She can't get any better."

The 4-year-old filly began her work about a furlong behind Jones, who was galloping maiden 2-year-old **Reason to be Proud** (Proud Citizen) at the time. The three-time Grade I

winner passed her stablemate around the quarter pole.

"I wanted to be real close to Gabriel so I could scream at him in case he needed some coaching," Jones quipped. "[Trainer Bob] Baffert uses walkie-talkies. I'm not that innovative yet. I've either got to do it this way or use smoke signals." He continued, "To be honest, I thought my horse was running and she just come by me like 'Whoa.' We were just lucky to watch. I really wasn't planning on her catching me until we turned for home, but she came on by me quick."

Saez added, "She was doing it easy. When she saw another horse in front of her she put her ears up and she was like 'Come on, let's go get him.' That's the way she is. In her races she does the same thing."

RED LETTER DAY AT TATTERSALLS

Red Gulch (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}) topped day one of Tattersalls' Autumn Horses In Training Sale in Newmarket yesterday when selling for 250,000gns 13 days after his victory in the Listed Prix du Ranelagh at Longchamp. The 4-year-old gelding, who had been purchased for 40,000gns at the same sale a year ago to join his rookie Newmarket trainer Ed Walker, had many admirers in the ring this time. Anthony Stroud and David Loder, who traditionally shop at this sale for Sheikh Mohammed's various entities, outlasted Kentucky-based Joe Miller of Kern Lillingston for the session topper. Californian agent Jamie Lloyd, Alastair Donald of Sackville Donald and New Zealand agent Guy Mulcaster all made spirited attempts for the horse, but were outgunned.

Flay Acquires French Filly for Breeders' Cup Bid

Celebrity chef Bobby Flay revealed yesterday that he has purchased French listed stakes winner **Dear Lavinia** (Grand Slam) from owner/breeder Joseph Allen, and will enter her in the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. Flay got his first taste of Breeders' Cup glory when

More Than Real (More Than Ready)--also acquired by private purchase--won the Juvenile Fillies Turf last term. "Dear Lavinia was brought to our attention by bloodstock agent Michel Zerolo, who does a lot of good work bringing horses from Europe to the United States," Flay told the *TDN*. "The thing that most impressed us was how consistent she's been during

her first five races--she's won three times with a second and a third. She's already a stakes winner, and she's always right there. We also liked the fact that she's a late foal, so there's lots of upside going forward."

Trained by Jean-Claude Rouget, the bay finished a close third to G1 Prix Marcel Bousac heroine Elusive Kate (Elusive Quality) in a Listed event at Deauville in July, and most recently annexed the 7 1/2-furlong Grand Criterium de Bordeaux at Bordeaux le Bouscat Oct. 13 ([video](#)). Flay said that a defense of More Than Real's Breeders' Cup title was not a factor in the decision to purchase Dear Lavinia, explaining, "I'm always on the look-out for young fillies that have some capabilities, and this one just sort of came up at the last second." Flay's new acquisition will arrive in the States on Saturday.

Super Espresso (Medaglia d'Oro) and **Her Smile** (Include) will also carry Flay's silks on Breeders' Cup Friday. The former has been pre-entered in the GI Ladies' Classic, while the latter will go in the GI Filly and Mare Sprint. "I think the Ladies' Classic is a wide-open race if Havre de Grace goes in the Classic," noted Flay. "The Filly and Mare Sprint also looks like it will be wide open--Turbulent Descent (Congrats) is very fast and will probably be favored, but Her Smile is just sort of learning to run at these distances. We bought her as a distance filly, but we dropped her back to six furlongs for the GI Prioress S. and she won. I draw a line right through the Charles Town Oaks [last time Sept. 17]--there was a lot of bumping and it's an odd race with the way the turns are there."

Asmussen Brigade Hits the Track

Leading juvenile filly **My Miss Aurelia** (Smart Strike) led a five-horse contingent of Breeders' Cup hopefuls from the Steve Asmussen barn to work yesterday at Churchill Downs. The GI Frizette S. winner breezed five furlongs in 1:01.40. With exercise rider Carlos Rosas in the saddle, the GI Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies contender clicked off fractions of :12.80, :24.80 and :36.80. She galloped out six furlongs in 1:14.20. "We're extremely pleased

with her," Asmussen said after the work. "She's been very special at every stage and has looked the part and has come through. Her talent was obvious, but the races that she's run have shown another dimension."

Also working from the Asmussen barn, which expects to send out seven Breeders' Cup runners, were GI Dirt Mile contenders **Tapizar** (Tapit) and **Wilburn** (Bernardini). Ron Winchell's Tapizar covered five furlongs in 1:00.40 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:14. Stonestreet's Wilburn went the same distance in 1:00.80 and out six furlongs in 1:14.20.

Winchell Thoroughbreds **Sabercat** (Bluegrass Cat), prepping for the GI Grey Goose Juvenile, worked five furlongs in company in 1:01.20 and Ron Winchell's Juvenile Sprint hopeful **Seeker** (Hard Spun) covered the same distance in 1:00.20, also in company.

Asmussen's Breeders' Cup runners also include Cathy and Bob Zollars' GI Juvenile Turf contender **Daddy Nose Best** (Scat Daddy) and Vinery Stable's GI Turf Sprint hopeful **Regally Ready** (More Than Ready).


"I am happy with the group of them," Asmussen said. "I feel that they're very fresh, sound and happy at the right time."

Trainer Bob Baffert sent a trio of Breeders' Cup hopefuls out to work at Santa Anita yesterday. Leading the group was GI Goodwood S. winner **Game on Dude** (Awesome Again). The 4-year-old gelding was credited with a five-furlong drill in :58.60. "He actually went seven-eighths, even though they gave him five-eighths," Baffert said yesterday afternoon. "He worked from the 5 1/2 and he went three-quarters in :10 4/5 and [galloped] out in :23 and change. He had a really stiff, hard work. He worked really good." Game on Dude won the GI Santa Anita H. in March. A nose short in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup in July, the GI Breeders' Cup Classic hopeful was fourth in the Aug. 28 GI Pacific Classic before his half-length victory in the Oct. 1 Goodwood.

Euroears (Langfuhr), prepping for the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, did work five furlongs, covering the distance in a sparkling :56 4/5. "He worked the fastest five-eighths I've ever seen in my life," Baffert reported. "He looked pretty impressive." Euroears lost all chance when pinched back at the start of the GI Vosburgh H. last time out Oct. 1. The 7-year-old began the year with a win in the GII Palos Verdes S. He was second in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen in March and captured the July 31 GI Bing Crosby S.

Completing Baffert's trio of Cup contenders, GI Kentucky Oaks winner **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro) went six furlongs in 1:12.40, second fastest of nine at the distance. "She went really nice," Baffert said. "It was a strong breeze all the way around there. She did it the right way." Plum Pretty is coming off a 7 1/2-length romp in the Oct. 1 GII Cotillion S.

Suit Ready for Goldi Challenge

Strong Suit (Rahy) was the subject of an upbeat bulletin yesterday as he is geared toward a clash with Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) in next Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Mile. Acquired by Qatar Bloodstock prior to his impressive success in the seven-furlong G2 Challenge S. at Newmarket Oct. 8, the Richard Hannon-trained 3-year-old is giving all the right signals to connections prior to shipping to Churchill. "He's not yet raced round a sharp, left-handed bend and the best we could do at short notice was to gallop him at Newbury on Saturday," the owner's Racing Manager David Redvers explained. "He's in great form, and the lads are telling me he's better than he was before he went to Newmarket. He's a gorgeous horse, and he seems to be getting better, so Richard [Hannon] is mad keen to keep him in training next year. We haven't made a decision on that yet and will do after the Breeders' Cup. He was extremely impressive at Newmarket and, although Goldikova is the one to beat and is a legend, he would certainly be the biggest threat. Goldikova is such a wonderfully admirable, tough and consistent mare, but the problem is her style of running slightly sets her up to be shot down by a finisher. I would love to see her win at the Breeders' Cup if we don't, but I spend most nights going to sleep picturing Strong Suit coming hard on the bridle up to her shoulder approaching the line. I think she does look beatable and although she looks incredibly well and you'd be very foolish to discount her, I think we've got the right horse to take her on. If we are going to make him into a serious, world-class stallion we ought to go for the Dirt Mile, but that would be something to consider next year. He is penciled in for Hong Kong, and if he were to stay in training and looked like he'd taken the Breeders' Cup very easily, then we might consider it, but I can't remember the last horse to win both. It would be a tough ask, so I would think this will more than likely be his last run."

Switch Possible for Ladies' Classic

Lee and Susan Searing's **Switch** (Quiet American), originally expected to contest the GI F/M Sprint, may be headed for the GI Ladies' Classic instead after a five-furlong drill at Churchill yesterday. "I am going to talk to the owners and we may cross-enter in the Ladies' Classic as well as the Sprint," trainer John Sadler confirmed yesterday. Switch, coming off a third-place effort in the Oct. 8 GII Thoroughbred Club of America S. at Keeneland, drilled five furlongs Monday in 1:01.20, clicking off fractions of :12, :24.60, :36.80 and galloping out six furlongs in 1:14.80. "That was a nice work for her," Sadler said. "She looks good and bright and she shipped well over here." Switch finished second in last year's F/M Sprint. In two starts this year at the Ladies' Classic distance of nine furlongs, the 4-year-old filly finished second in both the GI Santa Margarita H. and GI Vanity H.

Prospective Impresses Casse


John Oxley's **Prospective** (Malibu Moon) solidified his chances of a berth in the GI Grey Goose Juvenile with a five-furlong work in 1:02 at Churchill yesterday. The colt recorded splits of :13.60, :26.80 and :38.60. He galloped out six furlongs in 1:16. "He worked about as well as a horse can work," reported trainer Mark Casse. "When we brought him here, we thought there was only a 10% chance we would enter him in the Juvenile, but he worked himself into the race. He reminded us a lot of [GI Stephen Foster H. winner] Pool Play." After debuting on the turf, Prospective's next two starts have come over Woodbine's Polytrack. Most recently the colt recorded a two-length victory in the Oct. 9 GIII Grey S.

Also yesterday, Casse sent out GIII Natalma S. winner **Northern Passion** (First Samurai) to work five furlongs in 1:02. The filly will be cross-entered in the Juvenile Fillies and Juvenile Fillies Turf. "If I had to make a decision right now, I would say we are leaning toward the turf," Casse said. "She worked very well over the dirt this morning, but we already know she handles the turf well."

Spirited Miss (Sky Mesa), working in company with stablemate **Sky High Lady** (Sky Mesa), went five furlongs in 1:01.80. She will also be cross-entered in the Juvenile Fillies Turf and Juvenile Fillies, but Casse said she was more likely to run on the dirt. Her workmate, who completed the five furlongs in 1:02.40, has yet to break her maiden, but may have earned a chance at the Breeders' Cup with yesterday's work. "That was a really nice work and I might pre-enter her in the Juvenile Fillies after watching her this morning," Casse commented. Sky High Lady was most recently fourth in the Oct. 8 Mazarine S. in her second outing.

Four D Stable's GI Woodbine Mile winner **Turallure** (Wando) turned in a five furlong spin in a fastest-of-four :59.40 over the Keeneland sod yesterday in preparation for what looks like it will be a very deep and contentious renewal of the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. "He's pretty good right now," said trainer Charlie Lopresti. "I think that's about all he's going to have. Heart of Destiny Out of Cup

Trainer Jim Baker reported that GI Darley Alcibiades runner-up **Heart of Destiny** (Lion Heart) will bypass the Breeders' Cup in favor of Sunday's GII Pocahontas S. "Our main goal is to have a good horse and a good broodmare," Baker said. "We are going to be conservative with her and the Breeders' Cup would be too much too quick."

Fallon Booked for Caspar

Kieren Fallon will be back on **Caspar Netscher (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}) in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, it was announced yesterday. Having partnered Charles Wentworth's colt to success in the Sept. 17 G2 Mill Reef S. at Newbury, he missed the ride in the G1 Middle Park S., in which he was an unlucky fifth as the 5-1 joint-favorite under Robert Winston. "Kieren was unfortunately banned last time, and Robert has done a fantastic job on him all year, but Kieren has said he is going out there, so he will be the first choice and we have booked him to ride," trainer Alan McCabe said.

Trainer Gai Waterhouse, represented by assistant Bruce Slade, made her first European purchase yesterday. The Australian-based conditioner went up to 135,000gns for **Glencadam Gold (Ire)** (Refuse To Bend {Ire}), a Newmarket

handicap winner for Henry Cecil. New Zealand agent Guy Mulcaster, who was shopping on behalf of Sydney trainer Chris Waller, was the immediate underbidder.

"He is a lovely looking, stretchy, scopey sort who is bred to get a bit further," said Slade, who

was working with agent Johnny McKeever. "He's also lightly-raced and well-rated so, hopefully, there's a bit of improvement in him. We've never had European horses in the stable, but we've seen how well they have been doing in Australia and wanted to be part of that. We give horses from New Zealand plenty of time to settle in and, I would think we would do the same with the Europeans."

Only one other lot made six figures, 3-year-old **Grumeti (GB)** (Sakhee), who was purchased as a jump prospect for 100,000gns. Anthony Bromley of Highflyer Bloodstock signed for the gelding, who was consigned by Fitzroy House Stables. The bay is set to join trainer Alan King and race for owner Max McNeill. Another member of the Fitzroy House offering was **Gramercy (Ire)** (Whipper), a 3-year-old purchased for 90,000gns by agent Stephen Hillen. The Irish-bred will target one of the season's best-know handicaps, the Ayr Gold Cup next September.

"He's been bought for [owner] Dr. Marwan Koukash and will try and win the Ayr race for a third time for him," said Hillen. "I thought we got the horse for a bit under budget, and there seems to have been some value about today."

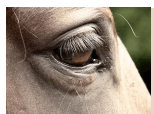

It's been said that no good horse has a bad name. While the history of the Thoroughbred disproves that optimistic theory, the good names come around time after time. According to the Equineline database, 17 individual horses have been named Camelot, after

the legendary castle and court associated with King Arthur.

Indeed the Arthurian legend has been a highly popular source of names with racehorse owners, and there have also been multiple horses carrying such names as Avalon, Excalibur,

Merlin, Guinevere and Morgan Le Fay. What's more, colts named after some of the Knights of the Round Table have matched their namesakes' fame, with Sir Gallahad III becoming America's champion sire on four occasions, while Sir Tristram was champion sire in Australia five times in a six-year period. Of course, Round Table was the name of America's Horse of the Year in 1958 and champion sire of 1972.

Camelot was also the name chosen for the company which operates Britain's national lottery, and--forgive me--the equine Camelot looks a good bet to hit the jackpot. He has already shown great authority in winning the G1 Racing Post Trophy three days ago. While it isn't easy to know the exact merit of Camelot's performance at Doncaster, any horse who hardly comes off the bridle to win a Group 1 must have huge potential, as his odds of 3-1 for next year's Epsom Derby illustrate.

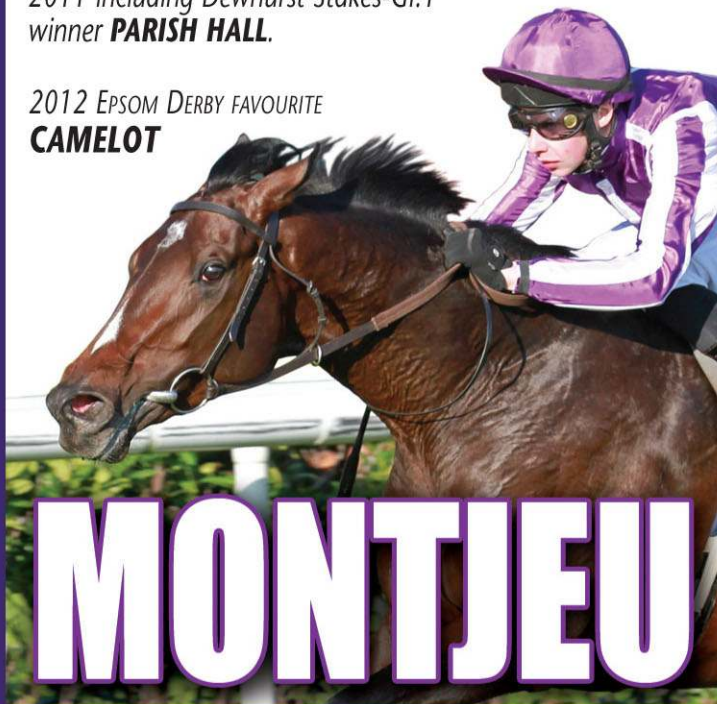

Camelot is a son of Montjeu, a stallion I have written about on a couple of other recent occasions. I wouldn't normally shower so much attention on one stallion, but Montjeu has enjoyed a sensational run of Group 1/Grade I success over the last six months, thanks to Pour Moi, St Nicholas Abbey, Fame And Glory, Masked Marvel, Jukebox Jury, Miss Keller, Sarah Lynx, and now Camelot. This total of eight winners at the highest level earns Montjeu a very honorable second place among the sires of Northern Hemisphere Group 1/Grade I winners, behind Galileo, who leads the way with a team of 10. No other stallion has sired more than three Group 1/Grade I winners this year. It is worth pointing out that Montjeu owes his figure to a total of 194 runners, compared to Galileo's 270.

Camelot is Montjeu's fourth winner of the Racing Post Trophy, even though the stallion has had only eight crops of 2-year-olds. You won't need me to remind you that the first two, Motivator and Authorized, went on to victory in the Epsom Derby, while St Nicholas Abbey missed the Derby, but went to Epsom a year later to win the G1 Coronation Cup over the Derby course and distance. Although St Nicholas Abbey missed the main event, Montjeu boosted his total of Derby winners to three from his first seven crops when Pour Moi staged his spectacular last-to-first effort in June, so Camelot is ideally qualified for Epsom.

Coincidentally, Camelot's female line has already shone in an Epsom Classic, as his fourth dam was a sister to Polygamy, winner of the 1974 Oaks for her breeder Louis Freedman. Polygamy had earlier failed by only a short head to catch the Queen's fine filly Highclere in the 1,000 Guineas.

Incidentally, having mentioned the topic of names earlier in this piece, I have no hesitation in nominating Camelot's fourth dam, One Over Parr, as one of the cleverest names ever given to a racehorse. Her dam, the smart middle-distance performer Seventh Bride, presumably owed her name to her being a daughter of the American import Royal Record II. The record number of wives for an English king was Henry VIII's total of six. The sixth wife was Catherine Parr, so a seventh bride would have been One Over Parr.

One Over Parr was a year younger than Polygamy, so a lot was expected of her after she had won both her juvenile starts in the year of her sister's Classic success. Unlike Polygamy, One Over Parr didn't contest the 1,000 Guineas and was soon racing over a mile and a half. Although she disappointed in the Oaks and Irish Oaks, she was good enough to win the Cheshire Oaks and Lancashire Oaks, collecting a Timeform rating of 114 in the process. Her owner's Cliveden Stud had the great misfortune to lose Polygamy in her first year as a broodmare, but One Over Parr was expected to make an excellent substitute.

She didn't live up to expectations, though, producing only three winners from 13 foals, the best of which was Tom Seymour, a multiple group winner at up to 1 7/8 miles in Italy. She was tried with a wide range of stallions, including Shakapour and Persepolis, two Group 1-winning sons of Kalamoun, a remarkable but short-lived stallion. It is One Over Parr's unraced Persepolis filly Fade who ranks as Camelot's third dam.

Mention of Kalamoun is a reminder that mares whose pedigrees include his sire Zeddaan have played a very important role in Montjeu's success story. Montjeu's third dam Adele Toumignon was by Zeddaan and Montjeu's second dam Toute Cy produced a Group 2-winning stayer inbred 4x3 to Zeddaan.

Montjeu has numerous stakes winners with two lines of Zeddaan in the first five generations of their pedigrees. Camelot doesn't quite scrape into this category, as his second line to Zeddaan is in the sixth generation, but it is worth mentioning that Kalamoun sired the second dam of Montjeu's St Leger winner Scorpion and that Kalamoun's son Kenmare is the broodmare sire of the Irish St Leger winner Jukebox Jury. Then there's Kalamoun's grandson Kendor, who sired the dam of the Group 1-winning brothers Corre Caminos and Recital.

Camelot's second dam Fickle won the Virginia S. over a mile and a quarter to become one of three stakes winners out of Fade, another being the Lingfield Oaks Trial winner Birdie. Fickle stayed quite well for a daughter of Danehill, a stallion who sired the dam of Montjeu's recent Canadian International winner Sarah Lynx.

Fickle started her broodmare career in the U.S., with a visit to Kingmambo. The resultant filly, Camelot's dam Tarfah, won five races, the longest being her Group 3 victory in the Dahlia S. over a mile and an eighth.

Tarfah is being given every chance as a broodmare, visiting Galileo, Montjeu, Cape Cross and Pivotal in her first four years. Her Galileo filly, Ideal, has won over a mile and a quarter.

There are several aspects of Tarfah's pedigree which suggested that she would do very well with Montjeu. As a daughter of Kingmambo, she is a granddaughter of Mr. Prospector. Another granddaughter, this one by Gone West, produced the Derby-winning Motivator and another, this time by Woodman, produced his Irish Derby winner Frozen Fire.

Partly as a consequence of Kingmambo having Nureyev's brilliant daughter Miesque as his dam, Camelot is inbred 3x5x5 to Northern Dancer and 4x5 to Special. Kingmambo, of course, enjoyed excellent results with the broodmare daughters of Montjeu's sire Sadler's Wells.

There can be little doubt that Camelot has a pedigree worthy of a Classic winner, but which Classic? Apparently the 2,000 Guineas hasn't been ruled out, which is fair enough in view of Sadler's Wells' victory in the Irish 2,000 Guineas and Kingmambo's in the French version. Danehill, the sire of his second dam, was responsible for two winners of the 2,000 Guineas. Although the stoutly bred Montjeu has yet to sire a Classic winner over a mile, Camelot must have a fair chance of being the first, as his fellow 2-year-olds don't appear to be a vintage collection at this stage and he didn't look short of speed at Doncaster.

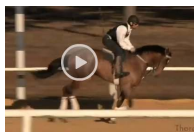

DENALI D'ORO AS NUMBERS SOAR AT F-T

A brief, but intense squall hit the Lexington area yesterday just before the start of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearlings Sale, but the rain cleared in time for the sun to shine on a session-topping colt by Medaglia d'Oro--Especially Me who sold to Debbie Easter for \$200,000.

Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud boasted the opening day's blue-ribbon horse, offering the athletic bay as [hip 16](#) ([ThoroStride.com galloping video](#)). The colt highlighted a lively day of selling at Fasig, where

numbers soared from last year's corresponding figures. The average of \$21,554 was up 58.7%, while the median of \$12,000 was up a whopping 140%.

Acquired by SFD Stables LLC for \$175,000 at the Keeneland January Sale earlier in the year, yesterday's session-topping colt was produced by a Coronado's Quest half-sister to GSW Better Now (Thunder Gulch) and is a grandson of SW and MGSP Scenic Point (Unbridled).

"He's beautiful," Easter said shortly after signing the ticket sitting alongside an associate inside the pavilion.

"He's a nice, stretchy, long-legged Medaglia d'Oro. He looks athletic, and he's a June foal, so hopefully he just matures into a man. I think he's a real nice example of what the sire can throw. Medaglia d'Oro's obviously a great sire."

Easter signed the ticket on behalf of Peter Deutsch, but said the colt was purchased for a New York-based partnership. She said the partnership was comprised of relatively new clients. "I've bought them a few horses, and they own a horse named Adirondack Summer (Thunder Gulch), a New York-bred who's done pretty well this year," said Easter. "He won an open stakes at Gulfstream earlier in the year and just finished third in one of those New York-bred stakes over the weekend."

Trained by Christophe Clement and running under Deutsch's name, the 3-year-old Adirondack Summer defeated subsequent Grade I winner Brilliant Speed (Dynaformer) in the \$100,000 Dania Beach S. at Gulfstream in January, and was beaten just 3/4 lengths when third to Air Support (Smart Strike) and Great Mills (War Front) in the GIII Transylvania S. at Keeneland in April. On New York Showcase Day at Belmont Saturday, he was third in the \$125,000 Mohawk S. Easter purchased Adirondack Summer for \$38,000 at the 2009 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred Sale. He has earned \$129,900.

Yesterday, Easter also purchased a colt by Grand Slam--Her Ladyship ([hip 118](#)) for Deutsch for \$50,000. Saratoga Glen Farm LLC, agent, consigned the New York-bred, who hails from the family of Badge of Silver.

Summer Bird Full Leads Trio of \$100K Fillies...

Three fillies--two by Tapit and a full-sibling to champion Summer Bird--sold for \$100,000 each to share top honors among the fairer sex, including a pair who sold back-to-back. First through the ring was [hip](#)

[131](#), a chestnut (somewhat improbably, given her bloodlines) Tapit filly out of the Grade III-winning Holy Bull mare Hollywood Picture. Dapple Bloodstock purchased the filly from the Paramount Sales draft.

[Hip 132](#), the Birdstone full-sister to Summer Bird, followed just after. Consigned by Ben and Elaine Walden's Pauls Mill Bloodstock, the filly was knocked down to Dromoland on behalf of successful commercial breeder Peter Blum. "She was a splendid filly," said Ben Walden. "She was a late May foal, and I wish she had an extra 30 days [to develop], because she really sold below her value. But Peter Blum is a guy who knows value when he sees it, and he's a smart end-user. I would say they bought a really, really nice filly for that kind of money to add to his race stable and, ultimately, his broodmare band."

The filly, a daughter of the 15-year-old mare Hong Kong Squall (Summer Squall), was bred by retired cardiologist Kalarikkal Jayaraman and his wife, retired pathologist Vilasini. The Jayaramans purchased Hong Kong Squall as a yearling for \$22,000 at the 1997 Keeneland September Sale. She was a modest performer on the track, but proved a gem in the breeding shed after Summer Bird collected the GI Belmont S., GI Travers S. and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup in his championship season in 2009.

The third of the \$100,000 fillies was [hip 173](#), a gray by Tapit--Jig (Ire) (Catrail) who went to Kinwy Stables. John Stuart's Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services consigned the Apr. 29-foaled miss.

Brilliant Timing for Middleton & Horton...

For breeder Charles Middleton and partner Rae Horton, the sale of [hip 289](#)--a colt by Songandaprayer out of Merry Me In Spring--to Adena Springs for \$92,000, proved a case of ideal timing. But then, that's becoming a trend with the colt's family.

Three years ago, Middleton was in the hunt for a mare in foal to then first-crop sire Medaglia d'Oro. He got shut out on three, but was able to buy a fourth, the stakes-winning Merry Me In Spring (Wekiva Springs). He paid \$57,000 for the 7-year-old at Keeneland November.

"She was a great-looking mare," said Middleton. "She was a little light on pedigree, but she was a fabulous-looking horse."

Around the same time, a filly named Rachel Alexandra was just emerging as top juvenile, and after her exploits the following year, Medaglia d'Oro's stock soared. So much so that when Middleton returned to Keeneland a year later with the resulting produce, Merry Me in Spring's eye-catching weanling colt by Medaglia d'Oro, a spirited bidding duel ensued. BG Stables won the day on a \$190,000 bid, providing Middleton and Horton, his neighbor, a nice return on their initial investment.

On Saturday, that colt, the now 2-year-old So Brilliant, made an extremely promising debut for the Bob Baffert barn. At 3-5, So Brilliant--eventually a \$300,000 FTfEB juvenile acquisition by Arnold Zetcher--was on the lead through a wicked half in :44.56, and despite running greenly in the stretch, won by 2 1/2 lengths. The final time for the six-furlong race was 1:09.02 ([video](#)). In addition to the victory, of course, So Brilliant gave his year-younger Songandaprayer half-brother, selling from the Warrendale Sales draft, a huge update.

"I was actually planning to race this colt," Middleton admitted yesterday. "Before Saturday, I didn't think he'd bring much more than \$35,000, and at that price I was going to keep him. But the [\$92,000] was so much more than I expected to get for him. My trainer, Dave Kassen, was standing right next to me, and I think he was the most disappointed guy in the whole room!"

Middleton said that there could more good things from Merry Me in Spring next year. "I have a Kitten's Joy weanling filly from her at the farm, and she's going to be a great-looking yearling, too," he said. "She's big and has a great body. We'll probably put her up for sale."

Middleton, an attorney based near Louisville and the nephew of the prominent late horseman Warner Jones, has been in the Thoroughbred business actively since 1983, when he purchased a farm in Shelbyville. In 1990, he campaigned the homebred mare Countus In (Dancing Count) to victory in the GI Matriarch S. at Hollywood, and estimates he's bred 15 or so stakes winners.

"I race one or two a year, as well, and we just hope to get lucky sometimes," he said. "I have five mares on the farm. We're selling one in foal to Lemon Drop Kid at Keeneland November, and I'll probably add another one or two after that."

Middleton is quick to credit those around him, including Warrendale's Kitty Taylor. "Kitty has been working with me selling horses since her days at Vinery, and I think we've now been doing this for 20 years," he said. "She's been a special gal and has helped a lot--she helps me pick 'em and helps me sell 'em."

Middleton concluded of his afternoon, "This has been the love of my life for 30-some years, and sometimes we have good days. Today was a great day."

Monday Notebook..

A pair of yearlings from the first crop of dual Classic winner Big Brown sold well. [Hip 78](#), a colt by the Boundary sire out of Gift to the World (His Majesty), went to Adena Springs for \$120,000. That was the second-highest price of the session. Hunter Valley Farm, agent, consigned the half-brother to GSW Uncle Denny (In Excess {Ire}). About 15 minutes before that colt sold, [hip 71](#), a daughter of Big Brown out of Galaxy Dancer (Kingmambo) was hammered down to Richard Balfour for \$95,000. Three Chimneys, which stands Big Brown, consigned the Jan. 25-foaled filly, from the family of GSW Lotka (Danzig), GSW Lotta Dancing (Alydar) and GSW Fantasticat (Storm Cat).

Adena Springs continued its fall buying spree. Frank Stronach's operation was the fifth-leading buyer last month at Keeneland September, purchasing a whopping 44 yearlings for \$4,574,000 (\$103,955 average), and between Adena Springs and Adena Springs North, added no fewer than 12 yearlings to the fold yesterday for a total of \$704,000.

Adena's purchases ranged from a \$4,000 Sun King filly ([hip 61](#)) to the aforementioned hip 78, the \$120,000 Big Brown--Gift to the World. Adena also purchased the third-highest price of the auction, going to \$110,000 for [hip 283](#), a colt from the first crop of champion Midnight Lute out of May Day Bluff (Pine Bluff). The colt is a half-sibling to a pair of nice horses in this year's 3-year-old filly May Day Rose (Rockport Harbor) and SW May Day Vow (Broken Vow). KHRC EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR LEAVING POST

Edited Press Release

Lisa E. Underwood announced Monday that she is stepping down as executive director of the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC), effective Nov. 16. Underwood will rejoin the law firm of Wyatt, Tarrant & Combs LLP as a partner to practice equine and business law. She has served as executive director since October 2006. Governor Steve Beshear will appoint KHRC Deputy Executive Director Marc Guilfoil to serve as interim executive director while a nationwide search is conducted.

"The Commonwealth and the industry will miss Lisa's leadership," said Gov. Beshear. "When I appointed the Governor's Task Force on the Future of Horse Racing in Kentucky, I told Lisa I expected to see a number of aggressive, positive recommendations from the group and I was not disappointed. Her leadership in implementing the many positive changes to the way the industry and the public participate in horse racing has been tremendous. We wish her the best of luck."

"This was a difficult decision to make, one that I did not make lightly," said Underwood. "I had several goals when I was first appointed, including establishing a world-class laboratory in Kentucky, hiring an equine medical director and focusing on integrity and safety issues. I am proud of the accomplishments that have been made during my time at the KHRC, and much of that credit goes to the staff of the KHRC, as well as the commissioners who have worked tirelessly to help me accomplish our goals. I am excited to be able to return to my roots at Wyatt, Tarrant & Combs as an equine and business attorney."

NYTB Announces Awards Increases for 2012:

The New York Breeding and Development Fund has announced a 50% increase in breeders' awards for all New York-sired and non-New York-sired horses in 2012. Earnings caps will also be raised significantly. Breeders of New York-sired New York-breds who win a race in the state of New York currently receive a bonus worth 20% of the winners' share of the purse up to \$10,000--those numbers will increase to 30% with a cap of \$40,000, with similar increases across the board. See the table below for a breakdown of all changes.

"Raising the breeder's awards percentages is yet another message to breeders across the country that New York is open for business and the incentives and purses here are up for grabs," said Jeffrey Cannizzo, Executive Director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc. "If you have mares and are contemplating the move, simply take a look at the numbers: 600-plus restricted races with \$35 million-plus in state-bred purses and an incentive Breeding Fund worth upwards of \$17 million in 2012."

Cannizzo continued, "Raising the awards by 50% across the board will further increase the net worth of New York-bred foals and, hopefully, get more cash back into breeders' and owners' hands. We took an additional stride towards rewarding excellence by raising the cap on breeders' awards. Now, the sky is virtually the limit for breeders whose horses are winning purses of significant value. They will be rewarded for excellence. There is endless opportunity here with great upside for every class of breeder."

It was very unfortunate that he sustained a hind-leg injury in his last piece of work prior to the Dewhurst, as you wouldn't be worried about taking on anyone. He's undoubtedly the model and type to go forward dramatically as a 3-year-old."

FRANKEL'S BROTHER DEBUTS All eyes will be on Khalid Abdullah's **Noble Mission (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) as the full-brother to superstar Frankel (GB) makes his eagerly awaited debut in a mile maiden at Yarmouth today. Sir Henry Cecil has opted to introduce the latest progeny of Kind (GB) (Danehill) in the British Stallion Studs Supporting British Racing EBF Maiden S., which was won by another Juddmonte luminary, Sea Moon (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}), 12 months ago and Frankel's three-parts brother Bullet Train (GB) (Sadler's Wells) in 2009. "We're very pleased with him and we hope he can run decently, but he's not going to be Frankel," said Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. "He has done everything nicely at home, but it is slightly bad luck for the horse who his brother is. He is straightforward and we look forward to seeing him make his debut."
