RECORD 193 PRE-ENTERED FOR CUP

A record 193 horses were pre-entered for this year's Breeders' Cup World Championship, which return to Churchill Downs for the eighth time in the event's 28-year history Nov. 5-6. Among the stars expected for this year's championship are the remarkable **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa), seeking an historic fourth straight win in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile; and last year's juvenile champion **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie), who will try for a second Breeders' Cup victory in the GI Classic after battling back from a life-threatening liver disease. Classic pre-entries also include **Havre de Grace** (Saint

Liam), who will make her case to become the third straight filly to earn Horse of the Year honors when she tackles the boys in the Classic; and **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) will look to extend his dominance to a third continent in his first attempt on the dirt.

"These horses represent a brilliant cross-section of international talent returning again to Louisville for two outstanding days of racing," commented President and Chief Executive Officer Craig Fravel. "There is no better place than Churchill Downs and no better management team to put on a significant event in the racing world."

The pre-entries include 29 overseas horses and 66 Group/Grade I winners. Uncle Mo and Goldikova are joined by six other returning Breeders' Cup champions: last year's Sprint champion **Big Drama** (Montbrook), the last two winners of the Turf Sprint in **California Flag** (Avenue of Flag) and **Chamberlain Bridge** (War Chant), and the last two winners of the GI F/M Turf in **Middy (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) and **Shared Account** (Pleasantly Perfect), as well as last year's Marathon winner **Eldaafer** (A.P. Indy).

Get Stormy Tunes Up

Sullimar Stable's **Get Stormy** (Stormy Atlantic) tuned up for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile with a five furlong move over the Keeneland lawn in 1:00.80 ([video](#)). He was caught in splits of :25.20, :49.40 and galloped out in 1:14.60. "It was just what we were looking for," trainer Tom Bush said. "We needed to finish up strong and gallop out and he did. He went the last quarter in :22 and 4. That's good enough. We did what we needed to do." Get Stormy, coming off a runner-up effort behind Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) in the Oct. 8 GI Shadwell Turf Mile, was 11th in last year's Mile, but Bush is looking for an improved effort this year. "We think he's a better horse [than last year]," Bush said. "We were disappointed in the effort last year. We had some issues that we had to deal with after that, with his throat and all. We're pleased with him. We really are. We think he's going to run well."

Gio Ponti Likely Mile Bound

Multiple champion **Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat), coming off a win in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile, was cross-entered in both the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and GI Breeders' Cup Mile. The Castleton Lyons runner was second behind Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) in the Mile last year and runner-up behind Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) in the Classic the year before. "He will most likely go to the Mile," trainer Christophe Clement said yesterday. The 6-year-old worked five furlongs over Belmont Park's inner turf yesterday in 1:02.11. "It was a very, very good work," Clement commented. "He was very relaxed and I was pleased with his gallop-out. He will ship to Kentucky on Tuesday."

Also working at Belmont yesterday, GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic hopeful **It's Tricky** (Mineshaft) worked a bullet five furlongs over the main track in 1:00.10. "It was a very nice work; we were happy," reported trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "We worked her last Tuesday and with the rain coming, we decided to work her today. She's plenty fit, so we won't do anything more with her. All systems are go."

CONGRESSIONAL HEARING ON INTERNET POKER

The House Energy and Commerce Committee's Subcommittee on Commerce, Manufacturing and Trade held a hearing Tuesday on Internet poker. Comments from members of Congress and the witnesses focused largely on the need for consumer protection, regulation and the opportunity to use Internet poker as a revenue-raiser for the federal and state governments.

Rep. Mary Bono Mack (R-CA) chaired the hearing with ranking member Rep. G.K. Butterfield (D-NC). Among other attendees were Reps. Joe Barton (R-TX) and Brett Guthrie (R-KY).

Rep. Guthrie, co-chair of the Congressional Horse Caucus, spoke on behalf of his state's signature industry. In a brief statement, Guthrie noted that online poker would have a significant impact on horse racing - not only in Kentucky, but nationally.

Rep. Joe Barton (R-TX), who this year introduced a bill for online poker, emphasized that the current system is unregulated, untaxed and largely operated offshore, and urged passage of his bill, H.R. 2366.

Witnesses who addressed the subcommittee included those with interests in consumer protection, tribal gaming, problem gambling and poker.

A second hearing, this time with state lawmakers, is planned.

The NTRA has been involved with I-gaming since 2000 and continues to defend horse racing's interests in this key market segment.

Head Confident in Four-Peat Bid

It wasn't long after the cheers had died down from **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa)'s historic third win in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, that the Wertheimers announced their star mare would stay in training in 2011 for a tilt at an improbable fourth Mile. The 6-year-old mare began the year with a win in the G1 Prix d'Isphahan, and despite earning a 14th Group 1 tally in the G1 Prix

Rothschild, has seemed vulnerable with runner-up efforts in the G1 Queen Anne S., G1 Prix Jacques le Marois and G1 Prix de la Foret. Still, trainer Freddy Head enters this year's Breeders' Cup with plenty of confidence.

"She looks the same," Head reported yesterday. "She works the same at home.

She maybe hasn't been very lucky this year. Maybe at Deauville [in the le Marois], we didn't have the best of runs, the going was a bit soft. And as for the [Foret], it was a record-breaking race. She missed in the Queen Anne at Ascot by just a length and I knew it was going to be a very tough race because the mile at Ascot is a bit far for her, it's very testing. But otherwise, I think she has done everything that we've wanted her to do. I think her form is as good, if not better, than last year. I think she's done as well as she did last year. I come with great confidence."

Head is looking forward to the historic challenge.

"It seems unreal to be going for a fourth Breeders' Cup," he admitted. "It is a very special thing. To train a 6-year-old mare is something that I've never done before. All this is new territory. This year, I must say, I was very happy with her. I think she is as good as she has ever been."

Repole Thinks Mo is the Comeback Kid

Owner Mike Repole and trainer Todd Pletcher had things all mapped out for their juvenile champion **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie).

"At the beginning of the year, Todd and I scripted that we wanted to be in the Breeders' Cup Classic at the end of the year," Repole recalled yesterday. "This is not the way we wanted to do it, but we got here and we should be first, second or third favorite [in the Classic]."

The majority of Uncle Mo's sophomore campaign was lost when he was diagnosed with a liver disease, but the champ has bounced back with a gritty runner-up effort in the Aug. 27 GI King's Bishop S. followed by a sparkling three-length victory in the Oct. 1 GII Kelso H. Should the handsome bay complete the comeback with a win in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, Repole thinks he'll be more than just racing's Horse of the Year.

"To me, if he wins the Classic, not only is he Horse of the Year, he's probably ESPN Comeback player of the year, he's probably *Sports Illustrated* athlete of the year. What he's doing at such a high level is

remarkable; losing 200 pounds in May and June, gaining that weight back and now competing at this level. To me that takes, not a super horse, but one of the greatest of all times, to pull off a feat like this, if he is able to do it."

And Repole thinks Uncle Mo is up to the challenge.

"Uncle Mo has never looked better, has never trained better," the *New Yorker* stated. "This is the Uncle Mo we thought we'd see the whole 3-year-old

season."

Repole, who plans to host "60-70 friends and family" at the Breeders' Cup, said that Uncle Mo may come back for a 4-year-old campaign despite an agreement to stand the colt at Ashford upon his retirement.

"There is definitely a chance [he'll come back], whether he wins or he loses," Repole said. "When I negotiated the deal back in July and August, I didn't even know if Uncle Mo would make it back to the races. The deal was, if he doesn't come back to the races, we'll retire him in July, and if he comes back, we'll just play it by ear. This is a partnership, I didn't sell the horse 100%. I own a significant portion of the horse. If Uncle Mo comes back next year, it will be because Todd and I think it is the right thing. And if Uncle Mo doesn't come back, it will be because we are doing what is best for him. It will not be a Coolmore or Ashford decision."

Havre de Grace a Revelation for Porter

By just about anyone's standards **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam) had a pretty good season in 2010, hitting the board in all six starts while keeping top company. The filly won the GII Cotillion S. and was second in the GI Alabama S., GI Go For Wand S. and third in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic. Owner Rick Porter admitted he didn't know what to expect when the talented bay returned for a 4-year-old campaign.

"Originally, when [trainer] Larry [Jones] got the horse at the first of the year, I don't think we anticipated where we would be now," Porter said.

Havre de Grace began the year with wins in the GIII Azeri S., GI Apple Blossom H. and GIII Obeah S. The filly suffered her first loss of the year when second after a dramatic battle with Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision) in the GII Delaware H., but talk about a possible Horse of the Year title began after a 1 1/4-length victory in the Sept. 3 GI Woodward S.

"She continued to improve through the Azeri and the Apple Blossom," Porter explained. "And then we made some choices in our races in New York and things have worked out beautifully for us. It's been a great surprise for her to mature as a 4-year-old and she is at the top of her game right now."

Havre de Grace was cross-entered in both the Classic and Friday's GI Ladies' Classic, but Porter confirmed the fillies' race was just a fall-back.

"The only reason that we wouldn't run in the Classic, I think, is if we drew the one hole, or if we saw a complete difference in the weather on Friday and Saturday," Porter explained. "I am using the entry into the Ladies' Classic strictly as an insurance policy in case a couple things go wrong."

O'Brien Holds Court

Aidan O'Brien yesterday gave the low-down on the stable's big three for the Classic, Turf and Mile, admitting that he was in the dark as to whether **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) would handle the dirt. The Ballydoyle conditioner also revealed that the use of lasix would be governed by looking at each horse in turn, suggesting that the recent flop of **Zoffany (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) in Keeneland's GI Shadwell Turf Mile may have been down to the use of that medication. "So You Think has those attributes we feel that you need, but we don't know about the dirt as he hasn't run on it before," O'Brien said. "We think he's a great traveler through his races and is tactically sharp. He is a very mature, seasoned horse and we always thought the world of him, but his high cruising speed makes him unique and the better the race, the better those horses are. He has an amazing constitution and capacity for work and he had a couple of months off in the summer with an autumn campaign in mind. Very few horses can be backed up in big races like this and he didn't lose a kilo at Ascot last time. That shows how strong and competitive he is and he's naturally very quick from the gates like Giant's Causeway.

"Ryan [Moore] will decide where he is in the race, but usually he has pace to get a nice position," the trainer added. O'Brien also revealed that ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Await the Dawn** (Giant's Causeway) will sidestep the Classic in favor of the Turf. "Await the Dawn is a horse we dreamt about this year and

everything was going to plan up to York, but he was close to passing away after that and it was touch and go for a long time. We think it was travel sickness brought on by anxiety and it's unusual that he is able to be back to where he is and being considered as a runner. We're very happy to go for the Turf, which wouldn't be as extreme a test for him as the Classic." Of the Mile hope Zoffany, he added, "We were excited about him after his run in the G1 St James's Palace S., but he lost his way

and his latest performance may have been down to first-time lasix, as we couldn't put our finger on any other reason and he seems to be well since. Every horse is different and there is no hard-and-fast rule regarding lasix, so each horse will be discussed. All the horses are in a good place and the races are coming up nicely, so we're looking forward to it."

Musical Romance Supplemented to F/M Sprint...

When interviewed for a *TDN* "Take Two" piece last week, Pinnacle Racing Stable's Adam Lazarus knew that in **Musical Romance** (Concorde's Tune), a \$22,000 juvenile acquisition, he had a filly with the quality to be a contender in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint, but was looking at a hefty fee to nominate her to the Breeders' Cup. "Unless I hit the Powerball, we're probably not going to run," he said matter-of-factly. Well, there was no seven-figure jackpot to tap into, but Lazarus and trainer Bill Kaplan, his partner in Pinnacle Racing, decided to pony up the money and Musical Romance will make the trip to Churchill after all.

"It had nothing to do with whether she could compete, but just that it was going to be so expensive to do it," said Lazarus, who admitted that last week's withdrawal of Sassy Image (Broken Vow), who nipped Musical Romance in the GI Princess Rooney H. in July, was a motivating factor. "Bill came to me on Sunday and said, 'What do you think?' and was there anyone in the race you're really afraid of. I said, 'No.' Our jockey Juan Leyva and Bill have done such a terrific job with her, and this is their life and their dream. It also puts our partnership in the spotlight and hope it generates some publicity for us. This type of opportunity doesn't come along very often."

And Lazarus isn't planning on going to Louisville simply to collect monogrammed purple baseball caps.

"We're going with a really live shot to win the whole thing," he offered.



Mace Siegel Dies (cont. from p1)

Mace Siegel founded Macerich Company of Santa Monica, a company which develops, owns and manages regional shopping malls. He retired from the company in 2008. The New Jersey native and his late wife, Jan, purchased their first racehorse in 1964 and celebrated their first stakes win in 1976 with Wininreno.

Siegel and daughter Samantha began racing horses under the banner Jay Em Ess Stable to honor Jan Siegel after her death in 2002. The stable was represented by

2004 champion juvenile Declan's Moon, as well as Grade I winners Urbane, I Ain't Bluffing, Stormy But Valid, Miss Iron Smoke, Hedonist, and I Believe In You. The family's blue and green silks were carried to victory by Rail Trip in the 2009 GI Hollywood Gold Cup and GII Californian S.,

while Boys of Tosconova won last year's GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. and was second in the GI Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

"Racing can be quite frustrating, in more ways than one," Siegel was once quoted as saying. "But it's a wonderful game, and we've had great fun."

Siegel has been involved in many philanthropic endeavors. In February, he pledged more than \$1.5 million to endow the Jan and Mace Siegel Professorship in Hematology & Hematopoietic Cell Transplantation at the City of Hope cancer center. He was honored by the group with its 2007 Spirit of Life Award. He and his daughter Samantha were honored by the Edwin Gregson Foundation in 2008.

In addition to Samantha, Siegel is survived by his son Evan and a granddaughter, Riley.

Anthony Stroud and David Loder signed for the 3-year-old, who raced for breeder Woodcote Stud and trainer Richard Hannon, and he was a prize that was not easily won. Alastair Donald of Sackville Donald, bidding on behalf of Macau trainer Gary Moore, also tried hard for the colt, and the eventual

underbidder was agent Paul Moroney, acting for his brother Mike, who trains at Flemington in Australia.

"We had to really pay top whack for him but he's a genuine group horse," said Stroud, whose purchase is likely to race for a Darley entity in Dubai. "He hasn't been allocated to a trainer yet, and we keep coming up against the Australian buyers for these horses."

Stroud later outbid Mick Flanagan of Dermot Farrington Bloodstock to pay 200,000gns for **Naqshabban** (Street Cry {Ire}), who was narrowly beaten in a Saturday handicap at Newbury for trainer Luca Cumani and owner Sheikh Mohammed Obaid Al Maktoum.

While U.S. buyers have been notably quiet at a sale they once dominated, there has been a bigger Australian representation than ever, and Caulfield-based handler Robert Smerdon, who could be represented by Shewan (Aus) (Blevic {Aus}) in Tuesday's G1 Emirates Melbourne Cup, was paying his first shopping visit to Newmarket. Smerdon

was advised by locally based agent Stephen Hillen, and they paid 260,000gns for Juddmonte homebred **Verdant (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}), who was Listed-placed for trainer Sir Michael Stoute. Tom Pritchard-Gordon of Badgers Bloodstock also made a play for the 4-year-old, on whom Ciaran McManus, son of top jump owner J P McManus, was underbidder.

Smerdon and Hillen teamed up to buy the following lot, the smart handicapper **Arch Fire** (Arch), for 180,000gns. He was another Juddmonte offering conditioned by Stoute. Smerdon is employed at one of three stables run under the Aquanita Racing banner, and he had been drawn to Newmarket by the recent successes of European horses in Australia.

"I was put in touch with Stephen through [jockey] Johnny Murtagh, and he has been a big help with his knowledge of the local form," Smerdon explained. "We did a lot of work on the catalogue but I am a novice feeling my way. We've had the occasional European horse before but they could make up half the Melbourne Cup field next week, and I decided to come here and tip my toe in the water. We have looked at some privately as well with Stephen, and these were the only two we bid on at the sale." **Cont. p12**

"He has been a pacemaker and has looked a tired horse and we'll give him some time off to freshen up and look forward to this time next year. They need plenty of time to acclimatise," said Moroney, buying for his trainer brother Mike. "It's very good value for us coming here. You'd be paying that sort of money for something with no black-type form from New Zealand, and an equivalent horse would make about NZ\$500,000."

Moroney's sentiments were echoed by Bruce Slade, assistant to famed Australian trainer Gai Waterhouse, and another first-time buyer at Tattersalls. After spending 125,000gns through Johnny McKeever on Jeremy Nosedo's two-time winner **Galiando (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), Slade reflected: "I've found it great value here, and the same standard of stayers would cost between a quarter and a half more if we got them from New Zealand."

The sale concludes today with a lower-key final session starting at 9:30 a.m.

VINTAGE RENEWAL OF F-T FALL CONCLUDES

The Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearlings Sale got off to a strong start at the company's Newtown Paddocks in Lexington Monday, but what looked like an auspicious opener proved to be the most modest of three days of selling, as the sale concluded its three-day stand with an outstanding final session yesterday. On the day, no fewer than four horses made over

\$200,000, led by a Medaglia d'Oro--Catumbella colt who went to Adena Springs for a sale-topping \$380,000. Mill Ridge consigned the half-brother to GISW Honor in War (Lord at War {Arg}) as [hip 915](#), with Mark Casse coming in as the direct underbidder. Just as encouraging, eight horses brought six figures Wednesday, pushing the

sale total to 22. By way of comparison, only nine horses made six figures during the entirety of last year's sale, when only two made \$200,000 or more. The sale average of \$24,010 was up 76.3%, while the sale median of \$12,000 was up an even more substantial 140%. "People were really hungry for horses here," said Bluewater Sales' Meg Levy. "I guess it's just supply meeting demand. People feel a little more positive, and it seems the market has solidified since September." Fasig-Tipton's President and CEO Boyd Browning, Jr. said he was thrilled with the results. "The main body of the sale was very successful, and there was strong demand to the very end. I had some consignors express some concern when the catalogue came out--'Will there be enough money there? What am I going to do with a late hip number?'--but we saw horses bring over \$100,000 late in the catalogue and multiple bidders on many of the last lots, so the demand was there throughout the sale. Overall, the sale was very encouraging to us, and very encouraging to the overall marketplace." Many observers at least partially attributed the rebound in this year's yearling sales to advantageous tax breaks. In 2011, buyers can write-off 100% of their purchases if the horses are put into use this year. That number goes down 50% next year. "The tax break is huge," said trainer Kenny McPeck. "Next year, there could be a significant dip [without it]."

Adena Again, This Time for Sale Topper...

Frank Stronach's Adena Springs continued to amass a wide array of prospects at Fasig-Tipton, a month after bringing home no fewer than 44 yearlings at Keeneland

September. Adena purchased at least 32 yearlings at the Fasig-Tipton Fall Yearling sale, including five of the auction's 22 six-figure horses. Fittingly, it was Adena's perseverance for the sale-topping Medaglia d'Oro--Catumbella colt that provided the sale's highlight. Adena reps

Mark Roberts, Jack Brothers and Dan Hall--perched on the second floor of the sale pavilion just to the right of the press box--outlasted Mark Casse, who was on the phone directly under them crouching against the back wall. From the family of European Horse of the Year Allez France and Grade I winners like La Gueriere and Icon Project, the well-made youngster had all the ingredients, said Roberts. "He was just a really, really nice colt, and he's a half to a Grade I winner," he said. "It's a great family; Frank's had some success out of that family before, and he was just a big, strong colt. We liked him a lot." Roberts added the price was no surprise. "It was maybe a touch higher than we first thought, but not by much." Roberts was among the many buyers who complimented Fasig on the quality of horses assembled at the sale. "I think they've done a great job," said Roberts. "It's become a sale people aren't afraid to come to and buy a horse at."

Wrong Sale, Right Price...

As was the case with the \$260,000 Arch filly that topped Tuesday's session, the sale-topping \$380,000

Medaglia d'Oro--Catumbella colt was being pointed toward a previous auction--in this case Fasig's Saratoga Selected Sale--before a minor injury suffered on shipping day altered plans. "He came up with some swelling, and so we were forced to scratch him," said consignor Mill Ridge's Headley Bell. "Thankfully, Bayne Welker and Fasig-Tipton worked with us and supported us, and gave us confidence that there would be people here to support the sale.

They've done a heckuva job, just as everybody on the farm did a great job. Mark Casse, who I think is as good a judge of horses as anyone, wanted him very badly, as did Mark Roberts and Adena--and they have an exceptional team as well.

So we were very fortunate that two top buyers wanted the horse. But he was a Saratoga horse that just happened to be in this sale. Thankfully, this market here could support a Saratoga horse. He brought what he was worth--he was that kind of horse. But truly, he stood out in this market. At Saratoga, he was just another one."

Mill Ridge co-bred the colt, in partnership with Audrey "Tolie" Otto's JAMM Ltd. "She's a partner on Keeper Hill and has been a dear friend of the farm," Bell said of Otto. Originally from St. Louis, Otto has been living in Lexington for the past 20 years and was on hand to watch the colt sell. She has bred, among others, millionaire Strut the Stage and GSW Zavata. Otto bought an interest in Keeper Hill when that filly was a 2-year-old in 1997 and, along with Mill Ridge, campaigned the daughter of Deputy Minister to a win in the following year's GI Kentucky Oaks. The name of Otto's operation from the first initial of her four children: John, Audrey, Michael and Matthew.

'Strike' Force Four for Casse...

Mark Casse might have been shut out on the sale topper, but did walk away from Fasig with four other yearlings, including the sale's second-highest-priced horse, [hip 780](#), a colt by Smart Strike who was hammered down for \$270,000. Bluewater Sales consigned the son of Yaqeen (GB) (Sadler's Wells), a stakes-winning half-sister to MGISW Grand Couturier (GB) (Grand Lodge). As was the case when he purchased a Lemon Drop Kid--Present Danger colt for \$190,000 on Tuesday, Casse opted to not identify his client, but did confirm the horses were purchased for the same person.

Asked about his dearest acquisition, Casse said, "I love Smart Strike--I trained a champion by him a few years ago--and I just thought he was a nice colt. When you get all those things together..."

He added, "We're always trying to buy two-turn horses, and I thought he looked like one. But a lot of the Smart Strikes are pretty versatile and can do a little bit of everything. We'll break him now, and let him tell us what he wants to do."

Casse said the colt and the rest of his purchases will now be sent to his Moonshadow Farm in Florida. "We'll break them there, and when they get up to start breeding, then we'll send them over to [the] OBS [sales and training complex]."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races.



Another Strong Fasig Sale for Bluewater...

For a time Wednesday afternoon, it looked like Meg Levy's Bluewater Sales would be represented by its third Fasig-Tipton sale topper in the past 15 months. Mill Ridge's Medaglia d'Oro colt ultimately blocked the hat trick, but the Lexington-based operation nonetheless had reason to celebrate after selling the sale's second-highest-priced horse, the Smart Strike--Yaqeen (GB) colt who went to Mark Casse for \$270,000. The colt is the second foal from his 7-year-old dam, and was scratched from a previous engagement at Keeneland September in favor of this spot. Levy judged the time between sales only helped the colt's cause, and said the price wasn't unexpected. "Not after he got 12 scopes," she said. "That's a lot for any sale. He's jumped forward a lot in the last couple of months, and he's a horse with a big hip and looks like he could be early. He had a lot of activity, and this market's just been fantastic." Bluewater's recent run at Fasig sales began at the 2010 July Sale, where Gold Rally (Medaglia d'Oro--Beright) brought \$450,000; the following month in Saratoga, Bluewater sold the \$1.2 million Global Response (A.P. Indy--Maryfield).



Branham Steps Up for Medaglia Filly...

Five years ago, owner Doug Branham purchased a property out on Paris Pike that he would wind up christening Hurricane Hills Farm, and yesterday, the successful businessman took a big step populating that farm with blue-blooded fillies. Bidding in the press box alongside Ken McPeek and the trainer's buying team, Branham bought [hip 844](#), a filly by Medaglia d'Oro out of Grade I winner Awesome Humor (Distorted Humor), for \$250,000. It was the second-highest price for a filly during the main portion of the sale. Bred by WinStar Farm, the filly was consigned by Chris Baccari's Baccari Bloodstock LLC. She had previously been offered at last month's Keeneland September Sale, but was bought back for \$190,000. The filly's dam, Awesome Humor, won the 2002 renewal of the GI Spinaway S. at Saratoga in addition to three other graded events during her career. She was also second in the 2003 edition of the GI Alabama S.

"The best filly in the sale, and maybe the best horse in the sale," asserted McPeek. "She just had all the right parts. She was a really good version of a Medaglia d'Oro. I ran against the mare, Awesome Humor, and she's even better looking than her momma was. Doug's got a farm out on Paris Pike and is trying to upgrade for the long term with his fillies and mares, and this is the kind of filly I encouraged him to go for."

Branham is the president of Colonial Claims Corporation, an insurance business that facilitates catastrophic claims during hurricanes, earthquakes and the like.

"The reason [the farm is] called Hurricane Hills is because he worked Hurricane Katrina," said McPeek. "Any natural disaster, his company is involved in."

McPeek is no stranger to success at this sale. He bought his very first stakes winner--Warside (Lord at War {Arg})--for just \$9,500 here in 1991, and has added several others in the ensuing years.

"There are a lot of good horses that come out of here every year," McPeek said. "It's kind of the same as the last few days of Keeneland [September]. You're getting about 3% stakes winners from this sale, so if there are 1,000 horses, you know there are 30 in here. You just have to find them. At September, they historically go from 7% stakes winners on Day 1, and it tails off to about 2 or 3% by the end of the sale. You just have to flush them out, which is what Dominic, Rory and I do."

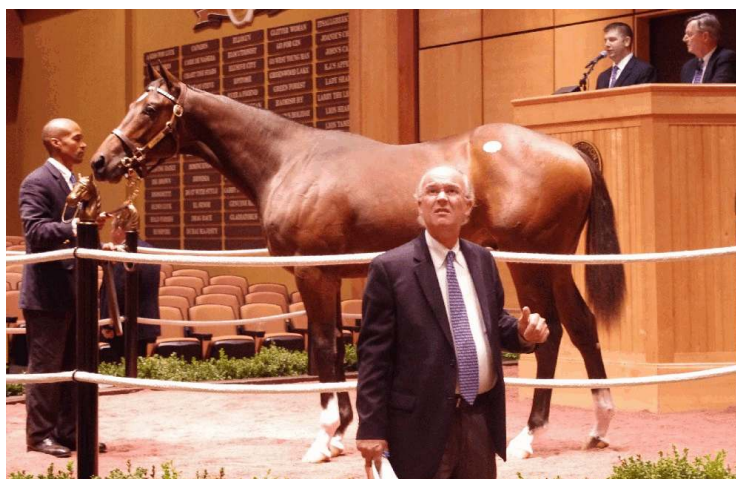
McPeek's team includes the Florida-based Dominic Brennan, who also breaks McPeek's horses, and bloodstock agent Rory Callis.

much, she seems to be able to sense winning bids. At least that's the way it looked yesterday, when she stood up and began wagging her tail after Miller, who operates the consulting agency EQB with founder Jeff Sedar, launched the winning \$150,000 salvo for [hip 732](#), an attractive Lemon Drop Kid half-brother to Irish highweight Pathfork

(Distorted Humor). Lane's End consigned the Mar. 12-foaled bay, a son of the stakes-winning Visions of Clarity (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). Miller, sitting inside the sales pavilion a few rows up from the ring, outlasted several other bidders, including Hill 'n' Dale's Donato Lanni.

Miller said the colt's grass-influenced pedigree might have put some buyers off him at a sale not frequented by many international players.

"I think he was a bit of a fish out of water here, because he's a European-type turf horse," said Miller. "But God, there are a lot of good turf races in the United States. He's got a beautiful page, and if he can run like I'll think he'll be able to, then he could be worth a lot of money. I thought he was a very good physical, he jumped through all the hoops, and I just really liked the horse."

Miller declined to say for whom she was buying, but said there was a chance the colt could return to the auction ring as a 2-year-old.

"[The client is] an end-user, but sometimes he'll put a few through the juvenile sales," she said.

After signing the winning ticket, Miller was thanked by Lane's End's Callan Strouss, then got a vote of confidence from another astute horseman in Ben Walden. "I thought he was a lovely colt," said the Pauls Mill head. "And I think he's only going to improve."

Bred by the Niarchos family's Flaxman Holdings Ltd., the colt was produced by a 3/4-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Spinning World (Nureyev) and hails from the family of Chimes of Freedom, Denon, Aldebaran, et al. The colt's 3-year-old half-brother Pathfork, a \$230,000 KEESEP yearling in 2009, won last year's G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. and G2 Futurity S. The 10-year-old Visions of Clarity had an A.P. Indy colt this spring.

decades, and his efforts to cultivate and improve his stock in recent years was recognized last night at Fasig-Tipton, as several horses from the Flying Zee Dispersal - Phase I brought top dollar. Lizza passed away in July at the age of 73. All the horses in the dispersal, which was being handled by Hidden Brook, were New York-breds.

Leading the way was [hip 1118](#), a filly by Lemon Drop Kid out of Salty Romance (Salt Lake), who went to bloodstock agent Donato Lanni for \$375,000. Lanni was buying the filly for Glen Hill Farm. The filly was the beneficiary of a nice update last weekend when her half-sister Agave Kiss (Lion Heart) aired by over six lengths in a state-bred maiden special weight at Belmont, earning a 90 Beyer.

"Everybody was on her, everybody waited for her," said Lanni, who had to see off challenges from EQB's Patrice Miller and New York conditioner Phil Serpe. "She checked every box. She moved great, she did everything right, and is just a nice filly. When you've got one that nice, it doesn't matter where they're foaled."

Lanni added, "I'm happy to have gotten a filly from the dispersal. [Lizza] was a great breeder and did so much for the industry, and it's good to have one from their breeding program. I'm just fortunate to work for people who allow me to buy these kinds of horses."

Lanni has had success buying for Glen Hill at this sale before. Two years ago, he acquired the ill-fated three-time graded winner Banned (Kitten's Joy) for \$130,000. He's also had luck buying Lemon Drop Kid fillies for the Florida-based Glen Hill. He paid \$170,000 for the 2-year-old Customer Base, a daughter of the Lane's End stallion who was recently tabbed a **☆ "TDN Rising Star"** ☆ after winning a first-level allowance at Keeneland in impressive fashion Oct. 19.

Trainer Mark Hennig, who currently has a single horse in his care for Broadway producer Jerry Frankel and his brother Ronald, capitalized on his limited opportunities with Lily Lynn, who came from out of the clouds to post an eye-catching win at Belmont Wednesday afternoon. As recently as last spring, the owner/trainer combo tasted success with Chinglish (War Front), winner of the JW Murphy S. at Pimlico in May. Better Late Than Never...

Heading into her career debut off a series of solid, if not blistering morning works, the late-starting Lily Lynn was given only mild consideration for yesterday's unveiling. Even Hennig had some doubts going in.

"I honestly thought she would want more ground, because of the Dynaformer on the bottom side," said Hennig, referring to the sophomore's dam, Disturbing.

"[Jockey] Alex [Solis] and I talked about it in the paddock, and we knew there was going to be a lot of pace in the race. I told him, 'If you just sit patiently on her, she'll kick.' I knew if we got the right setup, she'd run by a lot of them late."

Despite being overlooked by New York bettors at generous odds of 17-1, the filly took advantage of crisp early splits and produced a sparkling turn of foot late to collect her first career victory under minimal encouragement.

"It's hard to be real confident going in with a horse that doesn't have a lot of speed, but she definitely showed some quality," admitted Hennig.

Serving as an advisor, Hennig picked out the bay for a modest \$65,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale in Timonium, Maryland.

"I really liked her action and she had a big, nice hip on her," recalled Hennig. "Even though she had the Dynaformer on the bottom side, she really looked like she would be a racy type. Most of the Dynaformers I've had have been a little longer and and lankier, and we felt that she had a little bit of a different quality to her."

Hennig indicated that he was also drawn to the filly because of her dam, Disturbing.

"She was boarded at Dr. Lavin's Longfield Farm in Kentucky," he said. "So I knew her and really liked the family well."

As for Lily Lynn's future, Hennig offered, "Ultimately, I'd like to send her to Florida. You have to keep at the back of your mind with a pedigree like that, the Langfuhr out of the Dynaformer mare, she may even relish the turf at some point, too. Since she is a 3-year-old, I'll probably bring her back in allowance company either at Aqueduct or Gulfstream."--CBoss

VENGEANCE OF RAIN DIES *Vengeance of Rain*

(NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), one of the most talented and beloved horses in Hong Kong history, passed away Monday at Cambridge Stud in New Zealand after suffering an apparent heart attack in his sleep. He was 11 years old. "He had a heart condition," trainer David Ferraris, who conditioned the gelding in Hong Kong, told *South China Morning Post*. "It just shows how good he was that he was able to achieve so much in spite of it. There were no marks, no injuries, and as far as we can tell no pain. [Cambridge Stud owner] Sir Patrick Hogan said he just went to sleep and didn't wake up. He was such a wonderful horse, one of those who come along once in a blue moon." A listed winner in Australia, the son of Danelagh (Aus) (Danehill) took flight in Hong Kong at four, winning the prestigious Hong Kong Derby before defeating Greys Inn (Zabeel {NZ}) in the Queen Elizabeth II Cup for his first international Group 1 score. He defeated another deep and talented field to win the G1 Hong Kong Cup in December 2005 and registered the most important and valuable victory of his career in the 2007 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. A three-time champion stayer in Hong Kong and its Horse of the Year in 2007, *Vengeance of Rain* was retired in early 2008 after a recurrence of a heart irregularity, which shut him down twice in his career. "It came all of a sudden for me, and when David told me this morning, I was shocked," owner Raymond Gianco Chow Hon-man told SCMP. "We think it might have been a heart attack in his sleep as there was no sign of any distress or injury. He was such a good horse, a true champion for the Hong Kong people and one who did so much for the Chow family too."
