JUVENILES BREEZE AT KEENELAND

Caroline Forgason's unbeaten **Somali Lemonade** (Lemon Drop Kid), last seen posting an impressive last-to-first victory in Keeneland's GIII Jessamine S. Oct. 13, fired a bullet four-furlong move in :47 over the Keeneland Polytrack Friday. Trained by Michael Matz, Somali Lemonade is likely to vie for favoritism in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Churchill Downs. "It's exactly what we wanted," Matz's assistant Joss Sabille said of the work.

"She's not missed a day [since the Jessamine]. She's been training good." Clockers caught Somali Lemonade galloping out five furlongs in :59.60 and six furlongs in 1:13.60. Exercise rider Lauren Robson was aboard for yesterday's move. Sabille added that Somali Lemonade "is very professional and easy to manage. She just gets on with it."

AQUEDUCT RACINO UP AND RUNNING

It took a while, but slots are finally up and running at a New York Racing Association venue. Just one day shy of 10 years since legislation authorizing electronic gaming at New York's racetracks was signed into law, a total of 2,280 video lottery terminals and 205 electronic table games were powered on at Resorts World Casino New York City at Aqueduct Racetrack.

ROCKET TWENTYONE TUNES UP AT CHURCHILL

Frank Fletcher's **Rocket Twentyone** (Indian Charlie), perfect in two starts including the GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie S. Sept. 10, worked four furlongs from the gate in :50.20 at Churchill Downs Friday. With regular rider Eddie Razo Jr. aboard, she galloped out five furlongs in 1:04.40. "She left the gate running, was on the bit the whole way and then galloped out nicely," Razo Jr said. "I'm very happy with the work and excited for the race." The \$300,000 OBSMAR juvenile has been pre-entered in both the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, but will be entered in the former, according to trainer Tom Howard.

Michael Speller, President of Resorts World, added, "We are thrilled to welcome the public to this extraordinary new entertainment venue, which will permanently employ 1,350 New Yorkers, of which 89% are either minorities or women. With 41,000 applicants for these 1,350 jobs, Resorts World New York City will work hard with the state and leadership to find ways to create even more jobs--as many as tens of thousands--on our site as soon as possible."

Resorts World will also provide a windfall of cash for the state's Thoroughbred industry. With \$119 million in payments allocated to NYRA annually, purses at Aqueduct in 2012 have already been raised by about 36%. Breeders' awards will also see a 50% spike, and several major breeding farms have significantly increased their presence in New York.

NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward said recently, "The opening of Genting's Resorts World New York Casino is a highly anticipated event that will benefit all of the stakeholders at Aqueduct, Belmont Park, and Saratoga Race Course. Increased purses will help bring more top owners, trainers, and horses to our tracks, create larger fields for our customers to wager on, and generate higher handle for our races."

All signs point to a major boom for the state's racing business.

Slots/Racing Divide Still Strong at Big A...

Resorts World New York City is an absolutely beautiful, state-of-the-art facility on par with or surpassing the premier casinos on the East Coast. It's aesthetically pleasing, offers traditional slots plus

electronic table games (including roulette, craps and baccarat, but not blackjack) and boasts an upscale food court, a buffet and fine dining restaurants that are slated to open later this winter along with another 2,240 VLTs and 270

ETGs as well as a large event space.

There are also large windows and observation decks that overlook the racetrack as well as trackside seating by the food court--all major improvements over many other racino venues that completely insulate slot patrons from any exposure to racing. But, despite these wonderful vantage points for watching live racing, there is nowhere (at this point) in the actual casino to place a bet on a race. Resorts World features significantly more television sets than typically seen on a casino floor, including one situated in the centrally located "Bar 360" that is said to be the largest in Queens, but not a single set appeared to be tuned to racing.

To place a wager on a horse race, bettors must travel through a corridor located at the south end of the casino. That path leads to what is left of Aqueduct's physical plant, which stands untouched and unrenovated, in stark contrast to the bright colors and elaborate decoration of Resorts World. The juxtaposition of the two areas is quite striking, and leaves no doubt which way a potential new customer would elect to turn.

Within the confines of the racetrack proper, it was business as usual for the everyday bettor. The general sentiment among simulcast patrons was positive, but subdued--some noted that they were glad something was being done with the venue's large empty spaces, but did not appear overly eager to join the throngs of people waiting to funnel into Resorts World when it opened at 1 p.m.

The slots crowd on the other hand, could best be described as frenzied. Lines snaked out from every entrance and around the building, and somewhere around 1:01 p.m. a brief chant of "Open the gate!" broke out.

The opening day turnout so far exceeded expectations that late Friday afternoon, Speller released the following statement. "We are overcome with the absolutely wonderful welcome the new Resorts World Casino New York City at Aqueduct has received today. Due to overwhelming demand at the much-anticipated grand opening, we ask that visitors who would prefer to not wait on line please come back and visit Resorts World next week, once the excitement around opening day subsides somewhat."

Hopefully some patrons will wander over to the simulcast section while they wait for an open slot machine. --*Brian DiDonato*

RACETRACK Round-Up

Mack Back for Another Crack at Melbourne Cup...

Manighar (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) will carry the hopes of American owner and breeder Earle Mack in Tuesday's G1 Emirates Melbourne Cup, a race in which he finished a respectable seventh of 23 runners in 2010. The 5-

year-old, fourth to fellow Cup hopeful Jukebox Jury (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in Deauville's G2 Prix Kergorlay Aug. 21, a race used by Americain (Dynaformer) as a springboard to Melbourne Cup success last year. In his most recent trip to the post, Manighar ran on to be fourth, three lengths behind Southern Speed (Aus) (Southern Image), in the G1 Caulfield Cup H. Oct. 15. Mack is thinking

positive.

"The Melbourne Cup is billed as the race that stops a nation and this will be my third attempt to win it. Trainer Luca Cumani feels he is coming into this race in good form. Luca has done a great job preparing Manighar," said Mack.

Connections felt that Manighar got too far behind in last year's race and had too much work to do in the latter stages, prompting an equipment adjustment for Tuesday's race.

"Luca Cumani has proposed using blinkers on Manighar for the first time in the Cup to get him into the race a bit earlier," Fiona Shaw, Mack's racing manager for European affairs, explained. "Last year in the race, Manighar finished seventh and was perhaps too far back early."

Despite the defeat 12 months ago, the experience has led Mack back to Melbourne for a third try at the Cup.

Mack said, "Two years ago, Terry Henderson, the managing partner of OTI Racing and I were both looking to purchase Manighar individually. We decided instead to join forces and I have been very pleased by our partnership. The rich Melbourne Racing Festival has great pageantry and we're going to give it a try."

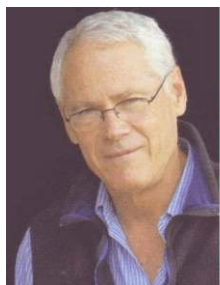

Two worlds. Two realities.

We currently are experiencing "a jobless recovery" in the broader world where contraction and consolidation places greater wealth and power in the hands of fewer people, and drives a stock market that churns along on corporate earnings while long unemployment lines remain unchanged. The gap between rich and poor grows daily as more people on the bottom drop below the poverty line, while the rich get richer and many corporations sit on a hoard of cash.

We have an analogous situation in our horse business, whereby contraction and consolidation creates similar disparities in the production chain.

Language that describes the "tremendous" Fasig-Tipton October sale that exceeded "high expectations," the "vibrant" Keeneland September sale, or Saratoga's "buoyant" performance, is similar to the language on CNBC's Squawk Box coverage of stock market issues and events.

As encouraging as the description may sound, it only portrays a partial reality and narrowly represents the power base and the big money.

In both worlds, the little guy gets the shaft. In the stock market, the individual investor often becomes a pawn in the manipulations of hedge funds and major investment houses. In the horse production world, breeders inhabit the disenfranchised underbelly where profits are largely wisps of fantasy.

Encouraging as it is to see that the horse market has stopped its precipitous drop for the moment, two differing realities are still in play. Sales companies and consignors make more money because they work off of commissions based on gross. Stallion owners in turn benefit and make more money because they are handed largely illusory rationales for raising stud fees. Breeders, on the other hand, continue to lose large amounts of money. In the end, this disparity and the steady attrition of breeders and related falling dominoes cannot possibly lead to a stronger and more important industry.

Fasig-Tipton October, bolstered by fewer horses on offer, more sire power, and defections from Keeneland's cataloguing of quality horses in the latter part of its September sale, produced a welcome across-the-board increase in Gross (81.4%), Mean Average (76.3%), and Median (140%). This had to make sales companies and consignors euphoric, as their revenues surged without having to bear the expenses of production.

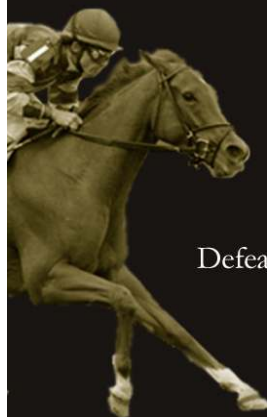

These percentage increases, however, remind me of a recent letter I received from my local bank offering me an 88% increase in the interest rate on my savings account (from 0.45% to 0.70%), if I will only deposit and maintain an additional \$50,000 in my account.

No matter what language is used, yearling sales results for July, August, September, and October have little positive overall effect on the devastated landscape for breeders.

It's hard to see how a sale can be "healthy," either in the short term or the long term, when all participants are connected and mutually dependent, and only 7% of the yearlings that went through the ring in October broke even or were profitable for breeders. (A \$20,000 stud fee + 6% Ky. tax requires a return of approximately \$60,000+ at sales time to break even, accounting for breeding and carrying the pregnant mare, raising the foal and yearling, and paying for nominations, sales fees and expenses, commissions, and misc. *For more detail, see TDN, October 8, 2010, Stud Fees and Profitability*).

For breeders, these stark numbers and this harsh reality can hardly be termed "tremendous." And this sale is not unique. Results for this year's Keeneland September Books 4-6 are similar. Even the clearance rate at both sales is not something to celebrate, as much of the improvement is explained by stressed breeders simply not being able to take their yearlings home and often having to send them through the ring unprotected with no reserve or ultra-low reserves.

Statistics can be manipulated, but these facts are straight forward and compelling. Breeders provide the foundation for the industry and, by producing each annual crop, they feed every other entity up the production chain. Yet mare owners continue to lose large amounts of money. Those up the chain who profit and who control the health of the equine garden need to take better care of the vines upon which their champagnes grow. Significantly lowering stud fees, sales fees, and vet fees from present levels is essential in order to provide breeders with a sustainable production platform during these tough times. Failure to do so will eventually leave the presently powerful playing with themselves in a small arena.

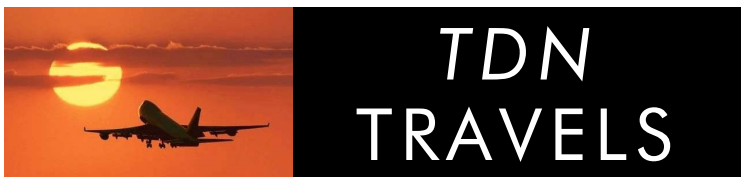

TRADE UP AT GOFFS

There were major increases across the board yesterday as Goffs staged their Horses-In-Training and Open Yearling Sale. In particular, the yearlings part of the auction saw an average of €8,249 opposed to the meagre €3,750 of 2010 and the median jumped by €3,000 from its previous figure of €2,000. Goffs Chief Executive Henry Beeby commented, "The Open Yearling Sale seeks to provide a low-cost option for Irish breeders and provided a lively marketplace for the commercial yearlings catalogued. The format is different from the remainder of our calendar but, in common with the vibrant results seen this autumn not least at our Orby Sale, there has been strong competition for those that appealed and the statistics are every bit as spectacular as those anywhere. There is little doubt that we made the right decision to combine today's categories and are pleased with a lively trade, healthy turnout and vastly improved figures in every sector."

As usual, the horse-in-training offerings from His Highness The Aga Khan's consignment prompted some movement from the national hunt buyers, but one who is destined to continue his career on the flat is the 3-year-old colt **Takapour (Ire)** (Shamardal). Twice a winner over an extended 10 furlongs on Dundalk's Polytrack, the Michael Halford-consigned hip [57](#) was knocked down to John McGrath for €115,000 and will be sent to Hong Kong. Later, trainer Eddie Harty paid €95,000 for the 4-year-old gelding **Maarek (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) consigned by Kilconnel Stables as hip [108](#). Successful over five and six furlongs at The Curragh, on the latter occasion in the Joe McGrath Premier H. in September, he is a son of the black-type winner Ruby Rocket (Ire) (Indian Rocket {GB}). Starring among those catalogued in the Open Yearling section was Cahermorris Stables's hip [157](#), a colt from the first crop of 2005 G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial winner and G1 Epsom Derby fourth Fracas (Ire). Bobby O'Ryan paid €50,000 for the half-brother to GSP Baan (Diesis {GB}) whose second dam is champion Life's Magic (Cox's Ridge).
