**EN FUEGO IN POCAHONTAS**

Sent off at generous odds of 9-1 while aiming for her first taste of graded stakes glory, **On Fire Baby** (Smoke Glacken) came from off the pace to land the lion's share of the purse in Sunday's GII Pocahontas S. at Churchill Downs. "We were hoping to lay off the pace, save some ground and hope things opened up," said winning rider Joe Johnson. "We've known she's been a good one since the day she stepped off the van. It's nice when you work hard and things come together." **Cont.p2**

**FRENCH CONNECTION IN INTERNATIONAL**

**French Fifteen (Fr)** (Turtle Bowl {Ire}) left it until the late stages in yesterday's G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud, but his effort was ultimately perfectly timed by jockey Thierry Thulliez as the chestnut came out on top of a competitive renewal of this term-end 2-year-old highlight. Rank under restraint in rear early, he was helped by **Swing Alone (Ire)** (Celtic Swing {GB}) and **Learn (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) pressing **Pakal (Ger)** (Lord of England {Ger}) into making it a generous pace up front. As Ballydoyle's Learn was committed at the top of the stretch, French Fifteen was looking for the gaps still at the tail of the field, but when they appeared, he quickened widest of all to overhaul that rival and Pakal in the final 75 yards. "It is nice for his sire to get a Group 1 winner from his first crop," said owner Raymond Tooth's Racing Manager Tony Stafford. "He will be trained for the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains next year." Unlike the winner, the British raider **Bonfire (GB)** (Manduro {Ger}) could not find racing room until it was too late, but caught the eye with a strong-finishing effort. Trainer Andrew Balding told the *Racing Post*, "Jimmy [Fortune] felt he would have won with a clear run. He's a very nice middle-distance prospect for next year." **Cont. p2**

**FRENCH STRANGLEHOLD ON CUP?**

They'll come from far and wide for Tuesday's "race that stops a nation," the G1 Emirates Melbourne Cup at Flemington Racecourse, where **Americain** (Dynaformer) will look for a rare second consecutive win in the two-mile test. The irrepressible Makybe Diva (GB) (Desert King {Ire}) managed to record three straight victories in the Cup from 2003 to 2005, but a repeat is an uncommon feat. Prior to that, you have to go back to Think Big (NZ) who gave the legendary Bart Cummings two of his 12 Cup successes in 1974 and 1975. Americain struggled a bit on the European continent this term, with a listed win at Deauville Aug. 2 prior to a 10th behind **Jukebox Jury (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) in defense of his title in the G2 Prix Kergorlay Aug. 21. The 6-year-old was in something of a do-or-die spot when he went to the post in the G2 Moonee Valley Cup Oct. 22, and he showed his readiness for this year's Cup with a handy score from **Tullamore (NZ)** (Savabeel {Aus}). And by all accounts, Americain is very comfortable in his Australian surroundings. "He looks better than last year," trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre told *AAP*. "In France he is not so happy this year, but now he looks better than last year. I think everything is better," the trainer said. **Cont. p8**

After trailing on debut in a baptism of fire against Everyday Dave (Weather Warning) over five furlongs at Chantilly May 2, French Fifteen was sent to Wissembourg and Chateaubriant for soft wins May 22 and July 18 before adding a seven-furlong conditions event to his tally at Le Lion d'Angers a month later. He beat subsequent listed scorer and Bobby Flay Breeders' Cup hopeful Dear Lavinia (Grand Slam) in the Listed Criterium de l'Ouest over an extended mile at Craon Sept. 5 before finishing runner-up to that filly's stable companion Abtaal (Rock Hard Ten) in the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon over this track and trip last time Oct. 6. "Last time, in the Thomas Bryon, there was no pace and he was too keen and was left with too much to do at the end," owner Raymond Tooth's Racing Manager Tony Stafford commented. "This time, in a decently run race, he showed how effective his turn of foot can be and is obviously a good horse."

Buena Vista had to settle for a close-up fourth in her return to the races as 32-1 outsider Tosen Jordan smashed the existing track record--and Japan's 2000-meter mark--with a late-rallying score. The victory earned trainer Yasutoshi Ikee his first Tenno Sho title

and second important Group 1 in a week, following Orfevre (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn})'s dominating victory in the G1 Kikuka Sho (Japanese St. Leger) last Sunday. As expected, it was the speedy Silport (Jpn) (White Muzzle {GB}) who laid down fast fractions while building a substantial lead, as both Buena Vista and Tosen Jordan raced under cover in a mid-pack position. The pacesetter began to come back to the field as they turned into the stretch, and any one of five or six horses stood a chance 300 meters out. Buena Vista came between rivals on the heels of second choice Dark Shadow, but it was Tosen Jordan, produced widest of all, who mowed them all down under Italian jockey Nicola Pinna. Tosen Jordan shaved 1.1 seconds off Vodka (Jpn) (Tanino Gimlet {Jpn})'s record time, set in 2008. "Winning a Group 1 race had been my dream since I came to Japan, so I am very happy now," said Pinna. "The horse ran a perfect race today. He was like maneuvering a machine. I thought that a longer distance would suit him better, so today's fast pace suit him quite well, and I was able to reserve him in the rear." Added Ikee, "I thought that he would have a better chance of winning if the race development required stamina rather than a burst of speed. So I was delighted when the pace became fast. I plan to challenge him in the G1 Japan Cup, and then the G1 Arima Kinen." Buena Vista, making her first start since running second in the G1 Takarazuka Kinen at Hanshin June 26, ran on well in the closing stages while not threatening for the win. Tosen Jordan, a well-beaten ninth in the Takarazuka Kinen at 44-1 odds, won the G2 Sapporo Kinen as the 2-1 choice at Sapporo Aug. 21 in his most recent effort.

Motor City debuted with a solid runner-up finish in a six-furlong test at Ellis Park July 30 before getting the job done on the front end when back at that track Aug. 14. Trying the synthetic in the Sept. 10 GIII Arlington Washington Futurity over a mile, the

gelding closed from well off the pace to be third, beaten 3 1/2 lengths. Most recently, the bay didn't offer the same closing kick and had to settle for eighth in the GI Breeders' Futurity at

Keeneland Oct. 8. Pinched back at the start, Motor City was allowed to trail the field as Seven Lively Sins carved out opening splits of :22.99, :46.27 and 1:11.26. With Calvin Borel aboard, the juvenile was brought up the inside to reach equal terms with the leader, overtook that rival midstretch and held the advantage late to collect his first win at the graded level. The winning jockey was also the regular rider for juvenile champion Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}), who went on to win the following season's GI Kentucky Derby and GI Traver S. "He ran like his daddy [Street Sense]," said Borel of Street Sense's railing-skimming win in the 2006 BC Juvenile at Churchill. "We knew he was a good one all along and [trainer] Ian [Wilkes] never gave up on him. We hope to be here next year [for the Kentucky Derby]." According to Wilkes, the colt will be pointed toward the GII Kentucky Jockey Club.

Cityscape has been admirably consistent in four seasons' racing, with his only blip before this term coming in the 2009 G1 2000 Guineas, where he ran 14th of 15 to Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}). He began this year with a second to Dick Turpin (Ire) (Arakan) in the Apr. 23 G2 Sandown Mile before running third--behind Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) and Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa)--in the June 14 G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot. Registering just a second off-the-board effort when eighth in the Aug. 15 G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville next time, Juddmonte's homebred chestnut annexed the Sept. 11 G3 Solonaway S. at The Curragh and lined up for this off a narrow second to old foe Dick Turpin in the Sept. 24 G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua at Milan's San Siro. Cityscape assert for the lead after the opening furlong here. In control thereafter, he surged clear inside the final quarter mile and ran on strongly to easily capture a fourth stakes score. "This horse deserves a Group 1, so he may stay in training next year, but I'll have to talk to Prince Khalid and Teddy Grimthorpe," trainer Roger Charlton explained. "He is much sounder this year than last, and seems to be able to handle fast ground, too, as they broke the track record on his last run in Italy. He could possibly go for the G1 Hong Kong Mile [at Sha Tin Dec. 11], but we'll discuss it."

Much of the focus was understandably on Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire})'s half-brother Born To Sea here, but Ballydoyle's Nephrite had looked an exciting prospect himself when scoring by four lengths in testing conditions at The Curragh Sept. 25, and he duly upstaged the Tsui homebred in this Classic pointer. Well-supported as the second favorite despite the obvious money for the Oxx-trained ⚡ **"TDN Rising Star"** ⚡, the chestnut was settled in fourth off the strong pace set by his stable companions Vault (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and Ishvana (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), with the 8-11 favorite up ahead in third with a bullseye on his back. As Born To Sea came under pressure from Johnny Murtagh in early stretch, it was soon clear that Joseph O'Brien had every move covered, and Nephrite quickly asserted passing the furlong pole en route to a decisive success. "He won well at the Curragh first time and came on from that and did it very nicely today," said O'Brien. "I thought he had a nice each-way chance, but I didn't know how good Born To Sea was. He has plenty of speed in his pedigree, but it was very soft at the Curragh the last time and he wasn't stopping. He relaxed today, and I think he'll get a mile next year. They went a nice, even pace and there was no hiding place. He picked up good and I like him--he has a good attitude." John Oxx was not too downhearted about the defeat of Born To Sea, who received three smacks with the whip when joined by Nephrite, but who was mainly hand ridden when his chance had gone. "He ran well, but didn't have his usual turn of foot, and Johnny said the ground wasn't in his favor," Oxx said. "The winner is a good horse, and the G1 2000 Guineas is still the plan." Nephrite's trainer Aidan O'Brien was not being drawn on plans for the winner regarding next year's mile Classic, for which his Group 1-winning stable companions Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), Power (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and Crusade (Mr. Greeley) have already put down their markers. "Joseph gave him a confident ride, and he'll stay a mile," O'Brien said. "He will prefer quicker ground, and he's certainly in the mix for the Guineas, but we'll see how he winters."

## FLAT OUT IMPRESSES IN WORK

Preston Stables LLC's Flat Out (Flatter), who appeared on the Churchill Downs main track shortly after 7 a.m. yesterday morning, appeared poised for his start in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, posting a bullet half-mile in :46.60. Jockey Greta Kuntzweiler was

aboard. Fractions for the work were :12.20, :23.80, :35.20. The 5-year-old galloped out five furlongs in :58.80 and six panels in 1:12.40. The half-mile time was the best of 58 for the morning. "I'm flat-out pleased," laughed trainer Scooter Dickey. "I told Greta

to let him do what he wants to do, then cluck to him at the eighth pole and have him gallop out strong. We're ready." Dickey confirmed jockey Alex Solis would be aboard for the remainder of the bay's morning gallops. Sunday's work was the second bullet move at Churchill Downs for Flat Out since winning the 10-furlong GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Oct. 1. Flat Out, who has started at the Louisville oval on two prior occasions, finished sixth both times, including in the GI Stephen Foster H. in June. "He had a bad trip the first time he ran here when he was a 2-year-old," Dickey said. "The Stephen Foster was not a bad race. He was trapped down on the inside and couldn't get out. All the others [that finished in front of him] came down the middle of the track. He made a good move, but the rail was dead that day."

## SAVING GRACE

Fox Hill Farms Inc.'s Havre de Grace (Saint Liam), who arrived at Churchill Downs from Keeneland Saturday afternoon, got her first look at the main track Sunday morning. Sent out after the renovation break, the bay, under trainer Larry Jones, is scheduled for a five-furlong work this morning.

"She is doing really well and acting like she is feeling better than she ever has in the past two weeks," said trainer Larry Jones. "I don't know if it is the cooler weather, but she is very lively and acts like she is ready to do something."

Jones confirmed that Havre de Grace, who was pre-entered in the GI BC Ladies' Classic, as well as the GI Classic, will be entered in the test for males today.

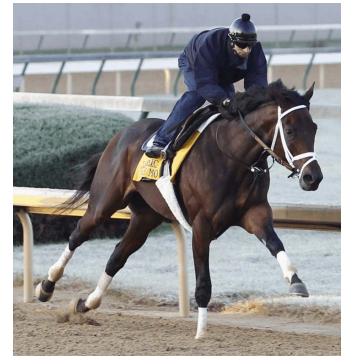

Baffert's Team of 10 candidates are: **Secret Circle** (Eddington) (Juvenile Sprint); **Irish Gypsy** (Hennessy) (GI F&M Sprint); **Candrea** (Trippi) (GI Juvenile Fillies); **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro) (GI Ladies' Classic); **The Factor** (War Front) (GI Dirt Mile or GI Sprint); **Euroears** (Langfuhr) (GI Sprint); **Drill** (Lawyer Ron) (GI Juvenile); **Irrefutable** (Unbridled's Song) (GI Dirt Mile); **Game on Dude** (Awesome Again) (GI Classic) and **Prayer for Relief** (Jump Start) (GI Classic). Euroears worked five furlongs Sunday morning under Martin Garcia on Santa Anita's main track in a bullet :57.80, galloping out six furlongs in 1:09 3/5; Plum Pretty covered six furlongs in a bullet 1:11.60; Game on Dude went the same distance in 1:12.20, breezing, in company with Amazing Hearted (five furlongs in 1:01.40); and unbeaten Juvenile Sprint favorite Secret Circle went five furlongs in company. 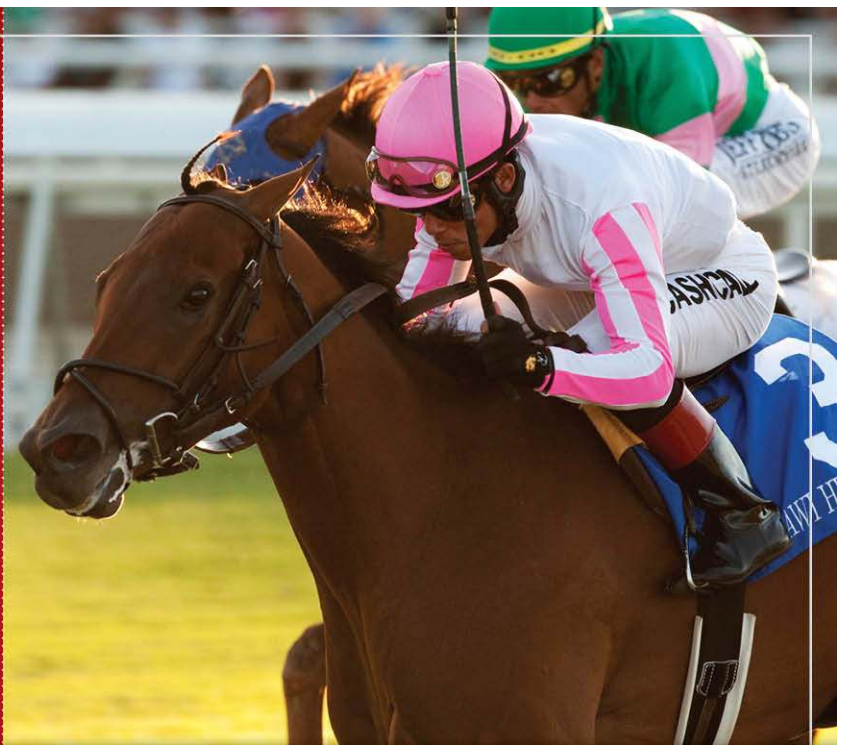

Under Javier Castellano, Stay Thirsty reeled off opening splits of :24.20 and :35.80, before completing five furlongs in 1:00.60. The bay galloped out six furlongs in 1:14.20. Castellano, who rode Stay Thirsty to victory in the GII Jim Dandy and GI Travers at Saratoga this summer, was pleased with the work. "It was a very good, consistent work," Castellano said. "He handled the track really well and pulled me the whole way." Rule, who was given a two-length head start on Stay Thirsty, completed the task in 1:01.20. "(Rule)'s work was OK," Pletcher said. **Mott all Smiles after Delta Work**

Royal Delta (Empire Maker), slated to run in Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic and To Honor and Serve (Bernardini), being aimed toward the BC Classic, both put in works which pleased trainer Bill Mott Sunday morning. Royal Delta, winner of the Aug. 20 GI Alabama, gave Mott reason to smile yesterday as she worked four furlongs in :47.80 under exercise rider Rudolph Brisset. The 3-year-old carved out fractional splits of 12:80, :25 and :36.20, before galloping out five furlongs in 1:00.40 and six panels in 1:14.40. "If you didn't like that, you don't like training horses," Mott said. "That's what you're looking for. You just dream of getting up in the morning and coming out and seeing something like that. She went great."

Mott was equally pleased by the news that Havre de Grace (Saint Liam), who defeated Royal Delta in her latest start in the Oct. GI Beldame Invitational, will target Saturday's Classic instead of the Ladies' Classic Friday. "Hey, I think they made a great move," Mott said with a chuckle. The work by Royal Delta was tied as the fifth-fastest of 58 moves at the distance. Also giving Mott reason to be upbeat yesterday was Live Oak Plantation's To Honor and Serve. The winner of the GII Pennsylvania Derby breezed five furlongs under Brisset in 1:00.40, with internal splits of :12.80, :24.60, :36.80 and :48.40.

He galloped out six furlongs in 1:13.80 and seven panels in 1:29.20. "It was very smooth," Mott said. "He was very professional about everything. I thought it was a better work than it was last week. We let him go off a little quicker today, so ultimately it was a little bit of a faster work. The gallop-out was very good and I thought everything worked out very well." The move ranked as the fourth-fastest of 33 at the distance Sunday.

Trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre was in a positive mood yesterday ahead of the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, for which **☆ "TDN Rising Star" ☆ Sarafina (Fr)** (Refuse To Bend {Ire}) will be a warm order on Saturday. Only seventh when favorite for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 2, His Highness The Aga Khan's 4-year-old bids to rebound in the mile-and-a-half contest. "Sarafina arrived today in America and is going to run in the Turf over 12 furlongs," he told *PA Sport*. "We still can't explain what happened in the Arc, it just wasn't a good run. The weather was hot, the ground was fast so maybe the conditions weren't right, but we just don't know. She is a better horse than **Shareta (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}), who finished second. She is very well at home, so hopefully she runs well." Of the Arc runner-up, he added, "I think Shareta will be going for the G1 Japan Cup [at Tokyo Nov. 27], [while] [G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris winner] **Vadamar (Fr)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) might go for the [Dec. 11] Vase in Hong Kong."

## TDN Q&A: CRAIG FRAVEL

### TDN Q&A: Breeders' Cup President Craig Fravel

Craig Fravel became the fifth president and chief executive officer of Breeders' Cup Ltd. in July 2011. The former president and general manager of the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club was a partner in the San Diego law firm of Luce, Forward, Hamilton and Scripps before joining the seaside track as its executive vice president back in 1990. The 54-year-old recently caught up with *TDN's* Steve Sherack for a question and answer session to discuss the quickly

approaching Breeders' Cup World Championships at Churchill Downs and much more.

**Even without Zenyatta competing in the Breeders' Cup this year, there are still plenty of intriguing storylines-- Goldikova going for her fourth straight win in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, Havre de Grace taking on the boys in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and Uncle Mo returning for the big one after winning last term's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Is there a certain race or horse that you're looking forward to seeing the most?**

**CF:** Personally, I'm looking forward to seeing Goldikova. For a horse to win four Breeders' Cup races in a row would be a pretty amazing accomplishment if she could pull it off. The other horse I'm watching, Union Rags, is because of his connections--Phyllis Wyeth and her husband Jamie, who's an artist. It's kind of a small stable, but it's a really neat story about the people.

**TDN Q & A**

**The Breeders' Cup expanded to a two-day format in 2007, and will have another new race added this year in the Juvenile Sprint. Can we expect further expansion moving forward?**

**CF:** When we looked at the expansion for this race, one other possibility was considered, but it was decided to take it one step at a time. I think that there's a chance that we'll move from 15 to 16 [Breeders' Cup] races at some point. Eight and eight sounds better to me than seven and eight.

**Which division would get a new race?**

**CF:** Right now, I don't know. We'll step back and look at all the races and see how they do with the reception from horsemen and the wagering public, and see if we need to make any tweaks or changes.

**Popular, charismatic owners like Mike Repole, Bobby Flay and Kevin Plank--who are also well known outside of the racing world--all won Breeders' Cup races in 2010. Does that help racing and what the Breeders' Cup is trying to accomplish for the sport?**

**CF:** The job of the Breeders' Cup is ultimately to promote the breeding and sales of Thoroughbreds. So, when we can get guys like that who are passionate about the sport and who bring a slightly different look and feel about them from what we may've had traditionally, it's great. We like owners both old and young, and we're glad to have these young ones coming in and changing things up.

**What's been your favorite moment in Breeders' Cup history?**

**CF:** I was recently watching some highlight reels from the past couple of years and it's certainly hard to pick just one. When Zenyatta came from off the pace and won the Classic at Santa Anita in 2009 is my personal favorite.

**Is there any talk of the Breeders' Cup ever being held overseas?**

**CF:** We haven't had any conversations since I've been here, but that's only since July. I do know that they've had conversations about that in the past though. Whether it's a practical option or not is unclear because so much of our revenues are dependant upon wagering income, and the ability to generate that kind of income elsewhere is a big question mark. I certainly think it would be a fun thing to do, but whether it really works and whether we can continue to support the domestic industry that way is an open question.

**Have any new tracks shown an interest in hosting the Breeders' Cup?**

**CF:** I think we're looking at [small racetrack in the Midwest]. No, I'm kidding. There haven't been any new shooters raising their hands since I've been here.

**The new race-day medication policy, which bans Lasix from competition at the Breeders' Cup in 2012, has been a lightning rod for discussion and has really split the industry. What was the thought process behind making the change?**

**CF:** The thought process behind the new policy is that we want to make sure that the Championships are conducted on a basis where their outcomes are not impacted by medication, and where we are truly identifying champions as well as keeping Championships on a level playing field across the world.

The policy announced by the Breeders' Cup was directed *just* at the Breeders' Cup. It wasn't intended to create new rules for people to follow in particular racing jurisdictions.

I've gone back and looked at some of the early Breeders' Cups, and interestingly enough, there were very few horses running on Lasix in those days. Clearly, it's something that can be done.

**What kind of response have you been getting from horsemen?**

**CF:** Internationally, horsemen love it, and domestically, for the most part, they are very unenthusiastic. We hope that they view it as a worthwhile approach and continue to support the Breeders' Cup.

**It was a record year for the Breeders' Cup in 2010, which established a new mark for attendance as well as across-the-board gains in wagering revenue. Can we expect the positive trend to continue this year? What are your expectations?**

**CF:** I think as a practical matter that you're going to have some hangover effect from Zenyatta. We estimate about \$10 million worth of earned advertising from Zenyatta's appearance on *60 Minutes* and other national news publications covering [her story]. It would be hard to top that.

**Did you set any specific goals once taking over the reins at the Breeders' Cup?**

**CF:** I think that the Breeders' Cup needs to be recognized as the kind of championship event that it is. Every major sport needs a major championship. My main objective is to build on that to make sure that the Breeders' Cup is recognized by the industry, both domestically and internationally, as the premier event in racing. I think it is now and it can get better, too.

**What are some of the challenges facing the Breeders' Cup right now?**

**CF:** The Breeders' Cup is not alone in the challenges of a declining foal crop that are certainly going to impact the bottom line. But, I think at the end of the day, hopefully there's going to be a flight to quality, and events like the Breeders' Cup that provide a platform for the best will thrive.

**During your time at Del Mar you helped draw a younger audience to the racetrack through concerts and other events. Will the Breeders' Cup employ this strategy at some point as well?**

**CF:** I think we're going to take a look at those kind of options and things that might have a little broader appeal in future years. I'm not sure exactly what form we will take, but we're open to trying things.

**Was it a hard decision to leave your post as president at Del Mar and relocate to Kentucky?**

**CF:** It was about 42 degrees and raining with the wind blowing massively the other morning, so I did give it a second thought for a minute or two [laughs].

But you know, change is good. My family (wife Cathie and daughters Sarah and Ireland) is adapting great. The best part about it is that we're surrounded by horses everywhere and that's such a big part of our lives. It makes it a very special place to be.

**Did you get a chance to make it out to the races at Keeneland?**

**CF:** Oh yeah. My 7-year-old loves going to Keeneland; we've been there three or four times. We've had a really nice meet from a weather standpoint. You can't beat it.

**What do you love about racing and how were you introduced to the sport?**

**CF:** I was introduced to the sport when I moved to California in 1985. Del Mar racetrack was one of my clients as a lawyer and I didn't have much exposure to racing before that. I think the great thing about racing is how it appeals to people on so many levels. You've got the Turf Club types, the backstretch guys and everybody in between. It's a great environment for everybody.

## Sweet Ducky Last in NA Return for Chechen President:

**Sweet Ducky** (Pulpit) trailed the field throughout in an allowance event yesterday at Woodbine (race six), his first start in North America since being purchased by controversial Chechen President Ramzan Kadyrov. He finished 13th in the G2 UAE Derby at Meydan in his only other start after the owner switch from George and Lori Hall. Kadyrov ran two European-based horses earlier in the meet in the G1 Canadian International. Sweet Ducky was the first horse he has raced in North America that is stabled here. The 3-year-old is trained by Seth Benzel and is based at Belmont Park. Kadyrov has come under heavy criticism from international press for allegations of corruption and human rights violations. He applied for an owner's license in Kentucky, but the state racing commission there tabled the application and announced it wanted to investigate Kadyrov before moving forward. Sweet Ducky had been entered at Keeneland during the recently concluded meet, but was forced to scratch. Ontario racing officials, however, have decided to license Kadyrov. "We have no reason to deny the man a license," Ontario Racing Commission Steward Gunnar Lindberg said yesterday. "All there are at this time are allegations. There are no charges against him in North America. I have googled him and, at this point in time, there are no charges against him or any charges pending in North America. He is also licensed in the UK and is spending a lot of money there on horses."
