DUNADEN BY A WHISKER DOWN UNDER

Dunaden (Fr) (Nicobar {GB}) successfully defended France's title in the G1 Emirates Melbourne Cup Tuesday afternoon, holding off a resurgent

Red Cadeaux (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) by the narrowest of margins in Australia's two-mile marathon. The winning owner, Sheikh Fahad al-Thani of Qatar, was exceedingly pleased after the photo revealed Dunaden to be the winner. The French-bred had

been acquired privately about 12 months ago, and the young Qatari pegged the Melbourne Cup as the long-term target. "We wanted to preserve his handicap rating, so we thought, Melbourne Cup this year, Gold Cup [at Ascot] next year," al-Thani said. "I am confident he would have gone close in the Gold Cup." Winning rider Christophe Lemaire, who picked up the mount after Australian Craig Williams was controversially suspended, flew in Tuesday. "I didn't know if I would be able to ride," Lemaire said after the race, alluding to the fact that he was hung up in Singapore due to the labor action against Qantas Airlines. "But I thought at least it would be nice to see the Melbourne Cup as a spectator. It's a dream to win this race in this country." **Lucas Cranach (Ger)** (Mamool {Ire}), whose participation in the Cup was cast into some doubt by a foot ailment in the last two weeks, was a gritty third, while defending champ **Americain (Dynaformer)** finished well for an excellent fourth.

HAVRE DE GRACE BACK ON TRACK TUESDAY

In an uncustomary move by trainer Larry Jones, **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam) returned to the racetrack Tuesday morning. According to Jones, the 4-year-old proved to be a handful yesterday as she dragged around the trainer's wife, Cindy. During her outing, the Foxhill runner was allowed to jog in the chute.

"She's ready to get it on," said Larry Jones. "It would have been a long time between now and Saturday if we hadn't taken her to the track [Tuesday] morning. It's the first time we've ever had to do that with her."

Following a five-panel work in 1:02 at Churchill Downs Monday ([youtube video](#)), Jones reported that he rated the bay's move a "D." However, the midwest horseman upgraded it to a "B or B+" yesterday.

"After going home and watching the workout, I realized it was a good workout," said Jones. "[Jockey] Gabriel [Saez] didn't even move on her. I even sent [owner] Rick [Porter] a text saying that I thought it was a really good work. We know she's fit enough."

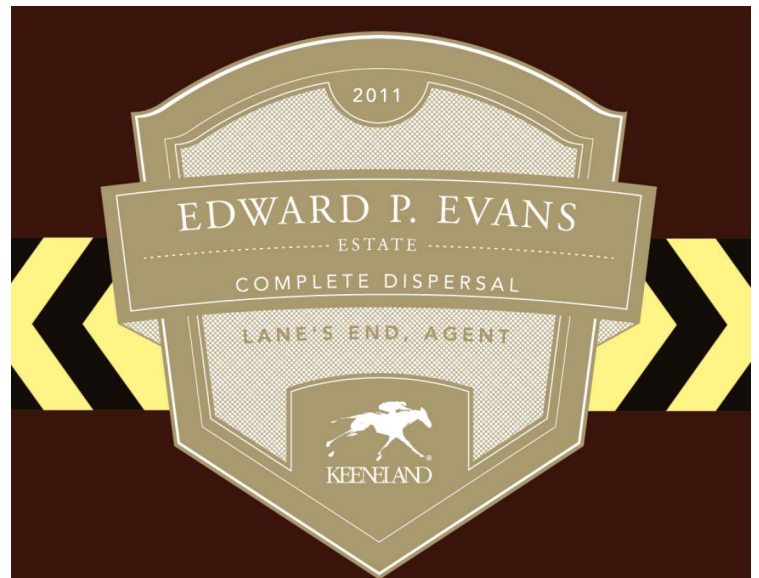

Returned off just a 2 1/2-month absence following a vigorous 2010 campaign which saw him make no fewer than a dozen starts, Dunaden returned with a close third in a listed event over 2500 meters at Cagnes-sur-Mer Feb. 26 before bouncing back to take the G3 Prix de Barbeville at about this distance at Longchamp Apr. 30. After missing by a nose to **Brigantin (Cozzene)** in the G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier May 22, he was shelved and resurfaced to be ninth--beaten six lengths behind **Jukebox Jury (Ire)** (**Montjeu {Ire}**)--in the G2 Prix Kergorlay. **Americain** had won the Kergorlay in his lead-up to last year's Cup success, but was only 10th this term. Connections opted

for the same path as **Americain** and sent Dunaden to Geelong for that track's G3 Geelong Cup Oct. 19, and he defeated a field including **Bauer (Ire)** (**Halling**)--the 2008 Cup runner-up--by 3/4 of a length. That effort got the attention of punters and handicappers alike, as he was the race's second heavyweight--though in receipt of eight pounds from **Americain**--and 15-2 second choice.

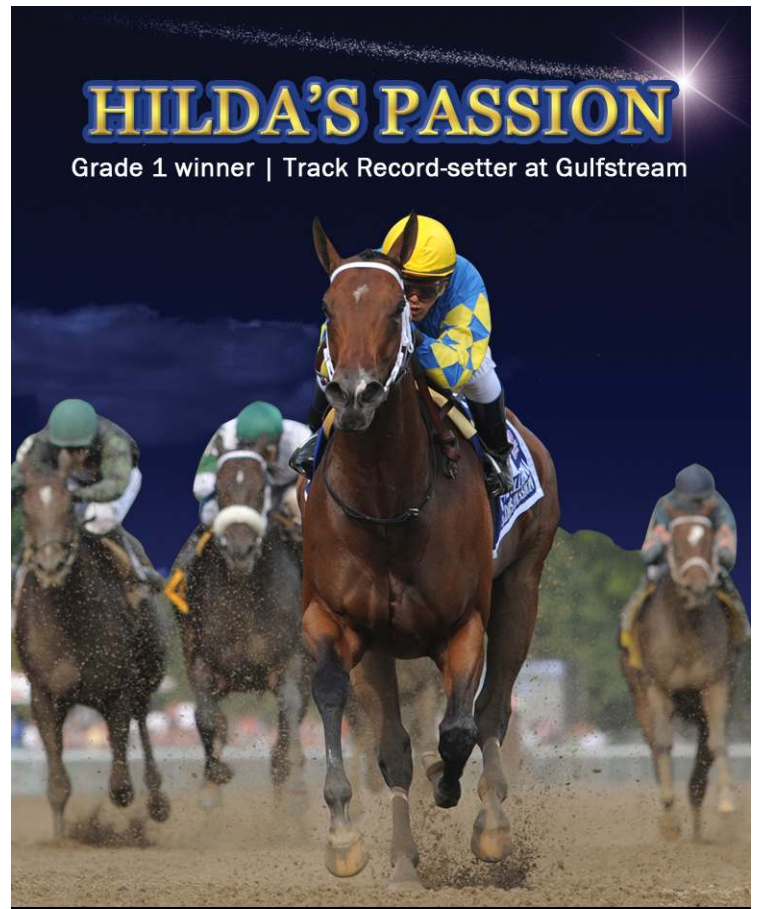
Vive la France...

Dunaden, a bit edgy in the stalls, jumped well enough, as did Americain, but both were content to drift back to the latter third of the 23-strong field as a moderate tempo was dictated early on by Illo (Ger) (Tertullian). Manighar (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}), about four off

the fence down the stretch and under the wire the first time, raced up into a clear second and they raced that way around the first corner. Positions were largely unchanged to the midway marker, at which point Precedence (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) was asked to go forward from his wide position and advanced into second to pursue Illo. For a time, Bart Cummings was 1-2 in search of a 13th Cup. Towards the back, Red Cadeaux sat just off the heels of Dunaden, while Americain was a bit further back, and his task seemed nearly hopeless with over a dozen lengths to make up past the five-furlong marker. Precedence went up to lead narrowly entering the lane, but that was only short-lived and was the prelude to a wild final 300 meters. Manighar, who sat back in third, made his bid, but was soon usurped atop the leaderboard by Lucas Cranach. Godolphin's Lost in the Moment (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) also looked a danger inside the final furlong and a half, but by then, Dunaden, who'd worked his way into the clear, and Red Cadeaux were coming with irresistible rallies. The latter looked to be doing the better of the two, but it was Dunaden who looked on his way to a clear-cut success in the last 100 meters. Red Cadeaux was getting back to the winner, but ultimately lost the bob, as Lucas Cranach was a highly credible third. Americain, well off the track and fanned widest into the straight, was staying on at the finish, but the wire came too late in a gallant defense of his title. Lemaire wasn't exactly sure he'd gotten there first. "I was a bit anxious, because I knew it was very close and the pony [Clerk of the Course] said that maybe [Red Cadeaux] had won. I felt a bit disappointed even though the horse gave everything but then they said 'you win,'" the Frenchman told AAP. "It was very, very close and when it is like this I prefer to wait for the final results before celebrating. I have to say thank you to the team. To Mikel Delzangles, the owner who gave me the opportunity, my agent, my wife and all my friends." Americain's rider Gerald Mosse was pleased with his mount's effort. "I think the ground was a bit firm for him," he told AAP. "He gave me a good acceleration in the straight but he started to get tired in the last 50 metres with the weight and the ground. He's very honest and tried his best."

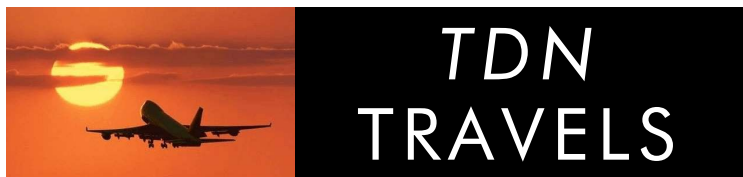

My first reaction was that the inside (Dunaden) had it, and that was bolstered by the fact that the live camera (that guy is never wrong) stayed with the bay. However, the slow-motion replay made it seem like Red Cadeaux's nose was in front, and the announcer began to speculate whether history would be made by the first-ever dead-heat.

The horses returned to be unsaddled on the other side of the fence from me; I could have reached out and touched Manighar's cool new blinkers. Ed Dunlop, with a rueful smile on his face, made his way over to console Red Cadeaux's owner Ronald Arculli.

"Hip, hip, hooray!" the crowd roared when the victorious Dunaden and Christophe Lemaire returned to the mounting yard. Absolutely electric; am truly thrilled to have been a part of it.

My coworkers know I'm a bit of a pedigree buff, but I had to wrack my jet-lagged brain about the winner's lineage. Turns out his sire Nicobar--a son of Indian Ridge, whose progeny include Breeders' Cup Mile winners Ridgewood Pearl and Domedriver--won the 2001 G2 Premio Emilio Turati (OK, I totally looked that up) before eventually finding his way to Ron McAnally's barn in California. Perhaps best effort on our shores was a third, beaten two noses, in the 2002 GII Oak Tree BC Mile; finishing behind him that day were Congaree and D'wildcat. His bottom line is even more obscure: Dunaden is one of just two black-type horses--plus a steeplechaser--under the first five dams.

Over the course of the next 14 hours, I'll get the pictures together, pack an enormous suitcase and board a plane back to New York. They tell me the Breeders' Cup is upon us, so I'll tack my four designated races onto my "to do" list. It's been real!

Prayer for Relief out of Classic

Zayat Stable's **Prayer for Relief** (Jump Start), who was not aboard a Tex Sutton Forwarding charter flight from Southern California Tuesday transporting trainer Bob Bafferts Breeders' Cup team, will not contest Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic. The 3-year-old reportedly developed a fever, which prompted the defection. Prayer for Relief, a winner of his four of five races this season, including the GIII Iowa Derby, GII Super Derby and GII West Virginia Derby, finished third most recently in the Oklahoma Derby Oct. 16. Baffert will still have representation in the Classic with **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again).

Union Rags Gets Acquainted With Churchill

Union Rags (Dixie Union), the 2-1 morning line favorite for Saturday's GI Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile, got his first look at the Churchill paddock and racetrack Tuesday morning. The winner of the GI Champagne S. and GII Saratoga Special S. arrived from his Maryland base at Fair Hill training center Monday. Ridden to the track by assistant trainer Peter Brette and trainer Michael Matz, close by on a pony, the Chadds Ford runner visited the paddock before galloping 1 1/2 miles over the main track. "He didn't do any training [Monday] since he was traveling, so he was a little fresh this morning," said Matz. "He looks good." The trainer added, "He's just been a dream to train. He's got everything you'd want in a racehorse. He's fast, he finds a way to get out of trouble and he's got a great mind. He came out of his last race [a win in the Oct. 8 Champagne] great. We took him back to Fair Hill that night and he ate right up. The next morning he was looking for me." Also making a trip to the paddock Tuesday morning was **Majestic City** (City Zip), morning-line choice for Saturday's GI Juvenile Turf. "We had a good schooling day today," said trainer Peter Miller. "He jogged, stood in the gate and made a trip to the paddock." The winner of the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship and runner-up in two Grade I tests drew the eight post Monday. "The eight-hole is just right," said Miller. "It will give our rider [Garrett Gomez] a perfect sport to survey the situation."

EYEWEAR FOR STACELITA IN F&M TURF?

Martin Schwartz's **Stacelita (Fr)** (Monsun {Ger}), the 2-1 morning-line choice for Friday's Breeders' Cup GI Filly & Mare Turf, appeared in good form during a routine 1 3/8m gallop at Churchill Downs Tuesday morning.

"I'm very happy the way she went," said trainer Chad Brown. "Her energy level is good. She's getting over the track good. She's her normal self."

The 5-year-old is undefeated in two starts against her own sex in the United States, including her most recent outing in the Oct. 1 GI Flower Bowl Invitational. While the result of that race was as connections might have hoped, some of the lingering effects were not. The French Group 1 winner exited the race with an injured left eye. According to Brown, the eye is protected during training with a clear plastic cup.

"A couple of days after the race, the eye was a little puffy and had some inflammation in it and ended up having a little ulcer on the eye," explained Brown. "We've been treating that and cleared it up, but it's not quite at 100% yet. These kinds of things take a while to get perfect. It's a tough area of the body to heal for anybody, horse or human. Because I feel that it is still sensitive, I don't want to take any chances with this filly. If something was to hit it, while the eye is not at full strength, it could really harm her. We don't want that to happen. I want to keep the eye shield on her during training all week, and I'm even going to think about possibly running her in it. I'm not sure yet. It's going to depend on how I think her eye is."

Brown added, "She's very comfortable with [the eye gaurd] on and Ramon Dominguez breezed her with it on last week and thought she went perfect. It's not something that I'm going to really worry about too much. I'm just going to continue to work on her eye, take care of the filly and, come race day, we'll make a decision if we'll run her in it."

Restiadargent made light of the testing conditions prevalent here to provide a fairytale result for her owner-breeder Guy Pariente and first-season sire Kendargent. After an initial success by four lengths over six furlongs at Chantilly May 25, the bay was fourth behind subsequent G1 Prix Marcel Bousac heroine Elusive Kate (Elusive Quality) when tried over seven in the Listed Prix Six Perfections at Deauville July 30. Back at 5 1/2 furlongs last time, she bested her fellow Haras de Colleville homebred and stable companion Kendam (Fr) (Kendargent {Fr}) by 3/4 of a length in the G3 Prix d'Arenberg at this venue Sept. 13. Keen early in the hands of Maxime Guyon while racing behind the early pace, she was sent into the lead with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and drew clear for an emphatic score. "I always believed in Kendargent and never doubted he would make it, as he is by Kendor (Fr) out of a Linamix (Fr) mare and they were the best two stallions to stand in France over the past 25 years. I especially thought he would sire fast ones like this filly. She is out of a Montjeu mare, so I had no concerns about the soft ground, and she proved here she can quicken on this ground and on fast. We will savor the moment for now, but she is probably through for the season."

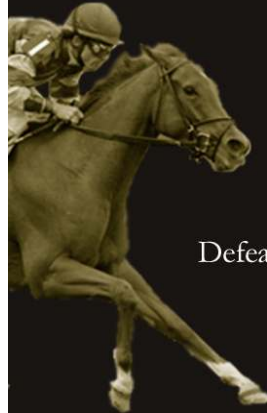

Plum Pretty's Dam Proves Ever 'Green' for Reid...

It isn't often that you both buy and sell a GI Kentucky Oaks heroine in utero, but for Walnut Green's Mark

Reid, that's what happened with this year's 3-year-old standout **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro). Moreover, Walnut Green has both bought and sold the filly's dam...not once but *twice*. And while Reid cheers home his former pupil in Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic at Churchill, he'll also be preparing her dam Liszy (A.P. Indy) to sell a third time through Walnut Green at Fasig-Tipton's November Sale Sunday. Walnut Green consigns the 11-year-old Liszy, in foal to Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike), as [hip 125](#).

Walnut Green's long involvement with Liszy began in 2006, when it offered the then 6-year-old, in foal to More Than Ready, at the Keeneland January Sale on behalf of client Hickory Tree Farm, which was dispersing its breeding stock. Another of Walnut Green's clients, Linny Scott, took an interest in the daughter of Grade II winner Silent Account and half-sister to sire Gold Case (Forty Niner), and so Walnut Green signed the ticket for Scott for \$260,000.

Two years later, Scott sent Liszy back through the same Keeneland January Sale, and this time, it was Reid himself who took an interest. He was in the hunt for a broodmare for yet another group of clients, and the more he shopped around, the more he liked the big chestnut mare selling from his own consignment.

"I'd seen her before and liked her, but she wasn't really on my radar because we were selling her," said Reid. "But it seemed every time I went by, she was out,

and I was liking her more than what I had been looking at. She's a striking mare. She's 16.2 [hands], stands over a lot of ground and is really pretty. She had some issues in her youth that kept her from running to her ability. I was told she had gotten pneumonia as a 2-year-old. But if you

look at her, she's got the 'wow' factor. She was by the right horse from an old Hickory Tree family, so to me she had everything in spades."

If the mare needed anything to make her more appealing to Reid, she was selling in foal to Medaglia d'Oro, whom Reid had purchased privately as a racehorse for Edmund Gann.

"She was actually bred on one of my seasons to Medaglia d'Oro, who obviously I'm absolutely in love with," said Reid. "It was just a combo I couldn't turn down. So I called and said, 'Mrs. Scott, I have some people looking for horses, would you mind if we bid on her out of our own consignment?' And she, 'By all means--if it helps us get a better price, the more the merrier.'"

Walnut Green thus signed for Liszy a second time at KEEJAN, this time for \$170,000. Reid brought the mare home to Walnut Green's Pennsylvania base and sold her to a partnership group that included Vince and Denis Curran's DDS Stable and Silent Indy Stables, a group of four New Jersey-based couples who were making their first foray into breeding. The couples are: Frank and Beth Pulio; John and Leeann Azzari; Milton and Yvonne Brown; and Mitchell and Kim Czoch

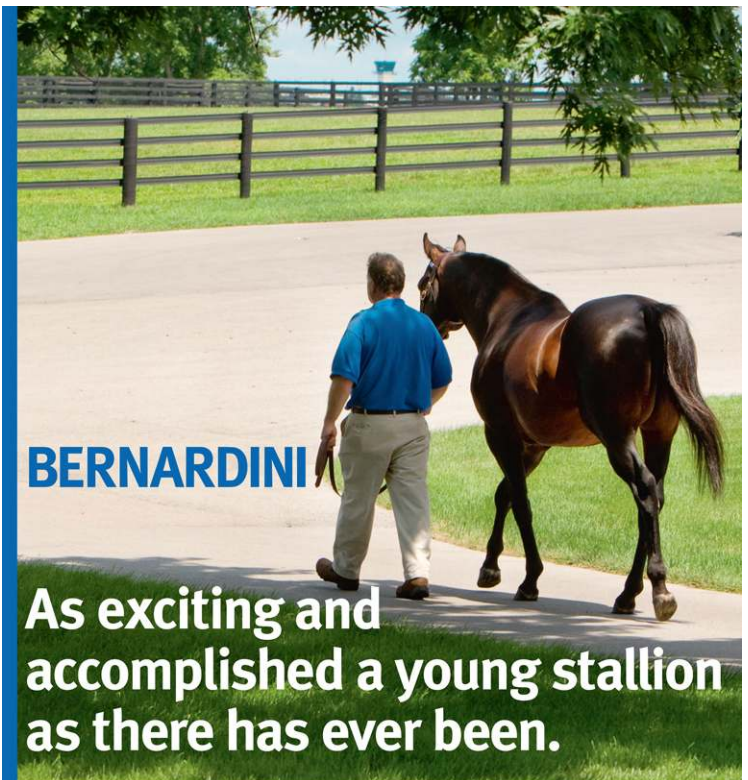
The foal Liszy was carrying the second time around was, of course, Plum Pretty, and for a while, it looked like she might keep returning to the Walnut Green fold, as well.

"We raised Plum Pretty at the farm, and she was a nice filly," said Reid. "We pointed her toward the [Fasig-Tipton] Saratoga Sale as a yearling, but unfortunately, when we got her there, she was at a gawky stage. She was tall and right in the middle of a growth spurt."

Plum Pretty's awkwardness led to a pair of RNAs. She went unsold at Saratoga for \$100,000, then for \$75,000 at the F-T Midlantic Fall Yearlings Sale.

"At that point, we decided to put her through a 2-year-old sale, so we sent her to Kip Elser at Kirkwood, and he sold her for us," said Reid.

Entered in the 2010 renewal of the OBS March Sale, Plum Pretty worked a quarter in :22 1/5 and was hammered down to Peachtree Stable's John Fort for \$130,000. **Cont. p15**

“Kip had said to me, ‘Mark, she’s a big, pretty mare,’ recalled Reid. “She doesn’t walk exactly the greatest, because she’s just so awkward,” said Reid. “And while she worked okay, you could tell there was a lot more there to give. She wasn’t a typical 2-year-old in training, by Medaglia d’Oro out of an A.P. Indy mare. She didn’t look like she was going to work a fast eighth or quarter--and she only worked an acceptable one, not an outstanding one.”

And while Plum Pretty had improved physically, she still was very much an unfinished project. Bob Baffert, tabbed by Fort to train her, quipped after the Oaks that, after laying eyes on her for the first time, he asked Fort, “Did you say her name was Plum Pretty or Plum Ugly?”

Said Reid, “She’s a big beautiful filly now, and we kind of knew that was going to happen. She had looked great at the farm about a month before Saratoga, but when we got there, she had to be two inches taller than she had been a month earlier. She sort of looked like a giraffe. If the same thing happened at this point, we probably would buy her back, but at the time, it was the partner’s first voyage into breeding, and I wanted to show them how it works selling one. We probably sold her for a little less than we should have.”

That may be the case, but DDS Stable and Silent Indy Stables are now sitting on a hot commodity: a relatively young A.P. Indy mare, dam of an Oaks winner, and in foal to a Classic winner.

“We used him because he was a great genetic match for her,” Reid said of Ashford’s Lookin At Lucky. “He’s a young horse, but he’s a two-time champion-- champion 2-year-old, champion 3-year-old--and he’s a decent-looking horse. That’s what got us on him.”

Of course, Liszy might not be the only star of the Walnut Green consignment Sunday.

Also entered for the Fasig sale is the 2-year-old filly Grace Hall (Empire Filly), winner of the GI Spinaway S. this year and one of the favorites for Friday’s GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies. She’s catalogued as [hip 107](#).

Grace Hall is owned by Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables and Stuart Grant.

“I would think a lot would depend on what happens in the Breeders’ Cup whether they retain or sell her, but they decided to put her in and see how it goes,” said Reid.

Reid said he also has a particularly choice offering at the Keeneland November Sale in [hip 393](#), a Tapit filly out of GSP Mountain Dawn (Mountain Cat). “She as pretty a weanling as we’ve raised here,” said Reid.

NOVEMBER SIRES

In 2009, Fasig-Tipton's November session plus Keeneland Book 1 generated \$100-million in revenue combined; in 2010, the figure was \$98-million. Both years Fasig kicked off with around a \$28-million night, followed by Keeneland Book 1 generating \$70-million (2010) to \$72-million (2009, featuring the Overbrook Dispersal). So--even given the notorious difficulty of comparing mixed sales from year to year--we do have a benchmark for comparison for this year's November sales, kicking off with another strong catalogue at Fasig on Sunday, and following with Keeneland Book 1 Monday-Tuesday, featuring most of the Ned Evans dispersal on Monday.

Both sales have plenty of group-winning fillies and mares, but of course another important feature of each November's sales--aside from how many top racemares each sales company can attract--is the appearance of the first weanlings by the previous year's new sires. This year there are 19 stallions with 19 or more weanlings catalogued between Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland (all 6 books, covering 11 days), of which six of the 19 are stallions with their first foals 2011, including the two with the most weanlings catalogued, Ashford's Dunkirk (33 catalogued) and Pin Oak's Cowboy Cal (32). Dunkirk was a \$3.7-million yearling who finished second in the GI Florida Derby (to Quality Road) and the GI Belmont S. (to Summer Bird) in 2009; Cowboy Cal, a son of Giant's Causeway, won three Grade II races at four in California the same year.

Dunkirk is by Unbridled's Song, who is the sire of three of the top six sires of first weanlings 2011 by number catalogued in the November sales; the other two, with 22 catalogued each, are: Taylor Made's Old Fashioned, unbeaten at two when he went three-for-three, including the GII Remsen; and Hill 'n' Dale's Zensational, winner of three Grade I races on the all-weather in California in 2009. Another of the six is Vinery's Pioneerof the Nile (20 catalogued). He is by Empire Maker, like Unbridled's Song a son of Unbridled; Pioneerof the Nile won four Grade I and Grade II races in a row in California as a two- and three-year-old before running second to Mine That bird in the 2009 GI Kentucky Derby. The other first-year sire in this category is WinStar's Colonel John (19 catalogued), by Tiznow and a dual 2008 GI winner of the Santa Anita Derby and Travers S. Cont. p17

Two other (not first-year) sires have 30+ weanlings catalogued total: Spendthrift's Tiz Wonderful (32 catalogued), whose first yearlings sold well this year; and Bluegrass Cat (30), who transfers from Kentucky to New York in a partnership venture between WinStar and Vinery. And there are five sires with 25 or more catalogued, of which 15 or more for each are in Fasig plus Keeneland Book 1: Ashford's Henrythenavigator, with 29 catalogued throughout the two sales, of which 24 are in either Fasig or Book 1; Claiborne's War Front (20 of 26); Spendthrift's Malibu Moon (21 of 26); Darley's Hard Spun (19 of 26); and WinStar's Harlan's Holiday (15 of 25).

Seven stallions have more than 30 mares catalogued in foal, of which three are stallions which stood their first seasons in 2011. Lane's End's Quality Road, bred and raced by Ned Evans, leads all sires with 53 mares catalogued in foal, including quite a few of the top Evans mares. Adena Springs' versatile Einstein has 32 catalogued, while Taylor Made's top 2010 three-year-old Eskendereya has 31. Other first-year covering sires with 17 or more mares catalogued in foal include: Lane's End's Discreetly Mine (27 catalogued); Ashford's Lookin' at Lucky (22), champion 2-year-old and 3-year-old; as well as Munnings (18), another Ashford stallion, winner of three GII races and placed in another seven; the 2010 GI Travers S. winner, Afleet Express (17), at Gainesway; WinStar's Super Saver, winner of the 2010 GI Kentucky Derby; and Spendthrift's Warrior's Reward, a Grade I-winning sprinter by Medaglia D'Oro; 17 each for the last two also. Other sires with more than 30 catalogued in foal include: Vinery's Congrats (37); WinStar's Bellamy Road (36); Ramsey Farm's Kitten's Joy (34); and Ashford's Scat Daddy (32), North America's Leading Freshman Sire going into the Breeders' Cup.

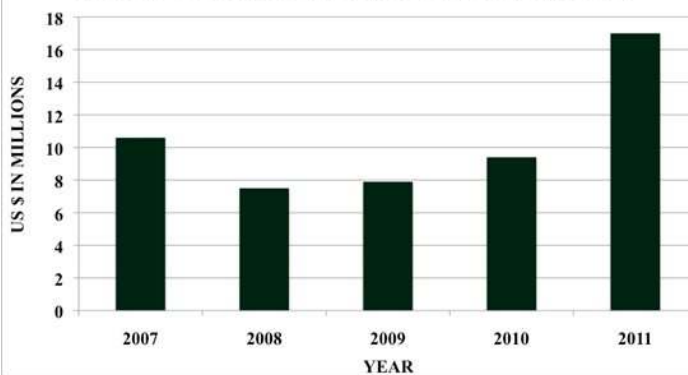

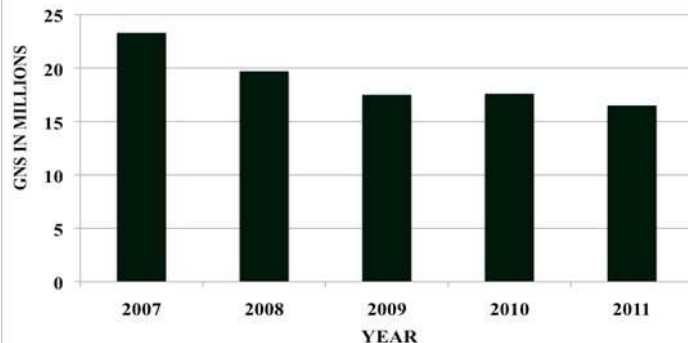

SEA HAD EXCUSES FOR DEFEAT

John Oxx yesterday revealed that ☆ **"TDN Rising Star" ☆ Born to Sea (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) sustained a torn muscle during Sunday's G3 Killavullan S. at Leopardstown. Christopher Tsui's three-parts brother to Sea the Stars (Ire) met with a 1 1/2-length defeat at the hands of Nephrite (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) in the seven-furlong contest and, after the initial disappointment, connections believe he may have a valid excuse for the reversal. "We think he probably did it coming out of the stalls as he stumbled and came out on his head," Oxx told *PA Sport*. "After that, he started to get a high, climbing action, which they do if they start to push from behind. Thank goodness it was nothing serious and he'll recover from it in the normal way. It wouldn't be a long-term injury. It wasn't minor on the day, obviously, but it's minor in that it's not something that will be a problem in the future. He hadn't run badly and the winner is obviously smart, but we were a bit disappointed, so it was nice that we found an obvious explanation." Oxx is targeting the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, a race the colt's illustrious relative won in 2009. "He didn't get the chance on Sunday to prove himself as we'd have liked, and that's a bit irritating, but we still think he's done enough that he can be considered for the Guineas and trained for it," he added. "We'll just see now how everything goes in the spring and see how he measures up, but Newmarket is the first objective. The Guineas trials at Leopardstown are going to be in the middle of April next year. They are normally at the end of March, which is too early. There is a possibility we could run him in a trial--I wouldn't rule it out."

PICCOLO FILLY TOPS DBS SALE

Doncaster Bloodstock Sales hosted the yearling section of its Autumn Sale yesterday, with a daughter of Piccolo (GB) coming out best when selling to the owner-trainer combination of Ron Hull and Debbie Sanderson for £22,000. Hip 410 is from the extended family of the top-class Hong Kong performer Goggles (Ire) (Eagle Eyed) and was consigned by agents Manister House Stud. Hip 394, a colt from the draft of Mark Dwyer's Oaks Farm Stables, sold for £20,000. By Manduro (Ger) and out of a half-sister to the triple group scorer Arabian Gleam (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}), he was knocked down to Pat Eddery. "Our Yearling Sale is significantly smaller than previous years, which is very much a reflection of the reducing foal crops, particularly at the lower end of the market, but we would submit that it serves the industry by providing a low cost marketplace," DBS Managing Director Henry Beeby said.
