FUNNY MOON TOPS STRONG F-T NOVEMBER

A fast and furious Fasig-Tipton November Sale was held last night in Lexington, with Grade I winner **Funny Moon** (Malibu Moon--Fun Crowd, by Easy Goer) leading a bullish evening on My Meadowview Farm's \$2.3 million offer. The sale topper, catalogued as [hip 105](#) from Gainesway's consignment and selling in foal to Indian Charlie, was one of 13 horses on the evening to eclipse the seven-figure mark, and the lone horse to clear the \$2-million mark. Bloodstock agent Lincoln Collins was representing Leonard Riggio's My Meadowview. "We very much like the mare," said Collins, who was on the phone during the bidding while inside the pavilion. "We only had two or three mares on the list for the sale. She was an extremely good racemare. She's good looking. We like Indian Charlie. It's a very solid pedigree."

Collins added that the 5-year-old's price tag had everything to do with her quality. "Looking at this sale, it looks as if the real thing is going to sell very competitively, but if you fall short of the real thing, it's much stickier going," he said. "But I think if you've got something the market really wants, and the big players really want, it looks as if the money is there. I think it's getting harder and harder to buy at the top end. I think a lot of people at the top end are gaining confidence, and I hope that confidence will gradually seep down through the rest of the market. But I think it's going to remain, for the time being, a pretty selective market."

KEENELAND NOVEMBER TAKES THE BATON

An 11-session renewal of Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale begins this morning in Lexington at 10 a.m. following a very successful Fasig-Tipton November Sale last evening. Keeneland has crafted a catalogue of 3,919 horses for the event, down 15.5% from last year. A pair of high-profile dispersals will help propel the 68th edition of the sale, including that of the late Edward P. Evans and the late Prince Saud bin Kahled's Palides Investments N.V. Inc. The latter dispersal features **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker), winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic on Friday, while last year's Ladies' Classic winner **Unrivaled Belle** (Unbridled's Song) and champion **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision) add further luster to November.

Moon Landing at F-T...

Last night was the second time the \$2.3 million sale-topping Funny Moon passed through a Fasig-Tipton auction ring. At the 2007 Saratoga Sale, she was hammered down to bloodstock agent Debbie Easter for a much more modest \$175,000. Easter was representing Morrowdale Farm, the nom de course of Carter and Wilson "Wick" McNeely III.

Produced by Fun Crowd (Easy Goer), a half-sister to GISW and sire Vanlandingham (Cox's Ridge) and from the family of Grade I winner Distant Music (Distant View), Funny Moon lived up to her page while in training with Christophe Clement. As a 3-year-old, she won the 10-furlong GI CCA Oaks at Belmont, then returned at four to take the GII Shuvee H. over Seattle Smooth (Quiet American) last term. She was retired earlier this year with a record of 15-5-3-2 and earnings of \$530,900. Funny Moon is a half-sister to two stakes horses, including MSW Throng (Silver Deputy).

Wick McNeely is a past president and chairman of the board of Eagle Corp., a holding company that deals in the manufacturing of concrete and other building materials. He is also a co-founder and member of the board of directors of the Virginia National Bank. His wife Carter got involved in horses through her father, Hunter Faulconer.

Morrowdale Farm is based in Charlottesville, Virginia, and while the McNeelys operate a small breed-to-race operation with roughly six broodmares, the lure of the open market proved too tempting.

"Funny Moon's a young mare, a Grade I winner, well-covered, good looking, and that's what the market wants to buy," said Gainesway's Michael Heron. "She was here to sell, everyone knew that. It was a fair price and two people wanted her. That's the auction process."

The New York City-born Riggio is the largest shareholder in the popular book chain Barnes and Noble. He has raced, among others, the Grade I horse Noble Causeway (Giant's Causeway). Last night wasn't the first time Riggio's made a splash at Fasig's November sale. In 2006, he acquired Andujar (Quiet American) for \$2.5 million and Win's Fair Lady (Dehere) here for \$2.3 million. -LM

Dubawi Heights Brings \$1.6 Million...

About an hour before she was to sell, **Dubawi Heights (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}--Rosie's Posy, by Suave Dancer) stood as the picture of class at Noel Murphy's Castle Park Consignment in Barn 2 as several buying groups took a look at the striking bay. She carried the same comportment into the Fasig-Tipton pavilion when she entered the ring as [hip 97](#), where she was hammered down to Teruya Yoshida's Shadai Farm for \$1.6 million. That was the second-highest price of the auction. Shadai's Dr. Mitsuru Ikeda signed the ticket, saying the mare would be retired from the

track and sent to Japan. He said a mate hadn't yet been chosen for her, but said, "maybe a son of Sunday Silence."

Dubawi Heights headed to the Fasig sale off a sixth-place try in Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf, where she was beaten 2 1/2 lengths by Perfect Shirl (Perfect Soul {Ire}). It was just the second time since she arrived on American shores that she was off the board.

The talented filly launched a four-race winning streak that began with a maiden victory at Hollywood a year ago and concluded with a head victory in the GI Gamely S. at Hollywood in May. Second to Stacelita (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) in the GI Beverly D. S. at Arlington in August, she returned to California to win Santa Anita's GI Yellow Ribbon S. Oct. 1.

Dubawi Heights has helped launch the career of the well-

pedigreed young trainer Simon Callaghan, whose father Neville Callaghan is a now-retired trainer in Europe. The elder Callaghan, who conditioned Danehill Dancer (Ire), leads the partnership group that owned Dubawi Heights, which also included M.V. Magnier, Clodagh McStay and Anabel and Charlie Wyatt.

Simon Callaghan watched his charge sell from the back walking ring, and was philosophical about seeing the filly who brought him his first Grade I win go through the ring.

"She's a very valuable filly now, and understandably the owners want to cash in," he said. "But she's been fantastic for me, to win two Grade Is, and she's been a true pleasure to train. She's got a fantastic temperament, and she's done a lot of good for me. She's got so much quality." Callaghan said Dubawi Heights bounced out of the Breeders' Cup in fine fettle.

The 5-year-old mare sold as [hip 140](#), in foal to Malibu Moon. Mona de Momma won the GI Humana Distaff in 2010 and retired with 5 wins from 13 starts and earnings of \$384,399. Lane's End, agent, consigned.

Clay lives in Bronxville, New York, and is in the sports marketing business. He performs corporate consulting for companies that sponsor sporting events, primarily golf and tennis.


"I am looking for graded stakes winners, and [Mona de Momma] fits the bill," Clay said. "She also has a great page. She's got Mr. Greeley and Street Sense in her pedigree. How can you not want a piece of that family?." Clay continued, "My program is mostly commercial breeding. Naturally, I'll keep a few to race, but I'll predominantly sell the offspring. I have about 15 mares right now, and I'm still looking to expand. I'm always in the process of trying to add better stock."

Alpha Delta also purchased stakes winner **Funny Feeling** (Distorted Humor--Hookedonthefeeling, by Citidancer) for \$520,000. In foal to Medaglia d'Oro, Funny Feeling sold as [hip 104](#) and was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent.

Clay was accompanied by his advisor, Lexington-based bloodstock agent Reynolds Bell, Jr.

"It's a strong market. We tried on a lot of mares before this one," Bell said of Mona de Momma. "If you want to get the best, you're going to have to be there to do it. The best mares are going to be strong, and she was one of the best mares in the sale."

Shunsuke Yoshida, son of Katsumi Yoshida, was the underbidder on Mona de Momma. Earlier in the sale, Yoshida went to \$1.225 million for 4-year-old **Hilda's Passion** (Canadian Frontier--Executricker, by El Prado {Ire}), winner of the the GI Ballerina S. in August. Yoshida said Hilda's

Passion will be retired. She sold as [hip 115](#) and was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent.

"[Hilda's Passion] will be bred to one of the best stallions in Japan," Yoshida said. "She was very fast and a very good-looking filly. We like that she had very good speed." -Pete Denk

Joneses Run Up the Blue Flag...

Doug Cauthen, bidding on behalf of Aaron and Marie Jones, went to \$1.5 million to secure multiple Grade I stakes-placed **Bonnie Blue Flag** (Mineshaft--Tap Your Feet, by Dixieland Band) at Fasig-Tipton Sunday night. The 4-year-old filly ([hip 76](#)), in foal to Medaglia d'Oro, is a half-sister to multiple Grade I winner Diamondrella (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}). "Obviously she is one of the nicest mares in the sale and we thought she had the best physical," Cauthen said. "She is just a lovely mare."

The Jones' breeding operation was front and center at Churchill Downs Saturday when Drosselmeyer (Distorted Humor), bred by the couple, won the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

"The Joneses are trying to upgrade their broodmare band and this mare will fit right," Cauthen added.

Cauthen admitted the mare's seven-figure price tag was more than he hoped to pay, but within expectations. "I hoped we'd get her for a million-ish, but the fancy ones who have the pedigree and the race talent are going to cost more than you hope, but what you expect," he explained. "She is an A+ physical, obviously a super talented mare, a half to a Grade I winner and by a heckuva stallion who has the potential to be a great broodmare sire. The A+s cost a lot."

Asked who the mare would be bred back to, Cauthen said, “We think it’s a great mating that she has, but we’ll get together with Frank Taylor, who has all of the Jones’ mares at Taylor Made Farm, and we’ll figure that out after we see the foal, hopefully.”

John Fort bought Bonnie Blue Flag for \$300,000 as an FTSAUG yearling in 2008. Racing for Fort’s Peachtree Stables, the bay mare won last year’s Cinemine S., was second in the GI Test S. and third in the GI Prioress S. She retired with earnings of \$259,270.

Bonnie Blue Flag was consigned to the November sale by Taylor Made on behalf of Peachtree. Taylor Made’s Mark Taylor pointed out the mare has everything going for her. “She was the highest-priced Mineshaft of her generation,” Taylor said. “She has the pedigree--she’s a half to Diamondrella. She’s still a young mare, and she has the blood. Mineshaft is a beautifully bred horse, and she’s out of a Dixieland Band mare. It’s right on down the page, beautiful blood, and she’s in foal to a champion sire [Medaglia d’Oro] on a nice early cover.

“She could run,” Taylor continued. “She was Grade I-placed twice in New York. She just was the whole package. You couldn’t find a part of her you didn’t like.”

Of the price tag, Taylor said, “I thought she’d sell in the ballpark of a million, and she could bring more. But in this market, you feel foolish predicting that a mare is going to bring north of a million. I thought she could get up there, but I didn’t know if she’d have a lot of latitude over the million mark.”

Au Revoir Zaftig...

The Wertheimer brothers tried some retail therapy yesterday at Fasig-Tipton in the wake of Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa)’s disappointing third-place effort in Saturday’s

GI Breeders’ Cup Mile. The Frenchmen went to \$1.4 million to acquire the broodmare **Zaftig** (Gone West--Zoftig, by Cozzene), in foal to Candy Ride {Arg}). “It’s a great family, and she’s open to plenty of our stallions,” said Pierre Bureau, racing manager for Alain and Gerard Wertheimer. “The family is live with the 2-year-old [Zip Top] in Europe.”

Racing for John and Susan Moore, Zaftig won the 2007 GI Acorn S. Out of Grade I winner Zoftig (Cozzene), the 6-year-old is a half-sister to the dam of Zip Top (Ire) (Smart Strike), recently third in the G1 Racing Post Trophy. She was purchased privately by John Sikura’s Hill ‘n’ Dale Farm in February, 2009.

“She’s unique in that she’s an American racehorse with an international pedigree,” Sikura said. “Her half-sister is the dam of one of the best 2-year-olds in Europe.” **Cont. p7**

Sikura continued, "Zaftig is a long rangy type. Her dam is by Cozzene, and she looks like a mare that could work in North America or Europe. She's a Grade I winner of ultimate class. Being a Grade I winner is still pretty definitive. Even for Europeans who don't follow our form that much, a Grade I winner is still pretty definitive. It's the ultimate test of class. She was a good mare, and she sold well. We're happy."

From A to Z...

Tom Goff of Blandford Bloodstock, bidding on behalf of an unnamed client, secured last year's GI Frizette S. winner **A Z Warrior** (Bernardini-Carson Jen, by Carson City) ([hip 69](#)) for \$1,250,000 yesterday at Fasig-Tipton. "She is a lovely, lovely scopey beautiful mare by Bernardini," Goff said. "I absolutely loved her. She is tall and full of quality." Goff confirmed the filly, who sold as a racing or broodmare prospect, would be retired. "I bought her for an American client of mine, a commercial client, and she is going to go to stud here in America," the Englishman explained.

Goff, active at sales around the globe, sees reason to be optimistic about the bloodstock market. "I think the Keeneland September yearling, and obviously all yearling sales were up, which was fantastic news for the industry," Goff said. "The yearling sales back in Europe were just phenomenal; Tatts was up 50%, so I think trade for these good mares and breeding stock is going to be strong in Europe and it's picking up here."

Out of Carson Jen, A Z Warrior is a half-sister to graded stakes winner E Z Warrior (Exploit) and to stakes winner J Z Warrior (Harlan's Holiday). She RNA'd for \$775,000 at the 2009 Keeneland September sale and, racing for her breeder Zayat Stables, was tabbed a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ after winning her debut at Hollywood Park last July. She captured the Frizette two starts later. A Z Warrior concluded her racing career in the colors of John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Equine Holdings and was consigned to yesterday's sale by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency. She retires with two wins and earnings of \$286,906.

Pachattack to Niarchos Family...

The Niarchos family's Flaxman Holdings Ltd. struck early in last night's Fasig-Tipton November sale to take home **Pachattack** (Pulpit--El Laoob, by Red Ransom) for \$1.2 million. Alan Cooper handled bidding duties from the back walking ring. The 5-year-old, who sold last night as [hip 6](#), was fresh off a third-place finish in Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic and is expected to continue her racing career for her new connections. "She's a lovely filly with a lot of class and we thought, all being well, she could go on," Cooper commented after signing the ticket. "All being well, she's going to go to [trainer] Graham Motion." Flaxman Holdings got a close-up look at Pachattack when she was runner-up, beaten just a half-length, by the stable's homebred Aruna (Mr. Greeley), in the Oct. 9 GI Spinster S. at Keeneland. Pachattack, a \$270,000 Keeneland September yearling, won this season's Gill Arlington Matron S. and was second in the GI Personal Ensign S. while campaigned by Druid Racing. She has hit the board in 14 of 26 starts to date, with five wins and earnings of \$726,990. Pachattack was consigned to yesterday's sale by Bernard McCormack's Cara Bloodstock, as agent.

\$120k to \$1.4 Mil: Glen Hill Drills a Homer...

Glen Hill Farm has enjoyed a blockbuster 2011, campaigning the likes of ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Customer Base (Lemon Drop Kid), Grade III winner Broken Dreams (Broken Vow), and the ill-fated Banned (Kitten's Joy). Last night, the Florida-based operation enjoyed a successful turn as seller, putting through the dam of the Grade I-winning juvenile Drill (Lawyer Ron), the nine-year-old mare **Cat Dancer** (Storm Cat). Cat Dancer's \$1.4 million price tag was a huge return on the \$120,000 Glen Hill paid for her just 12 months ago when Leonard Lavin's operation acquired her while in foal to Strong Contender. At that point, Glen Hill's Craig Bernick, who manages the farm for his grandfather Lavin, saw a mare with plenty of potential.

"A foal of her's made \$1.6 million at Saratoga [the current 3-year-old Javanese, by Medaglia d'Oro]--we bought five fillies that year and liked her," said Bernick, who remembered that filly when he came across Cat Dancer selling deep into November sale as hip 3094. "Keeneland's catalogue is based on the in-foal sires, and she was part of Stonewall's dispersal, and they had bred her to Strong Contender. I don't know if she was Book 4 or 5," he said. "Donato [Lanni] had actually bought Drill that September, so we knew she was a good mare, and we knew she would have pretty babies. We put her in foal to Tiznow and got lucky with the 2-year-old [Drill]."

Drill, whom Hill 'n' Dale's Lanni acquired for \$300,000 at the 2010 Keeneland September Sale, broke through with a victory in the GI Del Mar Futurity for trainer Bob Baffert and owners Mike Pegram, Karl Watson and Paul Weitman. -LM

Mixed Results for Romans...

Trainer Dale Romans came into last night's Fasig-Tipton sale with a small two-horse consignment and, while both fillies attracted plenty of interest, only one found a new home last night. Grade I winner **C. S. Silk** (Medaglia d'Oro-Remember the Day, by Settlement Day) ([hip 89](#)) attracted a final bid of \$1 million from Town & Country Farms. The 5-year-old was purchased by Romans for \$120,000 as a Keeneland September yearling in 2007 and, racing for William Pacella, George Bonomo and Fred Barbara, captured the GI Just a Game S. at Belmont Park in June.

"She is a beautiful mare and I think she is going to a really good home," Romans said. "I think they'll do really well with her. She was Medaglia d'Oro's first stakes winner."

Asked what he had liked about the filly as a yearling, Romans added, "She was just a big, good-looking filly. We just liked the way she looked and walked. Nobody knew about Medaglia d'Oro then, but I've always been a fan of El Prado and I wanted to take a stab at one and it worked out."

Sassy Image (Broken Vow-Ideal Image, by Hennessy) ([hip 17](#)), who Romans purchased for \$42,000 at the 2008 Keeneland September sale, was led out unsold last night at \$1.475 million. The 4-year-old won this year's GI Humana Distaff S. and GI Princess Rooney H. while racing for Romans's brother Jerry. She has been sidelined since a sixth-place effort in the Aug. 27 GI Ballerina S., but will likely return to training after undergoing surgery.

"She has a chip in her rear hind ankle and we're going to have it taken out," Romans explained. "If it comes out clean and everything looks good and Dr. [Larry] Bramlage thinks it's OK, we're going to bring her back next year."

Romans had three horses compete in the weekend's Breeders' Cup championships, including Court Vision (Gulch), upset winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. He was also represented by Shackelford (Forestry), who was runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, and Dullahan (Even the Score), fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

"Everybody looks good," Romans said yesterday. "Court Vision is going over to Spendthrift to get ready for his next career and Shackelford and Dullahan are both going to take a little break and get ready for next year."

From \$75,000 to \$800k in Five Months...

The father-and-son team of Myron and Robert Miller reached in and claimed the 6-year-old mare **Ask the Moon** (Malibu Moon--Always Asking, by Valid Appeal) for \$75,000 in June and, having delivered the filly to trainer Marty Wolfson, watched as the strapping bay won the GI Ruffian H. and GI Personal Ensign H. in consecutive starts at Saratoga. Sixth in Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic, she made the trip over to Fasig's sale grounds shortly thereafter and, last

night, sold to SF Bloodstock's Tom Ryan for \$800,000. Taylor Made Sales consigned the mare as [hip 66](#). "She was a filly that always showed talent, but when Marty Wolfson got hold of her, he got her to another level," said Taylor Made's Mark

Taylor. "She reminded me of another filly we sold in the past, Fleet Indian (Indian Charlie). She was always around the stakes level, but then sometimes you get them in the right hands, and they figure it out a little bit. She won two Grade 1s, and was very good looking. She's big and has a beautiful neck and shoulder on her. I was happy for Myron. He does a great job with these fillies." Ryan signed for two others on the night, including **D'Wild Ride** (D'wildcat), who went for \$200,000 ([hip 98](#)); and **Strike the Bell** (Mizzen Mast), who cost \$150,000 ([hip 32](#)). SF Bloodstock is an international bloodstock conglomerate with farms in the U.S., Europe and Australia. Ryan said Ask the Moon would be retired and would stay in Kentucky. "She's a mare we've been high on all summer, she won two Grade 1s, she is by Malibu Moon, and it's a beautiful piece of paper," Ryan said, standing alongside SF's Australian manager Henry Field. "She'll go to our broodmare band, but I'm not too sure who we'll breed her to. We have several options." -LM

Strong Results at Fasig November...

After a strong four hours of selling, figures were up across the board at last night's Fasig-Tipton November sale. In all, 79 horses grossed \$32,745,000. The average of \$414,494 was up 31.8% from 2010, while the median rose 53.8% to \$200,000. The gross was up 17%, despite 10 fewer horses selling. During last night's session, 13 horses brought seven figures, up from nine million-dollar sales a year ago. With 79 of 109 horses offered finding new homes, the buy-back rate was 27.5%, down from 33.1% in 2010.

"Obviously, we had a strong sale tonight," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning. "We are very pleased with the trade and that the number of horses that brought over a million-dollars increased from last year."

Browning attributed the sale's success to its extensive buying bench.

"There was a very broad and diverse buying group here tonight," he said. "From Japanese to Australians, to Europeans to Americans, there was a broad international level of participation and you could notice it on the sales grounds three or four days before the sale."

Despite the strength of the market, Browning did notice that buyers continue to be discriminating.

"There was strong competition for most of the lots on offer tonight," Browning commented. "But when there is what is perceived to be a few holes, whether it be in terms of age or produce or covering sire, it's not easy. It's not a wide spread, complete lift in the market. I think there is more competition at the upper level of the market than we saw last year. Which is indicative of what we saw most of the later part of 2011 in the yearling sale."

Asked if he noticed more confidence in the market, Browning said, "I think it has increased, but you still don't see silly things in the auction ring. I think people establish what they think is a range of value and they quit bidding beyond that. And it doesn't matter who you are, people bid with some discipline, which is probably healthy long term. I think there is a higher level of confidence than there was a year ago, but we still have to work on that."

Buyers got an ideal autumn afternoon yesterday to shop the Keeneland barns, and Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell said all indicators pointed to a strong sale.

"The action's been very good--we've been very busy the last couple of days," he said. "I was out at the barns [Sunday] morning and it was very strong down there. It was good to see both mares and foals out. Traditionally, we see more foals out, so it was good to see the mares out as well.

"We have two very good dispersals, which has helped us attract other very good mares. We also have a strong group of Grade I racemares in this catalogue, including last year's GI Ladies' Classic one-two, with Unrivaled Belle and Blind Luck. And having a horse like Royal Delta confirm all the talent everyone knew

she had after she won the GI Alabama S. and go off and win the Ladies' Classic so impressively helps advertise her better than anything we could have done."

Russell added the sale's close proximity to Louisville's Churchill Downs, which hosted the Breeders' Cup, has historically been a significant positive.

"I'm a strong believer in that when the Breeders' Cup is at Churchill Downs, it gives an extra boost to the breeding stock sales," he said. "The Breeders' Cup is a major international event, and people who enjoy racing internationally like to come to these major events and then stay for the sale. So the principals who come for the races wind up staying for the sales, and anytime you have the principals there, it bodes well."

One of the biggest drivers of the bloodstock market might well be a solid 2011 yearling sales season. "Globally, it was very good," said Russell. "September 2010 helped everyone get a base, and we've been growing off that, both in America and internationally, and that's very positive for the industry. Hopefully, we'll see further improvements."

Last year's November Sale was topped by MGISW Society Selection (Coronado's Quest), who went to Coolmore connections for \$1.85 million. Taylor Made Sales consigned. A total of 2,929 horses sold for \$147,392,900, an average of \$50,322. That was down 12.4% from the previous year. The median of \$17,000 was down 15%. The sale runs through Thursday, Nov. 17. YOSHIDA BUYS STACELITA; EYE BEING TREATED

Stacelita (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}--Soignee {Ger}, by Dashing Blade {GB}), a disappointing 10th as the favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf Friday, has been purchased privately by Teruya Yoshida and will eventually be sent to Japan. She will not race

again. Owned by Martin Schwartz and trained by Chad Brown, the 5-year-old recorded wins in the 2011 GI Beverly D. S. at Arlington and GI Flower Bowl Invitational S. at Belmont. She is also a four-time Group 1 winner in her native France.

Yoshida also purchased a controlling interest in G1SW Elusive Kate

(Elusive Quality) prior to her eighth-place finish as the 5-2 favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf Friday.

Stacelita is currently having her left eye treated at Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital. According to Brown, the area was apparently struck by a chunk of grass during the Flower Bowl, and it developed an ulcer. She was given the OK to compete in the Breeders' Cup, and Brown doesn't think that the condition affected her performance at Churchill.

"She will have her eye checked out real well," Brown said. "And getting a more thorough exam in a clinic environment will be better for her now that she's not under any stress of training."

He continued, "I think it's more the trip did us in. I'm not going to use the eye much [as an excuse], but it's unfortunate that she wasn't 100% all month preparing for the race because I do think she's the best grass filly in the country. In a perfect world, I would have wished that this never happened and that I had her 100%. The two races where we had her 100%, she showed her stuff. I think she probably deserves the Eclipse Award."

- Juddmonte's **Announce (GB)** (Selkirk), still recovering from lacerations received prior to the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf, will remain in training in the United States under the care of Bill Mott.

John Velazquez won the 2011 Bill Shoemaker Award for outstanding jockey at this past weekend's Breeders' Cup World Championships. The veteran pilot rode Stephanie's Kitten (Kitten's Joy) to victory in the GII Juvenile Fillies Turf and Perfect Shirl (Perfect Soul {Ire}) to her upset win in the GI F/M Turf. He also recorded second-place finishes with Birdrun (Birdstone) in the GII Marathon and Force Freeze (Forest Camp) in the GI Sprint, and was third aboard Brilliant Speed (Dynaformer) in the GI Turf. The 39-year-old also won the Shoemaker award in 2004.



SAY WHAT?

Trainer Bob Baffert on Game On Dude (Awesome Again)'s strong performance in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic:

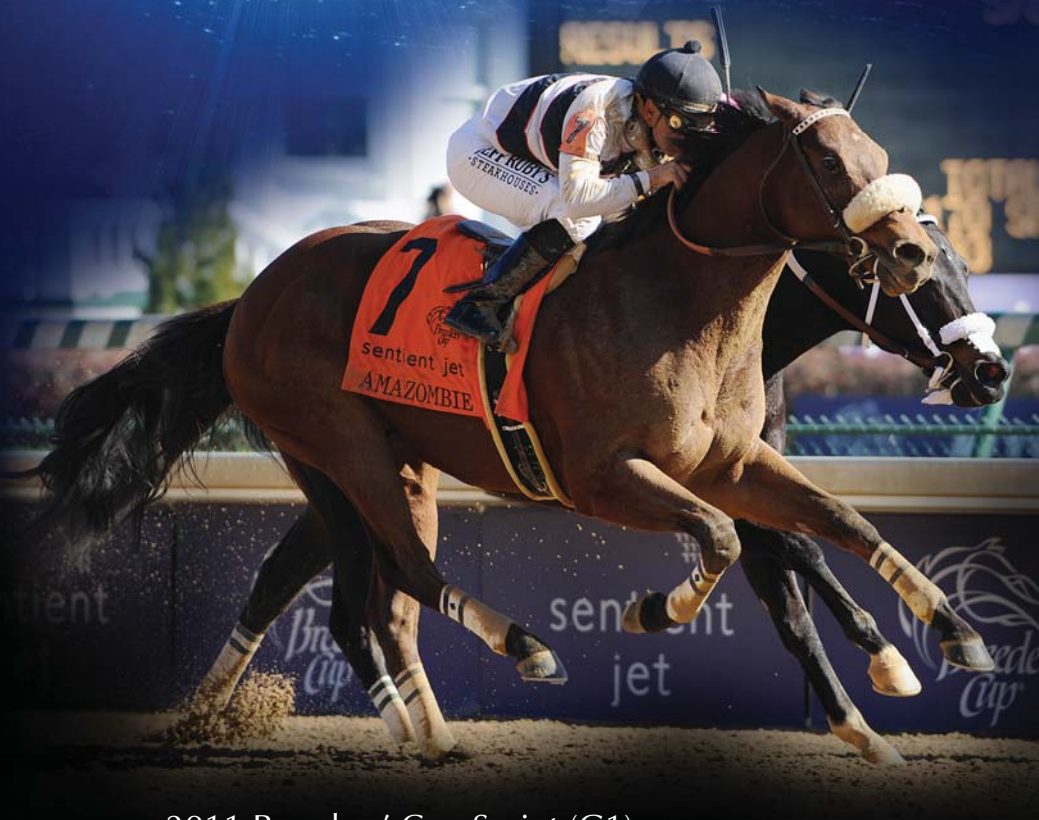

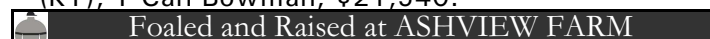

Impeccably bred Deluxe began her career for Andre Fabre in France, reeling off a pair of victories to open her account before splitting Sarafina (Fr) (Refuse to Bend {Ire}) and Hibaayeb (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) when second in Longchamp's G1 Prix Saint-Alary last May. She was fourth in the G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly a month later before dropping back down to the listed level for a win in September, and completed her European campaign with an eighth-place run in Saint-Cloud's G3 Prix de Flore Oct. 26. The homebred's late rush came up a head short when she resurfaced for Mott in Saratoga's Sept. 3 Paris Opera S., and she faded to sixth after attending the pace over yielding ground in Belmont's GI Flower Bowl Invitational S.

Santa Anita Fall Meet Ends with Gains:
Edited Press Release

Santa Anita's inaugural 24-day Autumn Meet concluded Sunday, as "The Great Race Place" stood tall in the face of declining industry revenues, posting significant gains in on-track attendance, handle and in average-per-race field size when compared to like racing dates the past two years. Average field size for the meet was 8.8 horses per race, a significant increase from 2009, when field size was 7.7 horses per race. Average daily on-track attendance was up 1% over 2009 and average daily on-track pari-mutuel handle was up 6%. "Our field size was up considerably over the fall meet here in 2009 and that's something that we look forward to building upon as we look to the winter/spring meet," said Santa Anita President George Haines. "This is a result of two things--an improving horse inventory and the fact that our natural dirt main track is performing very well. We installed this surface last summer and it's been very well-received by the horseman, which was reflected at the entry box. Haines continued, "The turf course also performed well and we believe all of this bodes well for the future. We've got the Breeders' Cup coming here next year and in an immediate sense, we're very much looking forward to opening day on Dec. 26." In addition to on-track increases, Santa Anita's overall business showed improvement as well. All-source average daily handle was up 5% compared to 2009 and the all-source handle was up 22% when compared to the same dates that were run at Hollywood Park in 2010. "The racing was outstanding throughout the meet and the fact that our Breeders' Cup horses performed so well is a good indication that the quality of our product remains world-class."

Increased Overnight Purses Hollywood Autumn Meet:

The Autumn meet at Hollywood Park, which begins with an eight race program Thursday, Nov. 10, will see an increase of approximately 25% in overnight purses from the 2010 season.
