## EVANS DISPERSAL STEALS THE SHOW

Yesterday's opening session of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock sale became a showpiece for the bloodstock of the late Ned Evans's Spring Hill Farm, with the broodmare **Christmas Kid** (Lemon Drop Kid- Christmas Gift, Green Desert) cementing the dispersal's domination when selling for a sale-topping \$4.2 million to the bid of Coolmore's Aisling Duignan.

The dispersal, handled by Lane's End, was responsible

for 18 of Monday's top 20 lots and 11 of the 14 seven-figure sales of the session. In all, the dispersal sold 63 head for \$40,684,500. The average was \$645,786 and the median was \$320,000. While responsible for 42.9% of the 147 horses sold at Keeneland yesterday, the dispersal represented 64.3% of the day's \$63,276,500 gross.

"It exceeded my expectations, and I had high expectations," admitted longtime Spring Hill Farm manager Chris Baker. "I've always felt that Mr. Evans and Spring Hill had put together a spectacular group of mares, and to see that the rest of the Thoroughbred world feels the same way is very flattering and very reassuring."

Evans, who passed away last December, spent four decades establishing a world-class broodmare band at his Casanova, Virginia farm. He bred more than 100 stakes winners, including 2005 Horse of the Year Saint Liam and multiple Grade I winner Quality Road.

The dispersal had international appeal, with buyers from the U.S., Ireland and France all taking home top lots. Ben Leon's Besilu Stables, based in Florida, acquired five of the dispersal's seven-figure lots, including a Keeneland record \$2.6-million Medaglia d'Oro weanling. The Wertheimer brothers struck for Grade I winner **Buster's Ready** (More Than Ready) for \$2.4 million and Coolmore representatives took home a pair of seven-figure broodmares.

The international attraction was no surprise to Baker.

"I think when you look at what Mr. Evans did, our U.S. program was just quality based," Baker explained. "And at the higher level there is international appeal for what is quality. This is just another example of that same trend." **Cont. p2**

## UNCLE MO RETIRED

Mike Repole's **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie--Playa Maya, by Arch) has been retired from racing after tests revealed elevated levels of the enzyme gamma-glutamyltransferase (GGT) in his blood. High levels of GGT also led to the diagnosis of a rare liver ailment called cholangiohepatitis this spring, which knocked last year's champion 2-year-old off the Triple Crown trail. Uncle Mo finished 10th in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic. "It's a sad decision, but an easy one," said Repole. "This is just a rare, rare liver disease. Knowing that he's going to be healthy, taken care of and have some great racing foals someday makes me feel good." Uncle Mo, a \$160,000 KEENOV weanling turned \$220,000 KEESEP yearling, was unveiled by trainer Todd Pletcher in a 14 1/4-length romp at Saratoga last August, earning the colt the **"TDN Rising Star"** distinction ([video](#)). He followed that effort with a facile 4 3/4-length score in the GI Champagne S. at Belmont in October ([video](#)), and ran away with year-end honors with another brilliant 4 1/4-length score in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Churchill Downs the following month ([video](#)). "Since I was a 13-year-old kid, I've dreamed about owning a horse like this--it was a dream come true," said Repole. "To win the Breeders' Cup Juvenile was the highlight of owning Uncle Mo." **Cont. p2**

**Uncle Mo Retired cont.**

Uncle Mo resurfaced at three with another easy victory in the Timely Writer S. at Gulfstream Park in March, but tasted his first defeat when third at 1-9 in Aqueduct's GI Wood Memorial in April. He was subsequently diagnosed with a gastrointestinal infection, and was scratched from the GI Kentucky Derby a day before the race. Uncle Mo was then laid up at WinStar Farm in Versailles, Kentucky, where he was diagnosed with cholangiohepatitis about a month later. The bay made what appeared to be a full recovery in the coming months, and returned to the site of his debut 364 days after first

bursting onto the scene, losing a photo finish to GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Caleb's Posse (Posse) in the prestigious GI King's Bishop S.

In his final race before the Classic, Uncle Mo took the one-mile GII Kelso H. at Belmont Oct. 1 by three lengths ([video](#)) over GISW Jackson Bend (Hear No Evil), earning a gaudy 118 Beyer Speed Figure.

"We got him back for the Kelso and it was great that he got his redemption and he showed that he wasn't just a precocious 2-year-old," said Repole. "Probably one of the most brilliant races of the year by any horse was his Kelso, so to get him back and have that one more brilliant performance at three, with me being from New York, to get that brilliance one more time on a New York racetrack was special."

Uncle Mo arrived at Coolmore's Ashford Stud in Versailles Monday afternoon, where he is set to stand the 2012 season. Coolmore purchased the colt's breeding rights in August, with Repole maintaining a interest in his star in the shed. Uncle Mo's condition is not hereditary. "I could be in this game probably another 100 years and I don't think I'll ever own another horse as talented as him, because I don't think they're made too many times--maybe every 20 years or so," Repole said.

For Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell, yesterday's results were a fitting tribute to a man whose life's passion was breeding the best possible racehorses.

"This is a life's work," Russell said. "Ned Evans spent 40 years developing this. He developed a broodmare band that the whole world wanted. And the whole world showed up here to buy. Certain mares went way beyond expectations, and it was a spectacular tribute to the man. These were the prettiest group of mares that I've ever seen in one collection. It's a credit to him, and it's a credit to Chris Baker. What they did together in the last 12 years, and what Mr. Evans did for 40 years, was reflected today. It's a great testament and a great comment on his life and his work."

Baker admitted the dispersal was bittersweet.

"It is very flattering in a way, with what we were able to be part of and help put together," Baker said. "But to see them go into capable hands, that is as good as it can get for where we are right now; that these families can go on, that 20 to 30 years from now, we'll still be reading about horses from these families who are running. That we can't do it ourselves is certainly bittersweet, but hopefully they can continue to go on and do something that we can be proud of."

Russell thinks that the dispersal's popularity is a positive for the entire November sale.

"We knew that the dispersal would attract worldwide interest and it would spill over to the rest of the horses, and I think it did," he commented.

Three Chimneys' Case Clay agreed. Three Chimneys sold one of the few non-dispersal seven-figure lots yesterday in **Life At Ten** (Malibu Moon), who brought \$1.95 million.

"So much of this has to do with the Ned Evans dispersal," Clay said. "It gets people here, but also, a lot of people try to buy the nice-pedigreed horses, and they can't get them, but they're here, and they're more apt to buy [other] horses if they are here."

An additional 107 head from the dispersal are scheduled to sell during the remainder of the sale. -

Aisling Duignan handled bidding duties for Team Coolmore on **Christmas Kid** ([hip 78](#)) and, after the Irishwoman signed the session-topping ticket at \$4.2 million, David Nagle joked, "Did you enjoy that?"

Reiley McDonald, bidding on the phone from the back row of the sales pavilion, was the underbidder. Duignan confirmed the 7-year-old mare, in foal to Bernardini, will head to Ireland. "She'll most likely go home to [be bred to Coolmore

stallion] Galileo (Ire)," Duignan said.

Christmas Kid captured the GI Ashland S. over Keeneland's Polytrack in 2007 and won the GII Davona Dale S. over conventional dirt. She also triumphed in the Tropical Park Oaks and was third in the Virginia Oaks over the turf. She was proceeded into the Keeneland sales ring by her first foal, a weanling colt by Elusive Quality, who brought a final bid of \$525,000 from Tim Hyde.

Duignan said the mare's race record and her attractive weanling contributed to the purchase.

"She was good herself, her first foal was really good, and she's magnificent looking," Duignan said. "It seemed the prudent thing to do." Of the price, Duignan added, "It was probably a little bit more than we expected, but she was so good looking. When a mare gets a good first foal like that, you have to pay attention."

Christmas Kid's popularity was no surprise to Chris Baker.

"She really speaks for herself," the Spring Hill manager said. "She was an exceptional racemare--very genuine and a stakes winner on dirt, turf and Poly--a Grade I

winner on Poly. It is just quality. You look at her and the quality comes through. She had it in her first foal and she had it herself. That's what people want."

Evans purchased Christmas Kid's dam Christmas Gift (Green Desert) for \$230,000 as a Keeneland September yearling in 1993. Multiple graded stakes placed on the track herself, Christmas Gift also produced stakes winner Elusive Gift (Elusive Quality). She sold for \$180,000 to the bid of Peter Blum yesterday.

**Six Pack: Besilu Aggressive for Evans Stock...**

If the story of Monday's opening session at Keeneland November was the Ned Evans dispersal, then the subplot was the dogged determination of Besilu Stables' Benjamin Leon, Jr. to purchase horses from the dispersal. By far and away the session's leading buyer, Leon acquired six horses for \$11.4 million--a staggering average of \$1.9 million. All his purchases hailed from the Evans dispersal being handled by Lane's End, and in one audacious six-minute stretch, Leon laid out \$6.4 million for three consecutive hips: [201](#), [202](#)

and [203](#). That included a record \$2.6- million bid for a weanling half-sister to Horse of the Year Saint Liam by Medaglia d'Oro.

"I am very happy that we were able to obtain these types of horses in this sale," said Leon, who spent most of the afternoon front and center in the sales pavilion surrounded by friends, family and associates.

"I really wish that Mr. Evans could have been here instead of the horses, but unfortunately he passed, and it became an opportunity to obtain these kinds of horses that otherwise, I don't think would have been available in the market for anyone else to acquire. I see that as a blessing and an opportunity."

Leon's purchases included three sisters produced by the 18-year-old mare **Quiet Dance** (Quiet American), as well as the mare herself. Quiet Dance has produced,

among others, the 2005 GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Saint Liam (Saint Ballado), as well as GSW Congression-alhonor (Forestry).

Leading all of Leon's purchases was **Quiet Giant** (Giant's Causeway--Quiet Dance), a 4-year-

old stakes-winning half to Saint Liam who was knocked down for \$3 million as hip 203. A winner of seven of 12 lifetime starts thus far for trainer Todd Pletcher, Quiet Giant captured four 2011 black-type events by a combined 23 3/4 lengths, including a five-length romp in the GII Molly Pitcher S. at Monmouth Sept. 3 in her latest. Quiet Giant was catalogued as a racing or broodmare prospect.

Preceding her into the ring by one hip was her dam Quiet Dance, purchased by Leon for \$800,000, and one before that was a weanling half-sister by Medaglia d'Oro who sold to the South Florida businessman for \$2.6 million. That eclipsed the \$2.4 million Isla Canela (Gone West--Islington {Ire}) brought in 2006, a Keeneland record for a filly at the time. The filly is also one of the highest-priced weanlings on record outside of Japan. At Keeneland November in 2006, Electrocutonist's half-brother Amour Maleureux (Montjeu {Ire}) made \$2.7 million, while Urban Sea's daughter My Typhoon (Ire) (Giant's Causeway) brought \$2.935 million at Tattersalls December in 2002.

"After analyzing all of them, we thought she might be the best weanling in the whole sale," said Leon. "She looked great and was well-balanced. That is a reflection of the experts, like the Pletchers, father and son [trainer Todd Pletcher and his father J.J.]. She comes from a great family and, in fact, we acquired her dam and two of her half-sisters. I think everybody [likes the family], otherwise I wouldn't have had to pay that much."

Earlier in the day, Leon purchased another daughter of Quiet Dance, the 3-year-old stakes winner **Dance Quietly** (A.P. Indy), for \$2 million. Selling as a racing or broodmare prospect as [hip 98](#), she was also trained by Todd Pletcher, who saddled her to a win in this year's Busanda S. at Aqueduct. **cont. p8**

Equaling that \$2 million tag was **Malibu Prayer** (Malibu Moon--Grand Prayer, by Grand Slam), whom Leon secured as [hip 161](#). The 5-year-old won the GII Chilukki S. at three, then came back at four to take the GI Ruffian Invitational H. at Saratoga. She was retired for the 2011 breeding season and bred on a Mar. 10 cover to Smart Strike.

Concluding Leon's Monday buys was Malibu Prayer's stakes-winning 10-year-old dam **Grand Prayer** (Grand Slam--Lyrical Prayer, by The Minstrel), who went for \$1

million. The half-sister to Grade II winner Tap Dance (Pleasant Tap), whose first foal was Malibu Prayer, sold in foal on a May 14 cover to Medaglia d'Oro. She was catalogued as [hip 125](#).

Leon said the quality of the horses dictated the prices they brought. "I don't think any horseman would be surprised that a bunch of people who have a passion for this sport and this business would be willing to pay at a given moment for a given horse," said Leon. "That's what makes an auction really exciting. We're just happy that we were able to get the horses that we got. They fit in our program."

Leon's participation continued a run at Keeneland that extends back to September of 2010, when he bought the unraced Mr. Besilu (A.P. Indy--Balance) for \$4.2 million. This year, he was September's second-leading buyer behind only John Ferguson, purchasing 13 head for \$8,175,000. Leading the group was the filly topper, a \$1.3 million half-sister to graded winner Multiple Choice by Unbridled's Song--Lady of Choice.

"Mr. Leon's participation is welcomed greatly," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "He made a great splash when he came in last year in September, and he's mentioned on more than one occasion that he wants to develop a top broodmare band, and he went to the right place to start it."

Interjected Keeneland's Walt Robertson, "He's certainly well on his way." -LM

**Dedomenico Buys Out Blind Luck Partners...**

Perhaps she didn't figure to be the session's top-priced lot, but probably no horse was more anticipated yesterday than [hip 201A](#)--the hard-knocking champion filly **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision--Lucky One, by Best of Luck), who over three seasons of busy campaigning has made fans of even the most reluctant hard boots.

Horsemen and more than a few of those fans lined up in the rear walking ring to see her yesterday, and as she was the last horse selling on the

day, the whole crowd out back seemed to shift forward in unison as she was led into the left rear lead-in chute. Ultimately, it was Blind Luck's biggest fan, her co-owner Dr. Mark Dedomenico, who came away with the racy chestnut, buying out his partners to the tune of \$2.5 million. The Taylor brothers' Taylor Made Sales consigned. Dedomenico essentially paid half the ticket price to acquire a full interest in the 4-year-old, as he owned 50% of her heading into the sale. Trainer Mike Puhich, sitting out front a few row up from the sale ring, signed the ticket on Dedomenico's behalf. Puhich manages Dedomenico's Pegasus Equine Rehabilitation and Training Center near Seattle, Washington.

"Quite frankly, we didn't know what she was going to sell for. But it's a good deal for the partners, it's a good deal for Mark, and it was a good business decision for everybody," Puhich said afterward. "Mark wanted to keep her and, hopefully, control her destiny a little bit, give her a good home and do right by her. She had a rough campaign. She ran her heart out, and we just want to let her be a horse for a bit. We'll let the smoke clear a bit, and then we'll decide who to breed her to."

Acquired privately by Dedomenico, John Carver and Peter Abruzzo after breaking her maiden against claiming company in her debut at Calder in June of 2009, Blind Luck won the GI Oak Leaf S. and GI Hollywood Starlet at two that year. At three, the Jerry Hollendorfer-trained filly added the GI Las Virgenes S, GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Alabama S. and, after running second in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic, was named champion 3-year-old filly. In 2011, Blind Luck pushed her Grade I tally to six in the Vanity H. in June. She went unplaced in the GI Lady's Secret S. Oct. 1, and connections made the announcement soon after that she was be a late addition to the Keeneland November catalogue. Puhich confirmed Blind Luck will now be retired with a record of 22-12-7-2 and earnings of \$3,279,520.

"We're actually not in the breeding business, but Mark thought, 'You know what, if she goes for the right money and we can just enjoy her and what she's done, let's do that, and we'll try to make some decisions later on,'" said Puhich. "Right now, he just wants to do what's best for the horse."

Among those who were on hand to watch Blind Luck sell was her breeder, Dr. William Baker, who, along with his wife Terry, bred her under the banner Fairlawn Farm. The Bakers had claimed Blind Luck's dam for just \$15,000 in 2005, and later sold her to Japanese interests for \$1.85 million. -LM

selling to Wertheimer et Frere for \$2.4 million yesterday at Keeneland. The 3-year-old Ned Evans homebred ([hip 63](#)) is out of a half-sister to champion Saint Liam. "She was one of the best fillies in the sale," the Wertheimer's racing manager Pierre-Yves Bureau said. "She

was a very talented filly; she was a Grade 1 winner and is good looking, and she's from a strong family."

Bureau admitted the Evans dispersal offered a rare opportunity. "We don't have the opportunity to buy these kinds of mares every year," he confirmed. "Because of the dispersal of Mr. Evans, there was a lot of choice, but this was pick number one, so we are very pleased to get her."

Bureau added that Buster's Ready would likely remain in the U.S. to be bred next spring. "We are not sure who we would breed her to, but she will be quite easy to mate. She's open to plenty of stallions, and we have plenty of time to make the right decision. She can go on both sides, and we especially like the broodmare line of Halo."

The Wertheimers were also active at Fasig-Tipton Sunday night, buying the mare Zaftig (Gone West) for \$1.4 million.

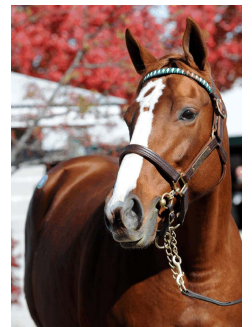
**Barronstown Stud Strikes...**

Asked if the price surprised him, Nagle said presciently, "It's a dispersal and that's the value of them. That's what you have to pay. There will be a lot of big prices here today."

Spring Hill manager Chris Baker admitted Weekend Strike's final price tag exceeded expectations, but he said it was a good sale for both sides. "She is a great young mare from the best family in the American stud book, so it's probably what she ought to bring and I think she'll prove to be well-bought," Baker said.

**For Stronach, 'Life' at \$1.95 Million...**

It's been a year full of questions for the 6-year-old racemare **Life at Ten** (Malibu Moon--Rahrahsixboombah, by Rahy), the notorious non-scratch from last year's

GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic who just never returned to form in 2011. But if there was any question that buyers would forget her outstanding performances from the 2010 season, it was answered resoundingly yesterday, as the big, handsome mare brought a strong \$1.95 million from Adena Spring's Frank Stronach. Stronach, sitting with Adena's Mark Roberts, outlasted a determined and

prolonged challenge from Denali's Craig Bandoroff and a client located across the sales pavilion. Three Chimneys consigned Life at Ten as [hip 152](#).

Life at Ten had been entered at last year's Fasig-Tipton November Sale, but was scratched shortly after running last in the Ladies' Classic, and even her connections were unsure how she'd be received by the market.

"It's a little more than what we expected," admitted Three Chimneys' Case Clay just after the transaction. "We were just having a discussion: would she have brought more last year? Nobody will ever know that, but this seems like such a strong sale for the top-quality stock. It was two people fighting from \$1 million to \$1.95 million, and we were very pleased. She's a beautiful mare, and we wish Frank Stronach the best of luck with her. She had a lot of interest from a lot of people, and I think she's one of the few mares in the catalogue who are both beautiful and were really good on the racetrack."

Racing for Candy DeBartolo and trainer Todd Pletcher, Life at Ten took a little while to get going, but after winning her first stakes in December of her 4-year-old year, went on a tear at five in 2010. In consecutive starts, she won the GII Sixty Sails H. at Hawthorne, the GI Ogden Phipps H. at Belmont and the GII Delaware H., then two starts later added the GI Beldame S. She placed in two more graded events this year, and was retired with a record of 22-8-6-4 and earnings of \$1,277,515.

Clay said DeBartolo and her husband Eddie DeBartolo Jr. weren't able to make the trip to Keeneland to watch Life at Ten sell. "But David Vance is their manager, and he was here and on the phone with them, giving them updates," said Clay. "They were pleased with the result."

Stronach said he hoped to get Life at Ten for less, but reasoned, "She's a very unique specimen and a good racehorse." Stronach said he hadn't yet picked a mate for her. -LM

Not long after, in front of a rapt crowd, the filly became the co-sixth-highest selling weanling filly in Keeneland history when knocked down to Frank Stronach's Adena Springs for \$1.5 million. “Physically, she looked great,” said Stronach, who did his bidding in front alongside Adena’s Mark Roberts and Eric Hamelback. “I liked the pedigree, I liked the sire, I

liked the dam. She’ll stay at the farm here, or maybe go to Florida.”

When asked about the price, Stronach said he expected, “Something like that. She is one of a kind.”

The filly is a daughter of Broodmare of the Year Vertigineux (Kris S.), also the dam

of MGISW Balance (Thunder Gulch), who in turn is the dam of the sale-topping \$4.2 million Mr. Besilu (A.P. Indy). The stakes-winning Where’s Bailey (Aljabr) is another sibling.

Select Sales was selling the filly on behalf of Ric Jamieson, who owns the Australian-based Gilgai Farm and who had acquired the filly somewhat circuitously.

Erik Kronfeld’s Maverick Productions bred both Vertigineux and her daughters Balance and Zenyatta, but in the fall of 2008, sold the mare privately to Coolmore’s John Magnier, under the condition that he would keep the in-utero foal, the current unraced 2-year-old Eblouissante (Bernardini). Coolmore sent Vertigineux to their promising young stallion Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) in consecutive years, then privately sold the resulting offspring, fillies born in 2010 and 2011, respectively, to Jamieson. A successful businessman, Jamieson purchased both horses close together, but not as a package.

In Australia, Jamieson heads the company Harry the Hirer, which rents marquee, lighting and audiovisual equipment for parties and events. In racing circles, Jamieson is best known as the breeder of supermare Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Spirit {Aus}), but he also bred this year’s G1 AJC Oaks heroine Absolutely (Aus) (Redoute’s Choice {Aus}).

The Irish-based bloodstock agents Dermot Farrington and Mick Flanagan advise Jamieson, and were on hand to watch Zenyatta’s half-sis sell.

“We didn’t really want to sell this filly, but just the way things have gone in the world, we decided it made sense, and away we went,” said Farrington. “We thought \$1.5 million for a half to Zenyatta was fair. Considering what Group 1 winners were bringing last night [at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale], she brought what Group 1 winners were making. But then she’s a half-sister to one of the best racehorses we’ve ever seen. And even if you take Zenyatta out of the pedigree, you still have Balance. So [Stronach] has a good product, and we’re happy with the money. Plus we still have another half-sister to Zenyatta.”

The filly Jamieson retained, an unnamed yearling, is currently being broken at WinStar Farm in Kentucky and will likely be campaigned in the U.S. “She’ll race here, and then later, possibly, she’ll go to Australia and race,” said Farrington, who said all of Jamieson’s buys “seep back to Australia eventually.”

As to who might train the filly, Farrington said, “We have a few [possibles] on the list. We have the trainer of Zenyatta [John Shirreffs], the trainer of Balance [David Hofmans], and Simon Callaghan’s on the list--he’s a good guy and has done a good job.”

Jamieson has raced just one horse in the States before, a maiden winner trained by Jerry Hollendorfer. He ramped up his breeding and racing operation in earnest about five years ago, telling Farrington and Flanagan, “We’re really going to have a go at this.” Said Farrington, “We’ve gotten lucky so far. We’ve had Black Caviar and Absolutely, and we have a half-sister to Peeping Fawn [Danehill] on the farm. Ric’s a real pedigree expert and is a really good guy, and he should be happy with himself after today.” **Cont. p13**

Select Sales' Andrew Cary said it was a rush to get a chance to sell a sibling to Zenyatta. "Obviously, she was an amazing filly from an amazing pedigree," he said. "She is going to a great home with Frank Stronach. The owner was thrilled. And we were very thrilled to be a small part of it."

He added the price had plenty to do with the filly's residual value. "I think it was definitely important that she was a filly, just because she'll always have a future as a broodmare, and who knows how many fillies from this family will ever come on the market," said Cary. "She is a collector's item, and that is why everyone lined up to buy her. She had a ton of interest at the barn, and

she showed herself like a champion. I think she is going to be an amazing racehorse."

The filly is among the highest-priced weanling fillies to sell at Keeneland since eventual Grade I winner Mi Sueno (Pulpit) elicited a bid of \$1.7 million from Southern Equine Stables in 2007. Isla Canela (Gone West--Islington {Ire}), a \$2.4 million weanling in 2006, holds the sale's high-water mark. -LM

### Dark Sky to Summer Wind

**Dark Sky** (Storm Cat-Media Nox {GB}, by Lycius) attracted a final bid of \$1.5 million from Summer Wind Farm's Laura Jane Lyon, sitting alongside daughter Karen Bailey and farm manager Mark Moloney. The 6-year-old mare ([hip 94](#)), in foal to Quality Road, is a full-sister to multiple Group 1 winner Nebraska Tornado and a half to group winner Burning Sun (Danzig) and graded stakes winner Mirabilis (Lear Fan).

"She's a really pretty mare, and the pedigree speaks for itself," Moloney explained. "It's just a huge, huge pedigree. She's had a good foal. If she can produce a stakes horse, you've got it made."

Moloney added that the competition for mares from the Evans dispersal was fierce. "We've tried on two mares, and it's really strong," he said. "But that's a credit to Mr. Evans. He was a great breeder."

Dark Sky was preceded into the sales ring by her Street Cry (Ire) weanling colt, who sold for \$475,000 to the bid of bloodstock agent David Redvers.

## BLACK CAVIAR DONE FOR THE YEAR

Australian sprinting sensation **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}), who ran her unbeaten streak to 16 over the weekend in the G1 Patinack Farm Classic at Flemington, will skip an intended start in the G1 Winterbottom S. at Perth Nov. 19, according to published reports. The popular mare emerged from her Flemington win with a slight muscle tear. "She's a little bit jarry, she's got a little muscle tear up high behind, it's nothing too dramatic, but just enough to suggest to us, after consultation with the owners, that we'll have a little rest rather than go to Perth unfortunately," trainer Peter Moody said in an interview on Radio Sport National. "These races look effortless, but they're not. They're Group 1 races, they run fast time and on Saturday the track was a bit firm, but we went there knowing that. I would not say she's come out of it worse for wear, but she's come out of it feeling the run." Moody indicated that if the Winterbottom hadn't required a cross-country flight, Black Caviar may have made the race. "If she was racing here in two weeks, there's a great chance she'd be going around, but the fact we've got to travel across the continent to do it, in strange circumstances, we're not going to risk that," Moody added. "She's done a good job--I don't think anyone could begrudge her a few weeks off." *Herald Sun* reports that Black Caviar could reappear in the G1 Australia S. at Moonee Valley Jan. 27.

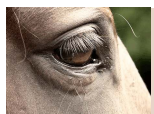

The Storm Cat male line struck out at a Breeders' Cup dominated by the male lines descending from Mr. Prospector and Sadler's Wells.

Mr. Prospector scored via his sons Gulch (Court Vision) and Smart Strike (My Miss Aurelia), but time is moving on and he owed a sizeable part of his success to his grandsons and great-grandsons. The in-form grandsons were Drosselmeyer's sire Distorted Humor and Amazombie's sire Northern Afleet.

His great-grandsons Empire Maker, Eddington and Afleet Alex were respectively responsible for Royal Delta, Secret Circle and Afleet Again.

Sadler's Wells owed his three Group 1 successes to his sons High Chaparral (Wrote), Montjeu (St Nicholas Abbey) and Perfect Soul (Perfect Shirl), with Kitten's Joy landing a blow for the grandsons. It was Kitten's Joy's daughters Stephanie's Kitten and Sweet Cat who filled first and third places in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf.

However, it was the Storm Cat line which stole the show when it came to the broodmare sires of Friday and Saturday's top winners. Although the nearest that Storm Cat's daughters came to a victory was with the Juvenile Sprint runner-up Shumoos and the rather unlucky Filly and Mare Turf third Misty For Me, his sons enjoyed a tremendous time in the role of broodmare sire.

First off the mark was Catienus, thanks to Stephanie's Kitten, and he was followed eighty minutes later by Sea of Secrets, sire of the dam of the unbeaten My Miss Aurelia. Friday's final event, the Ladies' Classic, saw It's Tricky, a daughter of a Tale of the Cat mare, take the lead entering the final eighth, but Royal Delta swept past to prevent her completing a significant hat trick for Storm Cat's broodmare grand-daughters.

However, that hat trick was completed a day later, thanks to Sir Cat. He sired the dam of the very game Hansen, who helped grand-daughters of Storm Cat complete a notable double in the Grey Goose-sponsored Juvenile dirt contests. For good measure, Storm Cat's sire Storm Bird also got into the act, as it was one of his daughters who produced the Mile winner Court Vision.

Of course, Storm Cat's impact on the Breeders' Cup had already been considerable. His progeny have done so well that the Overbrook champion holds top place on the table of leading Breeders' Cup sires by money won, thanks largely to Desert Stormer, Cat Thief, Storm Flag Flying, Sweet Catomine and Life Is Sweet. By contrast, only three of his sons have managed to sire a Breeders' Cup winner, namely Black Minnaloushe (Sprint winner Dancing in Silks), Giant's Causeway (Marathon winner Man of Iron) and Hennessy (the remarkable Juvenile scorer Johannesburg).

Judging by this year's Cup, perhaps it is going to be Storm Cat's female descendants which are going to exert the greater long-term influence.

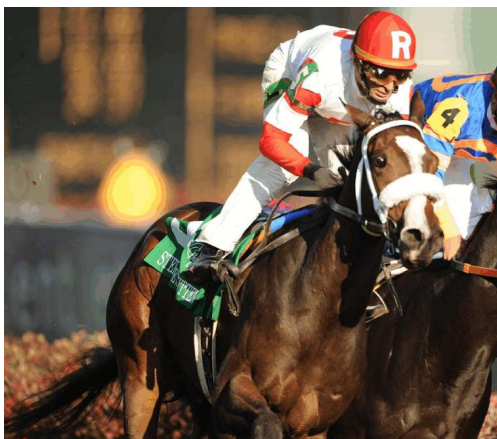
One interesting aspect of the treble by Storm Cat's grand-daughters is that none of them was sired by a Grade I winner. Sea of Secrets, sire of My Miss Aurelia's dam, won the GII San Vicente S.; Sir Cat, the broodmare sire of Hansen, numbered a pair of Grade IIs among his five graded victories; and Catienus, the sire of Stephanie's Kitten's dam, didn't even manage a graded success (though that seemingly damning fact tells nothing like the whole story, as he was Grade I placed and was once beaten only half a length at the Grade II level). Catienus and Sea of Secrets share the distinction of being products of Storm Cat's very fruitful partnership with Mr. Prospector mares, which yielded 13 graded winners.

Anyone who has driven the road between Lexington and Harrodsburg will appreciate the size of the investment that Ken and Sarah Ramsey have made in their breeding and racing venture.

The boundary for Ramsey Farm seems to go on and on and, according to the farm's website, it currently covers 1,215 acres.

The Ramseys have every reason to be delighted with the return on their investment. Stephanie's Kitten is by their homebred stallion Kitten's Joy, who provided the Ramseys with considerable excitement, plus earnings in excess of \$2 million, in developing into a champion turf performer. It was only the unconsidered Better Talk Now who denied Kitten's Joy victory in the 2004 Breeders' Cup Turf.

The Ramseys also raced the filly's broodmare sire, Catienus, after buying him from Sheikh Mohammed, and they have stood this son of Storm Cat in Kentucky and New York. Kitten's Joy's dam Kitten's First was mated to Catienus when Kitten's Joy was just a yearling and the mating resulted in Precious Kitten. This high-class turf performer achieved three Grade I victories and no doubt sowed the seeds for the idea of sending a daughter of Catienus to Kitten's Joy, to produce Stephanie's Kitten.

This filly ranks alongside Banned, Big Blue Kitten, Derby Kitten and Holiday For Kitten as one of five 2011 graded winners by Kitten's Joy, who also has such able graded performers as Celestial Kitten, Coalport, Cozy Kitten, Dean's Kitten, Kitten's Kid, Queensplatekitten, Suntracer and Sweet Cat representing him this year. All bar Sweet Cat and Suntracer were bred by the Ramseys, who still own quite a lot of them. Talk about making a stallion!



The efforts of these graded performers have helped earn Kitten's Joy seventh place on the general sire's list --one place above El Prado's other notable stallion son Medaglia d'Oro--and he also ranks second among the turf sires, with 59 per cent of his earnings coming on the grass. Kitten's Joy is also easily the leading third-crop sire by 2011 earnings.

Stephanie's Kitten's dam Unfold The Rose never raced, but she has the distinction of having a Grade I-winning dam in Bail Out Becky. This winner of the Del Mar Oaks was sired by Red Ransom. As Kitten's Joy's dam Kitten's First was by Lear Fan, Stephanie's Kitten is inbred 4x4 to Roberto, as well as 4x5 to Northern Dancer. No wonder she is shining on turf, having also won the GI Alcibiades on all-weather. It is well worth adding that Holiday For Kitten is inbred 3x3 to Lear Fan, whereas Big Blue Kitten and Suntracer are others inbred 4x4 to Roberto. This is clearly a strategy worthy of further exploration.

Bail Out Becky, in turn, was a half-sister to the dam of More Than Ready, who has enjoyed Breeders' Cup success on turf with Pluck, More Than Real and Regally Ready. This is also the family of the Grade I dirt winners Seldom Seen Sue, Cutlass Reality and Ten Most Wanted, so it will be interesting to see how Stephanie's Kitten fares if and when she is tried on the main track.

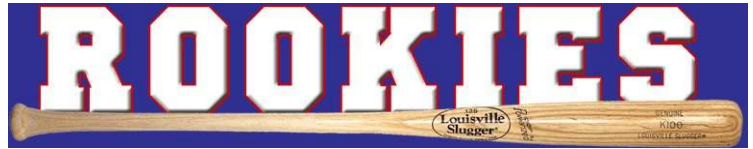
