### FAIRY TALE FINISH IN KYOTO'S QEII

**Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab) came from what looked to be a near-impossible spot to validate favoritism and successfully defend her title in Sunday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Commemorative Cup at Kyoto. "It did not look possible for her to win two furlongs out and we had virtually given up, but [jockey] Ryan [Moore] said that though she probably needed the race after that interrupted preparation," trainer Ed Dunlop said of the winner on his website. "She took off in the last 200 metres, and it was the most amazing run." Snow Fairy, who will remain in

training at five in 2012, will make her next start in Hong Kong Dec. 11 where she will either defend her title in the G1 Hong Kong Cup over 2000 meters or face stablemate and G1 Melbourne Cup runner-up Red Cadeaux (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) in the G1 Vase over 2400 meters. **Cont. p2**

### SHADWELL FILLIES LEAD KEENOV SUNDAY

A pair of 3-year-old racing and broodmare prospects selling from the draft of Shadwell Farm LLC led the way at the Keeneland November Sale yesterday. The sale's seventh session was just minutes old when **Sanadaat** (Unbridled's Song--Lindsay Frolic, by Mt. Livermore) entered the ring as [hip 2066](#), and the well-made dark bay set the pace on a \$190,000 offer from Shane Ryan's Castleton Lyons.

Originally a \$580,000 KEESEP yearling, Sanadaat was a strong second to Drawit (Tapit) over a sloppy Gulfstream track on debut in March, but hasn't raced since. Her racing days aren't over, however. She's scheduled to resume training in Florida before ultimately joining the list of mares to be bred to Castleton Lyons' newly retired champion Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat). "As she ran so well in the only start of her career, we will now ship her to Christophe Clement and, hopefully, have some success with her over the winter," said Ryan. Not long after, another Shadwell filly-- **Sharaat** (Distorted Humor)--sold for \$150,000 to Ken and Sarah Ramsey as [hip 2079](#). **Cont. p3**

After traveling to Hong Kong to win the G1 Hong Kong Cup following her win in this last year, Snow Fairy was an intended runner on Dubai World Cup night, but missed the meeting and resurfaced with fourth to So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in the July 2 G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown. She dropped back to her own sex to finish a solid second to Midday (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in the G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood July 30 and was much closer to

So You Think in the G1 Irish Champion S. Sept. 3, getting to within a half-length. An admirable third in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 2, she was back on just 13 days' rest for the G1 Champion S., finishing third to the hard-knocking Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) and So You Think. Attempting to defend her title here, Snow Fairy raced about five from the tail as Shimmei Fuji (Jpn) (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}) sped off to a double-digit advantage. After breaking from the widest post in 18, Ryan Moore was finally able to get in and save some ground down the backstretch, but the filly was still far back as Shimmei Fuji remained well in front at the 600-meter mark. Continuing on undaunted, Moore went for inside runs and the gaps came as the right time, as she hit the front in the final 50 meters and held off the talented Japanese duo of Aventura, perfect in three tries this season and the second wagering choice to Snow Fairy; and Apapane, winner of this year's G1 Victoria Mile and third to Snow Fairy last season. Dancing Rain (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) was pinched back at the start and never factored.

- the \$375,000 **Patti's Regal Song** (Unbridled's Song), a stakes-placed half to GSW Regally Appealing (Valid Appeal) and to the stakes-winning dam of Rockport Harbor (Unbridled's Song);
- the \$250,000 **Ask Me When** (Speightstown), a half-sister to this year's GI Dwyer S. winner Dominus (Smart Strike);



**Elaborate Further...**

In August of 2002, Anita Cauley entered **Ornate** (Gilded Time) for a \$30,000 claiming tag at Ellis Park. As the even-money choice, the 5-year-old went unclaimed in an easy victory. That was a good thing, as Ornate, in her very next start, registered the first black-type win of her career in the grassy Pleasant Temper S. at Kentucky Downs.

Fast forward a year, and Ornate was put up for sale again, this time at Keeneland November. The asking price was higher, and ultimately, Cauley opted to buy back the mare at \$95,000. Again, this was a good thing. That's because Ornate went on to be something of a mini blue hen for Cauley, producing three homebred stakes winners, including the recent GII Pocahontas S. winner **On Fire Baby** (Smoke Glacken), as well as the Grade II winner **High Heels** (E Dubai) and SW & GSP **French Kiss** (Hussonet).

Ornate is also the dam of **Elaborate** (Cherokee Run), who yesterday brought a bid of \$100,000 from Oak Ridge Farm. Lee McMillin's Amende Place consigned the 3-year-old, selling as a broodmare prospect, as [hip 2272](#).

"I used to just race, then breed and sell them when they were done racing," Cauley said yesterday from Barn 30. "With Ornate, she was a little bit of a feisty mare, and I wanted somebody that would pay enough money for her that they'd put up with her. So I set a pretty high reserve, *and...*they didn't meet it. That's how I started breeding."

Ornate's first foal was High Heels, who captured the 2007 GII Fantasy S. over Cotton Blossom (Broken Vow) before running third to Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) in the GI Kentucky Oaks. She earned nearly \$485,000 for Cauley and Gary Hartlage, who conditioned Ornate and continues to be Cauley's trainer.

French Kiss, a winner of nearly \$285,000, gave Ornate her second black-type winner, while On Fire Baby came on since the catalogue to make it a hat trick. On Fire Baby aired by four lengths on debut at Ellis Park in August, tired to fifth in the GI Alcibiades at Keeneland Oct. 7, then bounced back to win the Pocahontas at 9-1 odds Oct. 30 ([video](#)).

"We were hearing stories from Florida when she was a 2-year-old that she was a nice filly," Cauley said of On Fire Baby. "I took several trips down there to see her, and I really liked what I saw and was really looking forward to her getting to the racetrack. And my trainer loved her the moment he saw her. She's like her mom-- she wants to be out there."

Cauley said that temperament is something Ornate instills in all of her foals. "She was a great filly in terms of her attitude--she really wanted to go to the racetrack, and that can be half the battle," said Cauley.

"You can have a pretty horse who pins her ears and doesn't want to go to the track, but Ornate was never that way. She always had the attitude, *I want to go out there*. And she really passes that on."

While Ornate was Cauley's first broodmare, the 14-year-old's propensity to throw fillies--her first six foals were of the fairer sex--has meant Cauley's band has grown significantly. Yesterday's sale of Elaborate, in fact, marked the first time Cauley parted ways with a member of the family.

"I'm not a big operation, and there are only so many mares that we need to have," said Cauley. "It just came to the point that one of them needed to go."

Ornate has an E Dubai yearling full-sister to High Heels, foaled a Tiznow colt this spring, and is back in foal to Lemon Drop Kid. High Heels has a Tapit yearling filly, a Distorted Humor weanling colt and is in foal to Giant's Causeway. French Kiss, meanwhile, is currently carrying her first foal on a cover to WinStar/Vinery New York's Bluegrass Cat. All of Cauley's mares are boarded at McMillin's Paris-based Amende Place.

As for On Fire Baby, Cauley hopes the filly will continue to progress and suspects that, despite a pedigree that leans toward speed, the gray might be more effective going longer. "She's a very big and powerful filly, and she's got some length to her," said Cauley. "I don't know that I'd say she has a sprinter body, and I think the mare gives her the opportunity to go longer."

On Saturday, Nov. 26, On Fire Baby will get to prove her owner right in the 1 1/16-mile Gil Golden Rod S. at Churchill Downs. "She's nominated, and the plan is to run her there," said Cauley. "Then, she'll get a break and go on to Oaklawn, and start her 3-year-old season there."

**Ode to Joy...**

A colt by Kitten's Joy out of a half-sister to champion Pleasantly Perfect (Pleasant Colony) elicited a bid of \$125,000 to top all weanling sales Sunday. Consigned by Bill Reightler as [hip 2330](#), the Mar. 10-foaled bay was hammered down to Rocco Bloodstock. The colt was produced by the 11-year-old Highclere Memory (Cryptoclearance), a daughter of Group 1 winner Regal State (Affirmed) and thus a half to the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic and G1 Dubai World Cup winner. The mare is also a half to Group 3 winner Hurricane State (Miswaki) and to Gout de Terroir (Lemon Drop Kid), dam of this year's European standout juvenile Elusive Kate (Elusive Quality), a Group 1 winner since the catalogue. Reightler signed for Highclere Memory for just \$20,000 at last year's Keeneland November Sale with this colt in utero. The colt was bred by Lickitysplit Services.

The only other weanling to eclipse the six-figure mark during the session was [hip 2207](#), a filly by Lemon Drop Kid--Bernhardt (Out of Place) who made \$110,000. J.S.P. Stable signed the winning slip for the bay filly, produced by a winning half to GSW Top Commander (Kingmambo). Circle T Sales, which consigned the youngster, had purchased dam Bernhardt for \$11,000 at the 2009 November Sale. Danny Turner's operation sold the resulting offspring for \$8,500 as a 2010 KEENOV weanling, and came back to register a bigger score this time around with the Lemon Drop Kid miss, who was bred by Todd and Steve Lichti.



# RACETRACK Round-Up

## Miss Match (Arg) & Bourbon Bay Work

Grade I winner **Miss Match (Arg)** (Indygo Shiner) and MGSW **Bourbon Bay** (Sligo Bay {Ire}) worked seven panels over Hollywood's turf course Sunday in preparation for Saturday's GI Hollywood Turf Cup. Under Debra Biggs, Bourbon Bay was caught in 1:29, while the Argentine-bred went in 1:29.40. The 6-year-old was ridden by Mike Smith, who will accompany the mare for the first time in the 12-furlong test. Winner of the GII San Marcos S. and GIII Cougar II H. earlier this term, David and Jill Heerensperger's Bourbon Bay was eighth in his latest start in the 1 1/2-mile GI Northern Dancer S. Sept. 18. "He didn't care for the course," said trainer Neil Drysdale, explaining the gelding's lackluster finish. Miss Match, who was purchased on behalf of Matt Cloros for \$500,000 at last year's KEENOV sale, won her first two starts of the year, including the nine-furlong GI Santa Margarita S. in March. Most recently, the dark bay was ninth in the mud in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff Nov. 4. "She needs distance," said Drysdale, explaining the decision to run her back.

## Turallure Gets a Break

GISW **Turallure** (Wando) will get some time off following a bang-up second behind Court Vision (Gulch) in the Nov. 5 GI Breeders' Cup Mile, confirmed trainer Charles Lopresti. "We're just going to let him down and unwind him a little bit," Lopresti said. Winner of the Opening Verse S. at Churchill last July, the 4-year-old later added victories in Saratoga's nine-furlong GII Bernard Baruch H. before scoring in the GI Woodbine Mile Sept. 18. "We've got him out in a round pen right now, just letting him be a horse for about a month or so. Then we'll start back after the first of the year for him." Lopresti also confirmed yesterday that Turallure's stablemate, **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry), will make his next start in the GI Clark H. Nov. 25. In his most recent start, the 4-year-old came home an easy four-length winner in the nine-panel GII Fayette S. at Keeneland Oct. 29. "We had a question about the mile and an eighth, but after that race [the Fayette], we decided to go to the Clark," Lopresti said. "If everything goes right in the next couple of weeks, he's coming."

One of the most talked-about sprinters of recent years, Overdose had a point to prove here coming off another layoff, but showed he retained much of his ability when winning a war of attrition with Italy's leading sprinter Dagda Mor. In front after a tardy start, the "Budapest Bullet" was tackled and passed by the eventual runner-up inside the final quarter, but kept responding to Frankie Dettori's urgings to regain the advantage inside the final furlong. Asserting in the run to the line as the pair drew clear, Overdose was registering a repeat success in this race he captured by 10 lengths three years ago. Since that day, the bay had failed to add a fourth Pattern race to his tally mainly due to a recurrent foot injury, but had been fourth in the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot on his latest outing June 14. Owner Zoltan Mikoczy told the *Racing Post*, "Overdose will stay in training next year and we would take him to Hong Kong next month for the International meeting if we are invited and hope Frankie will ride him again." ## Quality from the Onset...

Magic Millions hosted its first sale in 1986, when it offered only 200 yearlings, all eligible for a lucrative juvenile test restricted to graduates of the sale. The initiative paid instant dividends when Snippets (Aus) (Lunchtime {Aus})--who sold for A\$22,000 at the inaugural sale--triumphed by four lengths in 1:09.90 in the 2YO Classic.

"When we started the sale in 1986, people said it wouldn't work," recalled David Chester, Magic Millions sales director.

"There were a lot of sceptics who said we couldn't get a full field of 16 runners from only 200 yearlings sold the previous year. But as it turned out, the winner of the race turned out to be a Group 1-winning racehorse and a champion sire, so we were lucky."

Following that most fortuitous start, the sale expanded, propelling the sale's marquee juvenile Classic purse to A\$1 million in 1990. In subsequent years, the

sale's race was responsible for launching the careers of Group 1 winners Assertive Lad (Aus), General Nediym (Aus), Testa Rossa (Aus), St. Jude (Aus), Excellerator (Aus), Lovely Jubly (Aus), Phelan Ready (Aus), Regimental Gal (Aus), and Dance Hero (Aus); in addition to group winners Molokai Prince (Aus), Bold Promise

(Aus), Brave Warrior (Aus), Zephyrz (Aus), Winger Charger (Aus), Catnipped (Aus), Mimi Lebrock (Aus), Augusta Proud (Aus) and Military Rose (Aus).

"Relatively speaking, if you compare us to Tattersalls in England or Inglis in Australia, we are a young company--we will be hosting our 25th running of the Magic Millions races this year," said Cox. "It's a young, vibrant company that offers a lot of panache and fanfare. Very early on, Magic Millions held a fairly low market share, and now it's getting toward 50-50 in the market."

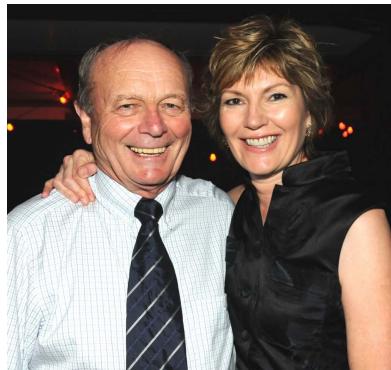

Chester, echoing the sentiment, added, "Magic Millions' horse sale is now a major event in the state of Queensland in Australia. The Queensland Government, through their organization called Queensland Events, are financially supporting this Magic Millions sale and race Carnival, and it is now the biggest event in Queensland."

While funds are not directed to the purse structure offered on the lucrative raceday, the government's support is funneled toward promotional efforts--tourism and marketing.

Despite the influx of funds, Magic Millions has no intention of resting on its laurels. The sales company ushers in the 2012 edition of the sale under new management. "The ownerships is now with Gerry Harvey and his family; they are very high-profile business people in Australia, and it gives Magic Millions a lot of credibility--and people like to deal with them," stated Cox.

Outlining some of his plans intended to foster the continued growth and development of the sale, Cox added, "My goal is to promote and bring back the fun to the Gold Coast. When I was a bit younger and, probably more accepting of late nights [laughing], I used to come up to the Magic Millions sale while I was working for Inglis, and everybody was having a great time here. The nightlife was great and so were the parties. The whole experience was just a lot of fun."

yearling sale of the season takes off at the Magic Millions Sales Complex in Bundall. The auction's four select sessions offer 645 head (Jan. 11-14); with 247 yearlings in the preferred segment Jan. 15 and an additional group of yearlings set to go under the hammer Jan.18. A total of 674

head was on offer during the select portion of the 2011 Gold Coast sale.

"We generally catalog between 650 and 700," said Chester. "We are trying to tighten up the quality a little bit more, because we know things are going to be tough. We want to put the very best catalog we can in front of our buyers. Given the world economy, it's probably a tough year to have such a good catalog, and obviously, I would have preferred if we were in a better economy to showcase such a good group of horses, but it is what it is."

Of the selection process, Chester added, "It's one of the hardest jobs we have the whole year, because as soon as you knock somebody's yearling out of the select portion of the sale, you become the worst person in the world. It is a very delicate process."

The heat is on for the consignors as well.

"Most breeders are trying to nominate or select yearlings for the sale that they think have a chance of making that 2-year-old race," Chester said. "So what has developed over the history of Magic Millions is that breeders are picking the earlier foals, the more precocious yearlings, and the yearlings that haven't had any setbacks."

It is that very pressure to get it right that gives Magic Millions the confidence that their graduates will always represents the company well.

"You can literally walk into the paddock [at the races] and see a Magic Millions yearling, because they just stand out," said Chester. "They may not always have the sexiest pedigrees in the world, but they are athletes."

"Naturally, we always try and get the Fastnet Rocks, Encosta de Lagos and Redoute's Choices. But sometimes, even with the top sires, the foals don't quite come through and might be a little bit backward in one way or another. They might look really good on paper, but they might be a little bit disappointing when you go and have a look. We actually try to get away from that by trying to select the athletes."

Those in attendance at the sale can see the athletes from past sales in action during the lucrative Magic Millions Carnival and raceday, with the very best competing in the A\$2-million 2YO Classic and the A\$1-million 3YO Classic.

"Our sale is unique in the world, because on the Saturday [before the fourth select session of the sale], we have a [A\$4.5- million] raceday," Chester pointed out. "Magic Millions hosts the only raceday in the world where every horse racing is a graduate of our sales. The main race is the second richest 2-year-old race in Australia, and among the richest in the world."

***Local Product; International Appeal...***

The '80s represented a turning point, of sorts, for the Australian Thoroughbred industry, with the importation of several sires of international importance, most notably European

champion sprinter Danehill (Danzig). The stallion, who stood the Northern Hemisphere season at Coolmore in Ireland, was introduced to Australian breeders via John Messara's Arrowfield Stud, and the stallion's

tremendous success helped cement what is arguably the most significant innovation in recent Australian history. Without a doubt, Messara's vision and effort propelled Australia's Thoroughbred industry into the new era. **Cont. p15**

"The first really successful shuttling horse was Danehill, but now we have some of the best stallions in the world here," said MM Sales Director David Chester. "Our broodmares have been improved through the shuttling phenomenon as well, and it has really helped expand the pool of international blood that we have in Australia right now. It is a truly international catalog that we produce as a result of the shuttle stallions."

Added Vin Cox, "If you pick up any catalog worldwide now, it doesn't matter what breeding jurisdiction you are in, you will recognize a number of stallions due to the shuttle stallion concept."

While the Gold Coast catalog has watched its international appeal grow along with the Australian bloodstock market over the last two decades, Magic Millions officials recognize that the local product is different than the yearlings featured in other world markets.

"Australia breeds fast, precocious types of horses, and that's where our industry is focused," said Cox. "Wrap that together with our \$2-million 2-year-old race [Magic Million 2YO Classic] for graduates of the sale, and it certainly is an incentive for people to have the fast and precocious horses in this sale."

He added, "These horses tend to train on to Golden Slipper runners, and have the potential to become international performers, whether it's at Ascot in England, Dubai or America."

Among the international performers who exited the Magic Millions Gold Coast ranks are Group 1 winners Scenic Blast (Aus) (Scenic {Ire}), War Artist (Aus) (Orpen) and Rocket Man (Aus) (Viscount {Aus}). A 2005 alum of the sale, Australia's 2009 Horse of the Year Scenic Blast ventured to Royal Ascot to take the prestigious G1 King's Stand S., adding it to wins in the G1 VRC Lightning S. and G1 VRC Newmarket H. back at home. The gelding also ventured to the U.S. to finish second in the G1 Bing Crosby S. and third in the GIII Vernon O. Underwood S. and the GIII Morvich H. Fellow globetrotter War Artist, victorious in the 2007 G1 Mercury Sprint S. in South Africa, added scores in the G2 Golden Peitsche in Germany and the G3 Prix du Petit Couvert and G3 Pris de Ris-orangis in France. The gelding, who also accounted for the G3 Al Shindagha Sprint in Dubai, was runner-up in Royal Ascot's G1 Golden Jubilee S. and third in the G1 July Cup and G1 Prix de l'Abbaye.

Rounding out the illustrious trio is Rocket Man, a graduate from the 2006 edition of the sale. The bay earned champion status in Singapore at 5-7 furlongs at three and four, but he enjoyed his best season on the racetrack in 2011, taking the G1 International Sprint in Singapore and G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen at Meydan.

"Australia is the second-biggest breeding country in the world, behind the United States, and we have a population of 22 million, versus 300 million in the U.S., so we have to work extra hard to find international buyers to purchase the international product," explained Chester. "My job, over the past 20 years, has been to canvas Asia very thoroughly. We work Hong Kong, Japan, Korea and Singapore very hard, and are now moving into China, to a lesser extent, to build up that international buying bench.

"It varies, but on an average over the past 10 years, about 30% of our horses have been sold internationally to those markets. We also sell a good number to South Africa and New Zealand."

Over the course of the past quarter century, Magic Millions has worked hard to develop a diverse buying bench domestically as well.

"We attract people from all different buying brackets at Magic Millions, and that has served us well, since we have sold very good horses at all levels," said Chester.

In an effort to bolster all fronts, Magic Millions has sought to offer not only a product of wide appeal, but also to develop ways to give back to the customer venturing in from afar. Included among incentives designed to facilitate the travel of international buyers to Australia for a Magic Millions sale is the International Inward Buyers Scheme. Coordinated by *AusHorse* Marketing in conjunction with Magic Millions sales, the program assists clients from all over the world with funding for airfares, accommodations, dining, entertainment and ground transport during the sale.

"When you start from nothing, naturally you have to throw some money in to market yourself to get buyers to come to your sale," Chester remarked. "So we reward our buyers, those who come to the sale and spend money with us, with rebates that can be quite considerable. The IBS has worked very well for us, because now, we are right up there with the big boys. It costs us a lot of money, but I think buyers really appreciate it."

**Ebb and Flow...**

It is an understatement of monumental proportions to say that Magic Millions has had success selling the progeny of Arrowfield's marquee stallion Redoute's Choice. The champion, who entered stud in 2000, topped the Gold Coast's yearling sale in three of the last four years. In 2008, a pair of colts (out of the mares Gypsy Dancer {NZ} {Dance Floor} and Lady Capel {Aus}) {Last Tycoon (Ire)} brought A\$2.2 million from Patinack Farm; in 2010, a colt out of They Say (Thirty Six Red) realized A\$925,000 from Bill Vlahos and Mark Pilkington; and last January, a son out of Sunday Joy (Aus) (Sunday Silence) topped the sale with a A\$1.15 million bid.

The stallion, who experienced a minor setback during the 2010 breeding season, will be represented by 13 yearlings for the 2012 renewal. A total of 17 yearlings were catalogued in 2011. But, with plenty of sire power ready to fill the ranks, Chester feels confident that Magic Millions remains on firm ground.

"Redoute's Choice has certainly been a wonderful stallion over the years, but we have never been in a better position with stallions, because now we have about 20-25 stallions in Australia that are really commercial," Chester offered. "The impact of not having as many yearlings by one particular sire is made up by the fact that we have a lot of other established sires like Encosta de Lago, Lonhro, Stratum, or like popular young stallions such as Bernardini.

"We are not a two- or three-stallion country anymore, like in the days when we had Danehill and maybe one or two more," he continued. "Now, the spread is a lot more even. If we had only six or seven Redoute's Choices in the sale six or seven years ago, that might have been very bad for us, but now we have several stallions coming there that are equally commercial."

The future looks bright as well.

"We have a lot of new young stallions coming aboard over the next couple of years, so we are really well placed in the world with quality stallions supporting us," Chester said. "The good thing is that our horses are racing well internationally and have been taking the eye, particularly in Asia. And I think that all goes well for the future of the industry in Australia, and particularly for the Magic Million sales."

Seeming to bode well for the upcoming season in Australia is the resurgence in the international sales arena this year.

"We run in parallel with many other markets," added Vin Cox. "We are dealing with an international product, so it's good to see that the North American sales have been relatively strong from the previous year. The Northern Hemisphere market had dropped significantly as compared to the Australian market. We certainly came off, but not to the extent that they did in the Northern Hemisphere, and my feeling is that [the 2012 Magic Millions January sale] will probably be somewhere around where we were in 2011."

While sales in the U.S. are on the upswing, the American dollar has lost strength relative to its global neighbors. Australian sales may have drawn an increased foreign presence in the past because of strong foreign currency, but officials feel there is still plenty of appeal on the Gold Coast in January.

"Historically, the Australian dollar has been at around 75-80 cents, and the currency situation doesn't help us," said Cox. "But, I think how we do it down here, and our racing product, is very exotic, and I think people in the Northern Hemisphere would get a real kick out of coming here and seeing it."

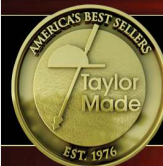
