## FRANKEL SPARKLES AT CARTIER AWARDS

Juddmonte's **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) continued to see off all challengers Tuesday night when the unbeaten colt took home Horse of the Year honors at the Cartier Awards. His competition in that category were **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}), **Danedream (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}), **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa) and **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}); Cirrus des Aigles and Danedream were respectively named

champion older horse and champion 3-year-old filly. Frankel was also honored as champion 3-year-old colt after a season that saw him collect the G1 2000 Guineas, G1 St. James's Palace S., G1 Sussex S. and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. The **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★** is slated to stay in training next year. "Frankel has had a great year and is hugely exciting," trainer Sir Henry Cecil said on his website Monday. "He really has caught the public eye, and it was great that he has given an interest to so many people. Hopefully, he will go on and I hope, by the time of the Eclipse S., he will be ready to tackle a mile and a quarter."

He continued, "Personally, I think it is a distance he will get well now that he has learnt to settle better, and he could be an even better horse at that trip. Let's hope he winters well and remains sound. Racing needs champions, and let us pray that he can continue where he left off." The prestigious awards, which were established in 1991, were determined by points earned in pattern races during 2010, combined with the opinions of a panel of racing journalists and votes from readers of *Racing Post* and *Daily Telegraph*.

Trainer Barry Hills, who recently handed over his license to his son Charles, was voted this year's Cartier/Daily Telegraph Award of Merit winner. The award is for the person or persons who, in the opinion of the special 17-strong Cartier Jury, has/have done most for European racing and/or breeding either over their lifetime or within the past 12 months. The list of past winners of the Cartier/Daily Telegraph Award of Merit includes Richard Hannon, John Oxx, Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, the Niarchos Family, Peter Willett, Henry Cecil, David & Patricia Thompson, Lord Oaksey, Prince Khalid Abdulla, John Magnier, His Highness the Aga Khan, Peter Walwyn, the Head Family, Sir Peter O'Sullivan, Frankie Dettori, John Dunlop, the Marquess of Hartington, Francois Boutin, Lester Piggott and Henri Chalhoub.

# RETIRED

## MIDDAY RETIREMENT CONFIRMED

Juddmonte Farms' brilliant racemare **Midday (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}--Midsummer {GB}, by Kingmambo) has been retired, trainer Sir Henry Cecil confirmed yesterday. Runner-up to Sariska (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) in the 2009 G1 Epsom Oaks, the homebred bay ran third to that rival when encountering deep mud in the G1 Irish equivalent. She gained compensation by taking the first of her three G1 Nassau S. victories at Goodwood during a busy sophomore campaign and closed that Classic year with a victory in the G1 Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf at Santa Anita. Midday remained in training as a 4-year-old and repaid connections' decision with a second score in the Nassau S., accompanied by wins in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks and G1 Prix Vermeille. However, she was usurped by Shared Account (Pleasantly Perfect) when defending her Breeders' Cup crown at the end of the semester. She has been among the elite again this term, running second in the G1 Coronation Cup and G1 Pretty Polly S. before registering a Nassau hat-trick with a sixth success at the highest level. She also ran second in York's G1 Juddmonte International S. and fourth in Ascot's G1 Champion S. at Ascot, and concluded her career having a third crack at the Breeders' Cup, finishing sixth in the G1 Turf. Midday goes to the paddocks with a record of 23-9-7-3 and earnings of £2,239,007. "Midday has been such a consistent mare and, with six Group Ones to her credit, she has proved herself to be a real champion," commented Cecil. "She showed signs that she had had enough at the Breeders' Cup last week and, although she by no means disgraced herself, her performance was a long way from her best. We will be sorry to see her leave Warren Place, but we shall keep an eye on her and visit her at Banstead Manor Stud." Cecil also revealed stablemate and four-time Group 1 hero **Twice Over (GB)** (Observatory), conqueror of Midday in the Juddmonte International, will continue to fly the Warren Place standard in 2012.

"I believe that Twice Over remains in training," he said. "This is wonderful for me as he is part of the furniture and over the last few years he has become a great friend to all of us at Warren Place."

## Cartier Awards cont.

Danedream captured the G2 Oaks d'Italia, G1 Grosser Preis von Berlin and G1 Grosser Preis von Baden for Gestut Burg Eberstein, and was supplemented to take her chance in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Japanese owner Teruya Yoshida secured a 50% stake in the bay filly in the days leading up to the event, and she duly stormed home while setting a course record of 2:24.49 for 2400 meters over the firm Longchamp course. Danedream is slated to contest the G1 Japan Cup at the end of the month.


Unbeaten juveniles **Dabirsim (Fr)** (Hat Trick {Jpn}) and **Maybe (Ire)** were honored as champions in their respective categories. Dabirsim, owned by Simon Springer, secured trophies in the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere among his five victories. ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Maybe accounted for colts in the Listed Chesham S. at Royal Ascot before handling her own sex in both the G3 Silver Flash S. and G2 Debutante S. Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's colorbearer signed off on the year with a win in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. Aug. 28.

Champion sprinter **Dream Ahead (Diktat {GB})** spoiled Goldikova's European finale by defeating the popular mare in the G1 Prix de la Foret Oct. 2. Owned by Khalifa Dasmal, the sophomore previously captured the G1 July Cup and G1 Haydock Sprint Cup. He has been retired to Ballylinch Stud.

**Fame and Glory (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}), looking to take up the baton from former stablemate Yeats (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), showed his best form at Ascot. The 5-year-old captured the G1 Gold Cup at the Royal Meeting, and returned to the Berkshire course to secure the G3 British Champions Long Distance Cup last month for owners Fitri Hay, Derrick Smith, Sue Magnier and Michael Tabor.

**COURT VISION'S BRO TOPS KEENOV TUESDAY**

The 4-year-old MGSP **Hailstone** (City Zip--Weekend Storm, by Storm Bird), baby brother of recent GI BC Mile winner Court Vision, is New York bound, while MGSW **Grassy** (El Prado {Ire}--High Savannah {GB}, by Rousillon) will soon be on a plane to California. That, after bloodstock agent Steve Young secured the pair for separate clients during a busy three minutes at Keeneland November yesterday. On a day highlighted by racing or stallion prospects--the top seven fit into that category--Young purchased the two priciest lots, which sold consecutively shortly after 5 p.m.

First up was the 5-year-old Grassy, being offered by his breeders Adele Dilschneider and Claiborne Farm. Grassy was hammered down for \$220,000. Claiborne consigned him as [hip 3251](#).

Seconds later, Young was back into fray for the next horse into the ring, the smartly bred Hailstone, who was offered through Lane's End's draft as [hip 3253](#). Young turned back a challenge from agent David Ingordo--standing in the doorway on the phone--for the half to MGISW Court Vision (Gulch) from the immediate family of A.P. Indy, et al.

"They're for two different people," Young confirmed. "Grassy's going to California to [trainer] Marty Jones. Hailstone is going to New York to [trainer] Bobby Ribaldo." Young did not identify his clients.

He added, "They're both ready-made horses--and ready-made stakes horses--and they both appear to have more run in them."

In his last 10 efforts, Grassy--previously trained by Christophe Clement--has started outside of stakes competition just once. During that time, he won the 2010 renewal of the GII Red Smith H., added the GII Bowling Green H. two months ago and, for the second straight year, ran third in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic at Belmont in early October. His record stands at 17-5-3-3, \$473,064.

Hailstone, bred by Will Farish, et al, and raced by Bill Farish's Woodford Racing and Westrock Stable, was emerging as Canada's version of Grassy earlier this season. After clearing his first-level allowance condition at Gulfstream in February, he went on to place in three Grade II's at Woodbine: the Connaught Cup in June, the Nijinsky S. in July and the Sky Classic S. in August. Mark Casse conditioned the consistent colt, who was produced by a full-sister to Classic winner Summer Squall and a half to A.P. Indy. In addition to Court Vision, Hailstone is also a half to stakes winners Smart Surprise (Smart Strike), Lord Snowdon (Seeking the Gold) and Garcia Marquez (Gulch).

Young offered, while the horses weren't cheap, he didn't consider them unreasonably priced, either. "Actually, I thought they might bring more," he admitted. "But I think good horses always bring money. I don't know Hailstone has well as I know Grassy. Grassy's a very cool horse in many ways. He's always been taken care of like a really good horse, and that's why, as a 5-year-old, there should still be a lot of blue sky above him."

Young said he thought Grassy might appreciate California's firm turf courses. "And something like the San Juan Capistrano series will probably hit him right between the eyes," he added.

Young signed for a third racing or stallion prospect, the stakes-placed 4-year-old **Christmas for Liam** (Saint Liam--Gone for Christmas), who made \$90,000 from the Edward P. Evans dispersal being handled by Lane's End.

**Blocks Peddle Some Prado...**

As a racehorse, **Fort Prado** (El Prado {Ire}) was easy to root for--tough, sound, versatile and consistent. With the big gray now retired to the stallion barn, the Block family that bred and campaigned him hopes he can pass on those same traits to his offspring.

The Blocks--parents David and Patricia, sons Chris and Ryan and daughter Dena--stand Fort Prado in their home state at Hill 'n' Dale Illinois. With the 10-year-old's oldest foals now

weanlings, the Blocks sent a small three-horse draft to November--comprised only of gray Fort Prado colts--in an effort to showcase some of his best youngsters. It was mission approved yesterday, as the consignment included the day's highest- and third-highest-priced weanlings.

Heading affairs was [hip 2935](#), a half-brother to this year's GII American Derby runner-up Suntracer (Kitten's Joy) who was hammered down to Thomas Fedro, Sr. for \$75,000. The colt was produced by the 18-year-old Taxable Deduction (Prized).

Also on the docket was [hip 3121](#), a half-brother to MSW & GSP Secret Kin (Sea of Secrets) who made \$57,000 from Rick Johnson's bid. From the family of last week's \$1.5 million Bonnie Blue Flag (Mineshaft) and her Grade I-winning sister Diamondrella (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), the colt is a son of Leisurely Kind (Capote).

Completing the group was [hip 3200](#), a half-brother to SP Lakeaway (Greenwood Lake) who went to David Kinnaird for \$23,000. All three weanlings were bred by Team Block in Illinois and consigned by the family's TimberView Sales.

"His foals all have great minds and great bodies," said Ryan Block, who runs the family's farm in Central Illinois. "The thing we keep getting is someone coming to look at one, then asking to see all of them. They're very impressed. [Hip 2935] probably should have been in Book 3, but we told [Keeneland] that we wanted to sell them all together, and he sold well."

In a way, the session-topping weanling completes a circuit for the Blocks. It was back in 1999 that they purchased his dam, stakes winner Taxable Deduction, for \$200,000 at Keeneland November.

The mare went on to be a successful producer, with her foals including MGSW Free Fighter (Out of Place), an earner of over \$440,000; and MSW & MGSP Corrupt (Belong to Me), an earner of over \$280,000; as well as Suntracer, who completed the exacta behind Willcox Inn (Harlan's Holiday) in both the GII American Derby July 9 and GIII Hawthorne Derby Oct. 15.

Chris Block, one of the Midwest's more prominent trainers, conditions Suntracer and the rest of the Team Block runners when they race in Illinois, including Fort Prado. An Illinois-bred, Fort Prado won his first stakes at three in June of 2004, captured a pair of Grade III events at five, and continued to be competitive through his 8-year-old year, when he won the Kentucky Cup Turf Dash.

"He retired sound," said Ryan Block. "He won stakes on the dirt, turf and Polytrack, he won from 5 1/2 furlongs to 1 1/8 miles, and was just a horse for all courses."

In his first year at stud, Fort Prado attracted 60 mares--a healthy number given the incertitude surrounding the Illinois breeding program. "We bred a lot of our mares to him--I think we bred 12 to him--and he got 48 others."

Block added, "In the past, we always bred to Kentucky stallions, just because there weren't any decent Illinois sires. When we retired Fort Prado, we had an offer to stand him in Canada, which seemed really nice, but boy, that's a heckuva haul to bring our mares up there. So we decided to stand him in Illinois."

The Blocks have been selling under the TimberView banner for about 10 years.

## NOVEMBER SALES: FIRST NINE DAYS

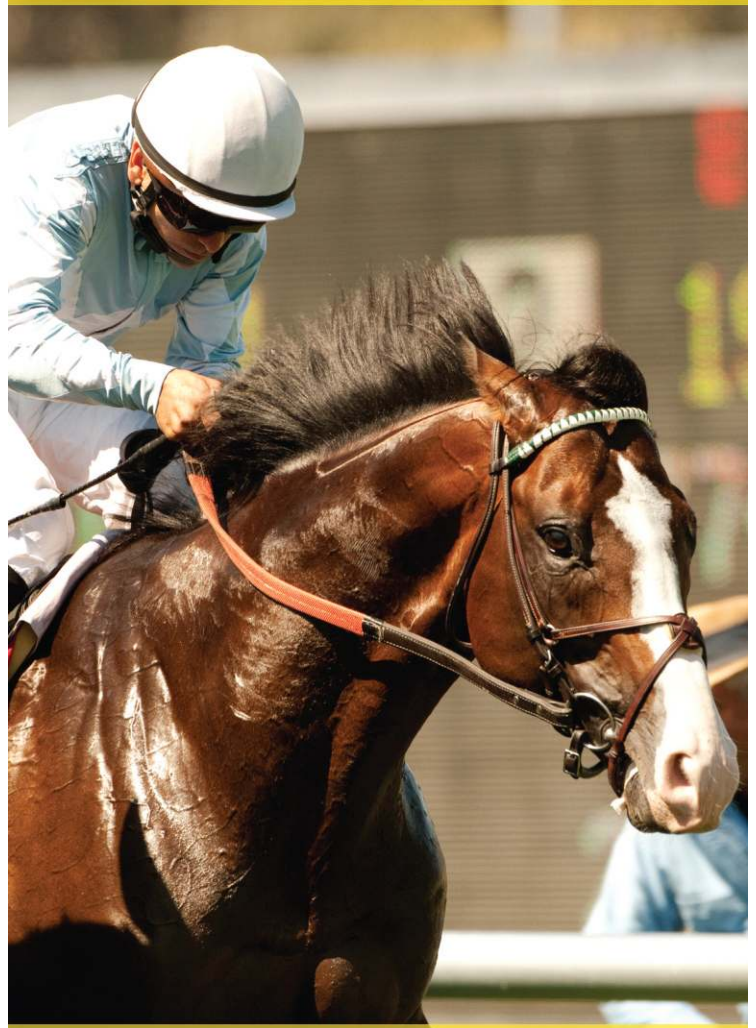
First, I have to apologize for getting the Dispersal and non-dispersal figures wrong in last week's column, covering Fasig and Keeneland Book 1. I don't know what I read that caused me to miscalculate the numbers, but I must have double-counted something. Instead of the non-dispersal average coming out within three thousand dollars of the previous two years, in fact they were up by 35%--which makes a lot more sense, as it continued the trends coming out of the yearling sales. The actual, correct figures were that the two dispersals in Book 1 did consist of 83 horses, but they sold for \$57,497,500, and averaged \$692,741. The dispersals were almost exactly half of Keeneland's Book 1 total of \$114,681,500 (not 70%, as I incorrectly stated). Fasig, plus non-dispersal Keeneland Book 1 horses, totaled 281 sales, for \$89,929,000, and an average of \$320,032--a lot higher than the \$239,000 and change which we published--and 35% higher than the corresponding non-dispersal averages of \$236,697 (in 2010) and \$236,200 (in 2009). I apologize again, and I promise that today's figures have been triple-checked, and I am confident they are actually correct.

Yesterday's ninth session of the Keeneland sale included the racehorses; the numbers from that session are not included in these totals; these figures include Keeneland's first eight sessions (Books 1-4), and then we add in Fasig's one-day sale last Sunday. The 2011 edition of the Keeneland November Sale had broken the \$200-million mark by the close of business Monday, by which time 1,904 horses had sold for a total of \$201,192,900, and an average of \$105,669. Last year, at the end of eight sessions, 1,924 horses had sold for \$136,145,600, an average of \$70,762. So, yes, when we look at Keeneland's first eight sessions, as a direct comparison with 2010, the number of horses sold is down one percent, the gross is up by 48%, and the average up by 49%.

But--you knew that was coming, didn't you? In the Evans and Palides dispersals, in the first four books, 182 horses have sold for a correct total of \$72,206,000, an average of \$396,736. Last year, there were no major dispersals; as you know, the bulk of the Overbrook Dispersal was at the 2009 November sale so, if we can get the figures straight, what we'd really like to do is to be able to look at all three years, with dispersal and non-dispersal horses added in and taken out. And then, finally, because from the point of view of the outside world Fasig's November Sale is just part of the Kentucky November Sale series, we must add Fasig's sale in for comparisons. *(See Table p14)*

These numbers do give us a different perspective on things. Including Fasig plus Keeneland Books 1-4, a total of 1,801 non-dispersal horses have sold; last year, the total for the same nine days--again, no major dispersal--was 2,013 sold. In 2009, the number was 1,733; in that respect, 2011 compares more to 2009 than 2010. Compared with last year though, 11% fewer non-dispersal horses have sold in the November sales' first nine days; their gross is down by 1.5%, their average up by 10%. Compared with 2009, when there was a major dispersal, 4% more non-dispersal horses have sold, for an 10% increase in gross, and a 5% increase in average. The non-dispersal horses averaged \$85,159 in 2009; \$81,581 in 2010, and \$89,801 this year. When we take the dispersals out--and in spite of the rises in the first three days which I miscalculated--the numbers are not so different.

But these are mixed sales, so other caveats do apply. We have no real way to measure the relative quality of the catalogues, that's still the case, either between dispersals (49 more horses have sold in the dispersals than to that point in the sales in 2009, grossing over \$40-million more) or, indeed, among the non-dispersal horses. Other factors could also be in play; number of Grade I/Group 1 winners sold; number of black-type horses sold; relative stud fees invested in the selling mares, etc. So we wouldn't exactly be getting too dogmatic about what all the figures might mean. After all, the momentum from the yearling sales was positive, the sales grounds are still crowded and the buzz has been strong throughout. One further complication to interpreting the numbers is coming up: the number of days after Book 4 has dropped, from five sessions in 2009 and 2010 (13 days total) to three sessions this year (11 days total). The number of cheap horses has dropped dramatically, which has two principal effects: the average will naturally rise and, in contrast to the way it was going before the crash of 2008-2009, you won't just be home by Thanksgiving, you'll be home the week before Thanksgiving.

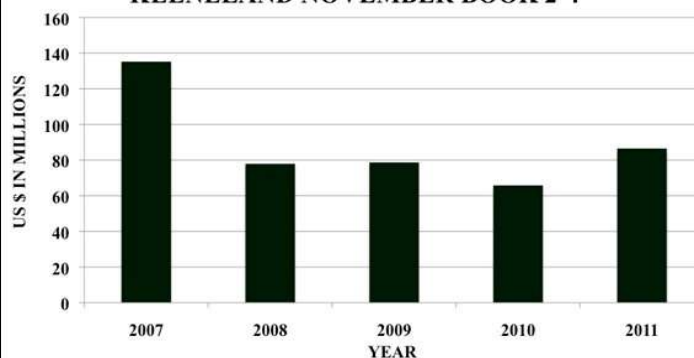
## Weekly Sales Ticker

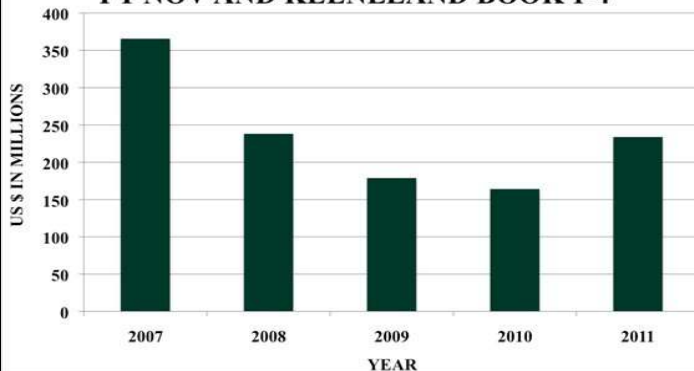

**Young Sires...**

The impact of the 2008 world credit collapse hit the horse business right after the Keeneland September Yearling Sale that year and continued for 12 months. By 2010, it was just about the worst time to be a first-year stallion; in Kentucky, the highest stud fee for a retiring stallion was \$25,000, for 2009 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint favorite Zensational (Unbridled's Song), who went to Hill 'n' Dale. The first crops of the class of 2010 retiring stallions are selling this November. It's been a largely low-key affair, but one horse who has really created a big impression is WinStar's Colonel John (Tiznow), winner of the 2008 GI Santa Anita Derby and GI Travers S. His 10 to sell (through Book 4) averaged \$105,000, but even more impressive is his \$102,500 median--an average of seven times his entering stud fee, and a median of 6.8 times stud fee: a scintillating commercial start. WinStar also has the number two sire of average, U.S. Ranger (Danzig), whose nine to sell (from 10 offered) averaged \$62,222. Zensational (\$56,400) was next (through Monday), followed by (five or more sold) Old Fashioned (\$45,000), Pioneer of the Nile (\$34,227), Cowboy Cal (\$25,500) and Dunkirk (\$17,823). Zensational, Old Fasioned, and Dunkirk are all by Unbridled's Song; Pioneer of the Nile is by another son of Unbridled, Empire Maker; Cowboy Cal is by Giant's Causeway.

Many of the mares in the Evans dispersal were in foal to his homebred stallion, Quality Road (Elusive Quality), a four-time Grade I winner in 2009-2010. The Lane's End stallion was the leading first-year covering sire (again through Monday), with 48 mares sold in foal, averaging \$283,208. Claiborne's Blame--who beat Zenyatta (Arch)--was second, with 10 mares in foal averaging \$229,000, followed by Taylor Made's 2010 GI Wood Memorial winner Eskendereya (Giant's Causeway, \$114,555) and Ashford's dual Eclipse Champion, Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike, \$103,545). All stood for \$35,000 this year, except for Eskendereya, who was \$30,000.

**JUDGE RULES IN FAVOR OF LEMON DROP KID SYNDICATE**

U.S. District Court Judge Jennifer Coffman has ruled in favor of Lane's End Stallions, syndicate manager for Lemon Drop Kid, in a dispute with shareholder KNC Investments over records requests. The California-based KNC Investments, with acting agent Jerry Jamgotchian, purchased a share in Lemon Drop Kid for \$350,000. Jamgotchian asked for all records pertaining to the syndicate and other shareholders. While he received documentation of receipts and disbursements for 2009 and 2010, the syndicate opted not to disclose full information about each of the shareholders after they were polled. Jamgotchian later filed suit.

In the Nov. 10 ruling ([click here](#)), Coffman said: "because the owners ratified Lane's End's conduct, the issues of whether the syndicate agreement contemplates confidentiality of owners' identities, whether Lane's End had authority to poll the owners as to whether they wanted their contact information released, and whether Lane's End had authority to recommend a 'no' vote are immaterial to determining the rights and obligations of the parties. Likewise, ratification removes the question of whether Lane's End violated duties to KNC by withholding the other owners' identities, because its doing so has been expressly approved by a majority vote of the fractional interest as provided in the syndicate agreement."

In conclusion, the judge said that Lane's End Stallions "has therefore complied with the syndicate agreement in the materials it has furnished to KNC, even though it redacted the documents to exclude identities of the owners in those materials." Coffman also pointed out that "each owner is entitled to be furnished with periodic statements and annual statements showing the results of the breeding season. It also provides that if an owner wishes to inspect other books and records of the syndicate, it may do so by appointment at the offices of Lane's End or the premises where the stallion is kept. The syndicate agreement does not provide that an owner is entitled to be furnished with a general accounting upon request."

The ruling was unexpected to Richard Getty, attorney for the plaintiff. "I was very surprised, because some of the comments during oral arguments indicated that Judge Coffman was leaning towards KNC," Getty said yesterday afternoon. "We plan to file under Rule 59 to alter or amend the ruling, and we have 10 days to do that. There are several factors that need to be addressed, including the conclusion that the vote [of the syndicate members] involving ratification constituted an amendment to the syndicate agreement."

If the ruling is not amended, Getty indicated that an appeal would be filed with the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals.

Bill Hoskins of Jackson Kelly, attorney for the syndicate manager, was pleased with the ruling. "We felt it confirmed our position," he said. "We found the judge's opinion to be well-reasoned, well-written, and perfectly consistent with applicable case law."

**CHAMPION BIG DRAMA TO STONEWALL**

Harold Queen's homebred **Big Drama** (Montbook--Riveting Drama, by Notebook) will begin his career at stud in 2012 at Stonewall Farm in Ocala, Florida,. He will stand for \$10,000. The dark bay, trained throughout his career by David Fawkes, was awarded 2010 champion sprinter honors following a sharp score in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Churchill. The Florida-bred earned a 120 Beyer--which remains the highest figure awarded this year--in his track-record setting performance in Gulfstream's GIII Mr. Prospector S. in January. "I've already received a lot of inquiries about Big Drama, regarding his stallion status since we announced his retirement just a week ago," Queen told *Daily Racing Form*. "He's just been unbelievable for both Dave [Fawkes] and I. Winning the Breeders' Cup was fantastic. I'm certain he's going to have a great career as a stallion. I've already committed at least eight of my 12 broodmares to him for next season." The 5-year-old retires with a record of 19-11-4-1 and earnings of \$2,746,060.

### NUMBERS UP AT NZB READY TO RUN SALE

Trade gradually increased throughout the opening session of the New Zealand Bloodstock's Ready to Run Sale of 2-year-olds at Karaka Tuesday to post across-the-board increases over last year's results. A total of 180 head were catalogued on the first of two sessions, with 107 horses selling for an average NZ\$62,036 and gross of NZ\$6,723,500. Tuesday's average currently 15% ahead of the same point in the sale last year. The sale median is up 19% to \$38,000 from last year's final median of \$32,000, and the day's clearance rate of 72% is well ahead of last year's final clearance of 59%.

"The day started off a bit quietly this morning, but demand steadily got stronger and stronger throughout the day," said Petrea Vela, NZB's co-managing director. "We're extremely happy with the turnout of buyers at Karaka. There are lots of familiar faces, but also lots of buyers who are here for the first time from all over the world, which is very encouraging. There's substantial depth to the demand for the more appealing lots, but still buyers are being selective. There's over 170 lots set for sale tomorrow so, hopefully, the momentum seen this afternoon can continue."

Heading the initial session's action was [lot 146](#), a gelding by Darci Brahma (NZ) (Danehill), who realized a NZ\$320,000 (US\$246,466) final bid from Singapore-based trainer Michael Freedman and local agent Michael Wallace, acting on behalf of Singapore owners Joy N Happiness stable.

"This horse genuinely reminded me of Super Easy 12 months ago," commented Freedman, who secured GSP Super Easy (NZ) (Darci Brahma)--winner of six straight--for the same partnership at Karaka last year.

"In my opinion he was the pick of the sale," Freedman said of the half to listed winner and Group 1 placed Bridgestone (NZ) (Pentire {GB}). "I liked the way he breezed up, and the guys that own Super Easy also loved the look of him, so we're very happy."

As for the gelding's future plans, Freedman added, "He will stay in New Zealand at Henley Park for the next six to eight weeks before we take him up to Singapore."

Out of the winning Gold Brose (NZ) mare Golden Dawn (NZ), the gelding was pinhooked from the Karaka Premier Sale as a yearling for NZ\$60,000 by Curraghmore Stud principal Gordon Cunningham.

"He breezed very well and was exceptionally popular on the sale grounds, and he's been bought by people who've had great success with Darci Brahma," remarked Cunningham. "The level of inspection been very good today at Karaka. There are lots of people here from overseas, and it seems that if you have the right horses, there are plenty of people here to buy them."

### Leaderboard at NZB Ready to Run...

Heading the stallion ranks in average during yesterday's Ready to Run sale was the Oaks Stud's pair Darci Brahma and Bachelor Duke (with three or more lots sold). Four Darci Brahma 2-year-olds sold for an average of NZ\$147,250, and four by Bachelor Duke brought an average of NZ\$71,875, with a top price of NZ\$130,000 (Lot 114). Leading buyer at the end of day 1 was Willie Leung's Magus Equine, with seven 2-year-olds purchased for NZ\$785,000. His top price of the session was [lot 113](#), a Street Sense colt, who brought NZ\$220,000. Mark and Shelley Treweek's Lyndhurst Farm led the vendor tables yesterday with eight of 22 entries sold for NZ\$1,290,000 for an average of NZ\$161,250.

**JET MASTER DIES** Jet Master (SAf) (Rakeen--Jet Lightning {SAf}, by Rollins), South Africa's leading stallion, died early Tuesday morning at Klipdrif Stud in Robertson. He was 17. The former South African Horse of the Year had been diagnosed with West Nile fever earlier in the season. Bred by Hugh Jonsson, he was foaled in Kwa-Zulu Natal in 1994. He was purchased for just R15 000 as a weanling by Pat and Henry Devine, and the couple--who had originally intended to purchase a broodmare at the same sale--walked away with one of the great bargains in South African racing history.

Jet Master began his racing career with Tony Millard in Gauteng. The imposing bay never saw a racetrack at two, but captured the G1 Cape Guineas before being sidelined with breathing problems. He went on to be named Horse of the Year at five, and also garnered awards as champion older male and champion sprinter. His greatest victories included back to back wins in the G1 Queen's Plate (South Africa's premier WFA mile race), and a five-length romp in the 1000-meter G1 Cape Flying Championship. Jet Master, trained in the later part of his racing career by Geoff Woodruff, also won the 1200-meter G1 Gilbeys S. twice; carrying top impost of 58 kg on both occasions. Jet Master ended his career with a fluent win in the G1 Mercury Sprint. During his career, Jet Master won 17 races, eight at the Group 1 level, for earnings in excess of R3 million.


Retired to stud at six, he begun his breeding career for a fee of R12,000. It eventually rose to as much as R250 000, and was R150 000 in 2011. Despite the humble star to his stud career, Jet Master--the only South African-bred stallion to head the general sires list on more than one occasion--quickly established himself as a leading stallion. His first crop, which consisted of 77 foals, produced 16 individual stakes winners. Among this tally were four individual Group 1 winners. Jet Master's first crop included his most successful son, Pocket Power (SAf). A triple Horse of the Year, Pocket Power won the Queen's Plate on four occasions, in addition to three runnings of the country's top races, the J&B Met. Pocket Power's 20 career wins netted him over R9 million in prize money. Jet Master's subsequent crops netted a further 10 individual Group 1 winners.
