### TOUCH GOLD MARE TOPS KEENOV

A three-parts sister to GI Illinois Derby winner Yarrow Brae (Deputy Minister) topped Wednesday's penultimate session of the Keeneland November Sale, selling to Bluewater Sales, agent for Southern Equine Stables, for \$105,000. The 6-year-old mare **Five Gold Rings** (Touch Gold--Bally Five, by Miswaki), a \$180,000 KEESEP yearling the last time she visited the Keeneland sales ring

in 2006, sold in foal to Indygo Shiner (A.P. Indy) on an Apr. 9 cover. Lane's End consigned the chestnut as [hip 3443](#). In addition to Yarrow Brae, the mare is a 3/4-sister to GSP To the Queen (Deputy Minister) and a half to SP Summinitup (Summer Squall). The mare's dam, Bally Five, is a half or full to three stakes winners, including Grade II winner Esteemed Friend (Gulch).

Machmer Hall and Partners signed for the highest-priced weanling on the day, a \$42,000 daughter of Bellamy Road--Red Sonnet, by Red Ransom. Ben Walden's Pauls Mill Bloodstock consigned the filly as [hip 3581](#). Craig and Carrie Brogden and Sandy Willwerth's Machmer Hall also signed for a second weanling yesterday, a \$25,000 colt by Notional--Destiny Now, by Jeblar. Like the first, that weanling, a half to SW Whiskey Lit (Fortunate Prospect) and SP Every Trick (Grand Slam), was consigned by Pauls Mill. "I think the market for any of the decent foals is still very strong," said Carrie Brogden. Machmer Hall has signed for no fewer than 20 weanlings, alone or in partnership, at the November Sale. ### EXCEED AND EXCEL COLT TOPS AT GOFFS

The three-day Goffs November Foal Sale continued apace yesterday, when a son of Exceed and Excel (Aus) stole the limelight late in the session by selling for €90,000. Consigned by Oghill House Stud as [lot 506](#), the chestnut is out of a half-sister to the talented Stateside performer Sohgol (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}), whose finest hour came when fourth in the 2006 GI Yellow Ribbon S., was placed twice in graded company. Julie Wood, who has enjoyed considerable success in recent years with several Richard Hannon trainees, prevailed for the sought-after colt, who may enter training with that same conditioner. The very last foal into the ring on day two, [lot 528](#), was a Manduro (Ger) half-sister to this year's G3 La Coupe de Maisons-Laffitte winner One Clever Cat (Ire) (One Cool Cat). Gilles Forien's FIPS Agency paid €58,000 for the granddaughter of the 1980 G1 Prix Marcel Bousac heroine Tropicaro (Fr) consigned by Ballyhast House Stud on behalf of Gerard Mulligan. Those purchases followed a flurry of late activity begun by the selling of [lot 492](#), a son of Footstepsinthesand (GB), for €50,000. From the draft of Tom Gaffney's Churchtown House Stud, the February foal hails from the family of top performer Henrythenavigator, and was knocked down to owner Norman Steel. Cont. p2

Also selling for €50,000 was [lot 501](#), a filly from the first crop of Coolmore's Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). The youngster's dam Woodland Chant (War Chant) is an unraced half to the millennium G3 Coventry S. winner Cd Europe (Ire) (Royal Academy). Also from the immediate family of last year's G1 St Leger third Corsica (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), Waterside Stud's offering on behalf of Anthony Gannon was snapped up by John Cullinan's Horse Park Stud.

Ballinacurra Stud's [lot 503](#), a son of Iffraaj (GB) was also in demand during the frantic period, and sold to Mark Dwyer's Oaks Farm Stables for €46,000.

Pinhookers were to the fore early, and Tuesday's high of €47,000 was threatened three times within the opening hour. First of a trio to hit €44,000 was Ballintry Stud's [lot 272](#), a filly from the first crop of Tally-Ho resident Bushranger (Ire) (Danetime {Ire}). She was knocked down to Manor House Stud and hails from the family of Invincible Spirit (Ire), Kodiak (GB) et al. That price was quickly matched when another Bushranger filly from Oghill House Stud ([lot 276](#)) went the way of Peter and Ross Doyle. The April foal is a half-sister to this term's Listed City of York S. third Lechevalier Choisi (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}). Tally-Ho sires were a popular early dish, and the Mullingar operation's Kodiak was responsible for the third lot to stick at €44,000. His April-foaled colt offered as [lot 282](#) by Ringfort Stud is from the family of Darshaan (GB) and Darara (Ire) (Top Ville {Ire}), and was acquired by Glenvale Stud's Flash Conroy, who will reoffer him at one of next autumn's Yearling Sales.

The day's early pace, which lasted until well after darkness descended, was set by Mary Davison and Debbie Kitchin's [lot 318](#), another by Bushranger who fell to Tally-Ho's Tony and Roger O'Callaghan for €50,000. Offered by Catherinestown Stud, he is the first foal out of a full-sister to MSW Andronikos (GB) (Dr Fong) and is another bound for the yearling sales carousel.

The standard was maintained two lots later when Tony Cosgrave's offering under the Ballynaslaney Stud banner was bagged by Redpender Stud pinhooker Jimmy Murphy for €48,000. [Lot 320](#), an April foal from the initial crop of Ballyhane sire Dandy Man (Ire) (Mozart {Ire}), is a half-brother to this season's Listed Chester City Plate victor Majestic Myles (Ire) (Majestic Missile (Ire)).

The middle session's gross of €3,507,900 far outstripped last year's €2,545,600, while the average of €18,560 and median of €15,000 were up by 17% and 15%, respectively. Today's action heats up considerably, with the first foals by Sea the Stars (Ire) taking center stage. Selling of the foals begins at 10 a.m., with the new November Yearling Sale taking place afterwards. Full results can be found on [goffs.com](http://goffs.com).

**581, f, Sea the Stars (Ire)--Finsceal Beo (Ire), by Mr. Greeley**

*Consigned by Al-Eile Stud*

One of the most illustrious offerings at this year's auctions, the first of Sea the Stars' foals to come under the hammer is a striking chestnut loaded with class. Finsceal Beo almost pulled off the unprecedented treble of English, Irish and French 1000 Guineas in 2007 and was one of the best of her sex in recent years. This is the second foal from the popular chestnut; her first is a yearling colt by Sea the Stars' half-brother Galileo (Ire).

**588, c, Acclamation (GB)--Glitter Baby (Ire), by Danehill Dancer (Ire)**

*Consigned by Rathbarry Stud, agent*

Acclamation's fortunes are on a steep upward trajectory at present, and this is one of the picks by Rathbarry's resident as the first foal out of a listed-placed descendant of a top Moyglare family. Sense of Purpose (Ire) (Galileo {Ire})--under the third dam--has supplied further luster to the family of Simple Exchange (Ire) (Danehill), Sights on Gold (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) and Grey Swallow (Ire) (Daylami {Ire}) with success in this year's G3 Ballyroan S.



**612, c, Galileo (Ire)--Kitza (Ire), by Danehill**

*Consigned by Rockfield Farm*

One of a trio by Coolmore's leading sire in the catalogue, this May-foaled son of dual Classic-placed Kitza represents famed Galileo/ Danehill cross flown by Frankel (GB), Teofilo (Ire) et al. He is a full brother to the well-regarded but, ultimately, disappointing Ballydoyle trainee Amen (Ire) and a half to listed winner Fort Dignity (Seeking the Gold).

**656, c, Danehill Dancer (Ire)--Perihelion (Ire), by Galileo (Ire)**

*Consigned by the Castlebridge Consignment*

Danehill Dancer has two in the book, and this is a son of 2008 G2 Park Hill S. runner-up Perihelion. It is also the extended family of Brian Boru (GB) (Sadler's Wells), Sea Moon (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}) and Workforce (GB) (King's Best).

**685, f, Sea the Stars (Ire)--Scribonia (Ire), by Danehill**

*Consigned by Redmondstown Stud*

Another stand-out on day three, this is a half-sister to 2009 G1 1000 Guineas runner-up and dual group scorer Cuis Ghaire (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), as well as last year's Guineas third and G1 Coronation S. second Gile Na Greine (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

**686, f, Invincible Spirit (Ire)--Security Interest, by Belong to Me**

*Consigned by Irish National Stud*

This April-foaled bay is a half to the 2009 G2 Norfolk S. winner, G1 Middle Park S. runner-up and G1 Nunthorpe S. third Radiohead (GB) (Johannesburg) from an American family that includes GISW A. P. Valentine (A.P. Indy).

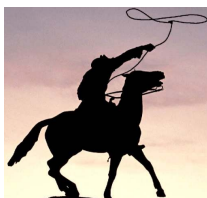

## Flat Out Confirmed for Clark...

According to connections, MGISW Flat Out (Flatter) will make one more start this season and that will be in the Nov. 25 GI Clark H. at Churchill Downs.

Campaigned by Art Preston and trained by Charles "Scooter" Dickey, the winner of this season's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and GI Suburban H. finished fifth in his most recent start in the Nov. 5 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill.

"He's been doing really well since the Classic," Dickey said. "Also, it's a Grade I race worth a \$500,000. We're excited about it."

In the 10-furlong Classic, Flat Out was only three lengths adrift of winner Drosselmeyer (Distorted Humor).

"He really didn't run a bad race," Dickey said. "Losing by three lengths in the Breeders' Cup Classic is nothing to be ashamed of."

While a win in the nine-furlong Clark could have major Eclipse Awards implications, Dickey said that wasn't the reason for running the 5-year-old one more time this year.

"A lot of people have been telling me that if Flat Out wins [the Clark] that he could be champion older male or maybe even Horse of the Year," Dickey said. "It'd be nice, but we're not really worried about all of that."

Flat Out is 0-3 at Churchill, including a sixth-place finish in this year's the June 18 GI Stephen Foster H.

"We don't really know why the same Flat Out that ran in the Suburban and the Jockey Club didn't show up in the Stephen Foster and the Classic," Dickey admitted. "He handles the track fine, though, and has always trained very well over it."

According to Dickey, Flat Out is expected to work this weekend in preparation for the Clark.

"We're going to see what the weather does and how the track looks," Dickey confirmed. "The earliest he'll work is Friday morning, but we might push it back a day or two."

As for plans following the Clark, Dickey added, "[The Clark] will be the end of his year and then we'll give him some time," Dickey said. "The goal is to come back next year in the GI Donn H. [at Gulfstream Park Feb. 11]."

**Regally Ready to Try Hong Kong Sprint...**

Vinery Stable's **Regally Ready** (More Than Ready), last-out winner of the GII Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, will accept an invitation to the G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Sprint at Sha Tin Racecourse Dec. 11, the farm's Tom Ludt confirmed Wednesday. "To quote [trainer] Steve [Asmussen], he 'came out [of the Breeders' Cup] better than any race that he's ever tried,'" Ludt commented. "We thought we were done for the year, but he's doing great, and at the end of the day it's horse racing and we want to race. We are accepting the invitation on the condition that [trainer] Steve [Asmussen] continues to be happy with the horse, but if everything goes right over the next week or 10 days, that's the plan." Regally Ready, who is six-for-nine in 2011, will be ridden by Corey Nakatani, who has partnered with the gelding for five of those victories. Nakatani will warm up for the Sunday races in the International Jockeys' Championship at Happy Valley Dec. 7. Given that racing is conducted in a clockwise fashion in Hong Kong, Ludt says that Regally Ready will breeze in that direction at a training center over the coming days. Connections are not overly concerned with not being able to race on Lasix on Hong Kong. "I've talked about it with Steve, the horse is very sound and Steve doesn't think it's an issue and he thinks we'd be fine," Ludt stated. Hong Kong horses have generally dominated the Sprint, though American-based Morluc (Housebuster) was runner-up in 2000 and 2001.

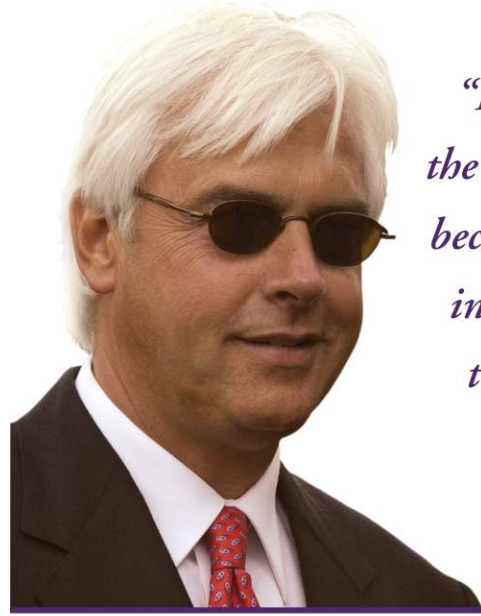

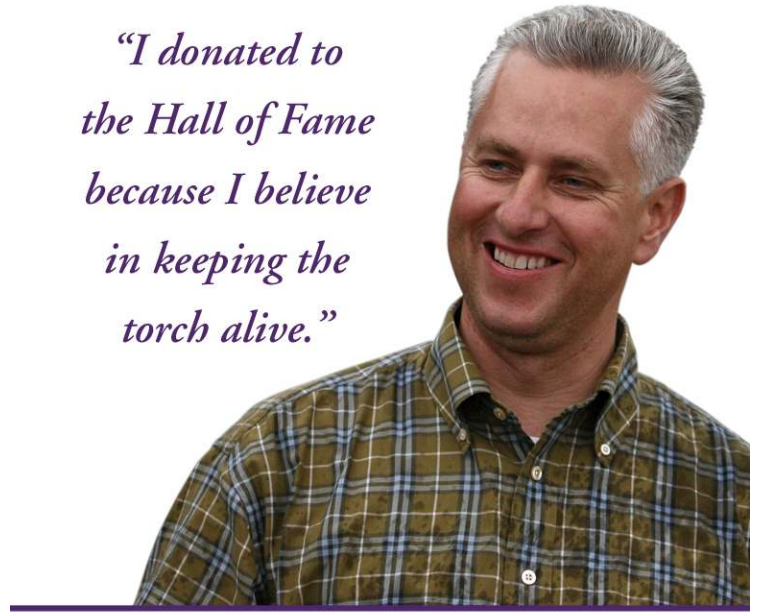

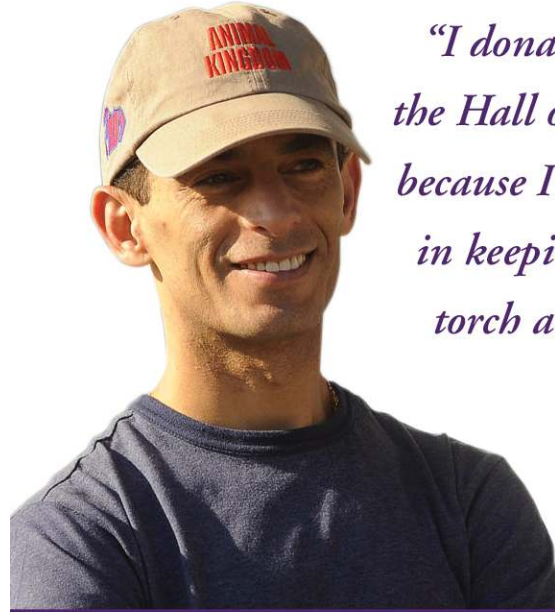

"We are grateful that a stay was granted, and we are looking forward to challenging the courts decision in the courts," said Michael Koenig, Dutrow's attorney.

Previously, Dutrow had received a 30-day stay of the ban, which expired yesterday.

"We filed our article 78 petition on Monday and, we're seeking the stay, pending the outcome of the case," explained Koenig.

In the near future, the case is expected to be transferred to the appellate division--which is the intermediate appeals court in New York State--where Dutrow's appeal will be heard. Historically, the time frame for such decisions from this point in time could range anywhere from six months to a year. The parties will be in the process over the next few months of submitting their legal arguments regarding their appeal issues to the court.

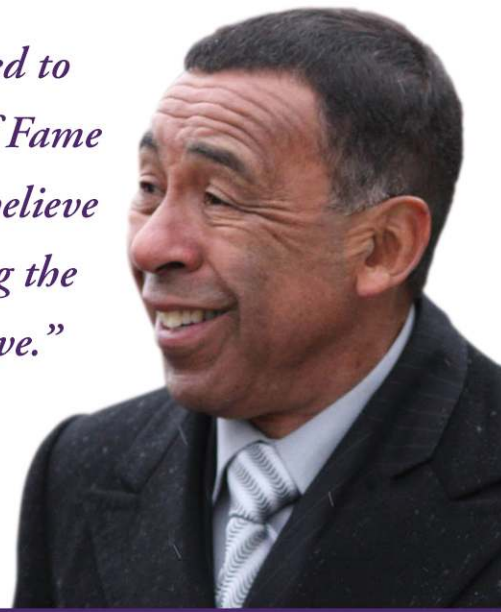

Luke Nolen will fly the flag for Australia and gained an invitation due to his partnership with the undefeated Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}), who is being spelled until the new year. Whyte, perennially a leading rider in Hong Kong, will be joined by the leading jockey and leading local jockey as of Nov. 24. Other participants include Yuichi Fukunaga (Japan) and James McDonald (New Zealand). The victorious rider in the four-race competition will receive a check for HK\$200,000.

**WHYWHYWHY TO KOREA** Gainesway announced the recent sale of GISW **Whywhywhy** (Mr. Greeley--Thorough Fair by Quiet American) to a Korean syndicate.
