

SCHWARTZ GETS BANIMPIRE

Following the euphoria of Thursday's foal session dominated by the first offerings of Sea the Stars (Ire), the Goffs November Sale produced more drama yesterday as **Banimpire (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) beat the company's record when selling to Martin Schwartz for €2.3 million (*US\$3.12 million*). Jim Bolger's star 3-year-old filly was always going to set off the pyrotechnics as the attention switched to the Breeding Stock Sale, and ultimately only the underbidders left the Kill venue disappointed. Many of her trainer's representatives are renowned for

their toughness, but this particular filly was as hardy as any the stable has nurtured in recent seasons. Less than 10 weeks after opening her black-type account in the G3 Ballysax S. in April, the dark bay descendant of 1980 Arc heroine Detroit (Fr) (Riverman) took Royal Ascot by storm, adding a fourth Pattern-race success in the G2 Ribblesdale S. She went on to add the G2 Royal Whip to her tally for good measure in August. "Here she is," uttered auctioneer Henry Beeby before asking for a starting bid of €1 million for the Kilcarn Stud-bred, who also lost out by a slither in the G1 Irish Oaks during her industrious sophomore campaign. "She needs little introduction as a Group 1 winner in all but name and it is a great privilege for Goffs to offer her," the Chief Executive added. While the bidding for hip [942](#) actually began at €200,000, it quickly caught fire with M.V. Magnier and Michel Zerolo's Oceanic Bloodstock eventually left with a face-off. After the former refused to stretch beyond €2.25 million, Banimpire became the property of Martin Schwartz to a ripple of applause. "I have bought her for Martin Schwartz, who has owned the likes of Elusive Wave, Stacelita and Maid's Causeway, and she is going to race on in America," Zerolo explained. "She is a very

high-class filly who has had a wonderful season, and she is a Group 1 winner in everything but name. You would have to think that she could do very well in America next year on what she showed this year. We were at our limit there." **Goffs cont. p2**

CHA-CHING!

Today's \$1-million GIII Delta Jackpot S. virtually guarantees the winner a spot in the starting gate of the GI Kentucky Derby next May, and morning-line favorite **Drill** (Lawyer Ron) ships in for Hall of Famer Bob Baffert. After winning the GI Del Mar Futurity Sept. 7, the bay colt ran second in the GI Norfolk S. at Santa Anita Oct. 1. However, with blinkers off in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Churchill two weeks ago, Drill never got involved and wound up 10th. He blew out three-eighths in a bullet :35 2/5 (1/12) this past Monday, and the hood will go back on. "He came out of the gate and was flat and never ran a jump," Baffert told *Daily Racing Form*. "He's doing fine--he just didn't run. I'm putting blinkers back on him." **Longview Drive** (Pulpit), a full-brother to GISW Pyro, also ships in from California, albeit from the Bay Area. The chestnut has rattled off three straight for trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, including the Charlie Palmer Futurity at Fresno Oct. 16. "He's done all of his running on the dirt and I didn't want to take him off dirt," Hollendorfer told *Daily Racing Form*. **Cont. p5**

Alasha Leads the Way...

As ever, His Highness The Aga Khan's draft proved popular. The star among them was the 12-year-old mare **Alasha (Ire)** (Barathea {Ire}), who was knocked down to Lodge Park Stud for €260,000. Lodge Park Stud supremo Seamus Burns defeated BBA Ireland's Michael Donohoe for hip [918](#), who came with a coveted Raven's Pass covering. Successful in the 2002 Listed Dick Hern Fillies' S., she also hit the board in that season's G1 1000 Guineas and GI E.P. Taylor S., and is the dam of this term's G3 Sceptre S. heroine Alanza (Ire) (Dubai Destination). "When we were starting off, we were very lucky with Red God, and this mare is out of one of his granddaughters," Burns said. "Before today, we had 10 mares at home, and three of them were Barathea mares. I really like Barathea as a broodmare stallion, and this is a good racemare who has already bred a good filly." Others to make their mark from the prized draft were hip [1003](#), the 3-year-old **Kirinda (Ire)** (Tiger Hill {Ire}), who showed talent for the John Oxx stable in 2010 when finishing runner-up in the G3 Kilboy Estate S. in July. She sold to Anthony Stroud Bloodstock for €135,000. Earlier, the first tranche of Aga Khan offerings included the 14-year-old winning mare **Lidakiya (Ire)** (Kahyasi {Ire}), sold in foal to Zamindar. Consigned as hip [924](#), the dam of four winners headed by the dual Group 1-winning globetrotter Linngari (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) went the way of Dermot Cantillon's Tinnakill House Stud for €85,000. "She will be a welcome addition to Forenaghts Stud and obviously she made a lot of appeal, having already produced a Group 1 winner," commented Cantillon. Minutes later, hip [926](#) **Riynaaz (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}), in foal to Dalakhani (Ire), continued the healthy trend when selling to BBA Ireland's Eamon Reilly for €70,000. A 4-year-old who won her maiden at The Curragh last year, she is out of the 2000 Listed Harvest S. winner Riyafa (Ire) (Kahyasi {Ire}) and is a sibling of three stakes performers, including the 2006 Listed Pretty Polly S. victress Riyalma (Ire) (Selkirk).

A Rathbarry Benefit...

Moments after the excitement of Banimpire's sale, Paul and Catherine Cashman's Rathbarry Stud were at the forefront when selling a trio of broodmares all in foal to the establishment's in-demand resident Acclamation (GB) for a total of €470,000. Hip [950](#), the 7-year-old **Pretty Demanding (Ire)** (Night Shift), whose dam is a half to the graded stakes performer Step With Style (Gulch), sold for €120,000; hip [951](#), the 8-year-old **Glitter Baby (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), who is a listed-placed half to the 2007 G2 Beresford S. third Going Public (Ire) (Night Shift), fetched €150,000; and hip [952](#), the 9-year-old **Petite Spectre (GB)** (Spectrum {Ire}), who is already the dam of the 2009 G2 Coventry S. third Rakaan (Ire) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) and promising 2-year-old Ballyea (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}), was secured for €200,000. John Walsh Bloodstock was the name on the docket for all three. "I've bought them for a client, and obviously the big attraction was the Acclamation coverings," commented Walsh. "They are three nice mares, and Glitter Baby is a black-type filly who was carrying her second foal. Petite Spectre has already produced a couple of decent 2-year-olds, and Ballyea looks a very promising horse for next season."

Ripsnorter...

Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was the covering sire of just two lots in this catalogue and the first was Ballyhane's 6-year-old **Lake Windermere (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), who proved popular yesterday. Hip [1041](#) is a daughter of the 2002 G3 Musidora S. runner-up Spinnette (Ire) (Spinning World), and therefore a half to the Green Desert duo of graded stakes placegetters Green Lyons (Ire) and Tarrip. Tom-Terry Rogers paid €75,000 for the bay, who also boasts Naissance Royale (Ire) (Giant's Causeway) among her immediate relatives. Acclamation's fortunes continue to take an upward turn, and he was the covering sire of two other highlights of the session. The first was hip [966](#), Lowland Enterprises' listed-placed 4-year-old **Deal (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), whose page includes the sires Beckett (Ire) and Entrepreneur (GB), knocked down to Peter and Ross Doyle Bloodstock for €70,000. The other was Swordlestown Stud's hip [824](#), the unraced 3-year-old **Cursory (GB)** (Hurricane Run {Ire}), who set the morning pace when falling the way of Oliver St Lawrence for €60,000. She is out of the 2001 G3 May Hill S. scorer Half Glance (GB) (Danehill) and hails from the family of Group 1-winning distaffers Wince (GB) (Selkirk) and Quiff (GB) (Sadler's Wells). That price was matched by Kozasa Shoten Co Ltd for hip [943](#), another member of 2010's Classic generation **Do the Bosanova (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) from Bolger's Glebe House. From the family of starlets Alexandrova (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Magical Romance (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}), the chestnut was twice a winner, including an 11-length tally at Leopardstown in July.

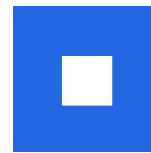

German import **Sanagas** figures to take a large portion of the win pool. After a sharp win in the 13-furlong John's Call S. at Saratoga Aug. 5, the dark bay was a close fourth as the favorite in the GII Bowling Green H. at Belmont Sept. 10, and most recently secured the GIII Sycamore S. that was washed off the Keeneland turf Oct. 20. "We felt the further he goes, the better, and this seemed like a good fit," said trainer Graham Motion. A dark horse in the field is **Goldwaki**, who will be saddled by Ron McAnally on behalf of Richard Duchossois. Produced by a half-sister to Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa), the bay seemed to be on his way to the big time after taking the G3 Prix du Lys for his breeders, Alain and Gerard Wertheimer, in June 2010. He was unplaced in three additional starts for trainer Andre Fabre, however, and has been sixth in each of his first two California tries for McAnally. MAGIC HAS THE BACK CLASS IN PRINCESS

Of the 10 young fillies that will head to the post for today's GIII Delta Princess S., **Delightful Magic** (Mineshaft) needed the highest number of starts--five--before celebrating graduation day. However, with a ton of back class and a pedigree that screams out for a route of ground, it would be no surprise to see John Oxley's silks in the winner's circle this afternoon. Second to recent GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' winner and likely champion My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike) at Saratoga July 22, she was third to **"TDN Rising Star"** **Stopshoppingmaria** (More Than Ready) Aug. 14. Delightful Magic was solidly on the board in Woodbine maidens Sept. 3 and Oct. 2, but broke through in style last time with an eye-catching five-wide sweep en route to a 7 1/2-length success at Churchill Oct. 30. She rated kindly on that occasion and that trait would serve her well in a race that looks pretty quick up front. **Candrea** (Trippi) looks like she'll be a major part of that pace, having made the early running in advance of My Miss Aurelia in the Juvenile Fillies. She gets blinkers on and worked a bullet just nine days after the Breeders' Cup and now makes another trip outside of California. **Now I Know** (Pure Prize) is another who should love this stretchout in distance. Perfect in four starts, all at Remington Park, the grey exits a handy 9 1/4-length tally in the Oklahoma Classics Lassie S. Oct. 28.

unprecedented third straight G1 Sun Chariot S. score, is drawn out wider in 13. "Her draw was a wide stall, as it always seems to be for me, but she can handle it," Rodolphe Collet stated. "It would have been better if we had Immortal Verse's draw, but it's the most inner stall I've ever had and we're very positive about it." Defending race champion **A Shin Forward** will leave from the stall just inside Immortal Verse, while the early favorite is 3-year-old **Real Impact**, who upset older rivals in the G1 Yasuda Kinen in June. He has post position number eight.

Racetrack Round-Up

DROSSELMAYER RETIRED TO WINSTAR

After seriously considering at least one more start for GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero **Drosselmeyer** (Distorted Humor--Golden Ballet, by Moscow Ballet), connections at WinStar Farm have decided to call it a career, and the 4-year-old will stand his first year at stud in 2012 for a fee of \$17,500. "Drosselmeyer came out of the Classic so good that it gave us cause for pause," said Elliott Walden, President & CEO of WinStar Farm. "We knew he had what it took to be one of the top older horses in the country, and I think we saw that with how he came to hand in his last two starts. So it made for a difficult decision. We took some time to think about all of our options, and we came to the conclusion that it was best for both Drosselmeyer and WinStar Farm to retire him and go out as a Breeders' Cup Classic champion."

A \$600,000 Keeneland September yearling, Drosselmeyer was third in the GIII Risen Star S. and runner-up in the GII Dwyer S. before upsetting the GI Belmont S. in 2010. The chestnut won an overnight stakes at Big Sandy this past May and punched his ticket to the Breeders' Cup with a runner-up effort to Flat Out (Flatter) in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. Originally headed to the GII Breeders' Cup Marathon, he was rerouted to the Classic and rewarded that decision with a furious stretch rally beneath the Twin Spires. Drosselmeyer is one of just seven horses to win a Classic and the Breeders' Cup Classic.

"Drosselmeyer has always been a superstar since we saw him as a weanling, and we couldn't be more proud of him showing up with his best on racing's biggest day to give WinStar our first Breeders' Cup Classic win," Walden added. "We're thrilled to be able to keep him at WinStar for his stud career. He retires as the most accomplished son of our leading sire Distorted Humor, and he has the looks to match his pedigree and race record."

Drosselmeyer, who was originally slated to enter stud in New York in 2012, retires as the leading earner for his champion sire with a record of 16-5-5-2 and earnings of \$3,728,170.

'Serve' Set for Cigar

Live Oak's **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini), who finished just 3 1/2 lengths behind stablemate Drosselmeyer when seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 5, will start next in the GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct Nov. 26. "We thought he was doing well enough to nominate and train up to the Cigar Mile," said Mott. "I know it's a bit of a squeeze to come back after a race like that, but he's feeling good, it's a Grade I, and probably the last race of the season for him." To Honor and Serve, who romped in the GII Pennsylvania Derby prior to his Churchill effort, showed a serious proclivity for the Big A last fall with wins in the GII Remsen S. and GII Nashua S. "I think it could be very good," Mott said about turning back to a mile. "He's a big horse, but he seems to be fairly quick, and he has speed for his size. Shortening back from 1 1/4 miles to a mile is not usually an easy task, but it's possible."

Light as a 'Feather'

Stronach Stables' **Awesome Feather** (Awesome of Course) will put her unbeaten record on the line next Saturday in the GI Gazelle S. at Aqueduct. "She's on target for the Gazelle and is doing really well," said Chad Brown, who trains the Eclipse Award winner. "She'll probably breeze on Monday. She's held up really well and she hasn't had a bad day of training. Not one day. I'm excited to see her run around two turns at Aqueduct and see what she can do in a Grade I." Two days after her 2010 Breeders' Cup victory, the bay filly topped FTKNOV on Frank Stronach's \$2.3-million bid. She was subsequently sidelined with a tendon issue, but resumed successfully in Belmont's Le Slew S. Oct. 5. "It would be a nice reward for the Stronachs," Brown said of a possible Gazelle victory. "They have been patient with this filly and gave me a lot of leeway with her. I just make sure she is 100% every day when we go out there, and she has been. It would be nice to reward them for their patience. She's a really gutsy horse--she just has a great attitude about her."

Ruler On Ice On Tap for Clark

George and Lori Hall's **Ruler On Ice** (Roman Ruler), third in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Nov. 5, tuned up for the Nov. 26 GI Clark H. with a four-furlong move in :48.60 yesterday under the Twin Spires. "It was excellent," said trainer Kelly Breen. "It was a textbook work, and he seems to really like this track." Breen added, "I'm very happy to report that he came out of the [Classic] in good order and he's currently in great shape. He's eating well and training well. He's a lean, mean fighting machine." The New Jersey-based conditioner is hopeful his charge can secure an Eclipse Award if he wins the Clark. "We're thinking that if he wins this race then he is in the running for champion 3-year-old," Breen said. "That would give us two Grade I wins, and he would be beating older horses."

MOTION BIG SPORT OF TURFDOM The Turf Publicists of America announced that trainer Graham Motion has been named the 2011 winner of the Big Sport of Turfdom award. As with Keeneland, there is no personal ownership of stock in the company. Also, like Keeneland, the net profit is to be distributed for the betterment of the sport and the breeding industry.

It was an honor to have been asked to join the inspection crew again this year, and the emulation of Keeneland in the development of Cape Thoroughbred Sales gave me further impetus to assist in selections again this year.

The officers of Cape Thoroughbred Sales are familiar faces: Robin Bruss, CEO; Adrian Todd, COO; Grant Knowles, Director-at-large; Kevin Sommerville, Marketing; and Amanda Carey, Administration. Bruss has a long and successful association with sales and breeding in South Africa. Todd has been instrumental in developing the Groom Education Program, for which he has been lauded by breeders and government alike. Knowles is a highly respected television personality and director of Gold Circle Racing. Sommerville is a graduate of the Darley Flying Start program, was an intern with Keeneland Sales and most recently worked with Juddmonte Stud in Newmarket. Carey has a distinguished record in sales administration and will be the glue to hold this group together.

Drawing from this talent, the new sales company should be able to build a brand recognized worldwide. Entries were dramatically up this year.

Along with stalwart inspector, John Kramer and able driver, Corrado Passerini, I saw more of South Africa in two weeks than most South Africans do in a lifetime. We began our trek in the Western Cape, traveled through the Karoo, through Kwazulu Natal, and on into the Eastern Cape. With greater numbers of entries from the larger breeding farms, along with participation by some farms that had taken a "wait and see" attitude last year, quality yearlings were in abundance. We were seeking those yearlings with pedigree, by serious sires, with maturity and conformational excellence.

From where I sit, the cataloguing committee should find plenty of quality from which to choose. South African stars Jet Master (SAf) and Captain Al (SAf) are well represented, as are Silvano (Ger), Fort Wood, Trippi, Var, Western Winter, Dynasty, and Miesque's Approval to name a few.

Additionally, we found plenty of impressive yearlings by freshman sires: South African-bred Champions Jay Peg (winner of the \$5-million G1I Dubai Duty Free), Argonaut (Triple Group 1 winner by Western Winter), Kildonan (Rich Mans Gold), and Horse Chestnut (now back in SA); plus U.S.-breds Judpot (A.P. Indy--Miesque) and A. P. Arrow, as well as others.

Interestingly, a number of foreign sires will also be represented. We saw some quality yearlings by Bernardini, Encosta de Lago (Aus), Tapit, Act One (GB), Borrego, Duke of Marmalade (Ire), Holy Roman Emperor (Ire), Lion Heart, O'Reilly (NZ), Royal Academy and Teofilo (Ire).

The fact is that the South African horse is raised tough, is durable, and its talent is recognized around the world. The breeders, now convinced of this sale's potential, have presented larger numbers of quality individuals with pedigree and sire power to match.

The inaugural sale attracted buyers from 15 countries. The 2012 sale will be more expansive, targeting a larger contingent of domestic and international buyers on the premise that horses purchased should remain to race in South Africa.

Del Mar Thoroughbred Club sent out checks totaling \$1.37 million to horsemen this week, representing a retroactive 10% increase on overnight purses paid out during the 2011 meet. "Given the uncertainty of the horse inventory, we had some concerns coming into the meet," said Tom Robbins, DMTC's executive vice president for racing and racing secretary. "But we put some things in place to deal with the situation, and the response was excellent. When you can have the kind of meet we had despite the problems that exist in our business, it is a tribute to all involved--horsemen, track staff and our racing fans." Del Mar also instituted the "Ship and Win" program, in which bonuses and incentives were offered to owners whose horses came from outside of the Golden State to run at the oceanside oval. Over 100 out-of-state runners took advantage of the incentive.
