**MORE STARS AT TATTERSALLS?**

While last year's December Foal Sale at Tattersalls produced a top price of only 320,000gns--the lowest sum for a top lot at the event since 2000--there will be some glum faces in Newmarket if that figure is not surpassed this week. The 1,003-lot foal catalogue, up from 941 youngsters in 2010, gets underway this morning at 10 a.m., and there are nine offerings remaining in the sales from the first crop of champion Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), as well as five lots by his half-brother and champion sire Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells).

The six-time Group 1 winner had foals sell for €850,000 and €800,000 twice at Goffs last week, and among his representatives at Newmarket is lot [984](#), a half-brother to G1 winners Youmzain (Ire)

(Sinndar {Ire}) and Creachadoir (Ire) (King's Best) bred by Frank Dunne and offered in the Castlebridge Consignment. Sea the Stars' jockey, Michael Kinane, is joint-breeder via his County Kildare-based Eadling Farm of lot

[1004](#), a colt out of Ice Mint (Awesome Again), a half-sister to G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner Falco (Pivotal {GB}) offered from Jackie Norris's Jockey Hall Stud. Meanwhile, lot [939](#) is a Sea the Stars colt who was bought in utero with his dam Ripples Maid (GB) (Dansili {GB}) for 240,000gns at last year's December Sale by the Al-Thani family's Qatar Bloodstock investment company. He appears from David Redvers' Tweenhills Stud. Also in the Castlebridge Consignment is lot [945](#), a Sea the Stars 3/4-sister to both G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Nightime (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and a Galileo (Ire) yearling filly who sold for 700,000gns to the Niarchos family at Tattersalls last month. **'AURELIA' FRESHENING AT GULF COAST**

Unbeaten My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike), a lock for Eclipse Award honors, will be freshened up at Gulf Coast Farm near Ocala, Florida. After running her perfect record to four in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies for owners Stonestreet Stables and George Bolton, the bay "developed a bit of a shin," according to trainer Steve Asmussen. "She is a special filly," said co-owner Barbara Banke. "Not since Curlin or Rachel Alexandra have we been this excited about an equine athlete. I expect great things

from My Miss Aurelia. [She] will have some well-deserved rest and relaxation in sunny Florida, at the same farm where she was trained as a baby, while we work to map out a winning strategy for our champion." Bolton added, "To be able to partner with Barbara Banke in her campaign after losing Jess earlier this year has meant the world to me and my family." In addition to her Breeders' Cup victory, My Miss Aurelia captured the GI Frizette S. and GI Adirondack S. She has earned \$1.38 million to date.

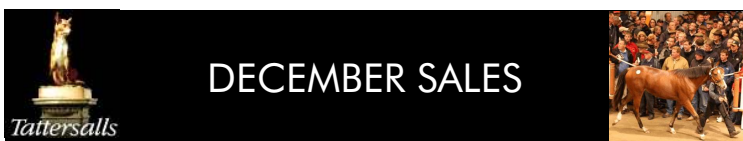

## DECEMBER SALES

Galileo (Ire)'s team includes lot [983](#), a full sister to 2009 G1 Epsom Derby runner-up At First Sight (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and lot [1010](#), a half-sister to this year's G1 Golden Jubilee S. winner Society Rock (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) bred by San Gabriel Investments and another consigned from Jockey Hall Stud.

Among those with expensive 'in utero' price tags is lot [971](#), a Montjeu (Ire) colt who was sold inside his dam Thinking Positive (GB) (Rainbow Quest) for 235,000gns at last year's Tattersalls December Sale. The colt, bred by the Breeding Capital partnerships, is offered from Peter Stanley's locally-based New England Stud. Lot [918](#) is one of no fewer than 34 for representatives for Exceed and Excel (Aus) (Danehill) on offer. The filly, bred by BBA 2010 and offered from Kirsten Rausing's St Simon Stud was bought 'in utero' inside her dam First Turn (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) for 200,000gns at Tattersalls 12 months ago.

Most pinhookers have enjoyed a good year and there were some familiar faces, especially from Ireland, looking for foals to resell at Tattersalls' Park Paddocks yesterday as well as those looking for longer-term racing and even breeding prospects. Pinhookers can be expected to be fickle towards what is regarded as fashionable stallions, but they should have plenty to choose from, including 24 lots by Rathbarry Stud sire Acclamation (GB), whose yearlings dominated book 2 of the October Sale.

Company officials are expecting to see a carryover of the momentum from two months ago.

"Our October Yearling Sale gave everyone cause for a degree of optimism and I'm sure the trade we saw in books 1, 2 and 3 will have an impact on the market this coming week," noted Tattersalls Marketing Director Jimmy George. "It's a quality catalogue and all the top European-based stallions are well represented in there."

The sale is graded, with the foals improving from today into tomorrow. Friday's session looks to have the best lots on paper, though trade is likely to slightly step back down a level again on Saturday. Two days after a testing work over a Tokyo turf course with plenty of ease in it, **Mission Approved** (With Approval), the one-time claimer who upset champion Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) in this year's

GI Manhattan H., jogged a couple of laps on the dirt course under the watchful eye of trainer Naipaul Chatterpaul. "After a day of rest, he was very fresh this morning--maybe too fresh, so we let him jog two laps instead of one," Chatterpaul explained. "Basically, horses jog right-handed and gallop left-handed when they train in the U.S. That's why he

jogged right-handed this morning. He goes stronger when he's moving left-handed." The 7-year-old got the day off Monday after working seven furlongs over a rain-affected turf course Sunday morning with a final clocking of 1:29.1 beneath local rider Hiroki Goto. Mission Approved was strong through the opening stages of the breeze, covering the opening half-mile in :49.6 before covering his next furlong in :11.5 for a five-furlong time of 1:02.1. "The horse is a real fighter, just like a lot of horses I've seen in the U.S.," said Goto. "His gallop this morning was more than anyone could ask for, considering that it's a whole week to the race."

The trio of European-based fillies who will start in Sunday's feature made the two-hour journey from the Shiroy quarantine facilities to Tokyo Racecourse, arriving just before 1 p.m. Since its inception in 1981, no horse has been able to complete the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe/Japan Cup double, but **Danedream (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}) will try to do just that this weekend. The filly had an uneventful passage to Tokyo and has looked well while exercising at Shiroy. "She was very calm and laid back during the trip from the quarantine stables," said Ilke

Hildebrand, representing the Peter Schiergen stable. "She did lose some weight because of the long overseas journey, but she has a good appetite, so I'm not worried. Our trainer will be here to check on the horse later this afternoon, so he probably decide then whether our jockey will do any strong work with her [today]." The fairer sex will also be represented by GI Canadian International **Sarah Lynx (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and Arc runner-up **Shareta (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}).

**36 YEARS LATER**

One of the consequences of the shift in the population of top stallions over the last 20 years from 80-20 Kentucky versus Europe to 50-50 has been the development that the next great superstar was just as likely to appear in Europe as in America. In 1973, when Bold Ruler still ruled the roost, and Northern Dancer had his first crop of Maryland-sired 3-year-olds after four seasons in Canada, Secretariat became the first North American Triple Crown winner in 25 years, and made such an indelible impression on everybody who saw him that virtually every American who watched horse racing in 1973 declared him the best they'd ever seen. I think everybody still thinks he's the best we've ever seen--in America.

In 2009, Sea the Stars earned the accolade of America's Secretariat: "the best we've ever seen." Virtually every European who has seen horse racing in the last 20 years said the same thing--at least, until Frankel came along, but that's a different debate. Trained by John Oxx for the Tsui family of Hong Kong, Sea the Stars was beaten in his first race--he finished fourth in a seven-furlong maiden race at the Curragh in July of his 2-year-old year--but then was never beaten again. He won his remaining two starts at two in 2008, including the G2 Beresford S., but it was at three, when he went six-for-six, that he earned comparisons with Secretariat.

Sea the Stars made his first start at three in the G1 2000 Guineas over a mile at Newmarket. He went off at 8-1 behind the lukewarm 3-1 favorite Delegator (Dansili), with Coolmore first string Rip Van Winkle (Galileo) second favorite. Sea the Stars ranged up to them a furlong out under a hand ride by his jockey Mick Kinane, and literally won in a canter. A star was born. But he was still only second favorite to Coolmore's then-first string, the previously unbeaten Fame and Glory (Montjeu) in his next start, the G1 Epsom Derby. Sea the Stars beat Fame and Glory by 1 3/4 lengths, with Coolmore runners also finishing third, fourth, and fifth. **Cont. p6**

Trainer Oxx dropped Sea the Stars back to 10 furlongs for his next three starts, knocking off Coolmore's Rip Van Winkle, Mastercraftsman, and Fame and Glory again, in the G1 Eclipse, Juddmonte International, and Irish Champion S., respectively. He concluded his career with an imperious win in the 'Arc,' winning in hand despite having none too clear a trip early in the straight, and burying a field that included Conduit, Dar Re Mi, Fame and Glory, and Stacelita, and, of course, perennial Arc runner-up Youmzain. Plenty of professionals declared him the best horse they'd seen in Europe, certainly in 30 years, and probably ever. He was the Secretariat of Europe. His jockey, Mick Kinane, retired not long after Sea the Stars did; he knew he was never going to top that.

Secretariat's dam, the Princequillo mare, Somethingroyal, had previously produced Sir Gaylord, later the sire of Sir Ivor. Sea the Stars, the second superstar sired by Green Desert's son, Cape Cross (after the filly Ouija Board), is a younger half-brother to none other than the world's best sire, Galileo, out of the legendary Arc winner Urban Sea. So he doesn't just have a little bit of pedigree to go with his race record; he's a half-brother to the world's best sire.

Five weanlings from Sea the Stars' first crop were offered at last week's Goffs November Foal Sale, of which four were related to or out of stars bred or trained by Jim Bolger. A filly out of G1 English and Irish 1000 Guineas winner Finsceal Beo, and a half-sister to Classic-placed Cuis Ghaire, each made €800,000 (about \$1,080,000), and a half-brother to G1 Irish Derby winner Soldier of Fortune (bred by Bolger, but owned by Coolmore and trained by Aidan O'Brien) sold for €850,000 (about \$1,147,500). The leading first-season weanling sire at the Kentucky sales, Colonel John (Tiznow), had an average of \$105,000. Sea the Stars' average, for five sold so far, is €572,000 (about \$772,200). He has nine more scheduled to go through the ring (and maybe through the roof, too) at the Tattersalls' Foal Sale in Newmarket on Friday.

**DISTORTED HUMOR ON TOP**

For all his accomplishments and top-five placings, WinStar's Distorted Humor has never actually been North America's leading sire by progeny earnings in a calendar year. Drosselmeyer's timely win in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic was not only great news for WinStar, ace trainer Bill Mott, and bloodstock agent Tom Clark--who gladly relinquished his stand-in-New York plan--it means Distorted Humor is 1-20 to finally get his first North American leading sire by money title. None more deserving, either. **Cont. p7**

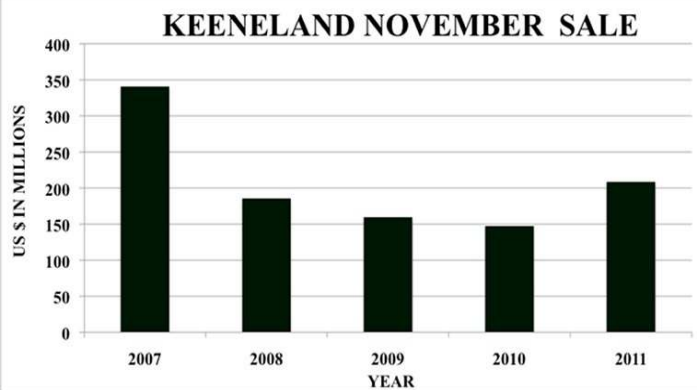

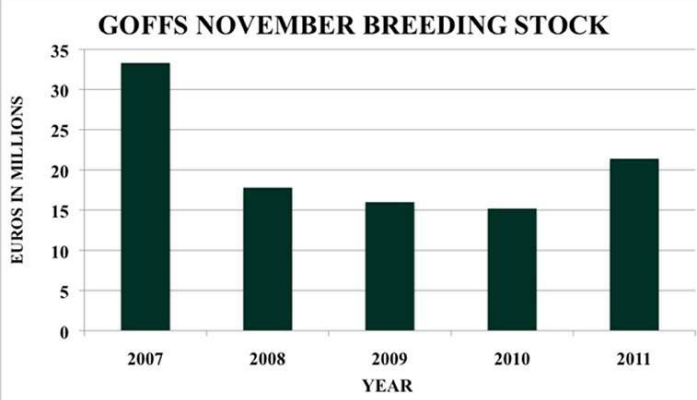

"The Evans and Palides dispersals at Keeneland and the appearance of the first Sea The Stars foals at Goffs pretty much guaranteed both sales would be significantly up on 2010 results; the gross at both sales was up 41%, in fact; the average at Keeneland was up 62%, and at Goffs 32%. The big thing those figures are masking are a big drop in the number catalogued and sold at Keeneland: down 13% in number sold with the dispersals included, down 20% (575 horses) not including them. The good news is that a big percentage of those came out of the back books, off the bottom."

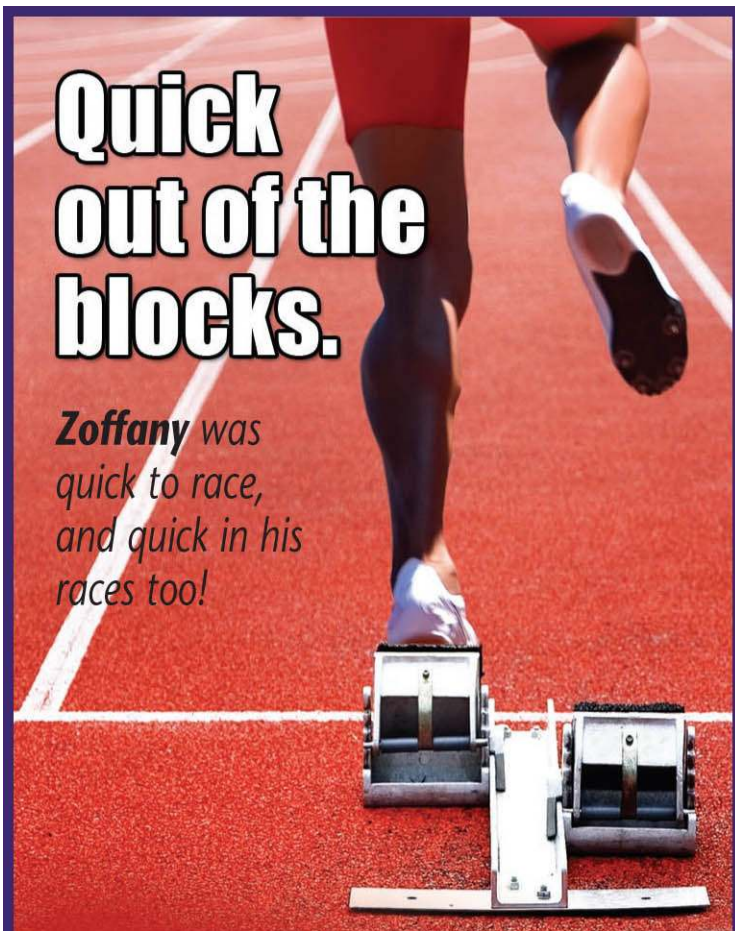

The *TDN* Year-to-Date General Sire List ([click here](#)) shows us that Coolmore's awesome duo of Sadler's Wells' sons, Galileo and Montjeu, are well ahead of third-place Distorted Humor in overall 2011 Northern Hemisphere earnings counted for this list (Japan not included, as their purses are about four times everybody else's). Galileo and Montjeu each has 16 group/graded stakes winners this year; Galileo has 10 Group 1/Grade I winners, Montjeu has eight; by comparison, Giant's Causeway, Oasis Dream, High Chaparral and (would you believe?) Mr. Greeley are tied for third, with three each. Interestingly, another European sire, Juddmont's Dansili, is actually the leading sire of 2011 black-type winners, with 23; Galileo has 21, Montjeu 20.

Of the European sires on the combined list, Dubawi is the third-ranking European sire by 2011 progeny earnings (16th overall, \$5.9 million), followed by Juddmonte's Dansili and Oasis Dream, and the deceased German sire, Lomitas, sire of this year's 'Arc' winner Danedream. Two-time champion sire Smart Strike ranks second among American stallions, with another two-time champion sire (2009-2010), Giant's Causeway, fourth in North America. Splitting that pair of two-time champions is Tapit, third in North America in 2011, and therefore a really good bet to be champion sire himself one day. Fifth in North America is Malibu Moon. Two more sires, like Tapit with just their first 5-year-olds, Medaglia d'Oro and Speightstown, come next (the fourth member of the F2006 Fearsome Foursome, Candy Ride--he'll get there soon); then leading 2011 third-crop sire Kitten's Joy; evergreen Stormy Atlantic; Empire Maker; and More Than Ready. Awesome Again, Dynaformer, and leading European third-crop sire Dubawi also all have 2011 earnings over \$5.9 million.

**BOB HOLTHUS DIES** Midwestern-based trainer Bob Holthus died of an apparent heart attack Tuesday morning at his home in Louisville, Kentucky. He was 77. A native of Nebraska, Holthus saddled his first winner in 1952 at Columbus Racetrack in the

Cornhusker State. Holthus built his reputation with runners in the claiming ranks before gradually getting better stock. His first major winner was Proper Reality, who captured the 1988 GI Arkansas Derby prior to finishing fourth at 27-1 in the "Run for the Roses." The colt bankrolled over \$1.7 million, and also captured the GI Metropolitan

H. in 1989. Holthus enjoyed great success at Oaklawn Park, taking the training title nine times, and also swept their series for 3-year-olds in 2006 with stable star Lawyer Ron. That chestnut colt had his conditioner in the headlines with his Kentucky Derby chances before finishing 12th on the first Saturday in May. Holthus also led the trainer standings in meets at Arlington Park, Detroit Race Course, Ellis Park, Hawthorne Race Course, Louisiana Downs, and Turfway Park. He tabbed 2008 GI American Oaks heroine and millionaire Pure Clan as the best filly he ever trained. *Daily Racing Form* credits Holthus with 2,824 wins from 19,674 starts, and over \$46 million in stable earnings. He is survived by his wife Bonnie, sons Paul and David, and daughter Debbie. A memorial service will be held Saturday at Christ Chapel on the Churchill Downs backside. "This is a very sad day for all members of the Churchill Downs and Kentucky Derby families as we have lost a revered figure and a true friend in Robert Holthus," said Kevin Flanery, president of Churchill Downs. "His talents as a horseman are easily appreciated by a look at wins and earnings that serve as the bottom line for a remarkable career, but Bob was also a true gentleman to everyone who crossed his path. He has meant so much to fellow horsemen, fans who have watched his horses compete here for more than a half-century and to members of our Churchill Downs team. Our hearts and prayers are with the Holthus family and Bob's many friends during this time of great loss."
