TOBA RELEASES 2012 GRADED STAKES

The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association's American Graded Stakes Committee has released its list of 2012 U.S. graded stakes. Of 659 stakes reviewed, 465 received graded status--nine fewer than in 2011. The most noteworthy changes include the upgrading of four races to Grade I: the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, Keeneland's Jenny Wiley S. and Parx Racing's Cotillion S. The same number of races were downgraded from Grade I to Grade II: Saratoga's Three Chimneys Hopeful S. and Ruffian H., Hollywood's Hollywood Turf Cup S. and Del Mar's Pat O'Brien S. **See p5 for all changes**

PERFECT SHIRL TO CONTEST PELLEGRINI

Charles Fipke's **Perfect Shirl** (Perfect Soul {Ire}), last-out winner of the G1 Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf at Churchill Downs Nov. 4, will likely make her next start in the G1 Gran Premio Internacional Carlos

Pellegrini at San Isidro Race Course in Buenos Aires Dec. 17. Trainer Roger Attfield confirmed by phone Thursday afternoon that preparations are underway for the homebred 4-year-old to make her way from Florida to Argentina and gave the filly's owner all the credit for coming up with the out-of-the-box idea.

"Mr. Fipke is looking forward to going there and we have put the wheels in motion," Attfield explained. "The original plan was to go to Hong Kong [for the G1 Hong Kong Vase Dec. 11], but we weren't able to do that. Then, the next thing I know, Mr. Fipke is suggesting the Pellegrini, so that's what we're going to do." The daughter of GISW Lady Shirl (That's a Nice) was shipped down to Payson Park in the days following her 27-1 upset on Breeders' Cup Friday and had her first breeze back Nov. 23, going five furlongs over the deep surface in 1:00 1/5, the fastest of four moves at the distance. "She had some time off [after the Breeders' Cup], but she's in good shape, and she worked really well the other day. It's going to be an adventure." Perfect Shirl must be EVA-tested on two occasions prior to the race, with a gap of 14 days between the two samples. One sample will be provided prior to her departure and one will be drawn while she is stabled at San Isidro. Tentative plans call for Perfect Shirl to be ridden by leading jockey Pablo Falero in the 2400-meter event, widely regarded as South America's most important race. *Additional reporting by Diego Mitagstein*

TATTS WRAPS SUCCESSFUL DECEMBER RUN

Stallion prospect **Tartan Bearer** (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}) headed trade as Tattersalls' 2011 December Sale finished in Newmarket last night. Turkish breeder Omar Aydin paid 50,000 guineas for the 2008 G1 Epsom Derby and G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. runner-up. The full-brother to 2001 G1 2000 Guineas winner Golan (Ire) also won the G2 Dante S. at York for his breeders Ballymacoll Stud and finished third in the G1 Irish Derby.

"I had no plans to buy him, but just watched him going through the ring," said Aydin. "I was amazed that such a horse could sell for that price, and it is sad that nobody in Britain or Ireland wants to stand him. It is a pity that such a good racehorse is selling for that price and commercial breeding is going to kill this industry. At least in Turkey, the Derby is the race everybody wants to win. He will cover mares in 2012 at the Jockey Club Stud, alongside the likes of Lion Heart and Victory Gallop, and I hope to get some partners in him. He is a great performer and a full-brother to a very good stallion; their sire Spectrum has done well in Turkey." **Cont. p2**

The other standout stallion prospect was G1 Prix de l'Abbaye winner **Total Gallery (Ire)** (Namid {GB}), who was bought by agent Ian Deane for 32,000gns to join Badal Stud Farm in India.

"He'll probably be the quickest stallion to stand in India and I just thought he was a lovely horse from a good family," said Deane.

The day's dearest female was the winning 3-year-old filly **Dead Cool (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}), a daughter of a Group

1-winning juvenile **Dead Certain (GB)** (Absalom), who went for 38,000gns to Mark Crossman, acting for Dream Ahead's owner Khalifa Dasmal. Mark McStay was underbidder on the filly.

"She's going to be covered by Dream Ahead at Ballylinch Stud next year but could stay in training after being covered," said Crossman. "She's from a very speedy family and out of a Group 1 winner."

December By the Numbers...

Turnover at the December Sale rose by around 16 million guineas to 71,747,900gns to the delight of Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony.

"From start to finish the 2011 Tattersalls sales season has outperformed expectation, and the December Sale has continued the momentum, bringing the year to a highly successful conclusion," he commented. "Last week's December Foal Sale produced returns bettered only twice this century and set the tone for the breeding stock this week. Total sale turnover in excess of 70 million guineas is the fourth highest ever for the December Sale, and the average and median have both also risen dramatically." VEITCH APPEALS DISMISSAL

John Veitch, who was dismissed from his duties as Kentucky's Chief Steward by the state's Public Protection Cabinet Monday, filed an appeal with the Kentucky Personnel Board Wednesday.

While Veitch's notice of termination stated that his services were no longer needed and that the "action is being taken without cause, therefore you do not have the right to appeal your dismissal to the Kentucky Personnel Board except as provided by the KRS 18A.095," Veitch's appeal argues that, because of his status as a "classified" employee rather than "unclassified," KRS 18A.095 does not apply. As a "classified" employee, Veitch argues, he should have been notified of the Cabinet's intent to dismiss him, and should have been provided with cause for his dismissal and the opportunity to be heard.

Veitch, 66, also cited age discrimination as reason for his determination, and noted that, regardless of his status as a "classified" or "unclassified" employee, he was entitled to appeal if he believed he was being discriminated against. Veitch's final reason for appeal stated that he was, "illegally terminated for asserting my statutory and constitutional rights to defend myself in an action brought against me by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission."

The Hall of Fame trainer had been battling charges by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission of violations of the state's racing regulations following the controversial non-scratch of Life At Ten (Malibu Moon) before the 2010 GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic at Churchill Downs.

ARC PRIZE MONEY BOOSTED

France Galop have announced that prize money for the country's flagship Arc meeting will be increased by €865,000 in 2012. In a move to counter the new threat of British Champions' Day, the French authority has made a special case of the two-day festival at Longchamp with forms part of a general 5% rise in prize money throughout the season. President Edouard de Rothschild revealed that the Qatar Racing and Equestrian Club had extended its sponsorship of the prestige weekend, with the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe purse rising from its current €4 million to €5.3 million by 2018. "This extension of Qatar's sponsorship is intended, in particular, to face up to the risk of competition from British Champions' Day at Ascot and strengthens significantly the prize-money of all Group races on Arc weekend," a France Galop statement read. It was also announced that with the support of Longines, the G1 Prix de Diane would be worth €1 million next year.

Since its inception nine years ago, The Castlebridge Consignment has become one of the leading consignors in Europe. Castlebridge sold the top-priced broodmare in Europe in both 2010 and 2008, topped the most recent edition of the Goffs Orby Sale with a €350,000 New Approach (Ire)--Posterity (Ire) filly, and most recently was the leading consignor of both the Foal and Mare portions of the Tattersalls December sale, with combined receipts of 5,460,500gns. **Cont. p7**

Castlebridge--the nom de course of Andrew Mead, Marion Goodbody and the husband-and-wife team of Tara and Bill Dwan--looks to keep things rolling at the Arqana Breeding Stock Sale, which kicks off tomorrow in Deauville at 11 a.m. local time.

Castlebridge's Arqana consignment has gotten some help on the racecourse over the past 12 months. Of the 10 horses it will offer, two are half-sisters to horses who won their first Group 1 races in 2011. And as Castlebridge's Andrew Mead commented this week, "There's nothing like a recent major update to help freshen a pedigree and give it current commercial appeal."

The 4-year-old **Extreme Green (GB)** (Motivator {GB}--Ventura {Ire}, by Spectrum {Ire}) sells Saturday as [lot 179](#), and is the beneficiary of an update secured not far from Arqana's sales grounds. The filly, offered as a horse in training, is a half-sister not only to SW & GSP Cedar Mountain (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), but to Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who in August won the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville. Moonlight Cloud also won the G3 Prix Imprudence and G3 Prix de la Porte Maillo in 2011 and has a record of five wins from seven starts.

Extreme Green raced twice for Augustin Stable's George Strawbridge, but was bought privately by one of Castlebridge's clients and is offered here by that client.

"Apart from the obvious attraction of being a half-sister to a Group 1 winner in Moonlight Cloud, the yearling half-sister by Manduro (Ger) was very attractive and made €400,000 at the Arqana August sale this year to Demi O'Byrne...the highest 2011 figure for a Manduro yearling by some considerable distance," said Mead. "It's a top-class family with G1 Epsom Derby winner Generous (Ire) prominent on the page. And the dam Ventura sold a few days ago at Tattersalls for 900,000 guineas to M.V. Magnier."

The Castlebridge Consignment also sells the 4-year-old **Main Spring (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}--Fairy Godmother {GB}, by Fairy King), who goes early tomorrow as [lot 26](#). Bred and raced by The Queen, Main Spring sold to Blandford Bloodstock for a modest 20,000gns last year at Tattersalls December. She figures to improve significantly after her exported half-brother My Kingdom of Fife (GB) (Kingambo) won the G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at Randwick in Australia in April and also ran second in the G1 Doomben Cup. Main Spring is also a half to the group horse Four Winds (GB) (Red Ransom).

"Again, it's not just being a half-sister to a Group 1 winner, it's also a top-class family with the outstanding Highclere (GB) as the third dam," said Mead, referencing the blue-hen descendent of Deep Impact (Jpn), Height of Fashion (Fr), Nashwan, et al.

Four on the Floor...

The Castlebridge Consignment was founded in the months following the 2001 Goffs Sales. Andrew Mead and Marion Goodbody, who together partnered in the bloodstock agency Mead Goodbody Ltd., were looking for someone to break a yearling they had purchased when Bill Dwan's name came up. Dwan had a sterling resume--he grew up in the National Hunt business before an eight-year run with Coolmore Stud, during which time he spent six breeding seasons in the Southern Hemisphere. Dwan also had the unique distinction of handling and managing Danehill while he stood in Japan. Dwan's wife Tara also boasted impressive credentials, being a daughter of, and assistant trainer to, Irish trainer Michael Cunningham, who saddled Cairn Rouge (Ire) to victory in the 1980 Irish 1000 Guineas.

All that alloyed well with Mead's and Goodbody's body of work. Mead learned the trade under such storied trainers as Barry Hills and the Australia-based Bart Cummings, and launched a 20-year career as a bloodstock agent with Richard Galpin before finally forming Mead-Goodbody. His eventual partner had broad experience in dressage, show jumping and eventing, and managed Tullamaine Castle Stud before switching to bloodstock work with Newmarket Bloodstock Agency, Tim Vigors and, finally, Mead-Goodbody.

With so much talent on hand, talk of simply breaking of a yearling soon turned to grander ruminations, namely Europe's dearth of top-flight consignors, and Castlebridge was born. The Dwans were initially the public face of Castlebridge as Mead and Goodbody continued their bloodstock work. But in 2007, the growth of Castlebridge necessitated their full-time attention, and Mead Goodbody Ltd. closed up shop.

A year later, Castlebridge sold the Group 2 runner **Princess Dansante (Ire)** (King's Best), a half-sister to the dam of Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), to John Ferguson for 1.7 million guineas (\$2,662,149). It was the top price paid for a broodmare in Europe in 2008. In 2009, Castlebridge sold the second-highest-priced yearling colt at Tattersalls October Book 1, a Galileo (Ire) full-sibling to Classic winner Nightime (Ire) who went to Sir Robert Ogden for 650,000gns (\$1,088,246). And last year, Castlebridge again sold the highest-priced broodmare in Europe when

David Redvers Bloodstock paid 1.3 million guineas (\$2,122,165) for **Diary (Ire)** (Green Desert), dam of G1SW Total Gallery (Ire) (Namid {GB}).

Impressive results, but it isn't just the priciest baubles that keep the Castlebridge team going. "It's always great to be selling top mares, but Bill and I get a lot of satisfaction from selling the lesser lights at prices that our clients are pleased with," said Mead.

Arqana and Elsewhere...

Today, Castlebridge has offices and/or farms in three countries: Ireland, England and France. The Dwans operate Castlebridge Stud in County Meath, Ireland, while Goodbody also has her own farm in Fethard, County Tipperary (Coolmore is her immediate neighbor). Mead and Goodbody also have an office and two farms (Castlebridge East) near Tattersalls in Newmarket, and roughly a decade ago, they purchased a house in Deauville that provides a perfect base for the Arqana sales.

From that base in 2010, Castlebridge sold the top-priced yearling through the ring at the Arqana August Yearling Sale, an Oasis Dream (GB)--Cap Coz (Ire) colt who went to Demi O'Byrne for €500,000. Mead has high praise for the French sale company.

"Arqana is a superb location with a very pro-active management team," he said when asked why Castlebridge liked to sell there. "Plus it's always good to have options where to sell your stock."

Of choosing which horses will make the trip, he added, "It's sometimes just a gut feeling as to what will work best at Arqana, coupled with our experience of selling here in the past. We managed to produce the top-priced yearling sold through the ring at the 2010 August sale, and our clearance rate for mares and fillies has always been excellent at Arqana."

With Arqana's December Sale on tap, Mead said he's waiting to draw conclusions on the state of the Thoroughbred market in Europe, but is finding plenty to consider. "The foals and mare sales at both Goffs and Tattersalls have been particularly interesting this year," he said. "The overall sale figures almost certainly don't tell the whole story, and I think we will sit down after Arqana and give some thought as to where the market is going."

For Castlebridge, at least, it appears the answer is...up.


40 RECOMMENDED 'VALUE' SIRES: KY, \$50K & UNDER

As I am well aware of by now, endorsing certain stallions as comprising 'relative value' is an exercise fraught with difficulties. Invariably many deserving sires are passed over, because you can't say you love them all, but I do want to emphasize again these are opinions, not statements of fact. It's a subjective process, and I readily admit other points of view are equally valid--which is why we always encourage people who feel a horse they like (or stand) and that they particularly believe in is left out, please email us what we call your Nomination From The Floor. Though we hope to base our recommendations on good, solid data, this is a subjective exercise and, as you well know also by now, 'we' are not infallible. So email, tweet, or post your objections and amendments, because discussion about the relative merits of stallions is always a good thing.

This week, I'd like to concentrate on Kentucky stallions standing for \$50,000 and under. Don't get me wrong, I think a lot of sires standing in Kentucky for more than \$50,000 are still good buys for who they are: Distorted Humor at \$100,000 and Smart Strike at \$85,000 are just two obvious examples. But you don't need me to tell you they're top sires--that's why they cost more than \$50,000 to breed to. They're all top sires, it's just a matter of whether, as a breeder, you're in that league. If so, then it's more a matter of narrowing down which of the top sires best suits the individual mare.

Only three of the 40 sires on this list stand for \$50,000, and they're all included for the same reason: given how good they all are, they should be standing for more. This has been the case for a couple of years with Adena Springs' **Awesome Again**, who--as if we needed reminding again--nearly had his fifth Breeders' Cup winner and second GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner (after Ghostzapper) when two-time 2011 Grade I winner Game On Dude held off all but Drosselmeyer in this year's Classic. Awesome Again himself won one of the best Breeders' Cup Classics ever in 1998. The other two \$50,000 sires would be on, if for no other reason, than they are members of the 'fearsome foursome' of North American sires with first foals 2006 (first 5-year-olds 2011) who all look headed straight to the top. Tapit is standing next year for \$125,000; Medaglia D'Oro is \$100,000; so, by comparison, Lane's End's **Candy Ride** and WinStar's **Speightstown** have to qualify as good value (okay, relatively speaking). Speightstown is up to the number six North American sire on the 2011 TDN General Sire List ([click here](#)), including 12 Black-Type Winners (hereafter abbreviated BTW) and seven graded/group stakes horses (GSH). Candy Ride has 14 BTW and nine GSH this year--not to mention three sons going to stud in Kentucky next year (to be discussed later).

There are a total of 15 sires on the list with first foals 2006 or earlier, so we can call them really 'proven sires.' After the three standing for \$50,000 just discussed, there are 12 others I thought deserve special mention, all standing for \$30,000 and under.

Claiborne's **Arch** (\$30,000) of course had Blame last year, but has been popular at around this level for a few years now, and has followings in both North America and Europe, which is unusual these days. Ashford's **Tale of the Cat** (\$30,000) was once champion sire of 2-year-olds and, besides still being good at that, (the injured GII Sanford S. winner Overdriven was arguably the best 2-year-old seen out this year), older horses like Tale of Ekati and Gio Ponti have kept his name to the fore the last few years. Both are now at stud in Kentucky. The first Kentucky crop by Three Chimneys' **Exchange Rate** (\$25,000) were 2-year-olds this year, and they rank him eighth on the North American Two-Year-Old Sire List (*Bloodhorse.com*), with 19 2-year-old winners, including four 2-year-old BTW. If there were such a thing as a first-Kentucky crop freshman sire list, he would rank number three, right on the heels of Hard Spun and Scat Daddy.

Lane's End's **City Zip** has now clawed his way up to a \$20,000 stud fee, the same as his previously more celebrated half-brother, Ghostzapper. Previously known himself as a sire of precocious 2-year-olds, now City Zip ranks 25th among North American sires on the TDN General Sire List, with the earners of more than \$5-million this year, including an impressive 22 black-type horses (BTH, won or placed in black-type races), including four graded stakes winners (GSW).

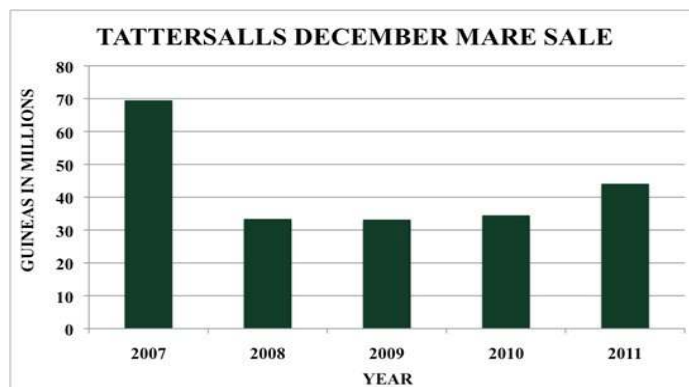
Taylor Made's **Northern Fleet** is another who has worked his way up the stud fee ladder, to \$15,000 for 2012. None more deserving: he now has six Grade I winners, his two this year, including impressive GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Amazombie. As well as being a perennial leading sire by winners and races won, he has also sired the 2005 champion 3-year-old and now successful sire, **Afleet Alex**. Also at \$15,000 are Walmac's **Successful Appeal**, never really a household name, but who sports a 2.21 APEX A Runner Index, and an impressive 2.62 ABC Index for 2-year-olds; and Claiborne's **Flatter**, who ranks 26th among North American sires this year with over \$5-million in progeny earnings, including 21 black-type horses. **Cont. p11**

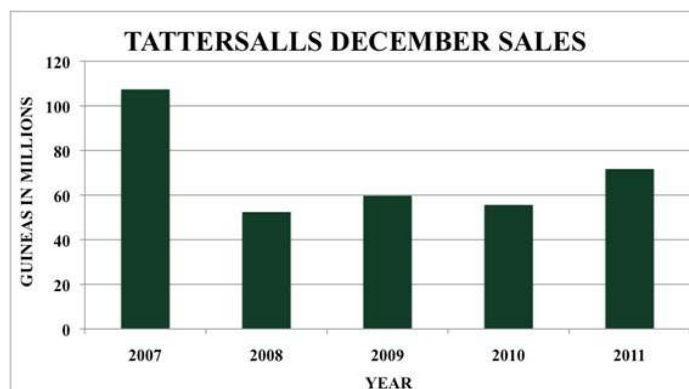

Airdrie's **Include** made a promising start with his first 2-year-olds in 2006 and got big books of better mares in 2007 and 2008. His 2008 crop now includes 15 black-type horses--he's proven he could 'stand the raise,' so offers plenty of appeal at \$12,500 for 2012. Lane's End's **Pleasantly Perfect** made over \$7.7-million on the racetrack, defeated **Medaglia D'Oro** in both the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and G1 Dubai World Cup, and has an A Runner Index of 2.72, so he looks great value at \$10,000. The gamble of the year has to be Gainesway's **Birdstone**, who drops back to \$10,000 for 2012. You remember Birdstone; a member of the dynamite F2006 sire crop featuring the Fearsome Foursome (and Pleasantly Perfect), Birdstone was number five on that list after he had two Classic winners in his first crop in 2009--GI Kentucky Derby winner Mine That Bird and GI Belmont S. winner Summer Bird. Birdstone's 2009 crop had 43 foals; there were 76 in his 2010 crop, and 87 in his 2011 crop (\$30,000 stud fee), though he did drop back to just 58 mares covered this year (\$20,000 stud fee), which is no doubt why they took him back to \$10,000. Having seen him in November, I'd call him just about the buy of the year at that price.

A couple of sires with four-figure fees shouldn't be overlooked either. I've long been a fan of Vinery's **Pure Prize** (\$7,500), who jumped into the top 10 on the 2-year-old sire list with four 2-year-old BTH in the last six weeks, including GIII Delta Princess S. winner Now I Know; and one who really could be overlooked is Claiborne's **Stroll**, a Grade I winner by Pulpit whose first three small crops registered an impressive 2.63 A Runner Index. He was leased to Italy for two years and came back in 2011. He's only \$5,000, and would have about the highest A Runner Index of any stallion standing for that price, certainly in Kentucky.

Young Sires with Runners

The sire crops with first foals 2007 (first 4-year-olds 2011) and 2008 (first 3-year-olds) are very much works in progress, and I'm not sure I have very strong convictions one way or the other about many of the contenders. Among those with their first 4-year-olds, there's no doubt Adena Springs' **Ghostzapper** at \$20,000 looks a reasonable buy. He's sired the winners of over \$4.9-million this year, including 18 black-type horses (BTH), of which 10 are graded/group stakes horses (GSH). When we did our August 1 APEX run, he had exactly a 2.50 ABC Runner Index, which ranked him third among more than 600 sires with 200+ year-starters 2005-2011, and which means exactly 20% of his runners were at least paying their way. In this world, that's a big number. Among sires with their first 3-year-olds, I thought the two horses which came over to WinStar from Pauls Mill are both fairly priced: **Bellamy Road** (\$20,000) ranks ninth among North American second-crop sires by progeny earnings, with seven black-type winners (BTW), three graded (GSW) this year; 2005 GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner **Artie Schiller** (\$10,000) is bidding to become the third successful sire son of El Prado, following F2006 **Medaglia D'Oro** and leading third-crop F2007 sire, Kitten's Joy. He has a very good 3-year-old colt, called Mr. Commons, who ran second against 'olders' in two Grade II races in California; and he had, by all accounts, a very impressive 2-year-old winner in California the other day, by the name of Blingo. These two at least seem to have real ability.

Backing freshman sires to still be around in 12 months' time is a road to ruin, but the top five North American sires on the 2011 *TDN* Freshman Sire List ([click here](#)) do merit a mention. Darley's **Hard Spun** (\$40,000) has worked his way to the top of the table, with 22 winners (3 BTW, 1 GSW) and the earners of just under \$1.4-million. Ashford's **Scat Daddy** (\$17,500) is less than \$100,000 behind, with 26 winners (3 BTW, 2 GSW), and the earners of just over \$1.3-million. These two have a big break (over \$500,000) over the next three living sires: Gainesway's **Corinthian** (\$17,500), who got a big thumbs-up from the legendary Alec Head when I ran across him out looking at the Gainesway stallions in November; the new Gainesway horse, **Hat Trick** (\$15,000), who moves over from Walmac having sired the horse I would say is Europe's top 2-year-old, the undefeated, French-trained Dabirsim; and Airdrie's **Flashy Bull** (\$10,000), sire of 15 winners (2 BTW, 1 GSW). **Lawyer Ron**, who stood at the now-defunct Kentucky Stonewall Farm, actually edges out Flashy Bull for fifth spot at the moment, but he died after siring just two crops.

The Unproven Brigade

While I would love to have a crystal ball and tell you all about how the freshman sire tables for 2012 are going to look a few months from now, I'm no better at that sort of speculation than the next guy; all we do know is that Lane's End's **Curlin** (now \$40,000), Three Chimneys' **Big Brown** (\$35,000), Ashford's **Henrythenavigator** (\$25,000), and Hill 'n' Dale's **Midnight Lute** (\$15,000) had the four highest yearling averages among North American sires with their first yearlings 2011 ([click here to see the Instatistics table](#)), and were the only four whose yearlings averaged over \$70,000. They all have the best shots. Among sires with their first foals 2011, in what was the lowest intake of new sires in years, the European superstar prospect **Sea The Stars** has had 13 weanlings from his first crop average \$531,258 at the European sales. The leading American sire with first weanlings 2011, WinStar's **Colonel John** (\$15,000), made a big impression among his contemporaries, too, though; 10 foals from his first crop averaged \$105,900, with a median of \$102,500. In a year when the first-year weanling sires did not make that much of an impression, he did.

The next two years have seen some really exciting sire prospects retired at what seem like reasonable and competitive fees. Among sires who retired in 2012, Lane's End's **Quality Road** (\$35,000) got a huge boost from the Evans Dispersal, with 48 mares in foal to him in the Kentucky sales averaging \$283,208 ([click here to see the Instatistics table](#)), which alone must enhance his chances of eventual sire success; we got a peek at him at Lane's End during the November sale, too; he's really filled out into a really impressive specimen now. Claiborne's **Blame** (\$35,000), the only horse ever to beat Zenyatta, had 10 in foal average \$229,000, and is clearly highly regarded by important breeders. The top two 3-year-olds of 2010, Ashford's two-time Champion **Lookin at Lucky** (\$30,000) and Taylor Made's impressive GII Fountain of Youth and GI Wood Memorial winner **Eskendereya** (\$25,000) have more traditional 'commercial' profiles; 19 mares in foal to Eskendereya averaged \$108,789; 12 in foal to Lookin at Lucky averaged \$95,142. Both look really good commercial prospects.

It's a deep sire crop, too, though. WinStar's **Summer Bird** (\$15,000), another to move over from Pauls Mill, was named champion 3-Year-Old male of 2009 after winning the GI Belmont, GI Travers, and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, the latter against older horses. And there are three stallions standing at \$10,000 and under who each have something significant to recommend them: Ashford's **Munnings** (\$10,000) won three Grade II races at seven furlongs, but also placed in six different Grade I's at six and seven furlongs, often compromised by wet tracks; Airdrie's **Majesticperfection** (\$8,500) ran a couple of boxcar Beyers, in the 110's, sprinting, in 2010, including when soundly defeating subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Big Drama in the GI Albert G. Vanderbilt S. at Saratoga; and there's a bit of word out for Hill 'n' Dale's **Concord Point** (\$7,500), by Tapit and inbred 4x4 to Seattle Slew. He was impressive winning a couple of graded stakes as a 3-year-old in 2010, but as he made only six lifetime starts he may be a little bit under the radar.

There is an impressive corps retiring in Kentucky for 2012, too, headed by Ashford's **Uncle Mo** (\$35,000), runaway champion 2-year-old male of 2011, and who did come back to run a tremendous Beyer 118 to win the GII Kelso in his final prep for the Breeders' Cup this year. There's no doubt, he's a really exciting prospect – he was arguably a superstar, so you have to say he's fairly priced, and he should be a big commercial hit, too. Spendthrift's **Tizway** (\$25,000) won the GI Met Mile and the GI Whitney H. this year; he's got a really strong case to be champion older male, and maybe even Horse of the Year. Castleton Lyons' **Gio Ponti** (\$20,000) was first or second in 22 of his 29 career starts, winning seven Grade I's and running second in another eight, including to Zenyatta in the 2009 GI Breeders' Cup Classic, and to Goldikova in the 2010 GI Breeders' Cup Mile; he earned over \$6-million. He's sure to have a big following; he certainly deserves to, anyhow. If you like Gio Ponti, you have to like Ashford's Galileo horse, **Cape Blanco** (\$17,500), too. He defeated Gio Ponti both times they met, in the GI Man O' War and the GI Arlington Million, and he's a certainty to be named North America's champion turf male this year after taking his American record to 3-for-3 with a gutsy win in the GI Joe Hirsch (Turf Classic).

So, you like **Candy Ride** (who doesn't) but can't get in, or can't afford to breed to him? Well, he has three Grade I-winning sons retiring to Kentucky next year. **Sidney's Candy** (\$15,000), a devastating frontrunner who won the GI Santa Anita Derby and four Grade II races among his seven wins, goes to WinStar; Lane's End gets **Twirling Candy** (\$15,000), winner of the GI Malibu and three Grade II's; and Hill 'n' Dale will stand **Misremembered** (\$7,500), winner of two Grade II's last year as a 3-year-old, and winner of the GI Santa Anita H. this year. Finally, Lane's End gets a really interesting \$10,000 prospect in **Courageous Cat**, a full-brother to After Market (by Storm Cat) but a turf miler himself; he won the GI Shoemaker Mile this year, and was been second to Goldikova in the 2009 GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita. **Bill Oppenheim** may be contacted at bopp@erb.com (please cc TDN management at suefinley@thoroughbreddailynews.com).
