'DELTA' STAYS WITH MOTT, EYES DUBAI

GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic heroine and likely champion 3-year-old filly **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) will remain with conditioner Bill Mott for a 2012 campaign, the Hall of Fame trainer confirmed Monday. The dark bay was purchased at Keeneland November by Ben Leon's Besilu Stable for \$8.5M out of the dispersal of the late Prince Saud bin Khaled's Palides Investments N.V., Inc. Mott had not had any contact with Leon until last week, at which point Royal Delta joined his Florida string at Payson Park.

"I speak for myself and my entire crew when I say that we're just really happy to have her back," said Mott. "We feel very, very fortunate to get another opportunity with her. She's been very good to us and we've kind of thought she was the queen all along and she proved it at the end of the year. We're excited to see where she takes us from here."

Mott mentioned the \$10-million G1 Dubai World Cup at Meydan Mar. 31 as a potential beginning of the year target for the **"TDN Rising Star"**.

"We're just in the very preliminary stages of planning her campaign," he said. "But we've got the World Cup as a possibility. That's something that we would definitely consider with her. It all hinges on how well she's doing at the time."

When asked about what went into the decision to point for Dubai, Mott, who took the inaugural running of the world's richest race in 1996 with Cigar, said, "It was something that was discussed [between myself and Mr. Leon], but it's something I've been thinking about all along...The World Cup would be a step up for her, but why not?"

Mott said that the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic would still be

Royal Delta's likely year-end goal, but maintained that all decisions were subject to change and that her condition would be the deciding factor.

"Those kinds are so hard to come by, so we're just very pleased to have her back," he concluded. "Anything better than what she's already done would be a big challenge, but we'll try."

STEADY GOING AT DEAUVILLE

Arqana's Breeding Stock Sale remains on course to slightly better its 2010 renewal after the auction's penultimate session concluded with marginal gains yesterday. Despite a fall in the cumulative median to €12,000 from €14,000, the average over the three days stands at €32,542, representing a 3% rise.

There were few moments of excitement on a generally low-key day, during which Paul Nataf paid €55,000 for hip 594, the 3-year-old filly **Land Star (Fr)** (Peintre Celebre) offered by trainer Jean-Marie Beguigne on behalf of owner Enrico Ciampi. Beaten just a short neck by the eventual G2 Prix Chaudenay heroine Shankardeh (Ire) (Azamou {Ire}) in a conditions event at Lyon-Parilly in April, she is a half-sister to the listed winner Law of Chance (GB) (Pennekamp) and to the dam of this year's G3 Prix de Conde winner Loi (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}). She also descends from Luvia (Ire), under whose auspices are the 2004 G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner Ask For the Moon (Fr) (Dr Fong), dam of Ballydoyle's group-placed juvenile Astrology (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

"She has been sold to dissolve a partnership between Enrico Ciampi, Salah Mosbah Al Mabruk and Ecurie Eclipse," Nataf explained. "I have bought her for Mr. Ciampi, who held a majority share beforehand and wanted to keep her. We hope Loi will run in the Epsom Derby next year, so we were keen to keep her and she will return to Jean-Marie Beguigne now." **Cont. p2**

Earlier, Anthony Stroud was the name on the docket for **Hail Holy Queen (Ire)** (Highest Honor {Fr}). Consigned by trainer John Hammond as hip **560**, the 3-year-old filly is out of Gabare (Fr) (Galileo {Ire}), a half to Roi Gironde (Ire), and cost €50,000. Stroud, who was bidding via the telephone with help from Arqana's Freddie Powell, commented, "She is a very nice filly who was highly recommended by John Hammond and is for a North Tipperary-based farmer. She will go back into training with John."

Crispin de Moubray purchased Haras de Meautry's hip **708**, the 6-year-old mare **Perruche Grise (Fr)** (Mark of Esteem {Ire}), for €40,000. In foal to the 2009 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains hero and Haras de la Hetraie resident Silver Frost (Ire), she is a half-sister to the 2005 G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano winner Pinson (Ire) (Halling) and her page includes the Pattern-race performers Welcome Millenium (Fr) (Kendor {Fr}), Verba (Fr) (Anabaa) and Ximb (Fr) (Septieme Ciel).

"She is a magnificent mare by an excellent broodmare sire whose mares are hard to acquire," de Moubray commented. "She is the sixth purchase for the Cheval Invest syndicate so far at this sale and her page is very current. She is set for Haras d'Ommel, where she will foal."

Of the foals on offer, the most sought-after proved to be Haras du Logis St Germain's hip **575**, a son of Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), who was snapped up by Bertrand le Metayer on behalf of BBA Ireland for €28,000. He is out of Hot Coal (Red Ransom), a half-sister to the graded-stakes placed Black Question (Seattle Song) and also to the dam of multiple group winner High Rock (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}).

"He is a very good mover and should be reoffered as a yearling," Le Mettayer said.

Snow Fairy to Race on...

Cristina Patino's **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab) will remain in training as a 5-year-old, trainer Ed Dunlop announced yesterday. Snow Fairy was ruled out of Sunday's G1 Hong Kong Vase with a near-fore injury suffered at Sha Tin last week and the 5-time Group 1 winner is back in Newmarket. "My veterinary surgeon Mike Shepherd examined her this morning and a decision has been made by me and Mrs. Patino that she will not be retired," Dunlop said. "The injury she sustained in Hong Kong will require a fair amount of time to heal, but Mrs. Patino has sportingly decided that she is prepared to give her every chance to return to the racecourse next year."

30 Pre-entered for Pellegrini...

Charles Fipke's GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf winner **Perfect Shirl** (Perfect Soul {Ire}) was among the 30 horses pre-entered for the Dec. 17 G1 Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini. Also among the pre-entries are the 2011 and 2010 winners of the G1 Gran Premio Nacional, **Lange (Arg)** (Aptitude) and **Expressive Halo (Arg)** (Halo Sunshine), as well as Group 1 winners **Aristocity (Arg)** (City West {Arg}), **Calidoscopio (Arg)** (Luhuk), **Es Richard (Arg)** (Espaciado {Arg}), **Jumbalaya (Arg)** (Pure Prize) and **Star Runner (Arg)** (Southern Halo). Seven international runners have been pre-entered from Brazil, Peru and the United States. The Pellegrini card also features the G1 Gran Premio Joaquin S. de Anchorena, G1 Gran Premio Felix de Alzaga Unzue, and G1 Gran Premio Copa de Plata.

SOUTH AFRICAN RESULTS

IGUGU ROMPS IN RETURN

Reigning South African Horse of the Year **Igugu (Aus)** (Galileo {Ire}) made a scintillating 4-year-old debut at Turffontein racecourse on Sunday. The filly was sent off the prohibitive 1-7 favorite in the one-mile G2 Ipi Tombe Challenge and never looked like letting her legions of fans down. She was making her first start since winning the July 2 G1 Vodacom Durban July.

Igugu was given a confident ride by regular partner Anthony Delpech, who has piloted the champion in her last seven starts. The filly jumped out well, and was sent to the front straight away. She maintained her lead throughout, and Delpech sent her for home with 400 metres left to run. Igugu simply drew further and further away from her mismatched foes (she was rated eight pounds superior to her nearest rival) to win the event by 5 1/4 lengths, despite being given just a hands and heels ride. **Queen's Bay (SAf)** (Fort Wood) was back in second place, and it was another 1 1/2 lengths to third-placed **Checcetti (SAf)** (Kahal {GB}).

A R1-million (US\$125,473) buy at the 2009 Emperors Palace Ready To Run Sales, Igugu has now earned in excess of R4-million in prize money for Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum and Andre and Joyce Macdonald. She was bred by the Kia Ora Stud and was pinhooked by Summerhill for A\$65,000 at the Inglis Premier Sale of 2009.

Igugu is now likely to run in the Jan. 7 G1 TBA Paddock S., before a crack at Cape Town's greatest race, the Jan. 28 G1 J&B Met.

VAL DE RA WINS AGAIN

Val de Ra (SAf) (Var), last season's champion sprinter, made it 10 wins from 11 starts when running away with Saturday's G2 Tony Taberer Southern Cross S. at Kenilworth. It was a fitting win, as the filly is owned and bred by the raceday sponsors, Avontuur Estate, one of the Cape's top wine farms and home to her sire, 2004 G1 Prix de l' Abbaye winner Var (Forest Wildcat).

The lightning-fast chestnut, trained by Kwa-Zulu Natal-based trainer Dennis Drier, and making her first start in six months, showed her class with a stylish two-length win over **State Blue (SAf)** (National Assembly) and Group 1 winner **Covenant (SAf)** (Western Winter).

Unbeaten over 1000 metres, Val de Ra received a round of applause from the crowd as she made her way into the winner's enclosure. She is widely regarded as one of the best sprinters seen in South Africa for many a year. Val de Ra will now likely go for the G1 Cape Flying Championship.

TDN **Q&A**

Last week, Craig and Holly Bandoroff, who operate Denali Stud in Kentucky, entered into a strategic alliance with Vivien Malloy's Edition Farm, a two-time New York breeder of the year, in an attempt to give their client base an opportunity to take advantage of the new purse structure and breeding incentives in the state of New York. *TDN's* Christina Bossinakis recently caught up with Craig Bandoroff to get further insight into the new venture and to get Bandoroff's thoughts on the Thoroughbred market in the Empire State.

Q: How has the market changed in New York over the last couple of years to spark people's interest in that area?

A: We have been the leading consignor at the [Fasig-Tipton sale for New York-breds] in Saratoga for the last four years, and every year really, we are at or near the top, so the New York market has been a very good one for us. In 2009 and 2010, [New York-breds] weren't bringing a premium, just like the rest of the market wasn't bringing a premium. The New York program and the promise of getting the money from the Aqueduct casino was still a promise to the point where people were wondering if it was ever really going to happen. And this year, when it was signed, sealed and delivered, the facility was under construction and everybody knew it was coming, the sale was one of the best ones we went to all year. There has been a real premium paid for New York-breds. So I think everybody, whether they are breeding to sell as commercial breeders or breeding to race, it's hard to ignore the money those New York-breds are going to be running for. **Cont. p6**

Bandoroff Q&A cont.

Q: Do you think the local breeding industry is capable of supporting the upswing in purses and incentives in New York?

A: From my experience, there is room for a quality operation. The availability of top-class operations are limited, and the ones that are there are full.

Q: Will you be sending anybody up from Denali or is it going to be completely staffed by people already at Edition? Is there any other Denali service you will be putting in place at Edition to ensure it maintains similar type and quality care to what is already in place in Kentucky?

A: The staff and management team at Edition Farm are excellent. I've worked with them for many years. We will be visiting periodically on a regular basis, once we determine what that needs to be. The primary service we will be providing is mare care and breeding. Once weaned, the foals will return to Kentucky, to Denali or the owner's farm. We don't plan to raise the babies [at Edition], which simplifies the management issues tremendously.

Q: How does this new partnership complement the Kentucky-based Denali Stud?

A: All of us in Kentucky are playing defense. The business has been contracting and the number of broodmares bred have been reduced, so many people have decided to take advantage of these lucrative breeders' programs.

Basically, we have all had to look for alternative sources. For me, it was a very natural move, because I am very familiar with the lay of the land [in New York]. I also have good relationships with some quality farms in New York, including Edition, so it made sense. The reason I really decided to give this a try was, number one, I really know the area and Mrs. Malloy's farm very well; and number two, this initiative can really appeal to a lot of people who want to race, too. Racing in New York is still one of the main centers in racing and, I think it will move closer to the fore when the purses start to go up after the first of the year.

Q: What kind of value do you think New York-breds offer those interested in both breeding and racing?

A: Commercially, we have seen the value of New York-breds have increased in the last year dramatically, so if someone has a commercial operation with a commercial slant to what they are doing, it's something they should strongly consider. And I am not saying this from the perspective of someone with a big operation in Kentucky. New York-breds are a valuable commodity at this point. For people who are racing, or have that as their primary objective, not only are the open purses going to be substantial, but the state-bred purses are also very significant, but the only difference is that the company isn't as tough as the open company.

Q: What is your impression of the current group of stallions standing in New York?

A: [The stallion roster] has definitely improved from a couple of years ago, and I think you will just see it get better. Commerce follows money; and once that moneys shows up, stallions, mares and infrastructure are going to follow.

Q: What message do you think this sends to other markets?


A: A significant message here is for the politicians in Kentucky to get their act together. Somebody once said to me that they weren't going to do anything about [the recession] until the time comes. And, the fact is, the time is here.

Q: If things were to surpass your expectations in this new partnership with Edition, would you consider expanding your own resources in New York?

A: We'll cross that bridge when we get to it. For the moment, this is another avenue available to us. It's just like the Denali operation in Kentucky; Denali in Kentucky is not all things to all people. It's for people that are looking for a certain level of service and expertise, and are willing to pay for it. I think our New York venture is going to be modeled the same way.

Q: What do think the New York market will look like five years down the road?

A: I expect it will look drastically different than it does right now. I think you'll see a higher level of everything, closer to what I like to call the Kentucky standard--a higher level of horsemanship, facilities and professionals. I'm not trying in any way to demean what is going on in New York right now, but as the demand increases and the quality improves, then everything else will follow.

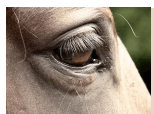

The *Thoroughbred Times*' stallion directory lists 20 stallions standing the 2012 season in Kentucky at fees ranging from \$50,000 to \$150,000. One revealing aspect of this list is how many of them have worked their way up the ladder, to highlight that there is often value to be had among the unproven stallions.

Although Street Cry will be standing at \$150,000 for the fourth consecutive year, he spent his first four years at \$30,000. Of his racing age offspring, only his current crops of 2- and 3-year-olds were conceived at higher prices (\$100,000 and \$50,000, respectively).

As the veteran Dynaformer is heading for his seventh year as a six-figure stallion, it is easy to forget that he spent his early years at a mere \$5,000.

Tapit's rapid rise through the ranks means that his 2012 fee will be \$125,000, even though all his racing-age offspring, from his first four crops, were sired at fees no higher than \$15,000. It has been a similar, but less extreme story with Medaglia d'Oro. He started out at \$35,000 in 2005 and owes his current reputation to four crops sired at fees no higher than \$40,000.

Although Distorted Humor has long commanded a six-figure fee, he was available for \$12,500 or less during his first four years.

Malibu Moon's story almost qualifies for the rags-to-riches description. Four seasons in Maryland at only \$3,000 laid the foundation for a career in Kentucky which has seen his fee rise from \$10,000 to \$70,000. **Cont. p9**

Smart Strike was a \$30,000 stallion in his early years, as was Unbridled's Song in his first two seasons, and breeders needed no more than \$10,000 to access Indian Charlie in his first five years. More Than Ready was priced at between \$25,000 and \$15,000 in his early years.

Candy Ride has only just joined this elite group, having established his reputation with four crops sired at fees no higher than \$12,500. War Front has taken this one step further, with two crops sired at \$12,500 helping to boost his fee to \$60,000.

And the in-form Tiznow spent his first four seasons at \$30,000 and was available for \$25,000 as recently as 2007. He will be spending his fourth consecutive season at \$75,000 in 2012, but his reputation has been built entirely with progeny sired at fees between \$25,000 and \$35,000.

Of course, the difficult part for a mare owner is to establish which of the unproven young stallions are going to exceed expectations.

Several different scenarios lead to future high-class stallions being affordable in their early years. For example, he may have been injured before he was able to fulfill the potential of his illustrious bloodlines, as was Malibu Moon after only two starts. Or he could be a top-class performer whose pedigree was a little foreign, such as Street Cry.

Distorted Humor was a good, solid performer with a fashionable enough pedigree, but he lacked that all-important Grade I victory on his C.V., as did War Front. More Than Ready was no doubt categorized as just a sprinter, despite his bold showing in the Kentucky Derby.

Then there are the horses who left no questions to be answered about their class on the racetrack, but whose pedigrees were less than fashionable. Candy Ride may have set a track record in defeating Medaglia d'Oro by more than three lengths in the GI Pacific Classic, but he carried the stigma of having been bred in Argentina, as well as being a son of a horse who failed to win at graded level in the U.S. That hasn't stopped him siring six Grade I winners in his first two crops. Two of those Grade I winners, Sidney's Candy and Twirling Candy, make their debut at fees of \$15,000 next February.

Tiznow was another whose sire hadn't quite managed a graded victory. Having Cee's Tizzy as his sire and Seattle Song as his broodmare sire no doubt raised some doubts in the minds of the numerous mare owners who would otherwise have jumped at the chance to use a dual winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. *Cont. p10*

By his fourth season Tiznow's book was down to 76 mares, for 52 foals, but he has since answered the doubters to such an extent that he has covered more than 130 mares in each of his first three seasons at \$75,000. He has been in fine form

this year, with the GI Carter H. winner Morning Line and the GI Metropolitan and GI Whitney H. winner Tizway boosting his total of Grade I winners to eight. Their predecessors include winners of the G1 Dubai World Cup (Well Armed), GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (Folklore), GI Santa Anita Derby and GI Travers S. (Colonel John) and GI Belmont S. (Da' Tara).

He has five sons at stud in Kentucky, now that Tizway and American Lion have respectively retired to Spendthrift and Darby Dan, to join Tiz Wonderful, Colonel John and Tizdejavu.

Tiznow has been in fine form in recent weeks. After Lovely Lil and Gemologist provided him with a Grade II double on the last weekend of November, another Grade II success came his way via Ellafitz in the GI Bayakoa H. two days ago.

Gemologist is arguably the most interesting of these, as his victory in the GI Kentucky Jockey Club S. was his third from three starts. He now appears well qualified to attempt to follow in the footsteps of Super Saver, winner of this Grade II event for WinStar Farm in 2009.

Tiznow is himself inbred to Northern Dancer, but his two lines are back in the fifth generation of his progeny's pedigrees, so it is hardly surprising that many of his black-type performers have a third or fourth line. Gemologist is inbred 5x5x3, as his second dam is Northern Dancer's smart daughter Sulemeif, a Grade III winner over a mile.

At least as relevant is the fact that Gemologist's dam Crystal Shard is a daughter of Mr. Prospector. Tiznow has only 13 foals out of Mr. Prospector mares, but Gemologist follows Tizaqueena as the second Grade II winner among them. Crystal Shard is herself one of 73 foals sired by Mr. Prospector from daughters of Northern Dancer. No fewer than 15 of the 73 became black-type winners-- 21%--and among them were four Grade I winners, headed by the Breeders' Cup winners Eillo and Rhythm and the outstanding European filly Ravinella. Another of the 15 was Crystal Shard's tough sister Withallprobability, winner of Grade II races over seven furlongs and 1 1/8 miles.

No wonder Crystal Shard cost \$400,000 as a yearling, but her price had fallen to only \$23,000 by the time she was offered in foal to Colonel John at Keeneland's 2010 November Sales. The foal she was carrying--a three-parts-brother to Gemologist--sold for \$170,000 after Gemologist had won his first two starts.

Gemologist's third dam, the speedy Barely Even, had the proud record of 17 wins from 30 starts. She was good enough to finish second in the Kentucky Oaks, so Gemologist is certainly bred well enough to be a factor in next year's Kentucky Derby.

Among agents, partnerships and nurseries that frequent the sales' scene are BC Thoroughbreds, Star

Thoroughbreds, Mayfair Speculators, Coolmore and Vinery Australia and John Messara's Arrowfield Stud.

This year promises to be no exception. Subsequently named Laughing Lad (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) that yearling also underscored the Gold Coast dominance of another individual, Arrowfield's Redoute's Choice. The flashy son of champion sire Danehill set the leader board ablaze during the latest installment of the Gold Coast Yearling sale when his youngsters filled four of the top five spots.

Quality, Not Quantity...

John Singleton, who built his empire in Australia's advertising sector in the 1970s and 1980s before developing diverse investment interests in radio broadcasting and publishing, launched a Thoroughbred breeding and racing operation in the 1990's. Since that time, his success, both on the racecourse and in the breeding shed, might have led many to believe that his operation numbers several hundred. In fact, Singleton's Strawberry Hill Stud has played at the highest level in both spheres with a broodmare band numbering approximately 25 head, with an additional 25-30 horses in training. Underscoring its focus on quality, the operation has achieved unprecedented success at the Gold Coast yearling sale. It began in 2001 when the stud sold a daughter of Sunday Silence out of Joie Denise (Aus) (Danehill)--who was bred in partnership with Arrowfield--to Gai Waterhouse for A\$1-million. Strawberry Hill followed up with subsequent leaders in 2003 (colt, Sunday Silence--Engraver, by Miner's Mark; A\$900,000); 2005 (colt, Danehill--Silken Whisper, by Diesis {GB}; A\$950,000); 2007 (colt, Sadler's Wells--Sunday Joy; A\$2-million); 2010 (colt, Redoute's Choice--They Say, by Thirty Six Red; A\$925,000). Singleton's latest Gold Coast topper--a colt out of G1SW Sunday Joy--realized a A\$1.15-million final bid from trainer Peter Moody last year. **Cont. p12**

This January, Strawberry Hill Stud offers a small but select group of nine yearlings--eight colts and a single filly. Prepared by stud manager Bridie Sparkes, the consignment is headed by [Lot 36](#), a colt by Redoute's Choice out of I Got Chills (Aus) (General Nediym {Aus}).

"He is by a very fast horse and a leading sire, so he should do well," offered Strawberry Hill Stud's racing manager Duncan Grimley. "He is a lovely type of horse."

"Redoute's Choice can produce a powerful horse, or you can get a tall, long horse that will need a little more time to grow into himself," he added. "Redoute's Choice himself was a very good 2-year-old, and probably was

unlucky not to have won the Golden Slipper. But, he can give you a horse that will turn into a good 3-year-old if you give him the time."

Offered later in the sale, [Lot 571](#)--a bay colt by More Than Ready--is expected to keep the buyers in their seats. The Aug. 21 colt is the first foal out of Deedra (Zabeel {NZ}), who is a daughter of Singleton's blue hen mare Joie Denise, dam of the operation's first Magic Millions topper. The 7-year-old Deedra is a half-sister to champion Tuesday Joy (NZ) (Carnegie {Ire}) and Group 1 heroine Sunday Joy, who was responsible for the first seven-figure sale for the operation in 2001.

"He is out of a Zabeel mare who was best over 10 furlongs, so he might need a little more time, but he is a lovely type of colt," Grimley said.

Another yearling by the Vinery stallion is [Lot 342](#). The sole filly in the consignment, the bay is the first foal out of Sugar Babe (NZ) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), winner of 1200-meter G3 McNeil S. at two.

Also likely to generate some buzz is [Lot 394](#), a colt by More Than Ready out of Universal Queen (NZ) (Scenic {Ire}), winner of the G1 SAJC Robert Sangster S. The Oct. 11 colt is the third foal out of a full-sister to Australian champion sophomore and G1 Australian Derby hero Universal Prince (Aus) (Scenic {Ire}).

"He is a precocious type of horse that you'd expect to be a good sprinter, more so than a miler," said Grimley.

Receiving a timely boost to his page is [Lot 132](#), a colt by Exceed and Excel out of listed winner Mirror Mirror (Aus) (Dehere). The second foal out of the 2006 Magic Millions 2YO Classic winner, the bay is a half-sibling to No Looking Back (Aus) (Redoute's Choice), the highest-priced yearling filly at the Gold Coast yearling sale in 2011. Purchased by trainer Gai Waterhouse for A\$500,000 from the Strawberry Hill Stud consignment last January, the filly broke her maiden impressively in a Warwick Farm juvenile test Nov. 19.

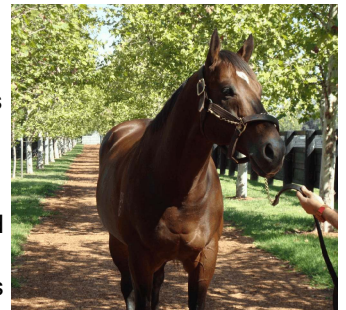

No Doubt Who's King...

Retired to stud in 2000, four-time Group 1 winner Redoute's Choice earned champion freshman sire billing in 2004, was Australian champion juvenile sire in earnings in 2005, and led the overall Australian sire rankings and the juvenile division in 2006. The flashy chestnut, who was back atop the leader board in 2010 with his second Australian title, is responsible for nine millionaires, 77 stakes winners and 59 seven-figure yearlings. Listed among his 20 Group 1 winners are Snitzel (Aus), Stratum (Aus), King's Rose (NZ), Melito (Aus), Dariana (Aus), Absolutely (Aus) and Allez Wonder (Aus), in addition to champions Fashion's Afield (Aus), Miss Finland (Aus) and Samantha Miss (Aus).

Arrowfield's marquee stallion, who has led all sires at the Gold Coast sale by average every year since 2006, had 13 yearlings realize a gross of A\$5,005,000 and an average of A\$385,000 during the 2011 renewal. In 2012, the 15-year-old stallion will have a slightly reduced selection of yearlings in the sales arena, with only 88 live foals produced in the current crop. **Cont. p13**

“He had a little bit of a setback just at the beginning of the season, so his numbers were down,” explained Jon Freyer, Arrowfield’s bloodstock manager. “It did have an impact on his foal crop. Normally, his figures would be in the region of 150-159, so it’s an exclusive bunch of horses this year.”

A total of 17 yearlings by the sire have been catalogued for the 2012 renewal of the Gold Coast sale, including only a pair of fillies --[Lot 409](#), out of Vormista (Aus) (Testa Rossa {Aus}) and [Lot 776](#), out of Street ‘Em Sheila (Street Cry {Ire}).

“There will obviously be less of them, and he’s had a great 12 months on the racetrack,” added Freyer. “I think it’s a supply and demand situation. They will be as well sought after as they usually

are, but because there are less of them around, it’s probably going to help those sellers that have one and, especially the people that have a very nice one. By virtue of that fact, I’ll think they will sell very well again.”

Listed among the 27-yearling consignment offered by Arrowfield is [Lot 35](#), the initial offering by the Scone operation’s top stallion slated to go through the ring and the sole member of the Arrowfield roster. The colt is out of the unraced Hustle Bustle (Aus) (Catrail), dam of Group 2 winner Hurried Choice (Aus) (Choisir {Aus}).

One of the most sought-after stallions in Australasia, Redoute’s Choice also ranks among the most commercial stallions standing in the region. As the stallion’s worldwide supporters continue to grow in number, Freyer thinks it won’t be long before the stallion’s influence is felt in America.

“There was a lot of interest in Redoute’s Choice while I was in America [for Keeneland November],” Freyer explained. “From only about eight or 10 foals that have run in Europe, he’s had several group performers over there, so I could see there is a chance for a horse like him to have some offspring in the U.S. in the next few years.”

From a total of 130-140 mares bred to him annually, Redoute’s Choice covered approximately 20 mares on Northern Hemisphere time last season.

“There is always European interest in breeding to him on Northern Hemisphere time, but I think from the interest I saw in America, I think it’s a possibility that some people [in North America] might follow suit. There is certainly the demand for it.”

Despite the diminished representation by Arrowfield’s kingpin, Freyer feels the operation will be well represented at Magic Millions come January.

“It is quite an even draft, rather than having any real standouts,” he offered. “We have a good draft of horses from Starcraft (NZ) (Soviet Star). I’m sure they will be popular, because he’s had a very good season so far. His oldest are only four, and he’s had a very good 3-year-old. They’ll be well-received.”

Another Arrowfield resident that Freyer expects to have some support on the Gold Coast is 2005 G1 Galaxy S. winner Charge Forward (Aus) (Red Ransom), also runner-up in the G1 Golden Slipper.

“We have a couple of nice ones by Charge Forward,” confirmed Freyer. “He’s also had a good year--we have a nice 4-year-old colt by him called [Group 2 winner] Shrapnel (Aus).”

Among offerings by the stallion is [Lot 256](#), out of Rezyana (Aus), by Redoute’s Choice. The family enjoyed a timely update when the Kneeling (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) took the Listed MRC William Crockett S. The 3-year-old filly is out of Sunday Service (Aus) (Sunday Silence), who is a half-sister to Rezyana.

FLYING ZEE DISPERSAL HIGHLIGHTS F-T DEC

Fasig-Tipton's one-day Midlantic December Mixed Sale took place in Timonium, MD Monday, and was highlighted by the final phase of the dispersal of the late Carl Lizza's Flying Zee Stables. Handled by Hidden Brook, the dispersal was responsible for the top two lots and six of the top 10. Leading the way was [hip 312](#), the 10-year-old SW and GSP mare Salty Romance (Salt Lake), who trainer Carlos Martin, agent for Blue Devil Racing, scooped up for \$260,000. Salty Romance is responsible for Flying Zee's undefeated 2-year-old filly Agave Kiss (Lion Heart), and was offered in foal to Cosmonaut on a May 6 cover. Also out of the Flying Zee dispersal, and the only other offering to exceed the \$100,000 mark, was [hip 328](#), a weanling colt by Hard Spun. Dundrum Farm secured the May 6 foal with a winning bid of \$205,000. A total of 258 head brought a gross of \$3,736,000. The average of \$14,483 represented a sharp increase from last year's figure of \$6,127. For complete results, visit fasigtipton.com.

JUDGE REJECTS SUFFOLK OTB BANKRUPTCY FILING

U.S. Bankruptcy Court Chief Judge Carla Craig ruled that Suffolk Off-Track-Betting's bankruptcy filing was void because the corporation did not obtain state authorization. Suffolk OTB--a public benefit corporation, filed for bankruptcy in March, two days after the Suffolk County legislature voted to authorize the filing. In May, Churchill Downs Inc., one of Suffolk OTB's creditors, argued the organization needed state approval for its bankruptcy petition and, on Friday, Craig agreed. Craig stated that the State of New York, and not the Suffolk County Legislature, needed to authorize the petition. In her ruling, Craig wrote, "Suffolk County does not maintain unfettered control over Suffolk OTB," and that "The [New York State] Racing and Wagering Board must approve each corporation's plan of operation (including contracts for audio-visual broadcasts of races) and betting programs, among other things." The judge also rejected Suffolk OTB's argument that Churchill was not authorized to file its objection. Attorneys for Suffolk OTB filed a motion requesting a stay of the dismissal order while the corporation prepares an appeal of Craig's decision.

Eclipse award-winning jockey Jorge Chavez will be out at least five months following a nasty spill Sunday at Aqueduct. According to agent David Grace, Chavez fractured his left clavicle, five ribs and both his L1 and L2 vertebrae when his mount Silver Mast (Mizzen Mast) fell turning for home in the day's ninth race. "He's doing ok," said David Grace. "They kept him overnight, he was in good spirits." Silver Mast did not appear to be injured in the incident. Chavez, a 50-year-old native of Peru, won an Eclipse Award in 1999 as the nation's outstanding jockey. His record on the NYRA circuit in 2011 is 22-25-38 from 297 starts.

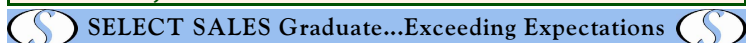
