DUNADEN DOUBLES UP IN VASE

Twice had the G1 Melbourne Cup winner come to Hong Kong for the G1 Vase, but neither Rogan Josh (Aus) in 1999 nor Americain last year could complete the double despite going off the favorite. But this year's Melbourne hero **Dunaden (Fr)** (Nicobar {GB}) proved it was third time lucky with a 3/4-length victory in the 2400-meter race at Sha Tin yesterday.

Dunaden, who defeated **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Geneurex {GB}) by a whisker in the 'race that stops a nation' Nov. 1, had been the subject of glowing trackwork reports from both railbirds and his jockey Craig Williams, and the 5-year-old

punched through three off the rail inside the final furlong and outstayed his rivals to land the first event on Hong Kong's International card. "He is an amazing horse because it is difficult for them to travel that much and yet peak at the right moment, twice," said winning trainer Mikel Delzangles. "I still can't believe it--if anyone had told me in April when I started training him that I would be here in December, I wouldn't have believed it. It's definitely very important to me professionally." **Cont. p2**

A MEMORY TO CHERISH IN CUP

When **California Memory** (Highest Honor {Fr}) drew the inside barrier for yesterday's G1 Hong Kong Cup, jockey Matthew Chadwick was dismayed, saying he would have preferred an outside stall, given his mount's come-from-behind style. Trainer Tony Cruz saw an opportunity. "What is he worried about?" he said in Saturday's South China *Morning Post*. "You can use the gate to your advantage. You make the best of it. Compare it to last year in the QE II where he lost too much ground from a wide draw and we couldn't catch [Ambitious Dragon {NZ}]."

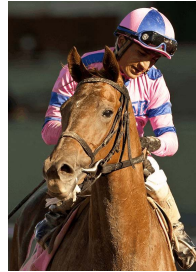

Reluctant or not, Chadwick, who was the fastest rider in Hong Kong history to make it through his apprenticeship, rode the grey gelding more forward than is his custom, and it paid dividends with a one-length victory over 2010 runner-up **Irian (Ger)** (Tertullian). "I haven't been around that long, but he's the best horse I've ridden, and the biggest win of my career," Chadwick enthused. **Cont. p3**

SURGERY FOR WEEMISSFRANKIE

Weemissfrankie (Sunriver), fourth as the 4-5 favorite in Saturday's G1 Hollywood Starlet, exited the race with a condylar fracture to her right front leg and underwent surgery yesterday. "It probably happened when she went to her nose at the start and probably got worse during the race," reported trainer Peter Eurton. "It didn't get really bad until she got back to the barn. She only got beat 2 3/4 lengths on three legs." Weemissfrankie won this year's G1 Del Mar Debutante and G1 Oak Leaf S. and was third in the G1 Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies.





Dunaden Doubles Up in Vase (cont. from p1)

Perhaps more effective at distances slightly longer than this at home in France, **Dunaden (Fr)** (Nicobar {GB}), a Sheikh Fahad al Thani colorbearer, took the G3 Prix de Barbeville at 3100 meters in April before missing by a short head to the talented Brigantin (Cozzene) in the G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier the following month. He made just one more start in Europe, a disappointing ninth to Jukebox Jury (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the G2 Prix Kergorlay, but connections remained committed to an Australian adventure. Dunaden validated that trust, first carrying Williams to a victory in the G3 Geelong Cup H. Oct. 19 ahead of his run at Flemington, where he came from 15th to score in the tightest finish of the historic race.

Dunaden broke alertly yesterday and landed handy to a moderate early tempo set by **Mighty High (Fr)** (Peintre Celebre). He drifted back to centerfield in the middle stages of the race, as **Jakkalberry (Ire)** (Storming Home {GB}) tugged his way to the lead as the field raced inside the final five furlongs. In some traffic when the real running began, Dunaden was a bit slow to pick up, allowing **Thumbs Up (NZ)** (Shinko King {Ire}) to creep about a length clear approaching the final furlong. Kept busy by Williams, Dunaden called upon his superior stamina and caught Thumbs Up in the final 50 meters, as **Silver Pond (Fr)** (Act One {GB})--pounded into 5-1 from 20-1 in the 10 minutes prior to post--and Melbourne Cup second Red Cadeaux hit the wire together for third.

"I couldn't have been happier with him since I sat on him earlier in the week," said Williams, who lost the ride on Dunaden in the Melbourne Cup due to a suspension. "I've been looking forward to today. We decided to have him up as close as we could, and he produced so much when I pulled him out, the hairs were standing on the back of my neck some way before the line. I really love this horse."

Favored **Campanologist** (Kingmambo) had a perfect trip, but couldn't quite keep pace late and finished fifth.

A Memory to Cherish in Hong Kong Cup (cont. from p1)

While even-money favorite **Ambitious Dragon (NZ)** (Pins {Aus}) was a touch slow from the gate, **California Memory** (Highest Honor {Fr}) was not, and, as was advertised, he was ridden along up the fence to sit just off the heels of the front-running **Pure Champion (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}). As early as the six-furlong marker, the tactical decision looked to be paying off, as Pure Champion was allowed a near :54 second opening half-mile and six furlongs in a remarkable 1:18.47.

Meanwhile, Ambitious Dragon lingered near the tail, waiting for his cue from Douglas Whyte, while Irian caboosed the 10-pack on the final bend. The chalk was finally given his head and looped the field into the stretch, while further down towards the fence, Matthew Chadwick was crafting a plan to get California Memory out of jail. Stymied into the final 250 meters, Chadwick could only watch as Ambitious Dragon set sail for home, but daylight finally came, and California Memory quickened through in a flash before putting the race to bed. Irian came with an equally stinging rally to be a gallant second, while **Zazou (Ger)** (Shamardal) kept Ambitious Dragon out of the top three.

“We had a game plan to go forward, and it worked out for him today,” Chadwick said. “Yes, maybe there was a bit of pressure after some criticism last time, but that was OK and the luck was with us today.”

California Memory, runner-up to Ambitious Dragon in the G1 QE II Cup over track and trip in May, was given a questionable ride by Chadwick in the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup, nearly costing him the ride. Connections stuck by, and horse and jockey scored a first-up win over Xtension (Ire) (Xaar {GB}) in the Sha Tin Trophy H. Oct. 30. He was coming into this off a fourth in the G2 Jockey Club Cup Nov. 20, where he could not get a clear run.

Scratched at the gate when favored for last year's Mile, Able One took a sit off a runaway leader in Flying Blue (Aus) (Piccolo {GB}), got first run when that one raised the white flag at the 300 and held off a desperately unlucky Cityscape and his charging stablemate Xtension for a win at the ripe age of nine. He'd won the G2 Jockey Club Mile leading up to last year's race, but his scratch made life that much easier on Beauty Flash (NZ) (Golan {Ire}), who pounced from just off the pace to score. The bay hadn't done much this term to indicate he could be a factor in a race like this, though he was a long-odds fourth to California Memory in a domestic Group 2 Oct. 30 ahead of a weakening eighth behind Destined for Glory (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}) in the G2 Jockey Club Mile Nov. 20. Outsprinted in the early stages as Flying Blue tore away to lead by three down the back, Able One traveled in his customary style, head down on his chest waiting to be called upon. The pacesetter tired from his early efforts, and Jeff Lloyd send the veteran to the lead with a furlong and a half to the wire. Cityscape, drawn wide and off the track every step of the journey, showed a tremendous amount of grit and stamina in the stretch, but could not quite get to Able One, who took it by a neck. "This win has given me the biggest buzz of my career, not just here in Hong Kong," Lloyd commented. "A 9-year-old with a 50-year-old on his back, it's just great. The race unfolded perfectly, with Flying Blue taking it up, so we had the trail. It was almost too good to be true." Xtension found a bit of traffic in the stretch, but came home gamely once he saw daylight to narrowly miss second. "I think he probably wins if he didn't have Cityscape sitting outside us," his jockey Darren Beadman stated. "He couldn't quite quicken fast enough, and he felt like a 2000-meter horse."

Lucky Nine, who endured a couple of very tough beats in Japan in September and October, returned here from a two-month freshening and took a three-way photo for a career best. Conqueror of Xtension (Ire) (Xaar {GB}) in the Hong Kong Classic Mile last January, the 4-year-old runner-up to Ambitious Dragon (NZ) (Pins {Aus}) in the Hong Kong Classic Cup and was beaten just a half-length by Xtension in the G1 Champions Mile Apr. 25 before taking a breather. While the majority of Hong Kong horses will do their preparations for this meeting at home, Lucky Nine was sent to Japan, and was assigned 130 pounds and asked to concede weight for the G2 Centaur S. Sept. 11, ultimately going down by just a head. He was making a potentially winning bid in the G1 Sprinters' S. Oct. 2 at Nakayama, but was blocked behind Pas de Trois (Jpn) (Swept Overboard) and ended up fifth. Freshened for this, Lucky Nine was bet into second favoritism and came through for his backers. After a slight hop at the start, the Irish-bred raced slightly behind midfield, as G1 Golden Jubilee S. winner Bated Breath (GB) (Dansili {GB}), Rocket Man (Aus) (Viscount {Aus}) and Pas de Trois knocked heads up front. Carried a bit wide into the lane by Joy and Fun, Lucky Nine joined that foe and the rail-skimming Entrapment for a scintillating finish. The trio was on more or less even terms passing the 100-meter mark, and Lucky Nine wore down his dead-heating rivals in the waning strides. "There was always going to be speed with Rocket Man drawn wide," winning rider Brett Prebble explained. "He missed the kick slightly and I was on the back foot from the start. Joy And Fun took me a bit wide on the turn but this horse is all heart, and 100% credit to [trainer] Caspar [Fownes]--he couldn't have had him any better." Favored Little Bridge (NZ) (Faltaat) had a beautiful trip behind the leaders, was in a bit of a box in the straight, and stayed on for fourth.

Handle Up at Successful Renewal...

Some 67,153 fans crowded into Sha Tin to witness a hugely successful renewal of the Hong Kong International Races. The crowd, up 24.2% from a year ago, rooted home locals to victories in three of the four International races, the first time that's happened since 2002. Handle, meanwhile, reached levels not seen

since 1998. A total of HK\$443 million was wagered on the International races alone, up 17% from last year's HK\$385 million, with the turnover for the 10-race card reaching HK\$1.2 billion.

"Looking at today's result from both a business point of view and a

sporting point of view, it was an absolutely outstanding meeting," said Hong Kong Jockey Club CEO Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, who hailed the event as "the greatest show on turf."

Engelbrecht-Bresges said the afternoon's success was an example of why the sport--and the local government--needs to embrace globalization. "[It] shows that our strategy of having simulcast races, familiarizing people with overseas horses, is key," he said. "I would like to use this again as an appeal to our government that we need to embrace the internationalization of racing so that, hopefully, people worldwide can bet in the pool of one of the biggest--if not the biggest--international race meetings in the world. This race meeting generated HK\$145 million tax revenue for the Hong Kong government, so the biggest benefactor of this race meeting is definitely the government. We had a terrific day for Hong Kong racing, and a terrific day for Hong Kong."

Engelbrecht-Bresges singled out jockey Matthew Chadwick for praise. The 21-year-old newcomer, a graduate of the HKJC Apprentice Jockeys' School, booted home the Tony Cruz-trained California Memory (Highest Honor {Fr}) with a savvy ride in the G1 Hong Kong Cup.

"It is a fantastic result for Hong Kong and a fantastic result for our academy," commented Engelbrecht-Bresges. "Matthew Chadwick is the first homegrown jockey from the academy to win an international Group 1 race here in Hong Kong. We are very keen to invest in the future of Hong Kong, and therefore it is very important. This is definitely the reward of a very good program."

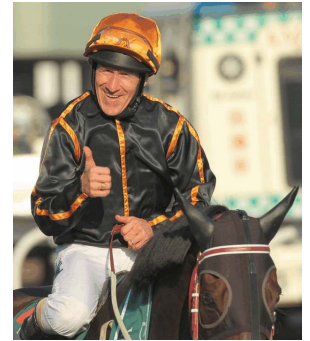

Unproven but bred to be any kind, Joie de Vivre, a three-parts sister to Japan's reigning Horse of the Year Buena Vista (Jpn), will likely follow in the hoofsteps of her famed sibling and her dam Biwa Heidi (Jpn) as the country's top-rated juvenile filly. That, after a decisive win in Japan's most important event for 2-year-olds of the fairer sex, the Hanshin Juvenile Fillies, won by Biwa Heidi in 1995 and by Buena Vista in 2008. Joie de Vivre had made only one previous start before the race. She won a 1600-meter turf maiden by 1 1/2 lengths as the favorite at Kyoto Nov. 12, and was sent off the fourth choice in the betting making the big step up in class here. Breaking from the 13 hole, Joie de Vivre settled nicely under Yuichi Fukunaga and raced along in mid-division as Fine Choice (Jpn) (Admire Moon {Jpn}) led. The pink-blinkered head of Fine Choice continued to show the way as they made the right-hand turn into the stretch, but as that one began to falter 200 meters out, a number of rivals were in with a chance.

Joie de Vivre, very wide into the stretch while still well back, began gobbling up ground with huge strides and simply outclassed them late, drawing away to a powerful 2 1/2-length tally. The margin of victory matched Buena Vista's win here three years ago, and came .30 seconds faster. The G3 KBS Kyoto Sho Fantasy S. winner I'm Yours, who drifted to 11-1 from her 5-1 morning-line quote, finished second, with the previously unbeaten and post-time choice Sound of Heart coming home third.

ROUSING SERMON PREPS FOR FUTURITY

Trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, who won Saturday's GI Hollywood Starlet with Killer Graces (Congaree), will look to sweep Hollywood's juvenile events when he saddles **Rousing Sermon** (Lucky Pulpit) in next Saturday's GI CashCall Futurity. The colt worked six furlongs yesterday at Hollywood Park in 1:12.20 with jockey Joe Talamo in the irons. Hollendorfer assistant Dan Ward called the drill "awesome." Ward said, "He used to be a slow workhorse, but he worked by himself today in 1:12 and one." Rousing Sermon took the Oct. 29 California Cup Juvenile S. and is coming off a runner-up effort in the Nov. 12 Real Quiet S. "His numbers have gone up with each race," Ward said. "He's training better now that he knows what he has to do. There will be some luck involved in a big field, but he will be running in the stretch, that's for sure." Hollendorfer would be the first trainer to win the Starlet and the Futurity in the same year.

Also prepping for the Futurity, ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Empire Way** (Empire Maker), sixth in his second career start in the Nov. 24 GIII Hollywood Prevue S., went five furlongs in 1:01. "He went nice," trainer Mike Harrington reported after the work.

Cozzetti (Cozzene), who shipped in from Kentucky last Tuesday, went five furlongs in 1:02.60. "I think he's a special horse, and this the last chance for a 2-year-old to run in a big race," said trainer Dale Romans. Cozzetti is coming off a maiden-breaking score in an off-the-turf special weight at at Churchill Downs Nov. 16 ([video](#)). The gray began his career with a pair of off-the-board finishes over the Belmont lawn.

Bob Baffert, who has won the Futurity five times, could have as many as four colts in this year's race. Yesterday, the trainer sent out Real Quiet S. winner **Liason** (Indian Charlie) and Nov. 24 maiden winner **Sky Kingdom** (Empire Maker) to six furlong works in a bullet 1:11.80. GI Del Mar Futurity winner **Drill** (Lawyer Ron) went five furlongs in 1:00. Also possible for the Futurity is Baffert's GIII Hollywood Prevue winner **So Brilliant** (Medaglia d'Oro).

Brother Francis (Lion Heart), runner-up in the Prevue, worked five furlongs at Santa Anita yesterday in 1:02 for trainer Jim Cassidy.

UNION RAGS UPDATE

Trainer Michael Matz yesterday provided an update on GI Champagne S. winner **Union Rags** (Dixie Union), who has been turned out at a Wellington, Florida farm since his runner-up effort in the GI Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile. "We got on his back Saturday and just walked him for about a half hour," Matz said. "He's going to be ridden three times next week, and then starting on the 15th, he's going to be ridden every day. Then after the first of the year, we'll take him down to Palm Meadows to start some serious training."

RAPID REDUX MAY BE RETIRED BEFORE '12

Trainer David Wells told listeners to the "Down the Stretch" show on Sirius XM radio Saturday that he would like to see **Rapid Redux** (Pleasantly Perfect) retired at the end of the year. Rapid Redux will seek his 21st straight win in a starter allowance race Tuesday at Laurel. But he might find winning much more difficult in 2012 because the 5-year-old will no longer be eligible to compete in starter allowance races.

"I haven't really talked that much to [owner] Robert [Cole Jr.] about this, but if it were left up to me I'd retire him at the end of the year," Wells said. "He's been so good to us that I'd love to just give him a good home. Maybe we could send him to Old Friends. Some of my help has reached out to people at the Kentucky Horse Park, so we'll see what happens with that."

Wells said he is also hoping to start Rapid Redux one more time this year after the Laurel race. He said officials at Gulfstream Park have reached out to him in hopes of having Rapid Redux start in a Dec. 31 starter allowance there.

"The Gulfstream people have been really nice and asked us to come down and said they would pay all our expenses to get there," he said. "The only thing I worry about is the shipping. That's a long way for him to go."

Wells said the Gulfstream race is slated to go for \$21,000, but track officials told him they would bump it up to \$25,000 should Rapid Redux appear.


FASIG-TIPTON TEXAS MIXED SALE TODAY

The Fasig-Tipton Texas December Mixed Sale takes place today at Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie. A total of 131 lots have been catalogued for the one-session sale, which begins at 12 p.m.

"Over one-third of our 80-plus mares are black-type producers, with several in foal to Valid Expectations, our perennially leading sire in these parts," commented Tim Boyce, sales director for Fasig-Tipton's southwest division. Thai Haku, winner of the Prix La Sorellina and runner-up in the G3 Prix Andre Baboin in France last season, just missed her first group tally when second by a neck in the G2 Cape Verdi S. at Meydan in Dubai this past January. Off the board in another Meydan Group 2 a month later and in a pair of European Group 3s in July, Thai Haku was moved to the States, and was still trained by Mikel Delzangles when she ran a strong second in the GIII Noble Damsel S. at Belmont Sept. 18. Chad Brown was the trainer of record when she returned a month later in the GIII Athenia S. over yielding ground in New York, and under Jose Lezcano she failed to overcome a wide trip while finishing fourth. Racing along in fourth here in the two path under first-time rider Julien Leparoux, Thai Haku began to gear up her challenge with a three-wide move into the lane and fought her way past the game longshot Hooch Why for the win. "She got a beautiful ride and a beautiful trip," said Brown. "I probably ran her back too soon in her last start. It was toward the end of the turf season [in New York], so we took a chance, but the ground was yielding, and we knew from her previous connections that she preferred it more firm. Today the course was listed as 'good,' but Julien told me it was closer to firm." Brown is following in the footsteps of his mentor Bobby Frankel, who excelled with European imports. "I had a good teacher," said Brown. "They're all different. Some I might not run for six months and others just fall into the program, and you can run them a lot sooner. We've had her with us for awhile now and gotten to know her. We'll see how she comes out of it and probably look at the GIII Marshua's River [at Gulfstream Jan. 7] next."

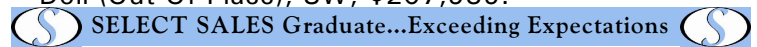
