### CASHCALL DRAWS FULL, INTRIGUING FIELD

Hollywood's \$750,000 GI CashCall Futurity S. drew a full and intriguing field of 13 2-year-olds, including three from Bob Baffert, who has more wins in this event than any other trainer with five. The Hall of Famer's three-pronged attack is led by Pegram, Watson and Weitman's GI Del Mar Futurity S. winner **Drill** (Lawyer Ron), who will look to bounce back from a well-beaten seventh-place finish last time in the Nov. 19 GIII Delta Downs Jackpot. Baffert will also saddle Arnold Zetcher's **Liaison** (Indian Charlie), winner of the track-and-trip Real Quiet S. Nov. 12 as an odds-on favorite; and **Sky Kingdom** (Empire Maker), who earned his diploma over this strip Nov. 24 in his third try for Westrock Stables. GSW and MGISP **Majestic City** (City Zip) will look to give Peter Miller back-to-back CashCall trophies--he won this event last term with Comma To the Top (Bwana Charlie). Impressive turf debuter **Blingo** (Artie Schiller) goes out for the same connections as Zenyatta, while Heinz Steinmann's **Empire Way** (Empire Maker), a full-brother to Royal Delta, will look to improve on the stretch-out after a disappointing sixth-place finish in the Nov. 24 GIII Hollywood Prevue S.

### STRIKE THE GOLD EUTHANIZED IN TURKEY

According to published reports, 1991 GI Kentucky Derby winner **Strike the Gold** (Alydar--Majestic Gold, by Hatchet Man) was euthanized Tuesday at Karacabey Stud Farm in Turkey after he collapsed and suffered a fracture. The 23-year-old was the oldest living Derby winner. Bred in Kentucky by Calumet Farm, the chestnut began his racing career for the partnership of B. Giles Brophy, William Condren and Joseph Cornacchia, who raced under BCC Stable. He was trained by Nick Zito throughout his career, giving the eventual Hall of Famer his first Classic victory ([video](#)). The full brother to MGSW Greydar was sixth in the GI Preakness S. in his bid for the Triple Crown, but rebounded to be second in the GI Belmont S. Strike the Gold did not return to the winner's circle in 12 starts after the Derby, however, and Condren and Cornacchia paid \$2.9 million in May of 1992 at a sale put on by Fasig-Tipton at Belmont Park to buy out Brophy. He returned just days later to take the GI Pimlico Special H. ([video](#)). Strike the Gold was retired after three starts at five with four graded stakes victories and career earnings of \$3,457,026 from a total record of 31-6-8-5. He began his stud career at Vinery in Kentucky, but was sold to the Jockey Club of Turkey in 1998, where he was responsible for two champions.

## YEAR SUSPENSION RECOMMENDED FOR VEITCH

Robert Layton, Kentucky's Chief Hearing Officer, recommended in a report filed yesterday that John Veitch, the state's former chief steward, be suspended one year for his role in the controversial incident involving 2010 Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic entrant Life At Ten at Churchill Downs. Jockey John Velazquez, who was later fined \$10,000 by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission, voiced concerns during national television coverage about how his mount was warming up, but while Veitch was informed of Velazquez's comments, he took no action and did not notify state veterinarians. Life At Ten trailed throughout the race and did not finish, but was not designated by Veitch for postrace sampling. Layton's report charges Veitch with violating five racing regulations and argues, "Because of Veitch's violations, the uncertainty over Life At Ten's performance will never be fully resolved. Such a consequence does not maintain the appearance as well as the fact of complete honesty and integrity of horse racing in the Commonwealth, and must also be considered as a factor in determining the appropriate penalty." Veitch was fired as Kentucky's chief steward at the end of last month, and is currently appealing his termination on the grounds of age discrimination and incorrect identification as a "classified employee." No reasons for dismissal were given to Veitch--an "unclassified employee," which Veitch argues he was, must be informed of the grounds for his or her termination and has the right to appeal.

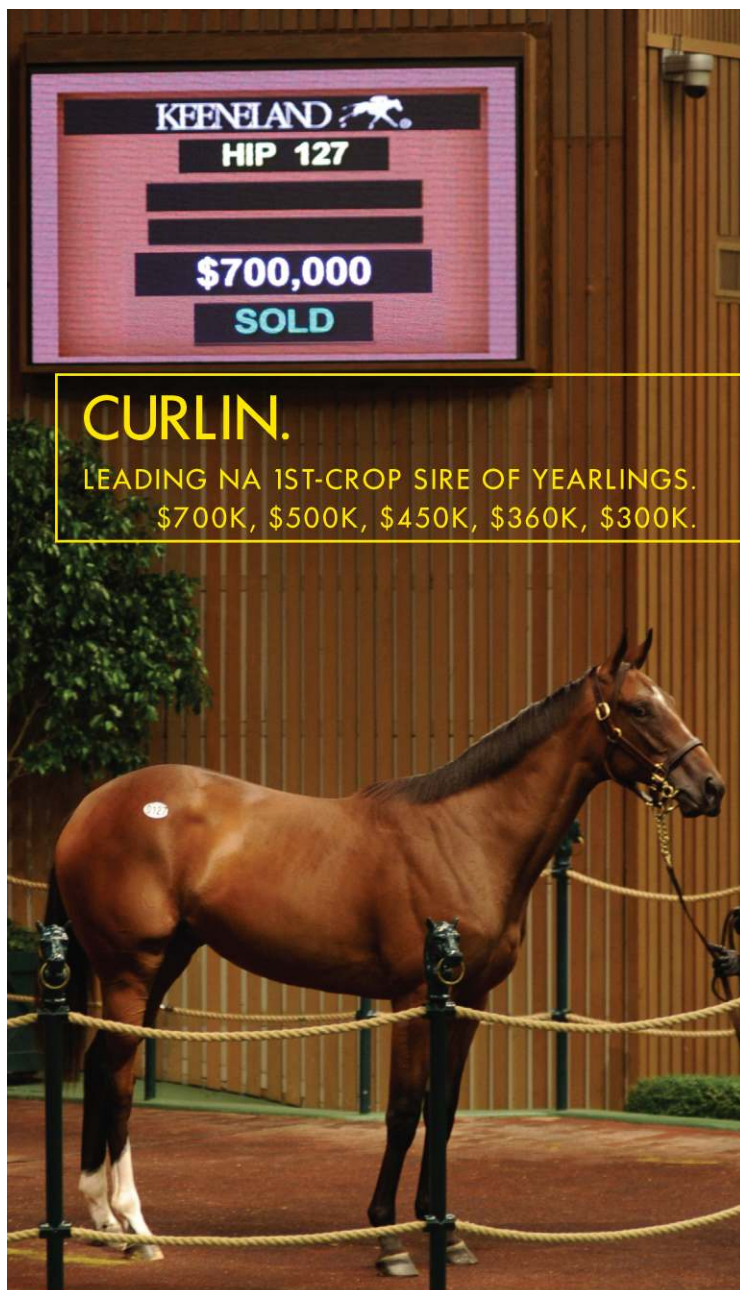

Japanese breeder Katsumi Yoshida has purchased multiple Argentine Group 1 winner **Balada Sale (Arg)** (Not For Sale) {Arg}) for an undisclosed price. The deal for Argentina's leading 3-year-old filly was brokered by California-based agent Emmanuel de Seroux of Narvick International. "She will be sent to Dubai for the meeting and will be trained by Mike de Kock," de Seroux said. Balada Sale capped off the 2011 season with impressive victories in the G1 Gran Premio Polla de Potrancas and G1 Gran Premio Seleccion. Under the tutelage of champion trainer Juan Carlos Maldotti, Balada Sale won five of six starts in her native country for breeder Haras Vacacion.

### ANOTHER STAR FOR LA QUEBRADA

The historic Haras La Quebrada, which celebrated its 200th Group 1 win as a breeder in September, will look to keep the party going when the La Quebrada-bred

#### Star Runner (Arg)

(Southern Halo) goes postward in Saturday's G1 Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini in Buenos Aires. Star Runner, who is coming off a win in the G1 Estrellas Classic in June, could become the farm's second Pellegrini winner.

La Quebrada was founded by Hernan

Ceriani Cernadas in 1945 in Pilar, Argentina--just 45 miles outside of Buenos Aires--and is the life's work of three generations of Argentinian horsemen.

Following in his father's footsteps, Hernan Rodolfo Ceriani Cernadas led the farm until his passing in 2007, and the operation is currently run by the founder's grandson Hernan Ceriani Cernadas, III.

"My grandfather started it," Ceriani Cernadas recalled. "And then my father was the one who grew it and made it so successful. I just continued on with the family tradition."

During Hernan Rodolfo's term at the helm of La Quebrada, the face of breeding in Argentina was forever changed by the arrival of Southern Halo in 1988. The stallion became the country's most successful sire, leading the standings from 1994 to 2001, as well as in 2003 and 2007. He also topped the broodmare sire's list from 2004 through 2010.

"Southern Halo was very important to La Quebrada," Ceriani Cernadas said. "He was an excellent stallion here, and now he is an excellent broodmare sire. He made many things possible for my father. When Coolmore bought him, he was the first stallion to shuttle from Argentina to the Northern Hemisphere. That was something new here."

Southern Halo died in November of 2009, but his tradition of siring stars of the Argentinian turf continues with Pellegrini hopeful Star Runner, who is already a three-time Group 1 winner.

"In Argentina, I think everything is before Southern Halo or after Southern Halo," Ceriani Cernadas said. "For La Quebrada, in particular, we had very good bloodlines in our mares, but Southern Halo moved them all up. If you had a family that had a stakes winner, he would produce a group winner, if there was a maiden family, he would produce a winner. He improved all his mares." **Cont. p5**

When Chuck Berry (Arg) (Grand Reward) won the G1 Gran Premio Polla de Potrillos in September, he was earning La Quebrada's 200th Group 1 win. The farm has bred close to 120 Group 1 winners, including 2001 GI Spinster S. winner Miss Linda (Arg) (Southern Halo) and this year's GI Santa Margarita Invitational winner Miss Match (Arg) (Indygo Shiner).

La Quebrada stands eight stallions, including Luhuk, Mutakddim, Indygo Shiner, Grand Reward and El Corredor. While the farm's primary focus is commercial breeding, it does race fillies with a future in its broodmare band.

**La Quebrada a Family Affair...**

With his family's background, it might seem like the grandson's profession would be a given, but Ceriani Cernadas's father insisted his son follow another family tradition first.

"I was born at the farm and when I was young, I always was at the farm with my father," he explained.

"But my grandfather was a notary and also my father was a notary. My father told me, 'If you want to do what I am doing [at La Quebrada], first of all you have to study law. Then you can work with me.'

"So that's what I did," he continued. "When I finished school, I started university. I studied in the afternoon and at night, but in the mornings, I would be working with my father. When I finished at the university, I started working full time with him. My father passed

away in 2007 in January and now I am in charge of the farm."

Taking charge of his family's legendary breeding operation, which includes a broodmare band of some 230 head, might be overwhelming, but Ceriani Cernadas, who runs La Quebrada with the help of his sister Maria Ines, admits there usually isn't time to get caught up in the magnitude of what he is doing.

"My whole life, when I thought about this moment, I thought there would be a lot of pressure," the Argentinian explained. "But when my father passed away, I didn't have time to think if there was pressure or not. I was so busy. I am very proud of the team my father put together to work with him. The team really supported me and my sister--they supported us and made our job very easy."

Ceriani Cernadas has one daughter and "one on the way." His sister has two daughters and a son. Asked if the young children would carry on the family business, he smiled, "We still have time to see."

### Eye on the Pellegrini...

Should Star Runner, or fellow La Quebrada-bred **Calidoscopio (Arg)** (Luhuk), win Saturday's G1 Carlos Pellegrini, he would join 1987 winner Larabee (Arg) (Babor {Arg}) as the farm's only graduates to win Argentina's biggest race.

"It is a race that everybody wants to win," Ceriani Cernadas said of the Pellegrini. "It's always a very open race and always a hard race to win. Horses come from all over South America, and now the mare [Perfect Shirl] is coming from the States, it makes it bigger."

Ceriani Cernadas was at the track when Larabee won in 1987, and the victory is still recalled fondly.

"I remember that race very well," he confirmed. "I was 14 and I was very impressed that day. The owner of Larabee unfortunately passed away this year, but I met his son a month ago and we were just talking about Larabee and the Pellegrini. So imagine we are still talking about it all these years later."

Star Runner was 14th in last year's Pellegrini, but is unbeaten in four starts since for owner Enrique Nunez and trainer Ernesto Romero. He has reeled off three straight Group 1 triumphs, most recently taking the Estrellas Classic over the San Isidro turf.

"Star Runner is going to be one of the favorites for sure," Ceriani Cernadas said. "He was always a very nice-looking horse and he's very fast. The only question mark is that he hasn't raced since June, but his trainer told me the other day that he is doing perfect. But with the Pellegrini, like all the big races, you have to have the right horse, but also the jockey has to do everything right in the race."

Perfect Shirl (Perfect Soul {Ire}) will become the first Breeders' Cup winner to compete in the Pellegrini, and her presence has generated extra buzz around the event.

"I was very surprised by the decision to run her and I am very happy about it," Ceriani Cernadas said. "I am very happy, because when you are an owner of an important horse, it is a big decision. It's a long trip to go to another country, to a different hemisphere. This is something very different and something important for the horsemen and the breeders. Everybody is talking about it; everybody knows the horses from Brazil and from Peru are coming and now the filly from the States is coming. The newspapers and the magazines are all talking about it. I hope she is the first of many horses who will come to race here."

Asked if he had a favorite Pellegrini, Ceriani Cernadas laughed, "I hope it is going to be the next one." He added, "The favorite Pellegrini that I remember was Larabee because we ran many many other times, but we weren't able to win. So the Pellegrini of Larabee is my favorite until next Saturday."

### Racing Fans at Home in Argentina...

Racing in Argentina suffered some declines in the late 1980s, according to Ceriani Cernadas, but has been resurgent in recent years.

"I think now racing is attracting a new generation of fans," he explained. "I think it took time for the racetracks to learn about new technology, new ways of communicating and the internet, and to use them to show people the sport. Now there are a lot of young people, not only coming to the races, but also there are a lot of young people who want to work with Thoroughbreds."

Argentina is also attracting a strong group of international owners, who enjoy the experience of racing in the South American country. Their appreciation for both the sport and the country doesn't surprise the La Quebrada maestro.

"I think Palermo and San Isidro are among the top racecourses in the world," Ceriani Cernadas said. "They are big and very comfortable with good tracks, both turf and dirt."

Of his native country, Ceriani Cernadas added, "Argentina is a special country--we are very friendly. You find good friends here and there are many things to do, not only races, you can spend a day at the farms and there are some gorgeous spots in the country. And the city is very nice; there are very good hotels and restaurants. It's a big country with not so many people and you can do many things. Many people come from the States and from Europe and they fall in love with Argentina." -*Jessica Martini*

## RIDERS BANNED IN CORRUPTION CASE

Jockeys Jimmy Quinn, Kirsty Milczarek, Greg Fairley and Paul Doe were yesterday handed lengthy bans after being found in breach of the rules of racing at the British Horseracing Authority's hearing into alleged corruption. Fairley and Doe--who no longer ride--were banned for 12 years, Milczarek for two and Quinn for six months as the investigation reached a conclusion in London. Former jockey Paul Fitzsimons, who now trains, was found not guilty by the panel while other individuals involved included owners Maurice Sines and James Crickmore, who allegedly laid their horse on a betting exchange. The charges related to 10 races between Jan. 17 and Aug. 15 2009, during which time Doe and Fairley were alleged to have deliberately ensured horses did not run on their merits. Quinn and Milczarek were found in breach of more minor offences, and the latter declared that she is set to appeal yesterday. Her solicitor Christopher Stewart-Moore stated, "We think the Panel's reasoning is flawed and we're going to be appealing to the BHA appeal board, as Kirsty was not involved in any conspiracy of any kind."

## NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



### HOUSE BILL PASSES WITH CONTINUATION OF 100 PERCENT BONUS DEPRECIATION

The House voted 234 to 193 on Tuesday evening to pass legislation that continues 100 percent small business bonus depreciation through 2012. Known as the "Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act of 2011," H.R. 3630 also extends the current payroll-tax cut and the duration of unemployment insurance benefits.

Sales officials and others within the Thoroughbred industry identified 100 percent bonus depreciation as a factor in the increased business activity at 2011 yearling sales. Bonus depreciation encourages investment by allowing taxpayers to write off the entire cost of new qualified depreciable property in the year purchased, if they put the property in service that same year. Examples of qualified property include yearlings and new farm equipment.

The Congressional Budget Office (CBO) and the Joint Committee on Taxation (JCT) estimate that the continuation of 100 percent bonus depreciation through 2012 will cost the Treasury \$6.005 billion over 10 years. Thousands of businesses nationwide, including those outside of horse racing, stand to benefit from this investment incentive.

The Senate is expected to vote on the bill later this week and the outcome is uncertain. Without a change by Congress, bonus depreciation drops to 50 percent in 2012.

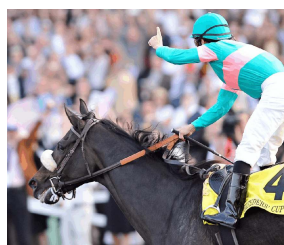
