Airdrie Stud's top stallion **Indian Charlie** (In Excess {Ire}--Soviet Sojourn, by Leo Castelli) was euthanized at the age of 16. He had been battling cancer. "Losing Indian Charlie after a challenging battle with

Hemangiosarcoma and its complications has been a shock to us all," a farm release read yesterday. "He was dearly loved by everyone that cared for him on a daily basis. "Charlie" has been a shining star at Airdrie for many years now. His personality, toughness, and utter determination remained

with him throughout treatment. He won many hearts at Hagyard's, and received an endless supply of much deserved carrots and peppermints while there. Our thanks go out to everyone involved with this fine stallion, and to our shareholders and breeders who faithfully supported Indian Charlie over the years. We would sincerely like to thank Dr. Nathan Slovis and his team at McGee Medical Center for their unrelenting efforts to try and save our stallion."

Campaigned by Hal Earnhardt & John R Gaines Racing LLC, Indian Charlie won his first four starts, including the GI Santa Anita Derby in a stakes-record time of 1:47. Retired to stud in 1999, the stallion is credited with four Eclipse winners to date, including last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero Uncle Mo. Indian Charlie's recent progeny record includes 15 stakes winners of 2011--seven graded, as well as a 2011

yearling crop that has averaged over \$200,000 in the sales ring. **Cont. p2**

PERFECT SHIRL TO SKIP PELLEGRINI

Charles Fipke's GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf heroine **Perfect Shirl** (Perfect Soul {Ire}) will not contest Saturday's G1 Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini at San Isidro as originally planned. The plane that was scheduled to take the 4-year-old to Argentina experienced mechanical problems, and connections were not satisfied with alternative arrangements. "She's not going because the new route would have involved a stop in Chile," Sid Fernando, bloodstock advisor to Fipke, told the *TDN*. "[Trainer Roger] Attfeld made the decision not to go, and Chuck agreed."

Perfect Shirl was scheduled to depart Wednesday, however, Attfeld's traveling assistant was unable to accompany the filly on that flight, forcing a redirection of plans. According to Attfeld, the filly will be given the rest of the season off at Payson Park in Florida, before gearing up for a 2012 campaign.

Indian Charlie was bred in California by Hal Earnhardt, and was the third foal produced by Earnhardt's graded stakes winner Soviet Sojourn. Turned over to trainer Bob Baffert, Indian Charlie romped by 12 lengths over Cal-breds at Del Mar in his career opener, but didn't see action again until February. After a nine-length score in a state-bred allowance, the bay colt annexed an open NW1X in March 1998, then dismissed stablemate Real Quiet and Artax as the 9-5 choice in the GI Santa Anita Derby. His unbeaten record made him the favorite for the GI Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs, but Indian Charlie was unable to resist Real Quiet under the Twin Spires, and wound up settling for third in what turned out to be his career finale. He retired to Airdrie Stud in 1999 with a bankroll numbering \$616,120.

Having stood his first season for \$10,000, Indian Charlie had 15 winners when his initial crop hit the races in 2002. He was 10th on a freshman sire list that included Distorted Humor, Awesome Again, Elusive Quality and Tale of the Cat as the top four names. The best runner from his first crop turned out to be Grade I winner Pampered Princess, and his second featured champion \$1,704,513-earner Fleet Indian. A steady stream of solid performers followed, and Indian Blessing, a Hal Earnhardt homebred, was tabbed as the nation's champion 2-year-old filly following her 2007 Breeders' Cup victory. She was also named champion female sprinter for 2008 before retiring with \$2,995,420. The brilliant Uncle Mo became his sire's second Breeders' Cup winner with a comprehensive Juvenile triumph at Churchill in 2010, and Indian Charlie stood for \$75,000 in 2011. He is also responsible Canadian champion Indian Apple Is and Grade II winner Two Trail Sioux.

To date, Indian Charlie has been represented by 57 black-type winners. He has also been represented by Canadian champion sprinter Indian Apple Is and Panamanian champion Indiano. His progeny have earned \$40,821,937 to date.

Desormais (War Front--Desert Princess {Ire}, by Desert King {Ire}), an impressive four-length maiden winner in France negotiating 1 1/4 miles in his third career start over Marseille Pont de Vivaux's all-weather course Nov. 15, dives right into the deep end in Saturday's loaded GI CashCall Futurity at Hollywood Park.

Purchased privately by Aron Wellman and Lee Midkiff's Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, the blaze-faced bay had his passport stamped last Wednesday and has quickly settled into his new digs at Paddy Gallagher's barn since clearing quarantine. Bred in

Kentucky by Ponchartrain Stud, he was formerly campaigned by owner Maurice Lagasse and trainer Jacq Rossi.

"He's an interesting colt," Wellman commented. "He comes from a very obscure, relatively low-level track, without question. What really intrigued me about him was that he won going 1 1/4 miles in November of his 2-year-old year. It's rare to see those races written, let alone see a colt win so impressively at that distance. I was impressed by his stamina and the amount of energy he displayed."

The Los Angeles native continued, "Secondly, he did it around a very tight left-handed synthetic course from the 13 hole, no less. It's a very American-style racecourse over there; I liked that he handled it so well. He switched leads right on cue every time, which is another unique thing for a European horse to do."

It also didn't hurt being by the very promising second-crop stallion War Front, already the sire of Grade I winners Summer Soiree and The Factor, Wellman reports.

"Personally, I'm a big fan of his," the 34-year-old said of the Claiborne resident. "He's obviously gotten off to a great start at stud. If [Desormais] was by some obscure turf stallion from France, I would've probably been less inclined to buy him, but because he's by a prominent young U.S.-based stallion who's proven he can throw Grade I horses in this country on all surfaces, it certainly gave me that much more confidence to take a chance."

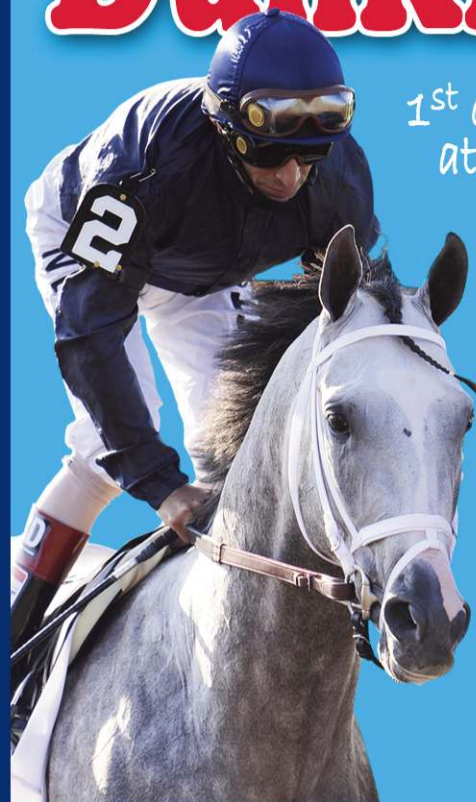

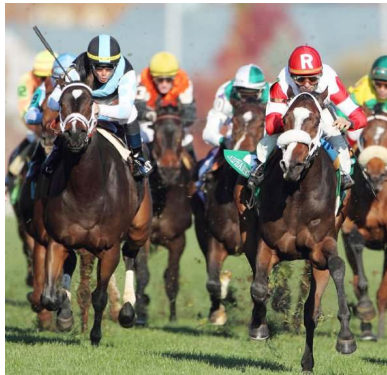

The stakes will be high for Desormais in his U.S. debut. Drawn widest of all in post 13 in tomorrow's main event, he will be facing a very seasoned group, including GI Del Mar Futurity hero **Drill** (Lawyer Ron), GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S. winner and GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity runner-up **Majestic City** (City Zip) and GIII Hollywood Prevue S. second-place finisher **Brother Francis** (Lion Heart).

"How he stacks up here remains to be seen," Wellman admitted. "Clearly, going from the South of France at essentially a no-name racetrack in Marseille and beating maidens to running at Hollywood Park in a Grade I \$750,000 race--it's an understatement to say that we've provided him with an ambitious challenge. It's a situation where we've got very little to lose and a whole lot to gain. One way or another, I'm not going to hold the result against him if he doesn't fare favorably, because this is a long-term play."

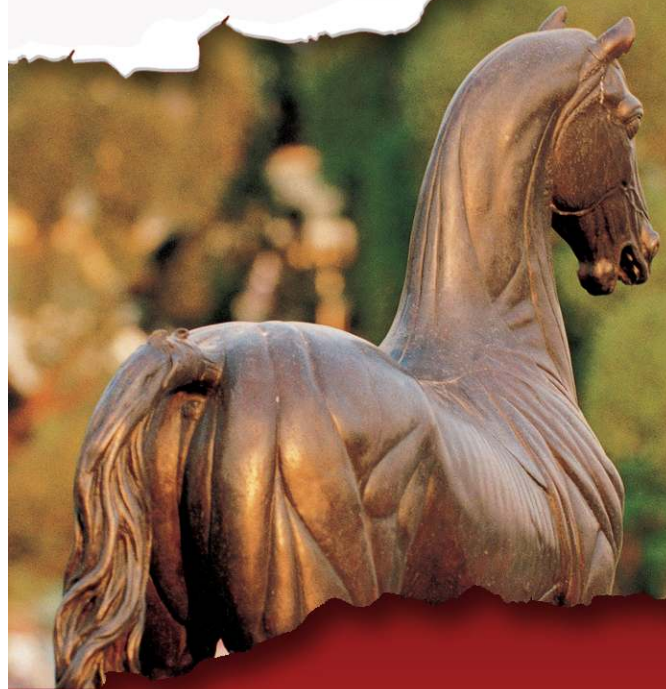
Wellman and Midkiff's fledgling operation is quickly making a name for itself. Launched earlier this fall, Eclipse hit the ground running with one of its initial private acquisitions, subsequent GIII JP Morgan Chase Jessamine S. runner-up and GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf third-place finisher **Sweet Cat** (Kitten's Joy). The racing partnership's first winner **Patrioticandproud** (Proud Citizen) added black-type in his next start when third in Woodbine's Display S. Nov. 27. Eclipse currently owns a half dozen juveniles, two yearlings and a weanling.

"With the exception of not winning the race, it worked out really well," Wellman reflected of Eclipse's Breeders' Cup experience at Churchill Downs. "To have a filly finish in the money in a Breeders' Cup race literally within two months of us launching the company was tremendous. It put us right where we want to be, which is competing for the best races that the world has to offer and showing up with the goods. Not just showing up to see our name in the program."

He concluded, "It's certainly been a feather in our cap at this early stage of the company's existence."

If Eclipse's private purchases keep running as good as they have so far, Wellman's going to need to get himself a bigger cap. -*Steve Sherack*

MORENO TO MISS ALZAGA UNZUE Peruvian invader **Moreno (Per)** (Privately Held) will be scratched from Saturday's G1 Gran Premio Felix de Alzaga Unzue, on the undercard of the card's marquee event, the Carlos Pellegrini's card at San Isidro Race Track. The colt, who was diagnosed with a respiratory problem by veterinarians, indicated that the condition is likely product of the climate change. "It is a pity, but we cannot risk a horse of these conditions," said trainer Alfonso Arias. A winner of four of seven starts, Moreno was second last time in the Clasico Greek Prince at Monterrico Racecourse.

HRTV's Conley On Hand for Pelligrini

HRTV will offer live coverage of Saturday's G1 Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini at San Isidro Racecourse in Buenos Aires, Argentina. Post time is 5:40 p.m. Eastern, with coverage beginning approximately one hour before the race. Carolyn Conley has made the trip to Argentina to cover the race. "I'll be sending back interviews and video to include in our daily programming," said Conley by phone from San Isidro. "You'll see it on Raceday America, as well as our other shows. It has been very eye-opening to be on site; to get to meet the trainers and learn about the racing here, but everyone is obviously very disappointed that **Perfect Shirl** (Perfect Soul {Ire}) wasn't able to make the trip." Conley has conducted several interviews so far that fans can look forward to seeing on HRTV, including a segment with Julio Penna, who trains **Es Richard (Arg)** (Espaciado {Arg}). He is the cousin of Angel Penna Jr. "His last race was at 3000 meters (15 furlongs), so he's dropping back in distance," she said. "I also spoke to Ernesto Romero, the trainer of **Star Runner (Arg)** (Southern Halo). That's the horse who won the Estrellas in June, but who has been laid off with a foot problem. Ernesto is an old-school trainer who is very good at bringing horses off a layoff. He worked in a minute flat the other day on the innermost dirt track, which was considered a very fast move. He really feels like he's the class of the field."

HRTV's Carolyn Conley from the Gran Premio Internacional Carlos Pelligrini



Bienvenidos a Argentina!

I am in Buenos Aires this week to cover the Gran Premio Internacional Carlos Pelligrini for HRTV. This has been quite an adventure and I thought I would share a few of my impressions, and a bit of inside information.

Buenos Aires is a lively place and a perfect destination this time of year for the horse-lover. Not only did the World Polo Championships take place across the street from Palermo Racecourse last weekend, but I spotted a beautiful show jumping club near downtown Buenos Aires, and San Isidro Racecourse will host four Group 1 races this Saturday, including the Pelligrini.

I haven't practiced my Spanish for a while, since I was exercising horses at Santa Anita, but it is improving quickly. My host--Jose Nelson of the Argentine Jockey Club--has been a big help, acting as an interpreter for the more casual interviews and driving me all over the place.

The property of San Isidro is enormous. The racecourse itself is a 1 3/4-mile turf oval with a dirt track inside of it. With this layout the Pelligrini is contested on turf at a one-turn mile and a half.

The horses do not train on the "pista principal" (main track), but instead have access to a turf training track with four dirt tracks inside of it. Training hours are similar to the states, but the picture looks totally different.

As you may know, racehorses in Argentina, and even the ponies that go to the track with them, are ridden with only bareback pads. Riders, who are also the grooms, sit down on the horses backs while trotting and galloping around the training tracks. Many horses wear roached manes, and all the horses have a long mane only at the withers, for the jockeys to hold on to when breaking from the starting gate.

I will be sending back interviews and videos of the contenders via satellite daily. Tune in to HRTV throughout the next few days for more on the Pelligrini. We will be showing it live at 5:40 E.T. on HRTV, and I will be catching up live with the connections both before and after the race.

Magnolia Racing LLC, Josephine Abercrombie's Pin Oak Stud announced Thursday. The 6-year-old stallion, whose first foals arrived this year, stands for \$7,500, L/F. "Over the last 30 years, I've come to recognize certain patterns in the physiology of the offspring of elite stallions," said advisor

Dr. David Lambert of Equine Analysis Co. "A majority of Cowboy Cal's foals are demonstrating these significant patterns, so I believe that he represents a value way beyond his present stud fee."

Through three seasons on the track, Cowboy Cal won or placed in 11 stakes. Following a 6 1/4-length win in the Laurel Futurity at two, he won or placed in five of six starts as a 3-year-old, including the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. and the GI Hollywood Derby.

ITALY



STRIKE SET FOR NEW YEAR

Italy's prize money crisis is set to deepen at the start of the new year, with its racecourses readying for strike action for the first time. Responding to the announcement by the ruling body Unire that there will be a 40% cut in prize money and racecourse revenue across the board in 2012, industrial action has been mooted for Jan. 1. Talks are currently ongoing in Rome between Unire and a collection of representatives of the country's tracks, as well as owners, trainers and jockeys in a bid to find a resolution.

GERMANY



GESTUT ISARLAND FOR CLOSURE

Gestut Isarland, famed for being the breeder of Monsun (Ger), is to be closed by the end of this year by its owners, the city of Munich. Explaining the situation, Stud manager Ulrike Castle said, "The political situation of the Stud as a lease object has become more and more difficult. Also, there is the problem of the figures in German racing and breeding being down significantly, with in our case the number of mares being covered each year declining. The nomination fees are down as well and the domestic market is not easy either, so we were always reliant on the market." One of Germany's most traditional stud operations, the 72-year-old Gestut Isarland was at one time regarded as the most economically successful of its kind. Aside from breeding the outstanding racehorse and stellar sire Monsun, it has been responsible for the likes of the 1999 G1 Preis der Diana heroine Flamingo Road (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}), the Group 1-winning champion miler and sire Waky Nao (GB) and the top stayer Flamingo Paradise (GB) (Rainbow Quest). Castle also stood the subsequent Australian champion sire Scenic (Ire) for a year at the beginning of his career, as well as the leading sire Law Society for many years. The operation's current resident stallion Desert Prince (Ire) will continue his career at the leading Italian operation Allevamenti della Berardenga, while the Stud's own broodmares have already been mostly sold.

MUNDRY TAKES TIME OUT

Germany's prolific young German trainer Torsten Mundry has announced that he will be out of action for the immediate future after reportedly suffering from "burn-out syndrome." The news came in a statement from Gestut Brummerhof's owner Gregor Baum, breeder of this year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe heroine Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) and one of the major owners at the Warendorf-based yard. Mundry, who is 40, started his current career in style only three years ago with his leading inmates being this year's G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis victor Durban Thunder (ger) (Samum {Ger}) and last year's G1 Preis der Diana heroine Enora (Ger) (Noverre).
