There's something for everybody in today's stacked GI CashCall Futurity at Hollywood Park. Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert will be represented by a trio, including GI Del Mar Futurity hero **Drill** (Lawyer Ron). The dark bay looks to get back on track following a 10th-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Nov. 5 and a disappointing seventh-place finish as the 2-1 favorite in the GIII Delta Jackpot Nov. 19. Baffert, a five-time winner of this event, also sends smart maiden winner **Sky Kingdom** (Empire Maker) and Real Quiet S. victor

**Liaison** (Indian Charlie). "This is when you start thinking of the Kentucky Derby," Baffert told *Daily Racing Form*. "I wasn't really pointing for this race after Delta, but once [Drill] got back [to Santa Anita], his last two works were really good." ★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Empire Way** (Empire Maker), a full-brother to GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic heroine Royal Delta, stretches to two turns following a close sixth in the GIII Hollywood Prevue S. Nov. 24. He broke his maiden in style 11 days prior to making his stakes debut. **Blingo** (Artie Schiller), an eye-catching debut winner over the Hollywood spinach Nov. 25, switches to the all-weather here. **Cozzetti** (Cozzene) invades for the Dale Romans barn following a five-length graduation in the Churchill slop Nov. 16. **Majestic City** (City Zip), winner of the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S. in July, returns to his preferred surface after finishing 13th in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Nov. 5. **Field**, p4

## CHURCHILL TO ALLOW AE'S FOR DERBY

Churchill Downs will permit four also-eligible entrants for the 2012 GI Kentucky Derby and GI Kentucky Oaks, it was announced Friday. The decision comes on the heels of late scratches of I Want Revenge (Stephen Got Even) and Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie) in the past two Run for the Roses. A maximum of 20 horses is allowed to compete in the Derby; the Oaks is limited to 14 starters. Also-eligible horses would be permitted to run if there are scratches from either race prior to their shared official scratch time of 9 a.m. on Oaks day.

"There has been significant discussion in recent years regarding also-eligible entrants for the Kentucky Derby and Oaks," Churchill Downs President Kevin Flanery commented. "Our concerns have always focused on preliminary wagering on the Kentucky Derby permitted during our Kentucky Oaks Day racing program, including refunds of wagers on scratched Derby horses and potential confusion during those two special days among our massive crowds of bettors."

Flanery continued, "Also-eligible horses for Oaks will have nearly three days of opportunity to get into their race, while the Derby's window for also-eligible entrants to participate is just under 48 hours. We feel strongly that the deadline for also-eligible horses to join the Derby field must be set before preliminary wagering on the race begins. Despite the more limited window for also-eligible horses for the Derby, this system provides owners and trainers an opportunity to keep their Derby dreams alive that has never existed before."

## JOCKEY CLUB UNVEILS RULINGS DATABASE

The Jockey Club announced yesterday the launch of Thoroughbred Regulatory Rulings, a searchable online database of rulings on Thoroughbred trainers from racing regulatory authorities. The web address is [thoroughbredrulings.com](http://thoroughbredrulings.com).

"In response to recommendations from the recent McKinsey study, Thoroughbred Regulatory Rulings is one part of a strategic initiative to develop new information resources to assist owners and other decision makers in our industry," explained James L. Gagliano, president and chief operating officer of The Jockey Club. "This website was created as a service to the industry to make regulatory information more easily accessible. Over time, we will add more features to this database and eventually migrate it into a new, comprehensive website for owners."

Alex Waldrop, president and chief executive officer of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, added, "Providing access to regulatory rulings is an important part of maintaining the overall integrity of our sport. Our fans and owners have told us repeatedly that they desire greater transparency, and this new website is clearly a step in that direction."

The design of the Thoroughbred Regulatory Rulings database features extensive sort and advanced-search functions supporting queries of the data, including regulatory authority, date range, trainer name and track/association.

Thoroughbred Regulatory Rulings currently includes approximately 12,000 Thoroughbred trainer rulings from 33 U.S. racing jurisdictions.

## NJ DEAL IN THE WORKS?

It's been a rollercoaster week for New Jersey horsemen, but things appear to have ended on a positive note Friday. *Daily Racing Form* is reporting that, according to representatives of the New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, a tentative agreement has been reached with Gov. Chris Christie that will allow for Monmouth Park to

conduct a 141-day meet in 2012 while the state re-opens the bidding for a long-term lease of the Oceanport oval.

Earlier in the month, real estate developer Morris Bailey backed out of a deal to lease Monmouth Park--which is owned by the state-controlled New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority (NJSEA)--after horsemen and Christie clashed over details of an original agreement reached in June. Horsemen said Christie reneged on a deal to allow them control over Thoroughbred dates originally licenced for The Meadowlands, while Christie said horsemen pushed a last-minute request for a 2012 purse subsidy--something he's adamantly opposed to.

On Tuesday, Christie held a press conference and threatened to shutter the track if the horsemen and the NJSEA couldn't come to some kind of an agreement before Monday. On Thursday, Oceanport Mayor Mike Mahon offered for the borough to act as a "transitional vehicle" until a new lessee was found.

According to *DRF*, the pending deal calls for Monmouth purses to be funded strictly through handle in 2012. Last season, the track conducted an "Elite Summer Meet," with purses boosted significantly from \$30 million in subsidies.

According to the *New Jersey Star-Ledger*, Monmouth employs approximately 1,600 people at the height of the season and pays \$1.84 million annually in property taxes to Oceanport.

**SEVERAL CHANCES IN THE PELLEGRINI**

**Perfect Shirl** (Perfect Soul {Ire}), the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf champion, awakened enormous expectations with her planned--then cancelled-- participation in today's G1 Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini at San Isidro, but her absence will not detract from South America's most important race. With the filly gone, a field of 23 will face the starter, and the lack of a true standout among the bunch should make for an interesting and evenly matched renewal. **Es Richard (Arg)** (Espaciado {Arg}) carries a three-race winning streak into today's 2400-meter test, including a Group 2 win over 15 furlongs in August and most recently a 12-length victory over **Blues for Me (Arg)** (Missionary) and **Sin Respeto (Arg)** (Caesarion {Ire}) in the G3 Clasico Progreso over heavy ground Oct. 8. "The horse is in great shape and we have the highest expectations," commented his trainer Julio Penna, cousin of U.S. trainer Angel Penna Jr. "I hope for more rain; that can only help his chances." The defection of Perfect Shirl leaves Haras La Providencia's **Jumbalaya (Arg)** (Pure Prize) as the field's lone female, and she is certainly in with a chance on the strength of her win over **El Serioite (Arg)** (Missionary) in the G1 Gran Premio Copa de Oro over today's distance Nov. 11. Victorious in the G1 Estrellas Distaff this past June, she will square off with another winner from that program in the form of G1 Estrellas Classic hero **Star Runner (Arg)** (Southern Halo), who makes his first start in nearly seven months. In the day's supporting Group 1s, **Curioso Slam (Arg)** (Grand Slam) rates the best chance in the Joaquin S. de Anchorena going 1600 meters, while **Dona Ley (Arg)** (Orpen) could be the one to beat in the 1000-meter Feliz de Alzaga Unzue. **La Laguna Azul (Arg)** (Orpen) was amazing by winning the G1 Gran Premio Enrique Acebal by 15 lengths and faces 2010 Mare of the Year **Catch the Mad (Arg)** (Catcher In the Rye {Ire}) in the Copa de Plata over 10 furlongs.



**Palermo Opens Turf Course...**

Palermo Racetrack in Buenos Aires, Argentina, hosted its first-ever grass races Friday afternoon, following two years of construction. "I was worried, like with any first time," commented Antonio Bullrich, president of the track's racing commission. "But thanks to God, everything is going pretty great. Palermo has made a huge effort to make this happen and this is their reward." The first race, aptly titled the 'Especial Inauguracion,' was conducted over 1600 meters and was won by the Juan Carlos Etchechoury-trained **Real Best (Arg)** (King's Best), who was ridden to victory by Uruguyan Pablo Falero. He defeated **Imaginante (Arg)** (Interprete {GB}) by a head with **Gladstone (Arg)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) another head behind. A total of three turf races were carded Friday.

**Making the Scene...**

Another very interesting day in Argentina. Thank goodness for the "cafe con leche" and the "media lunas" (croissants with a sweet glaze) to get the day started. It is true that dinners in Buenos Aires run late into the night. At restaurants the food often doesn't reach the table until at least 11:00 p.m.

I promised a bit of inside information yesterday on the contenders, so here goes...

**Star Runner:** The son of Southern Halo is trained by the old school "entrenador" Ernesto Romero. Romero is like a combination of Mel Stute and Bobby Frankel, with a bit of D. Wayne Lukas thrown in. His colt won the Estrellas Classic last June (the Breeders' Cup Classic of South America) and hasn't started since. The blood bay has been nursing a sore foot, but Romero feels like he's ready to go. Star Runner worked in 1:00 flat on the innermost training track this week, which is considered very fast for that dirt oval. This is a top-class horse in South America and should be respected.

**Veraneio:** This big bay looks incredible. I visited with the Brazilian contingent on Friday morning and when they kindly led the colt out of his box for us to see, I was smiling from ear to ear. Wow, and this is only a 3-year-old. He will only get bigger and stronger and he's already pretty big and strong now. Veraneio has a very strong looking back and hind end, a big barrel, and reminds me of my all-time favorite horse, who is also Brazilian and a dual Grade I winner, Siphon. His trainer, Estanislau Petrochinski Jr. won the Pelligrini last year with Xin Xu Lin, and said that this horse is just as talented. Veraneio is my pick in the Pelligrini.

**Val Champ:** A son of Val Royal, Val Champ, for trainer Jorge Valdivieso is a steel gray color and is not extremely big. His trainer was a jockey here in Argentina for 33 years, and was leading rider in the country eight times. Val Champ was disqualified twice in his career, including last time out in the G1 Gran Premio Nacional. Valdivieso says that the colt loses attention when he passes horses, and crossed the wire first last time out in very easy fashion. Val Champ threw one of his brand new shoes Friday morning while galloping a mile and a half. His trainer says the foot is ok, and that Val Champ loves any distance past a mile and a quarter.

**Jumbalaya:** Just 3 years old, this tall bay filly beat the boys last time out in the G1 Gran Premio Copa de Oro at San Isidro. She is just the kind of filly that you would picture in a classic painting--tall, angular, regal, and plain bay. She looks so good that it was hard to take my eyes off her. The interesting part is that the connections feel more confident in the chances of her stablemate, Video Game, who has been working extremely well in the morning. The listed trainer, Humberto Paez, is actually the assistant trainer to Jose Alvez, who is serving a suspension.

Good luck in the Pelligrini, and remember to watch it live on HRTV at 5:40 ET. I will be sending interviews and reports in the hour leading up, and catching up with the winning connections after.

## OBITUARIES

### STOLLERY, OWNER/BREEDER, DEAD AT 64

Gordon Stollery, one of Canada's most successful businessmen and the owner of the successful Angus Glen Farm, died unexpectedly Monday while vacationing

in the British Virgin Islands. He was 64. Stollery's best racehorse was probably Canadian juvenile champion Talkin Man (With Approval), whom his family co-bred with Kinghaven Farms Limited. Racing under the name of Kinghaven and Stollery's mother Helen, Talkin Man won Woodbine's Swynford S.,

Grey S. and Coronation Futurity by a combined 16 1/4 lengths in 1994 before running 10th in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Churchill. The next spring, he opened his 3-year-old campaign with a seven-length win in the GII Gotham S. at Aqueduct, then won the GII Wood Memorial S. by nearly eighth lengths ([video](#)). He was made the 4-1 second choice in the GI Kentucky Derby, but could do no better than 12th to Thunder Gulch. He went unplaced as a 3-1 chance in the GI Preakness S. two weeks later and never raced again. Talkin Man is the sire of Better Talk Now, winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Lone Star in 2004.

Stollery's father Arthur established Angus Glen in Ontario in 1957. In addition to Talkin Man, the farm produced 11 other stakes winners, including Kennedy Road and Lauries Dancer. The former won the Queen's Plate in 1971 and the GI Hollywood Gold Cup two years later. Kennedy Road was recognized as Canada's Horse of the Year in 1973, and was named champion 2-year-old and 3-year-old and was twice named champion older horse.

Lauries Dancer, by Northern Dancer, was named Canada's Horse of the Year in 1971, the same year in which she swept Canada's Filly Triple Crown and came to the U.S. to win the Delaware Oaks and Alabama S.

Stollery kept mares at both Walmac and Gainesway. "Gordon was a true gentleman, and a very creative guy," said Walmac's John T.L. Jones, III. "He loved horses and was actively looking for another farm until the time of his death. Gordon left behind many close friends, and he will be missed."

A scratch golfer, Stollery helped build a golf course at Angus Glen on some of the original horse paddocks. His father Arthur began the project in the early 1990s, and when Arthur passed away in '94, Gordon took over. The Angus Glen Golf Club opened in 1995, and that year was named the best new course in Canada by *Golf Digest*. Glen Angus has hosted two Canadian Opens.

Stollery helped foster a family-like atmosphere at Angus Glen, and a tribute on the club's website yesterday read, "Gordon was a man who, to a person, the staff of Angus Glen knew they could talk to, joke with, and feel listened to. He will be missed not only because his passion gave life to the dream of his father, but also that he was loved by those he touched, and his spirit will guide everything we do."

A Princeton grad, Stollery made his biggest impact in the business world. He was the former chairman of Northstar Energy Corp., and chief executive of Morrison Petroleum Ltd. He also founded several companies in Canada's oil patch, including Highpine Oil & Gas, OGY Petroleum Ltd., Storm Energy Ltd. and Canadian Gas Gathering Systems Inc. Arthur Stollery was a mining entrepreneur and the son of the well-known Toronto clothier.

He is survived by his wife, Judy Lorenz, and seven daughters. Funeral arrangements were not immediately available.

**How long have you been with OBS and what are some of the things you've worked on previously?**
