BELINGUIER WINS FRANCE GALOP BALLOT

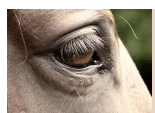
Bertrand Belinguiet has been elected President of France's racing authority, France Galop, after gaining an overall majority in the first round of elections staged at

Boulogne Billancourt yesterday. All 50 members of France Galop's committee were balloted and Belinguiet's 28 votes easily defeated Jean d'Indy's 14 and Edouard de Rothschild's eight. Belinguiet's four-year term of office begins with immediate effect and his

nomination of Loic Malivet and the vanquished Jean d'Indy as Vice-Presidents was ratified by the committee. Belinguiet previously served as President of the PMU between 1997 and 2009. Malivet, current President of the Syndicat des Eleveurs (Breeders' Association), will also act as Chairman of the Flat while d'Indy will occupy a similar role responsible for the National Hunt sphere. France Galop confirmed its Board of Administration's 12 members and also announced betting turnover had exceeded €10-billion this year.

Centralintelligence on course for Malibu

Centralintelligence (Smarty Jones) appears on course for Saturday's GI Malibu S., Santa Anita's opening day event of the winter/spring meet. Campaigned by a group headed by Amerman Racing Stables LLC, Bongo Racing Stable and Gary Finder, the \$90,000 KEESEP yearling purchase is trained by Ron Ellis. "He ran well over the track and he's an improving horse," said Ellis. A 3 1/4-length winner of his career debut on the dirt going six furlongs at Santa Anita Sept. 30, the chestnut was a close-up second behind the well-regarded Smash (Smart Strike) going a sixteenth longer over Hollywood's CushionTrack Nov. 27. In his latest work, the 3-year-old went six panels in 1:13 4/5 at the Inglewood oval. "He's been working at Hollywood, and he'll stay there until he's finished training for the race and ship to Santa Anita to run," confirmed Ellis.

The Cashcall Futurity fell to Liaison, an Indian Charlie colt with no duplications in the first four generations of his pedigree. The sires of his first three dams include Victory Gallop and Gleaming, so only A.P. Indy--sire of his second dam Indy Flash--is widely represented in America's gene pool. The names of Mr. Prospector, Northern Dancer and Raise A Native don't appear until Liaison's fifth generation, so they would be back in the sixth generation of Liaison's progeny if he ultimately earns a place at stud, as seems likely.

Over in Japan the Asahi Hai Futurity was won decisively by Alfredo, an unbeaten grandson of Kris S. As the concept of shuttle stallions means that pedigrees in the Southern Hemisphere are becoming more and more like our own, I remain convinced that the future will see us looking to Japan for some different bloodlines, such as though embodied in Alfredo.

While Alfredo's 4x4 inbreeding to Hail To Reason makes him far from an outcross in Japan, his pedigree is free of such ubiquitous occidental forces as Raise A Native, Mr. Prospector, Danzig, Danehill and Sadler's Wells. His only line of Northern Dancer comes via the many times champion Japanese stallion Northern Taste, sire of Alfredo's third dam, Sakura Hagoromo.

The Asahi Hai Futurity is firmly established as Japan's most important juvenile event. Its history also highlights how rapidly Japanese racing has changed in recent years. When I reviewed the pedigree of the 1997 winner Grass Wonder in the *Sporting Life*, I pointed out that eight of the first nine finishers were well-connected youngsters bred in the USA. Compare this to Sunday's 16-runner edition, which was contested entirely by colts conceived and foaled in Japan.

Does this change reflect the fact that Japanese racing and breeding have simply become more self-sufficient, or is it another indication of the suspicion which surrounds the modern American-bred?

While the latter may be a factor, I would say the change is more a reflection of the rewards that the Japanese have reaped from importing so much high-class bloodstock over the years. This is similar to what happened in Europe after so many top quality American-bred yearlings were imported during the 1970s and '80s. With the likes of Sadler's Wells, Danehill, Green Desert, Caerleon, Rainbow Quest and Machiavellian among the imports, breeders quickly had access to American bloodlines, but with the reassurance of knowing that these bloodlines had proven themselves under local conditions.

It almost goes without saying that the driving force behind the change to self-sufficiency in Japan has been Sunday Silence. Seven sons of this American Horse of the Year supplied eight of the 16 runners in Alfredo's race, and it was a Sunday Silence mare, Princess Camellia, which produced Alfredo. This was the fourth consecutive year that a daughter of Sunday Silence has been responsible for the winner, and the fifth time in all.

It's worth pointing out that the first two finishers in both the 2009 and 2010 editions of the Asahi Hai Futurity all went on to Group 1 success and there is every reason to expect Alfredo to continue to shine after the age of two.

He is a son of Symboli Kris S., who was bought in utero in Kentucky by Narvick International on behalf of Takahiro Wada. The price for Symboli Kris S.'s dam Tee Kay was \$300,000 in 1998. As might be expected of a son of Kris S., Symboli Kris S. improved with age. After winning a newcomers' race from only two juvenile starts, Symboli Kris S. developed into Japan's champion three-year-old of 2002, when he won the Tenno Sho (Autumn) and Arima Kinen. He won the same two Group 1 races as a 4-year-old, when *Timeform* rated him a world-class 132.

Symboli Kris S. currently holds fourth place on Japan's combined leading sires' list, behind King Kamehameha, Kurofune and Deep Impact. As he finished third in 2009 and fourth in 2010, he is firmly established among the leading sires. It is interesting that he usually also ranks among the leading sires of dirt runners, one of his best being Success Brocken, who--like Alfredo--is out of a Sunday Silence mare.

Although Symboli Kris S. thrived over a mile and a quarter and a mile and a half, some of his best winners have displayed more speed, including his sons Strong Return and San Carlo, both of whom have won group races over seven furlongs this year at the age of five. Interestingly, these two are both out of grand-daughters of Mr. Prospector, by Smart Strike and Crafty Prospector, respectively.

Alfredo is just the latest in a long line of important Japanese winners from the Roberto male line. Roberto's Florida Derby winner Brian's Time sired Asahi Hai Futurity winners Meiner Max and Narita Brian (who went on to win the Japanese Triple Crown). Then there was Silver Hawk, sire of Grass Wonder, the 1997 winner who in turn sired the 2008 winner Seiun Wonder.

If Alfredo can build on his excellent juvenile record, he will be much in demand as a stallion. You can quickly gauge the quality of his bloodlines from the fact that his yearling half-brother by Deep Impact sold for the equivalent of around \$800,000 in July.

Alfredo's third dam Sakura Hagoromo (out of the American import Clear Amber) was a sister to Amber Shadai, a top-class middle-distance winner who developed into a successful sire. Alfredo's second dam, La Traviata, is also a sister to a leading stallion, namely Sakura Bakushin O.

Speed was Sakura Bakushin O's main asset, as he showed with a pair of victories in the G1 Sprinters S. over six furlongs. Sakura Bakushin O has passed on his speed to the likes of Grand Prix Boss, Shonan Kampf (a Group 1 winner over six furlongs) and She is Tosho, Dasher Go Go and Kanoya Zakura (all Group 2 winners over six furlongs).

This stallion's record might raise a few doubts about whether Alfredo will stay well enough for the Japanese Triple Crown races, which start at a mile and a quarter. On the plus side, all four of his great-grandfathers--Roberto, Gold Meridian, Halo and Sakura Yutaka O--scored over at least a mile and a quarter. He could be an exciting prospect.

Tai Chi Pointing to French Classic...

Germany's leading juvenile colt **Tai Chi (Ger)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) will make his first start of his 2012 campaign in May's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp. He also holds entries in June's G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly, and July's G1 Deutsches Derby at Hamburg. Gestut Hachtsee's bay, a Werner Baltromei trainee, bagged a career-high win Germany's most prestigious freshman event, the Oct. 16 G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten at Cologne, and was a last-out third in the Nov. 12 G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud. His success in the Oct. 9 Ferdinand Leisten-Memorial, a valuable domestic auction race, also helped him become Germany's winningmost 2-year-old with earnings of €242,995.

Hollywood Meets Finishes with Increases:

Edited Press Release

Field size and handle on races run at Hollywood Park increased from a year ago during the 26-day Autumn meet, which concluded Sunday. Handle was \$151,319,791 compared to \$132,933,380 during a comparable six week period in the 2010 season, which began one week earlier and included two days of Breeders' Cup simulcasts. Average daily live race handle increased by 9.5%. The average field size in 2011 was 7.89 starters per race compared to 7.33 a year ago. The average daily Southern California on-track attendance declined 5.1% from 9,680 in 2010 to 9,187. The 2010 meet did include a Zenyatta appreciation day (Dec. 5), however, that attracted a Southern California attendance of 17,868. "We're very pleased that wagering on our live product was up over last year," said Hollywood Park President Jack Liebau. "The larger fields definitely contributed to the increase." The final day of the meet featured a record shattering Player's Pick 5 pool. Chasing a record carryover of \$183,594 generated during the GI CashCall Futurity program Saturday, bettors wagered an additional \$1,226,324 Sunday, creating a total pool of \$1,409,917. The previous high total Pick 5 pool was \$907,117 May 12. This followed a carryover of \$107,487 May 8. A 50-cent minimum bet with a 14% takeout, the Player's Pick 5 made its debut Apr. 21, opening day of Hollywood Park's Spring/Summer meet.

There were 635 winning tickets in the Player's Pick 5 Sunday--each was worth \$1,948.25. Oakhart Racing and Benjamin Warren tied for the top spot in the owners' standings with four wins. In earnings, Arnold Zetcher, who won the GIII Hollywood Prevue S. with So Brilliant and the Real Quiet S. and GI CashCall Futurity with Horse of the Meet Liaison (Indian Charlie), led with \$504,480. Jockey Joel Rosario won his third Autumn title in a row, finishing with 37 winners, four more than Rafael Bejarano. Both Rosario and Bejarano had four stakes victories. Bejarano finished on top in earnings with \$1,690,868. Mike Mitchell won his third Autumn training title and his seventh overall at Hollywood Park. Mitchell wound up with 18 wins, leaving him two clear of Doug O'Neill and three in front of Bob Baffert, who led the Spring/Summer meet earlier in the year. The championship was Mitchell's first locally since he led the Spring/Summer season in 1997. Baffert, who won the CashCall Futurity for a record sixth time was the runaway leader in both stakes victories (five) and earnings (\$1,139,180). The only other trainers who had more than one stakes win were Pender and John Sadler--each had two. Jerry Hollendorfer was second in earnings with purses totaling \$624,870.
