An evenly-matched field of 11 was drawn for Monday's GI Malibu S. at Santa Anita. Hall of Famer Bob Baffert sends four, led by **The Factor** (War Front).

The GI Pat O'Brien S. hero looks to get back on track following a disappointing fourth-place finish in the GI Ancient Title S. Oct. 8 and an eighth-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile Nov. 5. Baffert will also be represented by GII Carry Back S. runner-up **Smash** (Smart Strike). The bay returned from

that July effort with a Hollywood allowance win over **Centralintelligence** (Smarty Jones) Nov. 27. **Associate** (Wando) looks like an interesting wildcard here. Haltered for \$35,000 off trainer Linda Rice and Whitehall Stable in July, the chestnut rolled by 10 3/4 lengths in his first attempt at Belmont for the Rick Dutrow Jr. barn in September, good for a 104 Beyer. Owned by JMJ Racing Stable LLC and Sullivan Lane Stable, Associate will be tested for class following an eye-catching eight-length tally in a restricted \$50,000 optional tagger at Aqueduct Nov. 11.

Posthumous Success for Carl...

When Liaison won last Saturday's GI CashCall Futurity at Hollywood Park, he represented another notable achievement for the late William A. Carl, who bred the

son of Indian Charlie in Kentucky. It was Carl's second Grade I winner as a breeder in as many years, following the success of Shared Account (Pleasantly Perfect) in last season's GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf. He also bred the 2010 GIII Affirmed S. winner Golden Itiz (Tiznow).

Carl, who founded Old Colony Insurance Service and for years ran the insurance company with partner (and one-time son-in-law) Nick Strong, passed away in January of 2009 at the age of 78.

"His biggest success has come since his passing, and it is a shame to have that kind of success and not be here to enjoy it," Strong said earlier in the week. **Cont. p2**

Carl also bred and raced the 2008 GIII Bashford Manor S. winner Screen Your Friends (Friends Lake). Other homebreds included Golden Itiz's half-sister Sapphire N' Silk (Pleasant Tap), a two-time graded winner in 1999 and later the dam of the Carl-bred Shaniko (A.P. Indy). Sold by Carl for \$550,000 as a FTSAUG yearling, Shaniko won the GII Kentucky Cup Classic for Aaron and Marie Jones.

"It was his passion," Strong said. "He truly loved the horses. He wasn't a golfer, he didn't have a whole lot of hobbies--he just loved the horses."

Carl launched Old Colony in 1964 and managed the portfolios of some of the biggest names and operations in Thoroughbred racing, both in the U.S. and around the world.

"Back in the '70s, he started buying fillies to race," said Strong. "Although he had some success with colts, fillies were really his game. If they were successful, he'd keep and breed them, and he bred to the best stallions. He really created his own success"

In the early '80s, Carl began his owned racing and breeding operation, Wakefield Farm, on a former cattle farm on Pisgah Pike. He later sold it to the Preston brothers, who renamed it Prestonwood, before WinStar ultimately acquired the property in 2000.

At the time of his passing, Carl had roughly 25 mares boarded at Ben Berger's Woodstock Farm, including Galloping Gal. Carl purchased the daughter of Victory Gallop for \$50,000 as a KEESEP yearling in 2002. Trained by Ken McPeck, Galloping Gal won the Jessamine County S. and ran second in the GII Alcibiades S. at Keeneland in 2003 and won Churchill's Edgewood S. the following year. Retired to Carl's broodmare band, she produced two foals before striking paydirt with Liason, who was purchased by Arnold Zetcher for \$290,000 at the 2010 Keeneland September Sale. **Cont. p3**

Also there was Silk N' Sapphire (Smart Strike), a half-sister to the aforementioned Sapphire N' Silk and Golden Itiz. A minor winner on the track, Silk N' Sapphire produced GSP Mark of Success (Mt. Livermore), her first foal, then hit paydirt herself with Shared Account, her third. Carl had purchased Golden Ity (Dixieland Band), dam of Silk N' Sapphire, et al, and second dam of Shared Account, for \$32,000 at the 1991 Keeneland September Sale.

Though Carl wasn't around to witness Shared Account's win in last year's Breeders' Cup, his friends and family members reveled in his achievement. "We were at Churchill when Shared Account won, and it was a dream come true," said Strong. "She was carrying on his tradition."

Mark Brooking, director of research and marketing at Taylor Made, met Carl back in 1991, and for nearly 20 years acted as an advisor. "It was more a friendship than anything," said Brooking. "He and I met when I was with Overbook, and he was doing a lot of work with the farm and with [D. Wayne] Lukas."

The first horse Carl and Brooking purchased was the Damascus mare Breezy Stories, acquired for \$62,000 at the 1991 Keeneland November while in foal to Storm Cat. A few years later, in 1995, her 5-year-old daughter Desert Stormer (Storm Cat) won the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, and in '97, Carl sold a Tabasco Cat yearling three-parts sister to Desert Stormer for \$1.05 million.

"When he passed, Mr. C and I had been together for a long time, and he was very much a father figure to me," said Brooking. "He was well-known in the business, but he got things done very quietly. And he accomplished some interesting things. He bred Dixie Union's first stakes winner. He bred El Prado (Ire)'s first winner. He bred Pleasantly Perfect's first graded winner."

Over the years, Carl became close friends with many of the industry's big hitters: Dogwood's Cot Campbell, Airdrie Stud's Brereton Jones and Lane's End's Will Farish. In addition to Bruce Gibbs's Greenfield, Carl sold through Lane's End--Liaison and Shared Account were both grads--and frequented the farm's stallions.

Carl's estate has now dispersed the vast majority of his bloodstock holdings. Galloping Gal, bought back for \$120,000 at the 2009 Keeneland November Sale while carrying a full-sibling to Liaison, was purchased privately shortly thereafter. Sadly, she died before producing a foal.

Carl left behind four daughters--Betsy Strong, Sarah Monell, Jennie Carl-Howard, and Molly Thomas--as well as seven grandchildren. For the family, having a legitimate horse on the Kentucky Derby trail is a huge thrill, and if he indeed lines up on the first Saturday in May, a fitting tribute to his memory.

REPENT TO CLOVERLEAF FARMS Multiple graded stakes winner **Repent** (Louis Quatorze--Baby Grace {Arg}, by Cipayo {Arg}) has joined the stallion roster at CloverLeaf Farms II in Reddick, Florida. The 11-year-old stallion, winner of the 2002 GII Louisiana Derby, is the sire of multiple graded stakes winner Crown of Thorns, who recently retired to CloverLeaf. He has also sired graded stakes winners Atoned and Diva Delite. Repent, who began his sud career at CloverLeaf, was the leading freshman sire in Florida in 2007, and stood last year at Vinery New York. "We are excited about Repent's homecoming at CloverLeaf and believe he will be a leading sire in Florida for many years to come," said CloverLeaf owner John Sykes. "It is absolutely vital to note that all of his success at stud up to this point has come from Florida mares, including his leading 2011 crop of 2-year-olds that are sure to be exciting 3-year-olds next year. So we feel that Repent is returning at the right time and will offer Florida breeders great value in 2012." Repent will stand the 2012 season for a fee of \$3,000, stands and nurses. NYRA Lowering Takeout:

The New York Racing Association Inc. has announced that takeout on Trifecta, Superfecta, Grand Slam, Pick 3, Pick 4, and Pick 6 wagers will all be lowered by two percentage points. The change was made to correct an unintentional oversight in which NYRA's takeout for exotic wagers was one point above the statutory limit. The changes will go into effect for the races at Aqueduct Wednesday, Dec. 28. NYRA's new takeout menu is as follows:

- 15% - Pick 6 (non-carryover pools)
- 16% - Win, Place, Show
- 18.5% - Exacta, Quinella, Daily Double
- 24% - Trifecta, Superfecta, Grand Slam, Pick 3, Pick 4, Pick 6 (carryover pools)

Julian "Buck" Wheat Dead At 78:

Julian "Buck" Wheat, who was a revered figure at Churchill Downs after spending more than six decades working and playing in various capacities there, died Wednesday after falling severely ill Tuesday at his Louisville home. He was 78. Wheat began working at Churchill in 1949 while still in high school before branching out into other racing-related endeavors including training, while entrenching himself at Churchill and raising a family in Louisville. He ultimately endeared himself to countless numbers of horseman as the director of horsemen's relations for Churchill, earning the unofficial title of "mayor of the backstretch." Three-time Kentucky Derby-winning trainer Bob Baffert, who befriended Wheat in the early 1990's, said Wednesday from California that "everybody loved Buck. He was a huge part of the Kentucky Derby experience. Whatever you needed, that was Buck, that was his main thing. It really won't be the same going back there without Buck Wheat." Wheat was honored in numerous ways by horsemen's groups and industry organizations, including the 2001 Dominion Award from Dogwood Stable for meritorious service of the racing industry. Survivors include his ex-wife, Barbara, as well as three grown children and several grandchildren. Funeral arrangements are pending, although Churchill spokesman John Asher said a memorial service would not be held until after the Christmas holiday.
