**THE FACTOR TOO FAST IN MALIBU**

It was already hard to find a major race in Southern California that Hall of Famer Bob Baffert hadn't won--usually many times over--before George Bolton and Fog City Stables's **The Factor** (War Front) eliminated one of the few remaining events on Baffert's 'to win' list with a powerful exhibition of speed in Santa Anita's GI Malibu S. yesterday. **ORFEVRE BEATS ELDERNS IN ARIMA KINEN**

If there was any doubt as to Japan's Horse of the Year coming into Sunday's G1 Arima Kinen at Nakayama, **Orfevre (Jpn)** (Stay Gold {Jpn}), who this season became the country's seventh Triple Crown winner, settled the matter with a decisive victory in the crown jewel of Japanese racing.

"The horse was calm entering the track for the post parade, so I knew he would do well," said winning jockey Kenichi Ikezo. "We fell behind a bit at the break and had to race farther back on the inside than I had wanted to, but I was able to steer him to the outside on the backstretch. I moved him forward through the third corner, and the colt stretched really well, outrunning his rivals in the final stretch. He's still a young horse--he was born later than the horses of the same age group--but he is growing and getting better day by day. He is an amazing horse." **Cont. p3**

**Factor Back...**

The Factor broke his maiden by 8 1/4 lengths with a gaudy 108 Beyer Figure on this card a year ago, and followed it up with a track-and-trip victory in the GII San Vicente S. in February. He showed the ability to carry his plentiful speed over a route of ground when grabbing Oaklawn's 1 1/16-mile Rebel S. Mar. 19 by 6 1/4 lengths from champion 3-year-old male contender Caleb's Posse (Posse), but was a no-show seventh in the GI Arkansas Derby at odds-on a month later. Baffert opted to play it safe with his star and bypass the Triple Crown races, and the roan rewarded him with a victory over elders in Del Mar's GI Pat O'Brien S. Aug. 28. Backed down to a justified 2-5 in the GI Ancient Title S. here Oct. 8, the speedster was used up battling through a :43.80 half-mile, and faded to fourth. He was part of a similarly hot pace last time in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile at Churchill Downs Nov. 5, and could do no better than eighth.

Out of the box like a shot from his far outside post, The Factor was unhurried by Martin Garcia, conceding the early edge to a headstrong **Centralintelligence** (Smarty Jones). The Factor soon grew restless, however, and he ranged up three-wide to contest an opening quarter in :22.61 with stablemate **Hoorayforhollywood** (Storm Cat) also in hot pursuit. **Centralintelligence** began throwing his head about inside approaching the half, and quickly dropped back to last after bothering **Hoorayforhollywood**, giving The Factor a clear lead of about a length and a half turning for home. **Rothko**, who also encountered a bit of trouble during the incident with **Centralintelligence**, appeared in with a chance to run down The Factor in the lane, but his challenge was quickly dismissed and the favorite was home free. **Associate** came from last to grab a piece. **Centralintelligence** was eased out of the race, but did not appear to be injured. The Factor's winning time of 1:19.89 was .19 seconds off the track record set by Twirling Candy in last year's Malibu.

"It's exciting to win the Malibu," said Baffert. "It's a great race, some great horses have won it, some great trainers. It was lacking on my resume. I can put it on my website tonight." He continued, "The Factor, you could tell he was just kicking in gear at the end there. When The Factor runs his race, it's going to be tough to really beat him. The Factor we know showed up today."

Winning rider Garcia offered, "I decided to let him run and put me wherever he wanted to put me, and look at what he did. I didn't want to go to the rail today. I wanted to stay a little bit off and if somebody wanted to go, I just let them go and stayed outside. I don't think there was a horse that could beat him today, he was really sharp."

Trainer Steve Asmussen, who also saddled eighth-place finisher **Wine Police** (Speightstown) and ninth-place finisher **Light Up the Score** (Even The Score), was pleased with Rothko's runner-up showing in his first stakes try. "I wish it could have been a little smoother for him around the turn, but he ran a good race. I'm very pleased with who he is," said Asmussen.

A crowd of 44,579 were on hand for Santa Anita's traditional opening day card--the most since 1994.

**Ofevre Beats Elders cont..**

The even-money choice facing a field that included reigning Horse of the Year **Buena Vista (Jpn)** (Special Week {Jpn}) and last year's winner **Victoire Pisa (Jpn)** (Neo Universe {Jpn}), Orfevre hadn't raced since his historic score in the G1 Kikuka Sho (Japanese St. Leger) at Kyoto Oct. 23. Away from post nine under Ikezoe, the chestnut relaxed under cover toward the back of pack, some 10 lengths off **Earnestly (Jpn)** (Grass Wonder)'s early pace. They continued through an easy gallop as Victoire Pisa and Buena Vista tracked in second and third, respectively, before the pace quickened on the final turn. Orfevre, produced on the outside in upper stretch, still had five lengths to make up, but lowered his head determinedly and ate up ground with each stride. He finally hit the front in the final 200 meters and outfought a dead-game **Eishin Flash (Jpn)** (King's Best) and the running-on **To The Glory (Jpn)** (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) to the wire. The win margin was 3/4 lengths, with another neck back to third. Earnestly, in the mix until mid-stretch, faltered to be 10th, while Buena Vista came home a one-paced seventh, one spot ahead of Victoire Pisa.

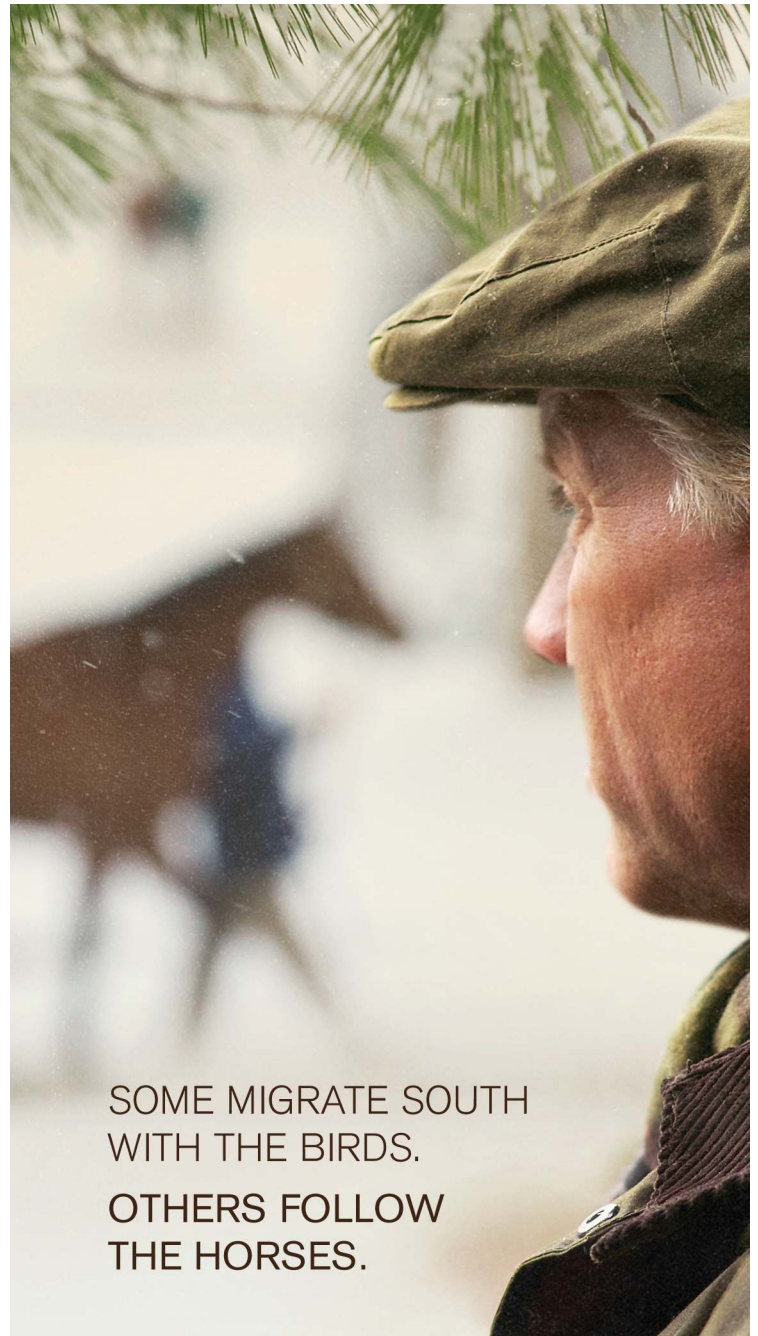

**Historic Campaign...**

Orfevre finished second and then third in consecutive Group 3 events last January and February, but hasn't been bettered since taking the 1800-meter G2 Spring S. at Hanshin in late March. The real story of his 2011 campaign began on Apr. 24 at Tokyo Racecourse, when he stretched out to win the 2000-meter G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) by three lengths. In a race originally scheduled for Nakayama, but moved because of the massive earthquake and tsunami that devastated the region, Orfevre was a relative outsider at 9-1, but he soon proved the Classic win was no fluke. A little over a month later, he returned to Tokyo to take the May 29 G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) by 1 3/4 lengths, this time as the 2-1 favorite. Given the summer off, Orfevre made his return in the 2400-meter G2 Kobe Shimbun Hai at Hanshin Sept. 25, and promptly won by 2 1/2 lengths as the odds-on choice. The win set him up perfectly for his attempt at Japan's Triple Crown in G1 Kikuka Sho (Japanese St. Leger) over 3000 meters at Kyoto Oct. 23, and Orfevre was once again at his best, putting in his customary powerful late run to win going away.

**The Age Old Question...**

With Orfevre's dominance over his fellow sophomores beyond question, trainer Yasutoshi Ikee opted to pass on an initial attempt at older horses in the G1 Japan Cup Nov. 27--a race won by Buena Vista--and instead point toward the end-of-season Arima Kinen. "During the short break he was given after winning the Kikuka Sho, he was able to loosen up and relax," said Ikee. "His conditioning went smoothly after returning to the Ritto Training Center, and everything went well up to this race. He lost some weight when he arrived here, but I lost all doubts after seeing how he was with my own eyes."

Ikee, who also saddled third-placed To The Glory and fifth-placed **Tosen Jordan (Jpn)** (Jungle Pocket {Jpn}) in the Arima Kinen, was securing a landmark win after saddling Orfevre's full-brother Dream Journey (Jpn) to victory in the 2009 renewal. Dream Journey, who two years earlier was crowned champion 2-year-old colt, was named that season's champion older male. They became the first siblings to win the race, and Orfevre is now just the third 3-year-old to claim the event. Meanwhile, it was Ikee's fifth Group 1 title of the year--in addition to Orfevre's four, he notched the G1 Tenno Sho (Autumn) with Tosen Jordan--which ties the JRA record.

"He was off slow and traveled on the rail, but the jockey was able to steer him out in the backstretch, and I knew then that he would get the job done," Ikee said of the running. "As I've said before, we are aiming for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, but are also examining the possibilities of racing him in Dubai in March." **Cont. p5**

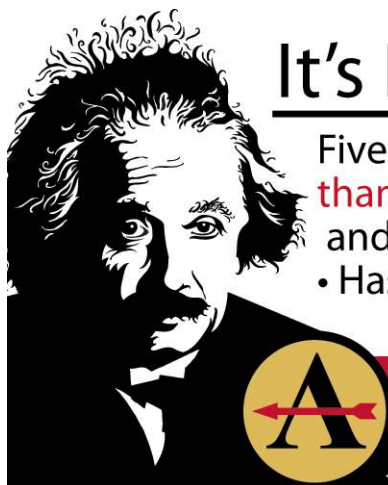

The many backers of Mr. Commons might have found themselves cursing pilot Mike Smith in midstretch as the heavy chalk searched for running room with a head full of steam, but the Hall of Fame jockey would soon garner applause for his bravery, as he and his mount burst through a seam and exploded in the run to the line for an ultimately facile success in Santa Anita's co-opening day feature. "Since I got through it was great," explained Smith. "I've learned that you can point this horse at a wall and he'll run through it if you ask him to. He really does everything you tell him, so normally when you're that big of a favorite you'll probably go around, but I was going to be able to cut the corner and make up three lengths. All I need is a very small seam with him." Cont. p6

Mr. Commons was an impressive second-out winner down the hill here in January, and reported home third in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 9 after a main-track allowance tally in late February. His graded stakes earnings weren't enough to get the big bay into the GI Kentucky Derby, and he was eighth in the GI Preakness S. May 21. Mr. Commons hit the bench after that, but returned over the sod in style to annex Del Mar's Oceanside S. July 20. He came up just a nose short against accomplished veteran Caracortado (Cat Dreams) in the GII Del Mar Mile H. Aug. 27, and filled the same slot when 3/4 of a length behind Jeranimo (Congaree) in the Oct. 8 GII Oak Tree Mile over this track and trip. Mr. Commons was fifth with an eventful trip in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile last time Nov. 5.

Content to bide his time from second-to-last as **Comma to the Top** (Bwana Charlie) posted impossible splits of :22.75, :45.75 and 1:09.14, Mr. Commons moved up with ease in between horses and in striking distance at the head of the lane. After a few tense moments, he swerved in slightly and rushed through a hole between the tiring frontrunner on the rail and **Ultimate Eagle** in the three path. At that point, the only question was margin of victory.

"It was good to have Mike Smith back in the saddle like that," offered trainer John Shirreffs. "Whatever Mike wants to do, I'm just fine with that. It's better to have a win on opening day than to have your first one on closing day. [Mr. Commons] recovers very well and has been training forwardly all along."

St George Farm is the nom de course of Ian Banwell, a former Bank of America executive and founder of North Carolina-based Round Table Investment Management Company. Banwell established his 100-acre farm near Lexington in 2006, and named it after the patron saint of horses and horsemen.

Adam's Peak remained undefeated here while giving his young sire another top prospect for 2012. Coming off a first-out maiden victory at Hanshin three weeks prior, the brown colt jumped well from the inside draw and settled along the rail in third. He drove through an opening in the stretch to take the lead 100 meters out and pulled away to win clear. Victorious jockey Christophe Lemaire commented, "He is a very smart horse. Team Valor International's GI Kentucky Derby winner **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) had his first workout on the comeback trail for trainer Graham Motion Saturday morning over the main dirt track at the Fair Hill training center in Maryland. Going in company, Animal Kingdom breezed three furlongs around the far turn in :38 flat. "It was like an open gallop for him," said Motion. "He went in company just to keep his mind on business. I thought he handled it well." The chestnut colt has the 2012 \$10-million GI Dubai World Cup Mar. 31 as his initial goal--Motion plans to give the Derby winner a prep, either in Florida or at Meydan Race Course. "It's all up to the colt and how quickly he gets himself into shape," Motion added. "I'd like to run him in a race like the [GI] Gulfstream Park Turf H. Feb. 11, but if he fails to make that race, we always have the option of sending him over to Dubai early and giving him a race over there." Animal Kingdom won the Kentucky Derby, finished second in the GI Preakness S. and was injured at the start of the GI Belmont S. The Kentucky-bred underwent surgery to stabilize a non-displaced hairline fracture of a hind leg.

The Canadian-born trainer Michelle Nihei got her Boxing Day present in the form of two winners on yesterday's card at Gulfstream. The 2-year-old filly **Donnatale** (Tale of the Cat), a homebred for Susan Atkin's CASA Farms I, kicked things off with a stylish three-length tally facing maiden special foes in the day's third race. In the fifth, the Nihei-trained **Woodford Belle** (Arch), a 4-year-old miss making her U.S. bow off a long break, rallied from second last to win a grassy optional claimer.

The pair caught bettors a bit off guard--they went off at 8-1 and 7-1, respectively--but Nihei wasn't among the surprised. "I had Donnatale up in Saratoga earlier in the year, and I fully expected to be able to make a start with her there, but we just hit a couple bumps in the road," Nihei said yesterday at the conclusion of racing. "It was just typical 2-year-old stuff. But Susan, who also owns [GISW] Prince Will I Am (Arch), is so wonderfully patient with her horses that it gave us the chance to step back and take our time. Once we got her on the right road, she never took a bad step. Every single time I asked her to do something, she did it the right way. If you were writing a book on how to train a horse, you'd give her schedule."

Since being sidelined from serious training at Saratoga in mid-July, Donnatale had only six published works, her last a modest five-furlong drill from the gate in 1:02 flat. The tab may not have revealed much, but Nihei knew her filly was primed for a big effort. "She had a huge foundation under her--I've had her in training since February--so I knew where she was fitness-wise," she said. "I really did expect good things from her today."

Nihei said the next obvious step would be a first-level allowance, but left the door open for a possible crack at stakes company. "I'm going to keep all my options open," said Nihei. "That's sort of an obvious way to go, but with an early 3-year-old, who knows? Johnny V even got off her and said, 'I love her!' And the more distance the better with this one. She's like driving a car--she loves to relax, she'll do whatever you want her to, she's brave, and she's not flustered by anything. She's a Classic-distance horse in the making, I think."

Woodford Belle had a much different profile with eight starts under her belt, though she hadn't faced the starter since running third in a Kempton Polytrack handicap last August. "She was in Europe, and she had some sorting out to do when she got here, but luckily for me, she had a good bottom, and we were able to find her the right spot," said Nihei. "Within the first couple of days of training her, I knew that Edgar Prado was going to be the guy to ride her. Really. I think those two were meant for each other."

Nihei said Woodford Belle's next start would fit two criteria: long and on the turf. "She'll definitely stay the distance, so her next start will certainly be surface and distance relative," she said. -LM

**Task Force Recommendations For Retired Racehorses:**

The New York State Task Force on Retired Racehorses has recommended New York's tracks and Resorts World Casino New York City to collectively dedicate at least one-half of one percent of commissions from video lottery gaming revenue to racehorse retirement efforts. This could total more than \$3.13 million annually based on 2010 and future revenue projections. In addition, the task force suggests owners should be prepared to pay \$400 per month for at least six months to support a transition, retraining and placement program for retired horses. The report also states, "New York's horse racing industry and its participants--not the better public or taxpayers--must take the primary responsibility for the after care of retired racehorses. Industry stakeholders, including owners, breeders, race tracks and trainers must address the fiscal challenges of ensuring quality aftercare for racehorses." The panel was created by--state lawmakers--in order to identify productive and beneficial uses for retired racehorses and ways of utilizing private and public funding to place them in their new roles.
