'SINSATIONAL' WIN CAPS TRYING WEEKEND

When **Shez Sinsational (NZ)** (Ekraar) ran down favored Veyron (NZ) (Thorn Park {Aus}) to win Monday's G1 Zabeel Classic at Ellerslie, it capped an emotional and tragic weekend for trainer Allan Sharrock. The conditioner's father, Bob Sharrock, a co-owner of the 4-year-old filly, suffered a heart attack

Christmas Eve, while his sister Doris was killed in a car accident the same day. Then, after leading Shez Sinsational back to the winner's enclosure to have their picture taken following the victory, the filly rammed Sharrock hard into a steel pole. Having snapped a seven-race losing streak in

Monday's weight-for-age event over 2000 meters, Shez Sinsational seems likely to be pointed for major Cups events at home and across the Tasman Sea. One near-term option in New Zealand figures to be the G1 Stella Artois Auckland Cup at Ellerslie Mar. 7, though Sharrock has his sights set on *the* Cup--the G1 Melbourne Cup in November. A trip to Australia last season yielded a third in the G1 Queensland Oaks June 4 followed by a narrow defeat when runner-up in the G1 Queensland Derby a week later.

NUMBERS UP ON SANTA ANITA OPENING DAY

Santa Anita enjoyed its best opening day crowd in 17 years when 44,579 went through the turnstiles

Monday. The on-track handle was \$4,246,752.

Twelve months ago, a crowd of 34,268 wagered \$3,851,594.

Despite favorites The Factor (War Front) and Mr. Commons (Artie Schiller) sweeping

the late double, a series of longshots prevailed earlier in the card, and there will be a carryover of \$148,184 for Thursday's program. "We knew it would be big because of reservations and the national holiday," track president George Haines told *Daily Racing Form*. "We knew it was strong, but we were a little surprised. There were opening-day problems that we hoped we wouldn't have."

MONSUN NAMED CHEF-DE-RACE

Gestut Schlenderhan's stellar sire **Monsun (Ger)** (Konigsstuhl {Ger}--Mosella {Ger}, by Surumu {Ger}) has become the 218th sire to be elected to the list of "chef-de-race" sires. The triple Group 1 winner and Germany's 1993 Horse of the Year has proved himself as an outstanding sire influence worldwide, most especially imparting stamina and stoutness, and is rightly regarded as one of his country's all-time greats. He is the best representative of the cross of Konigsstuhl on to mares by Surumu, with these two being leading sire influences themselves, and is also one of the few sires to gain the honor during his lifetime. Monsun was retired to stud in 1996 and his tally of group winners currently stands at 42, including 14 at the highest level. That tally includes 2005 G1 Breeders' Cup Turf hero Shirocco (Ger) and this year's top U.S. grass female Stacelita (Fr). He has been responsible for 11 Classic scorers, plus another 41 separate stakes winners. As a damsire, daughters of Monsun have produced six group winners and eight listed winners to date, including the Classic and Group 1-winning champion Night Magic (Ger) (Sholokhov {Ire}). Three sons of Monsun have sired group winners from their first crops, with Manduro (Ger) being the sire of this term's G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud winner Mandaeon (GB). Samum (Ger) has already sired four individual Group 1 winners, including 2010 G1 Prix Royal-Oak heroine Be Fabulous (Ger).

ECLIPSE AWARDS 2011

Since 1994, only five trainers have won the Eclipse Award for Outstanding Trainer. Bill Mott won back-to-back awards in 1995-96, the Cigar years. Then Bob Baffert won three in a row, 1997-99. The late Bobby Frankel, who had won it once before, in 1993, added four in a row, 2000-03. Then it was the Todd Pletcher era, with four wins in a row from 2004-07, followed by a fifth last year, in 2010. Steve Asmussen, who I thought deserved it the year he broke the record for most wins, has won twice, in 2008-09.

That string isn't likely to be broken this year: through Monday's racing, according to the *Daily Racing Form* website (www.drf.com), the three top trainers by

money earned are Todd Pletcher (\$17m), Steve Asmussen (\$16.2m), and Bob Baffert (\$14.3m). But this year I'm voting for the number four by money earned (\$10.6m), Bill Mott. It's his turn again, for producing Royal Delta to deliver on the Friday in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic (and clinch the 3-year-old filly championship; and help enhance her price tag, ultimately \$8.5 million, three days later), and

following up on Saturday to produce 2010 GI Belmont S. winner Drosselmeyer, at 15-1, to run a lifetime best and only win what is arguably the most important race in North America, the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. That's what you call a "Money" trainer; they were ready to run for their lives on the day that counted most of all. Great training performance.

Pletcher, Asmussen, and Baffert, with 10 Eclipse Awards among them, are all great trainers, and Baffert led all trainers with 10 Grade I wins this year. But my vote for second for the Eclipse Award goes to Aidan O'Brien, who saddled the winners of seven Grade I races in North America this year--second only to Baffert--including three Grade I wins by the guaranteed turf champion, Cape Blanco; and Breeders' Cup wins by St. Nicholas Abbey (GI Breeders' Cup Turf) and Wrote (GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf)--from just 25 starts. And for third place, I went for Graham Motion, who produced Animal Kingdom to win the GI Kentucky Derby in the horse's first career start on dirt. I see Graham as a finalist this year, and a certain future winner.

Those of us who are privileged to have a vote in the Eclipse balloting take it very seriously, as I'm sure you know, but that doesn't mean many of the key categories are all that clear-cut. This year, in particular, there's almost a vacuum at the top in three key categories: top 3-year-old colt; top older male; and Horse of the Year. You know this is the era of fan participation, so by all means let us know your selections, especially in those categories. Our votes aren't due in until Jan. 3, so who knows, maybe you will make a convincing case that will sway me, or some other random Eclipse voter who might read and agree with your reasoning. So, more or less in the order in which we voters get the PP's from the *Daily Racing Form*, here are my choices, and why...as of now.

2-Year-Old Colt and Gelding: 1. Hansen (Tapit);
2. Union Rags (Dixie Union); 3. Secret Circle (Eddington)

REASONING: Two years ago Lookin at Lucky got the Eclipse Award even though he was beaten a head, drawn 13, in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile; but he had won two Grade 1s going into the race, and added a third afterwards in the GI CashCall Futurity. I don't think Union Rags, who was beaten a head after a wide trip from the 10 hole, will get the nod over Hansen, who held him off to remain unbeaten and win the Juvenile. The contest is

clearly between them. I put in the new Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint winner Secret Circle for third, though plenty of others could get a mention. Secret Circle was remaining unbeaten in three, and won the race with a respectable 95 Beyer number--actually a tick faster than the Juvenile's 94.

2-Year-Old Filly: 1. My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike);
2. Stephanie's Kitten (Kitten's Joy); 3. Grace Hall (Empire Maker)

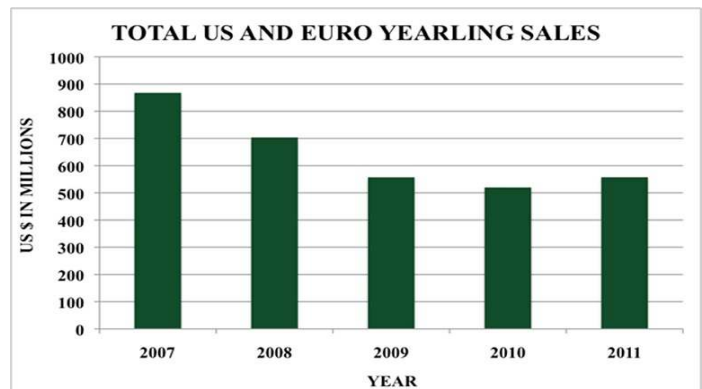
REASONING: A no-brainer; she should probably be a unanimous choice. My Miss Aurelia went 4-for-4, including decisive wins in the GI Frizette and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. I think Stephanie's Kitten looks a clear second, with wins in the GI Darley Alcibiades on the all-weather and the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. I picked the previously unbeaten GI Spinaway winner and Juvenile Fillies second Grace Hall for third spot (we have to pick a first three in all categories to determine finalists).

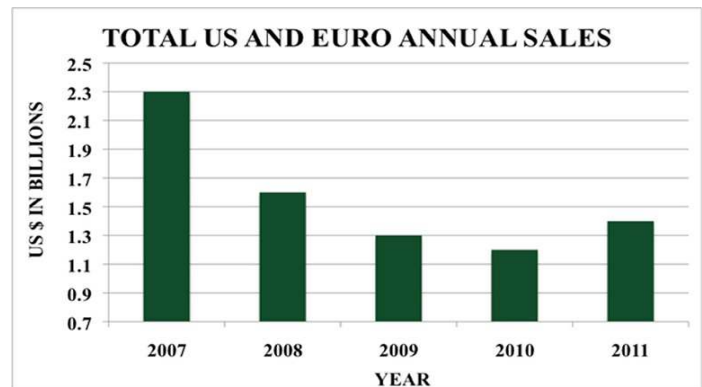
Weekly Sales Ticker

"We measure the vast majority of significant North American and European auction sales for this feature, so it is important and reliable news to say that this thoroughbred auction market, which declined 47% in gross terms, from \$2.2-billion in 2007 to \$1.2-billion in 2010, rebounded by 18%, to \$1.42-billion, in 2011. From the days of rampant overproduction, the number catalogued has dropped by 27%, and the number sold by 25%, since 2007. The average for the more than 22,000 sold this year was 17% below the 2007 average, suggesting the cuts have been most severe in the bottom ranges." – Bill Oppenheim

3-Year-Old Colt and Gelding: 1. **Caleb's Posse** (Posse); 2. **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux); 3. **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie)

REASONING: This is as difficult and controversial a decision as the 2-Year-Old Filly category is a slam dunk.

Traditionally, as one observer put it, this is a category for 'two-turn' horses. But each of the Triple Crown races and the Travers was won by a different horse. Shackleford (Forestry), who won the GI Preakness,

contested nine consecutive GI/GII races, finishing in the first four in five of them, and certainly gets the award on durability. But

Caleb's Posse, who had earlier won the GI King's Bishop in Uncle Mo's comeback race, decisively defeated Shackleford in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile. Caleb's Posse's two-turn form isn't that much to write

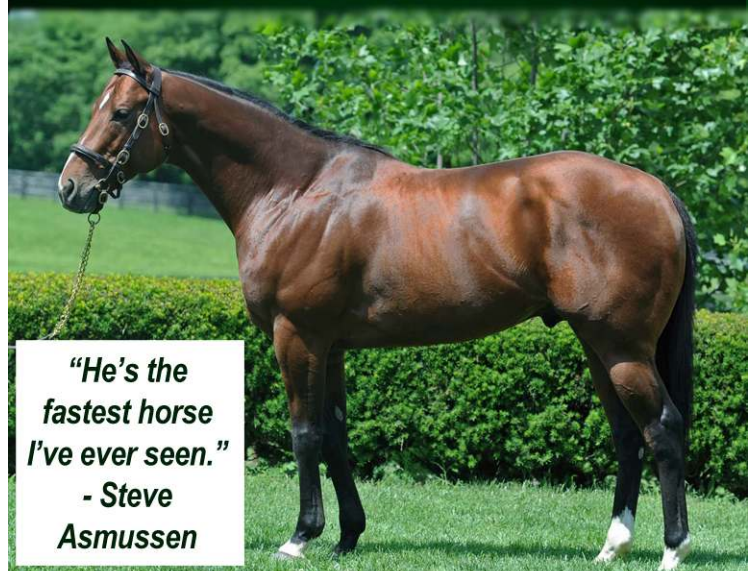
home about comparatively, but his one-turn form, beating Uncle Mo, then Shackleford, looks to me like the best form among the 3-year-old males. Animal Kingdom may win this division anyway. Uncle Mo did not win a Grade I at three, but his potentially rain-assisted 118 against his elders in the GII Kelso H. was deeply impressive, and the best Beyer run by a high-class 3-year-old all year.

3-Year-Old Filly: 1. **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker); 2. **Zazu** (Tapit); 3. **It's Tricky** (Mineshaft)

REASONING: Royal Delta was beaten by It's Tricky and Plum Pretty (Medaglia d'Oro) in the GI Coaching Club American Oaks at Saratoga, but decisively reversed the form four weeks later in the GI Alabama at the Spa. She was then second to the year-older Havre de Grace in the GI Beldame, and Mott brought her back to concert pitch to win the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic, with It's Tricky second and Plum Pretty fifth. The form is rock solid. My second spot goes to the Tapit filly Zazu who hit the board in all seven 2011 races, all Grade I or Grade IIs, and including two Grade I wins. I thought It's Tricky deserved third. **Cont. p5**

REASONING: Another really difficult category, because, as with the 3-year-old colts, no one horse really

dominated. True, Tizway never won a Grade I until he was a 6-year-old; but neither had Speightstown, and that hasn't stopped him making a sire. Tizway won two top New York Grade Is, the Met Mile and the Whitney, running Beyers of 111 and 113, respectively. Unfortunately he was injured and had to be retired, so was unable to contest the Breeders' Cup. Nonetheless, his form looks the best to me. Drosselmeyer,

who after all had won the GI Belmont S. as a 3-year-old, ran the two best Beyers of his life in his last two races, and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic set up for him. No, his numbers weren't great, but nobody liked Birdstone (winner of the Champagne, Belmont, and Travers, not dissimilar to Drosselmeyer) until he sired two Classic winners in his first crop. Flat Out ran in six Grade Is and a Grade II in his last seven starts, for a 2-2-1 record in those races; consistent.

Older Female: 1. Havre de Grace (Saint Liam); 2. Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision); 3. Awesome Maria (Maria's Mon)

REASONING: Havre de Grace gets the nod here (and underlines what a loss her sire Saint Liam was, siring just one crop) by virtue of beating the boys in the GI Woodward, hammering 3-year-old Royal Delta in the GI Beldame, and running a game fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. She traded wins with Blind Luck in their two meetings this year, but her form outside those two meetings was really strong. Awesome Maria won four graded races, including the GI Ogden Phipps in four starts in 2011, but didn't race after June.

Male Sprinters: 1. Caleb's Posse (Posse); 2. Amazombie (Northern Fleet); 3. Regally Ready (More Than Ready)

REASONING: Here is another tough category. Amazombie proved a real six-furlong dirt specialist, going 4-for-4 at six or six and a half furlongs on the dirt at Santa Anita and Churchill Downs; so he is probably the favorite to win the division, especially after his ultra-impressive win in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Churchill. But I'm still going for Caleb's Posse, on the grounds that this can also be defined as a 'one-turn' category. That's open for debate, I know. Impressive GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint winner Regally Ready merits a mention as well. **Cont. p6**

Female Sprinter: 1. Hilda's Passion (Canadian Frontier); **2. Musical Romance** (Concorde's Tune); **3. Sassy Image** (Broken Vow)

REASONING: This didn't seem to me a particularly strong category. Hilda's Passion won four graded races, including the GI Ballerina, and ran the fastest Beyers-- which, in my book, means she was the fastest horse. Musical Romance did not run a Beyer of 100 (Hilda's Passion did four times), but ran 14 times during the year and won the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint. Sassy Image won twice at the top level, the GI Humana Distaff and the GI Princess Rooney over Musical Romance.

Male Turf Horse: 1. Cape Blanco (Galileo); **2. Acclamation** (Unusual Heat); **3. Turrallure** (Wando)

REASONING: This should be unanimous: Cape Blanco ran three times in North America and won three Grade I races: the Man O'War, the Arlington Million, and the Turf Classic, the latter after sustaining an injury in the race. Coolmore decided to stand him at Ashford in Kentucky, partially to see if they could establish Galileo as a sire of sires in Kentucky, and evidently the breeders are flocking to breed to him. Acclamation won his last five starts in California, all in Grade I and Grade IIs, four on the turf and one on the all-weather. Turrallure closed out the year with wins in the GI Bernard Baruch at Saratoga and the GI Woodbine Mile, and a bang-up second to Court Vision in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, outfinishing Goldikova. But Cape Blanco is a *lock*.

Female Turf Horse: 1. Stacelita (Monsun); **2. Dubawi Heights** (Dubawi); **3. Perfect Shirl** (Perfect Soul)

REASONING: Stacelita went off favorite for the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf off GI wins in the Beverly D. (defeating Dubawi Heights) and Flower Bowl. Dubawi Heights won Grade I's on either side of her defeat by Stacelita, so their form dominated four important Grade Is. Perfect Shirl only won one race in seven tries this year; it was the right one, but it's hard to make her champion.

Horse of the Year: 1. Tizway; 2. Cape Blanco; 3. Havre de Grace; all 4-year-olds and up. Let's see who steps into the breach in 2012.

First-crop starters to watch: Wednesday, Dec. 28

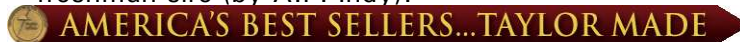
