showed in the first part of the season when she returns to the starting gate for Saturday's GI La Brea S. at Santa Anita. The winner of three of five starts earlier this term--including the GI Santa Anita Oaks and GI Test S.-- the bay finished runner-up

in the remaining two of the year in the GI Las Virgenes S. and GI Acorn S. Most recently, the filly faded late to finish a career worst fifth in the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint at Churchill Downs. Jockey David Flores, who has been aboard throughout the season, is slated to be back in the saddle come Saturday. "It was a rough start from right out of the gate," recalled Flores. "We got bumped pretty hard, but at that time, I was very comfortable. I just wanted to give her a chance and got her to relax, but the bumping started again before the five-eighths pole, right when we passed the chute. I was carried out and it was just too much bumping. She got her way through, but she made an early move and it was something I didn't want to do. But what are you going to do? You have to get over it and just move on."

Flores also accompanied the filly to post in all three starts at two, including a win in the GI Hollywood Starlet. "[Trainer] Mike [Puype] was very high on her from the beginning and I understand why. We've been very patient with her from the beginning and when the time comes for her to get serious in her races, she does the job very easily."

MINOR SETBACK FOR MY MISS AURELIA

My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike), impressive winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Churchill Downs Nov. 5, was discovered to have a small shin injury, according to published reports. Campaigned by her breeder Stonestreet Stables in partnership with Bolton, the \$500,000 KESEF yearling accounted for her first three career starts, including the Spa's GII Adirondack S. and GI Frizette S. at Belmont prior to her Breeders' Cup victory. Depending on her progress following her return to training, the GI Kentucky Oaks is listed among the early season goals for the leader of the juvenile filly division. The long-term goal for the filly will be the Breeders' Cup World Championships, which will be held at Santa Anita this fall.

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Centralintelligence OK after Malibu

Centralintelligence (Smarty Jones), who finished 10th after showing speed in the early going before dropping back abruptly in Santa Anita's opening day GI Malibu S., exited the seven-furlong test in good shape, according to co-owner Bob Feld, who represents Bongo Racing Stable. "He was sound after the race," said Feld Thursday morning from Clockers' Corner. "[Trainer] Ron [Ellis] jogged him and he seems fine. He'll probably walk for a week and then jog another week and we might look for a two-other-than [allowance race]."

Outlining his Malibu setback, Feld said, "We went from being in front to being eliminated, so that was very disappointing. It's hard to say what happened for sure, but Hoorayforhollywood was outside of us and, he came in and it looked like our horse shied from that. It looked like [Centralintelligence's jockey] Joel [Rosario] took hold of him and, at that point, he threw his head and we got shuffled way back. I really think that had that not happened, he would have been no worse than second and I think he'd have been head and head with [eventual winner] The Factor to the wire. I think he'd have made a race of it."

Prior to the Malibu, the sophomore gelding finished a close-up second in a Nov. 27 allowance at Hollywood Park.

BETFAIR APOLOGIZES FOR TECH GLITCH

Betting exchange Betfair has been forced to apologise to customers after a system error allowed one client's liability to exceed his available funds during the running of Wednesday's G2 Christmas Hurdle at Leopardstown. In what seemed an obvious technical glitch, some exchange players were still allowed to bet on the eventual winner, Voler La Vedette (Ire) (King's Theatre {Ire}), at the vastly inflated odds of 28-1 almost throughout the three-mile contest, and that erroneous price was still available as the 7-year-old mare crossed the line 4 1/2 lengths clear of her rivals. Betfair immediately suspended the win and place markets for the race and later confirmed those markets were to be voided. Over £800,000 had been accommodated at 28-1, which would have cost the unidentified layer a £23-million payout. Extraordinarily, another £21-million was still available to bet at the end of the race which would have resulted in a total payout of almost £600-million.

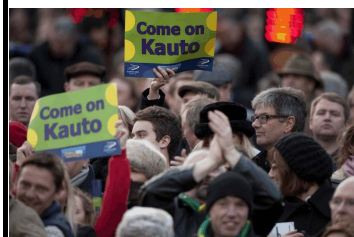

Betfair yesterday released a statement which read, "Firstly, we would like to re-iterate that anyone betting in-running in yesterday's Leopardstown race clearly received a very poor customer service and betting experience. We apologise once again for this. We have identified the issue and replicated it in a test environment last night. A fix was applied overnight, and is now subject to rigorous testing. A further update on this will be made today. Contrary to some media speculation, we can confirm that all in-running bets on this market would have been voided, had Voler La Vedette won or lost. There was never any chance of the account in question profiting yesterday. The account in question was also immediately suspended after the Leopardstown race. There has been some criticism from customers, and in the press, that Betfair took too long to void. Quite simply, we made the decision after we were in full possession of the all the facts and input from the relevant internal departments. A decision was then made to void in accordance with our terms and conditions."

WORLD CUP HERO VICTOIRE PISA RETIRED

Victoire Pisa (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn}--Whitewater Affair {GB}, by Machiavellian), who led home an historic 1-2 finish for Japan in this year's G1 Dubai World Cup, has been retired to stud at Teruya Yoshida's Shadai Farm, which also bred the colt. Victorious in the 2010 G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) and third in the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby), the grandson of Sunday Silence was a good third in the G1 Japan Cup before nosing out Buena Vista (Jpn) (Special Week {Jpn}) in the G1 Arima Kinen, earning honors as the country's champion 3-year-old colt. Following a soft win in the G2 Nakayama Kinen last February, Victoire Pisa was set for the World Cup, a race which took place just two weeks after a devastating tsunami struck the island nation. Near the tail of the field early, the bay whipped around horses to challenge mid-race under an enterprising move from jockey Mirco Demuro. He took command late and held off compatriot Transcend (Jpn) (Wild Rush) for an emotional success ([video](#)). A half-brother to SW and G1SP Asakusa Den'en (Jpn) (Singspiel {Ire}) and a 3/4-sibling to SW and GSP Swift Current (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), Victoire Pisa retires with eight wins from 15 starts and earnings of \$12,891,734. A retirement ceremony is set for Jan. 15.

HRTV EARNS ECLIPSE FOR ROMERO FEATURE

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association, *Daily Racing Form* and the National Turf Writers And Broadcasters announced Thursday that HRTV has won the 2011 Media Eclipse Award in the Television--Features programming category for its documentary "Inside Information: Randy Romero." The feature, which aired Dec. 26, 2010, chronicles the triumphs and lifelong struggles of the Hall of Fame jockey from Louisiana. This is the second consecutive Media Eclipse Award won by HRTV for programs which were written and produced by the network. Last year, HRTV won the Television--Features award for "Inside Information: Swale," the 1984 Kentucky Derby and Belmont S. hero winner. "Because of the subject matter--physical and emotional abuse, severe burns, the horrific breakdown of Go For Wand--this was a show that was emotionally hard on everyone who worked on it, but no more so than for the man who lived through the events," said Amy Zimmerman, executive producer of HRTV and the co-writer of the documentary.

Continued HRTV's Amy Zimmerman, "Everyone at HRTV is very grateful to Randy Romero for his honesty and assistance in letting us tell his story."

In addition to Zimmerman, production duties were handled by Phil Kubel, Steve Scheidler, and Kathryn L Beranich. Kristen Rocky was the field producer, who conducted interviews and directed the shoot of Romero and his friends and family in Louisiana. The documentary was narrated by Carolyn Conley.

An honorable mention in the Television--Features category this year went to NBC Sports for its "Keeneland History," segment on the 75th anniversary of Keeneland Race Course, which aired on the Autumn at Keeneland telecast, Oct. 15. Jim Carr was the producer.

Judges in the Television--Features category were Dave Johnson, television producer, host and longtime racing voice of the Triple Crown; Peter Lasser of Lasser Productions and Pat Scanlon of Shamrock Communications.
