BAUBLE QUEEN SPARKLES IN FRANKEL

Class Racing Stable's **Bauble Queen (Arch)** uncorked a tremendous stretch run to just get past pacesetter **Turning Top (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}) in the shadow of the wire and win Sunday's GII Robert J. Frankel S. at Santa Anita. Allowed to settle into stride early, Bauble Queen raced near the back of the pack as Turning Top took the field through fractions of :24.58, :49.27 and 1:12.78. Turning Top spurred clear of the field into the lane and looked home free, but Bauble Queen, tipped to the outside for the stretch run, produced a powerful late rally to earn

her first graded stakes victory by a half-length. "I was concerned about the slow fractions, but we have to be concerned about our filly and not let her get going too fast because she's a little on the excitable side," explained winning trainer Eric Kruljack. "I was thankful that Garrett [Gomez] was rating her and she was in a position by herself behind four horses with the five-horse in behind her. So I was reasonably comfortable even though the fractions were so slow." **Cont. p2**



HOLY HAT

Peachtree Stable's **Sacristy** (Pulpit) celebrated her third birthday in style, taking charge in upper stretch and inching clear late to score by 1 3/4 lengths in Sunday's GIII Old Hat S. at Gulfstream Park. The dark bay, sent off the 6-5 favorite, was shuffled back to last early in a tightly bunched field of seven sophomore fillies. She spurred into contention leaving the backstretch, rallied four wide to take the lead after five furlongs in :57.57 and reported home a confident winner. **Say a Novena** (Songandaprayer) was second and **Bet to Win** (Pulpit) was third. The time for the six furlongs was 1:10.97. "She was just spot on today," said winning rider Kent Desormeaux. "Her eyes were bugging out of the bridle. You could tell she wanted to be a racehorse when she was warming up and when the gates opened, she just ran out of there ready to go. She's one of those you really look forward to. I'm just thankful I get to ride a filly like that." **Cont. p2**

us out a little bit. I never had to give up any ground, though. I was sitting in behind them pretty easily the whole way. It was just a matter of if my filly would lengthen at all when we turned for home. As it worked out, it was in our best interest. My filly liked the mile-and-one-eighth for

the first time and was able to run them down."

A maiden winner over Hollywood's all-weather strip in June, Bauble Queen took a Del Mar turf allowance in July and was second in the Aug. 19 Sandy Blue H. and third in the GIII Harold C Ramser S. Oct. 16. She was coming off a third-place effort in the Dec. 4 GII Bayakoa H. at Hollywood.

Class Racing Stable is a racing syndicate run by Joe Masino and Tom Arndt. In addition to Bauble Queen, the partnership campaigned 2011 stakes horses Oilisblackgold (Tapit), Black Hills (Judge T C), Surrey Star (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), Major Art (GB) (Compton Place {GB}) and La Nez (Storm Creek).

"This is what it's all about--moving these young horses forwardly," commented winning trainer Wayne Catalano. "She was taking a step forward and we thought she might make it. She was training like she would."

Catalano said the Jan. 29 GII Forward Gal S. could be next for Sacristy and he added he doesn't think two turns will be a problem for the filly. "She should be fine [with two turns]," he said. "She relaxed back there and made a run. That's a good sign, right? It's a lot better to do it this way, rather than go to the front."

Reveron Wins Gulfstream Park Derby (cont. from p1)

Reveron gave trainer Agustin Bezara, a 10-time champion trainer in his native Venezuela, his first U.S. stakes victory and was the conditioner's third winner on Gulfstream's Sunday card from just a five-horse stable. "We think he is the best 3-year-old in Florida right now," Bezara said through an interpreter. "This is my first stakes win in the U.S. and the biggest day I've had since I came here two years ago." Bezara also won Gulfstream's third race with Pablo Gonzalez's Mommy's Image (Halo's Image) and the fifth race with Leoro Racing's Sweetlandofliberty (Anasheed).

As for what is next for Reveron, Bezara added, "We'll see how he comes out of it. He goes the [two-turn] distance. We'll consider the options." Bezara trains Reveron for hotel developer Walter Stipa, who was in Venezuela and missed his colt's stakes victory.

Reveron had made each of his previous starts at Calder, graduating with a six-length romp in his third try Nov. 5. He was coming off a 2 1/4-length allowance victory over seven furlongs Nov. 26.

Robert LaPenta's Casual Trick was making the third start of his career and first since breaking his maiden at Churchill Downs Nov. 18. "He ran very hard, but he was fighting me a little bit to pass that horse in the stretch," explained rider John Velazquez. "The winner was more experienced than mine and my horse was still a little green today.

"He just broke his maiden and was going two turns for the first time," Velazquez continued. "I think he's still learning. He actually handled the two turns really well. If he continues to mature and get better I think he's going to be very good."

PLETCHER, DOMINGUEZ LEAD 2011 EARNERS

Trainer Todd Pletcher, jockey Ramon Dominguez and owner Midwest Thoroughbreds led the 2011 North American earnings list, according to statistics released yesterday by Equibase Company LLC. Pletcher also led the earning's list in 2010, as well as from 2004-2007. He sent out the winners of 254 races from 1,016 starts for earnings of \$17,186,956. Runner-up was Steve Asmussen, who won 348 races from 1,681 starts for earnings of \$16,287,685. Bob Baffert, Bill Mott, Graham Motion, Jerry Hollendorfer, Mark Casse, Dale Romans, John Sadler and Mike Maker completed the list of top 10 trainers. Dominguez was also repeating as leading earner. He won 348 races from 1,424 mounts to earn \$20,264,822. Second in earnings was John Velazquez with 248 wins from 1,223 mounts and earnings of \$18,622,964. Rounding out the top 10 list were Javier Castellano, Joel Rosario, Rafael Bejarano, Julien Lejaroux, Luis Contreras, Garrett Gomez, Jose Lezcano and Patrick Husbands. Richard and Karen Papiieso's Midwest Thoroughbreds led the owners' list for the second year in a row, winning 418 races from 1,423 starts and earnings of \$6,307,278.

Runner-up was Kenneth and Sarah Ramsey with 114 victories from 490 starts and earnings of \$4,890,581. Completing the top 10 were WinStar Farm, George and Lori Hall, Zayat Stables, Repole Stable, Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith, Live Oak Plantation, Maggi Moss and Team Valor International.

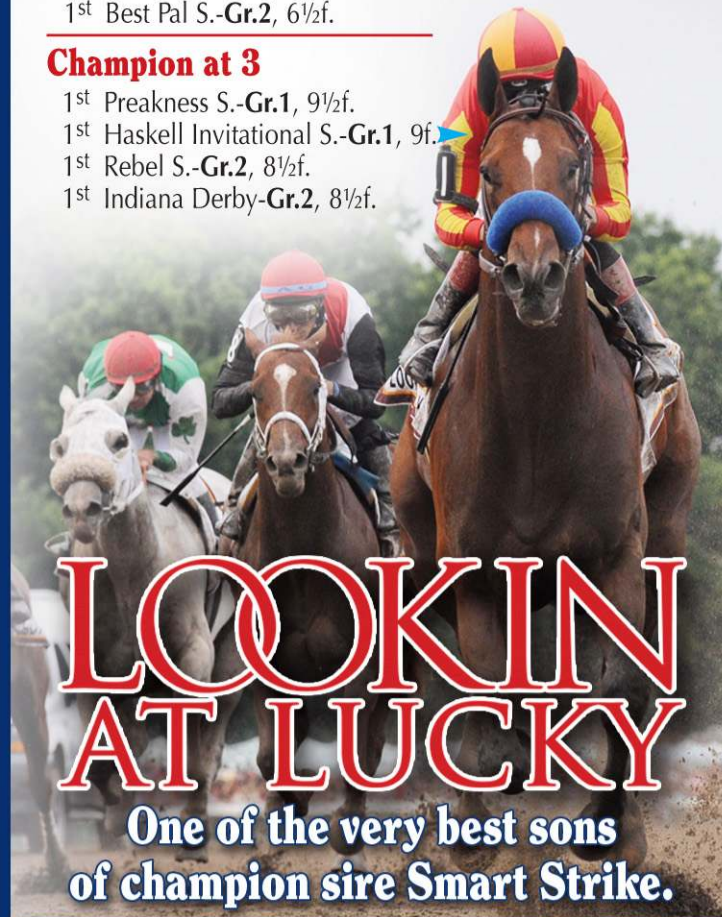

Cecil Expects Better from Frankel

Sir Henry Cecil has made it clear that he is looking for improvement from **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) as he ponders the brilliant Juddmonte-bred's 2012 campaign. With the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury in May and G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown in July penciled in at present, the unbeaten winner of five Group 1 contests and 2011 World highweight was the subject of an upbeat bulletin from his recently Knighted trainer. "Frankel gave us all a lot of pleasure," Cecil said. "He is doing really well and, touch wood, as long as he keeps right, he could be very exciting. He has grown up a lot and is getting much stronger--he is easier now and is learning how to race better. He is relaxing more, and I would be very disappointed if he isn't a better horse at four." Cecil also had news of Frankel's now 3-year-old full-brother **Noble Mission (GB)**, who was an encouraging second on his debut over a mile at Yarmouth in October. "He had sore shins in August and September and so was off for about a month, but I wanted to get a race into him," he explained. "It was very heavy that day at Yarmouth and he needed it, so he ran very well. He is a horse to look forward to and he will stay well. I think he'll definitely get a mile and a quarter, and maybe a mile and a half."

"The cowgirl's going to be just fine." That's what Peachtree Stable's John Fort said Sunday, a day after the operation's **Princess Arabella** (Any Given Saturday) dazzled in her career debut at Santa Anita. Given Peachtree's huge weekend--they also won the GIII Old Hat S. with the 3-year-old filly **Sacristy** (Pulpit) and sent out the 4-year-old colt **Troilus** (Speightstown) to his third straight win, both Sunday at Gulfstream--that Fort was most excited to talk about the maiden winner says plenty.

Princess Arabella, sent off the even-money favorite in a six-furlong maiden special weight, veered in sharply at the break and cost her herself six lengths. But once she got going, she pulled her way into contention on the far turn and swept past the rest on her way to a 3 1/2-length victory. By the time she reached the turn on the gallop out, she had put probably a sixteenth or more between her and the field. The final time of the race was 1:08 2/5 over the track's lightning-fast surface. That earned her a 93 BRIS figure--good but not great--but it was the style in which she won that has Fort dreaming big. As it turns out, though, the big chestnut has had Fort dreaming big for a while now.

"She tipped her hand very early," said Fort. "We hadn't had her a month on the farm last spring when we realized she was the best horse we had. She covers about a half a mile with every stride. Bob came out to the farm probably in March, and Plum Pretty was rolling along pretty well by then. I said to him, 'Bob, we're going to win the Oaks with this filly, too.' And he's never disagreed with me that we have a shot to do that."

The "Bob" is Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert, who conditions Princess Arabella, and who also trains **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro), who two months after Fort's prediction lived up to her half of the bargain by winning the GI Kentucky Oaks by a neck. Will Princess Arabella be able to give Peachtree the double? Time will tell.

Fort unearthed Princess Arabella, from the first crop of her Grade I-winning sire, at the 2010 Keeneland September Sale. He was scouting a few small consignments when the folks at Marty Takacs' Belvedere Farm pulled her out.

Fort was immediately impressed, and when he flipped open his catalogue, realized he knew the family as well as anyone. The filly's dam, Tortuga Lady (Thunder Gulch), was a full-sister to 2001 GI Kentucky Derby runner-up Invisible Ink, one of Peachtree's best runners. "I said 'Wow--how did fate direct me to this?'"

Despite the familiarity, Fort said he didn't make a play. "I had already bought three fillies at the sale, which is a lot for me," he said. "I thought she'd be expensive, and I just couldn't buy another expensive filly."

Fort's prediction was wrong. Bidding stalled out at \$47,000, and the filly was led out unsold. So he marched back to the barn and made an offer of \$50,000, contingent on her passing a vet exam. That's where the 'cowgirl' part of the story comes in.

"I sent my veterinarian out to vet her, and he went out to the farm she was at," Fort explained. "He called me and said, 'John, this is not a horse farm--are you aware of that? It's a cattle ranch. She's the only horse on the farm; it's all cows out here.'"

Fort said he'd noticed she'd been bred by an operation called Greenwich Cattle Company, but hadn't given it much thought. In any case, the filly passed the vet with flying colors. "All that my vet said was that she was kind of wild, and it didn't look like she'd been handled much," said Fort. "And that she had been out in a pasture with all the cows."

When she joined the rest of Peachtree's new purchases, the filly was still a little rough around the edges. "It looked like she just hadn't been around humans much, and she'd kick the whatever out of you if given the chance," he laughed. "But that wasn't her. As soon as we started handling her--within a week--she was just a big kitty cat."

While her attitude was changing, so too was her physique. "The remarkable thing about her conformation is that she was much higher behind than she was in front," said Fort. "She had a great big powerful hip and a nice straight hind leg. We thought if she ever grew up to that hind leg, she'd be a pretty big filly. And she has almost grown up to it. Bob measured her the other day and said she was 16.1 [hands], but that she's still growing."

Asked if the filly reminds him of Invisible Ink, Fort replied, "Not too much. This filly is leggier. She's taller right now than Invisible Ink, and she's a little longer through the barrel. He was a very pretty horse, but this filly is a better-looking horse, because she has a better range of motion. She gets her big hind leg up underneath her when she's galloping and propels herself with a beautiful stride. I don't know I've seen a horse with a stride like hers. I just hope she has the same class and stamina that Invisible Ink had. He was a wonderful-breathing horse, and a horse that would really relax. Unfortunately, his ankles weren't the soundest things in the world. I think we had to take chips out of three ankles. But he truly was a horse of the highest class.

"A mile and a quarter or a mile and an eight were right in his gunsight, and those distances are going to be just right for this filly, too," Fort added.

In fact, Fort's biggest surprise thus far with Princess Arabella might just be how quick she is. "If she had broke with the field, she'd have won by 10 and in 1:07 and change," he said. "But Bob kept telling me she was that fast. There are no secrets, especially at Santa Anita, and everybody and their brother knew how fast she was."

Princess Arabella will now likely make the jump right into stakes company, and Fort said he hopes to get a few starts into her before the GI Kentucky Oaks.

Princess Arabella's brilliance on Saturday shouldn't take away from Sacristy's win Sunday, and that filly should provide Peachtree a nice sprinter/miler this year. At least that's what Fort's hoping. "She's a very good filly," he said. "She's a very muscular filly, and I don't know whether that works for or against her going long. But it's hard to stay. Sometimes horses fool you in terms of how far they want to go. But I'm not in a big hurry [to stretch her out]. I'm not sure that's how you determine the quality of a horse, and especially for 3-year-old fillies, there are some really wonderful races going six or seven furlongs, races I'd just as soon win as some of the mile or 1 1/8-mile races."

As for Troilus, a horse going in the right direction into his 4-year-old season, Fort said that he too would make his next start in stakes company, with the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Feb. 11 a possible target. Troilus was winning his third straight since making the switch from Steve Margolis's barn to Marty Wolfson's. Fort credited the colt's streak to a "change in scenery and different training techniques." He explained, "He was trained a bit differently with Steve Margolis, who has success with his system. The Marty Wolfson system is long gallops and slow breezes, and Marty's got the horse to relax. I think his last three races have been extremely legitimate. We think he's a really nice colt. He doesn't look like your typical Speightstown--he's got a lot of length to him and looks like a horse who would go long."

And finally, Plum Pretty worked three furlongs in :35 4/5 at Santa Anita yesterday, her first move since running fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic at Churchill Nov. 5. "Bob says she's doing great," said Fort. "She had such a great 2011 and we just love her, and I hope we can win a few more Grade Is with her."

If anyone--Baffert included--thinks Princess Arabella has taken the mantle as Fort's sentimental favorite, think again. "Bob had said, 'I think Princess Arabella's going to be better than Plum Pretty,'" Fort chuckled. "And I said, 'Hey Bob, don't you throw down on my mare! One's a maiden winner, and one's an Oaks winner.'"

Still, he couldn't be more, em, bullish on Princess Arabella's future. "If she can hold her own out in the pasture with a bunch of cows, she'll do okay at the racetrack," he said. -L Marquardt
