NO BOUNDARIES

Darley Stable's homebred **Out Of Bounds** (Discreet Cat), out of GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine Unbridled Elaine (Unbridled's Song), will head straight to the big leagues in Saturday's GIII Sham S. at Santa Anita, trainer Eoin Harty confirmed Tuesday.

The well-built chestnut posted a visually impressive maiden win at second asking going seven furlongs at Hollywood Dec. 10 ([video](#)). Drawn widest of all in post nine, Out Of Bounds sat a stalking trip in fourth through fractions of :22.85 and :45.45. With Rafael Bejarano in the irons, he began to rev up on the turn for home with a four-wide move, and despite racing a bit greenly in the stretch on his left lead, was along in time for a well-timed 3/4-length decision.

"Out Of Bounds is doing really well," Harty told *TDN*. "He keeps improving. He showed quite a bit of ability before I ran him the first time, then he came back and graduated nicely. He's still immature a bit mentally. I don't know if he's going to win Saturday, but he'll certainly run well."

Out Of Bounds ran on late to finish a respectable fourth behind next-out GIII Hollywood Prevue S. winner So Brilliant (Medaglia d'Oro) in his Santa Anita unveiling going six furlongs Oct. 22 ([video](#)).

Harty believes that the one-mile distance of the two-turn Sham will be right in his long-striding charge's wheelhouse.

"He's a very big colt," Harty explained. "He's got to be close to 17 hands--for a [recently turned 3-year-old] that's a pretty imposing animal."

The 3/4-brother to Etched (Forestry), MGSW, \$587,586, has posted three workouts since earning his diploma, most recently covering five furlongs in 1:00.60 in Inglewood Jan. 2.

Harty got his picture taken following the 2008 Sham with subsequent GI Santa Anita Derby and GI Travers S. hero Colonel John (Tiznow). Does Out Of Bounds have that kind of upside?


"I'm optimistic right now that he has that kind of ability and potential," Harty replied. -SS

CAMPBELL TO RECEIVE ECLIPSE AWARD

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA), *Daily Racing Form* and National Turf Writers and Broadcasters will honor W. Cothran "Cot" Campbell with the Eclipse Award of Merit for a lifetime of outstanding achievement in Thoroughbred racing. Campbell, 84, founded Dogwood Stable in 1973 and introduced the concept of syndicated racehorse ownership, bringing hundreds of new owners into the sport. The concept of group ownership of Thoroughbreds appealed to Campbell because it allowed people the opportunity to participate in the racing world at a reasonable cost. Campbell estimated that Dogwood has brought in approximately 1,200 partners during the past 35 years. "The Award of Merit is a blockbuster for me," said Campbell. "I am surprised, delighted, and very appreciative that it comes my way. It is the highlight of a career that has been exhilarating, to put it mildly." Dogwood has campaigned many notable runners, including 1990 GI Preakness S. winner Summer Squall (Storm Bird), his Eclipse Award-winning daughter Storm Song, who won the 1996 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, and 1987 Eclipse Award-winning Steeplechaser Inlander (Ile De Bourbon).

ECHO OF LIGHT EUTHANIZED

Darley's young stallion **Echo of Light (GB)** (Dubai Millennium {GB}--Spirit of Tara {Ire}, by Sadler's Wells), whose first crop included the promising listed-placed

Sound Advice (GB), was euthanized Tuesday at Kildangan Stud in Ireland after suffering a broken leg in a paddock accident. He had just turned 10 years old. Produced by a full sister to five-time Group 1 winner Salsabil, Echo of Light, a €1.2-million Goffs Orby yearling purchase, established himself as his late sire's second-best runner from his lone crop, with multiple group victories in England and France and a Group 1-placing in Italy and a track record-

setting performance in the 2007 G3 Strensall S. at York. Echo of Light was initially retired to Dalham Hall Stud in England, where he stood the 2008 and 2009 breeding seasons before covering mares at Kildangan in 2010. In addition to Sound Advice, he is also the sire of Godolphin's promising colt Counterpunch (GB)--one of four Epsom Derby entrants for his sire--the John Gosden-trained Electrician (GB) and Kinloch Castle (GB). "Only time will tell how much of a loss Echo Of Light will be as a stallion, but to us at Darley he was a powerful reminder of his awesome sire," commented Darley Director of Stallions Sam Bullard.

time Grade I winner of more than \$1.5 million, has been retired. The 7-year-old posted a win in the 2008 GI Secretariat S. for trainer Dermot Weld, then added wins for conditioner Christophe Clement in the 2010 GI Manhattan H. over champion Gio Ponti (Tale

of the Cat) and the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational S., and the 2011 GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. Winchester concluded his career with a respectable third-place finish in Calder's GII W. L. McKnight H. Nov. 26. Stud plans are yet to be finalized.

An excellent third as a 3-year-old in 2011, Drakenstein Stud, Team Valor International and partners' **Ebony Flyer** looks ready to take it to her rivals in Saturday's centerpiece. Away nine months following her Queen's Plate run, the bay filly won her first two starts of this preparation and exits a strong runner-up effort to top South African sprinter What a Winter (SAf) (Western Winter) in the G2 Diadem S. at Kenilworth Dec. 17. "She's in peak condition and coming up to it perfectly," Team Valor's Barry Irwin commented. "With a run over a sprint distance, that should sharpen her up and we're very hopeful. It would be a huge race to win."

This year's Paddock S. was thrown wide open Tuesday with the announcement that 1-5 favorite and reigning South African Horse of the Year **Igugu** would be scratched with a cough. "Igugu has developed a respiratory infection which is not serious, horses normally recover quickly," said trainer Mike de Kock, who trains Igugu for Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa al Maktoum. "We've treated her with antibiotics and she won't be running on Saturday." The conditioner indicated that Igugu is still being pointed for the G1 J & B Met at the end of the month. "We'd still love to run her in the Met, but we have to take caution all the same," he explained. "We will make a decision at the end of the week because her participation will have a big impact on the betting. We will make sure that punters know exactly where they stand."



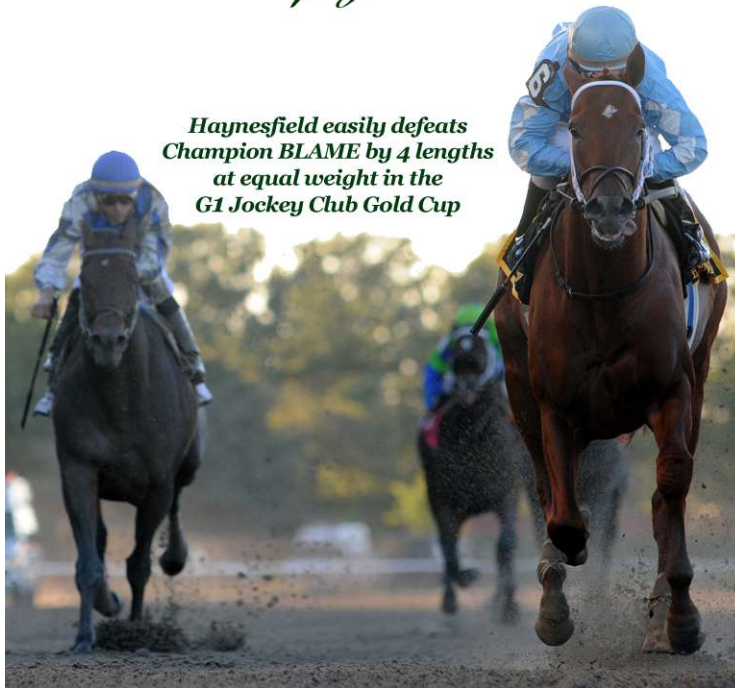

DISTORTED HUMOR: LEADING SIRE

In 2007 and 2008, Lane's End Farm's Smart Strike, sire of Curlin, was the leading sire on the North American general sire list, as compiled by *The Blood-Horse* magazine (bloodhorse.com). In 2009 and 2010, the leading sire was Ashford's (Coolmore America) ultra-prolific Giant's Causeway. In both 2009 and 2010, the runner-up was Distorted Humor. He had also been second in 2005, and third in 2007. Finally, in 2011, when Drosselmeyer upset the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, WinStar's Distorted Humor got his turn: final figures compiled by *The Blood-Horse*, and confirmed by our own TDN Sire Stats, show that Distorted Humor finished nearly \$1 million clear of Smart Strike, with Tapit third and Giant's Causeway fourth, to become North America's leading sire of 2011.

Though he was 'just' a Grade II winner on the racetrack (twice, at seven furlongs, as a 5-year-old)--like Dansili and Pulpit, just to mention two others who have become highly successful sires despite not having won a Grade/Group I--Distorted Humor was a successful sire from the word "go." Though he needed help via the disqualification of Elusive City from two races in Europe for drug positives, Distorted Humor was the leading freshman sire of 2002, with Awesome Again second and Elusive City's sire, Elusive Quality, a close third. He then had 2003 GI Kentucky Derby winner Funny Cide among his first crop of 3-year-olds (Elusive Quality followed with Smarty Jones in 2004), so there was never any question whether Distorted Humor, who is by Mr. Prospector's son, Forty Niner, out of the Grade II-winning Danzig mare, Danzig's Beauty, was a top-flight sire or not; clearly he was. His four top-three finishes on the general sire list since 2005 have reinforced the point. This summer, when we ran the mid-year APEX ratings, I was astounded to see that Giant's Causeway (305) and Distorted Humor (294) had nearly 60 more 2005-2011 'ABC Runners' (top 8% earners) than the number three stallion in that category, Danehill Dancer (235). That shows you beyond question that those two horses are the very top sires of consistent, money-making horses around. According to statistics supplied to TDN, Distorted Humor is now the sire of 96 black-type winners--well over 10% of his foals, a statistic almost unheard of in this 'Big-Book' era.

When you look at the *TDN* General Sire List for 2011, (Click [here](#)) you see first of all that two of the three leading sires are European: Coolmore's World Number One, Galileo, with the earners of over \$14-million, including 10 Grade/Group 1 winners in 2011; and Montjeu, also a Coolmore-based son of Sadler's Wells, who is number three by progeny earnings (\$10.1m), including eight 2011 Grade/Group 1 winners. Only three other European sires were among the 2011 *TDN* Top 30 by progeny earnings: Darley's Dubawi (\$6.09m) was third in Europe, followed by Juddmonte's duo, both with over \$5.4 million in 2011 progeny earnings, Dansili (14 GSW) and Oasis Dream. You wouldn't get too much argument that those really are about the top five sires in Europe.

Besides Distorted Humor finally capturing the top spot, the other name that jumps out at you is the only one in the North American top four who hasn't yet been leading sire: Tapit. Number two, Smart Strike, has been leading sire twice; 2011 number four, Giant's Causeway, has been leading sire twice; considering he's had three Breeders' Cup winners (all 2-year-olds) and six Grade I winners in his first four crops, you'd just about have to bet that Tapit is a future leading sire in North America. He had the earners of over \$9 million last year with just four crops racing--all sired when he stood for \$15,000 or less. A couple of interesting things about Tapit: first, he had been a \$625,000 yearling, and made just six starts for trainer Michael Dickinson. He ran a Beyer 98 when he won the GIII Laurel Futurity as a 2-year-old, and repeated that number when winning the GI Wood Memorial at three. So he never ran a Beyer higher than 98, though, when a 2-year-old runs a 98, that puts him toward the top of his generation. Second, Tapit comes from perhaps the best--maybe the only--active sire family in America.

Look at this breakdown:

- Tapit's 4th dam, Foggy Note (*The Axe II): dam of Relaunch (successful sire) and his full sister, Tapit's third dam, Moon Glitter;
- Tapit's 3rd dam, Moon Glitter (In Reality): dam of Glitterman (successful sire) and his half-sister, Ruby Slippers;
- Tapit's 2nd dam, Ruby Slippers (*Nijinsky II): dam of Rubiano (successful sire) and his 3/4-sister, Tap Your Heels;
- Tapit's 1st dam, Tap Your Heels (Unbridled): dam of Tapit (successful sire). If you want a tip on the family continuing, Ruby Slippers also produced Hong Kong Jade, by Alysheba;
- Hong Kong Jade is 2nd dam of 2009 champion 3-year-old Summer Bird, by Birdstone and inbred 3x3 to Storm Bird, from America's number one sire family. Inquire at WinStar.

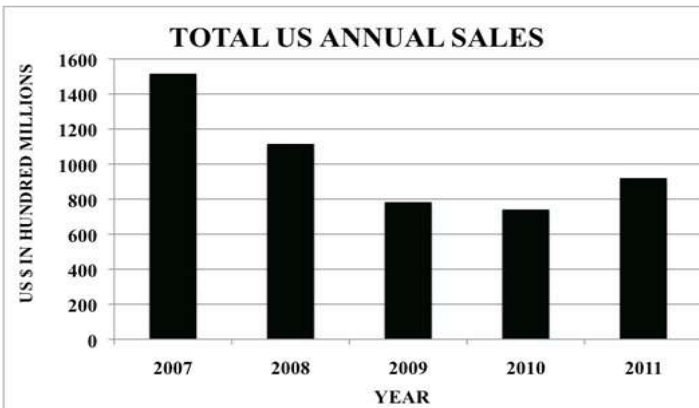

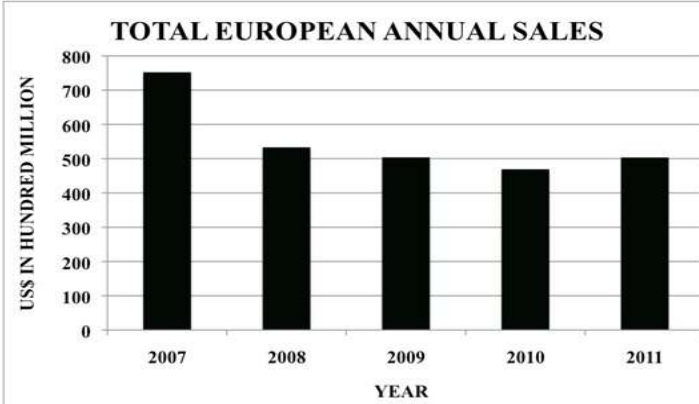

"The North American market rebounded by 24% in 2011, adding almost \$180-million in value. The European gross gained seven percent. But the North American 2010 gross of \$740-million was a 51% decline from the 2007 peak; by comparison, Europe bottomed out at a 38% decline the same year. The 2011 North American gross of \$920-million was 61% of the North American gross in 2007. The 2011 European gross of \$503-million was 67% of the 2007 European gross. The combined market gained 18% in 2011, to \$1.423-billion, which was 63% of the combined 2007 gross of \$2.268-billion."

The other sire who advanced his claims as a really big-time player in 2011 was leading third-crop sire Kitten's Joy, doing his best to add to El Prado's growing reputation as a sire of sires. Not only did he actually finish in front of Dubawi as leading third-crop sire, he also finished 2011 as North America's leading sire of 2-year-olds. His owner, Kenneth Ramsey, rather wears his heart on his sleeve as far as Kitten's Joy is concerned, but that doesn't make the horse any less effective as a sire. He had a dream year for a horse whose oldest were 4-year-olds.

KENTUCKY STALLION FARMS: STILL DIVERSIFIED

When Sheikh Mohammed's Darley operation went on a \$200-million spending spree for stallion prospects in 2007, there was a real possibility, if this represented a policy shift, that it could be a game-changer. If Darley was going to go out and buy all the top prospects every year, it wouldn't take long before they would shoulder everybody else out of the way--not just in Europe, but in America as well. Though they had bought Discreet Cat earlier, he was one of four high-profile 2008 retirements to Darley's former Jonabell Farm in Kentucky, along with top American 3-year-olds of 2007 Street Sense, Hard Spun, and Any Given Saturday. In Europe, in 2008, Darley retired Teofilo, Authorized, and Manduro.

As things turned out, the world economic collapse of 2008 intervened. Whether Sheikh Mohammed intended to try and corner the market for stallion prospects every year, as he had done in 2007, he did not repeat the strategy after the sky fell in--whether it fell in on Dubai, or not. We don't know whether his 2007 spending spree had been intended as a one-off 'surge' to try and cut back Coolmore's dominance of the top sires and sire lines the year after Sheikh Mohammed declared his team's intention to achieve self-sufficiency. But, as things turned out, it was a one-off surge rather than the forerunner of an ongoing new policy. At least, since 2008 Darley has not continued to buy top stallion prospects at anything like the level at which they bought in 2007.

It's not simply a question of Europe and North America, as well. Darley has massively expanded their involvement in Australia and the Far East, and clearly sees the emerging Southern Hemisphere and Eastern markets as ones where they intend to have far greater involvement in the future--all part of Darley's, and Dubai's, constantly expanding global brand. It is perhaps the case that Darley is as concerned, or more concerned, with these potential developments as they are with trying to dominate the stallion scene in any one place. As far as Kentucky goes, whatever the original intention, the policy which has emerged seems to be for Darley to be an established 'Top 10' Kentucky stallion farm, rather than trying to outgun Coolmore or anybody else to be number one in the North American market.

We counted 10 Kentucky stallion operations that will be standing nine or more stallions in 2012. Among the 10 farms, they will be standing, by our count, 124 stallions in 2012. Significantly, perhaps, three farms are standing more stallions retired since 2009 than is Darley Jonabell, which has added five new stallions since 2009: these are Spendthrift, which stands 10 stallions that retired in 2009 or later; WinStar, which stands eight; and Ashford, which has added seven stallions that retired since 2009. WinStar and Spendthrift have also moved other stallions in from other farms, but this is just counting those whose first foals were born in 2010 and later. I'm not one who likes to be persuaded too much by advertising, but you can't help but be impressed with the moves Coolmore has been making to restock Ashford. Besides two-time leading sire Giant's Causeway, as discussed above, Ashford has Scat Daddy, who appears to have just edged out Darley's Hard Spun for 2011 leading North American freshman sire, at least according to *TDN* and *The Blood-Horse*. They've also retired four stallions with very serious credentials, and three now-\$10,000 stallions you can find something to like about.

In 2009, Coolmore retired Henrythenavigator to Ashford, partially, we could surmise, to try and keep the Euro-friendly Kingmambo line working in America. In 2011 and 2012, they are standing the last two champion 2-year-old colts: Lookin at Lucky (also champion 3-year-old colt of 2010); and Uncle Mo, by Smart Strike and Indian Charlie, respectively. Plus, they are bringing the Galileo branch of Sadler's Wells to America with Cape Blanco, a certainty to be champion turf male for 2011. It's getting more and more difficult to find \$10,000 stallions in Kentucky, and Ashford's three each has a good case: Majestic Warrior was a Grade I winner at two, by A.P. He could be one of those Grade II-winning sprinting surprise packages, like Distorted Humor or, I don't know: War Front.

It's not just Ashford: four years ago it looked like Darley was setting into motion a policy that could threaten the very survival of the other top Kentucky stallion farms. But it has proved, for whatever reasons, to have been a one-off attempt to establish themselves in the market, rather than dominate it. Besides Henrythenavigator, Lane's End's Curlin and Three Chimneys' Big Brown have their first 2-year-olds in 2012; and Claiborne's Blame, Lane's End's Quality Road, and Taylor Made's Eskendereya all went to stud for prices in the \$30,000-\$35,000 range in 2011, as well as Lookin at Lucky (Taylor Made doesn't stand that many stallions themselves, but they are prominently partners with WinStar on several of their big horses). Given all the difficulties in the general economy and the horse market since the middle of 2008, at least one healthy aspect of the Kentucky stallion market seems to still be a wide distribution of top stallion prospects among 10 or more top farms.

INTERNET GAMBLING BILL ON TABLE IN NJ
New Jersey State Senator Raymond Lesniak, moving quickly to take advantage of the U.S. Justice Department's recently released opinion that federal laws do not prohibit in-state non-sports Internet gambling, is hoping to get an Internet gambling bill through the state's legislature in the final week of the session, according to *Associated Press*. The bill would need the approval of Governor Chris Christie, who vetoed a similar measure in March. "We can be the Silicon Valley of Internet gaming," Lesniak told *AP*. "It's the wave of the future. It's going to come and we can be in the lead on it." Last month, the DOJ issued an opinion stating that intrastate Internet lotteries are not in violation of the Wire Act. Nevada legislators have already approved rules to allow companies to apply for operation licenses for poker web sites.

HARLEM ROCKER SIDELINED Adena Springs' **Harlem Rocker** (Macho Uno--Freedom Come, by Lit de Justice) is expected to miss the 2012 breeding season after undergoing surgery at Cornell University to alleviate symptoms of spinal cord compression. Winner of the 2008 GIII Withers S. and second in that year's GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile H., Harlem Rocker began his stud career in 2011 at McMahan of Saratoga Thoroughbreds. The 7-year-old stallion is expected to return to the New York farm in 2013.

INJURY ENDS ARSON SQUAD'S CAREER Trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. has told *Daily Racing Form* that the injuries suffered by multiple Grade II winner **Arson Squad** (Brahms--Majestic Fire, by Green Dancer) when he broke down during a workout at Gulfstream Park Saturday do not appear to be life-threatening, although his racing career is over. Owned by Jay Em Ess Stable, the 9-year-old gelding retires with nine wins from 35 career starts and earnings of nearly \$1.2 million. He made his final start at Aqueduct, finishing third in the Queens County S. Dec. 10. "He might have to undergo surgery, but Dr. [Larry] Bramlage said he should be okay," Dutrow told *DRF*. "He was such a special horse to be around, and one of our best friends here at the barn. Out on the track, he was all racehorse and the kind you wanted to have bedded down in your barn. Now, he gets to retire and just hang out the right way the rest of his life." Arson Squad was one of four horses who broke down either during or immediately after completing workouts at Gulfstream Park Saturday. He was the only one of that group to survive.
