## RAPID REDUX TAKES 22; HONORED WITH SPECIAL ECLIPSE AWARD

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association, *Daily Racing Form* and the National Turf Writers and Broadcasters revealed that **Rapid Redux** (Pleasantly Perfect), who made headlines as the winner of 19 consecutive races in 2011, will be honored with the Special Eclipse Award. The Special Award honors extraordinary service, individual achievements in, or contributions to the sport of Thoroughbred racing. Baltimore-based owner Robert L. Cole Jr. will accept the trophy on behalf of his charge during the 41st annual Eclipse Awards, which will be held Jan. 16 at the Beverly Wilshire in Beverly Hills, California. Claimed for \$6,250 in October 2010, Rapid Redux began his now 22-race winning sequence Dec. 2, 2010. "It's a top award in this sport and a dream come true," said Cole. "Rapid Redux has shown the greatest in durability and consistency. He hasn't thrown in a bad race. To win like this over a 13-month period is nearly impossible. He's Maryland home-grown, running in Maryland. We wanted him to stay close to home as he relates so well to the average fan. It's not like going to the sales and paying a million dollars. He's a blue-collar horse."

Alex Waldrop, president and CEO of the NTRA, added, "The achievements of Rapid Redux in 2011 were remarkable. Winning 21 consecutive races, including 19 of them in a single year--at distances ranging from five furlongs to a mile and an eighth--is something we won't soon again see. We congratulate Robert Cole, trainer David Wells and the jockeys who rode Rapid Redux for all they did to help Rapid Redux earn this Special Award." Soon after the announcement was made, the chestnut grittily held on to post his 22nd win in a row in Laurel's sixth race ([video](#)). Trainer David Wells breathed a sigh of relief after the finish. "He has been placed really well," Wells admitted. "Condition books win races and that is what it is. He is not a stakes horse. He is not an allowance horse. People want us to try it, but he is not that quality."

## DUBAI CARNIVAL BEGINS TODAY

The race to the Cup is on. This evening at Meydan Racecourse, the 2012 Dubai World Cup Carnival begins a 16-fixture stand that kicks off with a weekend double header and concludes with one of the sport's most prestigious days of racing on Mar. 31, a day capped by the \$10-million G1 Dubai World Cup. "This is always an exciting time of year with the start of the Carnival, and the wonderful build up to the Dubai World Cup," said Meydan Chairman of the Board and CEO Saeed H Al Tayer.

A new age of racing dawned in Dubai two years ago when Meydan, born from the vision of Sheikh Mohammed, opened to rave reviews. The 60,000-capacity facility, which cost \$1.25 billion to build, set a new standard for racetracks around the world, and has since held two stirring World Cup cards, including an emotional 2011 renewal.

During a truly international night of racing in 2011, **J The Jet Plane (SAf)** (Jet Master {SAf}) won the G2 Al Quoz Sprint, **Skysurfers (GB)** (E Dubai) captured the G2 Godolphin Mile, and the filly **Khawlah (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) took the G2 UAE Derby over **Master of Hounds** (Kingmambo). But it was the card's four Group 1 races the crowd came to see, and they didn't disappoint. In the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, Hong Kong's **Rocket Man (Aus)** (Viscount {Aus}) beat the Bob Baffert-trained **Euroears** (Langfuhr) in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen. The 7-year-old gelding **Presvis (GB)** (Sakhee) beat the veteran mare **River Jetez (SAf)** (Jet Master {SAf}) in the G1 Dubai Duty Free, before the ill-fated **Rewilding (GB)** (Tiger Hill {Ire}) landed one for the home team in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. In the Dubai World Cup, Japan secured a one-two finish, with **Victoire Pisa (Jpn)** (Neo Universe {Jpn}) confirming his victory in the G1 Japan Cup over **Transcend (Jpn)** (Wild Rush). The win came just weeks after Japan was devastated by a massive earthquake and resulting tsunami.

**On Tap for 2012...**

Japan could once again be well-represented in Dubai this year. The country's pro-tem Horse of the Year **Orfevre (Jpn)** (Stay Gold {Jpn}), who became Japan's seventh Triple Crown winner last season, is coming off a victory in the G1 Arima Kinen at Nakayama Dec. 25, and trainer Yasutoshi Ikee said afterward he is mapping out a 2012 international campaign that could include a start on World Cup night.

Trainer Bob Baffert has never been shy to send a runner to Dubai. In 1998, the previous year's G1 Kentucky Derby hero **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) won

the G1 Dubai World Cup, and Baffert doubled up three years later with **Captain Steve** (Fly So Free). In 2009, he shipped over dual champion **Indian Blessing** (Indian Blessing), and the fleet filly ran a game second in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen to **Big City Man** (Northern Afleet). Baffert could have an imposing duo for the 2012 World Cup card. The Hall of Fame trainer indicated that **The Factor** (War Front) was being considered for the Golden Shaheen after his

lights-out win in the G1 Malibu S. at Santa Anita Dec. 26. Baffert is also mulling a run in the World Cup itself with **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again). Last season, Baffert requested and received an invitation for the G1 Santa Anita H. winner, but ultimately left the gelding in his stall in Southern California after he developed a foot abscess. Since then, Game On Dude has raised his profile even higher. He won the G1 Goodwood S. last October and finished second in the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic.

**Dubai Carnival notes cont.**

Another prominent horse who could show up in Dubai is the "Budapest Bullet," the European sprint star **Overdose (GB)** (Starborough {GB}). Owner Zoltan Mikoczy is reportedly considering a number of Dubai World Cup Carnival races in the lead-up to his ultimate goal, the G1 Emirates NBD Al Quoz Sprint on World Cup night. "We have gone to Dubai independently, but will be there to apply for an invitation to the World Cup meeting," said Mikoczy. "It would be a very proud moment to take part, as to our knowledge, no horse from Eastern Europe has ever participated at the meeting." Now seven, the Hungarian-based Overdose has won 16 of his 19 career starts. He capped his 2011 season with a win in the G3 Premio Carlo & Francesco Aloisi at Capannelle in November, his first start since running fourth in the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot. "He is entered in races in Dubai on Jan. 20 and Feb. 3, but races on either Feb. 23 or Mar. 1 would probably be better, as they would give us more time to prepare him," said Mikoczy.



**Dozen for Jockeys' Challenge...**

The World Cup Carnival begins with cards today and tomorrow. The double header features the third annual Meydan Masters International Jockeys' Challenge, which pits 12 of the world's top jockeys against each other in a series of four races. A points system based on placings determines the winner. The 12 confirmed riders are: Mickael Barzalona, Maxime Guyon and Christophe Lemaire from France; William Buick, Ryan Moore, Colm O'Donoghue and Tom Queally from Great Britain and Ireland; Italy's Mirco Demuro and Frankie Dettori; Kenichi Ikezoe from Japan; Andrasch Starke from Germany; and Australia's Craig Williams. The UK's Richard Hills won in 2010, while the U.S.'s Calvin Borel hoisted the trophy in 2011. Today's first post is 6:30 p.m. local time, while tomorrow has an early 3 p.m. start. Gates open each day 1 1/2 hours before the first race.

Highlights of opening weekend include no fewer than six handicaps worth six figures each this afternoon, as well as tomorrow's UAE 1000 Guineas Trial over 1400 meters on the main track. Six 3-year-old fillies will line up in the \$50,000 conditions event, which features **Alsindi (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}), winner of the G3 Oh So Sharp S. at Newmarket last September. ### Godolphin Geared Up for Carnival...

Trainers Mahmood Al Zarooni and Saeed bin Suroor are in positive mood ahead of the Dubai World Cup Carnival. Al Zarooni provided updates on his more high-profile prospects, including four-time Group 1 winner **Xin Xu Lin (Brz)** (Wondertross). The South American star makes his next start in the Royal Blue in next Thursday's round one of the G3 Maktoum Challenge. "Xin Xu Lin didn't run a bad race when he was fifth behind Khawlah (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the [G2] UAE Derby last year," Al Zarooni commented. "He runs from the front in his races and got a bit tired near the end. We will see how he gets on next week before deciding where to go with him, while I have earmarked rounds two and three of the Maktoum Challenge for **Casamento (Ire)** (Shamardal), **Dubai Prince (Ire)** (Shamardal) and **French Navy (GB)** (Shamardal). **Zip Top (Ire)** (Smart Strike) is a candidate for the [Feb. 9] UAE 2000 Guineas and he could have a possible tilt at the [Mar. 31] UAE Derby afterwards. We have **Monterosso (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and **Blue Bunting** (Dynaformer) out here and they could be aimed at Super Saturday [Mar. 10], when Blue Bunting could have her prep race for the [Mar. 31] G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, while **Opinion Poll (Ire)** (Halling) will be readied for another crack at the [Mar. 31] G3 Dubai Gold Cup."

Saeed bin Suroor, who has been leading trainer at the Carnival for the last four years, added, "The horses have been working nicely and I am looking forward to seeing them run. They will improve for their first outings of the season, but are in good form and I am hopeful of a nice start to the year. We will try to be the leading trainer at the Dubai World Cup Carnival again, but it won't be easy. There are some very good horses coming to Meydan from all over the world this year and it will be tough to win the title for a fifth time."

### Gold Readied for Carnival Challenge...

Conditioner Richard Hannon has earmarked a possible tilt at the Mar. 31 G1 Dubai World Cup for Andrew Tinkler's **Dubawi Gold (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}). Following the 4-year-old's fourth in the Dec. 11 G1 Hong Kong Mile, the dual G1 2000 Guineas runner-up and G2 Celebration Mile hero is set to be stepped up in trip. "We know that Dubawi Gold is very good over the mile, but everyone here is adamant that it would be no problem stepping up to 10 furlongs and, having already won on the Polytrack at Lingfield, it would be tempting having a look at the Dubai World Cup itself," Hannon explained. "Dubawi Gold is so tough and very laid-back and he never turned a hair when he got back from Hong Kong. He has to stay 30 days before he can head off on his travels again, but we could send him to Dubai at the end of January or early February. That would give him ample time to get used to the surface at Meydan and the plan would be to run him on Super Saturday, which would help make our minds up as to whether to aim for the stars and go for the big one, stick to what he knows best and keep to the grass for the nine-furlong G1 Dubai Duty Free or go for the G2 Godolphin Mile, which is also on the dirt."

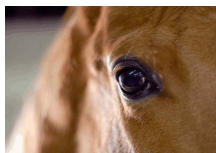
**Snow Fairy Ruled out of Carnival...**

Cristina Patino's **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab) will not feature at this year's Dubai World Cup Carnival after trainer Ed Dunlop provided a latest update on her road to recovery from recent injury. Having won Kyoto's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Commemorative Cup for the second consecutive year Nov. 13, the 5-year-old suffered the setback as she was being prepared to defend her title in the G1 Hong Kong Vase last month. "Snow Fairy won't be going to Dubai," Dunlop told the *Racing Post*. "We made the carnival entries before she got her injury. At the minute, she is recovering from it and we've not yet got to the stage where we'll decide where she starts. We'll think about that in a couple of months."

**Balada Sale to Represent Bary Stable...**

Argentinian sensation **Balada Sale (Arg)** (Not For Sale {Arg}) has joined the Pascal Bary yard, *Racing Post* revealed yesterday. Three times an authoritative winner at the top level in her native country last year, the 4-year-old filly now runs for Katsumi Yoshida. "She arrived here on Tuesday and, if everything goes to plan with her, she could run in the [G2] UAE Derby Mar. 31," Bary told the trade daily. "I don't think she'll have a prep run. I expect her to be my only runner at the Carnival this year."

## RACETRACK ROUND-UP

### Havre de Grace Big Easy Bound...

**Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam), a leading candidate for Horse of the Year honors, is slated to arrive early this morning at Fair Grounds in preparation for her 5-year-old campaign. The bay may kick off 2012 in the New Orleans Ladies S. at Fair Grounds Mar. 17. "That [possible Horse of the Year title] is going to be a real nail-biter, that's for sure, but I'd rather be in my spot than anybody else's," said trainer Larry Jones. "I don't see anybody more deserving than she is for Horse of the Year. She's one of the few candidates with a winning record, and we could have kept her undefeated if we'd picked some easier spots for her. We could have run her in the [GI] Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic like we did the year before. We'd beaten Royal Delta by eight lengths in the Beldame, but we thought our horse deserved the chance against male rivals [in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, where she finished fourth]."

### On Fire Baby Could Face Boys in Smarty Jones...

Trainer Gary "Red Dog" Hartlage may test his multiple graded stakes winner **On Fire Baby** (Smoke Glacken) against males in the \$100,000 Smarty Jones S. at Oaklawn Jan. 16. Campaigned by breeder Anita Cauley, the grey filly concluded her juvenile campaign with wins in Churchill's GII Pocahontas S. and GII Golden Rod S. She tuned up for her sophomore bow with a seven-furlong breeze in 1:29 2/5 yesterday at Oaklawn under regular jockey Joe Johnson. "She's just a different kind of horse and it's fun to watch," said Hartlage. "She looks great and did everything exactly the way we asked her to. We have about four things under consideration, but I know she could run with anybody, so the Smarty Jones is definitely something we will look at." The Smarty Jones is run at a mile, and Hartlage is also considering the six-furlong Dixie Belle S. at Oaklawn next Saturday. "I'm not crazy about running short," Hartlage added. "I know she's ready to run. Joe got off her this morning and he's ready to take on anybody, but we both said, 'Yeah, we still have a ways to go.'"

## STRONACH STARTS INVESTMENT CORPS

When Sunday Racing Club's Buena Vista (Jpn) retired from racing following the G1 Arima Kinen on Christmas Day, some 40 co-owners, part of a racing syndicate, piled into the winner's circle at Nakayama for a send-off celebration. If a new plan by Frank Stronach comes to fruition, that number may seem quaint in a few months' time.

Stronach, owner of Adena Springs and one of North America's leading owners and breeders, is hoping to establish six publicly held corporations that will offer investors the chance to buy into racehorse partnerships for \$10 a share. To that end, Stronach and related companies have filed papers with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). They are currently awaiting comments from regulators. The companies are named after some of Stronach's most successful racehorses: Awesome Again, Ghostzapper, Ginger Punch, Macho Uno, Perfect Sting and Red Bullet.

Each corporation will be comprised of 20 Thoroughbreds--or 120 horses in total. The horses were purchased as yearlings in 2011 and are now two. Plans call for 405,000 shares to be sold in each corporation at \$10 a share, which, if all shares sell, would gross \$4.05 million. However, Golden Pegasus Racing Inc., an entity controlled by The Stronach Group established to manage the corporations, is set to retain a 10% interest in each.

Golden Pegasus will be paid \$150 a day for horses in training, which includes training, blacksmith and routine veterinary care, and \$50 for horses out of training. Each company will also maintain a \$100,000 fund for vet emergencies. Golden Pegasus will decide who trains the horses, as well as where and at what level the horses run.

The Stronach Group owns racetracks across North America, including Santa Anita, Gulfstream, Laurel and Pimlico, as well as interests in Xpressbet and AmTote and the television network HRTV.

Stronach and his buying team, including Jack Brothers, Dan Hall and Mark Roberts, were extremely active at nearly all levels of the market at the 2011 yearling sales. Adena Springs signed for no fewer than 119 yearlings for \$8,623,667, for an average of \$72,468. The median price Adena paid was \$40,000. Adena checked in behind only John Ferguson as North America's leading buyer of yearlings in 2011. *Cont. p8*

**Mitch Shiota Dies:**

Trainer and former jockey Mitch Shiota passed away Wednesday at Norton Suburban Hospital in Louisville, Kentucky after a lengthy illness. He was 78. Born in Hawaii, Shiota kicked off his career as a jockey in 1958 at Agua Caliente in Mexico. He rode for 15 years before taking out a trainer's license. According to Equibase, he saddled 236 winners from 1,637 starts. His runners earned \$5,692,466, topped by the 1992 success of Firm Stance in the GI Top Flight H. at Aqueduct and Shaconage's win in the 2004 running of the Gill Argent Mortgage S. at Churchill. He is survived by his wife, Lynda; their daughter, Lori Gowen (Greg); grandchildren Whitney Gowen and Tyler Gowen; brothers Seiko and Hiro Shiota; and sisters Kay Tada, Sumi Martin and Tomi Shiota. Visitation and a memorial service are tentatively scheduled for Christ Chapel in the Churchill Downs stable area Jan. 7.

**NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL**



**CHANGES TO INVESTMENT INCENTIVES FOR 2012**

Two investment incentives for business that were available for horse owners in 2011 were not included in federal legislation recently passed by Congress to continue the payroll tax deduction through February 2012. As a result, both incentives change to the levels below for 2012.

**Section 179 Expense Allowance** - allows taxpayers to write off the cost of new or used qualified depreciable property, up to \$125,000, if the property is purchased and placed in service before 1/1/2013. The expense allowance is reduced dollar for dollar once investments exceed \$500,000. In 2010 and 2011, the expense allowance was \$500,000 with a \$2 million phase-out level.

**Bonus Depreciation** - allows taxpayers to write off 50 percent of the cost of new qualified depreciable property if the property is purchased and placed in service before 1/1/2013. Property is new if its original use commences with the taxpayer. Beginning on September 8, 2010 and through 2011, bonus depreciation was 100 percent for eligible property. The expense allowance and bonus depreciation may be used together.

Congress is negotiating to extend the payroll tax deduction through 2012 and these negotiations may impact the expense allowance or bonus depreciation. The NTRA will communicate any changes in this space.

Jay Sloan operates the High Five Racing Stable, which offers “friends-and-family type” partnerships, with a focus on fillies towards the goal of maximizing their investment. But, following yesterday’s good-looking debut from the cleverly named Cop A Tude, it turns out that the occasional colt is just fine too.

“We do prefer fillies for their residual value, and it wouldn’t really have gotten us anywhere to put this colt through the ring,” said Sloan, who is based in northern Virginia and works in the financial and accounting business. “So, we just thought we’d go on and see what might come of it.”

Sloan, who races Cop A Tude in partnership with Jeff Jaffee, bred the colt from Emotional Storm (Storm Boot), whom he acquired for \$39,000 as a FTMMAY juvenile and raced to five wins and nearly \$143,000 in earnings. She now resides at Pope McLean’s Crestwood Farm, who “have done a wonderful job with her,” Sloan stated. The mare’s first two foals to race each found the winner’s circle without significant further distinction, but the decision to send her to Officer while he still resided in Kentucky looks to be paying dividends.

“Officer gave a chance to do a real outcross,” explained Sloan. “[Emotional Storm] has Storm Cat and Mr. Prospector in her pedigree, so we thought we’d try a true outcross. He’s got a great sprinter’s profile, and hopefully he can repeat today’s effort down the road.”

The fact that Cop A Tude was live on the tote didn’t exactly come as a surprise to Sloan, who was on hand for the victory.

“He had been training very well; he had quite a few bullets, but you never know what to make of that,” he commented, adding that Cop A Tude is High Five’s first-ever debut winner. “We were certainly hopeful, but he does have a bit of an attitude with that Storm Cat blood, so we were cautiously optimistic that he’d handle the race-day experience well. He passed a few horses, which is always encouraging on debut, but I give all the credit to [trainer] Graham [Motion]. The 5 1/2 [furlongs] was a great debut distance.”

Sloan considers himself fortunate to have been affiliated with Motion since High Five’s beginnings back in 1999.

“We’ve known for quite a while what the world has known for only about a year,” Sloan offered. “He is a master horseman.”

As for what’s next, no one is getting too far ahead of themselves, Sloan assures.

“I thought he was green and professional in spots, and we’re just going to let Graham make the call,” he stated. “He has the patience of Job, and we’ll certainly abide by his decisions.”--Alan Carasso

**Retired Racehorse Trainer Challenge to Debut:***Edited Press Release*

A group of sport horse and racing enthusiasts announced this week creation of the Retired Racehorse Training Project (RRTP), a charitable organization whose mission is to increase demand for Thoroughbred ex-racehorses through public education and promotion.

"We received our 501(c)3 status from the IRS last spring, and have been working since then to build an interactive web site that provides the tools to help us fulfill our mission," said the group's founder Stuart Pittman, an event rider who operates Dodon Farm in Maryland.

The web site includes a Trainer Directory of professionals who work with ex-racehorses; a Sources For Horses listing of non-profit placement groups, farms, racetracks, and classifieds; and a Bloodline Brag where everyone can enter their ex-racehorse with pedigree, competition record, and assessment of characteristics. It can be found online at [www.retiredracehorsetraining.org](http://www.retiredracehorsetraining.org).

"United States Equestrian Federation statistics show that Thoroughbreds declined as a percentage of horses registered for national competitions from 41% in 1982 to 10% in 2011," according to Pittman. "One cause of this trend has been a lack of effective education and marketing about the attributes that these horses bring to the sport and recreation rider. Thirty years ago we all revered retired racehorses because we all rode them. Today we have a new generation of riders who need to hear the good news."

In addition to the Trainer Challenge, the RRTP plans clinics, symposia, online educational resources, and an Apprenticeship Program for aspiring professional trainers who can demonstrate outstanding riding skills.
