



ECLIPSE AWARD FINALISTS ANNOUNCED

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association, *Daily Racing Form* and the National Turf Writers and Broadcasters announced the finalists for the Eclipse Awards yesterday with few surprises among the nominees.



Havre de Grace *A Coglianese*

Fox Hill Farms's **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam) sits atop the list of finalists for champion older female, and is expected to give the boys a run for their money, just as she did when annexing the GI Woodward S. in September, in voting for Horse of the Year. Perhaps most notable is the absence

of GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Drosselmeyer** (Distorted Humor) from the older male category, making this the first time since 1996 that a Classic winner was not a finalist for an Eclipse. Winners in all categories will be announced Monday, Jan. 16 at the Beverly Wilshire Hotel in Beverly Hills, CA. Finalists for Horse of the Year will be announced that night. Of the 267 eligible voters from the NTRA, *DRF* and *NTWAB*, 248 (92.88%) submitted ballots. Voters submit their top three choices in each category in order to determine finalists, but only their top vote counts towards selecting a winner.

REGALLY READY RETURNS IN DAYTONA

Vinery Stables's GII Breeders' Cup Turf sprint hero and Eclipse Award finalist **Regally Ready** (More Than Ready) will face six foes while kicking off his 5-year-old campaign in Sunday's GIII Daytona S. at Santa Anita. The homebred was third in this event last year before taking a trio of races down the hill, and finished up his campaign with success in the GI Nearctic S. at Woodbine in October before besting a full field in the Breeders' Cup at Churchill Downs Nov. 5. "He's a tremendous horse, he's a great sprinter and he goes as fast as he can as far as he can," said regular rider Corey Nakatani, who has the mount Sunday. "He's going to go fast. It's just a matter if somebody wants to run with him or not. He's pretty handy. He doesn't have to be on the lead, but he likes to control the race. We'll see how he is and what [trainer Steve Asmussen] wants to do and we'll go from there." Among Regally Ready's competition is accomplished veteran **Caracortado** (Cat Dreams), fifth in the Turf Sprint with a wide trip, and lightly raced 8-year-old **Mr Gruff** (Mr. Greeley), winner of the Night Mover S. at Hollywood Last time Nov. 18. **Full field p3**

Pincay to Present Sham Trophy...

Retired Hall of Fame jockey Laffit Pincay, Jr. will present the trophy for Saturday's GIII Sham S. at Santa Anita. The race is named after the horse Pincay rode to victory in the 1973 Santa Anita Derby before runner-up finishes behind Secretariat in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness S. "I tell you, Sham is definitely one of the best horses I ever rode," recalled the 64-year-old legend. "He could have been the second-best horse I ever rode. He didn't run in that many races (13), but he was such a powerful horse. He could do anything, he had speed and was a very, very nice horse."

TRF SUES MELLON ESTATE

The Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation filed a lawsuit against Frederick A. Terry, Jr., executor of the Paul Mellon Estate, in New York Supreme Court Thursday, alleging slander. The TRF, which received a \$7-million endowment from the Mellon estate in 2001, cites a letter written by Terry to the attorney general of New York in November alleging that the TRF had used false and misleading financial statements. The attorney general was investigating the TRF at the time following highly publicized accusations of horse neglect and organizational mismanagement. "It's a shame we had to file this suit, but the problem is, we haven't heard a word from the Mellon executors in almost a year," said John Moore, Chairman of the TRF. "Instead of a dialogue, what we received was a copy of a letter to our accounting firm accusing us of having false and misleading financial statements because we had allegedly borrowed money improperly--none of which is true--it's a pure lie. Mr. Terry knew that when making these accusations." Moore continued, "I would ask, 'What on Earth good is it doing the Mellon executors to take this course of action?' It certainly isn't helping the horses at all--that's all we're trying to do. So, in order to clear the name of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation and to wipe out the accusations that we are raising money under false and misleading financial statements, we were forced to bring a libel action to bring the executors around and force them to admit that they have been spreading malicious statements about us and impeding our ability to raise money. We'd like to clear our name and move forward." The TRF seeks punitive damages, attorney's fees and at least \$400,000 for "the reduction in charitable donations received by the TRF caused by the Defendant's tortious conduct." Moore concluded, "We would like to spend more time raising money, because the herd is really fine. If we could be freed up from this, we would be able to be cash-flow positive again."

Ice Box (Pulpit--Spice Island, by Tabasco Cat), winner of the 2010 GI Florida Derby and runner-up in the GI Kentucky Derby, has been retired and will stand the 2012 breeding season at Calumet Farm in Lexington. "Ice Box had obvious talent on the racetrack. To stand a son of Pulpit who already has sired leading sires is a great opportunity," said Calumet farm manager Bill Witman. "Ice Box has the tremendous combination of the A.P. Indy sire line and the Storm Cat line, and his female family provides stamina and durability, which matches well with Pulpit's speed." Ice Box, who retires with career earnings of \$948,068 for owner Robert LaPenta, will stand for \$7,500 live foal, stands and nurses.

KENTUCKY OAKS BLUEPRINTS

Grace Hall (f, 3, Empire Maker--Season's Greetings {Ire}, by Ezzoud {Ire}), second-best to soon-to-be-crowned champion My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike)

while suffering her first career defeat in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Churchill Downs Nov. 4 ([video](#)), is slated to kick off her sophomore campaign in the GII Davona Dale S. at Gulfstream Park Feb. 25.

Last year's GI Spinaway S. ([video](#)) and Blue Hen S. heroine ([video](#)) has been in light training since joining Tony Dutrow's Palm Meadows string in early December.

"I was standing in the stall with her the other day," owner Michael Dubb commented. "She

looks great; her coat is nice and shiny. Grace Hall's a good-sized, good-looking filly and has gotten a little bit bigger, too. She's been galloping, and is just about ready for her first workout."

Long-term goals for Grace Hall include prestigious affairs like the GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Downs and GI Alabama S. at Saratoga. Dubb, the principal and founder of the leading Long Island-based real estate developing company Beechwood Organization, is hoping that Grace Hall emulates her sire and continues to move forward with experience and distance. She went three-for-four as a juvenile, capped by her aforementioned effort beneath the Twin Spires.

"There's an interesting statistic about how many Empire Makers have won at two," Dubb pointed out. "They really develop more as 3-year-olds. Empire Maker, of course, didn't fully develop until capturing the Belmont S. We're hoping that she goes the same way as the other Empire Maker filly [GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic victress Royal Delta] that Billy Mott has."

Like the majority of Dubb's high-powered 60-plus stable, Grace Hall is campaigned in partnership. In this case, he teamed up with Michael Caruso (Bethlehem Stables) and Stuart Grant (The Elkstone Group) to purchase the bay for \$95,000 as a yearling at the 2010 Keeneland September Sale.

The trio went back to the well in numbers last summer, too. According to Dubb, they purchased 15 well-bred yearlings at the select sales, spending approximately between \$100,000 to \$150,000 per head. Dubb's reasoning for having partners is simple: he prefers to share the experience, good or bad.

"It's great having these guys as partners because we can spread the risk around and we can all share in the enjoyment," the 55-year-old said.

What would it mean to Dubb to win a race like the Kentucky Oaks?

"It's not really what it means to me, but it's what it would mean to everybody around us," the New York native replied. "Anthony Dutrow is as good of a trainer as any of the more glorified ones out there. It would mean so much to the entire group of people and all of the partners who are involved."

He continued, "For a guy like Mike Caruso who's been in racing for 30 years, Stu Grant who does a lot of breeding, and for me, who has worked his way up from claiming some of the cheapest horses on the track to maybe winning the Kentucky Oaks, I think it would be terrific. It would really be the result of hard work on everybody's part. We've done this for a while, and have all won a lot of stakes races, but to win the Kentucky Oaks, it would mean everything."

Grace Hall was named in honor of Caruso's accomplishments as a three-time NCAA wrestling champion at Lehigh University in Pennsylvania.

"Mike was a Hall of Fame wrestler at Lehigh, and their pavilion is named Grace Hall," Dubb explained. "The entire Lehigh community is now following this horse and there's been a lot of interest." **Cont. p8**

The Churchill Downs faithful took plenty of interest in Grace Hall as well, sending her off as the 7-2 second choice in the Juvenile Fillies. She raced in eighth through a fast opening quarter in :23.20 over a drying out surface labeled as "good." The Kentucky-bred began to advance down the backstretch, but had to wait a bit in traffic as My Miss Aurelia enjoyed first run as they straightened for home. With Ramon Dominguez aboard, Grace Hall was angled out four wide for the stretch drive, took a valiant run at the leader, but couldn't reel her in, and reported home three lengths adrift. It was another six lengths back to Weemissfrankie (Sunriver) in third.

"We were really thrilled with the show that she put on for us," reflected Dubb, who topped the owner's standings on the NYRA circuit in 2010. "We would've like to have won it, but our feelings about the filly were validated. It was a special time."

Dubb is quick to point out who enjoyed the better trip on the first Friday in November.

"My Miss Aurelia had the perfect trip," he offered. "She sat outside of all the mud and all of the gook--it was a stalk-perfect trip. [Grace Hall] had to come up and go between horses and got all that sludge kicked in her face. For a 2-year-old to handle all of that and keep going with determination, we were *really* proud of her and couldn't be happier with her at the moment."

VON VOSS'S VISION PAYS OFF

Three years ago, Mina von Voss was looking to add a mare to add to her fledgling broodmare band, but the Texas native was looking for something specific.

"I had a mare that I had bred to Pollard's Vision that season," von Voss explained. "She lost her pregnancy at 52 days and it was the end of June, so there was no chance to get her bred back that season. I was upset because I really liked Pollard's Vision and I thought that he was going to have some really nice early 2-year-olds running. So I decided I would just ask around. I'm in Lexington, and I just

asked around if anybody had a mare in foal to Pollard's Vision that they would sell privately."

Her search led her to Kim Nardelli's Springwood Farm in August of 2008 and to the mare **Do the Wekiva** (Wekiva Springs--We Say Do, by Hyannis Port), who was in foal to the Wintergreen stallion. The mare, then 8, had sold for \$5,000 to dissolve a partnership at the 2007 Keeneland January sale.

"I knew Kim at Springwood and some of the people who worked there," von Voss continued. "So I went and looked at a few mares. I liked Wekiva the best. She is a great physical. She is a big-bodied mare and she's correct. She's got a laid-back personality and she was in the right price range."

Do the Wekiva produced a colt by Pollard's Vision the following winter, and von Voss sold the gray as a short-yearling for \$34,000 at the 2010 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky February sale. He resold for \$60,000 at Fasig-Tipton in July. Now named Il Villano and racing for Chuck Russo, the colt became the first horse bred by von Von Voss to race when he debuted at Parx in September. He became her first winner with an 11-length romp at Parx second time out Oct. 4. And he became her first stakes winner when he landed the Lord Henribee S. at Aqueduct Nov. 6. Il Villano, who added a second stakes victory in the Dec. 6 Southampton S., will look to take his game to the next level when he stretches out to one mile and 70 yards in Saturday's Count Fleet S. at Aqueduct.

"It's incredible," von Voss said of Il Villano's exploits. "She is such an awesome mare and he was just an awesome foal. I knew early on that this horse was going to be a runner--and you don't hope any further than that."

"He blows me away; he is so fast," she added. "And the question is, can he go further than six furlongs? He is a laid-back horse, so I think they should be able to teach him, but I don't know. That's the nerve-wracking thing."

Von Voss is taking advantage of Il Villano's success, returning Do the Wekiva to the Keeneland January sales ring next week. Selling from the Brookdale Sales consignment and once again in foal to Pollard's Vision, the mare sells as [hip 695](#).

"In the best world, I would keep her," von Voss admitted. "I'd rather keep her, but, depending on what happens Saturday, she's going to be too expensive for me. She is going to be too nice for my broodmare band and, if she can pay for my other four mares, then she has done great. It's a roll of the dice in this business."

A self-described "horse-crazy little kid," von Voss had a different life mapped out for herself.

"When I got out of college, I went to New York and I wanted to be a yuppie," von Voss laughed. "So I worked at The Jockey Club in the registration department. I was involved with horses on paper."

She moved to Lexington when The Jockey Club relocated its offices and spent another year with the organization before leaving to pursue a masters degree. After graduate school, she returned to the Blue Grass and became more hands-on.

"When I came back to Lexington after graduate school, I started to work at farms and for veterinarians," von Voss said. "Now I work as a technician and veterinary assistant for the surgeons at Hagyard Davidson. I started with a desk job and went backwards."

Von Voss, whose first foal was born in 2008, currently has five broodmares, and admits the down market has been advantageous.

"I've just been lucky," she admitted. "When the market fell, I said, 'Well, I can buy a mare or two.' Two years ago, I wouldn't have been able to afford X Y or Z mares because the prices were so strong. The market being down has been hard, but it has also been good for me because I could buy some bloodstock that maybe would have been two or three times the price a couple of years ago."

Asked what her favorite part of the breeding business is, von Voss said, "I really enjoy picking out stallions for mares, and the pedigree aspect--you know the little nerd sitting there looking at the sales catalogue and thinking about what matches what. I like that aspect a lot."

Her plan is to breed commercially, but von Voss does have a juvenile in training who RNA'd at last year's January sale. And, in partnership, she owns a couple of 2-year-olds in training with Kate DeMasi at Parx.

"I love racing," von Voss said. "If I had more money, that's what I'd do all the time."

If Do the Wekiva proves popular at Keeneland next week, von Voss is ready to reinvest her earnings.

"I've got the [January] catalogue marked all over the place," she laughed. "I've got race fillies marked and a couple of other mares." *-Jessica Martini*

They never ran him over his head and he never failed to pull it off. Well done to all!" The award will be presented to Rapid Redux's connections at a ceremony Jan. 15 at Santa Anita Park.
