## DAVONA DALE NEXT FOR MISS NETTA

Everett Dobson's **Miss Netta** (Street Sense--Dyna Peak, by Dynaformer), an eye-catching last-to-first winner in a \$75,000 optional claimer at Gulfstream Park Thursday ([video](#)), will be aimed at that track's GII Davona Dale S. Feb. 25, trainer Kiaran McLaughlin told *TDN*.

Backed at 4-5, the 2011 GI Frizette S. third-place finisher spotted the field nearly 10 lengths in the early going after blowing the break. With Rajiv Maragh

aboard, she began to advance down the backstretch, continued to make steady progress with a sweeping move on the turn for home, and kept on coming in the stretch for a determined neck decision. The \$260,000 FTSAUG

yearling purchase earned an 80 Beyer Speed Figure for the effort.

"It was very impressive," McLaughlin offered. "She's a very nice filly. She just needs a little more gate work. We will continue to work with her, and *hopefully* we're not spotting the field 10 lengths again, because it's hard to win races doing that."

Miss Netta, a sharp debut winner at Saratoga Aug. 27 ([video](#)), has encountered some trouble leaving the stalls in all three of her subsequent attempts, including a sixth-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Churchill Downs Nov. 4.

"She's just a little temperamental and is getting better, but that's the first time that I've ever run a horse with the Monty Irish Blanket, and I was worried about doing that," McLaughlin revealed. "She handled it well in the mornings, but it looked like she was trying to get the blanket off her in the first few jumps after breaking OK [Jan. 5]."

McLaughlin is confident that he can get his charge over her early woes.

"She's a nice filly--we'll point for the Davona Dale," he said before adding with a laugh, "and give her trainer a little bit of time to school her at the gate." -SS

## TWO-TURN TRIAL FOR SECRET CIRCLE

Given that **Secret Circle** is by a sire in Eddington who was a Grade I winner at about 10 furlongs and out of a mare by a broodmare sire responsible for a recent Kentucky Derby winner, it's difficult to believe that the bay colt would have any sort of issue with the two-turn variety of racing. But such is the question that will need to be answered this afternoon when the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint hero takes on five newly turned 3-year-olds in the GIII Sham S. "We're going to find out more about Secret Circle in this race," commented Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert.

### GIMME TRES STEPS

The \$100,000 question is: which **Tres Borrachos** (Ecton Park) is going to show up for today's GII San Pasqual S. at Santa Anita. Will it be the one that came from behind to win the GII San Diego H. and to grab third in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile? Or will he make

the running as he did en route to a runner-up effort in the GIII Native Diver H. at Hollywood Park Dec. 3. "Joel decided to put him on the lead, and I didn't have any trouble with that," trainer Marty Jones told *Daily Racing Form*, referring to the race strategy last time. "We'll

look at the competition and leave it up to Joel," he added. **Tweebster** (Tapit) is still eligible for a third-level allowance, but more than keeps paying his way at this level. After winning three of his eight starts at three, he failed to find the winner's circle in five tries last term, but was second in the GII San Fernando S. and the GII Strub S. and third in the Native Diver. "He's an honest little horse, but he can't get by seconditis," trainer Bob Baffert admitted.

**No Walkover for the Chalk...**

The 2012 running of the Sham marks the first time the race will be contested this early in the season and the first time at a mile. In years past, it has been run during the month of February at the distance of nine furlongs, but this switch has been well received by the likes of Baffert. "Running the Sham at a mile and an eighth this time of year was too early," he commented. "But the Sham at one mile now is a good spot for horses whose potential for longer distances you're not certain of." ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Hierro (Hard Spun) will do his best to strip Secret Circle of his unblemished career mark. A troubled fifth to Alpha (*see opposite column*) in his Saratoga debut Sept. 3, he improved to be runner-up next time out at Belmont Park Oct. 1, but won his maiden "as the rider pleased" per the DRF marginal comment, skipping away to score by 5 1/4 lengths at Churchill going seven furlongs Nov. 9. Steve Asmussen is shooting for a second consecutive win in the Sham, having sent out Tapizar (Tapit) in 2011. **Longview Drive** (Pulpit), a full brother to GISW Pyro, won a pair of stakes on the California fairs circuit at Santa Rosa and Fresno last season, and gave a good account of himself on a grander stage when third in the GIII Delta Jackpot S. Nov. 19. He'll add blinkers for his Santa Anita debut. "We think he worked better in blinkers," Hall of Fame trainer Jerry Hollendorfer said. "So that's why we put them on. We're not putting on semis, we're just putting some little French cups on him."

Look for the Ⓚ throughout the TDN graded stakes entries, denoting Keeneland sales graduates.



**IL VILLANO GETS FIRST ROUTE TEST**

Chuck Russo's **Il Villano** will look to increase his win streak to four as he makes his two-turn debut in today's Count Fleet S. at the Big A. The grey broke his maiden by 11 lengths at Parx Oct. 4 before annexing the Lord Henribee S. on the main track here Nov. 6. The grey is coming off a five-length tally in the Dec. 6 Southampton S. back in Bensalem in his most recent effort. Il Villano may have to dial back his ample early foot in order to comfortably see out the trip considering fellow speedster **How Do I Win** is drawn directly to his outside. **Alpha**, a debut winner at Saratoga Sept. 6 and a distant second in the GI Champagne S. behind Union Rags (Dixie Union) at Belmont Oct. 8, looms a heavy odds-on favorite on the morning line. He was never in contention after acting up at the gate before the Nov. 5 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile S., checking in a disappointing 11th, but the Godolphin colorbearer enters this off a bullet four-furlong drill at Belmont Jan. 2 and gets his first dose of raceday Lasix. "We have several 3-year-olds we think highly of, including Alpha and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Consortium (Bernardini) and some others who haven't started yet, and we're trying to split them up," explained trainer Kieran McLaughlin of the decision to keep Alpha in New York rather than Florida. "We have had great success in New York with our runners during the winter. At the Breeders' Cup, he lost it in the gate, and we're hoping he will step up off that effort. He's a nice horse."

**Soldat**, hero of last year's GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park ([video](#)), has begun gearing up for his 4-year-old campaign. The dark bay returned to the Palm Meadows worktab with a pair of three-furlong breezes, including a :36 4/5 move Dec. 31.

"He's doing great, he's working weekly every Saturday," conditioner Kieran McLaughlin told *TDN*. "He's down to work [today]. We're very pleased with him. Hopefully, you keep seeing his name on the worktab. We haven't picked out a spot yet [for his return]. He's just had two easy works."

The dark bay was freshened following a disappointing fifth-place finish as the 3-2 favorite in the GI Florida Derby Apr. 3 and an 11th-place finish in the GI Kentucky Derby May 7. He was targeting the grassy GII Virginia Derby in July before McLaughlin decided to tap on the brakes.

"It was just his campaign," McLaughlin said of his reasoning for placing Soldat on holiday. "We decided to give him a little break--his feet were the only thing that were bugging him at that time, but he had a lot of races too. It was a combination of both things. He's been great though--no surgery and he's doing well. It just took him a little bit longer than we thought to get him back on the worktab."

Soldat, a \$180,000 KEESEP yearling purchase, showed an affinity for grass during his 2-year-old season, posting an authoritative win in Saratoga's GIII With Anticipation S. ([video](#)) and very solid second-place finishes in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Churchill Downs and the GIII Pilgrim S. at Belmont Park. McLaughlin confirmed that Soldat will return to the green stuff for his 2012 debut. -SS



### A Guide to Horse Racing iPad Apps

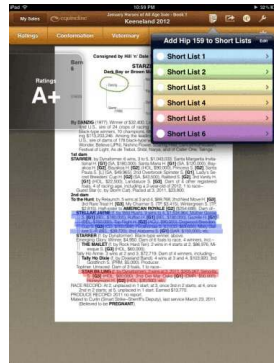
Get an Apple iPad over the holidays and want to know how you can use it for horse racing and sales? I tried out all the major horse-related apps out there, and while there's a definite lack in quantity, there's no shortage of quality. There are sure to be many new apps introduced over the next few years as tablets become more and more popular, but until then, see below for some of the best apps that are currently available.

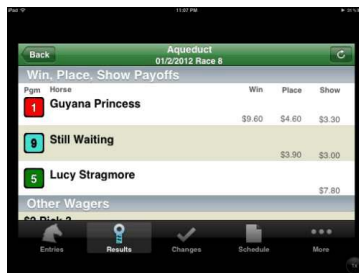

**EquineLine Sales Catalog** offers everything you could possibly want for viewing and editing sales catalogs from Thoroughbred, Quarter Horse and Standardbred auctions around the world. The features are endless and right on the money--this app was clearly designed by someone who knows what auction buyers, sellers and spectators want and need in an interactive catalog. Once you've downloaded a catalog of your choice from the extensive list of offerings, you can view each page as you normally would, but with a streamlined ease that a regular hard copy can't match. What further sets the app apart from a standard catalog are the ways in which it allows one to mark, edit and categorize pages. The user can add free-hand notes, highlights, underlines or sticky notes. It's also possible to add letter ratings or rate an offering by conformation or veterinary information. Various indexes are available as well as a search function. You can add horses to short lists too, turning each list into its own mini catalog. The app gives you the ability to email annotated pages, and you can even view breeze videos for 2-year-old sales. The only minor issue I had with this app has to do with its writing/highlighting functions. I found it a bit hard to accurately mark exactly where I wanted on a page--using a stylus might correct this.



**Equibase Today's Racing** is one of several apps featured here that is made for the iPhone, but that runs on the iPad. Touch the "2x" button on the bottom right corner of your screen for a double-sized view that doesn't quite take up the whole iPad screen, but does the job. The graphics of such apps are blurred a bit when blown up, but not enough to have any impact on functionality. The Equibase app offers entries for North American races for the current day as well as the next day, and includes owner, trainer and jockey info as well as morning line odds. There's also a link to purchase handicapping data. Results are available for the previous day as well as the current day, and detailed charts are offered in addition to quick results. Video replays are available for subscription holders. The app also lists scratches and changes for each track for the current day--something that could be very useful when taking your iPad to the track. While this app won't wow you with sharp graphics or features, it's perfectly suitable for looking up what you need to know on the fly.

**Racing Post's** app, also intended for the iPhone, features European cards and results with significant detail. The race cards include past performance information that can be customized, which is a nice added bonus. Cards are available for the upcoming race day through whatever day is available--usually about a week or so. Results go back about six days and include a fair amount of information. The app's news section lists top stories in chronological order with the most recent news at the top. There's also a video feature section that isn't updated as often. European users can use the app to access and bet through their William Hill account, and there's a link for streaming William Hill radio. This is a useful app for accessing

European racing information regardless of your location, but only European users will have the luxury of taking full advantage of its functionality.

**Daily Racing Form TicketMaker** helps you structure exotic wagers using the breakthrough methods outlined in Steve Crist's "Exotic Betting." This is another app intended for the iPhone, so it's not the prettiest thing to look at, but it's a very useful tool that gets the job done. It's easy to sort runners into the A, B, C, and X categories and to adjust parameters, and the "callout" function would be useful when placing a bet with a teller at the track. You can also save tickets or email them to yourself or others. The TicketMaker app features a link to the DRF website, but it would be better to simply access the site on Safari--the in-app browser does not



address issues of incompatibility between iOS and flash-driven content, so the only difference is a smaller screen. Either way, no Formulator without using some sort of third-party app--I've tried it using the GoToMyPC app and it works well enough.

Hollywood Park's **iGoRacing** app is only really useful when Hollywood is running, but it is a very aesthetically pleasing app that takes full advantage of the iPad's high resolution screen.



Entries, results and changes are available during the meet, and workouts are updated each day for both Hollywood and Santa Anita. There are also some handicapping resources which are a bit more geared to the novice, including

a bet calculator for determining the cost of a given wager. One of the app's more appealing functions is live streaming video, which is something hard to come by due to the flash issue on iOS. With a load of information presented in an excellent format, this is a must-have app for the Hollywood Park enthusiast.

The Kentucky Derby and Breeders' Cup apps haven't, of course, been updated yet for 2012, but both appear like they'll be very useful when the time comes. Don't forget to check them out during the spring and fall respectively.

It's also worth noting that while there is no *TDN* app, all features on the *TDN* website are fully functional with Safari. The newsletter itself looks great on the iPad either in Safari or in iBooks, and video replays are compatible with iOS.

Louise Courtelis, who owns the Georgetown, Kentucky-based Town and Country Farms with her daughter Kiki, turns 80 years of age in just under two weeks, and received an early birthday present with The Last Meow's debut victory Friday at Gulfstream Park.

"She ran a very powerful race, and we are all just very proud," commented Sonny Werneth, the president and CEO of Town and Country who watched the race with a group of farm staff and employees from their offices.

Town and Country Farms was founded by Courtelis and her late husband Alec in Micanopy, Florida, and stood leading Arabian stallion Wiking, whose progeny amassed earnings in excess of \$6 million and won 17 Darley Awards for Arabian excellence. The operation was recognized on five separate occasions as the Arabian Breeders of the Year and was named Arabian Owner of the Year in 1997. One of the leading clients of the farm in its days as an Arabian operation was none other than Sheikh Mohammed, for whom Town and Country housed over 300 horses over the years, in the estimation of Werneth.

Upon the untimely demise of Wiking in the early 2000s, Courtelis, who ran the farm alone following the death of her husband in 1996, decided to make the transition to Thoroughbreds, and ultimately relocated to Central Kentucky.

"We felt that if we were going to make money in the Thoroughbred business, we'd have to move to Kentucky, and we've been here for a little over three years now," Werneth commented.

It didn't take long for Town and Country to make a splash, as they went to work on day one of the 2008 Keeneland November sale. On offer that afternoon was the talented Richwoman (Successful Appeal), winner of the Gill Debutante S. in 2006, who was carrying one of the final foals by the legendary Storm Cat. Town and Country was able to privately secure the filly, then four, after she was led out of the ring unsold on a bid of \$725,000.

"She was a maiden mare and we were looking for a good racemare and she was that," Werneth recollected. "We just liked her, and knowing that she was going to have one of the last Storm Cat babies was of significant interest to us."

Richwoman foaled the filly that would come to be known as The Last Meow Mar. 5, 2009, but they suspected nearly from the start that the filly may not be commercially viable. That proved to be the case when bidding stalled on her at \$220,000 at Fasig-Tipton Saratoga in the summer of 2010. Werneth believes that was a blessing in disguise.

"Richwoman had the filly and she was a little low in the back, so we didn't get to sell her in the sale, but later on we were pleased that we didn't because after we broke her, she showed a lot of potential," he stated.

After being broken by Eric Reed at Pegasus Stud, The Last Meow was put into serious training at Keeneland in early 2011, and recorded several promising workouts over the Polytrack with an eye on an opening-day maiden in Lexington. As entry day neared, the phone rang. On the other end of the phone was one of the country's top conditioners. **Cont. p4**

"We had talked to Todd [Pletcher] the year before and he said he'd love to have her," Werneth explained. "Ironically, he called the same week that we were getting ready to enter at Keeneland, so we decided to send her on to Todd. After Todd got her, he decided she needed a little more maturity. We knew that she had a lot of speed, but we were a little afraid that she would turn out like her mother, so we wanted to give her a little more time to mature, and hopefully she'd take to the racetrack and do well."

The Last Meow shipped to Pletcher's Palm Meadows base in November, earning the bullet for a half-mile breeze in :47.19 (1/18) Dec. 7. She capped her worktab with a solid five-furlong move in 1:01.33, setting her up for Friday's debut.

Despite the speed she showed yesterday, Werneth, who will turn 67 Jan. 18--the day before his boss's birthday--sees no reason she won't be able to stretch out in distance.

"We certainly think so," he said when asked if she'll go on. "It showed in her early works that she had a lot of speed, but I just hung up with Todd, and he said she galloped out really well. She's been doing that in her recent works, so we hope so. She's a longer-bodied filly than her mother, only thing is that she's a swayback. Some people hold that against horses, but we had one a few years back and she was a great racemare. If they have the heart and the ability, the swayback doesn't matter--they can still run."

Town and Country's broodmare band currently numbers 28, which optimally will be pared down to about 20, Werneth stated. The operation added another high-class performer to their collection last November, going to an even \$1-million to acquire GISW C. S. Silk (Medaglia d'Oro).

In terms of the future for The Last Meow, there will be no back-seat driving, according to Werneth.

"When you've got someone like Todd, you have to depend on them," he offered. "We'll pretty much leave it up to him. If there's a spot that we don't like, we'll certainly share our opinion, but it's his call."

Werneth has held any number of odd jobs throughout his life, from fast-food restaurant owner to shipyard worker, from horse trainer to housebuilder. But, as he says, "the Lord always brought me back to these horses." Following yesterday's promising score, he is happiest not for himself, but for Louise Courtelis, with whom he has worked for 35 years.

"I'm so proud for my boss," he stated. "She's a wonderful lady, and we're hoping to have a big runner for her before her time comes."

The Last Meow just may be the one.--*Alan Carasso*
