TAPIZAR REIGNS SUPREME IN SAN FERNANDO

Winchell Thoroughbreds LLC's **Tapizar** (Tapit) was back to his brilliant best in Saturday's GII San Fernando S., leading nearly every step of the way for an ultimately comfortable 3 1/2-length victory. **Balladry** (Unbridled's Song) continued his progressive form, coming from near the back of the field to touch last year's treble Derby winner **Prayer For Relief** (Jump Start) out of second. Tapizar won his maiden by 10 1/2 lengths in his final start at two at Churchill Downs, and looked like a serious contender on the Triple Crown trail when he strolled home to take the GIII Sham S. in fast time last January. Those dreams were derailed when he was no better than seventh at odds-on in the GII Robert B. Lewis S. the following month, and the homebred went to the shelf. He resumed following an eight-month absence to wire the field in a tough second-level Belmont allowance, where he had SW & MGSP Uptowncharlybrown (Limehouse) 2 1/4 lengths back in second and GISW Boys at Tosconova (Officer) further back in third. Ambitiously spotted in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile Nov. 5, he fought Garrett Gomez midrace before finishing fifth. **Cont. p4**

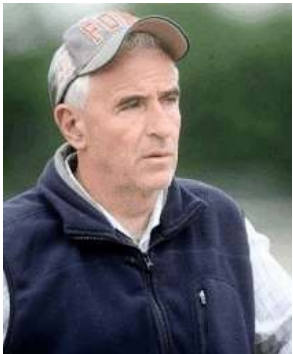

A Little Bit of Sunshine for Zito...

Jackson Bend has always been the equine version of the "little engine that could" for the Nick Zito bound, as he routinely outran his pedigree early in his career, including a third in the 2010 GI Preakness S. After

racing for the Hall of Famer at three, the chestnut was returned to his original trainer Stanley Gold last season, but despite running well in four starts, failed to win and was sent to Saratoga for the summer. A 8-1 winner over a graded-stakes quality bunch in the James Marvin S. July 22, he emerged from the pack for a richly deserved first Grade I success in the Forego S. Sept. 3. Though he recorded a career-best 112 Beyer behind

Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie) in the GII Kelso H. going Belmont's one-turn mile Oct. 1, the decision was made to turn him back in distance for the Sprint, and he ran on late to complete the trifecta behind Amazombie (Northern Afleet).

Slow to Start, Fleet to Finish...

Drawn inside here, Jackson Bend was a bit slow to begin and took up a inside position in the latter half of the field as longshots **Decisive Moment** (With Distinction) and **Will's Wildcat** (Wildcat Heir) kept each other company through splits of :24.30 and :47.44 over what appears to be a dull racing surface. Confidently and patiently handled by John Velazquez, the odds-on favorite crept up the inside before being eased out around a tiring rival at the three-eighths. Faced with a wall of horseflesh in front of him, he was steered out several paths, found daylight between **Cool Blue Red Hot** (Harlan's Holiday) and a rallying **Sangaree** (Awesome Again) approaching the eighth pole and exerted his class from there to get 2012 off on a positive note.

"I've been watching replays of his races and he can be a little bad," said Velazquez, aboard for the first time. "He didn't really stumble, but he didn't break that well. I was sort of biding my time around the turn. I didn't know if I should go inside or outside. But then I took the easy way out and said, 'I'll just take him outside.' It worked great."

With Jackson Bend showing the ability to see out the mile strongly, trainer Nick Zito has a much clearer view of what this season may hold.

"I'm going to suggest to Mr. [Robert] LaPenta that we keep him in races up to a mile. That's what he's happy doing," Zito offered. "I'd like to take a shot at the Met Mile with him. I've been second in it a couple times. We'll probably run him here one more time."

Ridden for speed from the outside gate in this field of eight, Tapizar broke alertly, but had to work hard to clear some inside traffic before leading into the clubhouse turn. Aggressive in his first start of the season, he proved a bit difficult to handle beneath Corey Nakatani and wanted to overrace through a sharp half-mile in :46.45. But by the time they'd reached the

midpoint of the backstretch, Tapizar had settled into a more rhythmic stride and remained firmly in command following six panels in 1:10.88. He looked to be idling a bit when they cornered from home, but he responded once set down for the drive and came home honestly for the victory. Balladry, last for the opening half-mile, split horses into the lane and stayed on gamely for second while never threatening the winner. "He's a really big and muscular horse. He's huge,"

commented winning jockey Corey Nakatani. "When you get him in that high cruising speed, he just seems to do it so easy. Steve [Asmussen] and I just wanted to get him to relax and run his race, and that's what he did. My job is to get the horse to relax and get into that comfortable zone that makes them run their best race. He ran a tremendous race today, and with his athletic ability, he's such an amazing horse."

A black-type winner on turf at two, Silver Medallion was fourth as the favorite in last year's GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 9, then went away following a fourth in the GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland Apr. 23. He returned off a near six-month layoff to miss by a half-length to Hollinger in a grass sprint at Woodbine Oct. 7. He was a solid third against his peers in the GIII Commonwealth Turf S. at Churchill Nov. 3 before closing the season with a defeat of his elders in the GIII Tropical Turf H. at Calder Dec. 2. The 4-year-old was content to race along ahead of only Kindergarden Kid as Yummy With Butter (Silvador) got away with an easy pace up front. Committed to the overland trip around the far turn, Silver Medallion made eye-catching progress to challenge wide into the lane. He came to the drifting pacesetter under a full head of steam and outfinished that one for the victory. Yummy With Butter was ultimately found to have bumped hard with favored Mutual Trust (GB) (Cacique {Ire}) and was demoted to sixth. Winning trainer Todd Pletcher indicated that Silver Medallion is under consideration for the GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. at nine furlongs Feb. 11.

Trainer Gai Waterhouse was going to be a winner either way as two of her charges, No Looking Back and Driefontein, sped under the wire together. No Looking Back was a head in front at the line, but, after a lengthy inquiry, the stewards deemed Driefontein had been hampered and awarded her the huge prize. "It was fabulous fun--I thought I was riding them myself," Waterhouse said prior to the inquiry. Both fillies will be pointed for the G1 Golden Slipper S. at Rosehill Apr. 7. Purchased for A\$75,000 at last year's Gold Coast Sale, Driefontein is now unbeaten in three starts. She captured her Nov. 5 unveiling at Randwick before adding the G3 B J McLachlan S. at Doomben on New Year's Eve. The filly is owned by a syndicate formed by Denise Martin of Star Thoroughbreds. "This is what racing is about," Waterhouse said during the presentation. "These owners around me--you don't have to have a lot of money to get involved. You couldn't do this in America or England, and certainly not Russia or China--we're very lucky, and this is what it is all about."

"She will be in the paddock on Monday," Balzen added. "We're going to set to her for the [G2] Queensland Guineas [June 9]--it is over 1400 metres, and will be right up her alley."

ROCK OF AGES

Leading young sire Fastnet Rock (Aus), whose daughter Driefontein (Aus) prevailed in the A\$2-million BMW Magic Millions Classic, proved popular once more during Saturday's session of the Gold Coast Yearling Sale. Offered by Coolmore Stud as agent, lot 637, a son of Fastnet Rock out of Freckled Face (Aus) (Polish Patriot) topped the day's trade at A\$370,000. He will join the stable of Bevan Laming, who trained his Group 3-winning half-brother Face Value (Aus) (Red Ransom). "He's a nice strong colt who is very athletic and looks a great prospect," Laming said. "Obviously, I had a lot of success with his half brother Face Value, and this bloke is a bit bigger." The Queensland-based conditioner added, "He's probably not the style of horse for the 2YO Classic next year, but he could make a later two-year-old."

Through the first four sessions, the sale has grossed A\$62.57 million. The clearance rate is 84% thus far. Both the average and median--A\$127,175 and A\$100,000, respectively--have posted increases from last year's auction. **Cont. p7**

To make a long story short, a protest (in North American lingo, objection) was lodged by the connections of Driefontein, who crossed the line in second, against No Looking Back, the filly that crossed the wire first. To be honest, since the toteboard is not very detailed, I didn't even realize the issue hadn't been



settled until a horn went off (I thought the cavalry was coming), signaling that the race was official. The result was finalized, and while Gai Waterhouse still emerged the winner, owner Nick Vass had to stand by and watch as winnings of A\$1.14

million suddenly slipped out of his hands. On the flipside, Driefontein's connections--headed by Star Thoroughbreds' Denise Martin who put together the partnership--went absolutely crazy. The new winning connections who were in the paddock, not to mention the large group of supporters lining the rail, shouted, cheered and chanted for a long time afterward. Truth be told, I felt pretty bad for Nick Vass. To go from that high to that low has to be crushing. In fact, he came by to commiserate with a few people nearby and looked absolutely gutted. I must admit, however, he handled the whole thing with such class and grace, that in my books, he gets the award for sportsmanship. Getting an honorable mention is Gai Waterhouse, who respectfully hung back, away from all of her clients, as the new winners cheered wildly. I'm told that normally, she would be in the thick of the celebration, but on this occasion, she opted for a more subdued approach. That display of good judgment is just one of the reasons why she is so highly respected and continues to be one of Australia's greatest racing ambassadors.

One of the most unfortunate occurrences of the day was the tote went down sporadically through the card, leaving many unable to place a bet on the day's races. I'm not sure if the facility and infrastructure in place simply couldn't support the numbers (although I don't think this has happened before) or whether it was caused by some other reason, but it really has to hurt those who put so much time and effort to produce and promote the event. Having encountered such misadventures in the U.S., including the sort encountered during Big Brown's Belmont Day meltdown (both literally and figuratively), we all know how unfortunate that is for the local economy.

A final note on the raceday; also hanging on the steward's decision in the 2YO Classic was the race for supremacy in the stallion ranks (at least in earnings). Heading into Saturday, Arrowfield's Redoute's Choice led Fastnet Rock by a solid margin. So when Driefontein was promoted, he not only landed his connections in the winner's circle, but he also propelled Fastnet Rock ahead of the perennial leader to the top of the stallion rankings. Interesting observation: Soon after the race, Jon Freyer (team Arrowfield) walked over to the Irish contingent (team Coolmore) and, while I was curiously awaiting the exchange, it consisted of only a polite and respectful banter. It made me realize that despite all the plots and subplots inherently involved in the leadup, running and aftermath of every race contested anywhere in the world, people understand the basis of this game. You might be the winner today, but you can just also be the loser tomorrow, so you better make sure not to kick anybody when they're down, because you're turn is invariably right around the corner.

After the races, the crowd streamed over to the Magic Millions sales grounds, which is conveniently located just across the street from the racecourse. In my opinion, that convenience creates an atmosphere like of nothing I have ever experienced before. By the time the sale got under way (a little after 6 p.m.), a crush of bodies (some standing, some walking, many stumbling and most drinking) jammed the grounds. Let me tell you, the mix of people was something to see. Women and men dressed to the nines were haphazardly tossed in with folks wearing t-shirts, shorts and flip flops. On the grounds one could see the old, the young and everything in between. I found myself highly amused when I happened to chance upon a very well-dressed woman--fascinator, high heels and all--languishing on the ground nearest the barns, while chatting nonchalantly on the phone and drinking beer from a bottle. Nice. Truthfully, I can't even use the word 'electric' to describe the feel in the air, because it doesn't even begin to describe the mood accurately. Maybe the more appropriate word is 'volcanic.' Despite all the hoopla, the auctioneers went on with their business and, lo and behold, the horses got sold. I guess you can say that it's not their first rodeo.

A quick follow up to a note earlier in the week. I had mentioned Channel 9's personality and farm owner Anthony Mithen had a few horses in the sale, and after four of six sold thus far, I am happy to report (and so is he) that each one was sold for a profit of about 30%. Also happy with its results, Magic Millions is pretty pleased that, despite a sluggish first day, the sale picked up from day 2 onward and overall numbers appear to be up over 2011. In this day and age, that's very good news for any sales company and hopefully, the sale can maintain its momentum until the very end.

Australian Pioneer...Danehill

All one has to do is peruse the current Magic Millions Gold Coast catalog to realize the significance of the legendary Danehill (Danzig). Over the course of this past week's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling sale, descendants of the sire have realized top dollar, including the sales topping yearling thus far, Lot 265--a colt by Fastnet Rock (Aus)--that brought A\$960,000

during Wednesday's second session. Many of the sales'--and nation's--top stallions trace back, in many cases within the first two generations, to the influential sire. Without a doubt the most important stallion acquisition made by any breeding operation in

Australia, Arrowfield struck a deal with Coolmore to import of European champion sprinter in 1989. Among the earliest shuttle stallions, Danehill--who stood the Northern Hemisphere season at Coolmore in Ireland--sired the winner of Australia's premier event for juveniles--the Golden Slipper--in each of his first three foal crops Down Under.

"He was a perfect horse to shuttle, because he had such a great temperament," explained Arrowfield's Jon Freyer. "He was also so well suited to the bloodlines out here. For the early part of his career anyway, he was a much better stallion in this part of the world than he was in Europe."

Over the course of the next decade, the stallion shuttled to Arrowfield until Coolmore became the sole owner after a reported \$24-million deal, making Danehill the most valuable Thoroughbred stallion in Australian history. Though he died in 2003, the Juddmonte-bred earned the leading sire of juveniles in Britain and Ireland six times, and was also a two-time champion sire in France. In Australia, he headed the sire list eight out of 10 seasons.

"His progeny were tough, sound and had a good temperament and suited to our training techniques," said Freyer. "He certainly did change people's perception of European horses. He also changed the overall bloodline nicks in this country, because prior to him, the Northern Dancer line hadn't done particularly well. A lot of the bloodlines were dominated by Star Kingdom blood, and since Danehill came along, he just overwhelmed that to the extent that nearly today, there isn't a Star Kingdom horse at stud that is a terribly commercial horse." 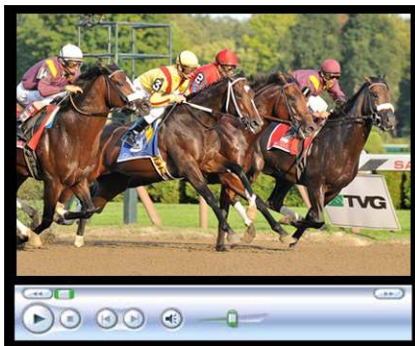

Included among Danehill's long list of champions and Group 1 winners are Aquarelliste (Fr), Asia (Aus), Aussie Rules, Banks Hill (GB), Cacique (Ire), Catbird (Aus), Champs Elysees (GB), Clodovil (Ire), Dane Ripper (Aus), Danehill Dancer (Ire), Danewin (Aus), Danzero (Aus), Desert King (Ire), Dylan Thomas (Ire), Duke of Marmalade (GB), Elvstroem (Aus), Exceed and Excel (Aus), Fairy King Prawn (Aus), Fastnet Rock, Flying Spur (Aus), George Washington (Ire), Holy Roman Emperor (Ire), Horatio Nelson (Ire), Intercontinental (GB), Lucky Owners (NZ), North Light (Ire), Nothin' Leica Dane (Aus), Oratorio (Ire), Redoute's Choice, Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), Scintillation (Aus), Spartacus (Ire), Tiger Hill (Ire) and Westerner (GB).

"He certainly revolutionized bloodlines and pedigrees in the this part of the world, but ultimately in Europe as well," added Freyer. "Not only as a sire, but as a broodmare sire as well. Even though it took longer there than it did here."

And the Danzig/Danehill influence spanned far beyond simply the Australian nation.

"The worst thing in the world for us in Hong Kong was Danehill dying," explained Mark Richards, who buys on behalf of the Hong Kong Jockey Club. "He was so dominant in Hong Kong. His sons have also proven to be dominant, not as dominant as he was, but certainly Exceed and Excel and Danehill Dancer have been exceptionally good. The Danehill/Danzig line works in Hong Kong."

And what made him the ultimate candidate for shuttling went beyond his offspring's success.

Looking to carry the torch for his sire is Coolmore's young stallion Fastnet Rock, whose progeny grossed A\$6,525,000 for 26 sold, averaging A\$250,961. And according to Coolmore's Peter O'Brien, the difference between a stallion that is good and great on the shuttling circuit goes beyond the obvious.

"Fastnet Rock just eats, sleeps and covers mares, and travels very well," O'Brien said. "He ticks every box for a stallion that shuttles."

Bred and owned by the Niarchos family, Denon was third in the 2001 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains. He captured a quartet of Grade 1 races under the care of Bobby Frankel over the next two seasons, and is the sire of last year's G3 Premio Carlo d'Alessio winner Il Fenomeno (Ity) and the listed performer Adragon (Ity).

Lucky Nine, last-out winner of the G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Sprint, has thrived since that Dec. 11 test, but must cope with this minimum trip against several who show their best form down the straight.

"Lucky Nine has done well since his last race and I'm happy with his preparation," said the 5-year-old's trainer Caspar Fownes. "He's very consistent and I've kept him fresh, but 1000 meters is a trifle short.

The straight 1000 is a bit of a specialist's course, really, so the key will be a good pace up front and then hopefully he can hit the line strong." One-time world champion sprinter **Sacred Kingdom** has eight wins and has missed the top two just once in 12 tries at the distance, but exits a 10th from a high draw in the Hong Kong Sprint. He is this race's two-time defending champion. **Little Bridge** was sent off the 19-10 favorite in the HK Sprint on the strength of his win in the G2 Jockey Club Sprint in November, but found some trouble on International Day and settled for fourth. 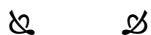
