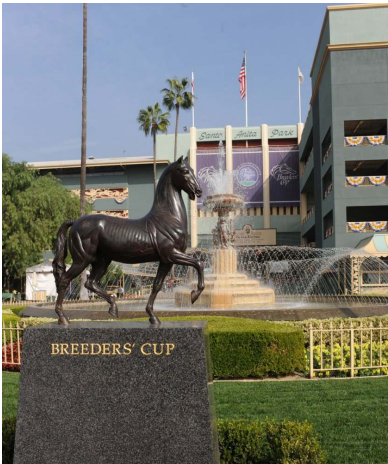

BREEDERS' CUP MOVING TO NBC

The Breeders' Cup is going prime time. In a new, multi-year partnership between the Breeders' Cup and the NBC Sports Group, NBC again takes over the television coverage of racing's biggest day and, for the first time in history, the \$5-million G1 Breeders' Cup Classic will be aired in prime time. NBC will show 9 1/2 hours of live coverage from the 2012 Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita on Friday and Saturday, Nov. 2-3, capped by the Classic, which airs Saturday from 8-9 p.m. ET. The Cup returns to the network that broadcast the event since its inception in 1984 through 2005. ABC and ESPN covered the

Breeders' Cup for the last six years. Financial terms of the deals were not disclosed.

"Everyone here is delighted that the Breeders' Cup has returned home," said Jon Miller, President, Programming, NBC Sports and NBC Sports Network. "Bringing back this prestigious event, combined with our long-term partnerships for the Triple Crown with Churchill Downs for the Kentucky Derby, in addition to the Preakness and Belmont, cements the NBC Sports Group as the home of horse racing."

Craig Fravel, president and CEO of Breeders' Cup Ltd, added, "We are extremely excited to begin our new relationship with NBC and the NBC Sports Group in televising the Breeders' Cup World Championships as the finale to its expanded commitment to Thoroughbred racing. In addition to fans enjoying the best in international competition over the two days of the Championships on NBC Sports Network, we look forward to NBC showcasing the Breeders' Cup Classic in primetime."

STAR-STUDDED WORLD CUP ENTRIES

The Dubai World Cup meeting, to be held Mar. 31 at Meydan, has attracted entries from 24 countries and includes five Breeders' Cup winners and four Eclipse Award champions. Nominees include G1 Kentucky Derby winner **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}), G1 1000 Guineas and G1 Irish Oaks winner **Blue Bunting** (Dynaformer), and G1 Melbourne Cup winner in **Dunaden (Fr)** (Nicobar {GB}).

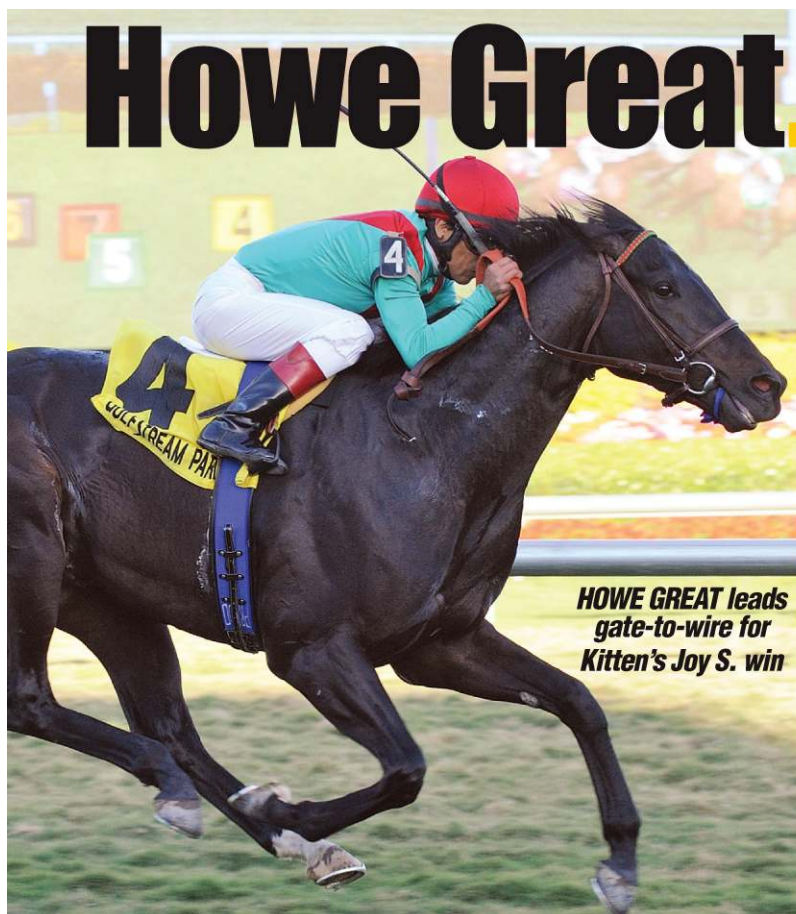
JOCKEYS' GUILD, CDI REACH AGREEMENT

A dispute between the Jockeys' Guild and Churchill Downs Incorporated (CDI) has been settled after the two groups reached a multi-year agreement that calls for CDI to make payments to the Jockeys' Guild to subsidize health insurance, life insurance and disability benefits for members of the Guild who ride in the U.S. Terms of the agreement were not disclosed. "We sincerely appreciate the commitment made by CDI to support the benefits that impact our jockeys," said Terry Meyocks, national manager of the Jockeys' Guild. "This agreement will directly benefit approximately 950 active, retired and permanently disabled members. It is critical that we receive support from all of our racetrack partners within the industry." Last summer, CDI announced that it would no longer make financial contributions to the Guild. Under the previous agreement that expired Dec. 31, the four CDI tracks--Churchill Downs, Fair Grounds, Arlington Park and Calder--paid about \$330,000 to the Guild through per-mount and per-race fees. In return, the tracks got to use images of the jockeys to promote themselves and the sport.

A petition signed by 240 jockeys was submitted to the CDI board of directors in mid-November in the hopes of urging the board to reconsider its stance, and at least two states--Illinois and California--had delayed decisions on the renewal of the advance-deposit-wagering operation Twinspires.com, which is owned by CDI. Currently, the Guild provides life insurance, AD&D insurance and temporary disability benefits to its active members, as well as life insurance and aid to permanently disabled members.

Canadian Up-And-Comer Maritimer Sold Privately

Maritimer (Stormy Atlantic--Highland Mood, by Highland Ruckus), one of Canada's top juveniles last year and a likely finalist for a Sovereign Award as champion 2-year-old colt, has been sold by owner/breeder Howard Walton.

Walton, who races under the banner Norseman Racing Stable, confirmed yesterday that the multiple-stakes-winning colt had been sold privately, but

disputed a story in the *Toronto Star* that said Maritimer had been sold to controversial Chechen leader Ramzan Kadyrov. Walton said the horse had been sold in a deal brokered by two bloodstock agents, but that he isn't aware of who the purchaser

"I don't know where that information came from," he said, referring to the *Star* story. "There were two agents that dealt primarily with my lawyer, and that's about all I know." Walton declined to disclose the price, but said, "It was good for them, and it was good for us."

Walton, who operates the Toronto-based Norseman Plastics, co-bred and raced Maritimer's dam Highland Mood, who was undefeated in four career starts. Her wins included the 2001 editions of the Ontario Damsel S. and Passing Mood S. Trained by Sid Attard, Maritimer, her fourth foal, won sprinting six panels on debut at Woodbine in July. He then ran second in the six-furlong Vandal S. three weeks later, defeated a head by another Norseman homebred in Buongiorno Johnny (Mr. Greeley). Maritimer hit his best stride in the fall when stretched to two turns on the main track, winning the Coronation Futurity S. by 2 1/4 lengths Nov. 6 ([video](#)) and the Display S. by 5 1/2 lengths Nov. 27 ([video](#)).

"His speed figures spoke for themselves, which is why we had a lot of the big people calling," said Walton, who declined to disclose the purchase price, but said, "It was good for them and good for us." Walton has campaigned, among others, MGSW Signature Red (Bernstein).

The 35-year-old Kadyrov is a former Chechen rebel who became president of Chechnya in 2007. An avid horse racing fan, he has competed internationally, and in 2009 was represented by G1 Melbourne Cup third Mourilyan (Ire) (Desert Prince {Ire}). Last year, he privately purchased the GIII Holy Bull S. runner-up Sweet Ducky (Pulpit) and sent him to Dubai for the G2 UAE Derby. The colt went unplaced and, returned to the States and, sent to Seth Benzel's barn, went unplaced again in a Woodbine allowance race in late October. The *Toronto Star* said that Benzel would also train Maritimer, but the *TDN* couldn't confirm as of last night. -LM

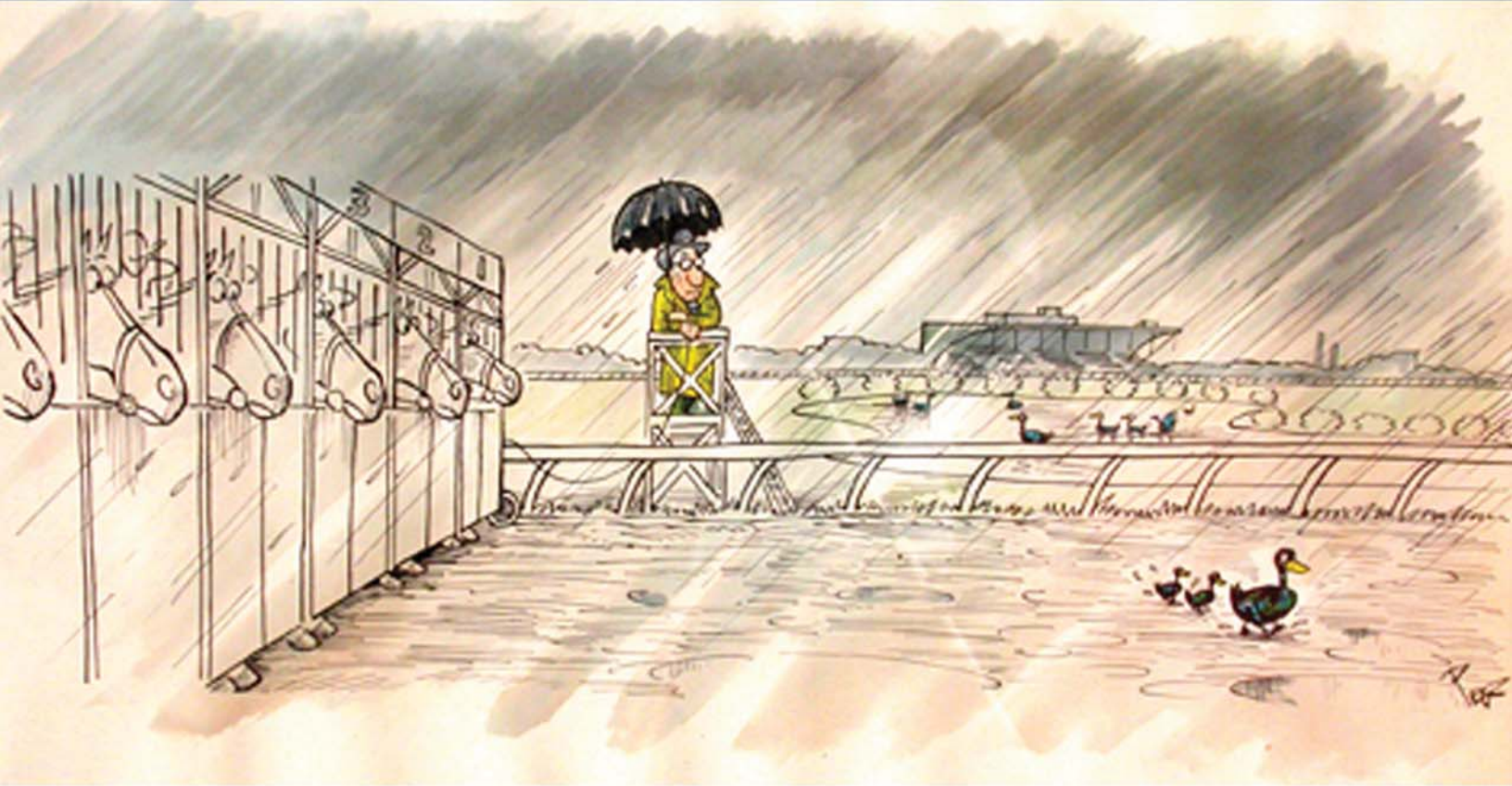

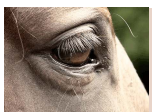

It could be an exaggeration to describe Don't Trick Her as an ugly duckling, but there can be no denying that she has now developed into a magnificent swan. Include Me Out is her third stakes winner by an Airdrie stallion, following Don't Trick Me's speedy Canadian Frontier filly On The Menu and her excellent Stormin Fever filly Check The Label, who numbered the GI Garden City Breeders' Cup S. among her four graded victories on turf.

The mare's younger progeny are Look Busy, a brother to Include Me Out who sold for \$340,000 as a yearling; the 2-year-old Divine Park filly Wooden Nickel who sold for \$180,000 as a weanling and \$220,000 as a yearling; and a 2011 filly by Divine Park. Don't Trick Her was sent to an outside stallion for the first time in her eight-year broodmare career when she visited Malibu Moon in 2011.

I described Don't Trick Her as an ugly duckling because she is an unraced daughter of an unraced mare and was covered for the first time as a 3-year-old in 2004. Neither her sire Mazel Trick nor her broodmare sire Northjet ranked among Airdrie's numerous success stories. By 2006 her sire Mazel Trick had been moved from Airdrie to Pennsylvania, where he lasted only one season before moving on to British Columbia in Canada.

The future had looked much rosier in the early years of Mazel Trick's stallion career. He had earned his place at stud with his performances in California, after his return from France. He won all four of his starts on dirt and on one occasion dipped under 1:20.00 for seven furlongs, when he set a new track record in the GII Triple Bend H. Mazel Trick also collected a pair of Grade IIIs over a mile and a sixteenth.

There had been quite a buzz about Mazel Trick when his first foals reached the sales. Sired at a fee of \$15,000, they averaged more than \$75,000 as weanlings and nearly \$80,000 as yearlings, when they achieved such prices as \$535,000, \$290,000 and \$255,000. Unfortunately, such optimism proved to be misplaced and Mazel Trick's career yielded only one graded stakes winner (the sprinter Major Success)--hence his departure from Kentucky. However, another of his daughters, Mazel Tov, produced that smart turf filly Summer Soiree.

Include Me Out's second dam Lucy Sims also ranks as the second dam of the previously mentioned Silver Medallion, winner of the GIII Ft. Lauderdale S. on turf a couple of weeks ago. Silver Medallion's dam Another Vegetarian failed to win in four starts, but she too has served Airdrie very well. She is also the dam of Sweet Talker, a Stormin Fever filly who became a Grade I winner in the Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup.

Include Me Out's third dam Join The Waves won only one of her 24 starts, but there is another successful family descending from her, via her Gallant Man filly Porthole. Porthole produced the Grade I-placed Personable Lady, who in turn produced the GI Las Virgenes S. winner Likeable Style. Likeable Style now ranks as the second dam of last year's leading freshman sire Scat Daddy.

Having said that Don't Trick Her didn't look hugely promising at the start of her broodmare career, how do I explain her success? Perhaps it has something to do with the fact that her pedigree is free of many of the major influences, her only inbreeding in five generations being 5x5 to Nearctic and 5x5 to Big Game. Big Game won the 2,000 Guineas and appears in Don't Trick Her's pedigree through his talented daughters Queenpot (winner of the 1,000 Guineas) and Safari Moon (second dam of the Irish 1,000 Guineas winner Even Star).

I could also add that Don't Trick Her's female line traces all the way back to the famous mare Marchetta. She belongs to the Rosetta branch, which has provided European racing with numerous classic winners.

The sire's side of Include Me Out's pedigree was covered fairly comprehensively when I assessed the pedigree of Her Smile last July. As I pointed out on that occasion, Include's career represents a perfect example of the peaks and troughs that affect so many of today's stallions. His first crop, which featured the Grade I winners Cash Included and Panty Raid and those talented fillies Runway Rosie and She's Included, helped restore demand for Include's services in 2007.

Consequently, he had only his second three-figure crop in 2008, and it's deja vu all over again. This time the 125 members of this crop include the GI Prioress S. winner Her Smile, the Grade II winners St John's River and Include Me Out and the Grade III winner Redeemed.

Unfortunately, Include attracted fewer mares over the next few years, the end result being 60 live foals in 2009, 29 in 2010 and 20 in 2011. As he covered 55 mares in 2011, let's hope the tide has turned once again.
