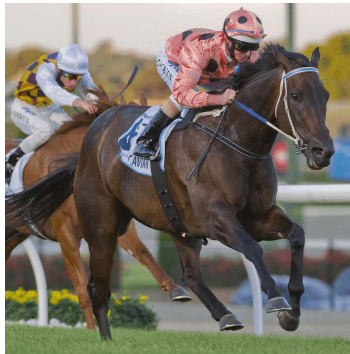

BETTING ON 'BLACK'

In her first run since November, Australia's undefeated supermare **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}) rolled to her 17th straight win in the G2 Australia S. at Moonee Valley Friday night. Unhurried from the gate and sitting a few lengths off pacesetter **Zedi Knight (Aus)** (Zeditave {Aus}) and the pressing **Doubtful Jack (Aus)** (Not a Single Doubt {Aus}), Black Caviar drew closer at the midway point. As they approached the left-hand turn into the stretch, she cruised up three wide under her own resolve, and once straightened for home, pulled away with devastating ease. The winning margin was four lengths. Zedi Knight finished second, with Black Caviar's stablemate Doubtful Jack another 4 1/2 lengths back in third. The final time of the 1200-meter turf sprint was 1:09.44--just .15 seconds off the track record established by subsequent 2007 G1 King's Stand S. heroine Miss Andretti (Aus) (Ihtiram {Ire}). **Cont. p3**

SOLID FIELD IN SUNSHINE MILLIONS CLASSIC

A salty group of seven Florida-breds will line up in today's \$400,000 Sunshine Millions Classic at Gulfstream, topped on the morning line by Reeves Thoroughbred Racing & Dream Team Racing Stable's G1 Kentucky Derby third-place finisher **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno). The big bay, who captured last term's GII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds, hit the sidelines after competing in all three Triple Crown events, but returned no worse for wear when annexing an Aqueduct optional claimer by 5 3/4 lengths last time Nov. 9. "He came back great in his race at Aqueduct [and] he came back for this race great," said trainer Kathy Ritvo. "Now, we're looking forward to starting this year right." Robert Sahn and trainer Stan Hough's **Adios Charlie** (Indian Charlie) will look to build on a handy 3 1/4-length success going a mile here Dec. 16. The GII Jerome S. hero had last been seen completing the exacta in Belmont's GII Dwyer S. July 2. **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate) annexed the Sunny and Mild S. and Queens County S. in his last two runs at Aqueduct Nov. 17 and Dec. 10 respectively, and **Turbo Compressor** (Halo's Image) comes off a 10 1/2-length romp in the Nov. 12 Carl G. An International Black Out...

"It was great to see her back," trainer Peter Moody said. "They raced in 1:09-something. It was easy to say she was unextended, but how much faster do they go? It was wonderful to see her back in great shape. Her attitude was good, her action was terrific, so hopefully, it's the start of a wonderful six months." Added regular pilot Luke Nolen, "It probably wasn't the strongest opposition she's met, but she relaxed nicely off an even speed. I just squeezed her [at the end of the race], not that she was complacent, but just to make sure she took full benefit of the gallop today." It was Black Caviar's second win in the Australia; she also won the race in 2010.

It's been nearly three years since Black Caviar debuted a winner at Flemington in April of 2009, but improbably, her wins just seem to get easier and easier. A perfect eight-for-eight in 2011, she wrapped up a successful campaign with wins in the G2 Schweppes Schillaci S. at Caulfield Oct. 8, G2 Schweppes S. at Moonee Valley Oct. 22 and G1 Patinack Farm Classic at Flemington Nov. 5. In her return to Moonee Valley on Friday, track officials were prompted to admit fans free of charge after ticket lines became too long to service. And despite the sweltering conditions, the imposing mare delivered for the appreciative crowd.

"She is just terrific for our sport; she's put us on the front page for all the right reasons," said Moody. The conditioner told *racenet.com.au* that Black Caviar will now attempt a Group 1 double in the C F Orr S. and Futurity S. at Caulfield next month. He also left the door open for international travel, with Dubai and Great Britain possible destinations. "We'll use the old adage of [AFL coach] Kevin Sheedy, to take it one game at a time," Moody told the publication. "There's a race for her every Saturday on the eastern seaboard of Australia and other parts of the world for the next six months."

RUMOR MAKES GRADED DEBUT

Ramona Bass, Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Rumor** makes her graded stakes debut in the seven-furlong GI Santa Monica S. today at Santa Anita. Never out of the exacta in seven lifetime starts, the Richard Mandella trainee took the Sept. 7 CERF S. at Del Mar and Jan. 1 Kalookan Queen H. here in her last two efforts. "She's doing good and she's kind of done everything we've asked of her so far, so we'll see if she's this good," said Mandella. "The distance should suit her." Rumor will stretch out a half-furlong from the Kalookan Queen. She was second in a one-mile allowance here Feb. 13 in her only start beyond 6 1/2 furlongs. Ted and Judy Nichols' **Teddy's Promise** seeks to replicate her 16-1 upset of the track and trip GI La Brea S. Dec. 31 last time. She'll be re-opposed by La Brea runner-up **Sugarinthemorning** and fourth-place finisher **Home Sweet Aspen**, but there doesn't appear to be any obvious reason for either one of those foes to turn the tides. Teddy's Promise's own improved form may have been due to the switch to dirt--she's now two-for-two over the conventional stuff for trainer Ron Ellis.

EDEN'S MOON TAKES CLASS LEAP

Kaleem Shah's **Eden's Moon** will look to justify her ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status in today's GIII Santa Ysabel S. in Arcadia. The \$390,000 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic buy ran into subsequent GII Santa Ynez S. romper Reneesgotzip (City Zip) on debut Dec. 18 sprinting at Hollywood, but returned going a mile here Jan. 8 to earn her diploma by 11 1/2 lengths with an 88 Beyer Speed Figure. "Her maiden win was pretty impressive, and she's trained forwardly since," offered trainer Bob Baffert. "The Santa Ysabel is a pretty tough race. I think the best fillies in California are all in there." While her potential has garnered her an 8-5 quote on the morning line, Eden's Moon is far from a cinch facing the Dec. 10 GI Hollywood Starlet one-two finishers **Killer Graces** and **Charm the Maker** as well as impressive Blue Northern S. winner **Lady of Shamrock**. "She's training very good," said Dan Ward, assistant to trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, of Killer Graces. "She was a maiden when we bought her right after her first race [at Hollywood May 1] and she's really been a pleasant surprise." Lady of Shamrock, a Hronis Racing private purchase who was previously trained by co-owner Ronny Werner, showed a head-turning late speed for John Sadler in the Dec. 30 Blue Northern here. She'll try dirt for the first time, but trains regularly over this strip.

AWESOME FEATHER SEEKS NINTH STRAIGHT

Stronach Stables' **Awesome Feather** looms an imposing presence in the Sunshine Millions Distaff as she looks to up her career unbeaten streak to nine. The 2010 champion 2-year-old filly, who sold for \$2.3M at Fasig-Tipton November after her Breeders' Cup victory, made just two starts in 2011 for new trainer Chad Brown, but her 5 1/4-length romp in the Nov. 26 GI Gazelle S. at Aqueduct last time is hard to argue with. She earned a career best 99 Beyer Speed Figure for that effort. "Since she's won the Gazelle everything's been perfect," said Brown. "She's been training here at Palm Meadows and hasn't missed anything. She's been working right along." The favorite's sternest test could come from Jay Em Ess Stable's **Tiz the Argument**, who has won her last three starts by a combined 15 1/2 lengths under the tutelage of Rick Dutrow. She annexed the Dec. 18 Let Me Linger S. last time at Aqueduct by 7 3/4 lengths.

CHAMP MUSICAL ROMANCE RETURNS

Recently crowned champion female sprinter **Musical Romance** takes on her fellow Florida-breds in the Sunshine Millions Filly/Mare Sprint. The 20-1 upsetter of the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Filly/Mare Sprint has never hit the board in four tries over this strip, but she she ended last year in career form and appears to have been working well at Calder in the interim. GIII HOLY BULL S. - GULFSTREAM PARK - SUNDAY

Breeders' Cup winners have historically been significant underlays in their subsequent return races, and Hansen (Tapit) should be no exception here. While his Eclipse-earning form in 2011 was solid, it's likely that he will regress off the bench--especially with serious early pressure. Recent maiden breaker Silver Max (Badge of Silver) has proven unwilling to rate, and if My Adonis (Pleasantly Perfect) runs as quick early as he did last time in the GIII Delta Jackpot (95 Moss Pace Figure--23 points above par), he'll add more fuel to the fire. My Adonis has run slower early in past efforts, but he enters this race with three straight bullet drills, including a :34 4/5 spin at Palm Meadows Jan. 22--*much* faster than what any of the other nine workers at that distance went in.

With Fort Loudon (Awesome of Course)'s speed figures ruling him out for the top slot, this becomes a two-horse race between Algorithms (Bernardini) and **Consortium** (Bernardini). While the former came out ahead in the first "Battle of the Bernardinis" here with a slightly tougher trip going 6 1/2 furlongs Dec. 16, Consortium offers more upside--especially at this longer distance. Algorithms hails from a family of predominantly sprinters (namely Keyed Entry and Justin Phillip), whereas Consortium is the first foal out of a GSW at 1 1/8 miles who was out of a nine-furlong GSW herself. Consortium also gets Lasix for the first time--trainer Kieran McLaughlin boasts a \$2.28 ROI (23%) over the past five years with horses adding Lasix in stakes races, according to *DRF Formulator*. McLaughlin swept Aqueduct's 3-year-old stakes Jan. 7 with Captivating Lass (A.P. Indy) and Alpha (Bernardini)--both were adding Lasix and ran new Beyer tops in victory.

Consortium won't be too high of a price facing just five foes, but his odds will be inflated thanks to the presence of Hansen. Something in the 3-1 or 7-2 range would be value. A straight double with **Sacristy** (Pulpit) in the preceding GII Forward Gal S. might also be a worthwhile play. While she figures to be a short price, if the field remains intact, she is a *very* likely winner due to the projected pace scenario.

WHITHER IGUGU, THEY FOLLOW

The R2.5-million G1 J&B Met is the highlight of the summer season on the Western Cape, and though a competitive field has been drawn, much depends on **Igugu (Aus)** (Galileo {Ire}). The bay filly has shown a propensity to use her tactical speed in garnering nine wins in 11 starts, and the race could play right into her cards. However, her interrupted preparation, coupled with her quarantine stabling situation at Kenilworth, could be cause for an upset in the making. But who can capitalize? **Beach Beauty (SAf)** (Dynasty {SAf}) moved smoothly through her paces Friday at the Phillipi training center, and trainer Dennis Drier was confident about her chances. **Gimmethgreenlight (Aus)** (More Than Ready), who turned the tables on Variety Club (SAf) (Var) last out in the G1 L'Ormarins Queen's Plate three weeks ago, steps up to 10 furlongs for the first time. The dark bay colt earned a trip to the GI Breeders' Cup Mile by virtue of his recent victory, and his future may depend on whether he sees out today's 2000 meters.

The progeny of leading sire Jet Master (SAf) figured to be in special demand following his death in November, and so it proved during Friday's second and final session of the Cape Premier Yearling Sale. Three of them broke through the R2-million barrier, led by lot 225, who sold for R2.8 million (US\$361,105) to trainer Mike Bass on behalf of Marsh Shirliff and partners. Not long before that, Shirliff and Bass struck for R2.3 million for lot 209, another son of Jet Master.

Shirliff, who founded the vehicle maintenance and warranty company Motorite in 1984, has had tremendous success with his racehorses. In addition to being co-owner of globe-trotting star Jay Peg (SAf), Shirliff also campaigned the popular Pocket Power (SAf) with Arthur and Rina Webber, and was also partners in that champion's accomplished full-sister River Jetez (SAf). With both of those standouts being offspring of Jet Master, Shirliff was keen to secure the best possible yearlings by the late stallion.

"We had Pocket Power and River Jetez, and it always seems that when a stallion dies, his runners start performing even better," Shirliff noted. "But he was a great sire from day one. I think especially that the fillies will be at a premium. We'd seen them during visits to the farm, and really wanted these."

The sale topper was lot 225, a bay colt consigned by Highlands Farm Stud. He is the second foal from stakes winner Our Table Mountain (Fusaichi Pegasus), a daughter of multiple Grade I winner Hidden Light (Majestic Light), making her a half-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero Artie Schiller (El Prado {Ire}). His future stablemate was offered by Drakenstein Stud. Lot 209 is out of Mountains of Mist (Ire) (Shirley Heights {GB}), whose Grade III-winning daughter Madeira Mist (Ire) (Grand Lodge) is the dam of Grade I winner Joshua Tree (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}).

"They are in partnership," Shirliff confirmed. "[225] will be with Markus Jooste and Bryn Ressel, and the Drakenstein colt--Gaynor Rupert will stay in for a quarter share."

Shirliff indicated that having a boutique auction in Cape Town itself was well done.

"I think it's an absolutely amazing sale," he said. "It's very customer friendly, and you can watch racing. It's very nice for the horses. They're in a small area here, and it's very accessible. I think we've shown we can produce a world-class horse, and it would be nice to see them go to overseas buyers. There is the problem with the protocols, but someday I hope we can get past that."

The affable owner was seated with Bass, who had conditioned Pocket Power to four victories in the G1 J&B Met S. and three G1 Queen's Plate titles. Bass acknowledged that the final prices weren't unexpected.

"Well, obviously, I'd have preferred they be cheaper," he quipped. "Lucky for me, my buyers were strong."

Bass indicated that the unifying characteristic among the Jet Master runners was class.

"They really come in all shapes and sizes," he said. "He could get you a cracking sprinter, a stayer, or a Classic-distance horse. I think these two colts are Classic types. I'm always trying to buy a good horse. He's only got one more crop to come, and I think we got the two best-bred ones."

Jet Master was also responsible for the sale's top-priced filly, who sold for R2.2 million to bloodstock agent John Freeman early during Friday's session. Offered as lot 169 by Klawervlei Stud, the bay is a half-sister to Jay Peg, and is a full-sibling to last year's sale topper.

Having picked up lot 120--a Jay Peg colt from Normandy Stud--for R300,00 Thursday night in partnership with Kip Elser, Finley successfully bid R600,000 for lot 260, a Var colt consigned by Klipdrif Stud.

"Kip called me after the holidays and said he'd been coming here for a few years, and suggested I make the trip," Finley explained. "We've been to sales in Dubai, Ireland and Hong Kong, and I may be going to Argentina in April. It's always good to meet people from around the world."

Thursday's purchase will be offered to West Point's investors, but the Var colt already has a deal in place. Both will join the yard of trainer Dean Kannermeier.

"We'll syndicate the Jay Peg," Finley confirmed. The Var--we were seated at the table with Peter Doyle, and I'd met his brother before. So we decided to be partners in this colt."

Finley applauded the sales company's efforts.

"There's a lot of energy here; they're really thinking out of the box," he said. "In meeting everyone here, you realize that they really want to be players, on the international scale, and important people in the industry and agents are starting to take notice." **Cont. p11**

Finley described his purchases as "good-boned, athletic, and vetted well." He added, "They're similar to the type of horses we buy at home. The yearlings aren't really as prepped as you might be used to, but you have to remember, these horses are bred to run. Obviously, the purses aren't as strong here, and labor isn't as big a factor as at home. We try not to be too aggressive with our horses, and we're really looking for soundness."

Numbers Game...

At the end of Friday's trade, Cape Thoroughbred Sales CEO Robin Bruss was satisfied with the result. "It mirrored those brought at last year's sale," he said. "One positive aspect has been the number of new buyers from overseas. I'm also thrilled to see the ownership syndicates showing an interest, with West Point and a pinhooker like Kip Elser. They see horses as value for money and can perceive them as being on an upward cycle."

Over the course of the two-day sale, 238 yearlings sold from 294 head offered. The gross was R106,845,000. The average was R403,151 and the median was R300,000.

In the wake of Black Caviar's victory ahead of Friday's session, Bruss laid down an interesting gauntlet.

"In Val de Ra (SAf) (Var), I think we have the fastest female sprinter in the world," he stated. "Val de Ra has won 11 of 12 starts, and beaten the best males around. Last week, she won the G1 Cape Flying Championship, defeating J J the Jet Plane (SAf) by five lengths. 'JJ' won the G1 Hong Kong Sprint and the Group 2 in Dubai on World Cup night, and is ranked as the fastest male sprinter in the world.

"I think it would be an astounding race between her and Black Caviar. But the only way for that to happen is to put a stop to those who put barriers on South African horses, and to let the horses prove it on the racetrack."

New Zealand Bloodstock Karaka Premier Yearling Sale Jan. 30-31

On Backs of Super Sires & Sales Success, New Zealand's Cambridge Soars...

How dominant has Cambridge Stud been at the New Zealand Bloodstock's Karaka National Yearling Sales? For 30 straight years, Sir Patrick and Lady Justine Hogan's operation has led all consignors by gross at Karaka. Or, put another way, since Reagan gave his first State of the Union in 1982.

"Cambridge Stud is very similar to Taylor Made Farms in Kentucky," said Cambridge General Manager Marcus Corban. "We put a big emphasis on our yearlings through their conditioning, and we look set to have a fantastic draft for the 2012 Karaka Yearling Sales."

The Karaka Sales begin this Monday and Tuesday with the Premier Yearling Sale, followed by three days of the Select Yearling Sale. After a one-day break, the sale concludes with the single-session Festival Yearling Sale Feb. 5.

The history of Cambridge is a fantastic tale of success from humble origins. In the early 1970s, the Hogans operated a small farm that staffed just one worker, in addition to the Hogans themselves. In its first year, the farm had just five foals, and was soon in crisis mode after they lost not one but four mares for various reasons. That left them with a single mare and serious questions about just what the future had in store for them.

But in 1975, a savior came to Cambridge. His name was Sir Tristram (Ire). Now world renowned as one of Australasia's most prolific sires, Sir Tristram was a virtual unknown when he came to New Zealand to stand his first season at Cambridge. A son of Sir Ivor, he had won two of 19 starts racing primarily in Europe for trainer Clive Brittain. However, Brittain thought enough of the colt to send him to the States to compete in the Kentucky Derby in 1974, a fact that may surprise some American race fans. (At 25-1, Sir Tristram ran 11th to Cannonade under Hall of Fame rider Bill Hartack.)

Sir Tristram's immediate pedigree was as modest as his race record. His dam Isolt, by Round Table, was unraced and didn't produce a stakes winner, and his second dam, the stakes-placed All My Eye (*My Babu), didn't produce a stakes winner, either. But Sir Tristram's third dam was a half-sister to the outstanding international sire Hyperion, and his successful sire siblings Sickle, Pharamond II and Hunter's Moon, so there was some reason for hope.

Still, breeders were hardly clamoring for Sir Tristram's services, and he began his career at Cambridge for a fee of NZ\$1,300. Improbably, from that modest start, he built up a dynasty in Australia and New Zealand that included a record nine sire championships. He sired over 130 stakes winners, including a world-record 46 individual Group 1 winners, and was the sire of three Melbourne Cup winners. "Paddy," as he was called at Cambridge, ultimately saw his fee rise to NZ\$200,000, and when he was euthanized in 1997 after breaking his shoulder, he was buried standing up following a 40-minute service.

Sir Tristram's exploits built Cambridge into a powerhouse in New Zealand, and he left a lasting gift to the nursery: his son Zabeel (NZ), a Cambridge homebred.

Foaled in 1986, Zabeel won the G1 Australian Guineas three years later, but really made his mark once returned to stand at Cambridge. Twice he's been Australia's champion sire and four times New Zealand's, he has won the Dewar Award (combined Australian/New Zealand earnings) a record 14 times. His get includes over 120 stakes winners and 41 Group 1 winners, and he's the sire of three G1 Melbourne Cup winners and four G1 Cox Plate winners, including Might and Power (NZ), Savabeel (Aus) and Octagonal (NZ). The last named hails from what's widely considered the best family in New Zealand's stud book, the Cambridge-curated line of the bluehen Eight Carat (GB). Zabeel also sired Vengeance of Rain (NZ), winner of the 2007 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic.



"He is a freakish sire," said Corban. "He is a great sire of winners over a mile, plus staying distances, [as well as] Group 1 2-year-olds."

Now 26, Zabeel is still going strong in the breeding shed. "Zabeel covered 85 mares this season, with 80% of his book in-foal," said Corban. Zabeel stood for a fee of NZ\$100,000.

Cambridge has matched the success of its sire luminaries as a vendor at Karaka. In 2000, Cambridge sold the impeccably bred Don Eduardo (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ})--produced by a Group 1-winning half-sister to Octagonal {NZ})--for an Australasian record NZ\$3.6 million. Don Eduardo lived up to his price, winning the G1 AJC Australian Derby as a 3-year-old.

"I looked after him [as a youngster]," said Corban. "He was a fantastic yearling, and has become a reasonable sire with great temperament."

Last year alone, the top five horses at the Premier Sale hailed from the Cambridge Stud draft. That included the topper, a Red Ransom--Nureyev's Girl (Aus) (Nureyev) colt who went to David Ellis's Te Akau Stables for NZ\$875,000.

Corban expects big things from Cambridge's 2012 draft, too, and identified a few of the choicer offerings for the *TDN*.

Lot 149, f, Zabeel (NZ)--Dangerpoint (Aus), by Danehill

The third foal from a half-sister to Chilean MGSW Pleasant Secret (Pleasant Tap). "She's a fantastic athlete, out of an American pedigree, and a good type. Her full-brother at Peter Moody's stable looks very promising."

Lot 159, f, High Chaparral (Ire)--Diamond Like (Aus), by Danehill

This is a daughter of the stakes-winning Group 1 performer Diamond Like, a full-sister to G1SW Viking Ruler (Aus) and two other Group 2 winners. "She's the queen of the stable and is perfectly bred, hailing from the Sadler's Wells/Danehill cross," said Corban. "It's the top Eight Carat (GB) family. She's a real European-type, and she will have a home in any stud in the world."

Lot 196, c, Zabeel (NZ)--Femmebot (NZ), by Stravinsky

The third foal from a winning half-sister to multiple Group 3 winner Zacielo (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}). "He's a great-walking colt, typical of Zabeel, and will be very popular," said Corban.

Lot 281, f, Zabeel (NZ)--La Quinta Gold (Aus), by Encosta de Lago (Aus)

A full to MSP Our Heir Apparent (NZ) and produced by a winning full-sister to a pair of Group 3 winners. "She's the pick of our Zabeel fillies--a real athlete, a great walker," said Corban. "With Zabeel being the leading broodmare sire in the Southern Hemisphere, she would be a great acquisition for any stud in the world."

Lot 353, c, Fastnet Rock (Aus)--Nureyev's Girl (Aus), by Nureyev

A half-brother to the Red Ransom colt who topped the sale last year, this colt is also a half to NZ Bloodstock Filly of the Year King's Rose (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), winner of the G1 New Zealand One Thousand Guineas in 2003. "He's an outstanding individual, a good walker, and bred on a proven cross," said Corban. "And Fastnet Rock is the hottest sire in the Southern Hemisphere."

Lot 416, c, More Than Ready--Salsa (NZ), by O'Reilly (NZ)

The third foal from the listed stakes winner Salsa, a half-sister to four stakes horse, including a pair of stakes winner. "He's bred to be a 2-year-old," said Corban. "He will be a speedy individual."

Duty Free Attracts 332 Nominees...

A total of 332 horses from 13 countries have been nominated to the 2012 \$5 million G1 Dubai Duty Free, a supporting feature of the \$10 million G1 Dubai World Cup to be held at Meydan Racecourse Mar. 31. **Previs (GB)** (Sakhee), who was second in 2009 before winning last year's event returns to defend his crown. Other notable nominees include Britain's Champion S. winner **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}) and Hong Kong Cup winner **California Memory** (Highest Honor {Fr}).

Musir Has Duty Free Aim...

Trainer Mike de Kock yesterday pointed at the Mar. 31 G1 Dubai Duty Free as the principal target of Thursday's G2 Al Rashidiya scorer **Musir (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}). Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum's 5-year-old was adding to his previous success in the Jan. 12 G3 Al Maktoum Challenge Round 1 also at Meydan and, despite proving his stamina beyond a mile this week, is unlikely to be stretched to the 2,000 meters of the Dubai World Cup. "At this stage, I'm fairly confident that I won't run him in the World Cup as my main aim is the Duty Free," de Kock said. "I know he's won at 1900 meters, but I believe he is stretched at the trip and his best is a mile and nine furlongs. It is a trainer's dream to train horses like him, as he is as genuine as they come."

As Barry Irwin was busy in Florida yesterday trying to close the deal on a potential prospect for his Team Valor International, he got a chance to take a break and appreciate the work of a filly already running in the green and red of the racing partnership. Table Three Ten, named, presumably, for the Lexington restaurant, improved her record to two-for-two with a professional score at Gulfstream, and looks headed for stakes company.

"Now that we've got this race under her, and I think we'd like to stretch her out to a mile," said Irwin. "I haven't talked to Graham [Motion, trainer] yet, but in my mind, a race that would suit her would be the GIII Bourbonette Oaks [at Turfway Park Mar. 24], which is a two-turn mile race on the Polytrack. With her pedigree I think she'd like that [synthetic surface]. Ultimately, if she's good enough and keeps going, we'd like to run her in the GI Kentucky Oaks."

Table Three Ten caught the attention of Irwin and company with a stylish first-out maiden victory at Fair Grounds on Nov. 25 for owner/breeder Cobra Farm and trainer Michael Stidham. Team Valor acquired her shortly thereafter, but suffered a few setbacks before yesterday's start.



“When we bought the filly, she was all dressed up and ready to go, and then before we could get her shipped from Fair Grounds to Palm Meadows, she got sick,” said Irwin. “So we missed some time with her, and waited an extra week to ship her. By the time she got here, a lot of the benefits from that first race were gone, and we had to start from scratch.”

Irwin admitted he didn't really know what to expect from Table Three Ten, as clues from her morning works were hard to come by. “She's a very lazy work horse,” he said. “I don't think she's outworked any [of her workmates] yet. They've all outworked her, and we've put her with several different kinds of horses. She's not impressive in the morning, and we were told that beforehand. So I didn't know what the heck to think, to tell you the truth. But once she got in the gate, [jockey] John Velazquez said she absolutely perked up. He said she was a push-button ride and won easy.”

Both of Table Three Ten's victories have come at six furlongs on the main track, not the sort of races you'd expect a daughter of El Prado (Ire) out of a More Than Ready mare to excel at.

“When you see a horse run against its pedigree, it confuses you,” said Irwin. “She's out of a More Than Ready mare. Most More Than Readys have speed, but this particular More Than Ready only sprinted once in her life, I believe. She was a grass horse, and a router. And any time you see an El Prado (Ire) who can sprint, you think she's supposed to go long, but how do you really know? It's kind of a gamble.”

Table Three Ten was produced by the 9-year-old Hopes and Dreams, a good allowance horse on the New York and Florida circuit who registered four wins-- three going 1 1/16 miles, one at 1 1/8 miles, and all on the grass. She also ran third in the restricted, grassy Duda S. going 1 1/16 miles on the grass at Belmont in 2007.

Irwin thinks Table Three Ten will have what it takes to route, as well. “Based on how she's built and how she goes, we feel pretty confident she'll get two turns okay,” he said. “She does not look like a sprinter at all. She's got good length to her, and she has a nice hip, but not the hip of a sprinter. I think the best thing about her is that she's so laid back that it will help her when she goes long.”

Table Three Ten builds on what's been outstanding 12 months for Team Valor. In addition to GI Kentucky Derby hero Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}), the operation was more recently represented by the Kitten's Joy S. exacta Howe Great (Hat Trick {Jpn}) and Lucky Chappy (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) at Gulfstream Jan. 21. -LM

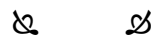
