STRAVINSKY FILLY TOPS KARAKA DAY ONE

Te Akau Stud's David Ellis came away with the top-priced horse during session one of last year's New Zealand Bloodstock's Premier Yearling Sale at Karaka--he eventually purchased the sale topper in session two--and he was back at it in 2012. During an opening session that yielded mixed results, Ellis saw fit to go to NZ\$740,000 (US\$605,847) to acquire a Stravinsky filly from the draft of Cambridge Stud. The filly was produced by Jesmonds Gift (NZ) (Magic of Sydney {Aus}), an 11-year-old half-sister to champion Canny Lad (Aus) (Bletchingly {Aus}) and MG1SW Canny Lass (Aus) (Bletchingly {Aus}). Its also the immediate family of the talented champion juvenile Sepoy (Aus) (Elusive Quality). The filly sold late in the session as [lot 256](#).

"She is a beautiful filly with a lovely outlook and a lot of class, and we are thrilled to be training her," Ellis said. "You have got to be prepared to pay for the best fillies, and we were prepared to do that today. She was bought for a very good client who has had many fillies with Te Akau over the past 20 years. Stravinsky is a very good international sire of fillies, and we are going to aim her for the New Zealand Bloodstock Filly of the Year Series, which Te Akau has a great record with, having won four of the last six titles."

Average, Median Down...

Overall, the sale was off to a slow start compared with 2011. With 107 lots selling for NZ\$24,817,500, (US\$20,320,434) the average of NZ\$145,985 was down 12% from last year's corresponding figure. The median of \$120,000 (US\$98,258) was down 7.7%. In kind, the not-sold rate was up, from 25% to 30%. But New Zealand Bloodstock Co-Managing Director Andrew Seabrook anticipates a stronger second session of selling Tuesday. "There is no lack of firepower to the buying bench, with good horses attracting plenty of competition, but the market is taking a bit of time to settle into a steady pace," said Seabrook. "Many buyers are taking a wait-and-see approach, and from what I'm told, several leading buyers have their favorite horses in [Tuesday]. Like Magic Millions, which picked up significantly on the second day, we would expect to see improvement here [Tuesday]." Today's session, which begins at 10 a.m. local time, will complete the Premier portion of the National Yearling Sales Series at Karaka. The Select Yearling Sale is comprised of three days, running Wednesday through Friday, with the single-session Festival Yearling Sale concluding things Sunday, Feb. 5, after a dark day Saturday. Ellis Leading Buyer After Opener...


Te Akau's David Ellis was the leading buyer Monday at Karaka, with 14 yearlings purchased for NZ\$2,402,500--an average of NZ\$171,607. While he did land the NZ\$740,000 session topper, most of Ellis's buys fell in the NZ\$100,000 to NZ\$200,000 range, and were split evenly between colts and fillies. His second-highest-priced yearling was a NZ\$200,000 Danehill Dancer (Ire) colt produced by MSW & GSP Anatomy (Aus) (Thunder Gulch). Pencarrow Stud consigned the Sept. 15-foaled bay as [lot 46](#). The colt received a nice update Saturday when his dam's half-brother Six O'Clock News (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) won the G2 Wellington Cup.

Ellis founded Te Akau Stud in 1979. The operation, much in the vein of a Dogwood Stable or Team Valor, syndicates young horses. According to the Te Akau website, Ellis has purchased the winners of over 100 stakes races, and Te Akau's tangerine and blue colors have been carried to victory by the likes of Darci Brahma (NZ) (Danehill), champion juvenile and sophomore colt in New Zealand in 2005-06, respectively.

Darci Brahma, a NZ\$1.1-million acquisition by Ellis at the 2004 Premier Sale, won five Group 1s, including the New Zealand 2000 Guineas, and now stands at The Oaks Stud in New Zealand for a fee of NZ\$20,000. Te Akau has been associated with a remarkable five winners of the G1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas, most recently with King's Rose (NZ) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), and sent out last season's G1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas ([video](#)) winner Rock 'n' Pop (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}).

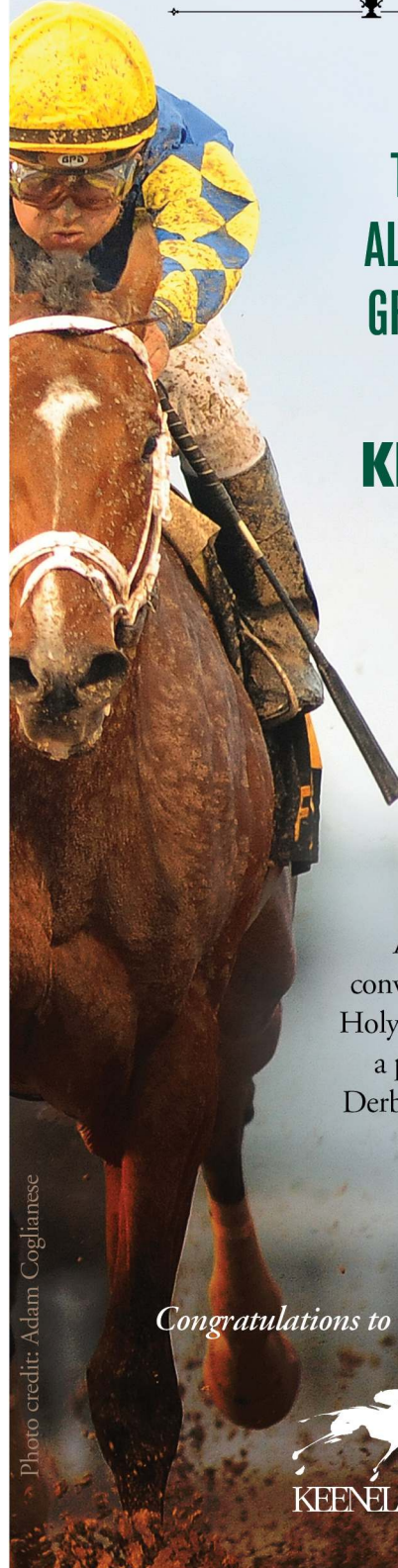

High on the High Chaparrals...

Dual GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner High Chaparral (Ire) has emerged as a legitimate understudy to his luminary stablemates Galileo (Ire) and Montjeu (Ire) at Coolmore, and has carved out a sterling reputation in

Australasia as the sire of the likes of So You Think (NZ) and the Group 1 winners Descarado (NZ), Monaco Consul (NZ) and Shoot Out (NZ). For much of yesterday's opener, yearlings by the son of Sadler's Wells held the top placings at Karaka before being demoted by the Stravinsky filly five lots from the end. The first of

the High Chaparrals through the ring was [lot 130](#), a colt from the account of Lyndhurst Farm who realized NZ\$650,000. The Nov. 2-foaled colt is the third foal from G1 Avondale Gold Cup heroine Creil (NZ) (Frenchpark {GB}), and was knocked down to Hong Kong agent Willie Leung for Hong Kong owner Mr. W.K. Lee.

"We thought he was the best High Chaparral in the sale, and we were very keen to get him," said Leung. "Mr. Lee wants a tough stayer and has been looking for a long time for a horse like this. We paid a premium to get him, but in order to get such a quality horse, that is sometimes necessary. The horse will remain in New Zealand for at least 18 months for training, and we will race him here in New Zealand before deciding whether he is good enough to send to Hong Kong."

Less than an hour later, a High Chaparral filly matched that NZ\$650,000 price tag when Gai Waterhouse and James Harron Bloodstock won the war for [lot 159](#). Consigned by Cambridge Stud, the filly traces back to the Cambridge blue hen Eight Carats (GB) and was produced

by the listed-winning Diamond Like (Aus) (Danehill). The 13-year-old Diamond Like is a half or 3/4 sibling to three stakes winners, including G1 Spring Champion S. hero Viking Ruler (Aus) (Danehill), and is a daughter of Australian and New Zealand champion Tristalove (NZ) (Sir Tristram {Ire}).

NZ\$400,000; and [lot 119](#), a colt out of Clarens (NZ) (Star Way {NZ}) from the female family of Eight Carat (GB) who sold to J.B. Cummings for NZ\$360,000. Windsor Park Stud consigned both colts. High Chaparral is the most represented of any sire at the 2012 Premier Sale, with 35 yearlings entered from his last New Zealand-conceived crop. On Monday,

25 sold for an average of NZ\$200,800. High Chaparral previously stood at Windsor Park Stud in New Zealand, but has spent the last two seasons at Coolmore Australia. He stood the 2011 season there for a fee of A\$99,000.

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Ever So Lucky To Debut in Hutcheson

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ Ever So Lucky (Indian Charlie), a debut winner by 3 1/4 lengths at Churchill Downs Nov. 11, will make his next start in the seven-furlong GIII Hutcheson S. Feb. 11, reports *Daily Racing Form*. Trained by Jonathan Sheppard, the Augustin Stable runner finished runner up in his most recent start in the 1 1/16-mile GII Kentucky Cup Juvenile Nov. 26. The bay worked five furlongs in :59.19 at Gulfstream Monday morning. "He got a little blow of it, but you don't want to overdo it," Sheppard told *DRF*. According to Sheppard, the \$600,000 FTMMAY purchase will have one more five-furlong work Monday before the Hutcheson. "We'll take things one race at a time and see how he progresses," added Sheppard. "I don't have any huge obsession to run in the GI [Kentucky] Derby. If would be fun if we do, but I'm not going to run just for the sake of being there."

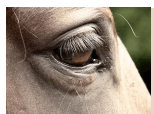

Two of the biggest fee increases for this year concern Bernardini, up to \$150,000 from half that price, and War Front, whose remarkable early results led to his fee being quadrupled from \$15,000 to \$60,000. This year will also see Candy Ride covering at \$50,000--twice the amount charged for his services in 2010 and four times his 2009 fee.

Last week provided further justification for all of these higher-level fees. War Front's son Warning Flag--a group-placed listed winner in Ireland as a juvenile--won the G1 Hong Kong Classic last Wednesday under his new name of Sweet Orange. In case anyone out there is still tempted to underestimate the quality of Hong Kong racing, it is worth pointing out that three Hong Kong horses were rated 120 or higher on the recent World Thoroughbred Rankings.

Thanks to Home Sweet Aspen's victory in the Santa Monica S., Candy Ride now has seven Grade I winners to his credit from the 306 named foals in his first three crops. His fourth crop, three years old in 2012, has yet to score at the top level, but numbers only 56 foals.

Fortunately Candy Ride's new crop of 2-year-olds should easily compensate for this smaller crop, as they number 137 live foals. Candy Ride's talent for upgrading his mares shines through Home Sweet Aspen's pedigree. Her dam failed to win and none of her next three dams earned black type. Home Sweet Aspen is also the first graded winner descending from any of the four.

The doubling of Bernardini's fee was fueled largely by the exploits of his impressive first crop, which achieved the eye-catching feat of producing four Grade I winners in Stay Thirsty, To Honor and Serve, A Z Warrior and Biondetti.

Now we have the thrilling prospect that his second crop may prove similarly successful. This crop made a bright start last year, with Gamilati winning the G2 Cherry Hinton S. and Alpha chasing home Union Rags in the GI Champagne S. Both of these have already made their mark this year. Alpha took the Count Fleet S. in the style of a colt who is going to flourish over longer routes, whereas Gamilati put herself in line for a tilt at the UAE 1,000 Guineas with an easy conditions win at Meydan. We have also seen Casual Trick go within half a length of winning the Gulfstream Park Derby. This second crop also includes ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Consortium, who was conceding two pounds when he went down by a length to Algorithms, another of Bernardini's sons, in an optional claimer over 6 1/2 furlongs in December. The two met again in the GIII Holy Bull S. two days ago, and when it was Algorithms who left top-weighted Hansen behind in the final eighth to score by five lengths.

When Lucas Marquardt looked into Algorithms' background in an "In Sharper Focus" feature a few days after the colt's December victory, he pointed out that Starlight Racing and partners were represented in the 2006 GI Kentucky Derby by Algorithm's half-brother Keyed Entry. This son of Honour and Glory and Ava Knowsthecode had earned his place at Churchill Downs with a record-breaking win in the GII Hutcheson S. and with placings in the GIII Gotham S. and GI Wood Memorial S.

The Derby distance proved too much for the free-running Keyed Entry and Marquardt pointed out that: "The majority of Ava Knowsthecode's offspring have been sprinters, or maybe milers at best. Her good son Justin Phillip (First Samurai) won the seven-furlong GII Woody Stephens S. at Belmont this year and was third in the seven-furlong GI King's Bishop, while Successful Mission (Successful Appeal) notched his lone graded win in the GIII Miami Mile H. All that makes you wonder how far Algorithms will want to go."

Hopes that Algorithms would break the mold are rightly based largely on the fact that Bernardini was a much more Classic type than some of Ava Knowsthecode's previous mates. Honour and Glory's victories included the King's Bishop S. over seven furlongs and the Met Mile.

His second visit to the Breeders' Cup was to contest the Sprint, whereas Bernardini took on the older horses in the Classic. Bernardini had previously won the GI Travers S. and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, displaying the type of stamina one might expect in a colt whose sire and grandsire both won the GI Belmont S.

The Belmont S. also features on the lengthy resume of Algorithms' broodmare sire Cryptoclearance. Although he finished second, Cryptoclearance was beaten so far by Bet Twice that there was no knowing whether he had really stayed the trip. There can be no doubt, though, that this very tough horse--a veteran of 44 races--stayed a mile and a quarter very well. In addition to a win in the GI Widener H. and 10-length victory in a Grade II, he was also second in the Travers S. and Gulfstream Park H. (beaten a nose).

Together with his speedy half-brother Justin Phillip, Algorithms is inbred 4x3 to Fappiano. This might sound a few warning bells regarding stamina, especially as Fappiano was a track-record-setting stakes winner over six furlongs as a juvenile and later shone over a mile, winning the GI Metropolitan H. and GI Forego H.

However, this son of Mr. Prospector was also a Grade II winner over a mile and an eighth and has made an indelible mark on the Triple Crown events. Directly responsible for one Derby winner in Unbridled, Fappiano also hit the Derby jackpot thanks to several of his stallion sons and grandsons. They have sired Real Quiet, Grindstone and Mine That Bird and there have also been Triple Crown victories from Victory Gallop, Birdstone, Summer Bird, Red Bullet and Empire Maker.

Reassuringly, the inbreeding to Fappiano in Algorithms' pedigree comes via Quiet American (sire of Real Quiet) and Cryptoclearance (sire of Victory Gallop). There is also some reassurance to be found in the fact that Algorithms' second dam, Ava Romance, was a stakes winner over a mile and a quarter, showing some of the stamina that had brought her sire Avatar victories in the Belmont S. and San Luis Rey S.

The main pedigree impediment standing in Algorithms' path to Grade I success is probably Crptoclearance's overall record as a broodmare sire. His daughters have been represented by more than 1,100 runners, yet only one of them--that good filly Elloluv--has so far managed to win a Grade I race in the Northern Hemisphere.

That said, Algorithms has the advantage of being out of Cryptoclearance's most successful broodmare daughter. Ava Knowsthecode now ranks among the strictly limited number of mares with four graded stakes winners to their credit. Her achievement is all the finer because each of the four has a different sire. Perhaps she already has a fifth graded winner in the pipeline, as her 2010 Bernardini colt sold to John Ferguson for \$625,000 last year.

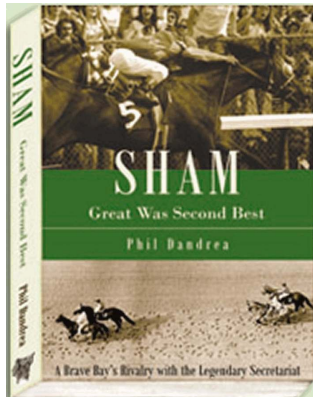


TDN Book Review

Sham: Great Was Second Best by Phil Dandrea

Phil Dandrea's [Sham: Great Was Second Best](#) is an impeccably researched insight into the underrated Sham, a horse who courageously battled the legendary Secretariat through the 1973 Triple Crown. While movies and books have been written about Secretariat and his amazing feats on the racetrack, little has been said about the horse some would argue pushed him to greatness. Dandrea uses a combination of intensive research and personal accounts to make that argument.



The book hits its stride in the days leading up to the Kentucky Derby, with rival trainers Pancho Martin and Lucien Laurin trading verbal barbs and the media fanning

the flames of Martin's temper. Dandrea does a great job of making you feel like you're right there, hearing from both sides as they mutter under their respective breaths and aloud to the media.

The races unfold vividly as well. In the Derby, Sham strikes the front in the stretch while missing the two teeth he knocked out hitting the gate at the start, only to be caught by Secretariat in record-breaking time. The frustration builds heading into the Preakness, when Secretariat's owner Penny Tweedy visits Sham and his trainer at their barn before the two square off at Pimlico. It's there you can get a sense of Sham's demeanor, as he willingly greets his rival's owner with a brush of his nose. In the Preakness, Sham gets rolling on the lead early, only to have Secretariat make a huge move on the first turn to join him on the front down the backstretch. Sham could only chase from there, unable to close the gap as the two run away from the others.

There was no avoiding the media frenzy over Secretariat in the days leading up to the final leg of the Triple Crown at Belmont Park. It was as if the race had already been run, Secretariat the winner, an unstoppable force. For it was Secretariat staring back at Sham's trainer, Pancho Martin, from the cover of *Time* magazine. Steve Cady is quoted in the book from the pages of the *New York Times*, "If ever a horse deserved to have a nervous breakdown, it's Sham." Asked to recall Sham's situation years later, jockey Heliodoro Gustines felt Sham might have been a bit down-hearted for the Belmont S. Even the once boastful Pancho Martin is quoted in the book telling *Newsday*, "If he beats me in the Belmont Stakes on Saturday, then I'll call him a super horse."

As Dandrea describes, the gates springing open for the Belmont, in what would be the duo's final meeting, I felt myself rooting for Sham as he dueled with his rival through those suicidal opening six furlongs. As Secretariat began to pull away from Sham down the backstretch of the Belmont, I could feel the disappointment both the horse and his team must have felt. In knowing not only Sham but the players and events that lead to that final duel, you really get the sense that he was truly a great horse, in the wrong place at the wrong time.

It's later revealed that, following Secretariat's death in 1989 and Sham's in 1993, Dr. Thomas Swerczek from the University of Kentucky performed a necropsy on both horses. Dr. Swerczek noted, Secretariat's heart was the largest he had ever seen, more than twice the normal size for a horse. Ironically, according to Swerczek, Sham's heart was the second-largest he'd ever seen.

Dandrea does an amazing job throughout the book of portraying the emotions of the moment. His extensive research and first-hand accounts of this incredible rivalry allow the story to play out as if it happened yesterday. I recommend even a casual fan of the sport read this book--the story is not only one of two rivals who were the best of their generation, but one of devotion, determination and ambition. Included in the 415 pages is 16 pages of photos as well as an expansive bibliography and endnotes section--definitely worth a read for \$17.95.
