DOUBLE THE PLEASURE FOR SOUTHWEST

The opportunities for 3-year-olds to pick up graded stakes earnings this season increased by one when Oaklawn split Monday's GIII Southwest S. into two divisions, each of which will be worth \$250,000. A total of 21 sophomores passed the entry box Saturday morning, and the Southwest will be run as races eight and nine on the Presidents' Day card with fields of 10 and 11, respectively. "Mr. [Charles] Cella's sporting nature and a lot

of hard work by our racing office, led by racing secretary Pat Pope, has allowed us to offer two Southwest S.," said David Longinotti, assistant general manager of racing. "In 2004, Mr. Cella took steps to make Oaklawn's 3-year-old program the best in the country by raising the Arkansas Derby to \$1 million and offering a \$5-million bonus to any horse that swept the Southwest, Rebel, Arkansas Derby and Kentucky Derby. We found Smarty Jones that year, and we're excited to see who emerges this time." California shippers **Longview Drive** (Pulpit) and **Castaway** (Street Sense) take on Smarty Jones S. winner **Junebugred** (Corinthian) in the first division, while Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint hero **Secret Circle** (Eddington) is the marquee name in the second. **Fields p8**

Black Caviar was away alertly under jockey Luke Nolen, but soon relinquished the lead to a headstrong Hay List. As they tore down Flemington's straightaway, Nolen began to ride the imposing mare for more speed, and while Hay List dug in and kept fighting, the champ took a narrow advantage 300 meters out and, in the end, won by a confident 1 3/4-length margin. "She loves the straight," said winning trainer Peter Moody. "She's had a six- and then a seven-furlong race, so coming back to five was always going to be an ask, but she ticked every box all week, and so we were happy to be here." As for what's next, Moody essentially ruled out a start in Caulfield's G1 Futurity S. next weekend. "I would pretty much say that she won't be there next week," the conditioner stated. "For her to be there next Saturday, she probably had to have it softer today, so we will let the dust settle but she needed to have it softer today to butter up three weeks in a row. I'll sit down with the owners, but, if she goes to Dubai [for next month's \$2-million G1 Golden Shaheen], she has probably run her last race in Australia this prep." The Coolmore Lightning S. was the first in the 2012 Global Sprint Challenge, which encompasses 10 races in six countries. Any horse that wins three races in three different countries is eligible for a \$1-million bonus. The next race in the Challenge is the G1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen at Chukyo Mar. 25, followed by the Dubai Golden Shaheen the following weekend.

Force Freeze began his career with promise at three in 2008, finishing third in the GIII Hirsch Jacobs S. at Pimlico on the GI Preakness S. undercard for owners Ronald Ellerbee and Poindexter Thoroughbreds and trainer Allen Milligan. Those efforts didn't go unnoticed, and the dark bay spent most of the next three years in Dubai. Fifth in the 2009 G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, he was ninth to Kinsale King (Yankee Victor) in the 2010 renewal of that contest, and closed out his tenure there under Doug Watson with a ninth behind Rocket Man (Aus) (Viscount {Aus}) in the 2011 running. He earned a 104 Beyer Speed Figure when repatriated in time for the Teddy Drone S. at Monmouth on the GI Haskell undercard, then was narrowly beaten when second on a muddy track in the GI Vosburgh S. at Belmont Oct. 1. Force Freeze ran nearly too good to lose in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Churchill Nov. 5, finishing second by a neck to champion Amazombie (Northern Afleet) after a scorching pace, and was widely expected to make amends here. After breathing down the neck of longshot Amanecer de Oro (Afternoon Deelites) through a :44.18 opening half, Force Freeze took command in the stretch, and was never seriously threatened by the rallying pair of Troilus and Capt. Candyman Can.

Magical Feeling worked her way through claiming and starter allowance company to earn a first black-type victory in the Regret S. at Monmouth July 31. That was the third of four consecutive trips to the winner's circle for the Peter Blum homebred, who completed the sequence with a starter handicap score at Parx on Christmas Eve. She could only manage third in her subsequent start, finishing 4 1/4 lengths behind Red's Round Table (Cuvee) in a six-furlong optional claimer at Laurel Jan. 21. The dark bay was 10-1 on the morning line in this step up to graded company, but found little love at the windows and went postward at 27-1.

Unhurried early, Magical Feeling hugged the rail and was still quite a ways back as odds-on Nicole H struck the front after a :46.11 opening half. The blaze-faced mare angled out, then shifted back in between rivals to commence her rally. Rider Ramon Dominguez had been a bit nonchalant aboard the favorite and got to work a tad late as Magical Feeling kept on coming to post a big upset. "She knows where the wire is," said winning rider Roberto Alvarado Jr. "At the eighth pole I started getting confident."

Owner/breeder Peter Blum was on hand to accept the trophy. "I have always wanted to win this race," said Blum, who last had a runner in the Fritchie in 1975. "It feels tremendous to finally stand in this winners' circle."

The family of the Barbara Fritchie winner is perhaps the most well known of the Blum broodmare band. Blum acquired the Better Self mare Mono in 1974. She produced stakes winners Rare Performer (Mr. Prospector) and A Sure Hit (Ack Ack) for Blum before foaling Mine Only (Mr. Prospector) in 1981. Mine Only has been quite the blue hen: she is the dam of graded winners Academy Award (Secretariat), Statuette (Pancho Villa) and Good Mood (Devil's Bag). Among her other descendants are Grade I winner Well Chosen (Deputy Minister) and Telling (A.P. Indy).

Blum has a Dunkirk yearling colt out of Magical Mood that has already been named Wild Magic.

Ellafitz was given a three-month break following a seventh to St Trinians (GB) (Piccolo {GB}) in the restricted Adoration H. at Del Mar Sept. 4. Since then, though, it's been nothing but blue skies. The bay resumed her career at Hollywood Dec. 4 with a front-running tally in the Gil Bayakoa H., and she mirrored that effort over this track and trip in the Paseana H. Jan. 15. Odds-on to make it three straight, Ellafitz bounced away quickly and assumed her customary spot on the front end. Miss Mittagong made a sustained bid along the rail in the stretch and Vision in Gold loomed a serious threat on the outside, but the favorite pinned her ears and flashed across the wire first. "She had to earn it today," said winning trainer Bob Baffert. "I thought maybe she'd cave in at the end, and she took off again. She's just showing that she's getting better and better. Once she gets in her groove, she's got a lot of Game On Dude in her. She really fought." Owned by Scottsdale residents David and Ella Sivage, Ellafitz will make her next start in the GI Santa Margarita S. Mar. 17 "if all goes well."

The nose knows! Daddy Nose Best, eyeballed by Lucky Chappy, dug in most gamely win to this contest by a whisker. After earning his diploma in his second try on the Saratoga sod--and fourth overall outing--he ran third in the GIII Summer S. at Woodbine Sept. 17. He finished sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Churchill Nov. 5, then posted a sharp allowance score over the same spinach Nov. 26. Bet down to 4-5 in the Eddie Logan S. on New Year's Eve at Santa Anita, Daddy Nose Best was a disappointing fifth, but made amends in this first all-weather attempt. The bay colt utilized his rail post to secure a ground-saving trip several lengths off the pace in fourth, while Russian Greek (Giant's Causeway) and Lucky Chappy caboose the field in the early stages. As Daddy Nose Best began to advance along the fence heading into the far turn, Lucky Chappy made eye-catching progress while circling the field. Daddy Nose Best angled off the fence for running room entering the stretch and was immediately confronted by Lucky Chappy. The two colts put on quite a show for the fans, but Daddy Nose Best took home the trophy for Bob and Cathy Zollars. The Zollars, residents of Dallas, also campaign MGSW Thiskyhasnolimit (Sky Mesa) in partnership with Mark Wagner.

JUST CAUSE

Heinz Steinmann's **Creative Cause** (Giant's Causeway) has as traditional a resume as can be found these days for a Classics candidate. The ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ made five starts in 2011, highlighted by a win in the 8 1/2-furlong GI Norfolk S. at Santa Anita, and closed out his initial campaign with a good third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Churchill Nov. 5. A son of Grade I winner Dream of Summer (Siberian Summer), the grey will start his 3-year-old campaign at seven panels this afternoon in the GII San Vicente S.

"This is a big race, but he doesn't have to win," trainer Mike Harrington told *Daily Racing Form*. "I've said all along, this is a progression. If he wins, fine. I expect him to run well. But I'm just trying to get a race into him." Creative Cause comes into the San Vicente off four consecutive six-furlong drills, including a bullet 1:11 2/5 (1/17) at Hollywood last Sunday. "I am very happy with the way he's been working," Harrington added. **Drill** (Lawyer Ron), who defeated Creative Cause in the GI Del Mar Futurity before running second in the Norfolk, is seeking to get back on track after four subsequent unplaced efforts. He is coming off a fifth in the 6 1/2-furlong San Pedro S. Jan. 22. The San Vicente is the stakes debut for **American Act** (Quiet American), who posted an 88 Beyer Speed Figure in breaking his maiden at Santa Anita Jan. 16. That race received national attention when runner-up Bodemeister (Empire Maker) came back to thump maidens last Saturday in a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ performance, and also had another next-out winner in the form of Immaculate (Distorted Humor--Folklore). "It's a step up, but we've got to find a spot to run him," said trainer Jack Carava. "He's actually an improving horse, he's doing well and we'll kind of see what we've got. This is obviously a lot deeper water than he's come out of, but the horses behind him when he broke his maiden were all pretty nice horses."

Bruce Hollander and Cary Shapoff's **Csaba** (Kitten's Joy) will head back to the main track for next Sunday's GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. After pairing up wins in off-the-turf events at Calder last fall, the bay colt tried grass for the first time in the Dania Beach S. at Gulfstream Dec. 18. He attempted to wire the field before getting passed late, and wound up fifth, beaten 2 1/4 lengths. "He is by Kitten's Joy and we tried to go right to turf for his first start," trainer Phil Gleaves explained. "That race was forced off the turf, as were the next two that he won impressively. He ran well enough back on the turf in the Dania Beach, but we've decided his wins on the main track were good enough to give him a chance in the Fountain of Youth, fully recognizing what a tough spot it is." Csaba--pronounced "Shaba"--breezed a half-mile in :50 4/5 at Calder yesterday morning. Among his expected rivals next week are marquee names **Union Rags** (Dixie Union) and **Algorithms** (Bernardini).

Another IBS Private Acquisition

Future Generation, heroine of last term's G3 Desmond S. at Leopardstown in August, completed her Irish campaign for trainer Ger Lyons and the Viking Syndicate with a close fourth in a handicap at the Curragh Aug. 28. Getting Lasix for the first time in her U.S. bow here, Future Generation stayed in hot pursuit in third through a half-mile in :47.02. Loaded for bear beneath Rajiv Maragh on the turn for home, the bay found room along the inside in the stretch and took off impressively when asked en route to a smart victory. "She's done well from the beginning," trainer Christophe Clement revealed. "She'll go in a stakes next time. She's a good horse, and he rode her like a good horse. He got a great trip. He got her to the inside and had a good trip." Clement added that the Gill Honey Fox at Gulfstream Mar. 18 is a possibility for Future Generation's next start. Fast Start for Newcomer Leidel...

Peter Leidel knows something about success. A Marylander by birth who grew up on the outskirts of Washington, D.C., Leidel got his start with Mobil in the 1980s, then parlayed his knowledge of the energy industry into a position as partner with Dillon, Read & Co., where he worked as part of their venture profit division.

In 1990, he founded his own company, Yorktown Partners LLC, which today handles roughly \$3.5 billion in oil and gas investments from its Park Avenue base in New York City.

If Leidel has learned anything launching a business, he says, it is to surround yourself with honest, competent and, most importantly, successful people who know what they're doing. And so last summer, after attending a New York dinner sponsored by Keeneland to introduce high-net-worth individuals to the Thoroughbred industry, Leidel felt confident dipping his toe into the game with the likes of George Bolton, John Moynihan and David Ingordo on his side.

In particular, Leidel struck up a friendship with Bolton, co-owner of reigning champion juvenile filly My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike) and horses such as Curlin (Smart Strike) and The Factor (War Front). Bolton suggested that if Leidel was going to get involved in the sport, he start with proven fillies, and the men agreed to purchase a pair of young prospects from Europe.

"He said with fillies that, even if they don't have additional success, they will retain some value, and there wasn't as much risk as buying a yearling or a young colt," explained Leidel. "He also said that, with proven fillies, I'd know that they'd be racing pretty soon after buying them."

Wednesday, the first of those prospects made an auspicious debut on American shores when **Future Generation (Ire)** (Hurricane Run {Ire}), a 5-2 chance in a one-mile optional claimer on the turf, drove clear to win by 1 1/2 lengths under jockey Rajiv Maragh. The 4-year-old, winner of the G3 Desmond S. in Ireland for trainer Ger Lyons, was purchased privately in a deal brokered by Ingordo in the States and Simon Marsh and Charles Gordon-Watson in Europe. She is now trained by Christophe Clement.

Leidel was able to escape the city and fly down for the race, and came away with a smile on his face. "I left a gray and cold New York and flew down to Ft. Lauderdale," he said. "I took a cab right to the track, got there around 1 p.m., and it was beautiful and sunny. Chris Clement met me for lunch and showed me around. Gulfstream doesn't look like the traditional

track, but it's really a very nice facility. I can't wait to retire and hang out there [laughs]."

A father of three--his youngest is a 16-year-old high schooler--Leidel will have a reason to make a few return trips to Hallandale, as Future Generation is being pointed to a start in the Gill Honey Fox S. over a mile on the grass Mar. 18. In addition, his and Bolton's other filly, **Miss Liberty (Fr)** (Statue of Liberty), is also working toward her U.S. bow.

“Both horses originally flew in to Belmont in New York, but then moved with Christophe Clement to Payson Park for the winter,” said Leidel. “According to Christophe, Miss Liberty may run in the next two or three weeks in Gulfstream. I don't think there's a particular race they've selected, but she should be running pretty soon.”

Miss Liberty, also four, won stakes in France in 2010 and 2011 before being purchased privately by Bolton and Leidel.

Asked why he decided to get into the sport, Leidel said, “It was partly the excitement of it, and partly the sense that I was getting in with good people,” he said. “I knew I was getting in with people who knew what they were doing, and that was very important. Guys like George and John Moynihan helped make me feel like I was in with good partners.”

For his part, Bolton is enjoying the role of successful mentor. “It gives me more of a thrill to celebrate a win like that with Peter than it does when I win a race myself,” he said after Future Generation's win.

Hopefully, it will be a season with plenty more thrills for both men. - *L Marquardt*



Unraced since his troubled sixth-place effort in a sloppy renewal of the GI Belmont S. last June, last year's GI Kentucky Derby hero Animal Kingdom kicked off his 4-year-old campaign with a stylish return to the races here. Given time off after emerging from the Belmont with a hind-leg injury, the GI Preakness S. runner-up was sent off the odds-on choice returning to the lawn for the first time since running a head second here in an optional claimer last March. The chestnut, wearing front wraps for the first time in his career, broke last, but was never far back in a tightly packed field. John Velazquez, his Derby pilot, kept him in the clear to the outside, and the pair made an eye-catching move up the backstretch to get within striking distance after a half in :49.44. He continued three wide into the stretch and kicked away with good energy to best a game Monument Hill by daylight. "They went slow enough where he just pulled me into contention all on his own," commented Velazquez. "I let him do what he wanted as opposed to wrangling him back behind horses. The second I started kissing at him in the stretch, he picked it right up and took off. It was a great feeling today, and great to have him back. He felt as good as ever." Next up for Animal Kingdom is likely a start in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 31. "He needed a race, and still has six weeks to regroup to get him to Dubai in the right way," said Motion, who added it was emotional to see his stable star return from injury. "This horse has come a long way since October," said Motion. "Nothing was more heartbreaking than to see this horse stuck in a stall a week after the Belmont. He went from being the fittest horse in the country to not being able to get out of his stall. That was tough."

Animal Kingdom, who was knocked hard at the start of the Belmont, came out of the race with a small fissure on the tip of the cannon bone just under his hock. **Click for the [brisnet.com chart](#) or [video replay](#).**

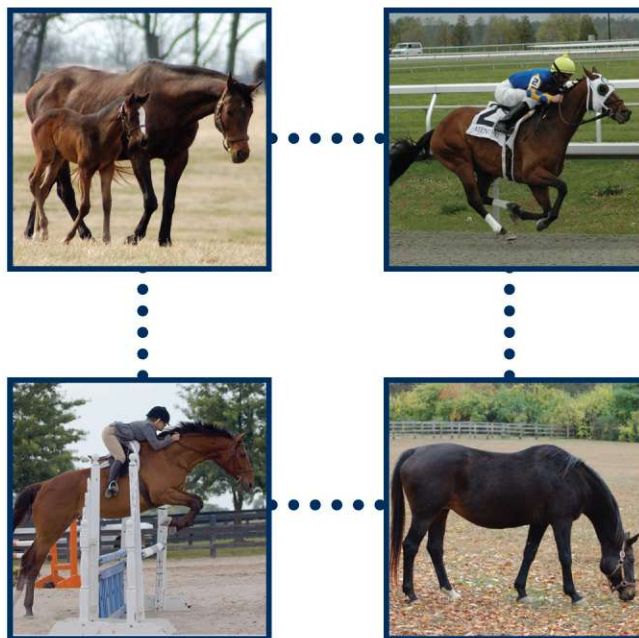
