

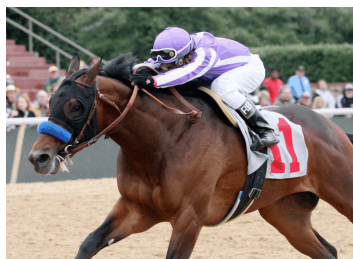

HURRICANE BAFFERT RIPS SOUTHWEST

Always a powerful force on the West Coast, trainer Bob Baffert extended his domination in the east when taking down both divisions of Monday's GIII Southwest S. during Oaklawn's President's Day card. Leading the charge was **Castaway** (Street Sense), who secured the first division of the one-mile prep for the Apr. 14 GI Arkansas Derby in emphatic style for team Coolmore. With little time to cool its jets, the Baffert juggernaut was back to round out the double, taking the second division with Karl Watson, Michael Pegram and Paul Weitman's **Secret Circle** (Eddington). Employing similar tactics, both colts stalked the early pace before taking over late. Castaway, an easy 3 3/4-length winner of his division, completed the task in 1:38.09, while his stablemate had to work harder and finally got the job done by a half-length in 1:37.08. "It went well," said Rafael Bejarano, who was aboard Secret Circle. "He showed speed. When I asked him to run, he had more left than I expected. He showed a lot of heart today and I'm very pleased with his effort."

'CITY' EARNS BUENA VISTA

Winless since last September's GII Palomar H., **City to City** (City Zip) had to make it back to the hallowed ground the hard way, but she got the job done in the end when eking out a head score in Monday's GII Buena Vista H. at Santa Anita. Settled off the early pace, the chestnut bided her time under Corey Nakatani as **Briecat** (Adcat) and **Sweetly Peppered** (Peppered Cat) duelled up front. Ready to go while three wide turning for home, City to City was part of a mad rush to the wire when the pace collapsed and she got up put her head down ahead of **Up In Time** (Noverre) at the wire. **Cont. p5**

WHATA TWIST

Favored to give Richard Dutrow Jr. his second win in the GII General George H., Steel Your Face Stables' **Yawanna Twist** (Yonaguska) lived up to his 9-5 billing when leading home a 1-2 finish for the trainer at Laurel Park yesterday afternoon. His stablemate, Paul Pompa Jr.'s **This Ones For Phil** (Untuttable), who was coming into this off a win against \$100,000 claimers at the Big A Feb. 17, rounded out the exacta at 4-1. Breaking from post three, Yawanna Twist was part of the trio consisting of **Fordangshore** (Forest Danger) and **Caixa Electronica** (Arromanches), all sitting just off pacesetting This Ones For Phil. Jockey Mike Luzzi, aboard the favorite, took a tighter hold of his charge on the turn and eased him back on the rail, but came charging through rivals as This Ones For Phil tired late and surged to the fore to earn a career-best victory by one length. Dutrow also won this race with Well Fancied in 2004. "He's a little racehorse and you can see his record," Luzzi said. "He tries every time, but we got him great this year. I think he's probably the best he's ever been." **Cont. p6**

Castaway Finds Winners' Circle

Castaway continued the hot hand of trainer Bob Baffert with this mild upset. From the first crop of his sophomore sire, the colt needed six tries to break his maiden, but found his stride once switched to two turns, running a close-up third in his route debut at Santa Anita Dec. 30 before a good-looking score in a 1 1/16-mile test over a wet-fast track Jan. 21. Sent off at 6-1 odds in his first test against winners, he was up smartly from post 11 under jockey Rafael Bejarano and pressed Majestic Strike (Trippi) through sensible fractions of :23 2/5, :48 and 1:12 3/5. He was still in hand as they hit the quarter pole, and after kicking away soon after, was never in danger down the lane. "Everyone said we drew bad when we got the 11, but I wasn't that bothered by it," said winning assistant trainer Jimmy Barnes. "You put them in from the rail out, so they're not in the gate that long. Rafael did a good job getting him out of the gate and getting over to the rail. I knew we brought two good horses, and this one had been getting over the track great all week." Added Bejarano, "I thought he won pretty easy. I was right where I wanted to be, especially at the end."

Allen Milligan, trainer of longshot runner-up Jake Mo, commented, "We had sort of a bad trip--got shuffled to the back. Cliff [Berry, jockey] did everything we could ask him to do. We will see him in the GII Rebel S. [at Oaklawn Mar. 17]." Unbridled's Note (Unbridled's Song), made the favorite off a debut victory at Churchill Oct. 30, ran ninth. "When we left the gate, he slipped from behind, so we were way far back and we didn't want to be there," said jockey Julien Leparoux. "It's always tough to come back from that, because they didn't go that fast up front."

Secret Circle earned **TDN Rising Star** status with an emphatic 7 1/4-length win in a 5 1/2-panel test over Del Mar's Polytrack last July before adding another tour-de-force victory on the dirt in the Oct. 11 Jack Goodman S. at Santa Anita. Favored in the Nov. 4 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint, the bay capped off his juvenile season with a one-length victory. Well supported for his seasonal appearance in the one-mile GIII Sham S. Jan. 7, Secret Circle was caught in the final jump to be beaten by a half length by Out of Bounds (Discreet Cat). Favored once again here, Secret Circle was up to press Scatman through opening splits of :23.21 and :46.81. Ready to confront that rival turning for home, the bay was giving his all and he needed it to outgame Scatman, who was 5 1/2 lengths ahead of Adirondack King. "This horse tries every time," said winning co-owner Paul Weitman. "I was a little nervous at the end, but he dug in and got there. It's always fun to come here. It's one of my favorite places. We'll leave his next start up to Bob [Baffert]. He's the coach." Regarding the runner-up's game effort, trainer Michael Lauer added, "I'm glad and I'm sad. He ran a big race but he just got beat. Turning for home I thought we were alive. Once we came out of his last race [a win over this track Jan. 29], we knew this was the race to be in. We never thought the allowance race would go so this would be the next logical spot. We knew he'd have to step up to run well in here, but we wanted to stay here. There was no reason to really look elsewhere. We felt he had a big chance. Now we'll get him back and reevaluate to see what the next step is."

City to City, victorious in the GII Providencia S. at three, added a win in last September's GII Palomar H. at Del Mar. Runner-up in the one-mile GII Las Palmas S. Nov. 6, the mare closed out the season with a fifth in Hollywood's GII Bayakoa H. Dec. 4. Jumped up in trip for her latest, she came home fourth in the nine-panel GII Robert J. Frankel S. Jan. 1. Assistant trainer Dan Ward, deputizing for Hollendorfer, thought a drop in weights made the difference this time. City to City carried 119 pounds yesterday after having shouldered 123 pounds in the Frankel. "She was carrying five pounds more than anybody else in the Frankel and that makes a big difference," noted Ward. "We were hoping that there would be some legitimate pace in the race, and in a mile race there always is," said winning rider Corey Nakatani. "This filly was doing fabulous coming into the race. I couldn't have been in a better spot and the way the race developed was perfect. I felt I won the race, but Brice's [Blanc] horse [Up In Time] was flying at me and I wasn't sure if we would hold on. When that filly came to her, she actually started to run again. I just made sure I had enough horse to get to the position I wanted to be in and she ran a big race." Ward indicated the nine-furlong GII Santa Ana S. Mar. 15 and the GII Santa Barbara S. Apr. 21 are possibilities for the mare's next start.

"I committed to the inside down the backside. I know Ramon [Dominguez]'s body language and it seemed like he had a lot of horse [under him; This Ones For Phil] and that was the one problem," continued Luzzi. "That's a nice horse, of course, and Mr. Dutrow is good at that, he likes short rest. When he does it, he's usually dangerous." As for the runner-up, Dominguez said. "He ran great. We were just second best. I was very pleased with the effort. There really wasn't a ton of speed and my horse is usually sharp out of the gate so when he broke out on top we would be on the lead. Rick [Dutrow] is amazing."

He added, "I wasn't concerned that he just ran the other day. He was not a tired horse at all. He even galloped out strong." Toby's Corner, off since his victory in last year's GI Wood Memorial, loomed a threat at the quarter pole and ran on gamely for show honors in a promising comeback. "He broke very good," said Eddie Castro, who was aboard Toby's Corner. "We just sat on the outside behind all the speed. I asked him to pick it up going into the turn. He was gaining on them slowly. He gave a little spurt at the top of the lane and finished with something left, just couldn't get to the winner."

Jacks or Better Sophs Ready for Weekend

Jacks or Better Farm offers a two-pronged attack at this weekend's Gulfstream stakes for sophomores in the form of homebreds **Fort Loudon** (Awesome of Course), who is primed for Sunday's GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. and **Awesome Belle** (Awesome of Course), who will line up in Saturday's GII Davona Dale S. "We know both races will be tough, but we're here [at Calder] and don't like to ship around," said trainer Stanley Gold, explaining the decision to remain in South Florida. Last year, Fort Loudon reeled off three consecutive wins in Calder's Florida stallions stakes series before finishing seventh in the Nov. 5 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Churchill Downs. In his first start this season, the bay was fourth--beaten 6 1/2 lengths--by Algorithms (Bernardini) in the GIII Holy Bull S. Jan. 29. "I thought Fort Loudon ran a good race off the layoff to finish fourth in the Holy Bull," offered Gold. "He only got beat 1 1/2 lengths for second by Hansen (Tapit) and a length for third by My Adonis (Pleasantly Perfect). Both of them are going to the [GIII] Gotham S. [at Aqueduct Mar. 3], so we don't have to worry about them." Winner of the Oct. 15 My Dear Girl S. at Calder last term, Awesome Belle gets a major class test this weekend, according to Gold. "I'd rather run Awesome Belle in a 'two-other-than' allowance, but that race just doesn't go, so we're here and she's going to run. Despite her last race [eighth in Jan. 22 Sweetest Chant S. on Gulfstream turf], I still think she'll prove to be best on turf later on."

Applauding to Scratch from Rachel Alexandra
 Ramona Bass's **Applauding** (Congrats) will not participate in Saturday's GIII Rachel Alexandra S., trainer Al Stall Jr. confirmed Monday. The decision was made shortly after the sophomore filly completed a four-furlong breeze in :50 4/5. "She didn't work to my satisfaction and I'm going to scratch her," Stall said. "She just wasn't herself. I don't know if something's bugging her internally or what. She just wasn't right." Applauding, a nine-length debut winner at Keeneland in October, hasn't raced since adding a six-length allowance score at Fair Grounds Dec. 2. She was the morning-line favorite in last month's Silverbulletday S., but scratched the day of the race due to a minor case of colic.

Pletcher Pair Primed for Fountain of Youth

Trainer Todd Pletcher sent out Starlight Racing's **Algorithms** (Bernardini) and E. Paul Robsham's **Discreet Dancer** (Discreet Cat) for workouts at Palm Meadows Monday morning. Algorithms was timed in an easy half-mile in :49 flat, while Discreet Dancer went five panels in 1:00 1/5. Undefeated in three starts, Algorithms was most recently an easy five-length winner in the GIII Holy Bull S. Jan. 29. 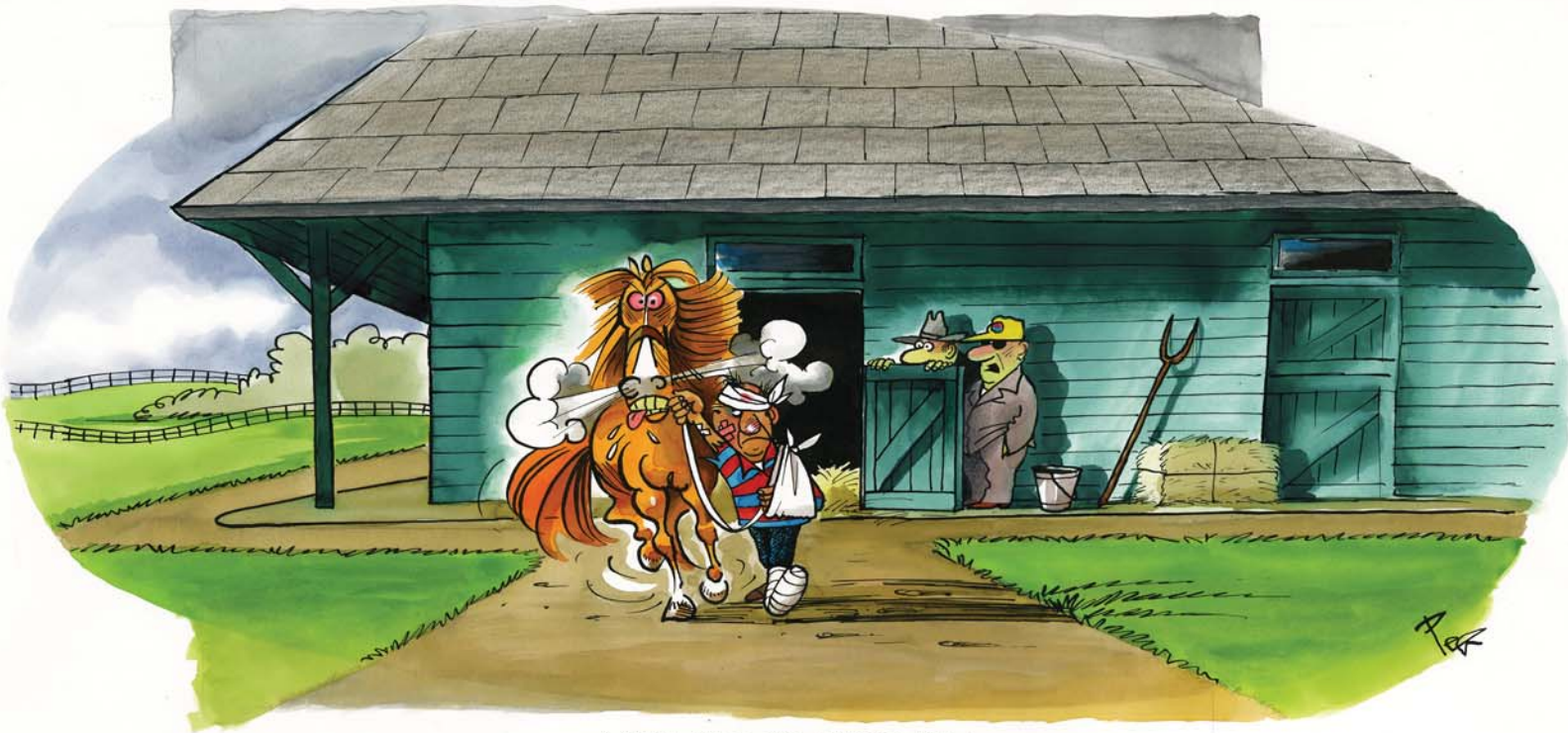

Havre de Grace Breezes

Reigning Horse of the Year **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam) breezed five furlongs in :59 4/5 Monday morning at Fair Grounds. The 5-year-old, who was sent trackward at 6 a.m. with Jen Brassier aboard, worked from the five-eighths pole to the finish line. Fair Grounds clockers caught the Fox Hill Farms representative carving out internal splits of :12, :24 1/5, :36 1/5 and :48. Havre de Grace galloped out six furlongs into the turn in an easy in 1:14 3/5. It was the first five-eighths move of the season for Havre de Grace after two half-mile breezes earlier this month.

Mott to Run Ron the Greek in Grade I Big 'Cap

Trainer Bill Mott confirmed Monday morning that he plans to ship **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate) to California for the Mar. 3 GI Santa Anita H. "We'll know a ship date as soon as we can arrange for a plane," said Mott. According to Mott, jockey Jose Lezcano will fly West to partner the 4-year-old in the 1 1/4-mile test. Lezcano was aboard Ron the Greek when he came home second in the Jan. 28 Sunshine Millions Classic behind Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno) at Gulfstream. The 5-year-old, owned by the Brous Stable, Wachtel Stable and Jack T. Hammer, has collected five wins and three seconds from 16 starts for earnings of \$319,665.

Gomez Back Big 'Cap Day; to Ride Jeranimo in Mile

Agent Tony Matos indicated Monday morning that Garrett Gomez is expected to be back in the saddle by Santa Anita H. Day, Mar. 3, and will partner **Jeranimo** (Congaree) in the GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile on turf on the card. The 40-year-old has been sidelined since Jan. 8, when he broke his left heel in a post parade mishap prior to the Daytona S. "He's going to the doctor [today] and, if he gets the green light, he'll ride," Matos said. "He's in very good shape. He's extra fit." Gomez was aboard Jeranimo in the GII Citation H. at Hollywood Nov. 26, but was replaced by Martin Garcia in the GII San Gabriel S. Jan. 16, a week after his accident.

Gamilati Skipping UAE Oaks

Godolphin's impressive Listed UAE 1000 Guineas winner **Gamilati (GB)** (Bernardini) will not line up in Thursday's G3 UAE Oaks in favor of targeting one of the mile European Classics in May. Following the 5 1/2-length success of the Mahmood Al Zarooni trainee in the Feb. 3 Meydan Classic, connections will aim her at either the May 6 G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket or G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp a week later. "We did not want to stretch Gamilati beyond a mile at this stage of her career, which is why she is not in the UAE Oaks," Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford revealed. "We will wait until we get back to Europe before running her again, and look at the English 1000 Guineas and the French equivalent. Where she runs will all depend on the going--she won't want soft ground."

Frankel-Caviar Clash Unlikely

Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe yesterday suggested that a face-off between **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}) at Royal Ascot was not on the cards. While a match between the unbeaten pair is a slim possibility if Frankel was to stick to a mile and trainer Peter Moody was to step up the star mare to that trip for the June 19 G1 Queen Anne S., Grimthorpe stated yesterday that the Henry Cecil-trained 4-year-old could tackle the 10-furlong G1 Prince of Wales's S. instead. "If it happens, it happens, but it feels like we've got slightly different agendas," Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. "Sir Henry is looking at stretching Frankel this year. We hope to start off in the G1 Lockinge S. [at Newbury May 18], and then we have two options at Royal Ascot, either the Queen Anne or the Prince of Wales's. I can understand there is tremendous good will out there for the two to get together. One is the best horse in the Southern Hemisphere and one is the best horse in the Northern Hemisphere--they are the two best horses in the world. But we don't want to mess up our season for the sake of one race. If we do decide to run in the Queen Anne and Black Caviar runs in it also, then so be it. But Sir Henry may decide that a mile and a quarter is the way for him this season. It would be a great clash, but I'd be very surprised were it to happen."

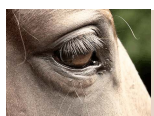

Six years ago, at Keeneland's January Sale, the table of leading buyers was headed by Richard and Audrey Haisfield, buying under the name of Stonewall Farm and Atoka. The couple acquired nine fillies and mares for a total of \$2,689,000, with the 4-year-old Storm Cat filly Cat Dancer being easily the most expensive at \$885,000.

The Blood-Horse's sales report included an interview with Bert Welker, then general manager at the rapidly expanding Stonewall Farm. Welker explained that the Haisfields were making an especially big push to find mares for Medaglia d'Oro and Leroidesanimaux, the highest-priced members of the farm's six-strong stallion team.

"There are certain mares that we've picked out that fit 'Leroy' and Medaglia physically and pedigree wise. Both stallions have been well-supported by the breeders, but Mr Haisfield is just taking the extra step to help them make it."

Cat Dancer duly visited Medaglia d'Oro in 2006 and 2007, firstly producing a colt, D'Oro Dancer, who won once as a 3-year-old. The second foal, Javanese, became the top-priced filly at the 2009 Saratoga Sale, when she fell to a \$1.5-million bid from John Ferguson. Javanese hasn't raced, so Cat Dancer's alliance with Medaglia d'Oro can only be considered a financial success.

However, Cat Dancer has thoroughly justified her purchase by hitting the Grade I target with Drill, the first of her two foals by Lawyer Ron. Stonewall had bought into Lawyer Ron as a 3-year-old in 2006 and the son of Langfuhr rewarded them by developing into the champion older male of the following year, when he landed the GII Oaklawn H, GI Whitney H. and GI Woodward S.

Sadly for Stonewall and the Haisfields, Lawyer Ron was euthanized in July 2009, after he had developed complications from colic surgery. He left 145 foals in his two crops. To add to the misery, Cat Dancer was sold for only \$120,000 when she came on the market again in 2010. By that time, this sister to GII Monmouth Oaks winner Magic Storm was carrying her fifth foal, by Strong Contender. Drill, still only a yearling, sold for \$300,000 a couple of months earlier.

It was a very different story a year later. By this time Drill had won a rough race for the GI Del Mar Futurity and finished second in the GI Norfolk S.--performances which were to earn him a weight of 116 on the Experimental Free Handicap. So, when Cat Dancer appeared in the Fasig-Tipton ring last November, she made more than 10 times as much as she had done 12 months earlier, selling to Stonestreet for \$1,400,000. A contributing factor was that this time she was in foal not to the inexpensive Strong Contender, but to Tiznow.

Drill restored his slightly tarnished reputation with his win in the GII San Vicente S. two days ago. The question now hanging over him is how much stamina does he possess? Both his graded victories have come over seven furlongs, and his sequence of setbacks in the interim included three consecutive defeats over a mile and a sixteenth. No wonder Bob Baffert has questioned Drill's desire to go two turns, which seemingly puts the Kentucky Derby out of consideration.

There is no reason, on pedigree, why Drill shouldn't stay at least a mile and an eighth. After all, Lawyer Ron gained his two Grade I victories over that distance and Drill's dam is a sister to a Grade II winner over that trip in Magic Storm (who sold to Japan for \$500,000 in 2007). Perhaps we shouldn't forget, though, that Lawyer Ron's sire Langfuhr was a champion Canadian sprinter who achieved the very difficult feat of winning the Vosburgh S., Carter H. and Metropolitan H. Although plenty of Langfuhr's sons, such as his Arlington Million winner Jambalaya and his Kentucky Derby third Imperialism, stay better than he did, Drill could prove an exception.

It could also be worth mentioning that he has four lines (5x5x5x6) to Nearctic, a very fast horse who set track records over five furlongs, six furlongs and a mile.


I am guessing as to why Lawyer Ron was selected as a mate for Cat Dancer in 2008, rather than Leroidesanimaux, after her visits to Medaglia d'Oro. I suspect the decision owed something to the fact that Lawyer Ron was a grandson of Danzig, a stallion who had sired the 2007 Kentucky Derby and Breeders' Cup Classic runner-up Hard Spun from Cat Dancer's female line. Drill's fourth dam Luiana ranks as the third dam of Hard Spun. Whereas Hard Spun's first two dams are by Turkoman and Roberto, Drill's are by Storm Cat and Fappiano, so it would be no surprise if Hard Spun proved the stronger stayer of the two.

If you look at Drill's catalogue-style pedigree on the TDN site, you will see that Luiana is described as "Half-sister to CHATEAUGAY, PRIMONETTA."

If you weren't around in the 1960s, you may not be aware of just how good these siblings were. Primonetta came first. This daughter of Swaps won the Alabama S. for Darby Dan at three and then became the champion older mare of 1962. She went on to produce four graded/group winners, including the high-class filly Cum Laude Laurie and the Florida Derby winner Prince Thou Art, to earn the title of Broodmare of the Year in 1978.


Chateaugay, for his part, defeated Never Bend and Candy Spots to take the 1963 Kentucky Derby and also easily defeated Candy Spots in the Belmont S. However, he wasn't fast enough to cope with Candy Spots in the Preakness. Luiana played her part in this outstanding chapter in the Darby Dan success story, with her son Little Current also winning two legs of the Triple Crown.
