## STATE OF THE UNION

Chadds Ford Stable's **Union Rags** (Dixie Union) kicks off his sophomore campaign in Sunday's GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park. The handsome bay, hero of the GI Champagne S. at Belmont, makes his first start since coming up a head short in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile S. at Churchill Downs Nov. 5. "He's as ready as he could possibly be other than running in a race," trainer Michael Matz commented.

"From the time he spent taking it easy at Skara Glen Farm until he came back to us at Palm Meadows, he hasn't missed a beat." Union Rags faces a pair of imposing unbeaten rivals in Starlight Racing's **Algorithms** (Bernardini) and E. Paul Robsham Stables's **Discreet Dancer** (Discreet Cat), both trained by the red-hot Todd Pletcher. Algorithms handed champion Hansen (Tapit) a five-length defeat in the GIII Holy Bull S. Jan. 29. Discreet Dancer makes his stakes debut after winning his first two starts by a combined 15 1/4 lengths. Both horses make their two-turn debuts in the Fountain of Youth. "I don't like running two horses against each other ever, especially two very talented colts that are undefeated," Pletcher revealed. "I think it's best for each horse's development--that's mainly where our focus is, not so much just about this weekend, but, hopefully, moving forward, as well."

## KY SENATE KILLS GAMBLING AMENDMENT

With only 16 senators voting in favor of the measure, the Kentucky State Senate has killed a bill that would have put a referendum on the issue of expanded gambling in the Commonwealth before the state's electorate. "I did everything I could do under very difficult circumstances," said Damon Thayer, the bill's sponsor. "I took on the leader of my party [Senate majority leader David Williams] who was adamantly opposed to this bill. I reached across the aisle to work with the governor from the other party. I sponsored the bill and gave it a fair hearing in committee, got it to the floor for the vote, and we lost. I'm disappointed that the people of Kentucky won't get an opportunity to vote on this issue, yet again." A total of 23 votes, or three-fifths approval, was required to pass a constitutional amendment in the Senate. There were 21 senators who voted negative, many of whom were originally in favor of the measure, but changed their votes when it became apparent that it was not going to pass. **Cont. p2**

## More From Damon Thayer...

"There were a number of people who, at one time or another, were in favor of letting the people decide, who voted no today," Damon Thayer told *TDN*. "Senator Williams has a very strong hold on a number of members of the caucus, and he was able to persuade enough of them to say no." On Wednesday, the Senate State and Local Government Committee passed SB 151 by a vote of 7-4 after a presentation by Governor Steve Beshear. Thayer had originally asked that the issue not be taken up by the Senate Thursday, as two Democratic senators were going to miss the session. However, the Senate's majority leaders, Williams and Robert Stivers, insisted that it would be voted on Thursday. In its original form, SB 151 was to allow for as many as five casinos at the state's racetracks and in two other locations. A revised version guaranteed seven casinos without a guarantee for the racetracks.

Falls of Lora created a big impression when swooping to a 3 1/2-length success from highly regarded stable companion Kunooz (Ire) (Hard Spun) in Ascot's Hyperion Conditions S. over a mile in September, and that was enough to earn a supplementary for the G1 Prix Marcel Bousac. Unable to land a blow in that Longchamp feature when last seen on Arc day, the bay returned to step up to the plate for connections as stable companion Pimpernel (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) flopped. Racing in third early as Mary Fildes was sent into a clear advantage, she was not able to wrest the lead until the final 150 yards from that wandering rival with Barzalona at his animated best in the saddle. Pimpernel, the choice of Frankie Dettori, missed the kick and pulled too hard before finishing a disappointing fifth of six. "We knew she would stay the trip, whereas as perhaps it was a slight doubt with Pimpernel, who was then keen early on," trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni said of the winner. "I must admit I thought the leader had stolen the race at one stage, but Mickael chased her at the right time. The [Mar. 31 G2] UAE Derby is a possible, but Kinglet (Kingmambo) is probably our number one for that at the moment. The option is there for her, though."

**Watching Brief for Harbour...**

Robin Heffer and Pearl Bloodstock's unbeaten **Harbour Watch (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}) is facing a race against time to make the May 5 G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas, trainer Richard Hannon revealed yesterday. Having sustained a hind-leg injury in the autumn, the G2 Richmond S. winner is being aimed at the Newmarket Classic, but needs everything to run smoothly until then. "It is a case of so far, so good, and, like all our other horses at this time of the year, Harbour Watch is doing steady slow work," Hannon commented. "He is too good a horse to take chances with, as you saw when he won the Richmond S. at Glorious Goodwood, but, while he would not be ready in time for the Greenham at Newbury in April, we have not given up hope that he might yet make the Guineas. However, if the clock beats us, then so be it. We know that Harbour Watch is a bit special and he will be treated accordingly, but if he can't make Newmarket, there is always the Irish 2000 Guineas and Royal Ascot."

**CAPUANO GETS WIN #3,000** Maryland-based trainer Dale Capuano saddled his 3,000th career winner yesterday when Father Mudd (Stormin Fever) captured the ninth race at Laurel. He is the 27th conditioner to reach that milestone. "I was pretty proud when I won our first race, so when you get to 3,000 it's pretty remarkable," Capuano said. "It's just been a pretty good run. You know we've had a lot of help, great clients, great barn people who work for us, a team effort. I'm just the leader." Capuano, 49, is in good company with fellow Maryland stalwarts King Leatherbury (3rd-6,335), Scott Lake (6th-5,153), Buddy Delp (12th-3,674) and Dick Dutrow (13th-3,665). "Racing against most of those guys, day in and day out, just makes you better," added Capuano. "The business has changed quite a bit since the mid-90's and early 2000's. We're trying to change with the times and things are tougher now, but we're going to keep rolling along. The economy is going down and most of the tracks race less days than they used to back then, so we're based here and we just don't have the days we had 10 or 15 years ago, and that really is a difference to an outfit like mine." Capuano, whose first winner was Who's Lucky in February 1981 at Bowie, has led the trainer standings 31 times at Laurel and Pimlico. He saddled his first graded winner in 2001, when Prized Stamp won the GII Barbara Fritchie H. During that season, his stable had a career-best \$4.4 million in winnings.

### Oaklawn Announces Record Purse Increase:

Citing perfect weather and a history-making President's Day weekend, officials at Oaklawn Park have announced that overnight purses at the track will be hiked by \$100,000 weekly. The increase will be divided as follows: \$1,500 for all claiming races under \$20,000, \$3,000 for all claiming races over \$20,000 and \$5,000 for all maiden special weights and allowance races. When the meet began Jan. 13, maiden races were a track-high \$40,000. Now, they will have a \$46,000 purse. "As we learned last year, weather can be the difference between a good meet and a great meet," said David Longinotti, Assistant General Manager of Racing. "We've been very fortunate that everything has fallen into place this season. It's very exciting to work for a company that puts as much effort into racing as gaming. Thanks to the positive trends on both sides this meet, we're able to keep making our racing the best nationwide." The weather wreaked havoc on the 2011 meeting, forcing the track to cancel eight programs, but there have been no such obstacles this year. A season-high crowd of 29,313 turned out for Monday's President's Day card, which featured split divisions of the GIII Southwest S.

### Purse Increases for Sam Houston:

The purses for the 2012 Sam Houston Thoroughbred meet are going up. An additional \$1,000 will be added to the purses of each of the races, an increase of 6.5% for the final 12 days of the racing season, which concludes Mar. 12. The increases have been fueled by a 23% upswing in handle. "We are very excited about the early success of our meet," said Eric Johnston, vice president of racing. "The purse increase is our way of thanking the horsemen for their support. We look forward to three more great weeks of racing."

### Santa Anita to Continue Four-Day Weeks:

With the approval of the California Horse Racing Board, officials at Santa Anita Park in Arcadia, California, have announced that the track will continue with four live racing dates for the remainder of the meeting. "We're very pleased with how the meeting is going," said Santa Anita President George Haines. "Our overall handle is currently up 7% and our field size has remained strong, at 8.3 horses per race, compared to 7.7 a year ago. The current racing schedule is working well for all of our stake holders and we want to thank the CHRB and Chairman [Keith] Brackpool for allowing us to continue to run four days a week in order to sustain and build upon the momentum we've been able to establish." Santa Anita opened its winter/fall stand Dec. 26, with over 44,000 fans on hand for the GI Malibu S., and over 30,000 racegoers passed through the turnstiles on Sunshine Millions Day Jan. 28. Officials are looking for the strength to continue through the rest of the meet. "We not only have plenty of great racing left, but we've got a number of popular promotions left as well," said Haines. "We want to thank our fans and horsemen for enabling us to put on a good show thus far and we look forward to finishing this meet strongly."
