ALGORITHMS KNOCKED OUT OF FOUNTAIN

The GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. lost its likely favorite Sunday morning when trainer Todd Pletcher was forced to scratch

Starlight Racing's **Algorithms** (Bernardini) due to a splint injury in his right front leg. "The colt has been training beautifully," Pletcher said of the GIII Holy Bull S. winner. "It's an unfortunate situation. We'll monitor him closely and see how he responds to treatment."

"It's disappointing to miss this start," said Jack Wolf, managing partner of Starlight Racing.

"Unfortunately these things are part of the game and we deal with them."

Pletcher, who noted the injury was first discovered Saturday, said Algorithms would be taken out of training for a few days before being reassessed. "We'll try to cool it out and then assess the situation in a few days," he told *Daily Racing Form*. "We still have lots of options left for him, if everything turns out all right."

Union Rags Dominates Fountain of Youth (cont. from p1)

Despite losing Algorithms, trainer Todd Pletcher still sent out the race favorite, with **Discreet Dancer** (Discreet Cat) the 4-5 crowd's choice. Union Rags, making his first start since a runner-up effort in the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, was the 6-5 second choice. Discreet Dancer, with **News Pending** (Harlan's Holiday) in close attendance, set the pace through moderate fractions of

:24.50, :48.11 and 1:12.05, while Union Rags tracked the top two while racing three wide. The strapping colt loomed menacingly turning for home and settled the race in a matter of strides, bounding to the lead at the top of the lane before effortlessly driving clear to the wire. News Pending stayed on for second as the previously unbeaten Discreet Dancer settled for third.

"Can you believe that one?" owner/breeder Phyllis Wyeth asked after watching Union Rags's dominating performance. "We were just out for a practice run and we didn't want him to peak too soon. We were not expecting him to win...giving [five] pounds to Discreet Dancer."

Julien Leparoux was aboard Union Rags for the first time Sunday, replacing Javier Castellano who had opted to ride Algorithms. The Frenchman admitted he was impressed by the performance. "I was hoping he would run a good race, but I was not expecting that," Leparoux said. "He's such an easy horse to ride and did everything so easily. I didn't hit him once. I just showed him the stick a couple times. I'm sure he was not 100% today, which means he should just get better."

Already looking ahead, Matz confirmed, "The next stop will be the [Mar. 31 GI] Florida Derby and hope we can go to the Kentucky Derby."

Union Rags sold for \$145,000 to the bid of IEAH Stables at the 2010 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale, only to be bought again by his breeder, who paid \$390,000 for the handsome bay at the 2011 Fasig-Tipton February Sale. He opened his career in sparkling fashion, following a debut win at Delaware last July with a 7 1/4-length romp in the Aug. 15 GII Saratoga Special and a 5 1/4-length triumph in the Oct. 8 GI Champagne S. He suffered the first loss of his career when he came up a head short of Hansen (Tapit) after a wide trip in the Breeders' Cup.

No Excuses for Dancer

Discreet Dancer (Discreet Cat) was the Fountain of Youth favorite based on a pair of open-length victories over the Gulfstream oval, but the chestnut colt suffered the first loss of his career in his stakes debut Sunday. "The pace was slow enough," commented jockey John Velazquez, aboard the beaten favorite. "With those fractions, he should have been able to finish a lot better. I don't know, I guess he was just flat today." Pletcher added, "There were no real excuses. We got the trip we wanted and he just finished evenly."

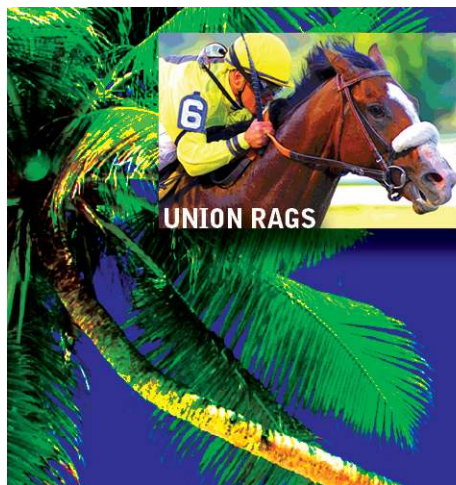

stalked the early pace as longshot Mambo Meister (King Cugat) led the field through three-quarters in 1:13.62. He engaged Center Divider (Giant's Causeway) as the leader faltered on the far turn and the 7-year-old assumed control at the top of the lane before determinedly holding off

the late surge of favored Newsdad. "Speed has been holding well here and the pace was slow, so I didn't want to be too far back," explained winning rider Javier Castellano. "[Trainer] Roger Attfield gave me the green light to ride him however I wanted. He's such a long-striding horse. I just let him break and sit in the clear. He wouldn't let the other horse by. He ran a huge race today." Attfield was represented by the first- and third-place finishers after 10-year-old Muskietier rallied late to get a head in front of Center Divider. "He doesn't have the big turn of foot that the gray horse [Muskietier] does, so I was happy to see that he was involved early," Attfield said of the winner. "I think he's been getting too far out of it early. The horse has been doing great. He's a horse that's developed really late in his career. He's got better and better. He's been knocking on the door in so many races, I knew he'd have to win a stakes eventually."

GOTHAM RUNNERS TUNE UP

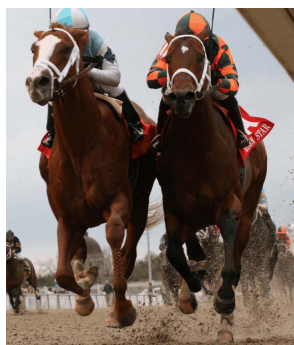
Dogwood Stable's **Raconteur** (A.P. Indy), coming off a pair of wins at Aqueduct, worked four furlongs in :48.89 over the Belmont training track Sunday in preparation for the Mar. 3 GIII Gotham S. The chestnut colt worked in company with GIII Tom Fool H. contender Calibrachoa (Southern Image). "I thought it was a decent move today; I was pleased with what I saw," said Michael McCarthy, assistant to trainer Todd Pletcher. "He got into a nice rhythm and maintained it throughout the work, and he galloped out well."

Dan and Sheila (More Than Ready), another Gotham hopeful from the Pletcher barn, worked five furlongs at Palm Meadows yesterday in a bullet 1:00.92. McCarthy said the Zayat Stables runner, a Gulfstream maiden winner and fourth in the GIII LeComte S. in two lifetime starts, would ship to New York Wednesday.

Also working towards the Gotham: **Hardened Wildcat** (Hard Spun) (five furlongs in 1:02 at Belmont), **King and Crusader** (Lion Heart) (five furlongs in a bullet 1:01.30 at Aqueduct), and **My Adonis** (Pleasantly Perfect) (five furlongs in 1:01.32 at Aqueduct). Working at Gulfstream yesterday, juvenile champion **Hansen** (Tapit) drilled five furlongs in 1:00.95.

"I don't think a mile will be any problem for her, not the way she trains and the way she's been running," commented trainer Peter Miller. "Going short, she's been kicking away from them pretty good."

With regular exercise rider Jen Brassier in the irons, the 5-year-old mare completed the five furlongs in :59 flat after ticking off fractions of :11.80, :23.80, :35.60 and :47.40. She galloped out six furlongs in 1:13.60. "She's a little faster and faster every time she works now," said trainer Larry Jones. "I don't understand why that keeps happening. Seriously, she looked like she was galloping pretty easy out there. It was a good work for her. I think we'll probably start working her in company, now."

BAFFERT REMAINS ON FENCE WITH DUDE

Trainer Bob Baffert remained undecided on a next start for **Game on Dude** (Awesome Again) after the 5-year-old was assigned top-weight of 123 pounds to defend his title Saturday in the GI Santa Anita H. "Here or Dubai," Baffert said yesterday, referring to the Big 'Cap or the Mar. 31 G1 Dubai World Cup. Game on Dude was an easy 5 1/4-length winner of the Feb. 5 GII San Antonio S. in his only 2012 start to date.

Ambitious Dragon is going to win most quarter-mile sprints, and so it was, as he shifted out into the daylight in upper stretch and used that superior acceleration to put two lengths on the field at the furlong grounds and held them safe to the wire. Xtension earned himself a trip to the Duty Free, outfinishing defending champion California Memory for second. Only a win in the Champions and Chater Cup May 27 stands between Ambitious Dragon and a HK\$5 million bonus for a Triple Crown, but his jockey isn't convinced it's the right trip. "I personally would not like to see the horse going [2400 meters]," opined Whyte. "I think he's too brilliant for that distance, and, now that he's back to his best, you just want to wrap him in cotton wool and look after him as long as you can. These kinds of horses are few and far between and when you've got one, you do everything you can and hold on to them with both hands."

TO THE EDITOR

The breeding side of our industry is in trouble only because the racing side is failing.

Racing is failing because off-track bet takers are ripping off racing content. Tracks and purses used to split 18-20% of every dollar wagered on their races. Today they are getting less than 5%.

I know of no track that makes a profit on its own races.

Can the problem be fixed? Sure. Businesses re-invent themselves when they get in trouble. None better than Apple Computer, which was failing until Steve Jobs returned. Today it is the most valuable company in the world.

The biography, *Steve Jobs*, tells how music execs went to him for advice. Napster was ripping off their music and sales were falling fast. Jobs figured out what they needed, a secure, central platform to sell their music. He called it iTunes.

The music execs knew music, but not changing technology. They thought they were in the record/cd business, because that was how they were making money at the time. Jobs changed their focus to music content.

The music execs would not do for their industry what Jobs did for them. They were competitors who didn't know they needed a central solution. When they reluctantly agreed to iTunes, Napster disappeared.

Here's the lesson. With iTunes handling digital sales, the focus of each music company shifted to producing and marketing music content. Now they make more profit than ever before.

The music case study applies. Racing needs the same solution as iTunes, a secure, central platform to sell racing content direct to customers and eliminate the Napster-like bet takers ripping off the sport.

Once our tracks are no longer in the off-track, bet-taking business, they will focus on packaging and marketing their own races for profit. That changes the future for tracks, the sport and finally, the breeding industry.

National wagering has fallen to about \$10 billion, which should still yield over \$2 billion to be split between tracks and purses. That's enough to make this industry whole again, but the revenue isn't coming through.

When technology allowed off-track wagering, racing chose a bad model for reasons that no longer apply. For example, when Keeneland sends its races to New Jersey bet takers, only 20% of the revenue comes back to Keeneland, while 80% stays with the bet takers in New Jersey.

But unlike the music companies, the track owners are not victims. They created this insane business model that is killing the whole industry. The tragedy is they will not fix it without outside intervention. That's because some of them own Napster-like subsidiaries and those with casinos no longer need racing.

Every time racing has been threatened, powerful men and women have used their influence in Congress to protect the sport and agricultural jobs at risk.

That's what needs to happen now. A central wagering platform will equally protect and serve customers, tracks and racehorse owners.

The vehicle for a secure, wagering platform is within the federal law that permits interstate wagering. A national wagering Trust can be established by tapping the cash flow in wagering. No federal funds are needed. The new trust can partner with the likes of Google, or maybe Apple, to make it simple for customers.

With a central wagering platform, tracks will profit from their own races for the first time in 30 years. They will have a virtual on-track model with 18-20% of every dollar wagered. That's enough. Their incentive to package and present races that customers desire increases by 38 states and perhaps worldwide distribution.

Congress wants to help this sport with tracks and breeding farms in most states. When they look across the table at resolute owners and breeders trying to save a sport and way of life, will they also see other people in opposition? Who will appear to say they should be allowed to continue ripping off the sport? Nobody.

Racehorse owners and breeders fund more than a hundred thousand jobs and there are very few track owners to object. A central wagering platform is a politically sound strategy.

If Congress brings in track owners, they only need to ask one question: "If a central wagering platform will give you every dollar of revenue from wagers on your races, tell us why you would not want that platform?"

What odds would you have given that Steve Jobs would take one-third of the music company's sales, cut them off from contact with their customers and herd those cats to iTunes?

One person can make a difference. Powerful ideas do change the world.

Steve Jobs didn't save the music industry for the music execs. He loved music and to assure a sound future for the talent who wrote and performed the music, he created iTunes. Economic satisfaction was a bonus.

Some wealthy breeders have donated millions of dollars to influence Congress on political philosophy, but not one dollar has ever been donated to incubate creative ideas for the sport. Breeders need to understand their future is the re-birth of racing.

If there is ever a good time for the silent partners in racing content to be ready to fight, this is it, because without racehorse owners taking a stand, with strong support from influential breeders, the racing side will not change and will soon fail as a national sport.

Timing is everything. iTunes would not have happened without the problem of Napster. And, the technology for a central platform like iTunes, or one for wagering, was not available years ago.

To re-invent a proud sport and industry, we need to follow the words of the late Steve Jobs. Think Different.

Racing content will have enormous value when the talent in the sport moves to protect it, not when those who take bets on it are in control. A central wagering platform gives the sport a new future. As Jobs would end... "Isn't that cool?"
