THAT'S MORE LIKE IT

Champion **Hansen** (Tapit), a well-beaten second to the sidelined **Algorithms** (Bernardini) after a stumbling beginning in his sophomore debut in the GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream Jan. 29, overcame a rough trip to deliver a dazzling three-length win over **My Adonis** (Pleasantly Perfect) in the GIII Gotham S. at Aqueduct. Unfavorably drawn in post 12, the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero was hung out at least four wide on the clubhouse turn. With Ramon Dominguez in the irons, the gray--racing without blinkers for the first time--forced the issue early through fractions of :23.68 and :47.51, hit the front at the top of the stretch and showed his class down the lane. "He lost all that ground and wasn't rank behind horses and settled," trainer Mike Maker said. "Ramon [Dominguez] said [on] his gallop out, he had to call the outriders to come and get him. He did everything perfect today, and I don't have to be embarrassed after his last race." Is the GI Wood Memorial at the Big A Apr. 7 next? "That is why we came up here, with that in mind," Maker replied. "I think I might take him back to Kentucky to train and come back." Cont. p4

Impressive Rally...

Ron the Greek had a hard time keeping up early, racing well in the back as **Ultimate Eagle** (Mizzen Mast) and **Gladding** (Sarava) exchanged blows through punishing early fractions of :22.26 and :44.55. The handsome bay began to make a visually impressive

middle-move down the backstretch to reach contention, then started to idle a bit. Jose Lezcano went to work on Ron the Greek on the turn for home, and the Florida-bred began to re-rally. He hit the front in the stretch, and kept on finding more to report home a much-the-best winner. "The last three races he has been improving," Lezcano said. "His last race in Florida he was racing a shorter distance and the other horse opened up early and I couldn't catch him. He was really coming the last three-sixteenths, but

the other horse opened up too early." The 28-year-old Rodolphe Brisset, an assistant of five years to Bill Mott, made the trip to California for the Hall of Fame trainer. "There was a lot of speed in the race, we just wanted to stalk the pace and see what happens," Brisset said. "[Lezcano] did very good to make a move on the backside and give him a little break on the turn and he just came running again, so it was a very good race." Brisset continued, "This is my first time at Santa Anita. I came six months ago to Hollywood Park and we won the Shoemaker with Courageous Cat, so that's two trips to California and we won two Grade 1's, so I like to come here."

Private Purchase Pays Off...

Co-owner Adam Wachtel told *TDN* earlier this week that he first tried to buy Ron the Greek as a 3-year-old following his impressive win in the 2010 GIII Lecomte S. at Fair Grounds ([TDN Feature](#)). Apparently good things come to those who wait.

Along with partner Nils Brous, the New York native completed a deal to obtain a two-thirds interest in Ron the Greek from breeder Jack Hammer last summer, and the 5-year-old has done little wrong since.

Transferred to Bill Mott, he finished second in a \$75,000 optional claimer at Saratoga July 29, then received some time off. He resurfaced with a five-length tally in Aqueduct's Sunny And Mild S. Nov. 17, his first time getting his picture taken in nine subsequent starts since the Lecomte. Ron the Greek added another victory in the Queens County S. at the Big A Dec. 10, and punched his ticket to the Big 'Cap with a strong effort in the Sunshine Millions.

Early Pressure Too Much for 'Eagle'...

B J Wright's Ultimate Eagle, tabbed as the slight favorite at 2-1 following a tour-de-force victory in the GII Strub S. Feb. 4, had little left in the tank after the sizzling early pace and faded to finish 10th. "We're very, very disappointed--I wanted to cry," jockey Martin

Pedroza revealed. "They came [at us] like a rabbit. The race is not a quarter of a mile. We're not at Los Alamitos. We're running a mile and a quarter. They're trying to hurt me--for what? I can understand if you're going to

win, but if you're not even going to hit the board." Mike Pender trains the 2011 GI Hollywood Derby hero. "They were hell-bent on getting the lead--[Joel] Rosario and [John] Sadler's horse [Gladding]--and when you go :44 and change going a mile and a quarter...like we said, anybody who tries to chase us is going to pay the price, and Gladding was hitting the reverse button at the three-eighths pole," Pender said. "We kept on going--credit to our horse. You can't go a mile and a quarter in [after a half in] :44 and change. It's literally impossible--unless you're Secretariat."

run at my hometown track. That's what I'd really like to do, but the Wood is a really famous race. A lot of history, and it'd be a real thrill to have a chance to win that. We don't have to run again [before the Kentucky Derby]. We may make that decision, whatever is best for the horse."

Diamond added, "I think

he ran the race we felt he was capable of running, and I think Mike Maker made the correct move and made some adjustments. Obviously, he isn't a one-dimensional horse. I think we'll move forward from here and hope and pray he comes out of this race sound and goes on to the next level."

Willyconker, who began his career in Ireland with trainer Augustine Leahy, was unplaced in his first two starts on these shores for Eoin Harty, then spent 10 months on the sidelines. Five starts into his comeback, the bay scored at Del Mar for \$32,000 Aug. 6, and was claimed next out for \$40,000 out of a third-place finish Aug. 27. Seventh in a hillside tagger in his first start for his new connections, Willyconker rattled off three straight wins before finishing second to Compari in an optional claimer over this course and distance Jan. 5. He was stepped up in class for the GII Arcadia H. Feb. 4 and just failed to reel in odds-on Mr. Commons, but turned the tables this time. Under a perfect ride by Joel Rosario, Willyconker skimmed the rail behind the leaders. Angled out in the stretch, the 5-year-old got first run on Mr. Commons, who, despite having every opportunity, could not reel him in. "What a great ride," said winning trainer Doug O'Neill. "That's why you use a guy like Rosario. He just had him in a perfect spot and then, as soon as they turned home, he got in the right line and just got it done." The Kilroe winner is owned by Martin Gardner of North Hollywood, David Kenney of Yorba Linda and Michael Viele of Anaheim.

Willyconker is by Pyrus (Mr. Prospector), who captured the G2 Richmond S. for trainer Aidan O'Brien in 2000.

Eden's Moon, the second-highest-priced juvenile at FTMMAY, was bet down to 2-5 for her career opener at Hollywood Dec. 18. She ran well enough to earn a 92 Beyer Speed Figure, but was forced to settle for second to Reneesgotzip. The Kaleem Shah colorbearer came back Jan. 8 going a mile and drilled her rivals by 11 1/2 lengths, and was tabbed a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆.

Sent off as the second choice to Reneesgotzip in this rematch, the powerfully built bay came away quickly to take command early. The favorite didn't handle the first turn well, and Eden's Moon continued to travel strongly up front. The fillies made contact entering the stretch, but Eden's Moon found another gear and opened up to post a stylish victory. A claim of foul was disallowed, despite trainer Peter Miller and rider Corey Nakatani maintaining that Reneesgotzip was struck by the whip. "I was hoping we'd be on the lead, get her out there and get her into a groove," said winning trainer Bob Baffert. "We want to take her to the [GI] Kentucky Oaks [May 4], so that's what we're pointing for." Eden's Moon is the first Grade I winner for San Diego resident Kaleem Shah.

Bred in Florida by Bridlewood Farm, Eden's Moon is out of a half-sister to champion Paradise Creek (Irish River {Fr}) and Grade I winners Wild Event (Wild Again) and Forbidden Apple (Pleasant Colony), as well as the dam of Group 1 winner David Junior (Pleasant Tap). Her dam has a yearling Unbridled's Song filly, and produced a Tiznow colt Jan. 19.

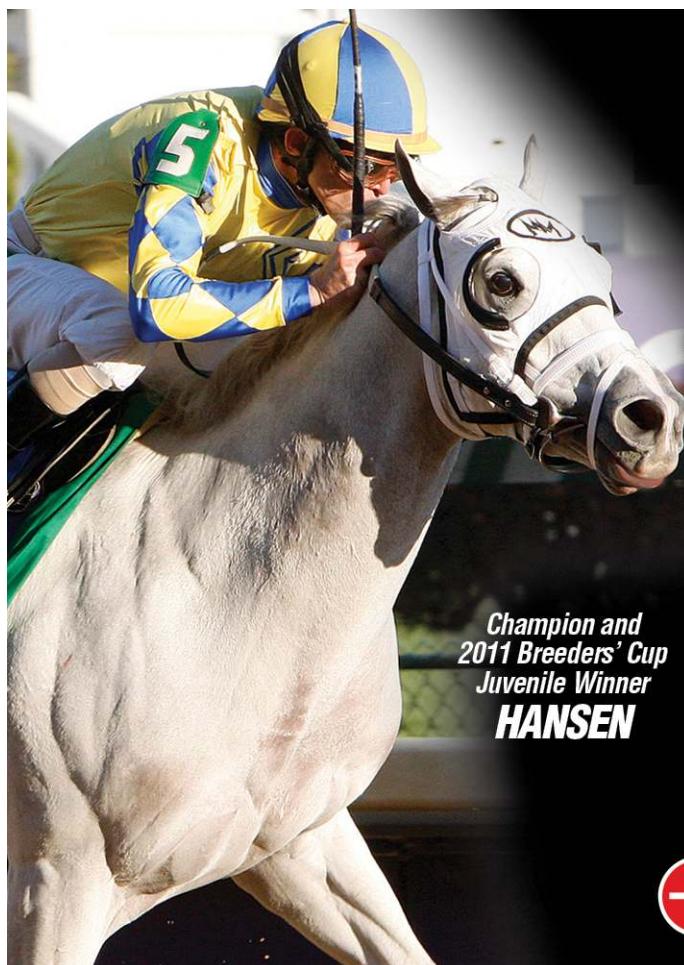

Placed in a tracking second behind Love and Pride through fractions of :24.05 and :47.98, the Godolphin colorbearer turned up the heat on the far turn, hit the front in the stretch and edged clear late to win with something left. "It was a good spot to get started and we're thankful she won," trainer Kiaran McLaughlin said. "We don't know where we are going to go next. We'll talk to [Godolphin racing manager] Simon [Crisford] about that." McLaughlin continued, "Ramon [Dominguez] said she didn't love the track, but she won, so we're off to the races. I think it was a very good performance and she'll improve from the race."

"The horse ran super off the layoff," said trainer Todd Pletcher from New York. "The guys at WinStar did a super job. He really worked well on Monday [at Palm Meadows] and came into this race in good shape." As for a next objective, Pletcher said, "We'll talk to Elliott [Walden] at WinStar and discuss strategy. I think it will either be the [GI Maker's Mark Mile at Keeneland Apr. 13] or the Woodford Reserve [May 5]." Doubles Partner is out of a full-sister to Hall of Famer Serena's Song.



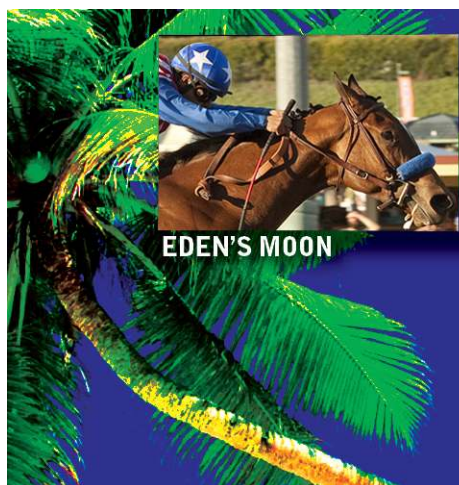

FIRST UP...BARRETT'S MARCH

With Barretts launching the juvenile season Monday evening with the March sale at Fairplex in Pomona and OBS, Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland's counterparts not far behind, the 2012 schedule has been whittled down to mere weeks, providing both advantages and disadvantages to buyers and sellers alike.

"It's going to be a hectic six weeks," said Wavetree Stables' Ciaran Dunne. "I don't really know if there is really any good way around it. It seems asinine that we are going to hold four select sales between the first week of March and early April. It seems that we are putting all of our product on the market in a very short period of time. Nobody really wants to sell any earlier any more and there is a limit to how late some of them want to

sell. Keeneland has their sale in conjunction with the meet, so that is pretty set."

Eddie Woods, who consigned last year's sales' topper—a colt by Pomeroy that brought \$625,000-- offered his perspective on the juggling of sales' dates, beginning with OBS's decision to halt the OBS February sale three years ago to Fasig-Tipton opting to move its sale to coincide with the GI Florida Derby at the end of March.

"We're going to find out how all the change in the dates for the major 2-year-old sales will turn out," said Woods. "Hopefully, it will now turn into a 2-year-old season. It's a buying season and spread over six weeks now as opposed to three months like it used to be. The dates has changed the whole dynamic. Now they have tightened everything up where there are only two weeks between each sale all the way through the Keeneland sale in April. It's made things pretty hectic for everyone. We've had to expand because of the schedule, but it seems to have worked out okay so far. It will be challenging to get to all the events in the shape that you need to get to them, but we will go with the hand that was dealt to us and we will make the best of it. We'll see what happens."

Dunne, responsible for three of the top four juveniles sold at the 2011 renewal, indicated that, while often challenging, the seemingly endless rearrangement of the juvenile sales' schedule over the past few years has required no small amount of adjustment, including both buyers and consignors.

"It probably didn't affect us as it did some other people," admitted Dunne. "We have always sold at every sale. The schedule has always been pretty tough, especially for buyers. People used to be concerned with a horses' gallop out, but the new 'in thing' is that people want to see them 'prep-breeze'. In the past, people were in a position where they had to decide to stay in Ocala to watch them prep-breeze or if they were going to come out here for the sale. Barretts had lost some people because of that, but buyers don't have to make that decision this year. I think from that perspective, there will be a few more East Coast people here this time."

Despite the inherent difficulties of the current schedule, Dunne was quick to point out some of the benefits granted to the sale given its position on the 2012 schedule.

"It's now the first sale of the year, and everyone is a little bit excited about it," explained Dunne. "The guys on the West Coast don't usually get the exposure that we do on the East Coast, and I think they are pumped up about it. Instead of the sale being squeezed in the middle somewhere, it stands out as the first now. The local buyers can stay home, come out and look at the horses at their leisure."

Regarding the larger catalogue for 2012, Dunne added, "I think it may have also become a little bit easier for some other

consignors to come here now that it is the first sale of the season. So, I think Barretts may have gotten a few horses as a result. I think the biggest winner, given the musical chairs with the 2-year-old sales, is Barretts. We'll just have to see what transpires in the ring."

In light of the challenges, many of the sales' most active and successful consignors make the pilgrimage from the east year after year. Chief among them, Dunne and Woods emphasized the importance of bringing the appropriate horse for the local market.

“For an East Coast consignor, it’s a long way to come and it is an expensive trip,” said Dunne. “Unless we think we have something that is worth hauling across the country, we’re going to stay home. So they get some really nice horses out here because of that.”

Woods, who has already seen a GI Kentucky Derby winner come out of his previous 2-year-old drafts in the form of 2007 Keeneland April graduate Big Brown (Boundary), echoed the sentiment.

“We generally bring to California very good physicals and then you can worry who they are by and out of later,” explained Woods. “We generally select them on conformational attributes, except when you have a horse like the Brother Derek filly [Hip 142]. She is a very nice horse and a beautiful mover, and more of a 3-year-old type. We thought Brother Derek would be more acceptable out there than anywhere, because that’s where he did all of his best running. He was quite popular, so I thought it was a good move to bring her here.”

Woods added, “It is the first sale of the year and California buyers have always been pretty active in the 2-year-old game, so I thought it was a good spot to bring some really nice horses and kick off the game, so to speak. They might not be the very best, but the horses we are bringing to Barretts this year are pretty close to the best 2-year-olds we have.”—C Bossinakis

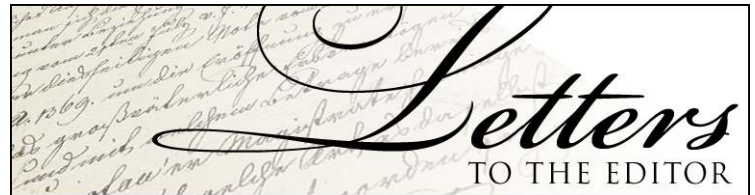

Editor's Note: Bill Oppenheim's column on TOBA (Click [here](#) to read) in Wednesday's TDN and TOBA's reply in [Thursday's TDN](#) continue to generate comment from our readers.

After reading Mr. Koester's letter to the TDN regarding the TOBA's decision to not move forward with the banning of Lasix for 2-year-olds in graded stakes this year, I had to comment--it got under my skin. If he thinks that it is the right of the public to have televised access into the barn of all trainer's Kentucky Derby day and show on television the injection of lasix, why isn't he calling for the television cameras to go into all professional sports locker rooms before the games are played? Do they show those athletes getting cortisone shots for pain? If so, do you really think everyone would turn the channel? Sometimes I wonder if any of you have ever known any professional athletes. Do you really know what goes on in other sports? If they implemented the drug tests that race horses have to go through, we might not be watching anything but knitting on Sundays. 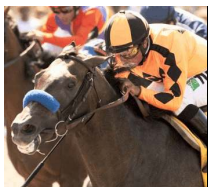

Santa Anita Third Declared No-Contest:

A horse that broke through the gate before the start of Saturday's third race at Santa Anita, a \$32,000 claimer going 6 1/2 furlongs down the hillside turf course, resulted in the race being declared a no-contest ([video](#)). The field had been loaded when, just prior to the starter springing the latch, Muny (Najran) broke through stall three. A split second later, the rest of the doors opened. Amid the confusion, three assistant starters held their horses, while three other horses began racing. Those three naturally finished 12-3, with Mr. Bossy Pants (Victory Gallop) edging Sky Cape (Najran) and Oak Key Why (Whywhywhy).

Afterward, Santa Anita, in agreement with the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC), said it will distribute purse money as though the race had been run without incident. Mr. Bossy Pants will thus receive the \$21,000 winner's share of the \$35,000 purse, with Sky Cape getting \$7,000 and Oak Kye Why earned \$4,200. The remaining monies will be divided amongst the other four horses, with each getting \$875. All jockeys, trainers and owners will all be paid normal percentages and fees according to where their respective mounts finished.

All single-race monies wagered on the seven runners refunded. In making their ruling, stewards Scott Chaney, Kim Sawyer and Tom Ward cited CHRB rule 1544 b., which stipulates that if "due to mechanical failure or interference, the majority of the field is effected, then the race is to be declared a no-contest." In addition to refunds on wagers placed on runners in the third race, all third-race horses used in the Pick Five, Pick Four, Pick Threes and rolling doubles were considered as winners and those wagers were still live.
