REDDAM BUSY AT BARRETTS

Owner J. Paul Reddam, sitting alongside Dennis O'Neill, and a row behind his racing manager Jamie McCalmont and trainer Doug O'Neill, went on a buying spree during Monday's Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training. Dennis O'Neill signed for five juveniles on behalf of Reddam for a total of \$540,000. McCalmont led all buyers while signing for seven juveniles for a total of \$940,000.



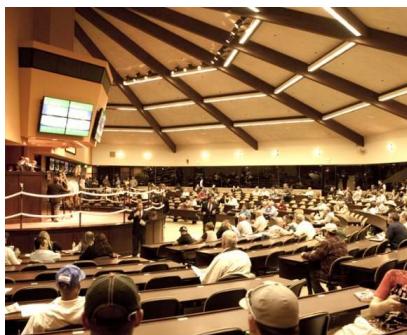

Leading the purchases was a filly by War Front who sold for \$310,000. The juvenile ([hip 108](#)), consigned by Bruno De Berdt's Excel Bloodstock,

is out of Kokena (Grindstone), a half-sister to multiple graded stakes placed Come On Jazz (Jambalaya Jazz). De Berdt purchased the filly for \$100,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale. She worked a furlong at last Friday's under tack preview in [:10 1/5](#) and Dennis O'Neill admitted the drill was a major selling point.

"We loved the breeze," he said. "We judge these sales by the breeze and I thought she had the prettiest breeze at the sale. She went in [:10 1/5](#) and did it very easily and galloped out really good. Just a pretty, brilliant, athletic-looking filly, so we are really excited about her."

McCalmont signed for a son of Candy Ride (Arg) for \$220,000 early during Monday's auction. [Hip 18](#), consigned by Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables, is the first foal out of the unraced Sweet and Clever (Mr. Greeley). The 6-year-old mare is a half-sister to graded stakes placed Moon Over Prospect (Crafty Prospector). A \$220,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase, the bay

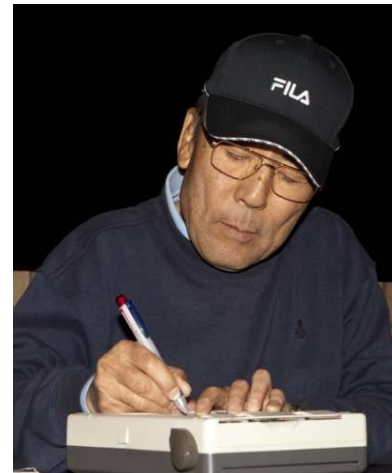
worked in [:10 3/5](#).

"He was just beautiful," O'Neill said of the youngster. "Physically, we thought he was just the best-looking horse. He kind of broke off slow in the breeze, but he finished good and galloped out good."

He continued, "We saw him the week before and he went in [:10 1/5](#), so I thought he was a really good horse and was probably underpriced a bit at \$220,000."

At the close of business Monday, Dennis O'Neill acknowledged that it was a strong sale without a breakout horse. "It was weird that there was really no big horse," O'Neill said. "There were a lot of good horses, but nothing that really stood out. I thought it was a great sale and I think in the next year or so, we will see how good it was. There just wasn't the big horse that people could jump on. For me, it was great because we really don't buy those horses. A couple of the ones that worked fast went for more than I thought they would bring, but overall it was a quality sale. Qualitywise, it was better than it has been the last couple of years."

Doug O'Neill will train all of Reddam purchases.

"The only reason I am running them both in the same race is the timing," Harrington said. "I had a plan for Creative Cause from the very beginning, which included this race. And Empire Way, I don't really want to ship

him out of town at this point, so the timing is right on him also."

Creative Cause won last year's GII Best Pal S. and GI Norfolk S. before a third-place effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He was the 1-2 favorite while making his sophomore debut in the Feb. 19 GII San Vicente S. and closed late to be third.

"I thought his last race was a very good race," commented Harrington. "Some people weren't impressed with it, but he got exactly what I wanted him to get out of it and he galloped out very strong."

Harrington has also been impressed with how his ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ has been training since that effort, including a four-furlong drill at Hollywood Park yesterday in :46 2/5.

"I wanted him to work in :48 and change," Harrington admitted. "He is not much of a work horse and he worked in :46 2/5 without being asked. So it looks to me like he should step forward pretty nicely."

Empire Way, also tabbed a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆, is coming off a runner-up effort in the Feb. 4 GII Robert B. Lewis Memorial S. He will be getting a new jockey in the San Felipe, as Joel Rosario, the regular rider of both colts, will stick with Creative Cause Saturday.

Romans Loaded for Bear...

Trainer Dale Romans has four 3-year-olds at various stages on the Triple Crown trail and two of them are expected to see action this weekend. Donegal Racing's **Dullahan** (Even the Score), winner of last year's GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity, will make his first start

since running fourth behind Hansen (Tapit) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile in Saturday's grassy GIII Palm Beach S. at Gulfstream Park.

The versatile chestnut prepped for his return to the races with a five-furlong move at Gulfstream Saturday in 1:00.60.

"He is sharp and ready to go," Romans told a national teleconference audience

yesterday. "He has actually turned the corner from two to three like you want to see a horse do, and he's doing everything on his own. I think he's fit and ready."

Romans added that the Palm Beach is just the first step on the path and not a goal in itself. "I am expecting a big effort out of him, but this race is not the end all," he explained. "We're not going to squeeze the lemon. We want to make sure that he is peaking on the first Saturday in May."

Dullahan was third over the Saratoga turf in the GII With Anticipation S. before breaking his maiden over Keeneland's Polytrack in the Futurity. Romans thinks his race over the dirt in the Breeders' Cup proves Dullahan is a bona fide Kentucky Derby contender.

"He has proven that he can run on anything," Romans said. "He ran a monster race on the Poly at Keeneland, he's run some really nice turf races and his race in the Breeders' Cup was sneaky good. He got really squeezed and shut off on the first turn and was all the way back to last and showed a big run down the lane on the dirt. I thought that he proved to me and the whole ownership group at Donegal that he can run with the best horses in the world on dirt. We were wondering that ourselves, if he was going to be a Poly or turf specialist, but the race he ran in the Breeders' Cup was as good as any race he's run and proved that he can run on the dirt."

Also this weekend, Romans will saddle the Albaugh Family Stable's **Cozzetti** (Cozzene) in Saturday's GII Tampa Bay Derby. The gray, eighth in last year's GI CashCall Futurity, is coming off a fourth-place effort in the Jan. 21 Kitten's Joy S. over the Gulfstream lawn.

"Cozzetti I think has potential, but I think he is a horse that hasn't turned the corner for us yet," Romans explained. "But he is going to keep improving. The natural ability is all there, it just has to click mentally for him. We're going to give him another shot, probably in Tampa, and see if he can get on the Derby trail."

DRUG WARS

Isolationism. It's a highly charged political concept in the U.S., but it has a very direct application to the American relationship to the rest of the Thoroughbred world. Just like in the real world, the days when the U.S. could dictate policy to everybody else--or stand alone--are over. This is especially true in a time when communication takes place with virtually complete disregard to national boundaries (unless the relevant Government turns all the channels off); and business, too, disregards national boundaries. The sales of racehorses, stallions, and broodmares routinely take place without regard to national boundaries. There is an established international marketplace, both through auctions and privately--and the continuing refusal of U.S. racing jurisdictions to convert back to drug-free racing is so out of step with international conventions that it is patently damaging the U.S. export market for horses, both at the racetracks and at the sales. Sure, the Japanese will come and buy a few 2-year-olds at Barretts, like they did this week, but if you don't think the writing's on the wall for the U.S. Thoroughbred export market--especially for higher-end horses--you're not reading the news. If we continue to insist on racing on drugs, the U.S. will rapidly become the world's biggest producer of second-class racehorses.

Fred Pope, in his *TDN* letter yesterday, remarked that "The horsemen who want drugs are not concerned about international buyers and graded stakes. The vast majority is just concerned about making a living and staying in the game." Fair enough--up to a point. Recognizing that racing in each state is subject to different jurisdictional decisions, Fred envisions some version of a two-tier system, where higher-class horses race drug-free, and, basically, lower-class horses move to jurisdictions with more permissive medication rules. It's tempting to speculate whether Fred's 'visionary' scenario will ever come to pass, but it's rather unfair to Fred to keep calling him 'visionary.' He's actually advocating practical, hard-headed solutions that would fix a lot of what ails us in one fell swoop. One of the interesting side effects of his proposals would be that the horsemen's groups that now wield so much power in state jurisdictions would lose their veto power. That would be an interesting development.

Meanwhile, TOBA's greatest failing hasn't been that they aren't on the right side of the argument, but that they have done a lousy job of communication. Their most serious failing on the communications front was not explaining to the rest of us the process they would have to go through in order to 'make it happen' for graded races for 2-year-olds this year to be run without race-day medication. I had a long talk on the phone Monday with Dan Metzger and Andy Schweigardt of TOBA, for which I'm very grateful. I now understand the process much better, and TOBA's strategy, which was a good strategy in one respect. I don't want you to nod off during some long, convoluted explanation, so I'll keep this short.

First, what races are we even talking about? According to The Jockey Club's Online Fact Book, there were over 46,000 races run in the U.S. in 2010. Andy Schweigardt tells me there were 465 black-type races assigned graded status in the U.S. in 2012. So, even if the TOBA-sponsored American Graded Stakes Committee was trying to run all 465 graded races drug-free, that would represent only about 1% of the races run in the U.S. this year. That's one out of 100. But they weren't even trying to do that; they were proposing (and are still proposing) to run 45 graded stakes for 2-year-olds drug free. That is 1/10 of 1% of U.S. races--one in a thousand.

TOBA realized that 40 of the 45 non-Breeders' Cup 2-year-old graded stakes are run in three jurisdictions: New York, California, and Kentucky. If we were talking about all graded stakes, the AGSC would have approached an organization abbreviated as RCI--Racing Commissioners International, though in this case the 'International' actually refers to only a few Caribbean countries who operate under essentially an American umbrella (the RCI is really a national association of state racing commissions). The RCI is advised by another, completely separate organization, funded by the industry, called the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC). This was the process by which the steroid bans were introduced: the RMTC's scientific advisors made recommendations to the RCI, which recommended adoption of rule changes to prohibit steroids.

Rather than engage in what would be sure to be a knock-down drag-out if it tried to involve the RMTC and 35 other states, TOBA quite rightly, in my view, decided to focus on the three state Racing Commissions responsible for 40 of the 45 graded stakes for 2-year-olds. Approval, in this case, would require each Commission to approve a rule change, saying that 2-year-old graded stakes would be excepted from the prevailing (permissive) medication rules. But TOBA's strategy ran aground, for different reasons in each state. They saw they weren't going to get approval, possibly from any of the three states; so they pulled the plug, triggering the events that lead us to where we are now.

I don't know of anyone who argues that America's drug rules are actually good for the U.S. export market. Nobody really disputes that the U.S. is out of step with most of the rest of the world; as Fred Pope points out, it's simply that a lot of horsemen don't care. They operate in a local, or, at most, national domestic market; international considerations don't figure into their thinking. But for anyone who aspires to sell horses abroad, well, how can you not care?

What has become clear, from the reaction of over 95% of TDN readers who have let us know what they think in the last week, is that there really is a strong body of opinion that, at the very least, graded races-- 1 out of 100!--should be run drug-free. But that's not even the fight: it's about 45 graded races for 2-year-olds (not including the Breeders' Cup 2-year-old graded races), 40 of which are to be run in these three states this year. That fight need not be over. It's really time for those of you who agree that graded races in the U.S. should be run drug-free to make your voices heard, in a way you haven't had the opportunity to do before. Below are the contact details for the Chairs of the three state racing commissions; for the presidents of the major racetracks in the three states; and for the members of the American Graded Stakes Committee. Now is the time for you to make your voices heard; send them emails and tell them what you think. Please copy in the AGCS (via toba@toba.org) and TDN (to suefinley@thoroughbreddailynews.com) so that AGSC members know the level of support they have, and so we can count how many voices speak up. It is especially important that the racetracks, as well as the Commissions, hear what the people think.

Citizens, Rise up! Part of the reason our leaders are ineffective is because they can only guess at the level of support they command among the populace. We must tell them; no, you must tell them. I want to wake up tomorrow morning and read that the regulators and the racetracks have been inundated, not with dozens, but with hundreds, of emails demanding, to start with, drug-free graded stakes, starting with the 2-year-olds. And, by the way, by 'citizens' I don't mean just of the U.S.; I mean citizens of this industry, internationally. If you are a non-U.S. reader who does not come to, or buy in, the U.S. as often as you used to, tell them--and let them know why, and where you're from. If you are a non-U.S. reader who for any reason thinks U.S. graded stakes (especially for 2-year-olds) should not race on drugs, tell them--and why. You are citizens, businesspeople in this industry just like the rest of us. These events have created an opportunity for us to speak. But don't just tell us; tell them. If this is what you believe, Citizens, make them listen.

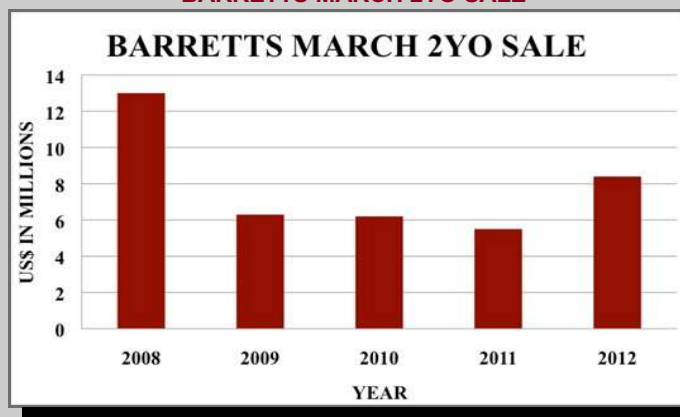

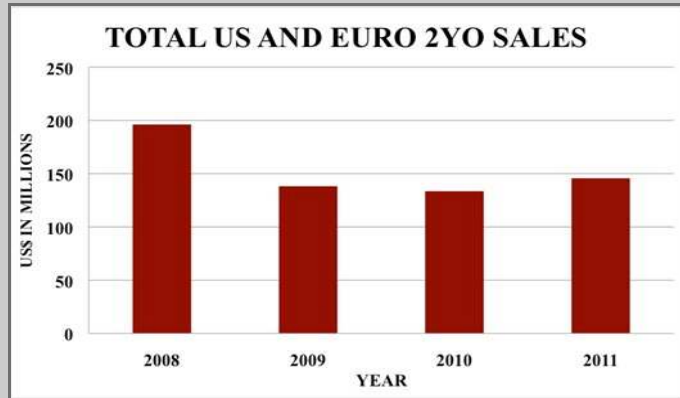
"It's hard to know just how strong Barretts' opening 2-year-old sale of the season (Mark DeDomenico's small Pegasus sale in Seattle excepted) really was; yes, the gross was up by 52%, but the number catalogued and sold were each up by 40%, meaning the average rose by 9%. Withdrawals were down from 32% to 19%, but not-solds were up from 24% to 36%, so the percentage sold from the catalogue was just under 52%, same as last year. Japanese buyers bought a lot, and Paul Reddam's Racing Manager, Jamie McCalmont, was the leading buyer by gross."

**Statement From
DAN METZGER, TOBA President**

"From its initial announcement last August, the committee has maintained that it needed to work with state regulators and racetracks in order to implement its ban of race-day medications in two-year-old Graded Stakes races for 2012. The members of the committee weren't pandering, but instead recognized that timely action by these groups was necessary and essential in order to implement the prohibition. The decision to postpone the implementation because timely action did not occur is not a change in goal or philosophy, but a tactical recognition of the time needed to make a major change in American Thoroughbred horse racing.

"Our committee members that represent TOBA, Dr. J. David Richardson, John Amerman, Bill Farish, Seth Hancock, Mike Levy and Pete Willmott, as well as racing officials Rogers Beasley, Dan Bork, P.J. Campo, Mike Dempsey and Tom Robbins, reflect active involvement for decades, and in some cases generations in the Thoroughbred industry and their ideals and principals represent integrity at the highest level. Criticizing them because of the decision they made doesn't advance the effort to bring about change. Action was not taken by regulators and racetracks because they do not believe the support is there to do so. Opponents of the ban have certainly made their position known to regulators and racetracks. Make your position known. We're on the same side of this issue and our energies need to go toward making positive change in race-day medication policy."

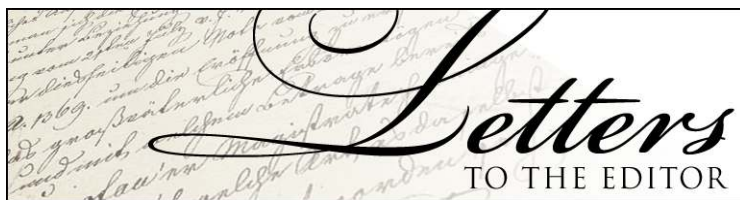

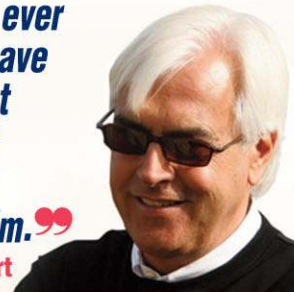
