FULL FIELD FOR SPIRAL

A full field of 12 up-and-coming sophomores based all over the country are set to contest Saturday's GIII Vinery Racing Spiral S. at Turfway Park. J. Paul Reddam's GIII El Camino Real Derby third-place finisher **Handsome Mike** (Scat Daddy) leads the California contingent alongside two-time stakes winner **Russian Greek** (Giant's Causeway) and longshot **All Squared Away** (Bellamy Road). All Squared Away was seventh in the El Camino Real Derby, but returned to finish second against older foes in a Santa Anita starter allowance Mar. 15. Of his reasoning for taking a shot here, trainer Peter Miller said Thursday, "He has tactical speed, and we know he likes the synthetics. It looks like a wide-open race, and we fit by all the sheet numbers. And it has that big purse... I galloped him myself yesterday and he was full of energy and strength." The local experience edge goes to **Mr. Prankster** (It's No Joke), a 7 1/2-length winner of the WEBN S. here two back Feb. 4. The Thomas Conway and Mike Maker representative was fourth with a wide trip in the local John Battaglia Memorial S. here Mar. 3, when **Ill Conceived** (Spanish Steps) was a very close second.

HANSEN TO BLUE GRASS

Reigning juvenile champion and recent GIII Gotham S. winner **Hansen** (Tapit) will bypass the Apr. 7 GI Resorts World New York Wood Memorial S. at Aqueduct for Keeneland's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. a week later, according to co-owner and breeder Dr. Kendall Hansen. "There are several reasons why we elected to run Hansen in the Toyota Blue Grass," said Dr. Hansen. "Foremost is that the horse will have to travel less and we think that is safer for him. If we win, Hansen will have Grade I victories on both all-weather and dirt surfaces. It also allows us to stay home and in familiar surroundings. And, very importantly, since a majority of his fan base is in Kentucky, it gives them a chance to see him run." The grey is currently stabled at trainer Mike Maker's home base at Churchill Downs's Trackside Training Center. The Blue Grass will also give Hansen's rider, Ramon Dominguez, an extra week to heal following a separated collarbone he sustained after a spill at Aqueduct Sunday. Rogers Beasley, Keeneland's vice president of racing, offered, "We're extremely pleased to have the 2-year-old champion from last year in the Toyota Blue Grass."

13 RACES ADDED TO BC CHALLENGE SERIES

The Breeders' Cup released the schedule for its 2012 Challenge Series yesterday, which features 13 new automatic qualifying races and a total of 73 events in 10 countries. Eight races, most notably the GI Haskell Invitational S., were removed from this year's line-up. New American additions include the GI Stephen Foster H. (Classic division) and GI Personal Ensign S. (Ladies' Classic division). International events such as the G1 L'Ormarins Queen's Plate S. (Mile division) in South Africa won by Gimmethegreenlight (Aus) (More Than Ready) Jan. 7; the G1 Gran Premio 25 de Mayo in Argentina; the G1 Longines Grosser Preis von Baden in Germany; and the G1 Prix de la Foret in France were also added to the schedule this year ([Click here for full schedule](#)). "Expanding the global reach and upgrading the quality of races in the Breeders' Cup Challenge series are critical factors in increased participation and in generating awareness for the Breeders' Cup in the months leading to our Championships," said Breeders' Cup President and CEO Craig Fravel. "We also look forward to horsemen taking advantage of our incentive program of free entries and travel allowances for Challenge winners into the World Championships, which was very well-received last year." First introduced in 2011, all Challenge winners' entry expenses will be paid. U.S.-based winners will also receive \$10,000 in travel expenses, while international runners will be awarded \$20,000. The Breeders' Cup World Championships will take place at Santa Anita Nov. 2-3.

JOCKEY CLUB UPDATES INJURY STATS

Statistics released Thursday by The Jockey Club show that the prevalence of fatal injury per every 1,000 starts is 1.88, equal to the corresponding figure from 2010 and a slight improvement from the 1.98 reported in 2009. Based on an analysis of over 1.1 million starts during that three-year period, the total prevalence of race-related fatal injury was 1.91 per 1,000 starts. There have been two changes in the way reporting of these statistics now take place: the updates now encompass information received during the calendar year and only those injuries that resulted in fatality within the first 72 hours of the date of the race are included in the national figures. Using the previous parameters where all fatalities are included, the rate would have been 2.05 per 1,000 starts.

"Continued growth of the database has shown variations among jurisdictions in follow-up reporting during the days and weeks after an injury was sustained, creating variation in the results," explained Matt Iuliano, executive director and executive vice president of The Jockey Club. "We realize there are situations in which the outcome is not determined until much later than 72 hours after an incident, but our confidence level in reporting an accurate benchmark statistic is greatest when we utilize information available within 72 hours." The attached tables include a three-year summary of statistics from the database broken out by age, sex, surface and distance as well as a summary of fatal injuries broken out by fatality date. In 2011, the likelihood of fatal injury on a synthetic surface was 1.09/1,000, 90% lower than the rate over conventional dirt surfaces (2.07/1,000). Fatal injuries on turf in 2011 were 1.53/1,000, 35.3% lower than dirt and 40.3% higher than on synthetic tracks. [Click here for supporting tables.](#)

Musical Chairs Lands Alpha Back in New York...

Godolphin's **Alpha** (Bernardini), who as recently as Wednesday was to have his final Derby prep race in the GII Louisiana Derby Apr. 1, will be shipped back to New York for the Apr. 7 GI Resorts World New York Wood Memorial S. with yesterday's word that the connections of Eclipse Award and GIII Gotham S. winner Hansen (Tapit) were opting for the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland. "Alpha is now heading to the Wood," trainer Kiaran McLaughlin confirmed. "I spoke to [Godolphin racing manager] Simon Crisford yesterday, and we agreed [the Wood would be] the race [for Alpha] if the rumors were true that Hansen wasn't going to the race. We'll get Ramon Dominguez back, and we'll be back in New York. It's a prestigious race, and we'll be happy to be back in New York. We are supporters of New York racing, and if Alpha goes to the Wood, he'll be staying in our barn with our people. It's why we prefer Florida or New York." Since his victory in the GIII Withers S. in early February, Alpha has been stabled and training at Palm Meadows. He was also a candidate for the GI Florida Derby, though would have started there only if Union Rags (Dixie Union) came out.

Team Valor Acquire Italian Maiden Winner...

Team Valor, who will start Lucky Chappy (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in the G2 UAE Derby next Saturday, has acquired fellow 3-year-old **Capitan Futuro (GB)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) and will point him for a run in the G2 Derby Italiano in May, *Racing Post* reports. Previously trained by Angelo Candi, the grey colt finished a promising third in a 2100-meter conditions event over the all-weather track at Rome Feb. 21 before backing up a week later to score by an impressive five lengths as the 11-10 favorite in a course-and-distance maiden ([video](#)). Capitan Futuro, the first foal out of Showstar (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), and was a €21,000 purchase out of last year's Arqana Breeze-Up Sale ([under-tack breeze](#)). Capitan Futuro is reportedly named after AS Roma's soccer star Daniele De Rossi.

Hays Buy into Treasure Beach...

Jim and Fitri Hay have purchased a 50% share in **Treasure Beach (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), the *Racing Post* revealed yesterday. Last year's G1 Irish Derby and GI Secretariat S. winner becomes the third high-profile Coolmore horse that the couple have entered into partnership with after Fame and Glory (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). "I can confirm that Mrs. Fitri Hay has purchased a 50% share in Treasure Beach and the plan is to run in the [Mar. 31 G1] Sheema Classic," the Hays' Racing Manager Alex Cole told the trade daily. "Jamie Spencer will ride, as he is Mrs. Hay's retained rider and he will race in her colours. There are no definite plans as yet after Dubai, we will see how he gets on before making any decisions."

HAY LIST CLEARED TO RACE

Despite being given preliminary clearance to take his spot in the field, **Hay List (Aus)** (Statue of Liberty) will be subjected to a pre-race veterinary inspection ahead of tonight's G1 William Reid S. after an abscess from which he was suffering earlier this week burst. The 6-year-old, who emerged from the shadow of Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}) to defy a 128-pound impost and win the G1 Newmarket H. last time out, races under weight-for-age conditions this time around and is heavily favored at 2-5 on TAB Sportsbet. He had **Buffering (Aus)** (Mossman {Aus}) and the 3-year-old **Foxwedge (Aus)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) in the Newmarket, but the runner-up is nine pounds worse in the weights, and even though Foxwedge gets an allowance, he picks up 13 pounds off their last meeting, and will have plenty to find with the favorite.

SAMAREDAY PREPS FOR THE SLIPPER

Samaready (Aus) (More Than Ready) ventures to Sydney and tries right-handed racing for the first time as she preps for the Apr. 7 G1 AAMI Golden Slipper in the G2 Reisling S. The filly, owned in part by Vinery Stud, brings an unblemished 3-from-3 mark into this event and enters off a dominating victory in the G1 Blue Diamond S. in Melbourne Feb. 25. Despite racing clockwise for the first time in her career, trainer Mick Price is expecting a big run while leaving something in the tank for the Slipper, for which she is currently the 2-1 favorite. "She's very good and I think she'll win on Saturday," the conditioner told *Australian Associated Press*. "I haven't tried to get her to improve [since the Blue Diamond]. I think if she's in as good form I'd be happy with that. I think the run will bring her on." **Snitzerland (Aus)** (Snitzel {Aus}) earned her first group success last time out, turning in a powerful performance to land the G3 Thoroughbred Breeders S. at Flemington Mar. 10, while **Hussousa (Aus)** (Husson {Arg}) ran Slipper second favorite **Pierro (Aus)** (Lonhro {Aus}) to a length when runner-up in the G2 Silver Slipper S. here three weeks back.

Pierro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) will look to remain perfect in his three career outings in Saturday's G2 Todman S. and cement his spot on the second line of betting for the Golden Slipper. Winner of the Listed Breeders Plate on his racecourse debut at this track Oct. 1, he was first up off a five-month layoff in the G2 Silver Slipper S. Mar. 3 and overcame the deep ground to best Hussousa by a length. **Epaulette (Aus)** (Commands {Aus}) is also undefeated in his young career, having taken a Dec. 26 handicap at this venue ahead of a last-out defeat of **Faustus (Aus)** (More Than Ready) in the Listed Black Opal S. at Canberra Mar. 11.

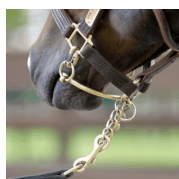

Among the juveniles scheduled to work at Palm Meadows during today's under-tack preview of Fasig-Tipton's Florida Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training is the first foal from multiple graded stakes winner J'ray (Distant View). The dark bay colt, by Medaglia d'Oro, is catalogued as [hip 41](#) from the consignment of Niall Brennan.

Like his accomplished dam, the youngster was bred by Larry Goichman and the Connecticut resident admitted it was a tough decision to sell the colt.

"There was a lot of sentimentality, but like a lot of people in the business, you've got to sell some,"

Goichman said. "We try to keep fillies and sell colts, so while it was hard, it was also easy--it is our focus."

Still the decision wasn't met with unilateral support in the Goichman household.

"I would think it would be a little less sentimental if it wasn't for the fact that J'ray was named after my wife," Goichman confessed. "That is what they used to call her when she was a young girl. Jennifer Ray, so they used to call her J'ray. When the foal was born, Jennifer said, 'You are not selling him.' and I had to say, 'Jennifer, remember we are selling colts.' And she said, 'But couldn't we keep this one?' And I said, 'No.' I was a bad guy."

Goichman, who admitted he had dreams of becoming a veterinarian, is founder and president of SCG Capital Corporation, a lease-financing company. He first got involved with racing almost by accident.

"We were at a wedding and Jennifer ran into an accountant who was putting together a syndicate of people to participate in owning some 2-year-olds," Goichman recalled. "She said, 'Why don't you go see my husband?' and I ended up buying two interests in these horses. We did it two years in a row, but it turned out the fellow who was doing it was basically interested in getting me to use his company for accounting. I don't think he liked horses and horses certainly didn't like him."

Goichman soon discovered he didn't need partners to enjoy the racing game.

"I said, 'I think I can do this,'" he continued. "So we ended up buying some mares and now we have 14 broodmares and lots of bills. But it is fun. It has taken awhile, but every single mare is either a stakes winner or a stakes producer."

In addition to J'ray, Goichman also bred multiple graded stakes winner Read the Footnotes.

Goichman's broodmare band has strong roots in a few well-chosen shopping sprees to England.

"We've been in this business since 1987 and began breeding in '89," he explained. "I was pretty unhappy with how I was doing and a friend suggested there were some wonderful pedigrees obtainable in England. So we went to Tattersalls for about six years in a row and all of my best mares and a number of stakes winners have come from those mares that I bought in England."

One of his acquisitions was J'ray's dam Bubbling Heights (Fr) (Darshaan {GB}). Goichman was able to pick up the Wertheimer-bred mare, in foal to Gold Away (Ire), for 22,000gns out of the 2000 Tattersalls December sale.

"Bubbling Heights was a Darshaan mare, she had the right pedigree, the right everything. She checked all my boxes," Goichman said. "And I was kind of lucky, because when we bought her, she was in foal to a stallion who was not highly regarded and she slipped in under people's radars. So we were able to buy her."

The Wertheimer connection still resonates with Goichman 12 years later.

"Bubbling Heights was owned by the Wertheimer family and whenever I kind of complain about Jennifer buying some of their merchandise, Chanel, she reminds me that J'ray has paid for it," Goichman laughed. "But we were really really lucky to get her--the Wertheimers have been wonderful breeders over the years and I was actually very surprised that they sold her." **Cont. p10**

J'ray was the third foal Bubbling Heights produced for Goichman. The chestnut filly won the 2008 GII Canadian S. and GIII Taylor Made Matchmaker S., as well as the 2007 GIII Bayou Breeders' Cup H. and GIII My Charmer H. On the board in 18 of 26 starts, she won nine times and earned \$969,843.

Goichman didn't hesitate to name the Canadian S. as his favorite moment from J'ray's successful racing career.

"I remember saying to [jockey] Joe Bravo, 'Don't let her get too far back,'" Goichman recalled. "And he said, 'Mr. Goichman I just want to get her to relax--they have a real long stretch here,' and that I shouldn't worry. She settled back in the pack and, as they are coming to the top of the stretch, it seemed like her colors were way in the back, but it is such a long stretch at Woodbine and the colors just kept moving up and, at some point I think she is in front and then, as she gets to the sixteenth pole she just opened up over the other horses. It was extraordinary and an exciting moment."

Goichman enjoyed further success with Bubbling Heights' offspring at last year's Fasig-Tipton Florida sale. The mare's 2-year-old, also by Medaglia d'Oro, worked a bullet furlong in :09 4/5 over the turf before selling for \$500,000 to the bid of John Ferguson.

According to Goichman, J'ray's first foal is very different from the Bubbling Heights' now 3-year-old .

"He's bigger, more robust," Goichman said. "He covers an awful lot of ground and he's a smart horse. He's checked all the boxes. I am hoping that he is as successful as J'ray was for us."

The juvenile is also a New York-bred, which may attract more attention with the state's new slots-infused purses.

"I would actually hope that he is purchased by someone who wants to race him in New York, if for no other reason than, selfishly, I would kind of enjoy the opportunity to watch him run," Goichman said. "The half-brother to J'ray was sold and shipped overseas, so I haven't gotten to see him. It is nice to be able to see a horse that you bred and say, 'That's her baby.'"


Goichman admitted he will have some nerves before Monday's auction, but thinks he is bringing a standout product to the sales ring.

"He is a wonderful-looking colt," Goichman said. "But you have to be lucky. You've got to hope he vets sound, that people like him. This is a very fickle business. People can like a stallion and all of a sudden they don't--all of a sudden someone says yes or no and you don't understand it necessarily. So I'll have my fingers crossed."

Today's under-tack preview gets underway at 10 a.m.

In 1997, shortly after Hong Kong had agreed to follow Europe's example by allowing direct imports from South Africa, Alec Laird travelled to Sha Tin racecourse with his South African-bred champion London News to win the G2 QEII Cup (now Group 1).

The South African Thoroughbred industry's impact on the international stage snowballed remarkably quickly from that memorable starting point, with high profile successes being enjoyed in most parts of the racing world, none more so than in Dubai, whose International Carnival provided conditions perfectly suited to the tough, hard-knocking South African-breds.

Whilst the likes of Ipi Tombe (Manshood), Irridescence (Caesour), Jay Peg (Camden Park), Perfect Promise (Caesour), Crimson Palace (Elliodor), Lizard's Desire (Lizard Island), Gypsy's Warning (Caesour) and JJ The Jet Plane (Jet Master), to name a few, helped keep flying the South African flag, it belied the tremendous difficulties in moving these high-class athletes to their international destinations, conditions that would have put off many other horsemen. This is borne out by the dismal market share South Africa enjoys, estimated to be less than a quarter of 1% of the global horse export business. A snapshot of current export numbers reveals the following: Hong Kong, five South African-breds registered; Singapore 22; the UAE 13; the U.S. two. And, in most other racing jurisdictions, there is no South African representation at all--this despite the fact that the South African Thoroughbred racehorse trades at approximately 20% of the global average. So what's the problem?

African horse sickness (AHS). This non-contagious, vector borne virus made international headlines in the late 1950's when an outbreak occurred in the Middle East and led to the embargo on horse exports from Africa which was deemed to be infected with the disease. The exception was the USA, whose quarantine philosophy differed fundamentally from other parts of the world, and they continued to allow the importation of horses from Africa on condition they were locked up in a vector-protected facility in New York State for 60 days post arrival.

On this basis, a trickle of South African horses made their way to the USA over the next four decades, including the top class Colorado King, Bold Tropic, Hawaii, Wolf Power and eventually in 1995, arguably South Africa's greatest racehorse, the mighty Horse Chestnut (Fort Wood).

By then, however, the South African equestrian community had gathered to seriously look at the international veterinary regulations, and the process of negotiating the South African horse export protocol started. Based on the principles outlined in the prevailing OIE (World Organisation for Animal Health) AHS Code, the protocol allowed the export of horses from South Africa's AHS Free Zone in Cape Town and was ratified by the European Commission early in 1997.

The protocol required that surveillance proved that the AHS Controlled Area in the Western Cape had been free of AHS for a period of two years, that horses spend 60 days in the AHS Free Zone, the last 40 of which under vector-protected conditions, and that horses tested negative for AHS (ELISA) and various other equine diseases.

The 36-stable Kenilworth Quarantine Station was developed in 2003, and its design ensured that positive pressure was maintained throughout, the net outflow of air preventing the culicoides midge from entering the stables. A world leader in its field, Kenilworth Quarantine Station had safely quarantined close to 1,000 horses by the time of the last outbreak of AHS in the Control Area in February 2011 which, led to the automatic suspension of horse exports from South Africa, for 12 months according to the guidelines in the 2008 AHS Code (reduced from 24 months in the earlier version). **Cont. p12**

And, in the context of Southern Africa, herein lies the single biggest flaw in the protocol, its failure to recognise the seasonality of AHS. South African tourist brochures might paint a picture of glorious beaches and endless sunshine, but it belies the fact that most parts of the country are bitterly cold during the long winter months, many stations presenting temps well below freezing, typically from May to October. This effectively kills off the culicoides midge or suppresses its breeding cycle and, therefore, provides an annual, natural window where the risk of infection disappears and consequently eliminates the risk of introducing AHS to importing countries.

The OIE provides guidelines to promote trade in animals or animal products on the basis of well researched risk profiles of dangerous diseases. However, the "one size fits all" model clearly has its limitations, and individual or regional interpretation of the various Code Chapters is the only way to sensibly agree on systems that promotes healthy trade between countries.

South Africa presently finds itself in a state of nervous optimism as new veterinary regulations are being considered by the OIE, and a new diagnostic test for AHS which gives a "yes or no" answer in a couple of hours is in the final stages of development. Both platforms will enhance South Africa's ability to negotiate improved conditions for export and allow our horses the chance to participate in and enhance the sport of horseracing in other parts of the world.

Last year's suspension prevented Mike de Kock from taking his "A" Team to Dubai for this year's International Carnival. Yes, he could have shipped them via Mauritius and Europe, but the risk of a 140-day journey was too much, and the master trainer made his position quite clear after his outstanding daughter of Galileo, Igugu, had won the 2011 G1 Vodacom Durban July. From a local perspective, this meant that South African racing fans were able to enjoy Igugu's G1 J&B Met victory and many other notable performances of South Africa's current crop of outstanding talent. These included Val De Ra (Var), What A Winter (Western Winter), Variety Club (Var), Jackson (Dynasty) and Gimmethegreenlight (More Than Ready) to name a few, all of which are world-class performers in waiting.

In respect of the last mentioned, Gimmethegreenlight, is the inaugural South African invitee to qualify for the Breeders Cup "Win and You're In," and negotiations are under way to find a way to get the colt to Santa Anita in good shape. This will require USDA approval of the principles of the OIE AHS Code which would allow Gimmethegreenlight to complete his pre-export quarantine in his home environment and remain in training throughout as enjoyed by other visiting contenders. To accept anything less would be an injustice to both horse and connections.

PARX-MONMOUTH CIRCUIT A WINNER

These past few years have been dark ones for New Jersey racing, where Monmouth Park was clinging to life while the State of New Jersey and its pro-casino governor decided it wanted nothing more to do with the money-losing track. Fortunately, the New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and its leader, Dennis Drazin, came to the rescue, stepped in and assumed control of the track. The reason why this is particularly good news is that Drazin is a visionary and he understands that the status quo in horse racing is no longer acceptable.

Shortly after taking over, Drazin announced plans to convert areas of the racetrack, ones that haven't been put to good use since 40,000 people used to show up every day, to such things as restaurants, shops, a miniature golf course and an indoor water park. Those sorts of things may or may not create new racing fans, but they will bring in revenue that will support racing and purses, something a track that does not have slots has to have.

Drazin barely took a deep breath before announcing his next idea, a circuit that includes Monmouth and Parx Racing. If he can make it happen he will have helped solve one of the sport's most vexing problems while creating a superior product at two different racetracks.

There's too much racing and that's becoming a bigger issue every day. Fans hate to bet on races with cheap horses and small fields, yet too many tracks feed them a daily diet of the stuff. And it's about to get worse. The Jockey Club estimates that 22,500 thoroughbreds were born in the U.S. in 2012, down 10,000 in just four years. Without a radical reduction to the amount of racing now being run, the sport is looking at the disastrous consequences of a steady stream of three-horse races.

Normally, horsemen are opposed to the concept of less racing. At various times, Drazin himself has led the fight in New Jersey for more racing dates. Now, playing the dual role of racetrack manager and horsemen's representative, he's going to have to convince owners and trainers in Pennsylvania that less is more. It won't be easy, but it shouldn't be impossible.

Pennsylvania racing is in the midst of a crisis because Gov. Tom Corbett has said he is going to take away \$36 million a year from Thoroughbred racing that it has been receiving from racetrack slot machines. If it happens, purses are going to be cut by about 30% at Parx, which is going to do immeasurable harm to racing there.

But if Parx, a year-round racing factory, cut its racing schedule by that same 30%, purses would remain just about the same. That's because the vast majority of purse money in Pennsylvania comes from slots and not from betting, so the fewer races they run the bigger the purses will be.

Bigger purses or not, trainers and owners need a place to run their horses, and that's the beauty of Drazin's plan. If Parx and Monmouth combine forces the purses at Parx will survive the \$36 million cut and the Pennsylvania guys can run all they want at Monmouth when their track is closed. With Monmouth and Parx having two distinct horse populations to draw from, both tracks should enjoy great racing with big fields.

Monmouth will have to get the Memorial Day to Labor Day dates. A summer track in a summer-oriented community, racing works there much better in the summer than it does any other time of the year. Parx will do just fine with the rest of the year.

Circuits used to be a big part of racing, but most of them have disappeared. Create this one and everybody--horsemen, fans, track management--wins.

Why Havre de Grace Should Run in the Apple Blossom:

Larry Jones is complaining and moaning and threatening to not run Havre de Grace in the Apple Blossom because he fears the Oaklawn Park racing secretary will put too much weight on her. Jones is just doing his job as a trainer and that means playing his hand so that she gets as little weight as possible. But when it comes down to it, even if they make her carry a Steinway piano, she should run in the Apple Blossom. It's among the most prestigious races in the country for older fillies and mares and it's where a horse of Havre de Grace's stature belongs. Jones and owner Rick Porter distinguished themselves last year by never ducking a challenge with their filly, even when that meant taking on the boys or fellow star Blind Luck. That's one of the main reasons voters rewarded them with the Horse of the Year title. Don't go soft on us now. Run in the Apple Blossom.

TASK FORCE TO ADDRESS AQUEDUCT

FATALITIES Pursuant to a directive from Governor Andrew Cuomo, the New York State Racing and Wagering Board has announced the selection of four individuals who will be charged with investigating the circumstances surround the deaths of 20 horses at Aqueduct Racetrack between December 2011 and Mar. 18, 2012. The group, named the New York Task Force on Racehorse Health and Safety, consists of former jockey and current racing commentator Jerry Bailey, Alan Foreman, chairman and CEO of the Thoroughbred Horsemen’s Association (THA); Dr. Scott E. Palmer of the New Jersey Equine Clinic, with 30 years of practice and Dr. Mary Scollay, equine medical director for the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission who piloted an injury reporting program which eventually became The Jockey Club’s Equine Injury Database. “We have assembled an outstanding panel of industry experts, who will conduct a fair and objective investigation to determine if there is a definitive cause for the increase in the number of catastrophic breakdowns at Aqueduct this winter,” commented Richard Violette Jr., president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen’s Association. “We trust they will analyze all data meticulously, and New York’s horsemen will give our whole-hearted support to this initiative. No one has more vested interest in protecting our horses and our jockeys to the very best of everyone’s abilities than the 5,000 members of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen’s Association. “In addition to analyzing the Aqueduct inner-dirt surface, the group will review and advise on policies relating to public disclosures, necropsies, track condition and pre-race examination of horses. They will also examine claiming and veterinary procedures as well as equine drug use. Added NYSRWB Chairman John Sabini, “This team of renowned experts has the knowledge, experience and objectivity to shine a light on the causes behind these tragic breakdowns. I’m confident that their findings will help improve the safety and well-being of equine athletes racing in New York.”
