BAFFERT 'UP' AND 'AWAY' IN SUN DERBY

Trainer Bob Baffert has never been afraid to prep for Kentucky's Classics in the southeast corner of New Mexico, and this year sends his strongest-ever contingent to Sunland Park. In addition to shipping in the **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★** Princess Arabella (Any Given Saturday) for the Sunland Park Oaks (p1 ATW), he is represented by a pair of improving colts in the \$800,000 GIII Sunland Derby. It took Team Coolmore's **Castaway** (Street Sense) six tries to break his maiden, but after a stylish graduation over a wet-fast Santa Anita strip in his second two-turn start Jan. 21, he showed that he was just a horse that needed some time to develop with a comprehensive 3 3/4-length tally in the GIII Southwest S. at Oaklawn Feb. 20. Baffert also saddles Robert LaPenta's **Stirred Up** (Lemon Drop Kid). As a \$420,000 KEESEP yearling he was the top-priced yearling of his sire's 2009 crop, and Stirred Up made a good impression at first asking, rallying from well back to finish second sprinting seven panels at Santa Anita Jan. 29. **Cont. p4**

privately thereafter and shipped to the U.S., the bay reported home a close fourth in his dirt debut at Gulfstream Feb. 4, then earned his diploma in Hallandale Mar. 3. Attempting to punch his ticket to Louisville here, the Triple Crown nominee raced within striking distance

along the inside as Heavy Breathing was hounded through early fractions of :23.10 and :46.98. With Johnny Velazquez aboard, Went the Day Well was shifted out three wide on the turn for home, hit the front at the head of affairs, and leveled out nicely late for a smooth success. "I was very impressed with him," trainer Graham Motion said. "Apart from a little greenness, he couldn't have been better. When Animal Kingdom won this race last year, he was very explosive, but this horse was a little explosive, too. I hate to compare the two because they are such different horses." Motion continued, "The beauty of [the timing of] this race is you have the option to run him one more time or not run more time. Probably the only option is the [Gill Coolmore] Lexington S. [at Keeneland Apr. 21]. I feel confident telling you this horse will run in the Kentucky Derby." Velazquez, who also partnered with Animal Kingdom in the Run for Roses, added, "When he got to the lead he started waiting and lugging in, and then [he switched leads and] just went on. He still doesn't know very much. You can tell; as soon as he pulled out at the quarter pole and he found himself on the lead, he didn't know what to do. So I just encouraged him to keep going forward. He did everything great today."

Union Rags Gearing Up...

Chadds Ford Stable's **Union Rags** (Dixie Union), a dazzling four-length winner of the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 26, tuned up for next weekend's GI Florida Derby with a four-furlong move in :49.10 at Palm Meadows Saturday. Assistant trainer/exercise rider Peter Brett was in the irons. "He did it the right way," trainer Michael Matz commented. "He went out with a set that worked, and Peter just sat behind them. I just wanted to have something for him to point at." Matz continued, "I think he should take a step forward from [the Fountain of Youth]. It didn't look like he had to give everything he had. I would hope that having a race under his belt would help him for the Florida Derby."

Take Charge Indy (A.P. Indy), second to El Padrino (Pulpit) in a salty optional claimer at Gulfstream Jan. 29, also tuned up for the Florida Derby with a five-furlong breeze in 1:01.57 at Palm Meadows. He was scratched from the GII Tampa Bay Derby in favor of the Gulfstream centerpiece. "It was a good maintenance work," trainer Pat Byrne said of the Chuck and Maribeth Sanford colorbearer. "He's ready to go. We know it will be a tough race. Union Rags is a very good horse. I'm actually a little surprised they've got six horses likely to run against him."

Fountain of Youth runner-up **News Pending** (Harlan's Holiday) was also on the worktab yesterday, stopping the clock for five furlongs in 1:02.90 at Gulfstream. "It was slow but good," trainer Dale Romans said of the Florida Derby contender's breeze. "It was a perfect work." He is owned by Klaravich Stables Inc. and William H. Lawrence.

Newsdad, just a nose short of Simmard in the GII Mac Diarmida S. last time Feb. 26, took another step forward to collect his first stakes victory here. Heavily favored in this scratched-down affair, last year's GIII Palm Beach S. third-place finisher was under a tight hold early before beginning to settle through a half mile in :49.05. With Julien Leparoux aboard, the dark bay began to rev up three wide on the turn for home, hit the front at the top of the stretch and kept on finding more down the lane. "It's definitely tougher to ride in these types of races with short fields--especially from the rail with the 3-5 favorite," Leparoux revealed. "You pretty much have two options. You can either go and try to clear on the lead or take back. I was able to make a little bit of a move pretty early on to get in the clear and from there it was perfect. He made a run around the far turn and finished good." Newsdad, fourth in the 2011 GI Blue Grass S. and GII Virginia Derby, has started to put it all together since receiving a freshening following a sixth-place finish in the GI Secretariat S. at Arlington Park Aug. 13. He posted a runaway Keeneland allowance win over the Polytrack in October, then was sixth in a grassy allowance at Churchill Nov. 10. A rallying third over the Gulfstream lawn Dec. 31, the James Karp homebred followed with a 6 3/4-length tally in an optional claimer over that course Jan. 28.

Dynamic Host completed a six-race journey from claimer to graded winner with a long-winded score here. The stoutly bred gelding was haltered away from trainer Genaro Vallejo for \$40,000 out a winning effort facing Del Mar optional claimers going 11 furlongs on the grass last August. His new connections evidently had distance in mind, too, as he was stepped up in company for the 10-furlong GII Clement Hirsch S. on the turf at Santa Anita Oct. 2. He ran much better than his 40-1 odds that day, finishing fifth to subsequent champion older male Acclamation (Unusual Heat) by five lengths, and followed up with three solid efforts when returned to optional claiming company. He ran a close-up second going nine furlongs over Hollywood's Cushion Track Nov. 17, was third in a 1 1/16-mile event Dec. 15, then returned to the sod to be third once again in a 10-furlong test at Santa Anita Jan. 27. Looking for his first dirt win while tackling more ground than ever before, he caboozed the field into the first turn as the leaders cut out relatively quick :47.72 and 1:12.55 fractions. Dynamic Host began to make up ground on the far outside as the field bunched together, hooked Skipshot nearing the quarter pole and, after putting that one away, staved off Dhammer to win under jockey David Flores. "The horse showed a lot of heart," said winning trainer Art Sherman. "He could go either way [in his next start, grass or dirt]. We could take a look at the GII San Juan [Capistrano at about 1 3/4 miles on turf] the last day here [Apr. 22]. I'll see how he comes out of the race and how he's training."

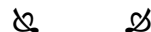

"We could think about the [Apr. 19] G3 Earl of Sefton S. over nine furlongs at Newmarket or the [Apr. 27] G2 Sandown Mile, but, as he's gotten older, he's developed a real aversion to soft ground," trainer Chris Wall said.

Last year's GI American Oaks dead-heater **Cambina (Ire)** (Hawk Wing) gets some more ground to work with in today's GII Santa Ana S. at Santa Anita, but will she get any pace to run into? That, ultimately, will be Garrett Gomez's problem, as the returning rider partners just one of several in with a big chance in the nine-furlong turf event. Cambina missed the board in her next three after the American Oaks, but she was far from disgraced in those, including an eighth-place effort in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf that saw her just three lengths adrift of upsetter Perfect Shirl (Perfect Soul {Ire}). In her return to the races, she closed from dead last to be fifth, beaten 1 1/4 lengths, in the one-mile GII Buena Vista H. Feb. 20, and now returns to the course and distance of her win in last April's GII Providencia S. The Simon Callaghan-trained **Camelia Rose (Fr)** (Oratorio {Ire}) figures to sit a good trip under Joel Rosario. The bay was never far back in her U.S. debut, a grassy nine-furlong NW2X here Mar. 1, and just missed by a nose after traffic in the lane. **City to City** (City Zip) comes off a rallying win in the Buena Vista, while **Bauble Queen** (Arch) makes her first start since a career-best win in the GII Robert J. Frankel S. over this trip Jan. 1.

"It was her first three-eighths work, and we're really excited," Sadler said. "Hopefully, the next time you're writing about her will be before the Breeders' Cup here in November." Now four, Zazu won last year's GI Las Virgenes S. and GI Lady's Secret S. at Santa Anita. Two weeks after winning the latter in early October, the gray exited a work with a shoulder inflammation and was forced to miss an intended engagement in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic.

Sadler also talked about another exciting gray in the form of **Holy Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}), who was tabbed a **"TDN Rising Star"** after an eye-catching 3 1/2-length win in a one-mile maiden at Santa Anita Friday ([video](#)). The conditioner remained non-committal about where the 3-year-old might appear next, but confirmed the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 7 as a possibility. "He's just a young horse with three races [before Friday's maiden win] who was very impressive," Sadler said. "Nothing is set in stone, but we're looking at everything."

New York Invasion of Florida...

With the imminent arrival of slots at Aqueduct last year, pinhookers took note and took stock of New York-breds eligible to compete for the state's historic purses. The result is evident at Fasig-Tipton, where of the 167 horses catalogued to Monday's sale, 17 are New York-breds. That is up from 10 in 2011 and six in both 2010 and 2009.

Dave Scanlon's Scanlon Training Center will send two New York-breds through the Fasig sale's ring. [Hip 62](#), a colt by War Pass, was a \$72,000 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic September yearling, while [hip 70](#) is a son of freshman sire Street Boss, purchased by Scanlon for \$258,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton New York-bred sale.

"[Buying New York-breds] was by design," Scanlon said yesterday. "Hearing what was going on in New York during the year, we focused in on some New York-breds. We think they should be the flavor right now."

He added that the plan is working so far. "I think they have proven popular so far, just with people coming around--everybody knows how good the purses are. They say, 'Hey, it's a New York-bred.' So it's a little bonus."

For pinhooker Nick de Meric, the decision to invest in New York-breds was a no-brainer.

TDN Q&A

With the opening of the Resorts World Casino at Aqueduct Racetrack late last year, the dreams of the New York racing community through a decade of delays and unfulfilled promises started to become reality. Horsemen have already begun to reap the benefits in the form of dramatically higher purse money and plans for capital improvements at the tracks. Even the weather gods have shined on the Empire State, harkening an earlier-than-normal return to grass racing. With the biggest weekend of spring racing at Aqueduct a couple of weeks away, Charles Hayward, CEO of the New York Racing Association, took

time out of his busy schedule for a brief Q&A session with the TDN.

time out of his busy schedule for a brief Q&A session with the TDN.

TDN: *What do you see as being the net impact of the Aqueduct casino on racing operations on the NYRA circuit and the state of New York at large?*

CH: When it was clear that Genting was signed on and that the casino was going to open by the end of 2011, the New York-bred yearling prices in 2011 had an increase of 46% and the median price was up 67%. Two-year-olds in training, the average there rose 21% and the median 25%, all very positive indicators. The New York breeders awards, which are the monies paid to breeders and owners for horses that win and win in open company as well, that fund is going to increase from \$10 million to \$20 million, so that's going to help the breeders who have been in a tough spot. So, that's all very optimistic. As you know, there have been many Kentucky outfits that have moved some operations to New York. For example, Frank Stronach has sent some stallions to Joe McMahan's farm, Darley has brought a stallion to New York (Girolamo) and he's been booked to 120 mares, so obviously there's a lot of excitement on the breeding side of things. Obviously, it's going to be a few years before those horses race as 2-year-olds, so our foal crop is going to go decline in the short term, but there's a significant reversal going forward.

TDN: *How have the numbers looked on the racing side?*

CH: We started off 2012 very strongly. During the month of January, we were about flat on handle, but January is kind of tough getting going--the weather isn't great--though we had four cancellations in 2011 and just one this year. But daily handle has gone up nicely.

One interesting number that we look at is that we have 12 trainers who made zero starts over the winter in 2011 who made over 10 starts this year, guys like Dale Romans, Eddie Kenneally and Jason Servis. Bill Mott never had horses here over the winter, Jimmy Jerkens left some horses here for the winter and Steve Klesaris on ship-ins made several starts, so there's no doubt that the purses have enhanced their participation. As far as the purse numbers go, on a daily average, we had projected Aqueduct purses to be up about 36%--they're actually up a little over 40% on a daily average basis. We see a number of horses coming back now. On the racing side, we were obviously able to get Hansen here for [the Gill Gotham S.]. It was a strong field and we were thrilled about that. It used to be that once the Cigar Mile was done on Thanksgiving weekend, we went all the way to the Gotham without much excitement, so doing something like adding in the Withers and the Count Fleet before that helped generate some enthusiasm and we have the Wood Memorial coming up. Alpha won the Withers and is now coming back for the Wood, so we're going to have had plenty of legitimate 3-year-olds coming through New York.

TDN: *Is there any indication that the casino is cannibalizing business away from the racing product?*

CH: I know of a few instances where a husband and wife came out here with a couple of kids, for example, and the father and the kids stayed on the racing side and the mother went and played the slots for a couple of hours. I know there was some discussion that when the slots came in that it was going to cannibalize us by a certain percentage, but we haven't seen that whatsoever.

TDN: *Do you have any comment on the reports that Genting has a broader plan to build a convention center on the premises, calling winter racing into question?*

CH: We haven't seen a plan as yet, but what I can say is that Genting has been a very good neighbor, if you will. Most companies that build casinos at racetracks--you can't find the racetrack from the casino, but on both their first and second floors, they built big patios with a lot of glass from inside, so you can actually stand inside the casino and watch the races. On the big days, there are probably 300 or 400 people out on the patios to watch the races, so that's pretty cool. As we know from history, there's not a lot of crossover from slots players, because that's one type of gambling versus another, but there is always a buzz of activity in the building, a lot more excitement. Genting has been great, and we'll see what might happen with the convention center. It's important to have winter racing and we want to assure our horsemen that it's going to continue.

TDN: *Can you talk about what types of capital improvements might be in the works and when changes might be seen?*

CH: We have some different timelines. We had no money to spend before Aqueduct opened, which was unfortunate, because we would have liked to do that. We are going to put \$3-\$5 million into some cosmetic things (TVs, paint, new carrels, etc.) in the building and we are going to spend another \$5 million to build what we would call a state-of-the-art simulcast center, which will be called Longshots and will operate year-round. Genting is actually going to pay to build it out since we gave them more space than what was allocated in the lease. That's just another indication of how good a partner they've been. We've got a significant capital expansion program that's in the works at Saratoga. Not much is going to be done this year, as it's in the planning stages, and we've got \$3 to \$5 million in capital expansion for Belmont as well. We're hoping to build out the first of many new dormitories at Belmont and do that by the end of the year.

TDN: *A few months ago it was learned that NYRA had essentially been 'overcharging' its customers by not adjusting the takeout on certain wagers. Has there been any negative residual impact?*

CH: It was a really unfortunate situation. What happened was, when we got the new franchise in 2008, the legislature increased the takeout rates across the board on win/place/show, which is one category, two-horse bets, which is another category, exotics and pick six. They were all moved up a point. We have ranges of takeouts in each of those areas, but unfortunately, with exotics, it was a range of 15 to 25% and it went up to 26%. We knew the bill was sunsetting, but no one knew that the bill had taken it out of the range. Unfortunately, the takeout rate ended up not matching the law. We did two things. At some point, the total 'overcharge' was \$9 million, but only \$1.2 million of that was with NYRA's customers, either on track or NYRA Rewards. Of that \$1.2 million, we've identified \$400,000 of it through NYRA rewards and are in the process of refunding that. Another \$100,000 is identifiable through tax forms. We can't identify the other customers. We took that 26% and took it down, not back to 25%, but to 24%. Within the year, customers will be repaid through lower takeout. No one was defrauded, but unfortunately it didn't comply with the law. We've accepted responsibility for it and hopefully we can move on.

TDN: *Recently you released the stakes schedule and purse structure for Belmont and Saratoga. You must be feeling very positive about the announcement.*

CH: We are very excited about the purse structure. The maidens at Belmont are going up to \$70,000 and \$75,000 at Saratoga. We have reduced the low end of the claiming ranks. We're taking the bottom up to \$10,000 Apr. 4 and bottom-level claiming at Belmont will be \$14,000 and \$20,000 at Saratoga. We're very excited about the numbers. Last year at Saratoga, we were at \$670,000 a day and that was highest in the country. This year we're going to be a little over \$900,000.

TDN: *Switching gears a bit, how do you feel about the Task Force which has been appointed to investigate the recent breakdowns over the inner track?*

CH: We are extremely pleased with the panel members-- they are all very qualified people. We have two very accomplished veterinarians. Alan Foreman has been involved with horsemen's issues for many years and Jerry Bailey has remained in the game on the broadcasting side. My understanding is that they're going to be drawing on other experts, racing surface experts and other vets. We were most recently certified by the safety and integrity committee in November, so we are turning over their comprehensive report to them. It goes through racing surfaces, veterinary protocols and jockey protocols. We are going to be as helpful and as transparent as they would like it to be.

TDN: *Is there anything else you'd like to add?*

CH: Well, because of the mild weather, we were able to add a couple of extras to the Wednesday overnight, and we will be on the turf for the first time this coming Wednesday. It's always exciting to be on the turf and we're thrilled to be able to do it so early. It's a great turf course, but we don't have a lot of time to use it in the spring, so it's wonderful to get on it so early.

BIG TEST FOR 'ARABELLA' IN SUNLAND OAKS

There might not be a more exciting 3-year-old prospect in the country right now than Peachtree Stable's **"TDN Rising Star" Princess Arabella** (Any Given Saturday). The chestnut, trained by Bob Baffert, earned that designation when she overcame a dawdling start to capture a six-furlong maiden event at Santa Anita on New Year's Even in 1:08 2/5. She won the race by 3 1/2 lengths, and matched that margin with a

similarly impressive score going seven panels against first-level allowance foes Feb. 12. By looks and by pedigree, however, it would seem that routing is what Princess Arabella was meant to do. Last year, the Peachtree/Baffert team used Plum Pretty (Medaglia d'Oro)'s 25-length romp in this event as a springboard to victory in the GI Kentucky Oaks. Stonestreet Stable's **Glinda The Good** (Hard Spun) faced some good fillies last October, running second to Grace Hall (Empire Maker) in the Blue Hen S. at Delaware before a third to On Fire Baby (Smoke Glacken) in the GII Pocahontas S. at Churchill. A well-beaten sixth to the latter in the GII Golden Rod S. under the Twin Spires in November, she opened her season with a win in the local Island Fashion S. at a mile Feb. 26.

FORMER HOLLYWOOD PARK CHAIRWOMAN MARJE EVERETT DIES AT 90 Edited press release

Marje Everett, the longtime chairwoman of Hollywood Park and a major force in Southern California racing, died Friday morning at her West Los Angeles home. She was 90. A native New Yorker, Everett, who grew up in a racing family--her father Benjamin Lindheimer owned Arlington Park and the now defunct Washington Park in Illinois--spent a great portion of her adult life in racetrack management. She took over as chairwoman at both Arlington and Washington following her father's death in 1960. After leaving Illinois and selling her interest in both tracks, Everett came to California, acquiring stock in Hollywood Park, eventually joining management. She was on the board of directors from 1972-1991 and served as chairman, chief executive officer and president of the track from 1985-1991. She resigned after losing a proxy fight to R.D. Hubbard. During her tenure, Hollywood Park twice hosted the Breeders' Cup--including the inaugural event in 1984--and began what is now the Pick 6 in 1983. "She was certainly an important part of racing in California for a long period of time," said Hollywood Park General Manager Eual Wyatt, Jr., who worked as racing secretary for more than 15 years under Everett. "She was very sincere about her love for racing. She tried to do everything in the best interest of both patrons and horsemen. She tried to look out for everyone." Retired Hall of Fame jockey Laffit Pincay, Jr. said he last spoke to her about two weeks ago. "She was one of my closest friends," he said. "She was always very good to me and was very close to my first wife [Linda] and my children. The thing I admired about her was her love of racing. She always wanted the best for racing. The last time I saw her was about two months ago, and we had a really good conversation." In addition to her career in management, Everett also was a horse owner. The best of her Thoroughbreds was 1975 Charles H. Strub S. and Santa Anita H. winner Stardust Mel. Trained by Charlie Whittingham, Stardust Mel was ridden by Bill Shoemaker, another of her very close friends. Services for Everett are pending.

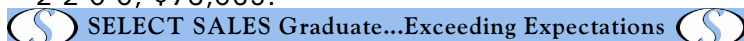
