**NYS APPROVES CLAIMING RULE CHANGE**

An unusually high number of fatal injuries on the inner dirt track at Aqueduct Racetrack led to an emergency rule change approved by the New York State Racing and Wagering Board Monday that voids claims made on horses that die during races or are euthanized on the track after races.

The 90-day amendment takes effect immediately at all Thoroughbred and harness tracks in the state. It may be renewed if the board proposes a new rule. Previously, the owner making the claim assumed all risk once the gates opened at the start of a race.

The 21 deaths that occurred--primarily in claiming races--during the inner track meet (Nov. 30, 2011 to Mar. 18, 2012) prompted the action by the board at a special meeting. Meanwhile, a panel of racing

experts appointed by the board in March is examining the flurry of fatal injuries.

Racing and Wagering Board Chairman John Sabini said that the sharp increase in purses in New York in 2012 from revenue from the Resorts World Casino New York at Aqueduct has changed the claiming race business at the track. Sabini said that the higher purses and have led to larger fields and more claims, possibly creating an environment in which horsemen are more willing to enter at-risk horses who could suffer injuries that produce life-threatening situations for both equine and human participants.

"The time to talk is over," Sabini said. "I believe that this emergency measure is the first step. It's not the last step. Far from it. There needs to be more done. This is something that we have talked about for a long and it's time that we need to give it a try and see if we can make things better."

In a letter to the board, New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association president Richard Violette Jr. said his organization supported the concept, but noted that "the devil is in the details." Violette asked that it be tabled until the panel makes its report because it forces the examining veterinarian to make decisions on whether to euthanize a horse without being able to use diagnostic tools like x-rays and ultrasounds. **Cont. p3**

**FRANKEL EYES RETURN IN LOCKINGE**

Sir Henry Cecil appeared to rule out a trip to the Breeders' Cup with **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) at a press conference in London yesterday. While providing another positive bulletin on the unbeaten Juddmonte star, the Warren Place trainer is looking at concluding the colt's career at Ascot's Champions Day. "The Breeders' Cup is not ruled out completely, but I'd think it would be a second thought at the moment," he said. "It's a very long way to go until the Breeders' Cup. There is Ascot, and the horse should hopefully stand in Europe. He's a grass horse and there's a very good chance he'll be retired at the end of the year. Why go over to America in November on unknown territory? Everything might not suit, but time will tell and it might come back into the equation." Frankel is set to have a racecourse gallop during Newbury's Greenham S. meeting later this month ahead of his comeback in the G1 Lockinge S. there May 19. "He has wintered well, and I've got to put work into him now because he gets too fresh," Cecil added. "I hope he'll start off in the Lockinge at Newbury, but there is a long time until then, and I've asked permission to give him a racecourse gallop at Newbury and for him to stay the night. After that, he'll tell me what to do and everything is open. There is Ascot and the Prince of Wales or the Queen Anne, going a mile in the Sussex S., or the Eclipse and the Juddmonte [International]."

**NYS Approves Claiming Rule Change..cont. from p1**

“The way the rule is written, what is best for the horse is in second-place here; it kind of puts forth what is best for the new owner,” Violette said in an interview. “While we should consider that, what is best for horse has to remain first and foremost.”

The American Association of Equine Practitioners proposed in 2009 that rules be changed to allow claims to be voided due to deaths in races or after a horse is euthanized on the track. California adopted the rule in 2011.

Sabini said he looks forward to the panel's report, but that the board had to deal with a pressing problem. “The goal and the practice here will not be to euthanize the horse if there are questions, but rather to disincentivize putting a horse at risk into a claiming race,” he said. “That’s what we seek to do here, to preserve the horse population and to preserve the riding population who risk life and limb being on what might be a compromised horse put into a claiming race.”

# Triple Threats

## Prospective Pointed toward Blue Grass...

John Oxley's **Prospective** (Malibu Moon), winner of the Mar. 10 GI Tampa Bay Derby, breezed five furlongs in 1:01.20 over a fast track at Churchill Downs Monday morning. The \$250,000 FTSAUG yearling purchase has been tabbed to have his final prep for the May 5 GI Kentucky Derby in Keeneland's GI Blue Grass S. Apr. 14.

"We are going to run Prospective in the Blue Grass rather than the [GI] Wood

[Memorial at Aqueduct Apr. 7], so he can run out of his own stall," said Norman Casse, assistant trainer to his father, Mark. "He'll ship from Churchill the morning of the [Blue Grass]. It worked out well for him when he shipped from Palm Meadows to Tampa [Bay Downs] the morning of the Tampa Bay Derby." With regular exercise rider Melanie Giddings in the irons, Prospective, who came onto the track shortly after the renovation break at 8:30 a.m., recorded fractions of :14.60, :27.20 and :39.40 before completing the final quarter mile in :21.80. "We were looking to go about 1:01 and that's what he did," Casse said. "I'm a little disappointed with how slow they went for the first eighth of a mile, but they finished up strongly and Prospective galloped out very nice. He continues to show how much he likes this racetrack." Casse confirmed that Prospective will have his final work in preparation for the Blue Grass at Churchill Apr. 8.

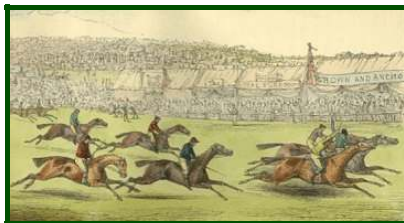

# Classic Corner

## Top Offer Nears Test...

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Top Offer (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) is being aimed at the G3 Greenham S. at Newbury, trainer Roger Charlton announced yesterday. Off since his impressive winning debut at that venue in August, Khalid Abdullah's homebred will bid to underline his 2000 Guineas credentials in that seven-furlong prep Apr. 21. "He looks well and is a very good-moving horse, so I'm not particularly concerned about the current firm ground, but the training is starting to get a bit restrictive with the drought conditions," Charlton said. "His preparations have gone well, but it's worth bearing in mind that, although he is a good-looking, impressive horse, he has won a maiden race and there has to be massive improvement. It was unfortunate he got injured last year and was unable to contest a conditions race, as if he had won one he'd have ended up in a group race and he'd know more and I'd know more. At the moment we're still in the dark, so it would be a mistake to ramp a horse up mentally and work-wise just to get him to the Greenham fitter than anything else. He'll come when he's ready, and if he's ready for the Greenham he'll run there, and if not we'll find something else. But it's so far, so good. He wouldn't go straight to the Guineas--he'd need to run in a trial and come out of the trial well. It's a long season, and I try not to screw things up by forcing things if they're not quite ready."

## RACETRACK ROUND-UP

### Cityscape Options Open...

Trainer Roger Charlton is weighing the potential targets for Saturday's impressive G1 Dubai Duty Free hero **Cityscape (GB)** (Selkirk). Following the 4 1/4-length success of Khalid Abdullah's 6-year-old at Meydan, connections are looking at the international calendar. "I was very bullish about him before the race, as he has been training really well and looked magnificent and has developed into a seasoned traveller," Charlton commented. "He eats well and takes everything well, but it's difficult to expect to win a \$2 million race against lots of previous Group 1 winners. To break the track record and win like that was really nice. He deserves to win a Group 1 race and he's got better as he's got older--he's a very tough horse. I believe the sectional times in that race were phenomenal, so the fact that he was able to quicken off a fast pace and then idle in front makes it an even more commendable performance."

He continued, "He relaxes very well in his races, and 10 furlongs is now definitely worth trying, and you wouldn't shirk a mile if it was suitable. It's a case of what we do and where we go, but the important thing is that, although he's a very good mover, I'd never run him at an undulating track. We will stick to level tracks--a lot of the man-made tracks like Meydan and Hong Kong are wonderful galloping tracks, and it's the same with Woodbine. There is a big race in Singapore that could come into the melting pot, but also perhaps the G1 Prix d'Ispahan over nine furlongs at Longchamp will be considered."

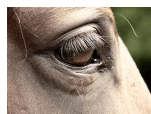

The horse thrived in the sunshine of Dubai and was actually pleasing me a lot more the closer we got to the race, but we got a bit of a kick in the teeth when we drew the 16 stall, and then Lady Luck dealt us another blow in the gates, so it all became a non-event."

The nearest he came to landing the Derby was when Aptitude chased home Fusaichi Pegasus in 2000, and there have been Derby setbacks such as Pulpit (fourth in 1997), Stephen Got Even (14th when one of the leading fancies in 1999), A P Valentine (who went on to be second in the Preakness and Belmont), Friends Lake (15th after winning the Florida Derby) and Friesan Fire (last but one when favorite in 2009).

Perhaps this record reflects the fact that fillies outnumber the colts by 14 to 11

among A.P. Indy's first 25 American Grace I winners, with the 14 fillies including two winners each of the Kentucky Oaks, Mother Goose S. and Coaching Club American Oaks.

The question now is whether A.P Indy's Derby drought can be ended by his latest Grade I winner, Take Charge Indy, a forceful winner of the Florida Derby. In overshadowing Union Rags and El Padrino at Gulfstream, the colt collected \$600,000, which is quite some prize for a colt who failed to sell for \$80,000 as a yearling.

Take Charge Indy's win might have been something of a surprise, but there is no questioning the quality of his bloodlines, or his ability to stay the extra furlong of the Derby (as long as he doesn't get caught up in an early speed duel at Churchill Downs). With A.P. Indy as his sire and a top-class grand daughter of Deputy Minister as his dam, he represents a very popular and successful cross.

A.P. Indy has 28 foals of racing age out of Deputy Minister mares and as many as seven of them (25%) are stakes winners. The most famous of the seven is undoubtedly Rags To Riches, the Kentucky Oaks winner who just got the better of Curlin in the Belmont S. Others are Telling (twice winner of the GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. over a mile and a half) and Serenading (GII Falls City H. over a mile and an eighth). Inevitably A.P. Indy's sons have been given every chance with Deputy Minister mares, and so far we've seen Bernardini sire the GI Cigar Mile winner To Honor and Serve, while Mineshaft and Old Trieste have both sired Grade II winners. His grandsons Tapit and Sky Mesa also have graded winners out of Deputy Minister mares.

Telling is relevant here, as this smart turf horse has a second dam by Secretariat, and is therefore inbred 3x3 to the 1973 Triple Crown winner. Take Charge Indy is out of a mare by Dehere, a champion 2-year-old sired by Deputy Minister from a Secretariat mare. The Florida Derby winner is therefore inbred 3x4 to Secretariat and has three lines of Bold Ruler. Other good A.P. Indy colts with Secretariat inbreeding include Majestic Warrior (3x4), Master Command (3x3) and Jump Start (3x4).

Remarkably, A.P. Indy's five foals of racing age out of daughters of Dehere feature three stakes winners (60%). In addition to Take Charge Indy, they include Friesan Fire, the 2009 Louisiana Derby winner whose career rather fell apart following his Kentucky Derby flop, and Vaulcluse, an unbeaten minor stakes winner. A.P. Indy's son Pulpit numbers the Grade II winner Oratory among his two foals out of Dehere mares, so this A.P. Indy/Dehere cross appears to be worthy of further exploration.

Perhaps I should point out that the dams of Friesan Fire and Take Charge Indy weren't just any old daughters of Dehere. Friesan Fire's dam Bollinger was a Group 1 winner over just short of a mile in Australia, whereas Take Charge Indy is out of Take Charge Lady. This popular filly over-achieved to such an extent that this \$175,000 yearling sold for no less than \$4.2 million as a 5-year-old, in foal to Seeking the Gold.

In a three-year career, she won half of her 22 starts and was second in another seven. Starting with an Experimental Free Handicap rating of 115 after winning three of her five juvenile starts, the 3-year-old Take Charge Lady achieved a figure of 116 on the 2002 International Classifications, followed by 115 in 2003. Clearly she was a model of consistency and her efforts brought in nearly \$2.5 million. She twice won the GI Spinster S. over a mile and an eighth, so a mile and a quarter shouldn't be a problem for her son by a Belmont S. winner.

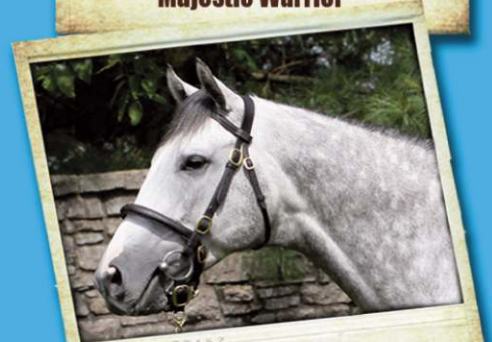
# The bargains of 2012...

It's getting more and more difficult to find **\$10,000** stallions in Kentucky, and Ashford's three each has a good case: **Majestic Warrior** was a Grade I winner at two, by A.P. Indy from a top Steinbrenner family; **Dunkirk** was a Classic-placed saletopper by Unbridled's Song; and **Munnings** was a dual Grade II winner (and placed in six Grade I's) sprinting, by Speightstown.

Unfortunately, we never discovered the full extent of Dehere's stamina. What we knew for sure was that he was a very talented and precocious juvenile. He owed his Eclipse Award to five wins from seven starts at two, when he became the first horse for a very long time to complete Saratoga's graded stakes treble of the GII Saratoga Special, GIII Sanford S. and GI Hopeful S. He also took the GI Champagne S. by four lengths.

Dehere looked to be well on the way to the Kentucky Derby when he defeated Go For Gin, Ride The Rails and Holy Bull in the GII Fountain of Youth S. over 1 1/16 miles, but his career was ended soon afterwards when he fractured a cannon bone. With Deputy Minister as his sire and daughters of Secretariat and Damascus as his first two dams, the Derby distance shouldn't have been too big an ask for him.

Dehere did a lot of travelling as a stallion and, arguably, was never in one place long enough to establish himself fully. After making a slow start in five seasons in Kentucky, he was transferred to Japan for six seasons, starting in 2000. He also shuttled fairly consistently to Australia, both from the U.S. and Japan, but the likes of Take Charge Lady, Graeme Hall, Soto and Belle of Perintown earned him a return to Ashford for four seasons, starting in 2006. He was then sold to Turkey at the start of 2010.

Dehere's daughters have produced good winners in several countries. Their best previous winner in the U.S. was undoubtedly champion sprinter Midnight Lute, but their Australian winners include two Group 1 winners at around a mile and a half in Rebel Raider (Victoria Derby) and Kidnapped (South Australian Derby).

On balance I would say that there is probably a little more speed than stamina in Take Charge Indy's female line. His second dam Felicita is an unraced daughter of the champion sprinter Rubiano, who was a Grade I winner at up to a mile. Felicita's Lear Fan filly Eventail was a stakes winner over a mile and an eighth, a trip which was also within the compass of Felicita's stakes-winning son Commendation. Eventail is now the dam of Straight Story, a Grade II-winning son of Giant's Causeway who has run well at up to 1 3/8 miles.

Felicita's dam, Grand Bonheur, produced two quite speedy performers in England to sons of Northern Dancer. Her Nureyev colt Zarbyev won at up to a mile before being returned to the U.S. and her Northern Baby colt Northern Tryst was third in the Middle Park S. Grand Bonheur did her winning at six furlongs and she also ranks as the second dam of the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint winner Chamberlain Bridge.

No wonder Take Charge Indy has plenty of speed at his disposal, but I am hopeful the Florida Derby winner will be able to carry his speed a bit further.

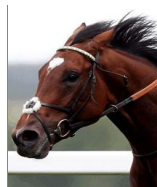
