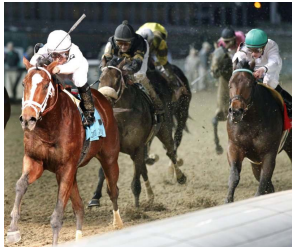


A REAL GEM

"After the Kentucky Jockey Club, we decided to plan on a similar program to what we did with Super Saver, which was two prep races prior to the Kentucky Derby," Pletcher revealed. "With another good performance, some good racing luck, and some graded earnings, he could be in a good spot." **Cont. p3**

LOADED SIX PACK FOR CARTER

Any one of the six entered in today's GI Carter H. appear to have a fighting chance, including Godolphin's lightly raced **Emcee** (Unbridled's Song). An impressive debut winner at Belmont last September, the dark bay fired fresh off the bench with an eye-catching six-length allowance win at Gulfstream Feb. 3. The 4-year-old battled on gamely to place a close third behind **Calibrachoa** (Southern Image) and **Caleb's Posse** (Posse) in a quickly run edition of the GI Tom Fool H. going a furlong shorter Mar. 3 ([video](#)). "Look at his form, he's a top horse," trainer Kieran McLaughlin said. "Yes, we have a lot of confidence, and he's a really nice horse. Hopefully, he can win it and stamp himself as a stallion." **Cont. p6**

CAUSE AND EFFECT

Creative Cause (Giant's Causeway) will be a deserving favorite in today's \$1-million GI Santa Anita Derby. Coming off a win in the GI San Felipe S. Mar. 10, the **"TDN Rising Star"** should be able to save ground from his rail post, and trainer Mike Harrington has opted to take the blinkers off his stable star while keeping his eye on the first Saturday in May. "I said all along it's a progression," Harrington explained, "and the only thing I hope is that he doesn't peak in the Santa Anita Derby instead of the Kentucky Derby."

Holy Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}) finally put it all together in his fourth start Mar. 23 ([video](#)), but his connections will make a game-day call as to whether he makes it into the starting gate here. "We won't decide until Saturday morning," Sadler said Thursday afternoon. "We're also looking at the Arkansas Derby and the Blue Grass [Apr. 14]. We'll have a conference call Saturday and make up our mind. What if he went back East and didn't get in?"

It wouldn't be the Santa Anita Derby without Bob Baffert, and the trainer's recovery from a heart attack suffered last week would be boosted immensely if one of his three entrants here could give him a seventh victory. **Liaison** (Indian Charlie) has disappointed in two starts since capturing the GI CashCall Futurity in December, most recently finishing fourth in the San Felipe. Baffert will also be represented by **Blueskiesrainbows** (English Channel), who hasn't faced the starter since finishing a non-threatening third to sidelined stablemate Fed Biz (Giant's Causeway) in a local optional claimer Feb. 9; and **"TDN Rising Star"** **Paynter** (Awesome Again), who looked like he might be any kind following a facile debut win going 5 1/2 panels Feb. 18 ([video](#)). The Zayat Stables colorbearer is out of a full-sister to Tiznow, which suggests added distance should be right up his alley. **Field, p5**

Taking it to the Streets...

Magnolia Racing Stable and Hidden Brook Farm's **Street Life** (Street Sense), tabbed as a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ after a visually impressive last-to-first maiden win at the Big A Feb. 11, heads to the big leagues off another good-looking tally in the Broad Brush S. over the inner Mar. 17. "The longer [the race] the better, but whether he's good enough to face this caliber of horses yet, we'll have to see," trainer Chad Brown commented.

"I know the talent is there. We're trying to develop the horse to get ready for some of these nice races. This will be a good test for him. I'm optimistic he'll give a good account of himself."

Godolphin Racing's **Alpha** (Bernardini) looks for his third straight decision. The handsome bay, second in last year's GI Champagne S., made it look

easy in the Count Fleet S. Jan. 7 and the GIII Withers S. Feb. 4 ([video](#)). Alpha tuned up for the Wood at Palm Meadows in Florida, most recently completing a four-furlong breeze in :49 Mar. 30. "We couldn't be happier with him, he's such a professional," said Art Magnuson, assistant to trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "Distance-wise, the longer the better for him. He's got kind of a medium build, and in the two two-turn races over the inner track he ran well, [although he might have been] have been a little wide. I think he'll appreciate the outer track."

George and Lori Hall's **My Adonis** (Pleasantly Perfect), second behind champion Hansen (Tapit) in the GIII Gotham S. Mar. 3 ([video](#)), fired a bullet four-furlong move in :47 over the main track Mar. 30. "To have won a Triple Crown race last year [with Ruler On Ice], and to be back out in the forefront this year with My Adonis is amazing," Lori Hall said. "We did get to the

"We were ready to run," trainer Donnie Von Hemel commented. "The distance was not quite enough for us. The fact that he beat older horses in the Breeders' Cup was a very good indication he would hold his form and class as a 4-year-old." **Jackson Bend** (Hear No Evil)

enters as a bit of an unforgotten horse following a non-threatening third in the GII Gulfstream Park H. Mar. 10. The chestnut is a perfect 3-for-3 at today's distance, led by a powerful win in last summer's GI Forego S. at the Spa. Shackleford turns back in distance after finishing a disappointing seventh as the 3-1 favorite in the GI Donn H. Feb. 11. He has gone winless in six attempts since upsetting the 2011 GI Preakness S. "I don't feel frustrated with him," trainer Dale Romans said. "He's danced every dance. He's been beaten a few times in unfortunate circumstances, but it's just racing. I wish I had a lot more like him to frustrate me."

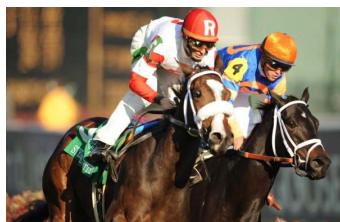

Kenneth and Sarah Ramsey's homebred **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) will be a tough customer this afternoon in the GI Central Bank Ashland S. After capturing the GI Darley Alcibiades S. over this track and trip in October, the bay filly capped 2011 with a win in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Churchill. She has not raced since. "That's part of what makes you feel good about it, that she won a Grade I over this track last year," trainer

Wayne Catalano told *Daily Racing Form*. "I don't mind the layoff. I remember before I won the Breeders' Cup [Juvenile Fillies in 2006] with Dreaming of Anna, everybody was asking me about a seven-week layoff and her never running on dirt. I guess we'll just be testing my training skills once again." After the Ashland, Stephanie's Kitten is expected to target the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot in June. Her main competition here could come from **Karlovy Vary** (Dynaformer), who kicked off her sophomore campaign with a win on the Gulfstream grass Feb. 26. "When she won the 'a-other than', we came here early and pointed for this race," said trainer Rusty Arnold. "She has had two works here [a bullet :59.60 Mar. 26 and a half-mile in :49.60 Monday] and is doing fabulous. She has trained well on the Poly. I have liked her all along. I know the Ashland will be a tough race, but I think she will run well."

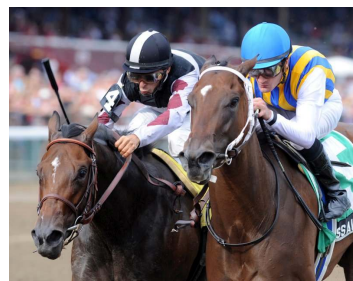

RACING NSW ANNOUNCES PURSE INCREASES

Racing New South Wales recently announced the largest prizemoney increases in the history of the state following last week's High Court decision that released A\$120 million in fees charged by the governing body to bookmakers and Betfair for the use of their racing information.

"We are determined to see participants across all sectors of the industry benefit and receive a fair return for their labor or financial investment whether as an owner, trainer, jockey or strapper," said Racing NSW Chairman John Messara. "The flow-on effect to service providers such as vets, float drivers, farriers and feed merchants will also be substantial." He continued, "Racing NSW fully appreciates the importance of Country Racing as an integral part of the economic and social fabric of rural communities. Rises in training costs over the last decade have made ownership in country regions non-viable and there was a need for a major upward adjustment to prizemoney. Importantly, country racing provides a platform on which much of the industry is built. While these prizemoney adjustments will place NSW in a most competitive position against all Western Racing jurisdictions, we will be aiming for further increases to prizemoney including the Group and Listed category, subject to success in other revenue-generating initiatives which are currently underway."

Racing NSW CEO Peter V'landys said that the funds will be used in a way to maximize the number of people that they benefit. "In a first for Australian racing, licensed stablehands will now get a cut of the prizemoney justly rewarding them for their efforts in the success of their stable," he noted. V'landys also said that some of the money will be used for increased drug testing equipment. "Racing NSW is proud of the fact that it has one of the most proficient integrity systems in sport and wagering. In order to maintain our pre-eminent position on integrity issues and to keep pace with world's best practice, we have a number of initiatives in the making, including investment in several new sophisticated drug testing instruments," he said.

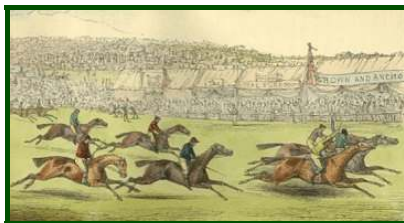

Jockey Christophe Soumillon has signed a contract with owner Simon Springer to take the prized ride on last year's joint-champion juvenile **Dabirsim (Fr)** (Hat Trick {Jpn}). Soumillon was in line to pilot the Christophe Ferland trainee in August's G1 Prix Morny, but his contract with Ecurie Wildenstein made him unavailable. The winning mount was taken by Frankie Dettori, who was also in the irons when the bay completed an unbeaten five-race freshman campaign in the Oct. 2 G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp last time. The Belgian will partner Dabirsim in the Apr. 15 G3 Prix de Fontainebleau, going one mile at Longchamp, before coming back over the same course and distance for the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains one month later.

CONTESSA HAS IT COVERED

Trainer Gary Contessa, the New York Racing Association's leading trainer from 2006-2009, has made a career of finding value on the track and in the sales ring. He says doing a little of everything is the key to success, and he has found plenty to like at this year's juvenile sales.

"I do everything," Contessa said. "I buy yearlings every year to pinhook, I buy 2-year-olds in March and I pinhook them back in the May sale. I am all about making money. So I do lots of different things. I think survival in this game is key, and I like to play at every level."

Active on both sides of the shedrow at this spring's juvenile sales, Contessa has successfully sent several yearling pinhooks through the ring and has more scheduled to sell at Monday's Keeneland April Sale.

"I thought the yearling sales were very strong last year and I thought that bode well for this year's 2-year-old sales, so I got involved buying yearlings to pinhook," Contessa explained. "And these are horses that, if we didn't sell them, I wouldn't mind racing them. It works out well."

In addition to the juveniles that are part of his pinhooking partnership, Contessa also purchased a pair of yearlings last fall on behalf of a client. Both fillies, who sell through Nick de Meric's consignment, will return to the ring Monday. Both worked a furlong in :10.1 during the auction's under-tack preview Thursday.

"I bought those two for a client and I actually thought we were going to race them," Contessa explained. "He wound up putting them in the sale because it is such a good market right now. He is testing the waters with them a little, but they are both horses that I like a lot."

[Hip 146](#) is a filly by Tapit out of multiple-stakes placed Garden Dance (El Prado {Ire}). Contessa signed the ticket on the yearling for \$160,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale.

"She is the prototype of every good Tapit filly," Contessa enthused. "She is big, she's got a huge behind on her, she's got a huge shoulder, a tremendous walk and she's the whitest kind of gray. So she is very appealing to the eye. She has the look of every good Tapit filly that I've ever seen racing. They all have that same look. They are very big, they are broad and quite a few of them are very gray. I just thought she fit the bill."

[Hip 138](#) is a daughter of Awesome Again out of stakes winner El Bank Robber (Eltish).

Contessa purchased the youngster for \$100,000 out of last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale.

"She has a behind on her as big as a truck and we all know the engine is in the rear," Contessa said of the bay filly. "She is very much eye candy with a great big behind and a great shoulder. And Awesome Again is a great stallion. We only paid \$100,000 and, for a nice Awesome Again, I think \$100,000 is right where you want to be to pinhook one."

Contessa acknowledged there is a different approach when buying horses to race versus pinhook.

"I think when you go to a yearling sale, which I do every year--every year I get there for the first day of the Keeneland sale and I stay for a week or two--I think you have to have a different mind set when it comes to price," Contessa said. "You have to really set the price in your head of what you think is a fair pinhook price--because, don't forget whatever you pay for that horse as a yearling, you are going to have about \$30,000 more into that horse when you try to pinhook it. So you really have to envision where that horse is going to be at a 2-year-old sale, and stay within those parameters of where you can make a profit."

The two fillies from the de Meric consignment don't exactly fit into that pattern.

"They are both such nice fillies, either one of them could light up the board as a pinhook," Contessa said. "But if my instructions when I went out to buy those fillies was for pinhooking, I might not be in this situation today. We paid race money for them, but they are not that far from being good pinhooks. They are very, very marketable fillies." **Cont. p16**

Contessa has a reputation for finding inexpensive 2-year-olds and reselling for a considerable profit. Among his finds was Peace Rules (Jules), a \$35,000 OBSMAR juvenile who was sold privately to Edmund Gann and went on to a multiple Grade I winning career. The New York native has found plenty of bargains already this spring.

"I bought five horses at the sales so far, between OBS March and last week at [Fasig-Tipton's Florida sale at Palm Meadows]," Contessa said. "My highest-priced horse is \$75,000. I've really had a field day spending \$40,000, \$50,000, \$60,000, because the middle market has been non-existent. Those type of horses, people have either been buying them back or letting them go fairly inexpensively."

He suspects the middle market may catch up to him later this month.

"I think we are actually going to see the middle market show up in the April sale in Ocala in two weeks, because I really haven't seen much of a middle market at either of these other two sales," Contessa explained.

Contessa hasn't seen any weakness at the top of the market, though, and he expects that trend to continue at Keeneland.

"The high-end money has absolutely been there," he confirmed. "Right now, to date, the demand for high-end 2-year-olds is off the charts. It seems like everybody is going to the sales looking to spend \$200,000, \$300,000, \$400,000. That is what I saw in March, that's what I saw at Palm Meadows last week and that's what I expect to see at Keeneland. There have been a lot of really nice horses sell and bring really good money. At the upper level, it has been very, very strong."

Either way, Contessa has proven he knows how to turn a profit.

"It's all about the owners being happy and solvent," he explained. "I am happy either way, any way I can make it a positive for them, that's my game." -*Jessica Martini*
