However, she faces some interesting new faces here. **Wait Til Dawn** (Giant's Causeway) stepped up from a Gulfstream maiden win Feb. 5 to overcome a troubled trip en route to taking the Suncoast S. at Tampa Bay Mar. 10. Trainer Bob Baffert has shipped in a pair of talented fillies. ⚡ **"TDN Rising Star"** ⚡ **Mamma Kimbo** (Discreet Cat) stretches out from her sizzling debut at Santa Anita Feb. 18 that was awarded a 101 Beyer Speed Figure, while **Jemima's Pearl** (Distorted Humor) also takes a class jump after taking an Arcadia optional claimer in her U.S. bow Mar. 9. With Amie's Dini drawn outside, trainer Ron Moquett hopes his charge can stalk Mamma Kimbo. "We'll sit right off of her," Moquett told *Daily Racing Form*. "She'll do anything we ask her to do. That's one of the things that makes her good. She's tactical, and she has heart."

**ROCKING IT AT INGLIS EASTER**

After a string of mild and sunny days, Tuesday's opening session of the Inglis Easter Yearling sale at the Newmarket complex in Sydney was greeted by blustery winds and considerably cooler temperatures. Despite the marked reversal in weather, the day's action proved much more consistent with a son of hot sire Fastnet Rock (Aus) realizing a session topping A\$1-million (\$1,026,074) from Coolmore. Flanked by a large group of associates in addition to advisors Demi O'Byrne and James Bester, Coolmore's Tom Magnier handled the bidding duties.

"We thought this horse was the best horse in the sale," confirmed Coolmore's Tom Magnier. "James and Demi were very keen on him. The whole team really liked him, so we are very keen to get those very good Fastnet Rocks."

The immediate underbidder on the Aug. 19 foal was agent James Harron, acting on behalf of Dr. Edmund Bateman.

"All the right judges were on him, so we knew he would bring about that much," admitted Magnier. "The top end is very strong."

Sent through the ring as [lot 94](#), the bay is the second foal out of listed winner Catreign (NZ) (Tale of the Cat).

The colt is from the family of GSW & MG1SP Distinctly North (Minshaashu Amad) and from the extended family of GI Hollywood Gold Cup winner Awesome Gem (Awesome Again) and GI Preakness S. hero Louis Quatorze

(Sovereign Dancer).

"Tale of the Cat [sire of Catreign] works very well with Fastnet Rock," said Magnier. "This horse had the pedigree and the physical to go with it."

The bay was offered by Newgate Farm on behalf of Robert McClure's Morning Rise Stud. Only a few days earlier, it was announced that Newgate Farm and purchased a 75% interest in Group 1 winner Foxwedge (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) from Bateman. The purchase price was undisclosed.

Coolmore secured an additional two yearlings during the opening session by its sensational dual-hemisphere stallion. Early in the day, the team paid A\$625,000 (\$641,674) for [lot 26](#), a filly out of Absolut Glam (Aus) (Snowland {Aus}) followed by [lot 60](#), a son of Banc de Fortune (Aus) (Galileo {Ire}), who was purchased for A\$300,000 (\$307,978).

"Fastnet Rock fillies are obviously doing very well," explained Magnier. "We've had so much luck with the Fastnet Rock fillies, like [Group 1 winner] Atlantic Jewel, so we're really trying to get the really good ones. The whole team was very keen on her as well, and Absolut Glam herself was very good," offered Magnier. "She was the right type of filly and exactly what we are looking for."

Lot 26, the first foal produced by Group 1 winner Absolut Glam, was bred by SF Bloodstock, who acquired the mare with the Fastnet Rock in utero for A\$950,000 at the Easter Broodmare Sale in 2010. Lot 26 was offered by Glenn Burrows's Willow Park Stud on behalf of her breeders.

Coolmore rounded out its buying yesterday when offering A\$500,000 for [Lot 123](#), a colt by More Than Ready. Bred and offered by John Singleton's Strawberry Hill Stud, the Aug. 21 foal is out of Deedra (Aus) (Zabeel {NZ}), half-sister to Group 1 heroines Tuesday Joy (NZ) (Carnegie {Ire}) and Sunday Joy (NZ) (Sunday Silence). The latter is responsible for Saturday's G1 Queen of the Turf S. winner More Joyous (NZ) (More Than Ready).

Weighing in on yesterday's opening session, Magnier added, "People come here to buy good horses and, if you come to this sale, they have the right artillery here. There are plenty of people here to buy that caliber of horse. It is a very strong market for the right horses."

Also bolstering Coolmore's resolve to pay a premium during Inglis' opening day of trade, Magnier pointed to the court ruling that fell on the side of Racing New South Wales, which awarded it over A\$100 million in funds that had been placed in escrow by bookmakers for the two years.

"Dad [John Magnier] and our whole Australian team are very excited about the future of Australian racing," said Magnier. "With the decision of last week's court case, you would be crazy not to be racing horses."

**Equal Opportunity...**

In addition to Foxwedge and Atlantic Jewel, Fastnet Rock has also enjoyed recent success with the highly-regarded performer Mosheen (Aus), who was victorious in Saturday's G1 Vinery Stud S. at Rosehill. The son of Danehill is also responsible for Driefontein (Aus), winner of the \$2-million Magic Millions 2YO Classic in January.

"Dad and everybody down here is excited by Fastnet Rock," said Tom Magnier. "His results have been very exciting. I would say that we haven't seen a stallion like him down here for a long time. His offspring have loads of quality and they are all great movers. They seem to progress on the racetrack and just seem to get better and better, which is an exciting attribute to have in a stallion."

His ability to produce top performers of both sexes has created a high demand for the stallion in both hemispheres, according to Magnier.

"He has thrown equally good colts and fillies," he offered. "So much so that we have a lot of the horses back on the farm that we are very excited about that are coming through. The reports on his stock in Europe --including from [Irish-based trainer] Aidan O'Brien--are very good, and a lot of the top breeders are very keen to use this horse. He is getting a serious book of mares in Europe, and we have been supporting him very heavily ourselves."

Magnier added, "When you have a stallion like Fastnet Rock and a very vibrant racing industry, this is where you want to be racing horses."

**Getting it Right the First Time...**

Willow Park Stud got off the blocks in fine fashion during Tuesday's initial session when sending out lot 26. The bay represented the initial collaborative effort at the sales between the bay's breeder, SF Bloodstock, and Willow Park.

"We have been lucky enough to have been picked out as a consignor for them for some of their top-end horses, and we will be offering their horses in the years to come at Magic Millions Gold Coast and Inglis' Easter sale," confirmed Burrows. "We were very pleased with that result and are looking forward to consigning more for them next year."

Asked whether the sales price of the yearling was expected Burrows said, "I was just delighted with the price, and she sold very well. We have parades on the farm as well, and we had about 25 individuals on hand and she was really popular. She is by the big-gun stallion of the moment and one that everyone wants and she is very well related."

The filly's page has been bolstered owing to the efforts of her dam's half-brother, Nobby Snip (Aus) (Snippetson {Aus}), a A\$185,000 Easter graduate who has accounted for a pair of Sydney stakes for trainer Gai Waterhouse since the issue of the catalogue. He now has five wins from seven trips to the post and earnings approaching A\$200,000.

"Gai ended up being the underbidder on this filly, so that tells you how highly the family is regarded," added Burrows.

Willow Park also enjoyed a nice return with [lot 65](#), a bay filly by Lonhro (Aus) out of Believe'n'succeed (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), who brought A\$425,000 (\$436,253) during the opening session. According to Burrows, yesterday's success was welcome following the stinging disappointment of the withdrawal of Lot 436, a full brother to So You Think (NZ) (High Chapparral {Ire}).

"He was a wobbler," confirmed Burrows. "He would have sold very well, but unfortunately, he had to be withdrawn."

**Lady of the Hour...**

Earning top honors for the fairer set Tuesday was [lot 40](#), a filly by Encosta de Lago (Aus), who realized A\$910,000 (\$934,086) early in the day. Handling the bidding duties on behalf of Dr. Edmund and Belinda Bateman was advisor James Harron.

"First of all, she was the pick of the catalogue, based on pedigree and then when I actually saw her, I thought she was the best filly on the grounds," said Bateman. "If you asked everybody on the grounds who might be among the top three fillies on the grounds, I would think everyone would have her in there. The page matched the phenotype."

After having recently completed a deal widely speculated to be in the vicinity of the A\$10-million mark for a 75% interest in Group 1 winner Foxwedge (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), Dr. Bateman returned to the same venue at which he purchased Foxwedge for A\$925,000 during the 2010 renewal of the sale to secure Lot 40. In a case of *deja vu*, John Messara's Arrowfield Stud, who was the immediate underbidder on Foxwedge in 2010, once again had to settle for second best.

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Consigned by Mick and Michelle Talty's Hunter Valley-based Edinglassie Stud, the bay filly is out of Amelia's Dream (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), whose brilliant, undefeated, but short-lived career included a win in the G2 STC Silver Slipper S.

"She was our number one pick of the sale," said Harron of the 7-year-old's first foal. "She is a very strong-looking filly. Her mother was an absolute super star on the racetrack. Unfortunately, she broke down early, but she was an absolutely amazing filly."

As for the cross, Harron added, "It's been a very nice cross between Redoute's Choice and Encosta de Lago, on the reverse side, but the cross has been proven to work."

When asked about the sale's price, Harron said, "We always knew she was going to be very popular. That was probably as far as we were going to go, but you just have to pay a premium for the top fillies."

Bateman offered a different perspective on the purchase price.

"What it says is that there is not a lot of disagreement about who the best ones are that are available," said Bateman of the final price. "I've always bought at the top end of the market, and I never regretted paying a premium for what I actually wanted, but I've often regretted buying cheap."

Bateman, who began practicing as a general practitioner four decades ago, later launched Primary Health Care, which developed into one of the biggest medical health care companies in Australia. Bateman and his wife Belinda launched their racing and breeding operation about nine years ago and have been buying at the top of the market ever since. According to Bateman, the Sydney native currently has six horses in training and a total of 16 mares divided between Newgate Farm in the Hunter Valley and Minx Park in Southern Highlands. Bateman, who largely buys to race and replenish his broodmare band, is enticed to buy a colt or two on occasion if they meet his criteria.

"We will retain a small group to race, and replace about half of them to keep the quality," explained Bateman. "Fundamentally, this is a business and we treat it like a business."

"The whole idea with the colt selection is to select a few colts with a view to making them stallion prospects," he summed up.

Regarding the sale of Foxwedge, Bateman added, "The reason we sold [Foxwedge] is because we are in that business, and I'm not in the stallion business. We sold him to Newgate, because we have our mares there and can go over and look at him, so it worked for us."

**By The Numbers: Day 1**

A total of 129 yearlings brought an aggregate of A\$27,426,000 (\$28,153,134) during Tuesday's opening session of the Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale. While bidding proved spotty at times, there was plenty of competition for the day's most-desirable lots.

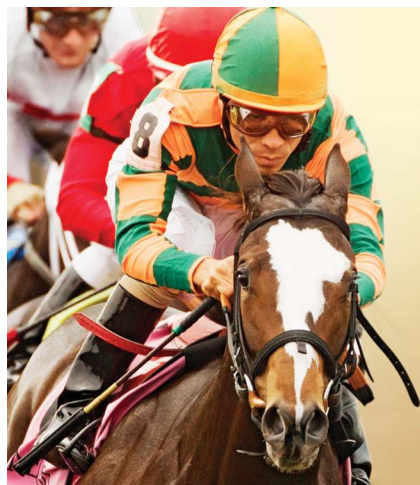
"The A\$160,000 median recorded [Tuesday] is very similar to that recorded the last three years, with 55 yearlings selling from A\$100,000 to A\$200,000 [Tuesday]," commented Inglis Managing Director Mark Webster after the day's proceedings.

"Clients from New Zealand, Ireland, United Kingdom, South Africa, Hong Kong, Singapore, Macau, Japan and all over Australia feature on the buyers list, making the best of this opportunity to buy into the best-bred and conformed yearlings that Australia and New Zealand have to offer here at Easter."

Among the participants making their presence felt yesterday was Kevin Maloney's Segenhoe Thoroughbreds, which secured three fillies for a total of A\$1,215,000. Coolmore's Fastnet Rock (Aus) led the sires list, with 14 of his 19 offered progeny selling at an average of A\$373,929, while Arrowfield's kingpin Redoute's Choice (Aus) had eight yearlings average A\$370,000. Other stallions that proved popular were Encosta de Lago (Aus) whose 17 yearlings averaged A\$251,765, while eight yearlings by More Than Ready sold at an average of A\$226,250. **Cont. p8**

Dr. Kendall Hansen and Harvey Diamond's champion Hansen (Tapit) heads to Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland as the main attraction. The GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero got back on track while

showing the ability to rate in the GIII Gotham S. Mar. 3 following a well-beaten second in the GIII Holy Bull S. in his seasonal debut Jan. 29. Is Hansen the horse to beat on the First Saturday in May? "The way I see it, there are probably five or six that are very evenly

matched and I'm kind of glad of that," Dr. Hansen replied. "I'm glad there's not a horse out there that's been winning every race by 10 lengths and breaking track records. I'm hoping this weekend that Hansen can separate himself and maybe solidify the number one spot in a lot of people's minds."

The popular gray returns to a synthetic surface for the first time since winning his first two career starts at Turfway Park--including the \$100,000 Bluegrass Cat Kentucky Cup Juvenile S.--by a combined 25 1/2 lengths. "It's exciting when your horse wins his two Polytrack races by 12 and 13 lengths," Dr. Hansen said. "I hope he could have a lot of fun on it Saturday without throwing out his biggest race. I'm really shocked to see how tough the Blue Grass is coming up. There's some great competition in there and he's going to have to run well just to win the race. Of course, we don't have to win the race, but it sure would be nice to see him win by daylight and have plenty left at the end." Dr. Hansen, who operates a pain-management clinic in Crestview Hills, Kentucky, is beginning to get his first case of Derby fever. "I actually told my nurses to keep an eye on me and make sure I'm focused," Dr. Hansen said. "I'm getting a little bit more jacked up every day--It's a really good feeling."

Shadwell Stable's homebred **Najjaar** (Jazil), a sneaky good sixth in the GII Rebel S. Mar. 17 ([video](#)), will need a huge performance in Saturday's \$1-million GI Arkansas Derby to punch his ticket to Louisville. The

stone-closer trailed the field for most of the way in the Rebel, no fewer than 20 lengths back at one point, and came running late on the far outside to finish within 4 3/4 lengths of Secret Circle (Eddington). Najjaar graduated and cleared his first allowance condition in two previous trips to

post in Hot Springs earlier this season; he was winless in four attempts as a juvenile. "In the Rebel, we were a little further back than we probably want to be," trainer Danny Peitz commented. "I don't think he has to be that far back. He kind of lunged forward right before they sprung the latch in the gate. I think Calvin [Borel] thought that they were going a little faster up front and he let him drop out further than he wanted to be." Peitz thinks that the nine-furlong distance of Oaklawn's main event for sophomores will be right up his charge's alley, as well as the added real estate of the upcoming Spring Classics. "I would think the Belmont S. would probably be our goal if we don't make it to the Kentucky Derby," Peitz said. "How we're going to get there, I'm not sure. Whether we look at the [GII] Peter Pan [S.] or possibly the Preakness S., I guess we'll have to see how he runs Saturday. We're almost in a win and you're in kind of situation [to make the Derby]." Peitz saddled Steppenwolver (Aptitude) to a runner-up finish in the 2006 GII Arkansas Derby and a rallying third in that term's Run for the Roses. The gray was also a stretch runner. "Similar running styles," Peitz said of the duo. "Najjaar might be a little more of a deeper closer than Steppenwolver. I think both horses needed to have some pace in front of them. They were both very professional about everything."

### Goffs Streamline Orby Sale

Goffs yesterday announced that this year's Orby Sale will be cut to just two days, with the third session moved to another date. The flagship auction will take place Oct. 3-4, with the less select day of trading set to be staged three weeks later alongside the Horses-In-Training Sale. "Every major yearling buyer of 2011 bar one attended the Orby Sale and Goffs attracted more unique buyers than any other sale," Chief Executive Henry Beeby commented. "The buyers are at Goffs, and they come to Ireland to compete at the highest level for the best yearlings. As we have proven on so many occasions with yearlings, foals and fillies out of training, we will achieve the highest prices for the best horses when they are offered at Goffs."

### Betting on Dubai Rises:

Wagering throughout the Western Hemisphere on the Dubai World Cup program, as administered by Prospect, Kentucky-based AmWest Entertainment, reached a new all-time record high this year of \$5.1 million. 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**THE BIG WEEKEND**

As the probable favorites for this weekend's concluding Grade I Derby preps both have to do something to suggest they'll stay 10 furlongs--Hansen (Tapit) in the GI Blue Grass S. and Secret Circle (Eddington) in the GI Arkansas Derby--barring an impressive finishing performance with a Beyer over 100, last Saturday's two major Grade I preps probably told us who will be the favorites in next month's GI Kentucky Derby. Gemologist (Tiznow) remained unbeaten in five starts when winning the GI Wood Memorial (Beyer 98) narrowly over Alpha (Bernardini) at Aqueduct, while I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) scored an even narrower win over favorite Creative Cause (Giant's Causeway) in the GI Santa Anita Derby (Beyer 94, but a fast time, and both I'll Have Another [Beyer 96, in the GII Robert B. Lewis] and Creative Cause [102 in the GII San Felipe] had run higher Beyers in their previous starts). Those four figure in the top six by probable odds right now. GI Florida Derby third Union Rags (Dixie Union) is still likely to vie for favoritism, based on an excuse for the trip and his overall record; and the other who rates right now in the top six is Hansen, pending this weekend's GI Blue Grass. The attached table shows this column's version of the likely contenders as of writing.

Naturally the Classic campaigns are of vital importance to all sires, but most particularly to those sires that have either their first or second crops of 3-year-olds racing (classified respectively as "2nd-crop" and "3rd-crop" sires). Among the 15 top 3-year-olds on my list, one second-crop sire and three third-crop sires are represented. **Cont. p13**

The sole second-crop sire--here he is again--is Scat Daddy (Johannesburg). He has two likely runners: Daddy Nose Best (out of Follow Your Bliss, by Thunder Gulch, and trained by Steve Asmussen), who comes in off two nine-furlong Grade III wins, in the El Camino Real Derby (Beyer 92) and the \$800,000 Sunland Derby, in which he actually ran the highest last-race Beyer (100, which is depressingly low for the top 3-year-old number going into the Derby) of the current Derby contenders; and Daddy Longlegs (out of Dreamy Maiden, by Meadowlake, trained by Aidan O'Brien), winner of the \$2-million G2 UAE Derby at Meydan. Those two wins, as you know, not only made Scat Daddy the leading second-crop sire by progeny earnings, but he's also the number one sire in North America right now.

He may have the only live Derby contenders, but there was plenty of other action among second-crop sires (first foals 2009) last weekend, not least Scat Daddy himself. He kept up the momentum with another Grade III winner, this time the filly Lady of Shamrock in Santa Anita's GIII Providencia at nine furlongs on the turf ([click here for the TDN Year-to-Date Second-crop Sire List](#)). Scat Daddy now has three graded/group SWs this year, six graded/group horses, and eight that have won or placed in a black-type race ('black-type horses').

Number two second-crop sire Hard Spun (Danzig) is beginning to look like Hard Luck. He had two more graded-placed 3-year-olds last weekend: Hard Not to Like kind of looked like the best filly in the race when second in Keeneland's GI Ashland S.; and the gelding Hardened Wildcat ran third to Trinniberg (by another second-crop son of surprise sire-of-sires Johannesburg) in the GIII Bay Shore S. on the Wood undercard. Hard Spun now has five graded horses this year--no 2012 graded/group winners yet, but four black-type winners, and an impressive 11 black-type horses. He's got too many showing promise not to have a breakthrough horse pretty soon. The same goes for 2012 number three, Street Sense (Street Cry), only more so: he has 23 winners already this year, leading all second-crop sires, and one after another of them look like two-turn horses with a lot of improvement in them.

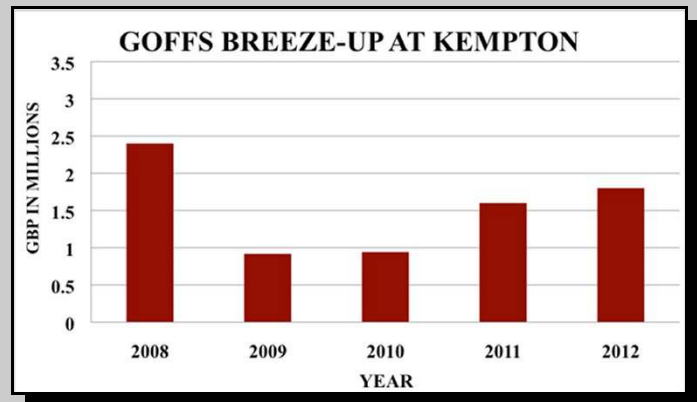
English Channel (Smart Strike), the 2007 grass champion, has been showing some good form of late. The Wayne Lukas-trained Optimizer ran second to Secret Circle in the GII Rebel S. last month, and on Saturday his Blueskiesrainbows ran a bang-up third behind I'll Have Another and Creative Cause in the GI Santa Anita Derby, also on the dirt. He also had a black-type winner at Tampa, and he's had five winners on the grass, at Gulfstream and Santa Anita, in the last three weeks, all of which has propelled him into fourth spot on the 2012 second-crop sires list. Lawyer Ron (Langfuhr), Corinthian (Pulpit; had GIII Bay Shore second How Do I Win over the weekend), and Discreet Cat (Forestry) come next, all with 2012 progeny earnings over the \$600,000 mark to date. **Cont. p14**

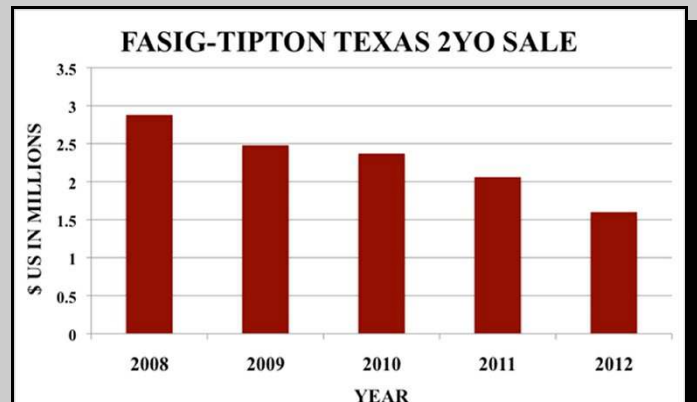

"We'll look at Keeneland in detail next week, but the short version is 16% fewer horses sold for 16% less money, and the average dead even with last year. Last week, Goffs opened the European 2-year-old sale season with a sale at Kempton Race Track outside London; that was up 12% in gross, with 18% more horses sold than last year, so a 5% drop in average. Fasig Texas, on the other hand, had 18% fewer horses sell, with a 24% drop in gross, and a 7% drop in average, perhaps reflecting the difficulties facing regional markets now."

Indy) is one of three F2008 sires with one of the top 15 Derby contenders, and in fact third-crop sires have two of the top six: Bernardini has Alpha, a narrow second to Gemologist in the GI Wood Memorial; and Flower Alley (Distorted Humor), who also had a Grade I winner in his first crop last year, is the sire of GI Santa Anita Derby winner I'll Have Another. He has moved into third place on the 2012 third-crop list. Second is another son of Distorted Humor, Sharp Humor, who was sold to South Korea earlier this year; he's the sire of Hero of Order, shock winner of the \$1-million GI Louisiana Derby. Number four on the list is now Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat), sire of GI Wood Memorial third Teeth of the Dog; number five is Badge of Silver (Silver Deputy) who, just as he did last year with his first crop, is having a good winter and spring. Bernardini, of course, is also the sire of Algorithms, who beat Hansen impressively in the GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream in January, running a Beyer 105, but was then forced off the Derby trail through injury.

As far as the overall 2012 General Sire List ([click here](#)) goes, Scat Daddy, as mentioned, still occupies the top spot in North America. Number two among North American sires is City Zip (Carson City), followed by Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat); Gemologist's sire, Tiznow (Cee's Tizzy); Speightstown (Gone West); Tapit

(Pulpit); Malibu Moon (A.P. Indy); Songandaprayer (Unbridled's Song); Bernardini; and the resurgent Proud Citizen (Gone West). These all rank between fourth and 14th on the TDN General Sire List; the top three are European sires Dubawi (Dubai Millennium), Selkirk (Sharpen Up), and Medicean (Machiavellian), who all had big results on Dubai World Cup night. The fourth European sire among the top 14 so far this year is Kyllachy (Pivotal), who ranks eighth by virtue of having Krypton Factor, winner of the \$2-million G1 Golden Shaheen (6 furlongs, AW) and Sole Power, second in the \$1-million G1 Al Quoz Sprint (5 furlongs, turf) that night. This is Kyllachy's highest international ranking to date.

## THE UPS & DOWNS OF BETTING HANDLE

Being a bit of a betting and gambling geek, a hobby of mine is looking at the factors that drive pari-mutuel wagering. It's a fascinating exercise because there are so many items that go into the make-up of a gross betting pool. Sure we know the basics, like the lower the takeout the higher the bet, and the less gambling competition we have the better it is for racing handles, but there are so many more.

So far in the 21st century we've seen wagering fall, but it has not been all bad. Racing has done some good too. I thought I'd look at some ups and downs this century; what I think has helped, and what I think hasn't.

### The "Ups"

**A Concentration on Increased Field Size** - I'm a horse owner. When I have a horse in to go and it's a five-horse field, the only thing I like better is a four-horse field. For bettors, it's the exact opposite. In the early 2000's, this metric was barely on the radar for tracks and racing secretaries. Small fields at some of our large tracks were not an exception, they were the rule. Now, in 2012, you'll often hear tracks like Gulfstream Park and Keeneland trumpet their field size numbers and do everything possible to increase them. A big field means more choices for bettors and makes for a more interesting product to wager on. This has been a plus for handles, and with race dates decreasing the past few years, it should only get better as time goes on.

**Dynamic Pricing** - It seems like it was a long time ago when bettors were flocking to offshore sites and Vegas to get rebated for their play. Racing wanted no part of dynamic pricing for a long, long time, but in the mid-2000's this started to change. Today, even large organizations like Churchill Downs Inc., and Magna have embraced the model. The jury is still out on whether this is good or bad for the long-term health of the business, but with some estimates that decreased takeout through rebating drives 60% of handle, it certainly is formidable.

**Lower Takeout Bets** - While you can grow organically by increasing the churn of your current customer base, any good business needs to look outside of it to try and increase turnover. If you visit a sports betting or poker site and tell the crowd you're a horseplayer, they immediately think you're a sucker. "How can you beat 20% juice? You can't," is a familiar refrain. **Cont. p15**



Lower takeout bets have, at the very least, tried to attack that mindset. They also act as a branding mechanism for racetracks to promote something positive, and increasing payouts to customers always increases the gross bet.

**"Big" Days** - Time and time again the last half-dozen years, we've seen a racing juxtaposition: headlines screaming at us about large overall handle losses, yet simultaneous headlines about tracks having record handles for their signature race days. Whether it's the Kentucky Derby, the Florida Derby, The Wood, The Preakness or the Jockey Club Gold Cup it doesn't seem to matter. A big part of this, perhaps, is social media. Go on Twitter and see first-hand the excitement regarding stakes racing and signature days. It's palpable and people want to be a part of it. For whatever reason, racing needs to continue focusing on their big days, because it's working.

**Wager Variety, Incremental Bet Sizes** - If the cheese market only contained havarti, it would be a pretty small market. If a company invented a few different kinds of cheddar, mozzarella and parmesan, sales of cheese would skyrocket. Bets like 50-cent pick 4's and 10-cent supers are racing's cheddar. More variety in increments means more dollars. When we lower the denominations, we increase churn, and when we do that, handle goes up. When fractional wagering catches on, which I believe it will, it should help handle even more.

**The "Downs"**

**Higher Takeout** - There's a reason your neighborhood bookie charges 10 cent lines in 2012, which is the exact same price charged a century ago--because that's where he/she makes the most money. When we increase takeouts we will make less money in the long-run, and even worse, it maddens horseplayers to no end because they feel underappreciated. Even the explanations like "we're increasing takeout so we can have a better product for you, so you should be happy to pay" are hair-pulling. Not only are they illogical (if increasing takeout made tracks more money, forget raising it to 25%, try 80% and make even more), they turn off customers. Would racing fans and participants be happy to pay \$5 a gallon instead of \$4 a gallon for gas if the purses for the Dubai World Cup went up?

**Jackpot Bets** - This may have been expected in the "ups" section, but I don't think it should be. Jackpot bets like the Rainbow Six, are great for a single track because they have something to promote. However, too many of them are churn killers. In the 1970's when win place and show ruled the roost, you could bring \$50 to the track, bet a few win and show bets, and that bankroll would last. Now, good luck with that. Jackpot bets, like a carryover pick 6, takes money out of circulation. Even winners don't invest that big payday all back into the pools. There's a place for jackpot bets in racing, but I think the proliferation of them does more harm than good.

**Internet Wagering** - We can bet a baseball game anywhere we want, without too much trouble. We can sign up and load an E\*Trade account, buy or sell stocks, options or futures in the middle of the night in all 50 states with ease. Betting horses on the web is anything but easy. If you live in state "A" you may or may not be able to bet state "C"'s tracks. You may be able to sign up to watch video only if you live in state "F". In state "G", well you may not even be able to do that. We have 1978 laws governing the 2012 Internet age. It's been a huge problem because potential new customers do not want to hear about horsemen and track "home areas" or a variety of excuses on why they can or cannot do something that others can do. Today's consumer wants action, and they want it yesterday. **Cont. p16**

**Wagering/Pari-Mutuel Technology** - If you or I go to our local Wal-Mart, see an iPad on sale for \$399, walk up to the cashier and he/she tells us the price changed to \$499 and we have to pay it, we would not be too happy. That's what horseplayers go through each day. If you bet a horse at the off that you think has a 33% chance of winning at 5-2 and he drops to 7-5 at the second call, you made a terrible bet. It's 2012. Late odds drops, an archaic wagering system and rumors and evidence of past posting does the game no good at all. It's a complete turn-off for informed and technologically savvy bettors that expect more.

There are several other factors I am sure I could've looked at, but those are a few that I found interesting and tangible. I believe if our industry does more of the positive, and less of the negative, we'll drive handle on the plus side this decade.

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**NEW CHALLENGE FOR MONMOUTH** Attorneys representing John Brunetti will appear before a New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority hearing officer Monday to argue that the bidding to operate Monmouth Park be reopened, according to published reports. Earlier this year, the New Jersey Horsemen's Association and two consultant groups were awarded the right to operate the Oceanport oval. The track is scheduled to begin its 2012 meeting May 3. In letters to the NJSEA, Brunetti claimed that the bidding process was altered to accommodate the NJHA. One of his attorneys, Paul Josephson, wrote in his filing to the NJSEA and published in the *Asbury Park Press*, "having selected a traditional procurement process by which to award the lease, the [sports authority] is bound to follow all New Jersey bidding laws designed to provide the equality and fairness of the competition. It is plain this did not happen here." NJSEA spokesman John Samerjan said that procedures would be followed for Brunetti and representatives to present their views.

## MILCZAREK WINS APPEAL

Jockey Kirsty Milczarek was successful yesterday in her appeal against a two-year suspension handed out by the British Horseracing Authority as part of their latest crackdown. Found in breach by the disciplinary panel in December of a rule of racing concerning corrupt practice and passing information for reward, the rider has now been cleared of involvement in the outlawed activity involving a series of races during 2009. Paul Scotney, Director of Integrity Services, Compliance and Licensing for the BHA, said in a statement, "We accept the decision of the Appeal Board to allow the appeal of Kirsty Milczarek. It is the role of the Appeal Board to consider such appeals and additional evidence when presented. However, we stand by the original decision to include the race as one of the 10 under scrutiny on account of the extraordinary betting patterns and the pattern of communication around the race." As the race concerning Milczarek--who will be allowed to re-apply for her licence--is now not part of the corruption case, the disqualifications for both the alleged masterminds Maurice Sines and James Crickmore have been reduced to 13 years from 14 years.
