PRINCESS ARABELLA RETIRED

Peachtree Stable's undefeated **TDN Rising Star** **Princess Arabella** (Any Given Saturday) has been retired due to a soft-tissue injury. An eight-length winner of the Sunland Park Oaks last time Mar. 25, the sophomore filly was one of the favorites for the May 4 GI Kentucky Oaks. "She came back with a soft-tissue problem and was going to need six or seven months off," explained trainer Bob Baffert on HRTV Thursday. "So we decided, in her best interest, to retire her and send her back to Kentucky [to be bred]. It's such a shame

because she was such a brilliant filly and we were really looking forward to a big Kentucky Oaks run. All her races were so effortless. It's a big blow to the Baffert barn--they're so hard to come by when you get a freaky filly like that." Baffert and John Fort's operation teamed up to complete last term's Sunland Oaks/Kentucky Oaks double with Plum Pretty (Medaglia d'Oro) and they still have fellow **TDN Rising Star** and recent GII Fantasy S. heroine Mamma Kimbo (Discreet Cat) penciled in for the first Friday in May. **Cont. p3**

SECRET CIRCLE INJURED, OUT OF DERBY

In another loss for the Baffert barn, Watson, Weitman & Pegram's **TDN Rising Star** **Secret Circle** (Eddington), winner of the inaugural Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint last November and one of the most consistent members of this year's 3-year-old crop, will pass on the GI Kentucky Derby. Despite amassing a perfect record over sprint distances in 2011, Secret Circle has raced exclusively at two turns this year, finishing second in the GIII Sham S. over a mile Jan. 7,

then made the first of his three trips to Arkansas a successful one, taking the faster of the two divisions of the GIII Southwest S. Feb. 20. Though many questioned his ability to stretch out even further, the attractive bay colt held on to land the 1 1/16-mile GII Rebel S. by a half-length Mar. 17 and was closest to stablemate Bodemeister (Empire Maker) in last Saturday's GI Arkansas Derby going nine panels, crossing the line 9 1/2 lengths behind the possible Derby favorite. Secret Circle has amassed a career record of 7-5-2-0 and earnings of \$1,018,990. **p3**

SHAMARDAL COLT SHINES AT CRAVEN

After Wednesday's quiet opener, last night's concluding session of the Tattersalls Craven Breeze-Up Sale seemed like a different event with an evening headed by a 500,000gns (*US\$842,912*) Shamardal colt. The dearest breeze-up horse sold in Britain for four years, he rocketed in price as John Ferguson, accompanied in the sales pavilion by Sheikh Mohammed, eventually outbid Peter Kelly of Emerald Bloodstock, who was taking orders from County Tipperary trainer David Marnane. The colt was consigned by Tally-Ho Stud in County Westmeath.

"He was a very athletic individual, he breezed exceptionally well and is by a sire we know and trust," said Ferguson. "Hopefully, he'll be a top 2-year-old."

For Roger O'Callaghan, who now helps his parents Tony and Anne with the day-to-day running of Tally-Ho, it was a memorable result. O'Callaghan had bought the colt for 53,000gns as a foal, and bought him back for 45,000gns as a yearling.

"He was easily the biggest sale we have had," O'Callaghan said. "We loved him from the day we bought him as a foal, and we were hoping for 100,000gns-150,000gns, but this far exceeded our expectations." **Cont. p4**

"It's a shame and it's one of those things--it's a part of racing," Baffert said of the loss of Princess Arabella, who broke her maiden first out at Santa Anita Dec. 31 by 3 1/2 lengths followed by an allowance tally by the same margin Feb. 12. "The talent was just amazing. Every time I led her out I didn't have to worry if she was going to get beat or not. There are very few that give you that feeling."

Peachtree principal John Fort said that Princess Arabella is currently in Kentucky at Taylor Made Farm, and said that he hoped to send her to Tapit this year. Bred in Kentucky by Greenwich Cattle Company, the

\$47,000 KEESEP RNA is out of a full-sister to Peachtree's GI Kentucky Derby runner-up Invisible Ink (Thunder Gulch). "I hope I don't sound like an owner bragging about his horses, but she was just a little more than another good racehorse," Fort said in an interview on TVG. "She was so explosively brilliant. I've never seen a horse quite like that and I've been involved in racing for 35 years." Fort was quick to compare his star-crossed runner with one of racing's greats. "I'm from

South Carolina and, of course, Frank Whiteley trained there at Camden and I remember him saying that every time they took Ruffian to the track they just sort of held their breath. And, this filly, because she put so much into it and she was so fast, you just were so afraid that something might happen. This filly gave everyone who watched her train the same feeling." He continued, "What a big, gifted filly--16.2 [hands] with a stride from here to Texas. It's that kind, unfortunately in this business that can get hurt. What an honor to have owned her, what an honor that she was undefeated and untested. I hope the Thoroughbred world will recognize her and always think about her in that pantheon of champions. There are so many ways to achieve greatness. You can have a long career, you can win a few marquee races or you can have three races that were just absolutely brilliant and that was Princess Arabella." Princess Arabella retires with earnings of \$188,400 from three winning starts.

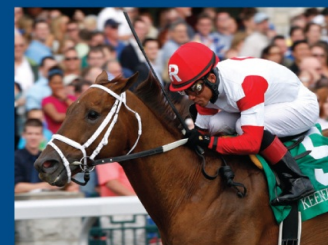

Take Charge Indy Works at Gulfstream...

Chuck and Maribeth Sandford's GI Florida Derby hero **Take Charge Indy** (A.P. Indy) breezed five furlongs in an easy 1:01.47 at Palm Meadows Thursday morning as he preps for the GI Kentucky Derby May 5. Under exercise rider Eric Rodriguez, the dark bay got his opening quarter in :24.06 and half in :48.26. The drill came in company with Transplendent (Sky Mesa), a maiden member of the John Kimmel barn. "The horse is ready, the horse is fit," said Pat Byrne, Take Charge Indy's conditioner. "Eric said he was like a Cadillac. He'll have one more work here next week, but he won't have any company. I'm going to do something next week just to do something." Byrne said that his Derby hope will ship from Florida to Churchill Downs May 1.

I'll Have Another Tunes Up at Hollywood...

J. Paul Reddam's **I'll Have Another** (Flower Alley), who will enter this year's GI Kentucky Derby undefeated in two starts, tuned up for the big race with a six-furlong work in 1:13.60 over the Hollywood Cushion Track Thursday morning. "He worked alone and went great," trainer Doug O'Neill said of the GI Santa Anita Derby hero. "He got stronger as he went. He'll have one more work at Hollywood on the 27th, then leave for Kentucky on the 28th."

"I have to thank Michael Hussey, who has done a lot of work with the horse and rode him in his breeze--he is a gift," O'Callaghan added. "The mare is owned by Mark and Pippa Hackett, and is being covered by our stallion Bushranger (Ire) tonight!"

The buoyant second session helped the sale finish with an 8,578,000gns turnover, up 7%, and the 73,316gns average rose by 3%, while the 57,000gns median was down by 5%.

A daughter of Shamardal took second place on the pecking order when realizing 360,000gns after Richard Frisby came out best in a duel with fellow Newmarket agent Mags O'Toole for the filly consigned from Willie Browne's Mocklershill operation. The half-sister to stakes performer Courageous (Ire) (Refuse to Bend {Ire}) was bred in Ireland by the McCalmont family's Yeomanstown Lodge Stud, and had not previously passed through a sale.

"I can't say who she is for, but she'll either go into training in Newmarket or in France," said Frisby. "I thought she was the pick of the fillies here, and she breezed exceptionally well. It's a very good female family and one I know quite well, as I manage a half-sister to her relative Fairy Queen (Ire). The family continues cropping up year after year."

Abu Dhabi royal family member Sheikh Sultan bin Khalifa Al Nahyan, bidding through Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock, paid 280,000gns for a Street Boss half-brother to Churchill Downs stakes winner Record (Devil His Due) sold from John Collins' Brown Island Stables. The colt had cost just \$22,000 as a yearling at Keeneland.

"This colt's breeze was awesome," said Brown, who outbid agent Tom Malone. "He and the Oasis Dream we bought [for 160,000gns on Wednesday] were the two we really made a play for, and I'm delighted to have got both. This fellow made a bit more than we expected to pay. The horses were a lot better tonight, so I thought it would be stronger, but it has been like a different sale."

Newmarket trainer Marco Botti outbid agent David Redvers early on to get a Cape Cross (Ire) colt out of Thiella (Kingmambo), a daughter of GI Del Mar Oaks runner-up Theoretically (Theatrical {Ire}). Offered from Charlie and Tracy Vigors' Hillwood Stud, the colt rocketed in price from the £40,000 he had cost at Doncaster as a yearling when knocked down to Botti for 200,000gns.

"I have an owner for him, but he doesn't want me to say who it is at the moment," said Botti. "The horse breezed really well and he's physically a very good model, especially for a first foal. He can probably race over seven furlongs, and he's by a stallion that has thrown a lot of good horses. I like the cross with a Kingmambo mare."

Charlie Gordon-Watson, standing with Ed Dunlop, was taken by a War Front colt offered from Paddy Twomey's Hawthorn Villa Stud offered near the close of play. Twomey had paid \$105,000 for the colt at Keeneland in September, and he resold for 175,000gns last night.

At the sale's end, Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony commented: "There has been plenty of competition at the top of the market this week, a number of spectacular pinhooking successes, and the individual highlight of the 500,000gns sale topper which was the third highest price ever at the Craven Breeze-Up.

"Buyers from throughout the world, most notably the Gulf region and Hong Kong, have had a major impact on the sale, and we are naturally delighted that the key indicators of turnover, average, median and clearance rate have held up so well.

"The figures should also be placed in the context of conditions for the breeze which were far from ideal. The 2-year-olds coped admirably in wind and driving rain and, as ever, paid tribute to the professionalism of the consignors who brought some outstanding individuals to the marketplace.

"Nevertheless, it would be wrong to pretend that all has been plain sailing over the last two days. The market has been selective at times and served as a reminder that the continuing economic uncertainty, particularly in Europe, continues to pose challenges.

"The positives that can be taken from this sale should however give cause for cautious optimism as we look forward to the Tattersalls Guineas Breeze-Up and Horses in Training Sale which takes place May 3-4."

Dayatthespa debuted a four-length winner sprinting over the Saratoga lawn last August before checking in second--one spot in front of subsequent GI Darley Alcibiades heroine Stephanie's Kitten (Kitten's Joy)--in Woodbine's Gill Natalma S. the following month. Jerry and Ronald Frankel bought into the filly at that point, but she could do no better than ninth behind Stephanie's Kitten in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Churchill Nov. 4. It has been a very different story this year. The chestnut showed a new dimension when rallying from far off the pace to annex Gulfstream's Jan. 22 Sweetest Chant S. and followed that up with a more forwardly placed neck victory in the GIII Herecomesthebride S. last time over Regalo Mia back in Hallandale Mar. 11.

Traveling well within herself on an uncontested lead through splits of :23.70, :48.50 and 1:13 flat, Dayatthespa was briefly confronted by Andrew's Girl (Lawyer Ron) turning for home, but something went amiss with that rival and she was quickly pulled up. He said, "[Somali Lemonade] was coming strong the last part, but the other filly was too far in front. I was very pleased with her performance."

This renewal of the Craven S. was robbed of a potential star turn when Most Improved (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) was ruled out due to lameness, but, after the emphatic success of John Manley's Trumpet Major, it ended up doing its job by showcasing a serious G1 2000 Guineas contender. Racing under a penalty for his win in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster in September, the dark bay tracked his prominent stable companion and 4-1 second favorite Crius (Ire) against the stands-side rail as Eastern Sun (Ire) led overall racing alone down the centre. Switched out for his effort approaching the quarter pole, Trumpet Major seized the advantage passing that marker and opened up to score by five lengths from Crius to provide the Richard Hannon stable with a one-two. "He's twice the horse he was last year and has done really well," winning rider Ryan Moore said. "He's filled out and is a lot bigger to sit on, and he'll definitely go to the Guineas with a chance." **Cont. p9**

An early 2-year-old in the Hannon mold, Trumpet Major broke his maiden over six furlongs at Goodwood in May before making little impact in the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot the next month. Beaten a short head by Talwar (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) in the seven-furlong Listed Winkfield S. back at Ascot in July, he was nearly nine lengths behind that rival when last of four on testing ground in Sandown's G3 Solario S. a month later after an interim win in a conditions race on the July Course. Rebounding to win Doncaster's G2 Champagne S. on the St Leger undercard, he suffered traffic problems when fifth--beaten less than two lengths--in the G1 Dewhurst S. at this venue in October. "The race was run at a good gallop and went very well," Moore commented. "They were all sorted out at halfway and I wanted to get him organised, as Johnny Murtagh who rode him in the Dewhurst said he took a while to get going there. I probably got there too soon, as he had a look in front." Making light of his extra burden against some intriguing prospects headed by Godolphin's ultimately disappointing 7-2 favorite Mighty Ambition (Street Cry {Ire}), he dominated this important 2000 Guineas trial--which his stable won with the subsequent Classic hero Tirol (Ire) in 1990--from a long way out.

John Gosden thought enough of Questioning to try him in the G2 Prix Greffulhe at Saint-Cloud last May, but he was fifth in that Classic trial prior to a game third in the G3 Darley S. over this track and trip in October. Denied a clear run when third--promoted to second--in the Apr. 1 Listed Doncaster Mile on his 4-year-old bow, the bay stepped up off that promising return to lower the colors of course specialist Twice Over for a career-best. Settled off the early speed by William Buick, he found a gap as the favorite was sent to the front passing the quarter pole, and rallied to wear him down in the final strides. "He got knocked over at Doncaster the other day when he should have won, so he deserved it," trainer John Gosden said of the winner, who had to survive an enquiry after leaning across Twice Over close home. "He's been a bit of a bad-luck horse who has sometimes hung fire, but he's been in the best form ever at home this year, and has stuck his neck out today. He could run next in the G3 Huxley S. [at Chester May 10]."

Rougemont scored on debut here over seven furlongs at the July meeting before finishing fifth behind subsequent G1 Racing Post Trophy runner-up Fencing (Street Cry {Ire}) and Wednesday's Listed European Free H. hero Telwaar (GB) (Haafhd {GB}) in the Listed Washington Singer S. over that trip at Newbury the following month. Back to winning ways in a 10-furlong conditions event at Leicester in early October, the bay tackled a similar race over this course and distance at the end of the month, and was an unthreatening third behind Godolphin's Mojave (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}). Settled in mid-division early here, he was moved up to lead with 2 1/2 furlongs remaining and was always holding the spirited challenge of Mickdaam up the rising ground. Last year's GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic third-place finisher **Pachattack** makes her first start for new connections in today's GIII Hillard Lyons Doubledogdare S. at Keeneland. Flaxman Holdings went to \$1.2 million to secure the former Druid Racing representative at last year's Fasig-Tipton November Sale. Trainer Graham Motion saddles the 6-year-old, who was campaigned by Gerard Lyons last term to a six-length win in the GIII Arlington Matron S. and a trio of Grade I placings, for the first time. She has been stabled at Motion's Fair Hill base ever since. "She was there all winter because it was so mild," explained assistant trainer David Rock. "She missed no training at all. She had her last work there Monday (five furlongs in 1:02) and arrived here Tuesday night." Bill Mott sends out a fresh face of his own in Juddmonte Farms' **Principal Role**. The homebred was a multiple stakes winner in Britain for Sir Henry Cecil and finished third behind Middy (Oasis Dream {GB}) and Snow Fairy (Ire) (Intikhab) in last July's G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood.

Herbert Schwartz Passes Away:

Herbert T. Schwartz, a successful real estate developer and owner and breeder of champion New York-bred filly Critical Eye (Dynaformer), passed away from natural causes Thursday at his home in Woodmere, New York. He was 80 years. Schwartz purchased his first horses in 1969 and raced a number of homebred horses in the family's flamingo pink silks, including Go Rockin Robin (Distorted Humor), who upset the GII Peter Pan S. in 2003. Schwartz also campaigned stakes winner Dynamic Lisa and bred the stakes winners Be



Bullish and Classic Endeavor. But his best horse by far was the durable Critical Eye. The first foal produced by Critical Crew (Dr. Blum), Critical Eye negotiated the step into open company with aplomb, upsetting the GI Gazelle H. in 2000 before adding that year's GIII Honey Bee S. and was named champion 3-year-old filly in New York. She went on to add the GI Hempstead H. and GII Sheepshead Bay H. the following season en route to being named champion older New York-bred female and capped her career with a score in the GIII Ladies' H. in 2002. She retired with 14 wins from 38 starts and earnings of \$1,060,984. Critical Eye was trained by Schwartz's son Scott. "He was a true horseman who loved the game," said Scott Schwartz. "He was involved for five decades and achieved a lot for being a small, hands-on operation." In addition to Scott, Schwartz is survived by his wife, Carol, daughters Karen, Bonnie and Robin, and many grandchildren. Funeral services will be private.

Former Racing Official Hamilton Dies:

Richard Hamilton, a former steward and long-time racing official for the New York Racing Association, passed away Wednesday evening at St. Peter's Hospital in Albany, New York, after suffering a heart attack. He was 76 years. Hamilton had been taken to Saratoga Hospital Tuesday complaining of pain in his neck and jaw, according to Peter Hammell, former director of the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame. A 1958 graduate of Emerson College, Hamilton served in the U. S. Army until 1961. After working for the *Daily Racing Form*, various radio stations in New England and ABC Radio, he went to work for The Jockey Club in 1972 before joining NYRA three years later. He served the organization as a paddock judge, clerk of the course, placing judge and alternate steward prior to being appointed a NYRA steward in 1989, a position he held for six years. Hamilton accepted an early retirement package in 1995 and became the communications officer for the Museum of Racing, developing the Hall of Fame ceremony. Hammell said that his colleague enjoyed volunteering his time at Saratoga Hospital and at the History Room at the Saratoga Public Library. "Dick Hamilton was an invaluable contributor to the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame both during his years here as our communications officer and also in recent years as a volunteer," said current museum director Christopher Dragone. "His knowledge of Thoroughbred racing and his passion for the sport and the Museum were evident to all who knew him. He was one of the true gentlemen in racing and was beloved in the Saratoga community." Hamilton is survived by a niece, Mary Lake, and three nephews, Philip, David and Steven Biati, the children of his sister Audrey Biati, who preceded him in death. A memorial service will be held in Saratoga Springs during the racing season.
