SWOOPING AIGLES

Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) had to travel overseas for his first taste of top-level success in the G1 Champion S., but his homecoming at Longchamp for yesterday's G1 Prix Ganay had a special feel to it, as he outclassed his rivals to add a first domestic Group 1 to his ever-growing tally. Sent off the 7-10 favorite after confirming his lofty status in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Meydan Mar. 31, the bay was soon at the head of affairs under Olivier Peslier and that jockey was simply a passenger throughout. Extending his advantage in the straight, the 6-year-old, who was enjoying his 42nd lifetime start, was always in hand en route to an eight-length success from Giofra (GB) (Dansili {GB}). "What new words can I use for him?" trainer Corine Barande-Barbe asked. "He is a dream who does everything every time--he is just extraordinary. I am very happy that he has now won a Group 1 in France." Cont. p3

BODEMEISTER TUNES UP

Zayat Stables' Bodemeister (Empire Maker) turned in his final drill in preparation for Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby yesterday, working five furlongs over a sloppy Churchill strip in :59.60--second fastest of 10 at the distance. Bodemeister broke off four lengths behind stablemate and GI Kentucky Oaks hopeful Jemima's Pearl (Distorted Humor) and finished a neck in front of the filly while posting fractions of :36.40 and :48. He galloped out six furlongs in 1:12.20 and a mile in 1:39.80 with jockey Martin Garcia in the irons. "He worked his usual self," reported trainer Bob Baffert. "He just went around there. I had the radio on [Garcia] and told him when to pick it up a little bit, to tease him a little bit. He sat behind that horse, stayed with that other horse. I don't see him being rank in the work. He's really settled in here really, really well."

Jemima's Pearl, coming off a third-place effort in the Apr. 11 GII Fantasy S., was credited with a five-furlong work in 1:00.40. "She usually comes off the pace, but she was a good work horse for him," Baffert said. "She worked really well. She's had a few outs and has been improving every time. She ran a good race in the Fantasy, so I think she deserves a chance."

Cirrus des Aigles Wins Prix Ganay (cont. from p1)

Cirrus des Aigles never had much commercial appeal, being by the virtually unknown Even Top, whose claim to fame was being beaten pixels by Mark of Esteem (Ire) in the 1996 G1 2000 Guineas, and who has hardly bred another winner. Now that he is an international performer of real renown, the decision to geld him has taken on extra significance as he is obviously made of serious material. Owned by the little-known partnership of Jean-Claude-Alain Dupouy and Xavier Niel and trained by Corine Barande-Barbe, who has long carried out her profession on the fringes, the 6-year-old has come from nowhere to emerge as France's worst-kept secret over the past 12 months.

Inching ever closer to the big time prior to his breakthrough when third and second, respectively, in this race and the G1 Prix d'Isphahan here last spring, he tacked another second in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud on to his record in between authoritative wins in the G3 La Coupe at this course and G3 Grand Prix de Vichy in the summer. In two weeks at Deauville, he had annexed the G3 Prix Gontaut-Biron and G2 Grand Prix de Deauville by a cumulative margin of 18 lengths. After a second in the G2 Prix Dollar back at this circuit at the start of October, he shipped to Ascot a fortnight later to deny So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) the laurels on that sun-baked Champions' Day.

Only two-lengths fifth in the G1 Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin in December, he was surprisingly beaten by the smart Zazou (Ger) (Shamardal) on his Dubai warm-up in a conditions event over 1 3/16 mile on Chantilly's Polytrack Mar. 3, but was in front where it mattered on World Cup night after getting first run on St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}).

As soon as Peslier was allowed a near two-length advantage in the early stages here, the contest was as good as over and it seemed up the straight that the more the de Royer-Dupre pair of Giofra and Reliable Man tried, the easier the task was for the favorite as he coasted to a landmark win. "Now we have many choices," Barande-Barbe added. "We could go to Kranji for the [May 20] G1 Singapore Airlines Cup, even though it comes up quite quick, or try the G1 Prince of Wales's S. [at Royal Ascot June 20] or the [June 24] G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. We will decide in time and let him tell us, but he didn't seem to have a hard race there." Alain de Royer-Dupre said of the second and third, "The filly ran a good race, but the heavy ground was probably against her and the winner is unbeatable in that. Reliable Man ran a good race, as he probably needed it and we could consider the Prince of Wales's S. for him."

While last year's Triple Crown winner and Japanese Horse of the Year Ofevre (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) garnered top billing in the spring renewal of the Tenno Sho as he looked to bounce back from a troubled second in the Mar. 18 G2 Hanshin Daishoten, 157-1 outsider Beat Black got the money in a shocker. The 5-year-old, who was 10th in the Hanshin Daishoten and looking for his first victory in over a year, took close order early. He grabbed command with four furlongs left to run, and simply never looked back, scoring a victory that was as easy as it was improbable, while giving pilot Shu Ishibashi the first Group 1 success of his 10-year riding career. Ofevre, who raced towards the back early, could only muster a dead-heat 11th-place finish. "I want to apologize that he couldn't run as well as the fans' expectation," trainer Yasutoshi Ikee told *Racing Post* of Ofevre, whose plans to point to the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe will now be reconsidered. "I am not sure what has happened." Rider Kenichi Ikezo added, "He was swept off his feet on the ground. A few times his steps were unbalanced. I felt his footwork was not smooth and he was not his usual self."

We've read the script before--Japanese horse trained by Katsuhiko Sumii, Italian rider, big-race win. It was a little more than a year ago that the Sumii-trained Victoire Pisa (Jpn), ridden by Mirco Demuro, took out the G1 Dubai World Cup, and Sunday, though in a race not nearly as valuable, Umberto Rispoli and Rulership got through at the fence turning for home and gave

Japan its third win in the Queen Elizabeth II Cup. Solid at home, the 5-year-old was well bet, but could manage just a fifth in the G1 Takarazuka Kinen last June, then was fourth, beaten 1 3/4 lengths behind Orfevre (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) in the G1

Arima Kinen when first-up Dec.

25. He followed up with a short-priced win in the G2 American Jockey Club S. Jan. 22, but disappointed when third at 2-5 in the G2 Nikkei Sho Mar. 24. He took plenty of tote action here as he looked to join Eishin Preston (Green Dancer) as Japanese-based winners of the QE II. Ridden positively by Rispoli, Rulership was one of five in the early mix out of the stretch, but Douglas Whyte wanted the lead on Hong Kong Derby hero Fay Fay (NZ) (Falkirk) and crossed over to the

fence despite doing some work to get there. Treasure Beach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) applied token pressure over the rain-affected going, while Rulership got an ideal spot a bit further back against the rail. Fay Fay was having a soft time of it on the engine, covering the opening 1200 meters in a pedestrian 1:16.68, but he drifted a touch away from the rail nearing the stretch. Reacting immediately, Rispoli sent Rulership through to lead nearing the 300-meter mark and he stretched impressively away. Thumbs Up rallied gamely for second, ahead of Sweet Orange, whose late kick may have been blunted some by the ease in the ground. After arriving in Hong Kong in February, the winning rider was shut out in his first 70 rides, but capped his local contract in style Sunday. "I rode the horse two mornings ago and he worked very well, but I had two fears before the race," revealed Rispoli. "I was worried about the ground because yesterday and this morning there was very hard rain, and also the pace, I was sure it was going to be very slow. I saw Fay Fay was a meter and a half from the rail, so I had one chance to take that gap and I chose to go inside. The horse wasn't scared and he went through easily and ran very well to the finish." Rispoli is heading back to France to ride for Melbourne Cup-winning conditioner Mikel Delzangles. Rulership is a candidate for the G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Cup in December.

Quiet Oasis, who concluded her time with Brian Meehan with a seventh-place effort in the 2010 GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Churchill Downs, opened her campaign with Ben Cecil with a narrowly beaten runner-up effort in the GIII La Habra S. in 2011. She returned eight months later to take an optional claimer down the hill at Santa Anita Oct. 15 and was making her first start since running sixth in the Nov. 25 GI Matriarch H. The bay filly broke on top, but was taken in hand by jockey Mario Gutierrez and tugged along in third as Briecat led the field through fractions of :23.61, :47.63 and 1:11.02. Briecat cut the corner and sprung clear in upper stretch, but Quiet Oasis uncorked a determined late rally to surge past the pacesetter in the dying strides. "I told [owner] Paul [Reddam] we should run in the 6 1/2-furlong allowance [May 4] because I thought first time off the layoff she'd be a little keen," admitted Cecil. "So I let him make the call and he made the right one to run here. He gets all the credit. We've always thought a lot of her. We're hoping next time she'll settle even more. How far she'll go is a question mark." Favored Nereid (Rock Hard Ten), making her first start since running third in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Cup last October, chased the pace early and finished well to be fourth. "She ran really well," trainer John Sherriffs said of the beaten favorite. "I thought it was a very nice race first time back. We'll move on from here."

Campaigned in France by trainer Giuseppe Botti's son and assistant Alessandro during the black-out in Italy this winter, the bay was placed on his first four starts culminating in a second in a mile conditions event on Chantilly's Polytrack Mar. 23. Back in his native country for a first win in the Listed Premio Gardone at the San Siro Apr. 8, he was switched off in rear despite the early pace proving less than taxing. As Vedelago swooped on British raider Farraaj inside the final quarter, Malossol was winding up from the back and his flourish carried him past his compatriot in the final strides.



Triple Threats

PLETCHER PAIR WORK AT PALM MEADOWS

Trainer Todd Pletcher sent his two Kentucky Derby hopefuls out to work over a rain-soaked Palm Meadows track Sunday. WinStar Farm's unbeaten **Gemologist** (Tiznow), coming off a win in the GI Wood Memorial, worked four furlongs in a bullet :50.39, in company with stablemate Disposablepleasure (Giacomo). "We're not looking for anything different," Pletcher said. "He's been perfect his whole life, so we're hoping to see more of what we've seen. He's had a really good time since the Wood. Everything's gone smoothly with the exception of catching a little rain here the last few days. We're very happy with him."

Let's Go Stable's **El Padrino** (Pulpit), also working in company, went four furlongs in :53.34. "He's an easy horse to train," Pletcher said. "He's a laidback kind of guy and just does whatever his workmate does. He's had a good five weeks since the Florida Derby." Winner of the GI Risen Star S., the chestnut is coming off a fourth-place effort in the Mar. 31 GI Florida Derby.

OPTIMIZER DRILLS FIVE FURLONGS

Bluegrass Hall's **Optimizer** (English Channel), currently sitting 21st on the graded earnings list, worked five furlongs at Churchill Downs yesterday in 1:00.40. With Jon Court aboard, the colt carved out fractions of :11.60, :23.60, :36 and :48 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:14.80. "We just had a maintenance move like everyone else this close to the Derby," trainer D. Wayne Lukas commented. "This track handles water really well and they did a nice job with it. It was a little peanut-butter consistency, but it was really safe and Optimizer handled it well. The times might be a tick or two slower today than recent days, so that might be a feather in the cap of a horse like Bodemeister or my horse who worked over it today."

I'LL HAVE ANOTHER HAS O'NEILL SMILING

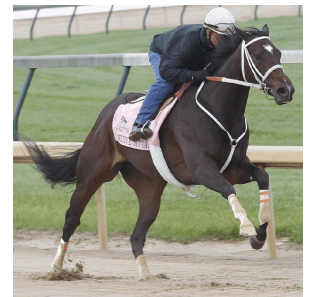

Mark Valeski (Proud Citizen)'s participation in the Kentucky Derby will hinge on a workout today at Churchill Downs. "He has to work well tomorrow," trainer Larry Jones said. "I told Brereton [Jones], if he's doing better than he's ever done before, then let's do it. We did the same thing with Eight Belles. That's the only thing Rick [Porter, owner of Eight Belles] asked me, he said, 'Look, if she's not doing better than she's ever done, we'll just run in the Oaks.' And I had to tell him that's the best she had ever been, and she showed it when she ran."

BULLET FOR BELIEVE YOU CAN

Brereton Jones's **Believe You Can** (Proud Citizen) breezed a bullet five furlongs in :58.80 yesterday at Churchill Downs in preparation for Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks. "Strangely enough, that's exactly the same time that [2008 Oaks winner] Proud Spell had her pre-Oaks work in at Churchill Downs four years ago," trainer Larry Jones said. "We were very pleased. She did it very easily. I'm not surprised because she floats, she just goes so easily." With retired rider Larry Melancon in the irons, Believe You Can worked in fractions of :11.60, :22.80 and :34. She galloped out six furlongs in 1:12. "We didn't feel like we had to have a great work out of her today, but I told Larry, let her skip on along," Jones continued. "We're not here to candy coat this thing; this is the race where you put winning works in them. You're either ready or you're not and if the work knocks them out, then they weren't ready. We have to let them go out there and show their stuff."

Grace Hall (Empire Maker), who had her work delayed by rain Saturday, tuned up for the GI Kentucky Oaks with a half-mile breeze at Palm Meadows Sunday in :52.10. "In a perfect world, if she had done a half mile [Saturday], that would have been ideal," explained trainer Tony Dutrow. "So this is the next best thing. This isn't the ideal situation--I'm not going to try my way out of that, but exposed to the circumstances that we had, this is the next best that we could do. We're hopeful that we get the same results." Second behind champion My Miss Auriela (Smart Strike) in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, Grace Hall is coming off a 6 1/2-length victory in the Mar. 31 GII Gulfstream Park Oaks. She is expected to ship to Kentucky Tuesday.

BROADWAY'S ALIBI CONFIRMED FOR OAKS

E. Paul Robsham Stable's **Broadway's Alibi** (Vindication) has been confirmed for Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks, a day after recording a four-furlong work at Palm Meadows in :48.45. "She's doing really well," reported trainer Todd Pletcher. "Everything she's done this year has been perfect. She handled the mile stretch-out well. We brought her back here with the idea to let her tell us if she wanted to run in the Oaks or something more conservative. She's done everything so well, so we decided it was worth a shot." Broadway's Alibi won the Jan. 29 GII Forward Gal S. by 16 3/4 lengths and is coming off a 3 1/2-length victory in the one-mile GIII Comely S. Apr. 7.

Pletcher added that Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners and Gary Barber's **In Lingerie** (Empire Maker), winner of the Mar. 24 GIII Bourbonette Oaks in her third start, would skip the Oaks in favor of the May 18 GII Black-Eyed Susan S. at Pimlico. "She's a pretty lightly raced filly," Pletcher explained. "We felt like it was a more suitable place to step up to a graded stake on dirt. She's doing very well, but after talking with Aron Wellman [president of Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners] and Gary Barber, we decided to take a little more cautious approach. We just felt it was a better progressive step for her."

"Dynaformer commanded respect and his toughness was undeniable to the very end," Case Clay continued. "He reminded me a lot of Seattle Slew in that, when you were around him, you knew you were in the presence of greatness."

Dynaformer sired GI Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro, as well as G1 Melbourne Cup winner American, multi-millionaire Perfect Drift and European champions Rainbow View and Lucarno. From 21 crops to race, Dynaformer's progeny have earned over \$105 million and he is the sire of 61 graded stakes winners, 25 Grade I winners and 18 millionaires. He is the broodmare sire of 78 stakes winners.

"Dynaformer's tough spirit will continue to influence our breed for many years to come," said Three Chimneys owner Robert Clay. "He reminds us that looks aren't everything, and that the will to win is that intangible ingredient we are all striving to find."

Three Chimneys stallion manager Sandy Hatfield added, "He commanded respect and total attention at all times. He had earned every bit of his reputation as being one of the toughest stallions in the industry, but when it came to his job in the breeding shed, he was a total professional. In my opinion, our industry has lost one of the greatest sires it will ever see."

ACCLAMATION AOK

Eclipse champion older male **Acclamation** (Unusual Heat), scratched from Friday's GIII Inglewood S., has been pronounced fit and could make his 2012 debut in Saturday's GII Mervyn LeRoy H. over the Cushion Track at Betfair Hollywood Park. Acclamation was scratched Friday after trainer Don Warren said he had taken "a few bad steps" Thursday. "We can't take a chance with a horse like this," Warren said. "But the x-rays were clean, his legs were cold and he galloped perfect Saturday and Sunday." Adding that Acclamation was being pointed towards the June 9 GI Charles Whittingham Memorial H., Warren said, "We really wanted to get a race into him before the Whittingham. Now that we're sure he's OK, he'll probably run in the LeRoy. He'll ship to Hollywood Park to work Tuesday and then we'll make the final decision."

Also expected in the LeRoy is **Morning Line** (Tiznow). Winner of last year's GI Carter H., the 5-year-old will be making his first start since last August and his first appearance for trainer John Shirreffs. "I really like what I've seen so far," said Shirreffs. "He looks very competitive and, like typical Tiznows, he's very versatile. The owners just decided to give him some time off after his last race."



BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

ALLEZ ALLEZ!

Introduced in 2004, Chantilly's G3 Prix Allez France has been won by Alain de Royer-Dupre on three occasions so far and he has a live chance of extending that tally today with His Highness The Aga Khan's **Shareta (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}). Quietly progressive last term, she followed wins in the Listed Prix de Thiberville at Longchamp in July and G3 Prix Minerve at Deauville in August with a third in the G1 Prix Vermeille back at the former venue in September. Excelling herself in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, the bay was five lengths adrift of Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) when runner-up in the autumn showcase, with the likes of Snow Fairy (Ire) (Intikhab), So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) and St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) behind. She was seventh when Danedream was a place ahead on her subsequent start in the Nov. 27 G1 Japan Cup, where she made eye-catching late progress to be beaten less than five lengths in all. "She's well, but she really loves quick ground and we don't know if she'll be the same horse on soft," de Royer-Dupre told the *Racing Post*. "We are running to find out and if she doesn't enjoy it, that will dictate our future planning with her." Haras d'Etreham's **Dream Peace (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) is burdened with a harsh seven-pound penalty for her success in the G2 Prix de la Nonette at Deauville in August, but has a lot to offer this season on the evidence of her unlucky third--beaten just a neck--to Miss Keller (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in Woodbine's GI E. P. Taylor S. when last seen in October. "It's her comeback and she's giving weight, so I don't want her to have too hard a race," trainer Robert Collet told the *Post*. "Depending on how she runs, we'll look at either the G1 Pretty Polly S. [at The Curragh July 1], or she may go to Singapore if we're invited."

Emperors Palace National Yearling Sale

JET MASTER COLT TOPS IN SOUTH AFRICA

A superb son of the late champion sire Jet Master (SAf) took center stage on the final day of the Emperors Palace National Yearling Sale in South Africa yesterday when he cost trainer Glen Kotzen R1.7-million (*US\$219,248*), making him the most valuable asset of the two-day auction. Consigned by Klipdrif Stud as agent, the sale topper, catalogued as lot 460, did not enter the ring until late on, but was widely acclaimed as one of the stars of the day. He certainly lived up to his billing, with Kotzen having to dig deep to contain the challenges of persistent rival Mike Bass, who had already secured two of the first session's top lots. "He was the pick of my colts--he had everything in the right place," enthused Kotzen. "As Jet Master is no more, he only needs to win a Group 1 race to make him a stallion prospect...I purchased him on behalf of a syndicate."

The full-brother to G1 Empress Club S. victress Stratos (SAf) is out of the Golden Thatch (Ire) mare Gilded Star (SAf), who is also responsible for G1 Allan Robertson Fillies third-place finisher World Of Stars (SAf) (Sportsworld). Another stellar name on the catalogue page is that of champion stayer Space Walk (SAf) (Dancing Champ), who completed a rare Group 1 double with victories in both the Durban July and Gold Cup.

Action from Start to Finish...

The second session blasted out of the starting gate when the second lot into the ring, a stand-out colt by Captain Al (SAf), was knocked down to trainer Justin Snaith for R1.4-million (*US\$180,563*). The trainer of likely GI Breeders' Cup Mile competitor Gimmethegreenlight (Aus) (More Than Ready) required just three bids to snare the brother to two standout fillies, the colt's full-sister and champion Captain's Lover (SAf) and Group 1 winner Ebony Flyer (SAf) (Jet Master). Snaith trained both for Barry Irwin's Team Valor.

The next-highest price, R1.05-million (*\$135,434*) was attained for yet another son of Jet Master (SAf) in lot 337, with veteran trainer Ormond Ferraris putting pen to paper for Varsfontein's handsome colt out of the Darshaan (GB) mare Alexandra Bi (Ire). The bay is a half-brother to G2 Golden Slipper victress Alexandra Rose (SAf) (Caesour), who also landed the GIII Monrovia H. in the silks of Team Valor. Other siblings include G1SP winner Pavlovich (Soviet Star), and this season's Oaks Trial runner-up Alessandria (SAf) (Fort Wood). Significantly, the yearling colt's full-brother Alexandra Palace (SAf) sold for a joint-highest price of R2.5-million at last year's Cape Premier Yearling Sale.

Three colts weighed in at R1-million (*US\$128,984*) apiece, including a cracking son of newcomer Sail From Seattle (Gone West).

Highlands Farms' colt, catalogued as lot 457, was widely regarded as one of the plums leading up to the sale. He is a half-brother to unbeaten juvenile sensation Soft Falling Rain (SAf) (National Assembly), who romped to a sensational victory in Saturday's G1 SA Nursery at Turffontein and is

set to continue his career in Dubai. Although the younger sibling stepped into the ring as the sale drew to a close, the determined Hong Kong trainer Tony Millard was rewarded for his patience when he saw off all comers to take home the classy bay, the third foal out of the American-bred Gardener's Delight. A daughter of Giant's Causeway, she hails from the family of GI Kentucky Oaks winner Gal In A Ruckus (Bold Ruckus) and GI Hollywood Starlet victress Habibti (Tabasco Cat), the dam of 2010 GIII Breeders' Cup Marathon hero Eldaafer (A.P. Indy). The seven-figure price handsomely contributed to Sail From Seattle's final returns and he averaged R258,214 (*\$33,310*) for fourteen sold, by far the highest of the first-season stallions.

Trippi., Jet Master Demand Continues...

Demand for boom freshman sire Trippi remained strong and Form Bloodstock had to go to an even million for Drakenstein Stud's colt (Lot 345) out of Aquatint (Aus), a daughter of G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero Peintre Celebre. She is a granddaughter of the magnificent French sprint champion Sigy (Fr) (Habitat). Trippi also sired one of the day's highest-priced fillies when Mike Bass snapped up his daughter out of Ankara (GB) (Elusive Quality) for R800,000 (*\$103,205*). The Wicklow Stud-bred (Lot 341) is the second foal of her dam, who is a granddaughter of Massaraat (Nureyev), a stakes-winning own sister to the great Miesque.

Klipdrif Stud matched that price for a robust daughter of Captain Al (SAf), with champion trainer Mike de Kock's purchase of Lot 294, the first foal out of G1 SA Classic winner Urabamba (SAf), whose half-sister Ghost Writer (SAf) (London News (SAf)) was twice Group 1-placed.

Jet Master's status as a champion sire is well and truly established and, although he had a much smaller draft compared to last year, he once again stamped his authority on the sale, with 15 lots selling at an average price of R529,667 (*\$68,327*), which just shaded Trippi's average of R524,750 (*\$67,590*) for 20 lots sold. **Cont. p13**



International Presence Lacking...

Although the exchange rate of the Rand is inviting and has added to the internationally recognized ability of the South African racehorse, the current export ban due to an outbreak of African Horse Sickness kept away the international buyers, who were conspicuous by their absence. Difficult economic conditions and a trimmer catalogue also impinged on the final returns, with the sale reaching an aggregate of R81,750,000 (\$10,545,342) as compared to R117,310,000 (\$15,132,345) in 2011. In comparison, the average of R240,441 (\$31,016) remained virtually unchanged from 2011's figure of R241,876 (\$31,201).

"Prices were realistic, taking into account the state of the economy. In contrast to last year, vendor buy-backs were not included in the final figures, which also made a difference," remarked Bloodstock SA's CEO Jan Naude. "With a smaller catalogue, it is difficult to compare apples with apples, however, it is pleasing to note that we maintained the average of 12 months ago." 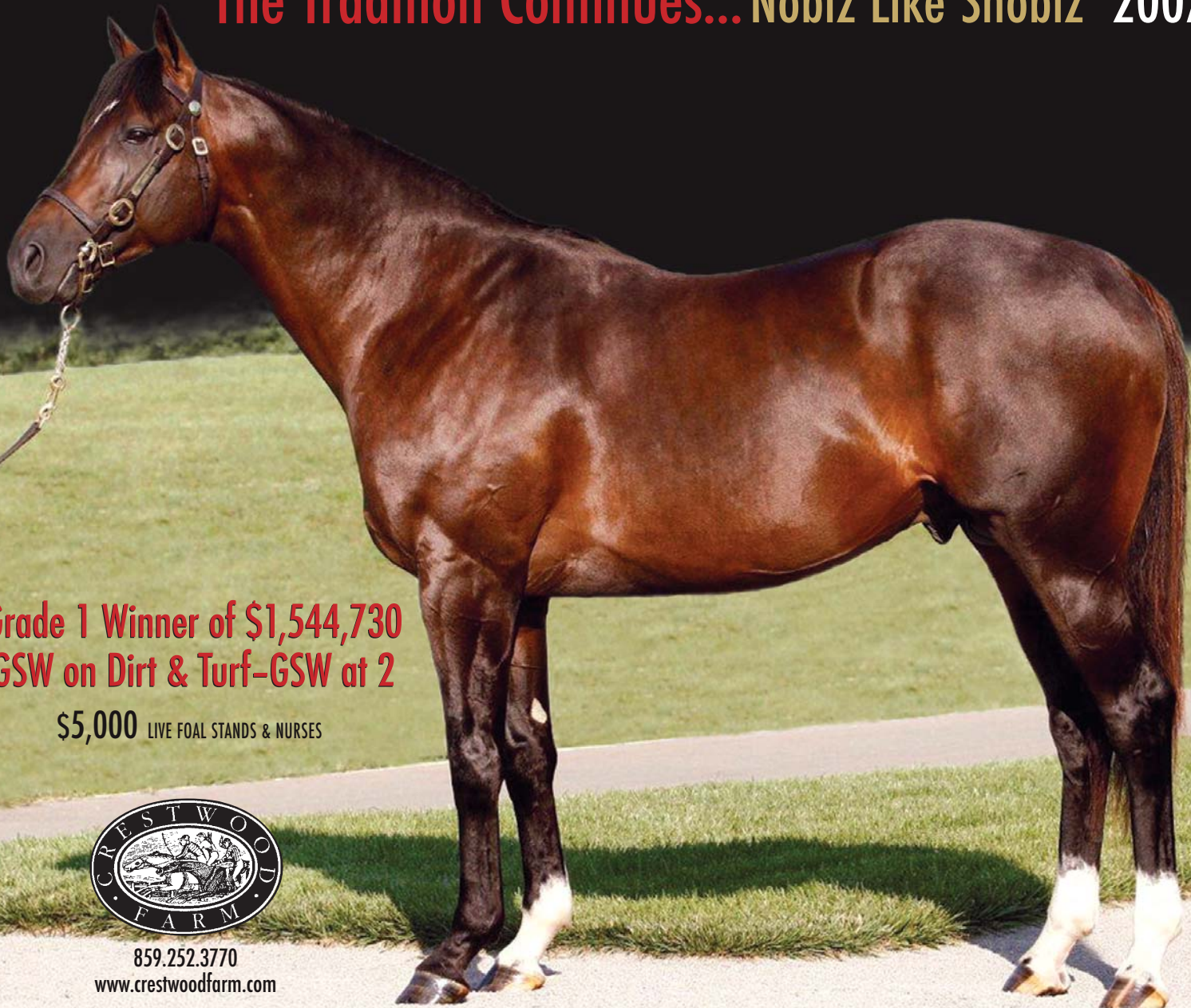
